Academic Attire

The traditional costume worn by Lock Haven University faculty, staff, Council of Trustees and distinguished speakers at Convocation and Commencement is a record of academic achievement.

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th Centuries, when universities were taking form in England and other parts of Europe. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was the dress of a cleric. Long gowns were worn, and may have been necessary for warmth, in unheated buildings. Hoods may have served as a cover to protect the tonsured heads of monks and other medieval scholars in the winter.

European institutions have always had great diversity in their specifications of academic dress. In contrast, shortly after the traditional academic dress was brought to the United States with the founding of Kings College (now Columbia University), American educators opted for a standardized system that all colleges and universities might follow.

In 1895, the Intercollegiate Commission, a group of leading American educators, drafted a code of academic dress, which in addition to regulating the style, cut and material of the gowns, prescribed the colors which represent various degrees of learning. This code was revised in 1932 and 1959, and updated in 1986.

The wearer's level of degree is indicated by the gown's cut. Doctoral gowns have full sleeves which are round and open. Gowns worn by Masters have long, closed, somewhat fuller sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees. The arm goes through a slot, giving the appearance of short sleeves. Those worn by Bachelors have long, pointed sleeves.

The color of the gown also varies. Although most of the doctoral gowns are black, in some cases their color is that of the university conferring the degree. Trimmed with three two-inch velvet bars on the sleeves and a five-inch velvet border extending from the back of the neck down the two sides in front, the doctoral gown is usually black. The velvet trimming may be of a color that indicates the nature of the degree. Master's and Bachelor's gowns have no such facing.

The size and shape of the hood, which is the most significant part of the academic dress, indicate the degree of the wearer. The Bachelor's hood is three feet in length with a two-inch velvet border; the Master's hood measures three and one half feet in length with a three-inch border; and the Doctoral hood is four feet with a five-inch border.

The color of the velvet border and hood lining indicate the academic field and the color or colors of the institution granting the degree respectively. The hood worn by University President Craig Dean Willis is lined in the school colors of The Ohio State University—scarlet and gray. Other representative colors displayed by members of the University faculty and staff include:

- Pennsylvania State University dark blue and white
- Ohio State University scarlet and gray
- Temple University red and white
- Columbia University slate blue and white
- Duke University royal blue

Some of the colors worn by Lock Haven University faculty and staff for all academic purposes, including the trimmings of doctors' gowns, edging of hoods, and cap tassels, are associated with the following disciplines:

The mortarboard cap, conventionalized from the skull cap worn by the monks of the 12th and 13th Centuries, is usually black. Tassels are worn over the left front quarter by degree holders; candidates wear the tassel over the right quarter until the degree is conferred.

The Academic Procession

The Centuries old pagentry of the academic procession dates from ancient tradition rooted in the early universities. Since the first academic ceremonies were predominantly in charge of the clergy, they followed the familiar order of the religious procession in which the place of highest honor was at the end of the procession. Accordingly, the academic procession is made up of members of the platform party, members of the faculty, and members of the graduating class, marching in that order. After the commencement ceremony, the order of march is reversed.

The Mace

The staff carried at the front of the academic procession is called the mace. It is a symbol of authority and indicates that the activity is an official function of Lock Haven University. Since responsibility for the ceremony is shared by co-marshals, each of them carries a mace. The maces were fashioned from wood from old Sullivan Hall which once stood on the present site of Stevenson Library.

Commencement Speaker

CAROL J. WHITCRAFT FREDERICKS, Ph.D.

Today's commencement address is presented by Dr. Carol J. Whitcraft Fredericks, the founding president of Whitcraft Consultants and the former deputy director and coordinator of the Governor's Executive Development Program at The University of Texas at Austin.

The first Mary E. Switzer Fellow of the National Rehabilitation Professional Association, Dr. Fredericks holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Baylor University and Master's and Doctoral degrees from The University of Texas at Austin in the areas of science, psychology, communication and organizational research.

Dr. Fredericks' diversified career began in the private sector where she worked for twelve years, directing marketing, public relations and research for major shopping centers, downtown associations and chambers of commerce. Following an early retirement from the Texas Rehabilitation Commission where she served as executive assistant commissioner, Dr. Fredericks founded Whitcraft Consultants, a consulting firm for organizational and executive development and research.

The recipient of several state and national research awards for rehabilitation studies, Dr. Fredericks served as a research scientist associate in the Genetics Department at The University of Texas at Austin. She also taught speech communication at Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos, The University of Texas at Austin and Austin Community College.

Dr. Fredericks has authored more than fifteen published articles and has received state and national recognition in the areas of ethics and communication.

Honorary Degree Recipients

SAMUEL H. FREDERICKS

Doctor of Science

A major benefactor of Lock Haven University, Mr. Fredericks and his wife, Dr. Carol Whitcraft Fredericks, initiated the Samuel H. Fredericks Leadership Seminar, which brought representatives from central Pennsylvania businesses and agencies together for two days in September 1992 to address strategies for change.

The son of three generations of Lock Haven residents, Samuel H. Fredericks began his early education at the Model School which once operated on the Lock Haven campus at the former Central State Normal School.

After attending Lock Haven High School and graduating from the Lawrenceville School in New Jersey, Mr. Fredericks went on to earn a degree from Yale University in 1935. The following year, he entered the graduate program at Yale University and received a certificate in transportation.

During World War II, Mr. Fredericks served his country as a naval officer for four years, retiring from active duty in 1945 as a lieutenant commander.

An avid railroad enthusiast, Mr. Fredericks' career spans twenty-five years in the railroad industry. He worked for both the New Haven Railroad and the New York Central Railroad until his retirement in 1967.

GEORGE ROSS

Doctor of Public Service

Recognizing the struggle that many college students face when trying to fund their education, Lock Haven University Alumnus George Ross established the George and Genevieve K. Ross Loan Fund. A major benefactor of the University, Mr. Ross endowed a fund to provide interest-free loans to 20 Lock Haven seniors every year, enabling them to complete their education.

A retired U.S. Navy commander and U.S. State Department official, Mr. Ross distinguished himself both in peace time and war. Prior to his retirement from public service in 1977, he held various positions in the areas of personnel, administration and industrial relations.

During his career as a foreign affairs officer, Mr. Ross implemented policies and procedures for U.S. employees in 21 Latin American countries; managed international negotiations and contracts; and supervised various construction and renovation projects.
