DR. DALE-ELIZABETH PEHRSSON

Founding President, Pennsylvania Western University

As Pennsylvania Western University's chief executive, Dr. Dale's leadership extends to all of PennWest's physical locations and online operations. She leads an executive leadership team representing the university's nine divisions: Academic Affairs; Advancement; Athletics; Diversity, Equity and Inclusion; Finance; Institutional Effectiveness and Student Affairs; Strategic Initiatives and Administration; University Affairs; and Virtual and Global Education.

With student needs at the forefront of every decision, "Dr. Dale" is responsible for setting policies and procedures governing academic standards; employee rights (subject to collective bargaining agreements); university finances and contracts; and other administrative functions.

Through the chancellor, she reports to the Board of Governors for Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. Under Board policy, her recommendations in key areas are reviewed and approved by the Council of Trustees.

Dr. Dale joined the State System as Clarion University's president in 2018. She became interim president of Edinboro University in December 2020 and of California University of Pennsylvania in July 2021. She was the presidential lead for the Western Integration Project, which united those three universities to create PennWest.



DR. SCOTT E. MILLER

Vice President of Academic Affairs and Provost

As PennWest's chief academic officer, Dr. Miller is responsible for the personnel, budget and institutional effectiveness of the Academic Affairs division. He directs all academic programs, leads new program development and partners with other divisions to ensure quality academic support for students.

Dr. Miller leads a team that includes associate provosts for faculty affairs, graduate studies, and curriculum management; the deans, associate deans, and assistant deans of PennWest's six colleges; the library director; the registrar; and support staff. He works directly with Faculty Senate and other PennWest governance bodies, manages relationships and local negotiations with faculty union chapters and other unions, and monitors regional and specialized accreditations for the university and its academic programs.



JOHN WHEELER

Student Trustee

Representing the PennWest Edinboro community as the student representative on the PennWest Council of Trustees, John Wheeler will provide the trustee greetings in today's Commencement ceremony.

A native of Albion, Pa., Wheeler will graduate this fall with a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology and minor in Criminal Justice.

During his experience at Edinboro, Wheeler has represented Edinboro's student body as trustee since 2020. Additionally, he has served as advisor and executive officer for the Student Government Association, leader in the President's Leadership Academy and a member of the Edinboro University Honors College – now the PennWest Honors Program.

Wheeler has volunteered his time with New Student Orientation, Edinboro Highland Games, RAKE, Homecoming and the Edinboro Food Pantry.

In 2022, Wheeler earned the Dr. John Schell Award as the outstanding junior in Psychology. He has been named to the Dean's List since 2019 and has maintained a 4.0 GPA all four years at Edinboro.



MITCH KALLAY '90

Alumni Speaker

Representing the PennWest Edinboro Alumni Association in today's Commencement ceremony, Mitch Kallay '90, serves as association director of business relations for Organogenesis, Inc. located in Massachusetts.

In his current role, Kallay collaborates alongside Group Purchasing Organizations and Integrated Delivery Networks with medical devices and acute-care products.

Mitch has worked in several roles including Regional Sales Director, Reimbursement Manager and Corporate Accounts Director in the pharmaceutical and medical sales fields. During his time at Edinboro, Mitch was a member of Sigma Tau Gamma and served as Student Government Vice President.

Mitch has served as a member of the Alumni Association Board of Directors since 2003.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May 1981 Commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's status as a University.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Mace Bearer. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College by President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, 27 inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. Cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.



DR. SUSAN PACKARD Mace Bearer | PennWest Edinboro

Representing her faculty colleagues in academic regalia and holding the ceremonial mace at today's PennWest Edinboro Commencement is Dr. Susan Packard, retired professor in the Department of Counseling, School Psychology and Special Education.

Dr. Packard's distinction as mace bearer is symbolic of the central role that faculty play in the academic and personal development of Pennsylvania Western University students.

Dr. Packard served as full-time faculty member at Edinboro University from 2001 until her retirement in June 2022. She is a member of Chi Sigma Iota, the international and professional academic honor society for counseling students, counselor educators, and professional counselors, and served as Chapter Faculty Advisor of the Epsilon Chi Chapter.

Dr. Packard earned a Ph.D. in Counselor Education with a specialization in Rehabilitation Counseling from the State University of New York at Buffalo. Prior to her doctoral studies, Dr. Packard earned two degrees from Edinboro – a Master of Arts in Counseling with a concentration in Rehabilitation Counseling and a Bachelor of Arts in Social Science with a focus in Criminal Justice.

In 2015, she was recognized with the Edinboro University APSCUF Distinguished Service Award. She also served as vice chair of the President's LGBTQIA+ Commission and project director for a grant awarded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services.

Dr. Packard is a licensed psychologist, licensed professional counselor, certified rehabilitation counselor and master addictions counselor. She has extensive work experience in the fields of corrections and addictions treatment. Dr. Packard holds memberships in a variety of national- and state-level professional organizations, including the American Counseling Association.

ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The academic costume worn at American college exercises today dates back in its essential features to the Middle Ages. The oldest universities of northern Europe, such as Paris and Oxford, grew out of church schools. Students and faculty wore clerical garb, largely borrowed from the monastic dress of their day.

The head-covering of the academic costume developed out of the skull cap worn by the clergy in cold weather. In the universities, this skull cap acquired a point on top which gradually evolved into a tassel. In this country, it has been replaced by the familiar mortar-board, which still retains the medieval tassel.

The hood was originally worn over the head, and otherwise dropped onto the shoulders, like a cowl. Today, each college has its distinctively colored hood-lining, by which its graduates may be recognized in academic colors listed on the next page.

GOWNS

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctorate degree has bell-shaped sleeves and is faced down the front with velvet and three bars across the sleeves. The facing and crossbars of velvet may be of the color distinctive of the field to which the degree pertains.

HOODS

The hood is usually worn only for the master's and the doctorate degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

CAPS

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The doctoral cap is indicated by a tassel of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

COLORS DISTINCTIVE OF THE DISCIPLINES AND PROFESSIONS

Only a single degree from a single institution should ever be indicated by a single garment. For all academic purposes, including trimmings of doctors' gowns, edgings of hoods, and tassels of caps, the colors associated with the different subjects are as follows:
