Coupons can be used with the Club Card, for bigger savings.

Teachers and customers have been donating money to Avenue 209, a coffee shop located on Bellefonte Ave., which has been helping to raise awareness for Haiti the first few days after the disaster. Local bands are performing shows at the

coffee shop and all proceeds go to the cause.

"We encourage everyone to donate and help in the relief. Even though we're a small coffee shop, we want to change the world," said James Reyes, a student at Lock Haven University and a worker at Avenue 209.

On Feb. 13, Jared Conti, an LHU and Avenue 209 worker, will perform with his band, The Jared and Anthony Show, at the coffee shop with all donations going to the American Red Cross.

Also, \$1 million will be given to the

"We are devastated by the recent loss of life caused by the earthquake in Haiti," stated Howard Schultz, chairman and CEO, Starbucks Coffee Co. to the Starbucks Newsroom on the company's website. "We feel a tremendous sense of urgency to respond to the humanitarian crisis."

Aikey and Duffield then got into a physical confrontation. Aikey supposedly had a knife, which led to Duffield pulling out a 9mm Smith and Wesson firearm and shooting Aikey outside of the apartment.

Duffield has been charged with the felony of delivery of a controlled substance, possession with the intent to deliver a controlled substance and criminal conspiracy-delivery of a controlled substance, the Lock Haven Express said.

## The best deal in town: Walmart vs. Weis

Emily Madrak, a sophomore at Lock Haven University, goes to the local Wal-Mart with her roommates once a week, and considers herself a devoted Wal-Mart shopper.

"Always low prices. Always! Madrak joked.

"They have generic brands that are even cheaper than the other generics," she added.

The other generics Madrak was referring to were those at Weis Supermarkets.

"I definitely think [Wal-Mart] is cheaper. I'd much rather travel the distance to Wal-Mart than walk to Weis," she said.

However, fellow student Nicolette Carothers disagrees with Madrak.

"I go to Weis because it's closer to campus than Wal-Mart is," she said.

Carothers then added, "I feel like even if Wal-Mart is a little cheaper, it would come to the same after you factored in gas money. I live in Evergreen, so I can just walk to Weis."

Weis employee of three years, Jaci Marshall also disagrees.

"I shop here [Weis] for food, and I go to Wal-Mart for paper towels and things to get the best deal," she said.

Although grocery shopping may not be the most exciting thing to debate over, it is a necessary part of life, and with the economy the way it is, people are looking to save money in any way they can.

So where can Lock Haven students and residents find the best bang for their buck?

The answer is Wal-Mart Supercenters, by \$1.51.

Two identical grocery orders consisting 19 items of mostly generic brands were purchased at Weis Markets and Wal-Mart Supercenter.

While Wal-Mart was the winner, only ten of the 19 items were cheaper there.

Some of these things included coffee, fruits and veggies, and bottled water.

Eight items, includ-

ing cereal, pasta and chicken, were cheaper at Weis.

Milk shared the price of \$3.08 at both stores.

The biggest difference between the two stores was on Lays Brand Potato chips, with Weis carrying the item for 99 cents more than Wal-Mart.

Close behind was butter, which was 93 cents cheaper at Weis, and salad mix which was 73 cents cheaper at Wal-Mart.

Other than that, items were cheaper by 50 cents or less.

April Crust, a Wal-

Mart employee of almost a year, says she isn't convinced that Wal-Mart will always give you the better deal.

"I can't say if one store or the other is cheaper," she said, even after looking at the data.

"I bet you could do the same thing next week, and come up with Weis as the cheaper store. I know bread is usually more expensive here, but right now, it's not. It really just depends on the item and the day," she said.

## Students opt for book renting option

More and more colleges are looking into textbook buyback program instead of renting books from the school bookstore.

Ask almost any college student what they think of buying textbooks, and you will surely be met with a groan and an eye-roll.

It is no secret that one of the more stressful parts of the beginning of the semester is buying the load of textbooks that professors require. While textbooks are an extremely important instructional tool, it is such a hardship for students to have to pay so much for them. That is why many colleges have adopted a textbook rental program.

Instead of having students pay full price for their books, they have the option of buying the books, new or used, and then returning them to the bookstore for a portion of their money back. This takes some of the sting off of the price that college students have to pay for books.

According to the National Association of College Stores, the average price of a college textbook is \$57. Now, this may not seem like much at first. But say you need a textbook for each of your five classes. Multiply 57 by 5 and it comes out to \$285. And this is just the average price -- there are many

more expensive books out there.

Textbook costs can come out to be over \$400. Put that on top of tuition and room/board, and college students truly have a lot on their hands. By instituting a textbook buyback program or a book rental program, students can save a little bit of the money they will need to spend on other aspects of college life.

Across the country, many schools have instituted some sort of rental program for textbooks. Many websites offer less expensive textbooks or deals on books. The bookstore at LHU offers a textbook buyback program at the end of every semester. Students can bring their used books to the bookstore and get a portion of their money back.

Senior Kate Bobbie thinks that the program is a good idea. "It's convenient to get rid of the books I know I'll never use again, and a lot easier than selling them online. That's just too much work for me."

Many students agree that it is extremely convenient. However, there are some negative aspects to a textbook buyback program. Sophomore Kathryn Shebeck said that she feels that students often get "ripped off" because they do not get a lot of money back for the books. Sometimes, though, students often feel

that any little bit back helps.

Sophomore Andrew Brake also gave his input about the textbook buyback program. "It helps to keep the brunt of the cost for books off of the students. Whereas the textbook publishing monopoly keeps increasing the costs of production without considering the economic situations the students come from. \$600 or more for new textbooks every semester is ridiculous," he said.

Brake also added, "If the SCC's buyback program can save a student anywhere from \$20 to \$100, that's money that can go to other essential things like school supplies."

Overall, the buyback program has been mostly beneficial to students. By using this program, students can gain back a little bit of the money that they spent on their textbooks.

Many students do take advantage of the program, as evidenced by the packed bookstore at the end of each semester shows. Consider selling books back to the bookstore at the end of the semester. In many students' opinions, it is much easier than having to worry about selling them online, and you do not have to go very far to do it. With more and more colleges taking advantage of programs like these, students' lives are being made easier.

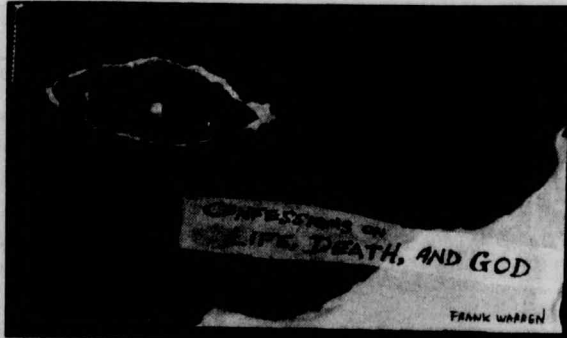

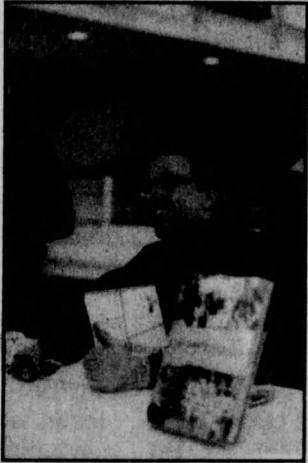

disease. Lastly, there is a Fight Back Ceremony. This is a time when people make personal commitments to fighting the disease throughout the year.

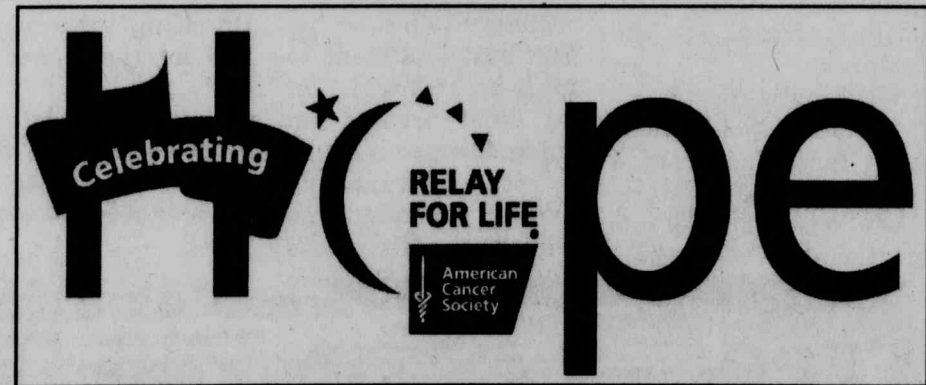
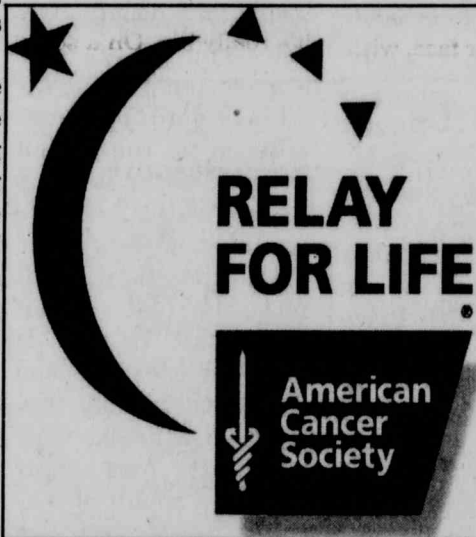
But why do people Relay? What fun is it to walk around a track for hours on end?

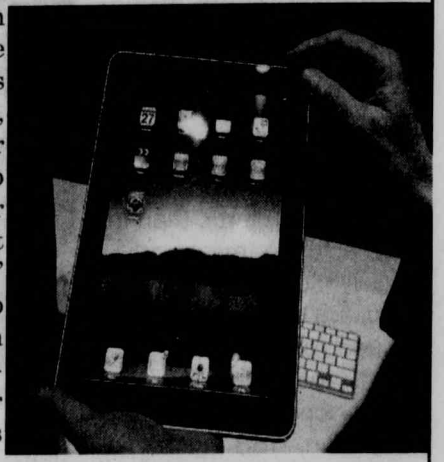
# Apple iPad: hit or miss for the college crowd?

The Apple iPad is said to be the most revolutionary device since the iPod or various smart phones such as the iPhone or the Google Droid. As Steve

Jobs said when unveiling the iPad, "It's unbelievable, its way better than a laptop and way better than a smart phone." Though, is also said to be in another category of consumer electronics altogether.

The iPad can stream music and videos, view pictures, surf the web with WiFi and 3G capabilities, read e-books downloaded from the iBook store, and download many more applications off of the Apple Store.

Even though the format of the iPad and iPod touch, Apple stated that the iPad can do much more with applications than the iPod touch. The screen is bigger which makes it possible to navigate easier through websites and read text. The keyboard is the same in which many consumers complained about in the past, as it is "hard to use and very sensitive." Apple will release an external keyboard which will be a docking station and charge the iPad while it is in use.

USB is a challenge to many users because the consumer must purchase an external port in order to use other devices which connect via USB.

The iPad gives a great gaming experience as the user can use the touch screen to

The iPad sounds great, but it comes with some downsides as well.

Many users complain that Flash is not compatible with the iPad, which is necessary for browsing many websites leaving website access slightly limited.

Google maps make it easy for the iPad user to get from one place to the other. There are satellite views to help a person plan out where to go. Unfortunately, the iPad is not GPS compatible. The only way it can find your location is with the WiFi hotspots or 3G network.

The iPad's cost starts at \$499 but costs about \$150 extra for the built in 3G network. Along with that, the 3G network costs an additional \$30 a month. Depending on hard drive space and 3G capabilities, the price range is between \$499 - \$899. Apple made an agreement with AT&T to provide 3G coverage to Apple iPad users.

While most will be looking for a hearty laugh or something to talk about around the water-cooler on Monday morning, CBS has alone transformed the stereotypical advertisement wonderland into a pedestal of moral debate with a single ad.

"Celebrate Family, Celebrate Life" is the name; pro-life is the game, or rather the position in this 30 second advertisement by Focus on the Family, a well-known Christian organization. Not only did this ad spark controversy, but it also led many in the nation to wonder why certain ads make the cut and others do not.

While Focus on the Family has not released many details about the video, including any footage, the ad will fea-

ture former Florida quarterback Tim Tebow, and his mother, Pam. In 1987, Tebow's mother became pregnant, and when she got sick during a trip to the Philippines, she declined her option

to abort her pregnancy, ignoring doctor recommendations.

The story is of the inspiring sort, as Tebow grew up, ended high school with various NCAA, Southeastern conference, and school records, and eventually won the 2007 Heisman Trophy. It's a story that many pro-life activists strive to have, because it gives a good answer to the question, "What if Tim Tebow had never been born?"

Jim Daly, President and CEO of Focus on the Family, told New York Times reporter Connor Ennis, this com-

mercial is coming at a time when "families need to be inspired."

"Tim and Pam share our respect for life and our passion for families to thrive," Daly continued. "Focus on the

Family is about strengthening families by empowering them with the tools they need to live lives rooted in morals and values."

Ads of this size ranged in price from \$2.5-\$2.8 million. According to Daly, the group used donations from "generous friends" and no money was taken

from the general fund of the organization.

CBS approved the ad, received the payment, and all was fine until another organization came along wanting to promote their cause.

Ever hear of Mancrunch.com? Not many in this world have until this week.

ManCrunch is a dating site targeting gay men. The group is relatively new and looking to increase their numbers. So, naturally, they want a spot in Super Bowl advertising.

The ad is this: two men watching the Super Bowl. Their hands meet

at the potato chip bowl, which instigates a glance. Then, that sparks a male-on-male make-out session while a friend overlooks, puzzled.

The ad was rejected by CBS, sparking more controversy than chemistry, and leaving many wondering why one side of the political spectrum was given air time and the other not.

According to CBS, the ad was rejected due to financial concerns.

But, with every reason, comes a plethora of "between the lines" assumptions by viewers. Elissa Butcher, a spokeswoman for the site, told CNN "It's straight up discrimination."

CBS declined to comment on the accusation, which raised eyebrows all the more.

In the letter of decline given to Butcher, CBS stated that the ad did not fall "within the network's broadcast standards for Super Bowl Sunday" and "has had difficulty verify-

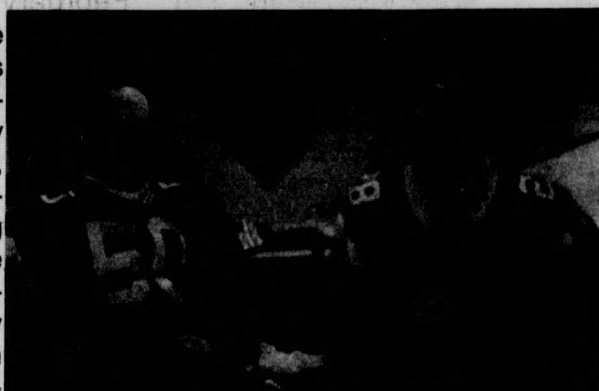
ing ManCrunch's credit account," CNN's Aaron Smith reported.

## Lock Haven Top 10: town's history surprises

To most LHU students, Lock Haven, population of 8,541, isn't one of the most exciting places. But, there are the selected few who beg to differ.

"Lock Haven is a fascinating place and a lot of people don't realize that," said Lou Bernard, curator of the Clinton County Historical Society. "It is a place of all sorts of mysteries and adventures."

Believe it or not, Bernard is right. Here are ten facts that may actually make the average student reconsider the next time you refer to "the Haven" as boring.

1. "Rain of Fire" - According to Bernard, Lock Haven was "baptized with a meteor shower," just nine days after the town was founded in 1833. Although this meteor shower, called the Leonid Meteor Shower, occurs about every 33 years, the "Rain of Fire" as it was later referred to, was the biggest.

2. "Fascinating Founder" - The founder of Lock Haven, Jerry Church, was actually kicked out of school at the age of thirteen for trying to kiss his teacher.

"He never really grew out of that," said Bernard. Church also built an elaborate tree house, around where Robb Elementary now stands. "The tree house, where Church went to play his violin, was said to have had a spiral staircase."

3. "Follow the North Star" - Lock Haven was a stop on the Underground Railroad. Maria Molson, a black woman

and resident of the city for 45 years, used her home as a refuge for runaway slaves. According to Molson's obituary published in the "The Clinton Republican" in 1890, Molson used to bandage the backs of the runaways who had received whippings just a few days prior to escaping. Molson's home still stands on 19 East Water Street.

4. "Shiver me Timbers" - Lock Haven was home to a retired pirate. James Jefferies, who retired from his life at sea in 1810, bought \$9,000 worth of land in Lock Haven. His house, on 400 East Bald Eagle Street, still stands as well. Jefferies' son was also the mayor of Lock Haven.

5. "Diplomatic Connections" - The William Mayer House, also known as the TKE house, was owned by a Lock Haven merchant. However, this merchant happened to know Abraham Lincoln personally.

In fact, Mayer worked for Lincoln during the Civil War, as a paymaster in the United States Navy. Also, Lou Bernard said that Jimmy Carter loved Lock Haven, a place where he came to fish.

6. "Crowned Connections" - the Fallon, named after the Fallon brothers, was built for the Queen of Spain. Although the Queen never did make it there, Mark Twain and P.T. Barnum were both guests in the hotel.

While the queen's mansion no longer stands, a piece of it still remains. A window from the mansion was used in the Griffin House, located on 104 West Water Street.

7. "Adulterous Arson" - Lock Haven was once home to the longest covered bridge. That however, isn't the exciting part. The bridge burned down in 1919. The fire was ruled an arson, and although no one was ever arrested, the police looked long and hard for a scorned woman.

"[They were looking for] a woman whose husband was having an affair on the other side of the bridge," said Bernard.

8. "Courageous Cop" - Lock Haven only had one police officer killed in the line of duty. Robert Probst was killed in 1934 by Harry Mayo. Mayo spent twenty years in jail.

9. "Singing Soldier" - Lock Haven was home to the first integrated soldier. William "Billy" Raymond was the first black man to fight with an all white unit. Raymond was also an opera singer, and was good friends with Ethel Barrymore, a relative of Drew Barrymore.

10. "Messy Move" - Great Island Presbyterian Church, the oldest congregation in Lock Haven, moved their cemetery, in what can be best described as a "messy move." A 12-foot marble tombstone was one of the things that went missing.

That's not the only thing that went missing during the move.

"People will sometimes find bones when they're installing pools," said Bernard.

If anyone is interested in learning more about the city, they can visit the Clinton County Historical Society, located on 362 East Water Street.

## LHU celebrates MLK

Students, staff, and faculty gathered at Lock Haven University to celebrate the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with guest speaker Mr. Jim Lucas, on Wednesday in Price Auditorium.

Jim Lucas is recognized across the nation for his dramatic recitations depicting the life and heroic actions of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Lucas is an advocate of Dr. King's philosophy of non-violent civil rights action to effect social change. Aug. 1983 is when Lucas got his inspiration to learn and recite Dr. King's speeches at the 20th Anniversary of the March on Washington.

Lucas spoke about his large family of 4 brothers and 6 sisters, who were shocked one afternoon by their

father's wishes and blessings for them to register to vote. At the time, it was almost impossible for a black man to be considered a registered voter, because the people in charge would make sure black citizens did not pass the test even if they had to lie. If someone were chosen to be the lucky few that did pass, they normally lost their jobs as a result of it.

"I never saw my mother so afraid. Everything we owned is mortgaged our farm, our farm house everything down to our furniture," said Lucas.

Lucas's father was the only black salesman in their town at the time. The morning Lucas's father went to register, he put on his best suit and went to his boss, and said, "On my lunch break I am going down to register to vote and wanted to know if I should come back." His boss

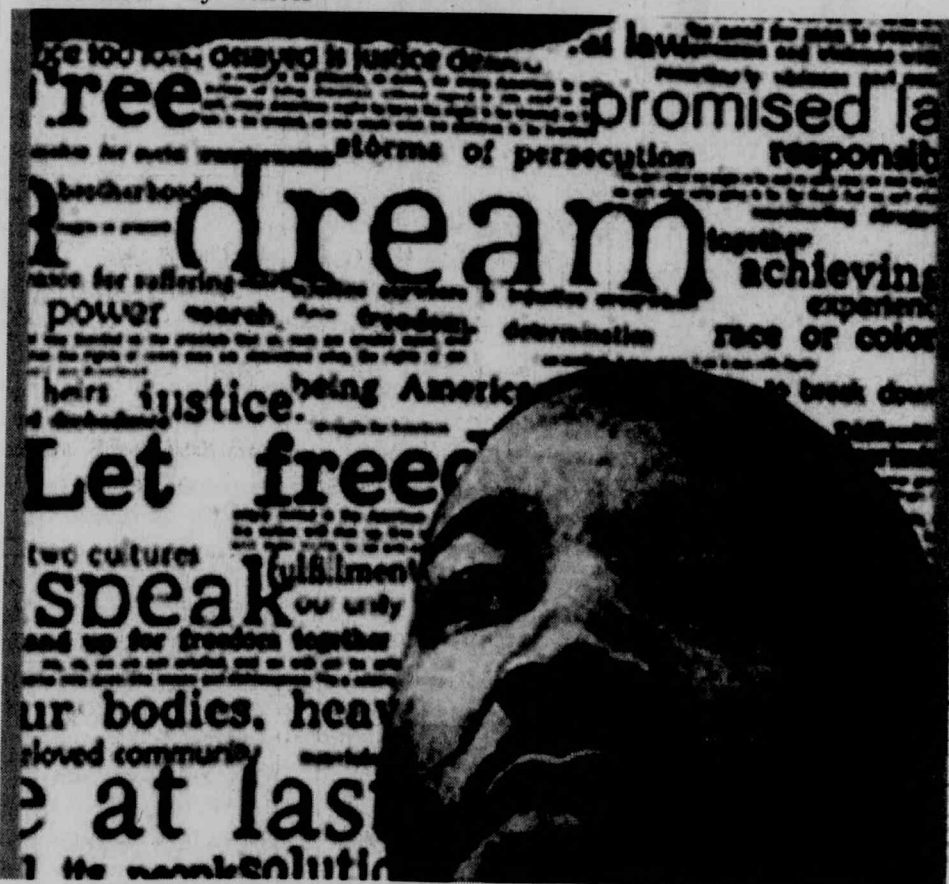
replied, "You take your time down there and when you are all done, you come on back."

"To this day we still own our family farm," said Lucas.

Sharon E. Taylor, Director of athletics at LHU reflected on Lucas's performance and said, "He captured Dr. King and made transitions marvelous. Lucas was the best I ever heard and I really hope the students enjoyed it."

Another observer Dr. Linda D. Koch, Vice President, Student Affairs said, "I thought it was excellent! Lucas captured the essence of what Dr. King was about. I was so grateful the student body got to hear him speak. Let's not lose the gift Dr. King gave to us and let the legacy go on."

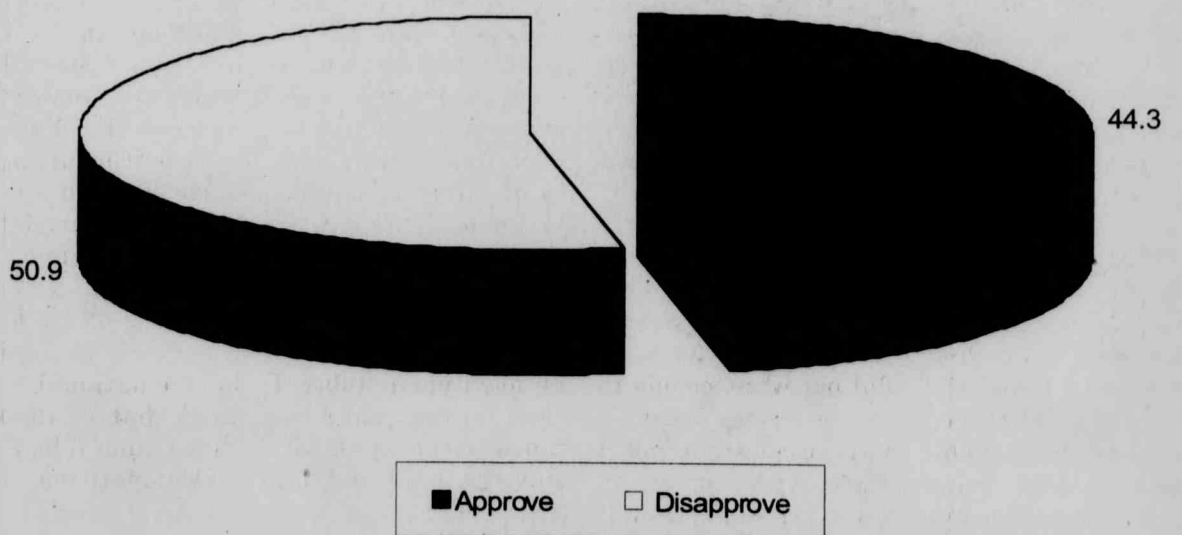

# American Red Cross sponsors blood drive on campus

On Wednesday LHU students, faculty and community members came to the PUB multipurpose room to donate their blood to the American Red Cross. Some of the volunteers were first time donors, while others had given their blood to the Red Cross before.

The students and others that decided to give their blood started by signing up either before hand with an appointment at a certain time, while others signed up at the table in the PUB on Wednesday. The donors were given reading material that explained what would happen during their time donating and

also what would exclude them from donating their blood.

The donors were also required to drink a bottle of water while reading the materials. After their names were called, they then sat in another line until a station with a medical technician was available. After the donor was called to a private station, they then had their temperature taken, blood pressure tested and their iron was tested as well.

After these tests were conducted, the donor was then required to answer questions about their personal activities that would not allow them to donate their blood: some being getting a tattoo recently or going abroad.

Once these steps were completed, the

donor was then taken to a table where they would be setup to have their blood taken. The donor laid on the table as they were instructed to squeeze a small instrument to help the blood flow out of the arm better. Once the donor got on the table,

the process took about 15 minutes before they were done.

The donor was then escorted, by one of the many volunteers, to a table that was filled with cookies and other treats. The donor was able to recover from donating at this picture and could also eat

pizza that was provided by Bentley.

The donors left with a feeling that they did their part to help others in their community.

"I've donated blood before and it always feels good to give blood. I know someone who gave blood

and they were telling me about how they saw a picture of a girl whose life was saved by donated blood, so it always gives me a good feeling," said sophomore Dave Lagerman, who is a frequent blood donor.

LHU will be hoping for a victory when they take on Bucknell University on Friday, Feb. 5 at 7:30 p.m.

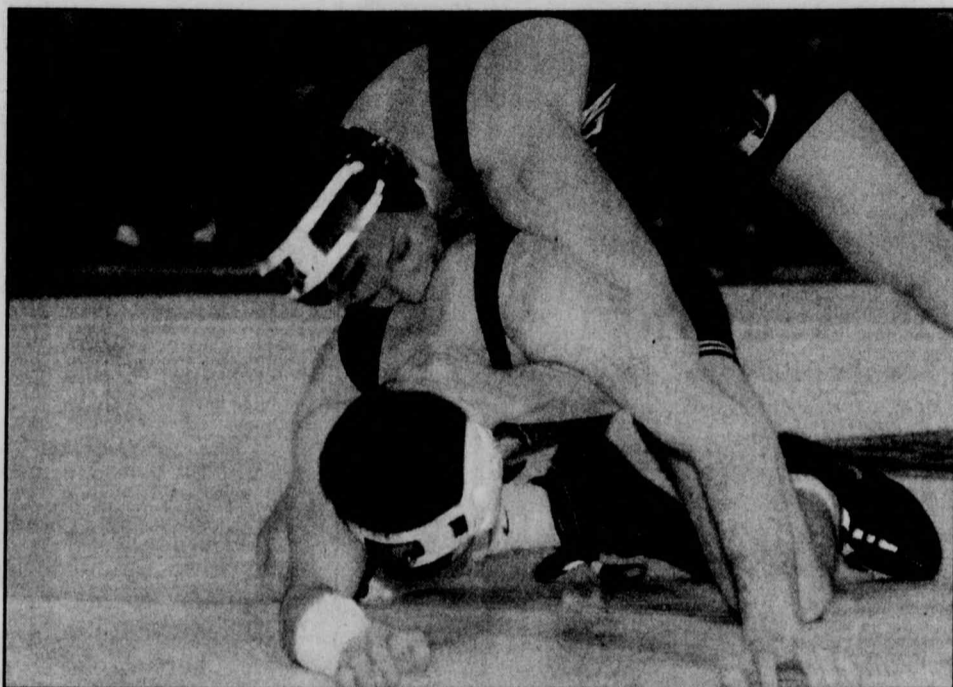

Highlighting the results last night was Sarah Navarro's (Milford, Del./Delaware Valley) 100 butterfly time trial. In her last attempt to qualify for

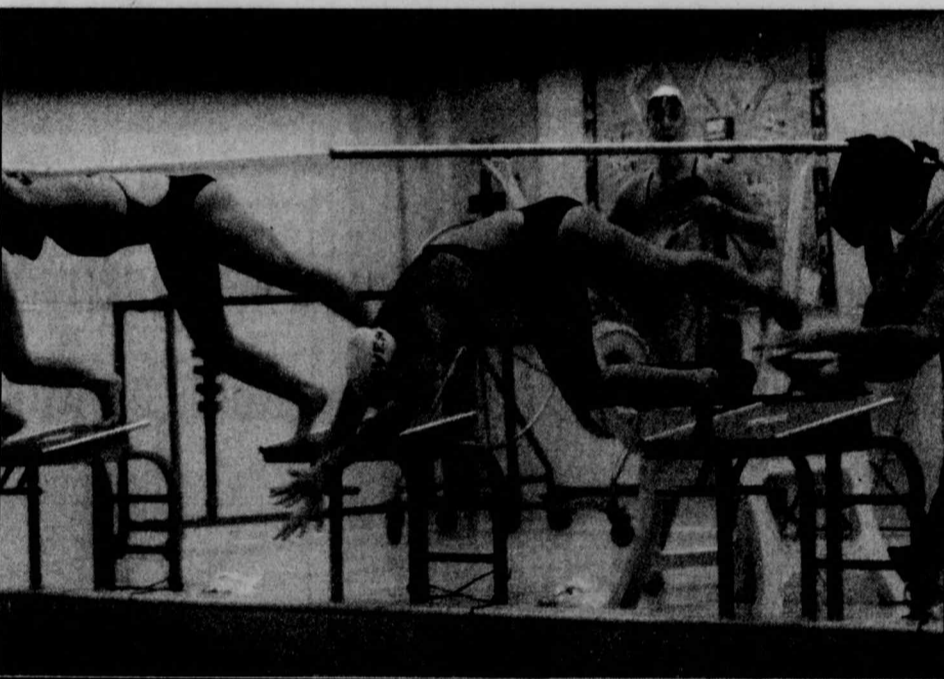

Moses turned in a huge performance in the weight throw at PSU.

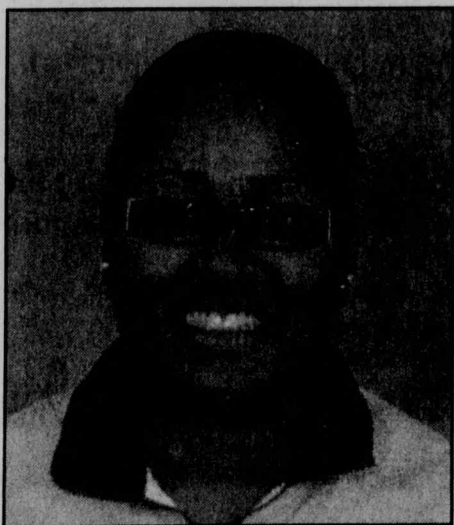

## Who will take home the Lombardi Trophy in 2010?

So here it is, Super Bowl XLIV. Every football fan is waiting to see a great offensive matchup between the two teams who nearly went undefeated in the regular season.

Obviously, the New Orleans Saints and Indianapolis Colts both have solid offenses, being led by great quarterbacks who have earned the respect of their teammates and coaching staffs.

Of course, the outcome of this Super Bowl will not be decided by Drew Brees or Peyton Manning alone; it will ultimately come down to which defense can get it done.

The Saints defense has not been nearly as strong as the Colts this season, although Manning's 16 interceptions this season

The Saints will need to shutdown Clark for sure. He's a lethal weapon in the short passing game especially on screen pass plays and inside the red zone, an area the Colts offense has no problem getting to.

New Orleans would most likely have a better chance of stopping the tight end setting up in a 3-3-5 or 3-2-6

defensive formation, putting more coverage on Clark and Wayne.

In order to keep Manning guessing, a blitz here and there wouldn't hurt.

A lot rests on the shoulders of Saints defensive coordinator, Gregg Williams at this point. The way in which he runs the defense on Sunday will be the deciding factor in who takes home the win.

The Indianapolis defense could struggle with defensive end Dwight Freeney not being at 100 percent after his ankle injury. If he does play, which the Colts say he will, he will most likely not play the whole game.

And then there is the running game, which the Colts are lacking in, ranking 32nd in rushing yards in the regular season. The Saints however ranked 6th.

Reggie Bush has been a surprisingly good asset to New Orleans in the post-season averaging over seven and a half yards per carry after sitting out for a long portion of the regular season.

Like everyone else, I expect a good offensive battle in this year's game, but I'm more interested in seeing what defense has what it takes to take home the Lombardi trophy.

In all honesty, I personally would like to see the Saints take home a Super Bowl victory; not only because they've never had one, but also because of the joy it would bring to the city of New Orleans who still suffer after

Katrina.

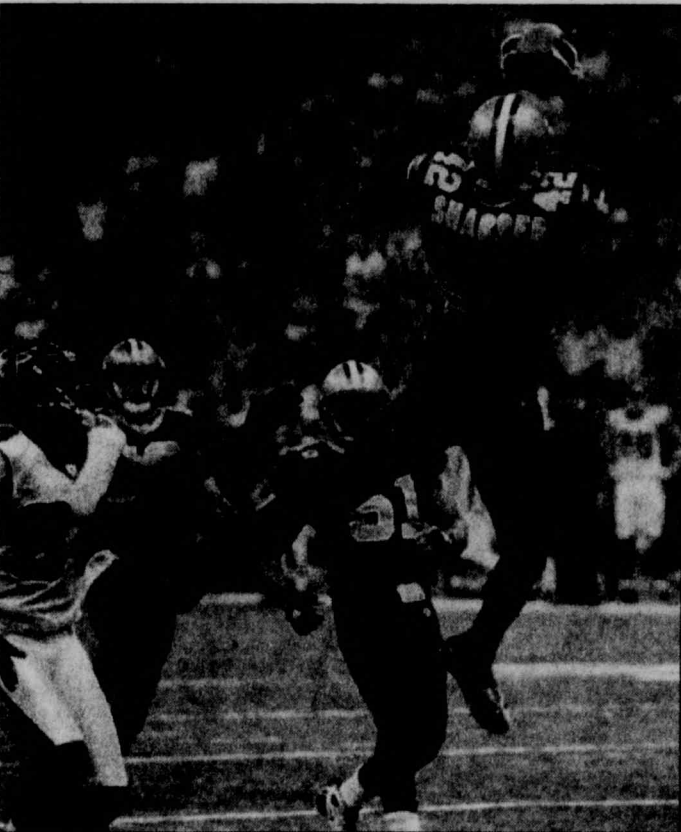
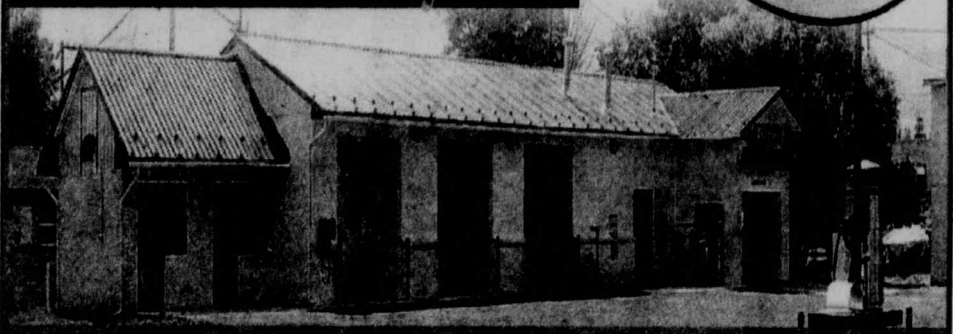

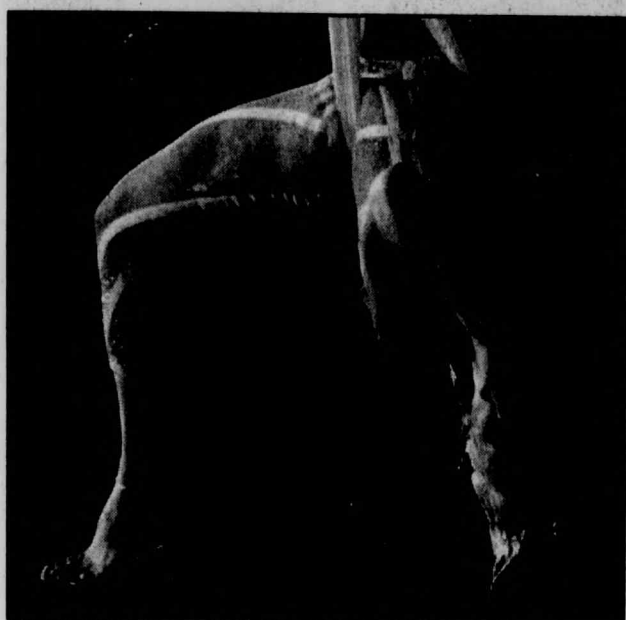

### Remake to go to Haiti

Almost 25 years to the date, music producer Quincy Jones and Grammy winning artist Lionel Richie are getting back together to remake the 1985 four-time platinum hit "We Are the World."

Unfortunately, it's not just because it's an anniversary.

With the 7.0 magnitude earthquake that rocked the island of Haiti this past month, the project of redoing the song quickly took a turn to help raise money for those in need.

Just like in 1985, an all-star cast of singers is going to be assembled into one sound stage for a good cause. The original song has raised over \$63 million to date for humanitarian aid, including selling 20 million copies worldwide.

Hopefully the remake can do just as good for helping raise money for Haiti.

According to the Hollywood Reporter, numerous singers that

attended the Grammy's were requested to stay an extra night to participate in the recording this past Monday at the Nokia Theater in Los Angeles, California.

The original song starred 45 of the biggest names in music at the time singing verses including Michael Jackson, Dianna Ross, Bruce Springsteen, Stevie Wonder, Ray Charles, Huey Lewis, Cindy Lauper, Bob Dylan, Willie Nelson, Billy Joel and Kenny Rogers, among others.

According to Smokey Robinson, who was one of the backing vocalists of the original song, none of those that participated in 1985 will be returning for the new re-make.

The song is set to have over 70 of today's biggest and most popular artists along with some of the big names of yesteryear. Some of those who will be singing include Jordin Sparks, Kanye West, Brian Wilson of the Beach Boys, Lil Wayne, Rob Thomas, Usher, Keri Hilson, 1970's funk band Earth, Wind and Fire, Brandy, Celine Dion, Snoop Dogg, Pink, Gladys Knight and Will.i.am.

Janet Jackson is rumored to be singing her brother, Michael's, verse. "The King of Pop" was instrumental in helping write and organize the original song with Richie.

One singer who will be more emotionally charged than perhaps any other is Wyclef Jean, who has already been active in helping raise money to

Haiti, his home country. When Jean heard of the remake and was called to help, he knew right away he had to be involved.

"I'm gonna go put some Haitian-influence sounds on it," Jean told reporters Monday. Another Haiti native that is excited for the remake is "Heroes" star Jimmy Jean-Louis, who will be participating in the song.

"I was in Haiti to visit my parents and my friends and family, and what I saw there was just devastat-

ing, so I'm happy the world is coming together so we can rebuild Haiti," Jean-Louis told reporters Monday. "I'm very happy to be here [recording "We Are the World"], but very sad deep inside, because my country is completely gone. And hopefully, this is a great start to rebuild my nation."

The video and song will debut on NBC on February 12 during the opening ceremony of the 2010 Winter Olympics, according to BBC News.

# Ke\$ha's using her 'Animal' instincts

Kesha Rose Sebert, born March 1, 1987, has been striving to make a name for herself in music way before she started brushing her teeth with a bottle of Jack. Now known as the stylized Ke\$ha (pronounced KESH-ah), this 22-year-old has become every American party girl's favorite new artist.

She began her career in 2005 by working hard and handing out demos, but she didn't achieve her first real breakthrough until 2009, when her vocals were featured in Flo-Rida's smash hit "Right Round."

Her own single, "Tik Tok", hit radio waves in August of 2009, and reached number one in five countries. It quickly became the anthem for young females associated with going out, getting drunk, and loving every minute. It has had TV placements in Project Runway promo spots, Melrose Place and So You Think You Can Dance.

Her album, "Animal", debuted at number one in the U.S. upon its Jan. 5, 2010 release. The singer/songwriter's album was executive produced by Dr. Luke (Katy Perry, Britney Spears, Kelly Clarkson, and Avril Lavigne) and includes collaborations with producers Max Martin and Benny Blanco.

Ke\$ha's website [http://www.keshaparty.com] boasts the story of how she went on an adventure to try to persuade Prince to produce her first album: "She found out his address and drove to his Beverly Hills home, where she paid the gardener five dollars to let her squeeze herself under his front

gate. Then she hiked up the driveway (which was lined in purple velvet), let herself in through an unlocked side door, and rode the mirrored elevator up to the third floor where the Purple One himself was jamming with his band. 'It was kind of awkward,' she recalls, 'but who cares, right? So I sat on one of the purple thrones in the room until he noticed me, which he finally did. He was like, 'How the hell did you get in here?'" she says with a laugh. 'His security kicked me out, but not before I left him my demo CD wrapped in a giant purple bow.'

Prince never contacted her, but the experience says it all about Ke\$ha's determination to break into the industry. "I've always known I wanted to be a performer," she says. "There's a video of me at age five, naked and covered in body paint, saying, 'I'm going to be a rock star and there's no way anyone is going to stop me!' It's my call-

bring Ke\$ha to performances in L.A., and later encouraged her daughter to sing, while also teaching her how to write songs. "One of my first memories is my mom telling me, 'If you want something, just take it,'" the singer says. The family (which also included Ke\$ha's two older brothers, Lagan and Louis) struggled financially for years, and had to resort to welfare and food stamps.

After they moved back to Pebe's native Nashville, Ke\$ha spent a lot of time in recording studios when she wasn't attending classes in a Tennessee countryside music school.

Ke\$ha quit high school at 17 to return to L.A. to pursue music full-time. She left behind the path she had been on to study psychology at Columbia, a choice she says was "crazy," but obviously paid off.

That was when she met Dr. Luke and got the shot she had been

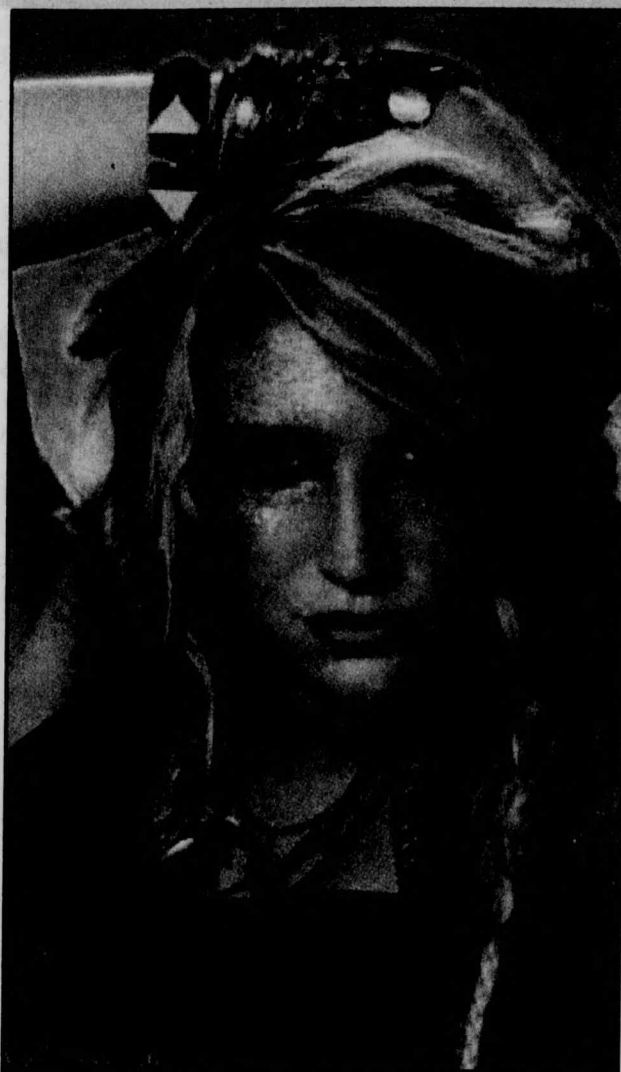
with Toby Gad, sang background vocals for Britney Spears' song "Lace and Leather," and appeared in the video for Katy Perry's single, "I Kissed a Girl." Kesha later supported Calvin Harris on tour in the UK and toured with Mickey Avalon in the US. She performed at Madison Square Garden on December 11, 2009 for the Z100 Jingle Ball. She has been announced as one of the acts for the 2010 revival of Lilith Fair and also presented at the 52nd Grammy Awards with Justin Bieber.

Animal received mixed reviews from critics, and sold 152,000 copies in its first U.S. week. It was seven years in the making; Ke\$ha had accumulated over 200 songs, with 14 making the final cut.

It has been described as "an edgy collection of hard-hitting electro-pop songs, made all the more irresistible by their high-octane punk energy and Ke\$ha's irreverent lyrics and attitude." Ke\$ha herself says, "I want my music to be fun, unapologetic, rowdy, quirky, humorous, and interesting, but with substance behind it. I'm an emotional person underneath all my fronting. I want people to listen to it and feel like they can relate."

Most of the tracks are based on Ke\$ha's actual life experiences; for example, "Party at a Rich Dude's House" is about the time Ke\$ha threw up in a closet during a party at Paris Hilton's pad, "Backstabber" is about a friend she used to have who tried to secretly bring her down, and "Kiss N Tell" relates to when she found out her boyfriend was cheating on her with a famous pop starlet.

In actuality, Ke\$ha isn't all about the constant party scene. The title track on the

album, which emulates artists like Flaming Lips and Arcade Fire, is the direction she would like to pursue for her next CD.

Above all that, Ke\$ha told the Herald Sun that "whether people like me or not, I just don't care." She also stated that she was on a "one-woman war against pretension" and that she felt people cared too much about how they appeared.

On her party girl image and fashion sense, she chalks it up to comfort with a "garbage-chic" flair. She doesn't mind being compared to artists such as Lady Gaga, because they are successful. "I'll take that," she says.

She's not looking to be a new role model either. "I do think it's an important thing that happiness and the amount of money you have are mixed. There's absolutely no correlation, because the happiest times of my entire life have been when I didn't

have \$2." She credits the dollar sign in her name to those broke days. She's simply being ironic, because she doesn't place an emphasis on earning money. She has a dollar sign tattooed on her hand for the same reason.

The idea came about after she didn't receive a dime for her part in "Right Round" because she was never credited. She's not bitter about that, however.

"When I first heard my voice on 'Right Round' on the radio, I started screaming and crying. I may seem kind of crazy, but behind it all I have my s\*\*\*t together. I'm working really hard to make this happen and it's nice to see that hard work pay off. I mean, three years ago I was stealing canned vegetables from the dollar store to survive. Now ... to be able to take my mom out to dinner is the best feeling in the world."
