The finishing touches are being put on one of the most elaborate productions ever to be presented by the College Players. *The Matchmaker*, which served as the basis for the musical hit *Hello Dolly*, will be presented November 4, 5 and 6, at 8:15 in Price Auditorium.

Very seldom is a comedy produced on the undergraduate level. In a recent interview, Dr. Denys Gary, who is directing the production, explained that a comic play can easily turn into a complete farce if the actors don't adhere strictly to the mood of the author. He described one rehearsal which deteriorated into a laughing siege for everyone.

Due to the nature of the play, the stage in Price Auditorium had to be extended over the orchestra

pit. Two large turn-tables have been constructed to swing the four basic backgrounds scenes into position between acts.

The action of the comedy centers around Mrs. Levi, who will be played by Chris Salidia. She enjoys playing cupid with her friends, but at the same time she succeeds in advancing her own romantic interests in Vanderghelder, being portrayed by Gary Robinson.

## Eagles Travel To Mansfield

Lock Haven travels to Mansfield on Saturday to try and rebound from a tough loss to Edinboro. Mansfield can't be considered as tough as Edinboro, but not many NIAA teams can be. Mansfield has a big team and this could pose some problems.

If the Eagles play as well as they did against Edinboro, however, the Eagles should have their fifth victory wrapped up by late Saturday afternoon. LHS still has a great deal of motivation remaining

for their last two games.

They are one of ten teams being considered for the Knute Rockne Bowl. Victories in their remaining two games would give LHS a good claim to that bowl, while a loss in either one would probably eliminate them from consideration. Along with the incentive of a bowl game is the drive for a 6 and 2 season. This would be especially rewarding since most of the "expert's" pre-season polls predicted that Lock Haven State wouldn't win a game.

## LHS Football Division Changed

Lock Haven State has been transferred from University Division to College Division status in the NCAA according to an official announcement made yesterday by Athletic Director Steven Jacobs.

The LHS wrestling team now will enter the NCAA College-Division Wrestling Tournament next March 2-3-4 at Oswego, New York.

Top three place winners at this big toumey will be eligible to compete the following weekend at the University-Division NCAA Tournament scheduled

for University of Maryland, March 9-10-11.

According to the NCAA News one of LHS' top wrestling rivals, Clarion State College, also has transferred to College-Division status along with Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Winona State. Already in the College-Division for the past several years are two other top Pennsylvania Conference wrestling powers, Slippery Rock State and East Stroudsburg State.

LHS also holds membership in the Pennsylvania Conference, ECAC, and NIAA.
