Student Cooperative Council

The Student Cooperative Council is the student governing group on the campus. Each student is a member. The powers of legislative action are invested in the Board of Directors. This Board consists of the president of the Cooperative Council, the representatives of the four classes, and a representative of every organization on the campus.

The biggest problem of the Board of Directors is to allot the money from the student activity fees to the various organizations on campus according to their needs. 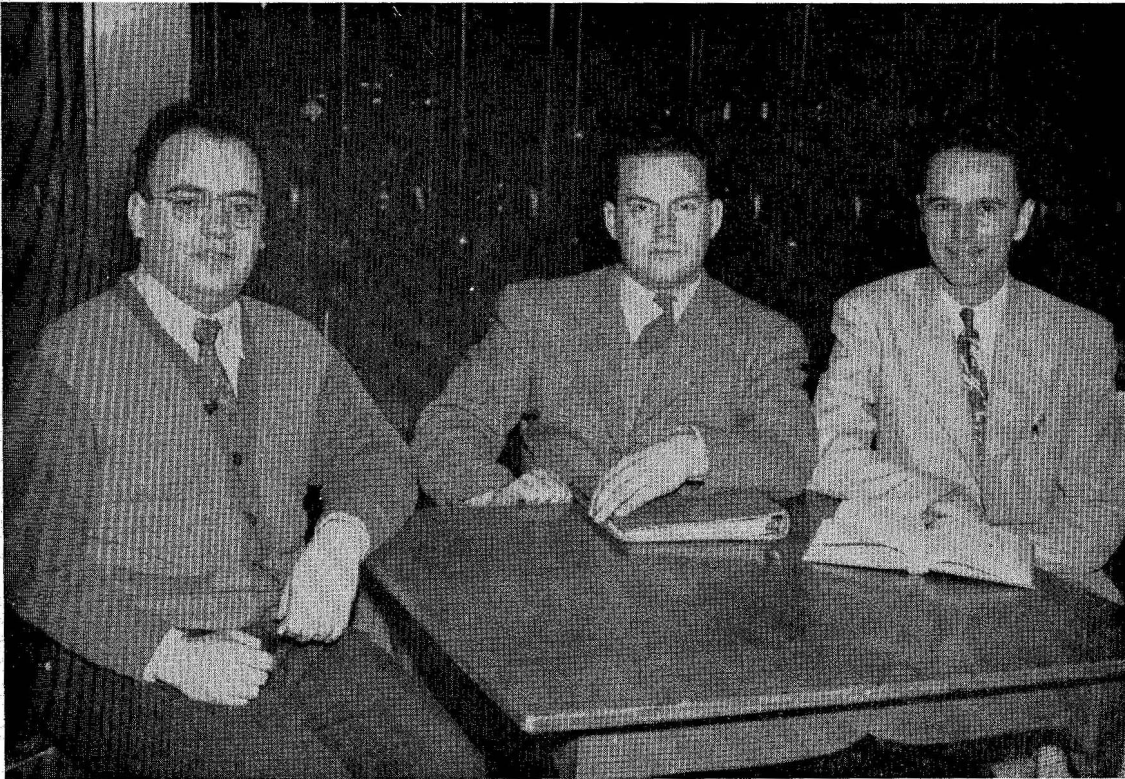

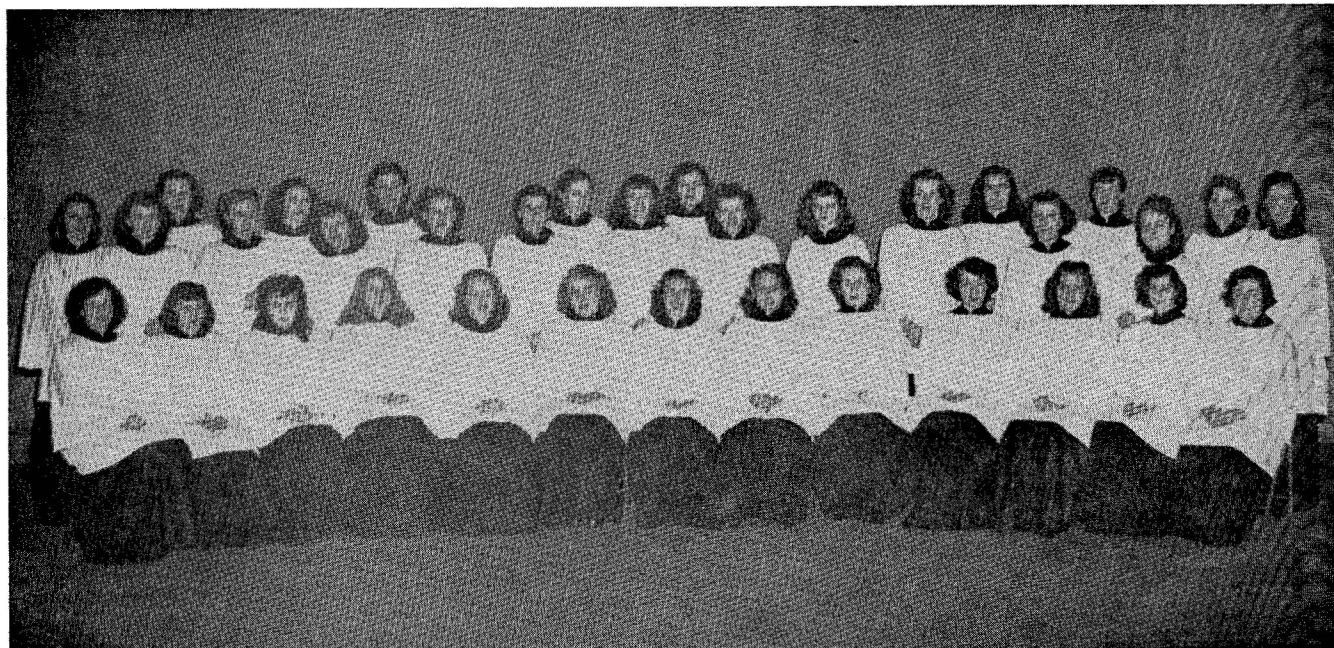

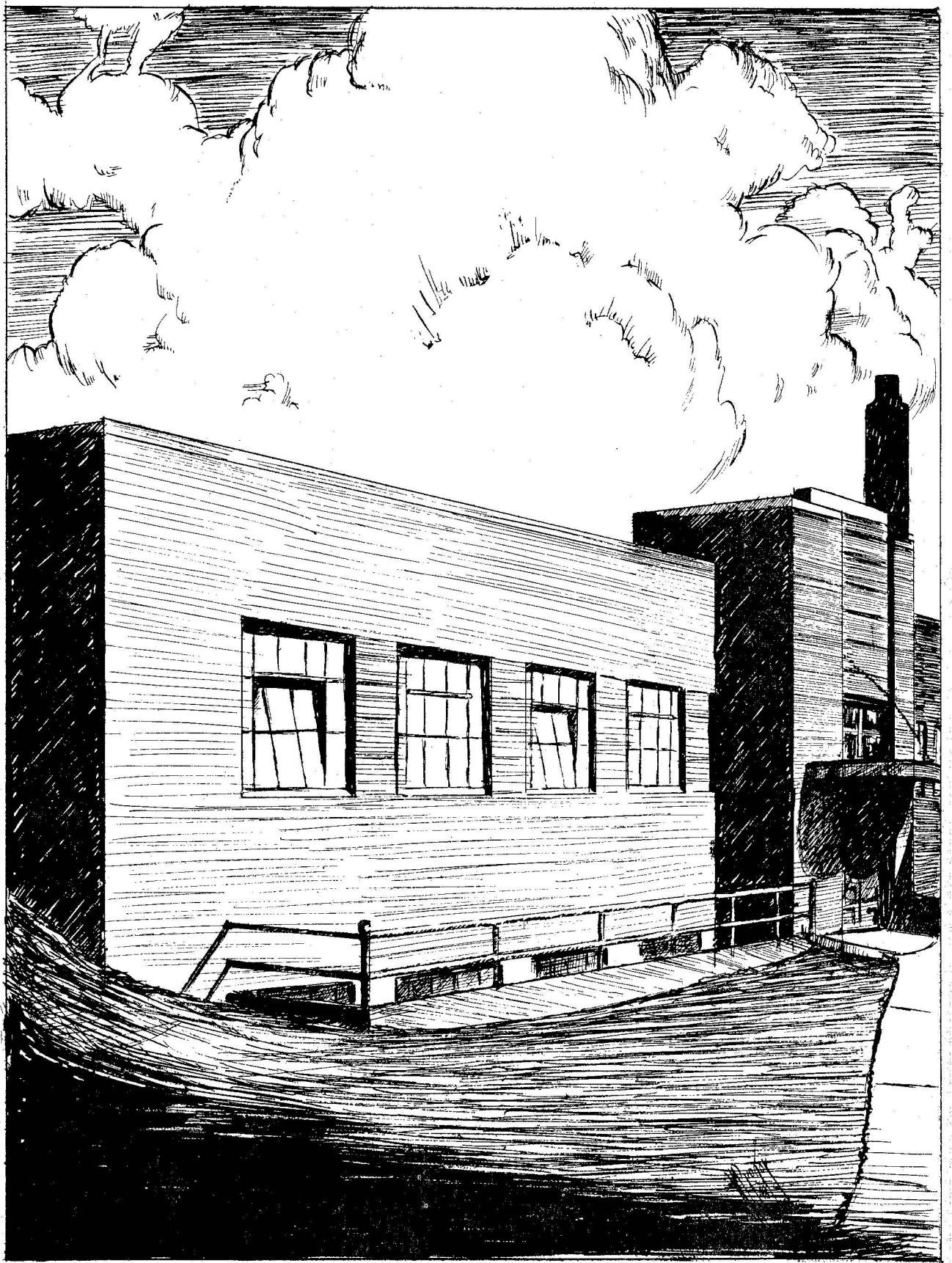
The Collegians

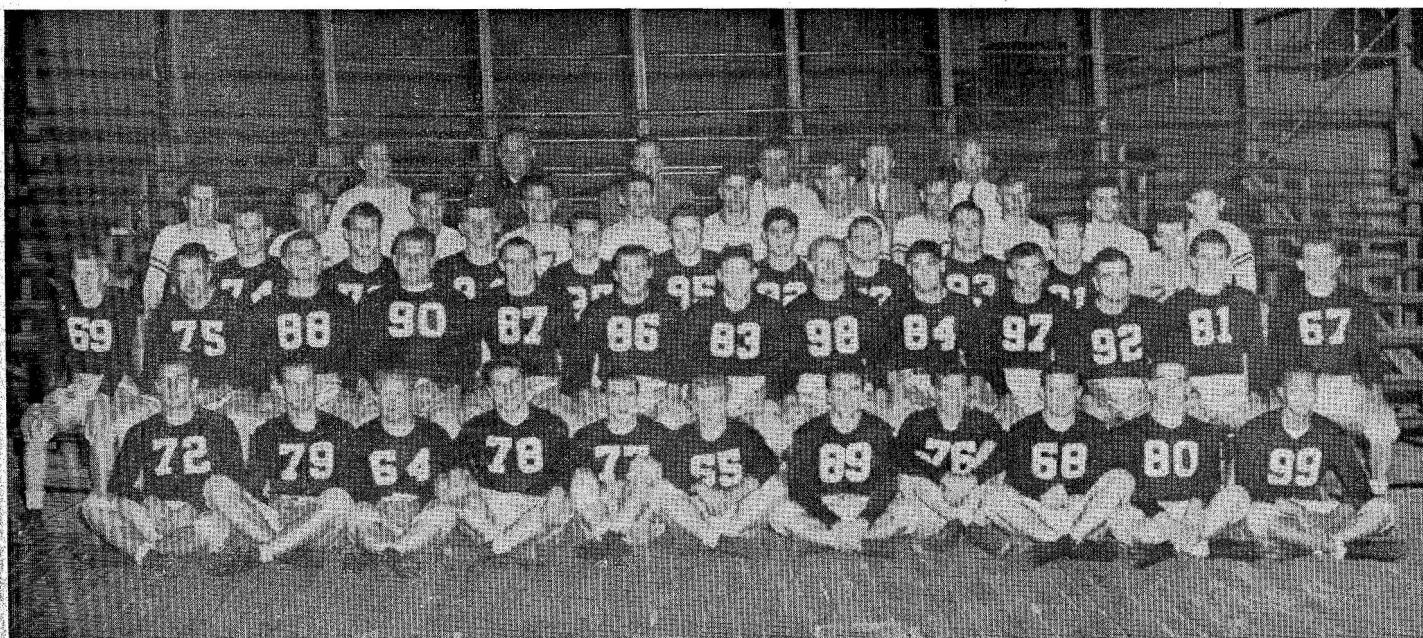

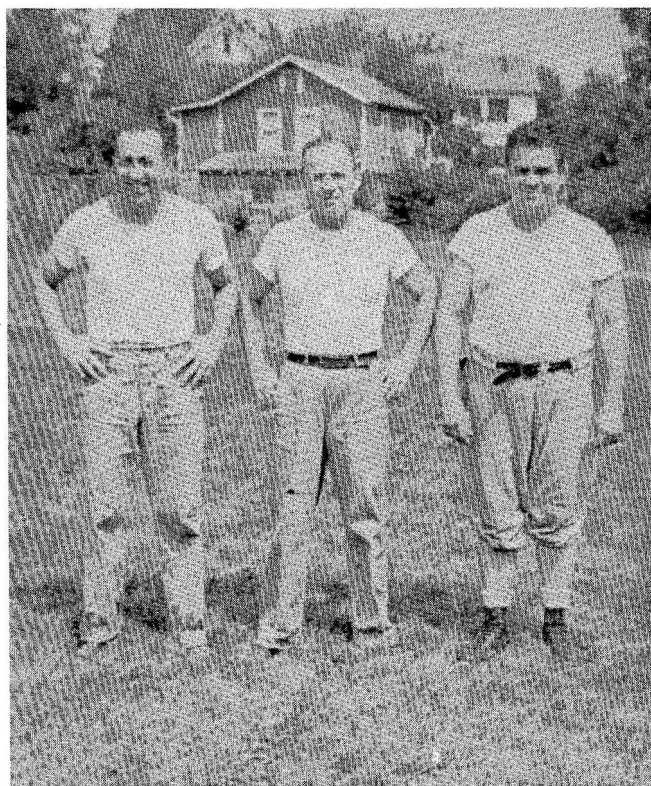
Department of Health and Physical Education

Members of each class were appointed to take of the monthly meetings, such varied programs as a wiener roast and snow carnival and other recreational activities were enjoyed by the members.

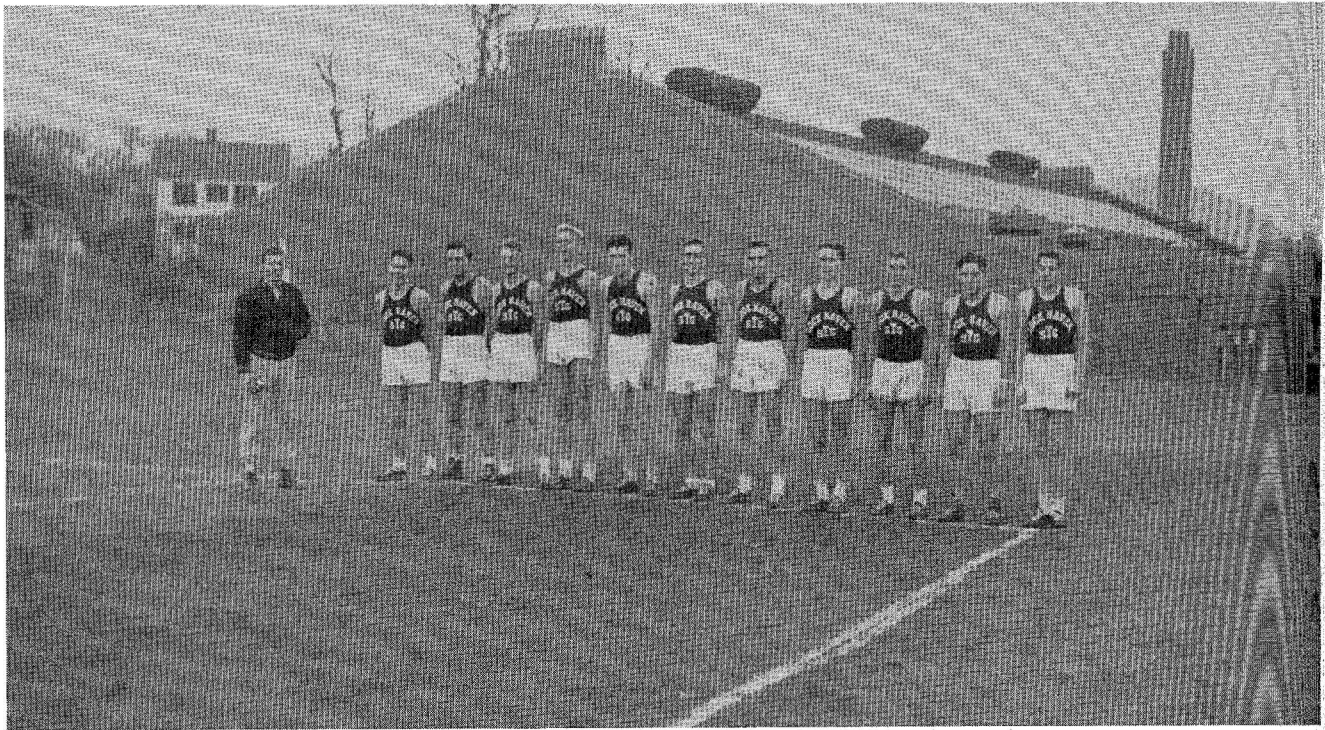

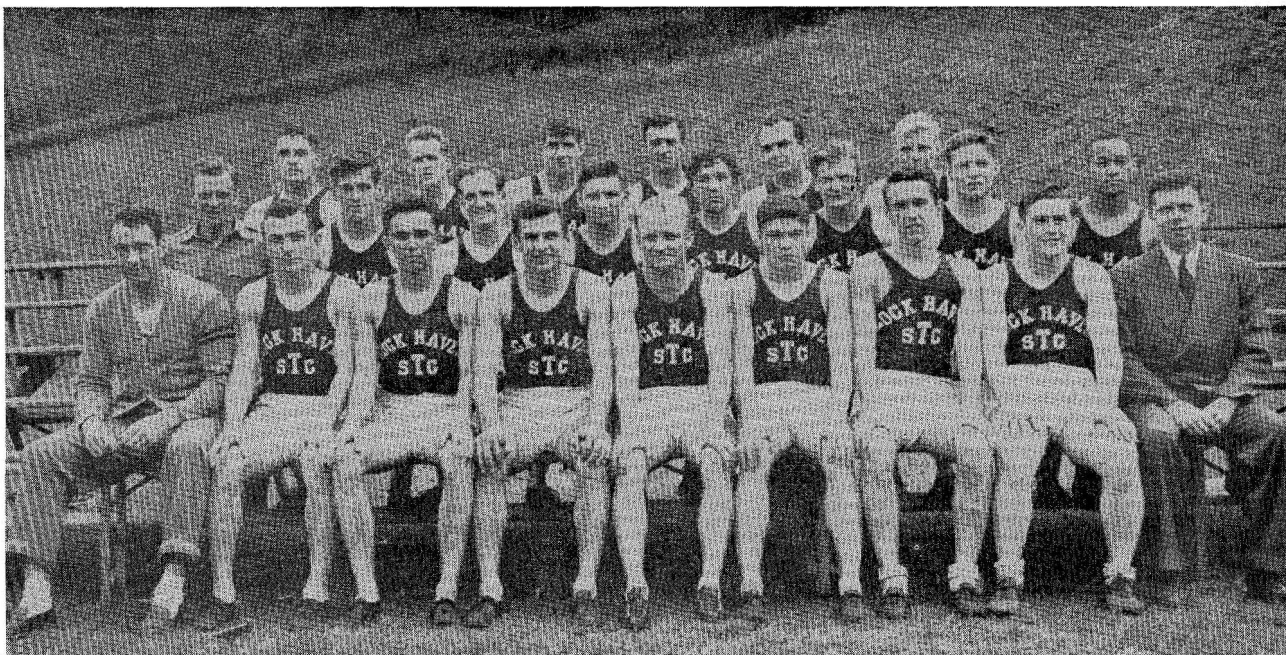

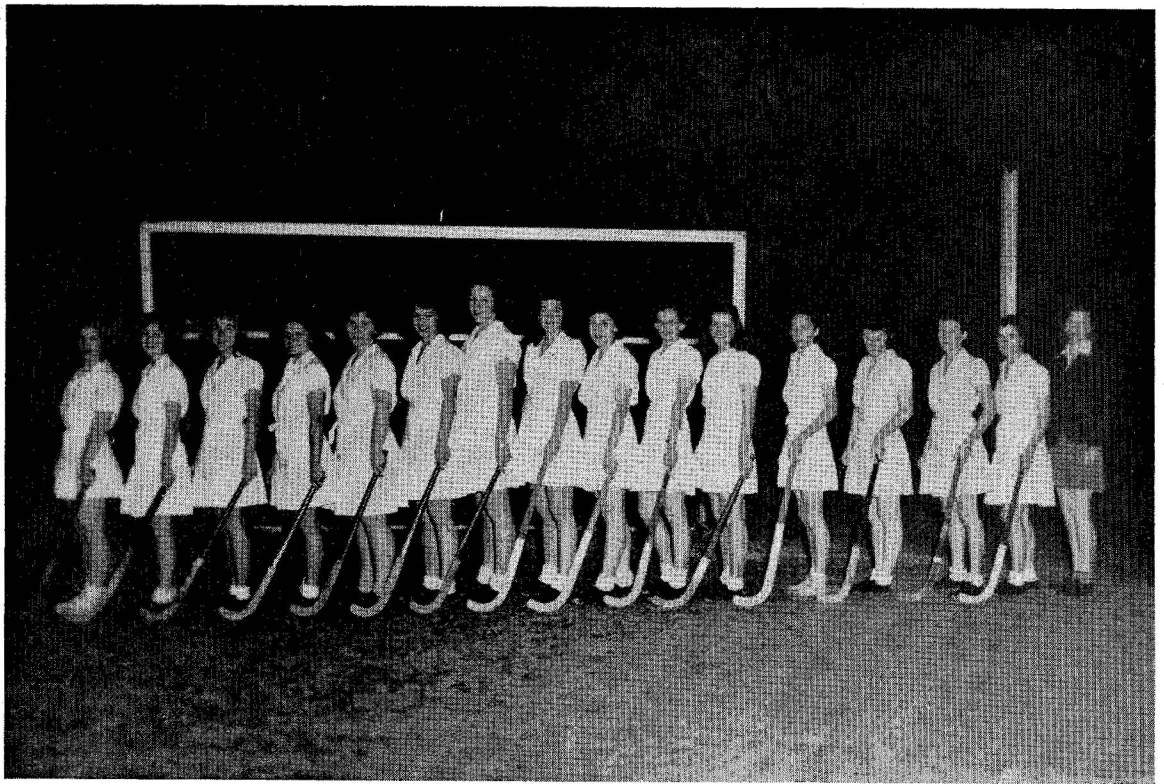
Track Team

The most ambitious track and field schedule in Lock Haven history was fittingly climaxed last spring when the college's first post-war team took third place honors at the annual state teachers colleges championship meet. This distinction, plus a spectacular second place in the college class mile relay at the Penn Relays, highlighted and otherwise mediocre dual meet win-loss record of 2-3.

The season opened with an indoor relay meet win over Bloomsburg Teachers College, in which the maroon squad lost only one event. Powerful West Chester State Teachers College was the next opponent, and through superior strength in the field events defeated Lock Haven 71-60. The Bald Eagles came back the following week to post a win over highly regarded Lincoln University 67½-63½. The final event—the mile relay—decided the winner in this meet, and according to local press accounts this provided “one of the all-time thrills of local track history.”

The next meet was the conference championships in which Lock Haven placed third behind West Chester and Shippensburg. The final two meets proved disappointing, with the local squad losing to Bloomsburg 65-51, and to Shippensburg 78 2/3-52 1/3. During the season new all-time school records were established by George Teufel in the 220 yard dash with his conference winning time of :22.2 (Teufel also tied the school mark of :10.0 in the 100 yard dash); Dick Collier with a :50.7 quarter mile; Charles Pfeffer with a 2:05.3 half mile; Herb Michaels who clocked a 10:38.3 two mile against Lincoln University; and John Kurtz who tied the high jump standard of 5'10".

At the conclusion of the season George Teufel was elected team captain for 1948.



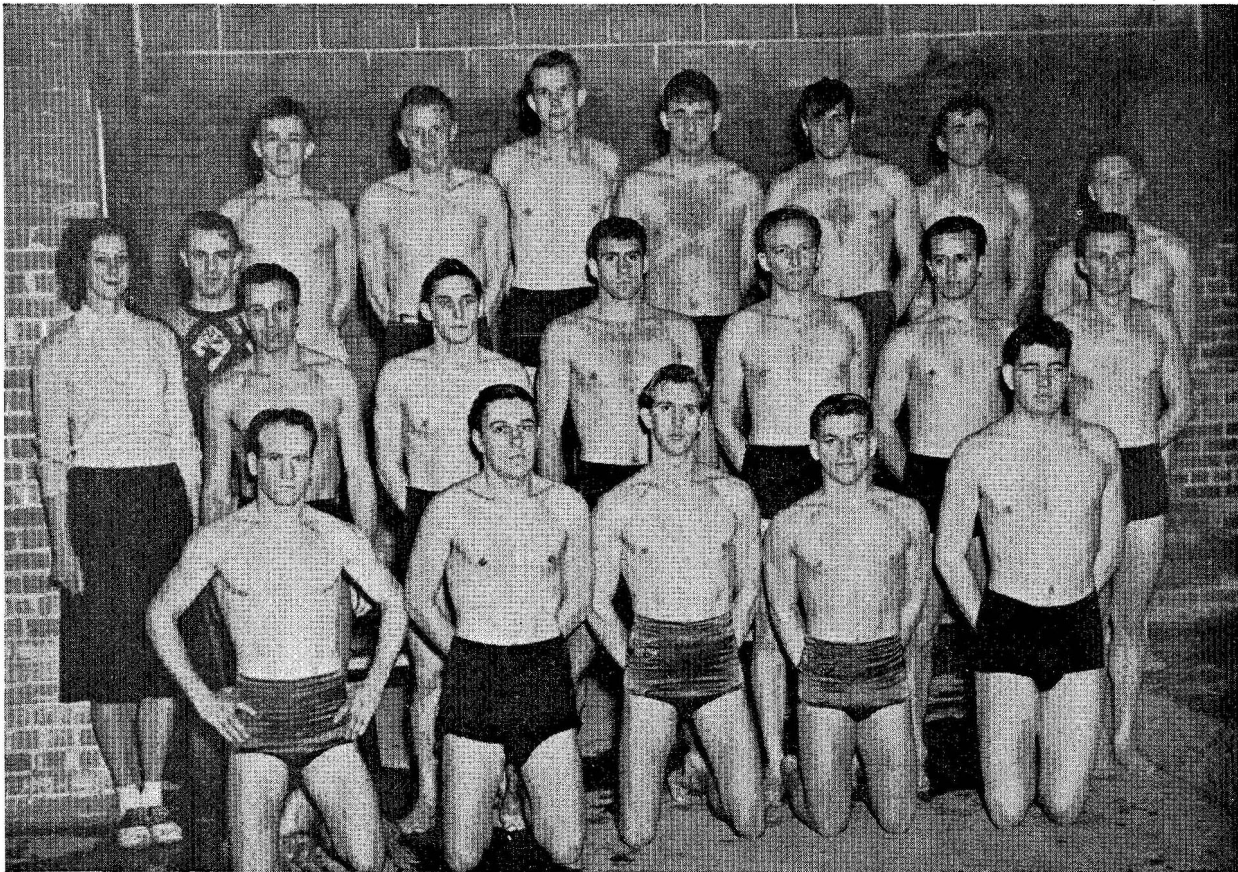
Girls' Hockey Team

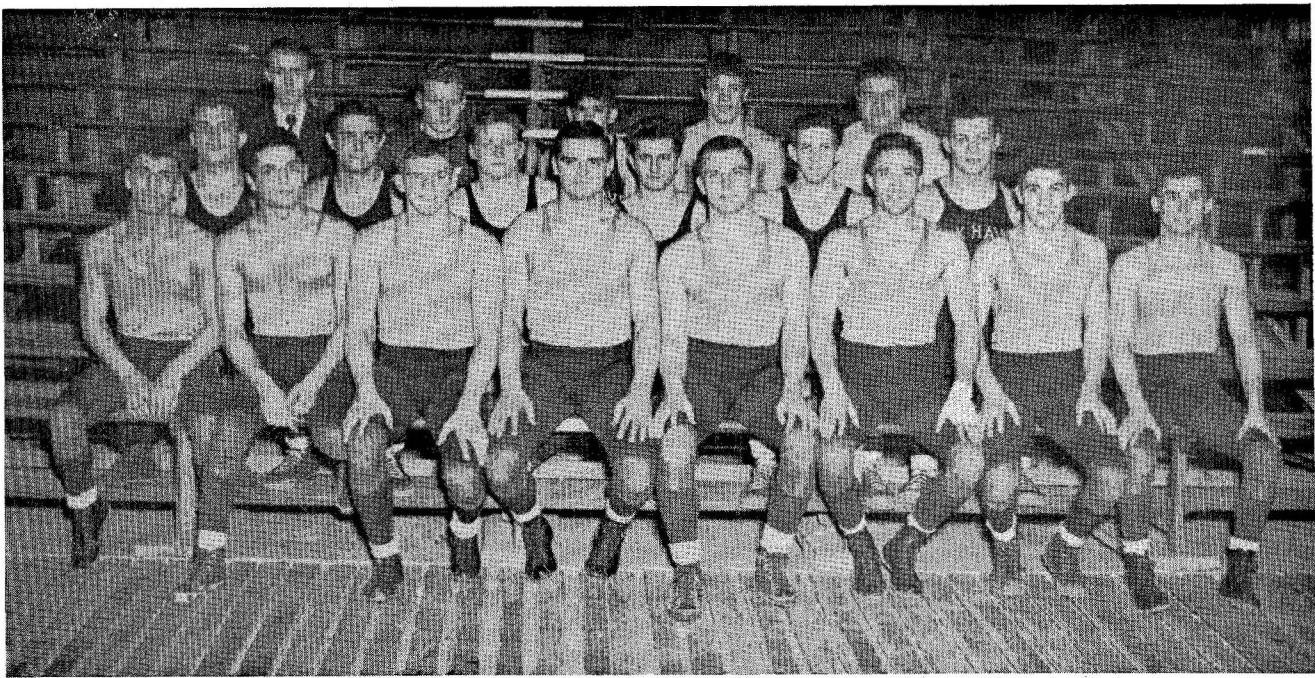

In the 121 lb. class was Steve Di Augustino who in the course of the year wrestled in all ten dual matches, amassing 29 points and losing 9.

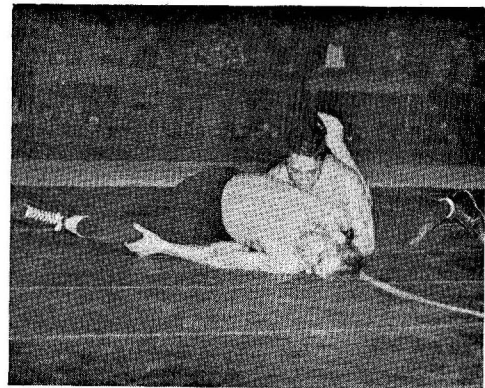
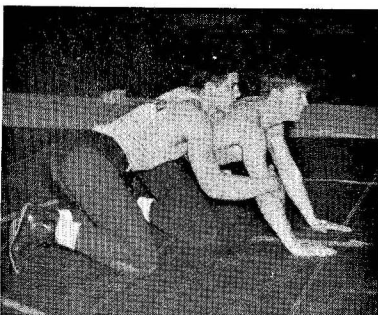

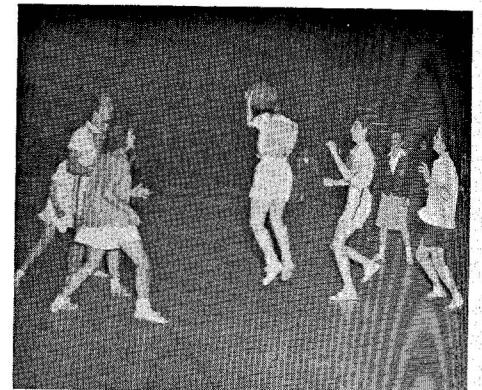
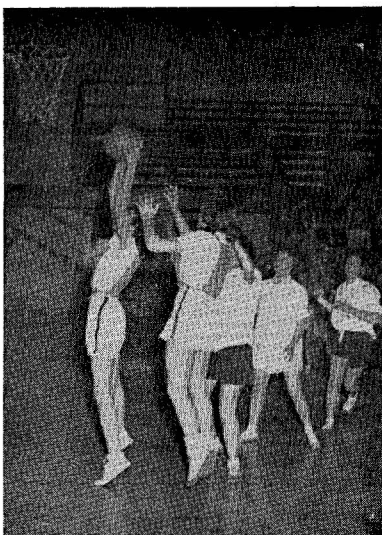
Girl's Basketball Team

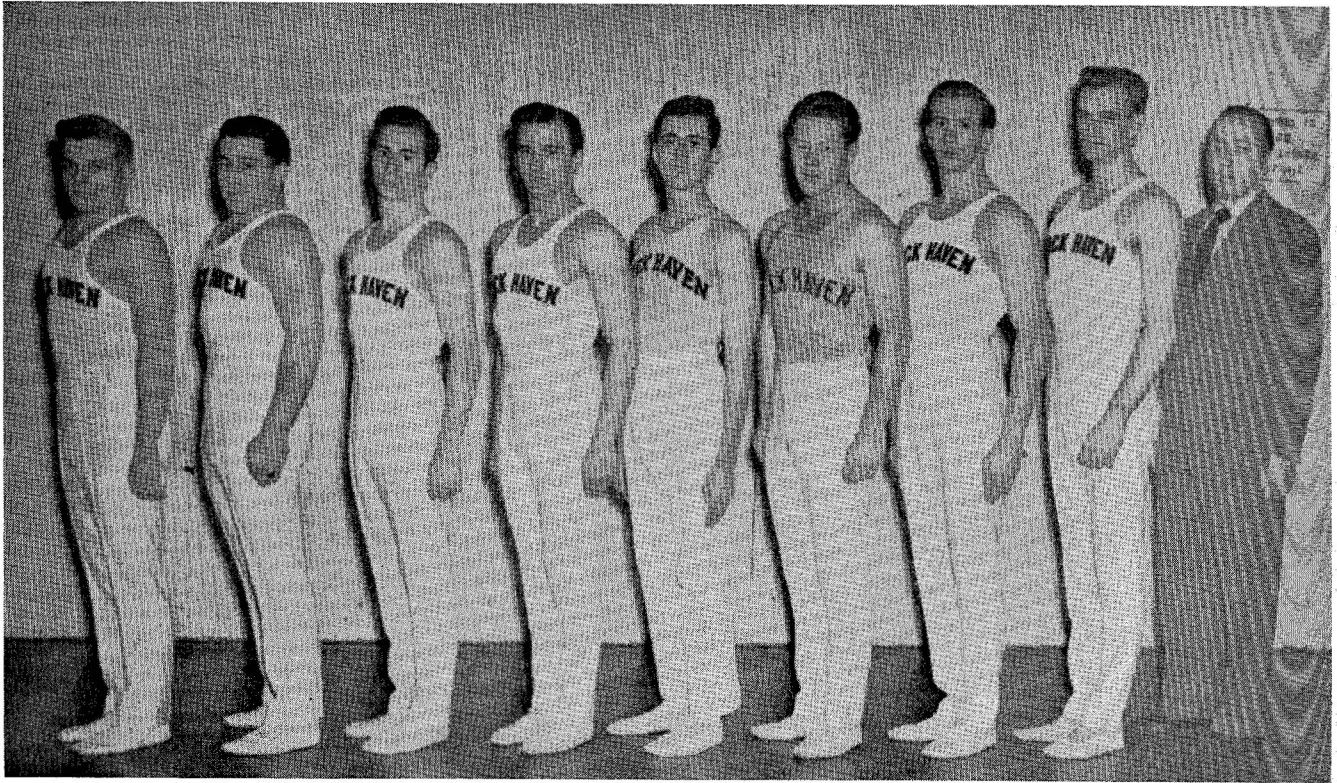
Soccer
