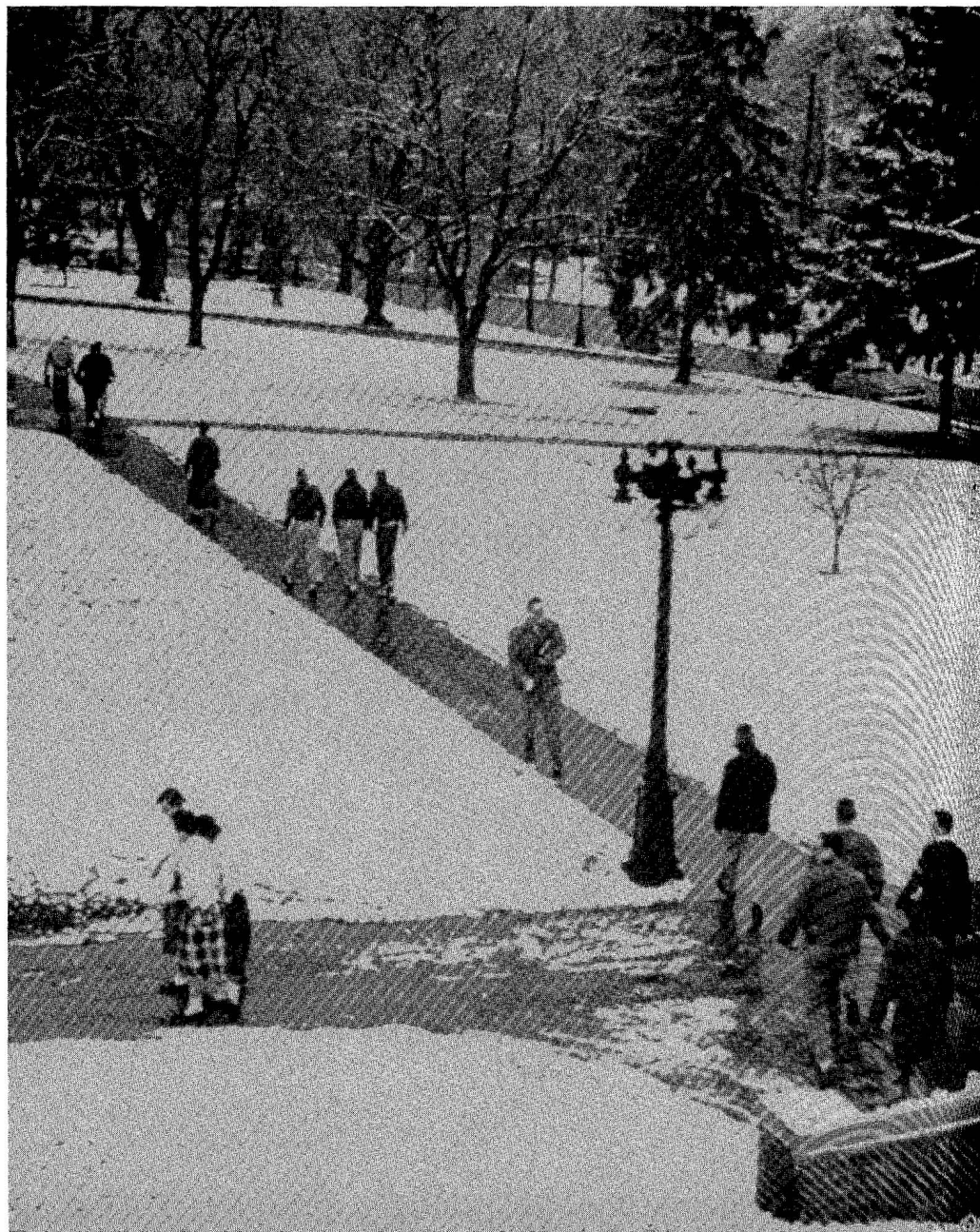

FOREWORD

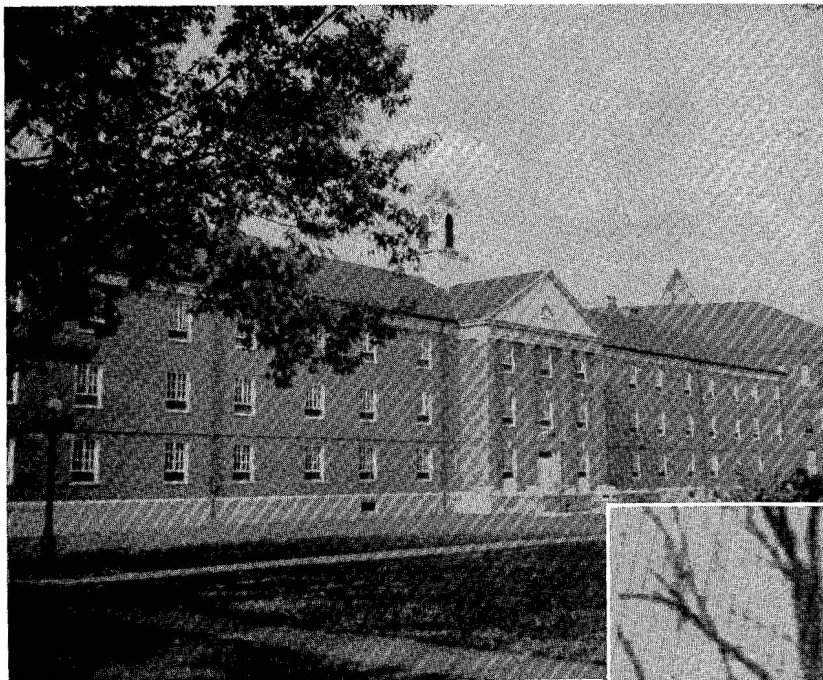

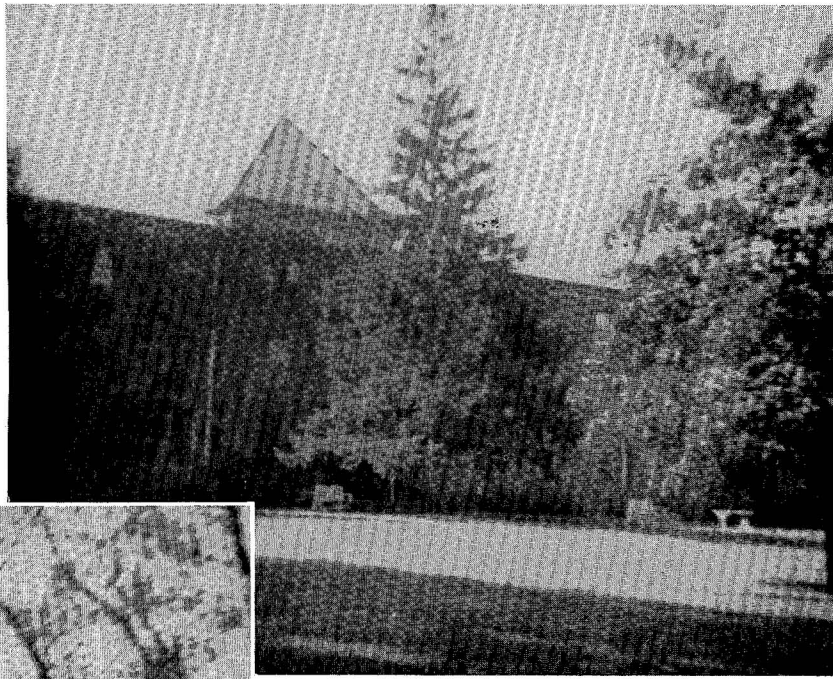

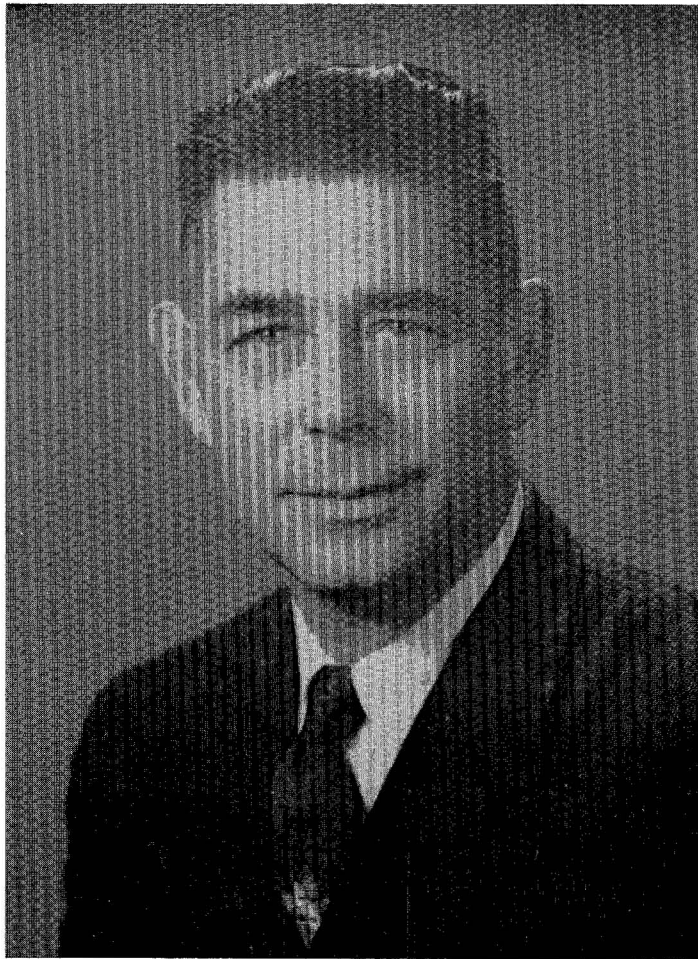

The President's Message

The primary purpose of the administrative organization of the college is to give leadership to those practices which will best educate our students as future teachers. Decisions are reached whenever possible, therefore, through cooperative action rather than direction. The trustees of the college have delegated full administrative authority to the President, who in turn, in establishing institutional practices, seeks the assistance of the fiscal officers, the faculty, and in many pertinent situations, the students. An informal give-take exchange of ideas is encouraged.

There is general agreement among the staff that while we are educating primarily for teaching, our responsibility should not be narrowly professional. We attempt to offer a program of liberal education. In doing this, we subscribe to the concept that the liberally educated person shows generosity of knowledge, is characterized by graciousness and good manners, has interests that are universal, chooses an orderly manner of thinking, and is concerned with enduring and spiritually satisfying values.

We also accept the goal of helping every student to achieve the best possible development in all areas of growth—intellectual, social, physical, emotional, spiritual, and aesthetic.

From an administrative viewpoint, these are the bases of our program. They are not always accomplishments but are constantly held before us when planning educational experiences for the students of Lock Haven State Teachers College.

"I like teachers from a teachers college." This comment by the principal of a Pittsburgh high school is both a compliment and a challenge to achievement. Graduates of a teachers college should be respected because they are persons who, with a singleness of vocational purpose, have aspired to know something, to do something, and to be something—a good teacher.

A teacher must have mastered knowledge—the knowledge needed to understand the world in which boys and girls are growing up. He must be respected because he has at least a beginner's command of basic knowledge in the disciplines of organized human experiences.

A teacher must be able to guide others who are learning; learning not merely the parts which are foundations of intelligent living but habits and skills of thought and action that mark the educated

person and the citizen of a democracy. To do this he must "learn" people and learn how they learn. He must understand the needs, the interests, the capacities of all who may someday be under his instruction. To do this effectively he must learn to deal with the "whole child"—physically, emotionally, intellectually, socially, and spiritually.

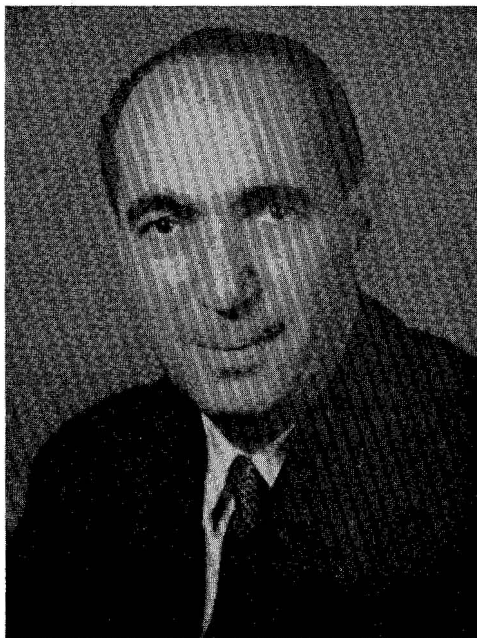
But most of all, the teacher must be a person who commands respect for his integrity, his professional skill, his knowledge, his decency, his fairness, and his respect for each person whom he teaches.

In Memoriam

MAX H. FROMM, M.A.

On February 1, 1955, Max H. Fromm, popular instructor in the Science Department of Lock Haven State Teachers College, collapsed and died while shoveling snow at his home, prior to meeting his eight o'clock class. Death was attributed to a cerebral thrombosis. He would have been forty-eight years old March 4.

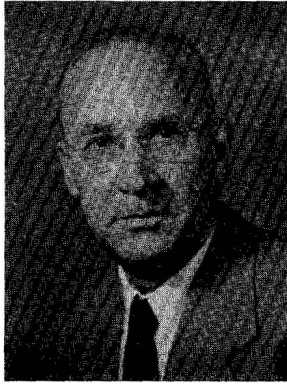
Mr. Fromm received his Bachelor of Science degree at the University of Pittsburgh and completed his Master's degree at Columbia.

His popularity as a teacher followed him from his teaching in the Lock Haven High School to the college campus in 1946. His interests ran the gamut from ardent rooter at all athletic contests to being an active participant in all student and faculty activities. He was a popular member of

numerous fraternal and civic organizations, as well as of many scientific, educational, and professional societies.

The faculty and students were deeply shocked at his sudden passing. His association with the students, faculty, and campus life in general were all above reproach. He never thought of himself but always in terms of others. His unselfish devotion to any cause, his generous contribution of his time and energy, and his never-failing courtesy and solicitude were factors that endeared him to all who knew him. His, indeed, was a life that may well serve as an example for those who remain to carry on where he left off. Co-worker, friend, gentleman, pedagogue, and scholar, Max Hardin Fromm epitomized "service above self."

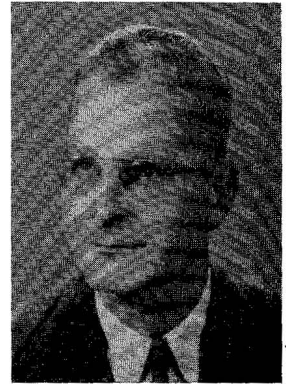

As we go out to start our teaching careers, we hope that, as a class, we'll be able to carry on Lock Haven's fine tradition of good teachers.

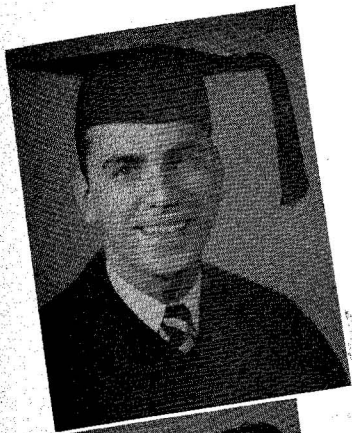

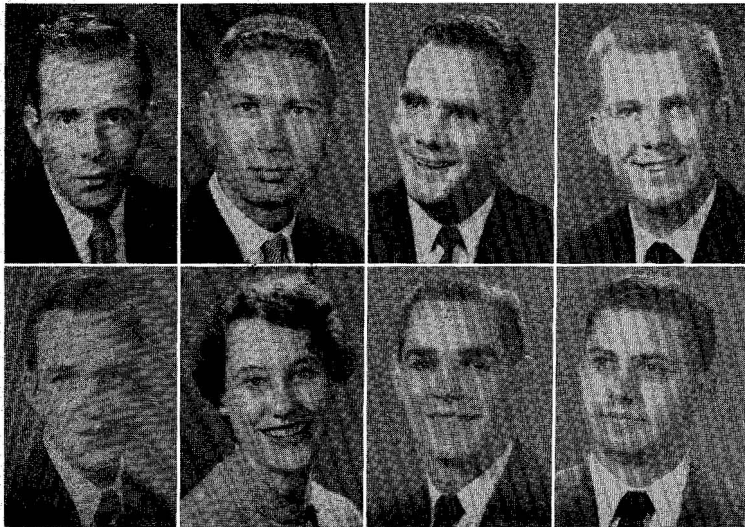
Among our many achievements have been spearheading Freshman Customs, taking part in

1954 Basketball Team

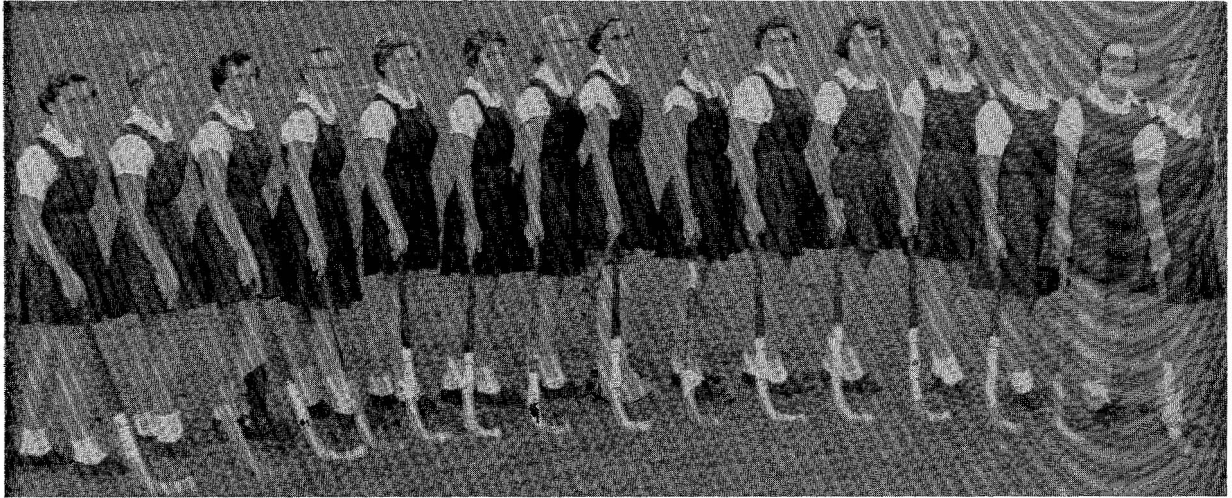

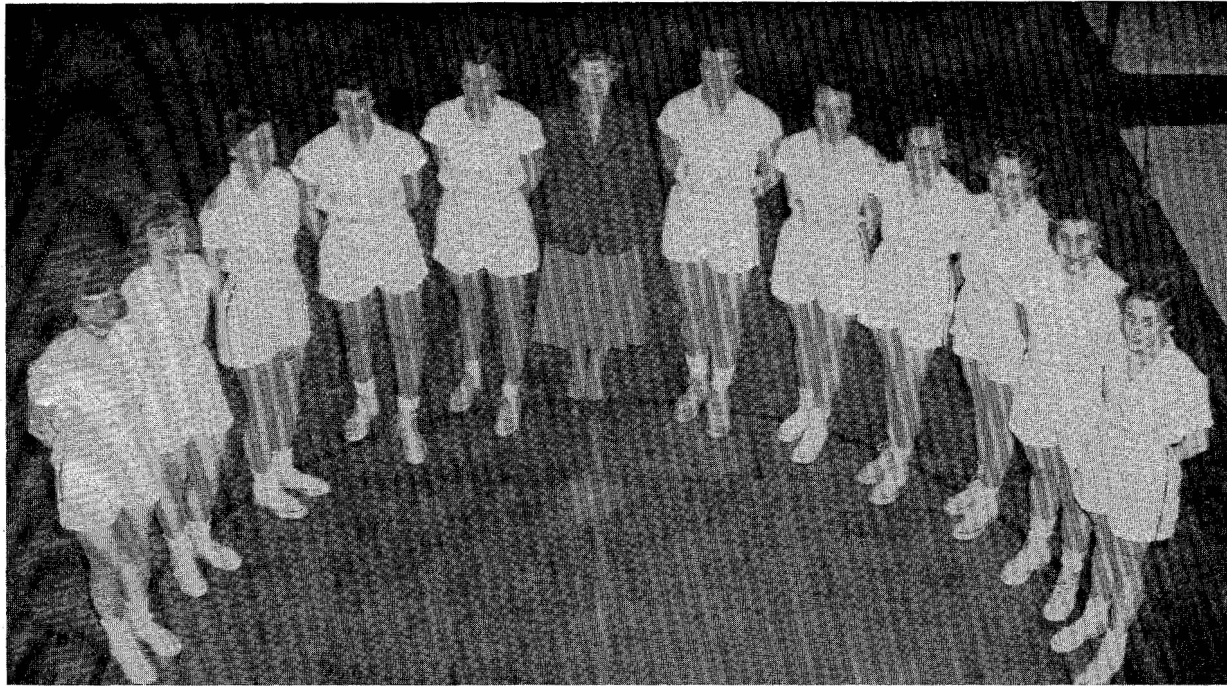
Bald Eagle Hockey Team

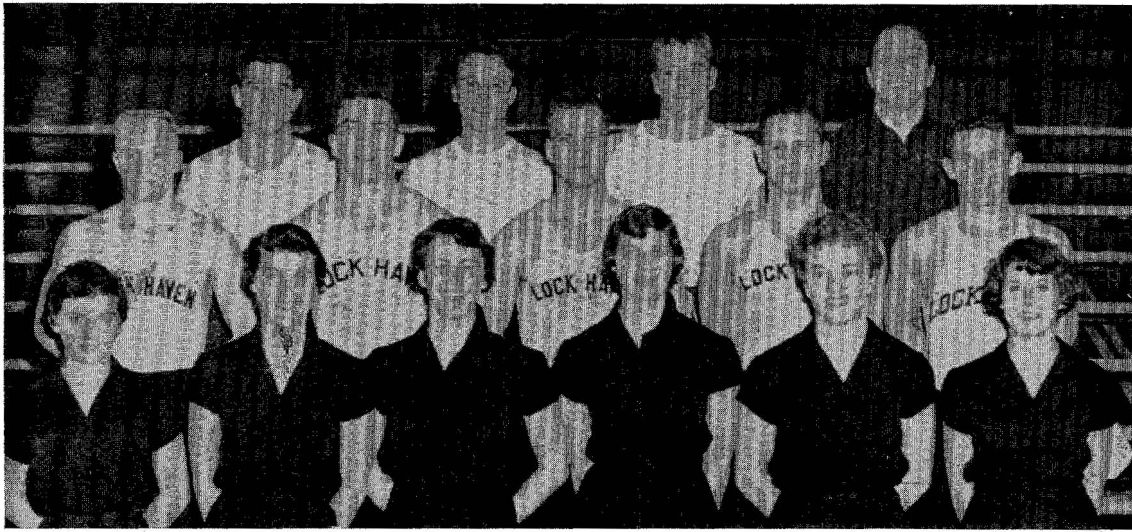

1954 Bald Eagle Baseball Team

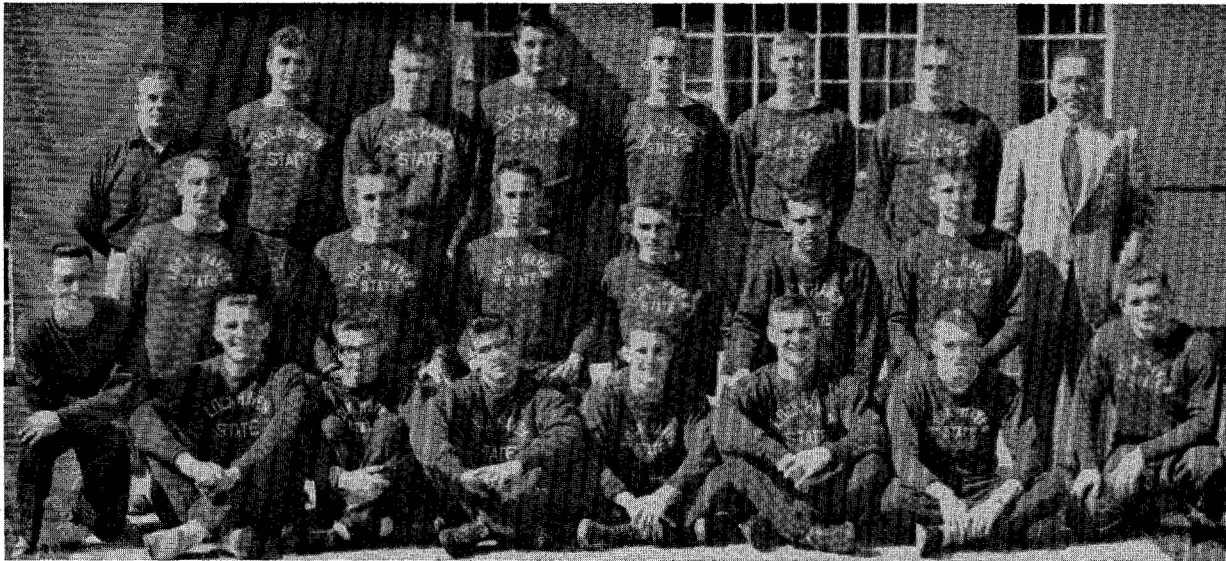
The 1954 edition of the Bald Eagle baseball team finished with a season record of five wins and three losses. They finished second to Shippensburg Teachers College in the conference standings.
