

# Reading Courses Offered

California State College's elementary education department is offering a comprehensive course in reading improvement and study skills this summer designed for high school juniors and seniors. Classes will meet Monday through Friday at 11 am to 12:30 pm in the Reading Center (202 Herron Hall) during the first six-week summer session which begins June 3 and extends through July 12.

Course skills will include reading comprehension, vocabulary development, reading rate, skimming, scanning, reading tastes, reading criticism, listening improvement, note-taking, study habits, location of reading material, use of library resources, and preparation for examinations. A limited number of students will be permitted in each class so that individualized instruction can be utilized.

Dr. Harry B. Miller, chairman of the elementary education department, will direct the program with Dr. Robert A. Kaiser, associate professor, serving as coordinator.

# Research Building To Be Built

California State College will soon be the center for biological research in southwestern Pennsylvania and as such will have a biological science building to be constructed on the ground now occupied by the North Hall. This building will be used for both teaching and research for faculty and student alike. One of the interesting aspects of the new building will be that it will have individual research cubicles for the professors and for graduate and undergraduate students. There will also be sufficient lab space to allow all those who take biology to have laboratory study too.

The building will consist of three floors and basement. It will contain dual purpose lecture lab rooms and three big lecture rooms, two holding 75 students, one containing 150 students.

For the biology majors there are specialized labs in all major disciplines of biology including radiation lab, electron microscopy, cytology, embryology, comparative anatomy, physiology, microbiology, plant physiology and green house, genetics, and a regulated temperature lab.

In addition there will be three other rooms of note: a museum display room, with access to specimens for students; an animal room for experiments with live animals, and an herbarium in which will be kept plants of Western Pennsylvania. Dr. R. W.

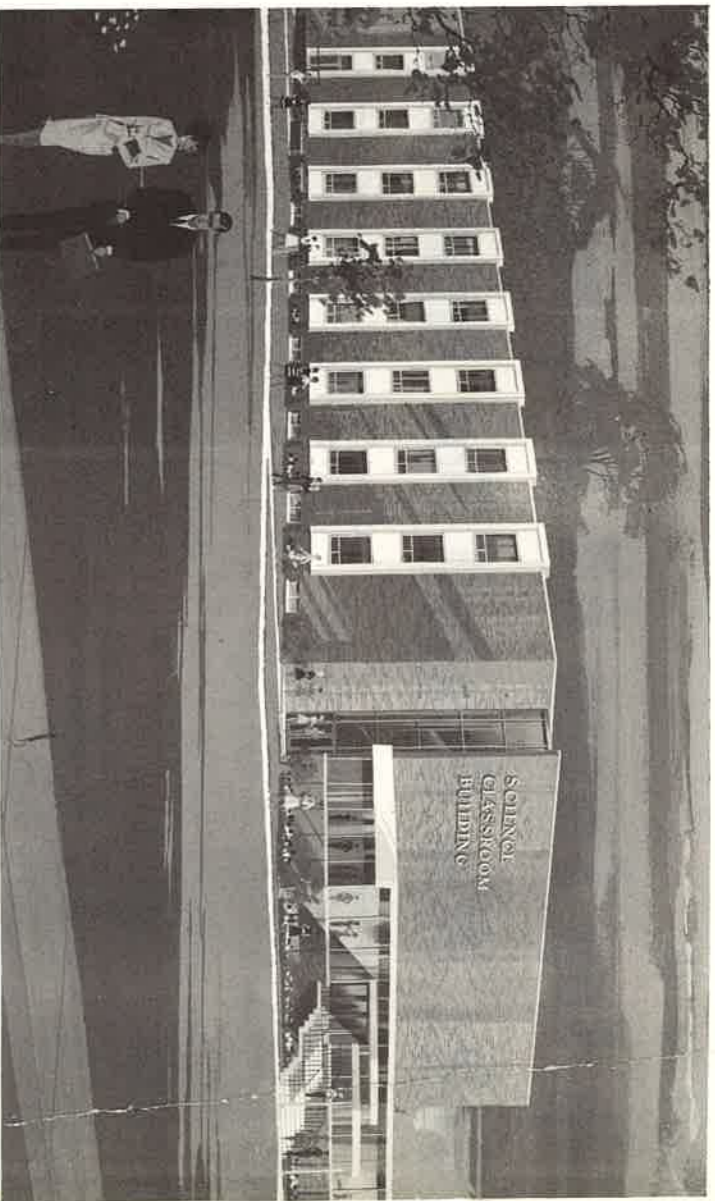
Little has already started on this project.
