Bloomsburg welcomes its 18th president, Jessica Sledge Kozloff

Over 500 friends, employees, students, and alumni of Bloomsburg University gathered for a reception in Haas Center for the Arts in April to welcome president-designate Jessica Sledge Kozloff to campus. The brief program was held shortly after the Board of Governors of the State System of Higher Education voted to appoint Kozloff the 18th president of Bloomsburg, effective July 1, 1994. At that reception Kozloff discussed her aspirations for the university, and remembered those people who have guided and helped her.

What a moment! This special occasion reminds me of a song my husband and I were listening to the other day as we were driving from our home to the airport. We frequently like to listen to musicals as he drives us here and there. And the song was from a musical "La Cage Au Faux," and the words of the song, if I can remember them, go like this: *So hold this moment fast, and live and love as hard as you know how, and make this moment last, because the best of times are now.* And I certainly feel that way. You've given me a great tribute.

I thought in my remarks tonight I'd try to introduce myself to you in a more personal way than your very thoughtful and lovely program does. And I wanted to introduce myself to you in terms of who I am as a reflection of my family, and why I want so much to be here as your president at Bloomsburg.

The first member of my family that I want to introduce is here with me tonight, my husband Steve, whom you will all meet in just a few minutes. I think the best way to introduce him to you is to say that no one, male or female, could ask for a spouse who is more supportive than he is.

I think especially of the years when I was a mother with two young children — and going back to graduate school for my doctorate — and the many times that I would come home — after commuting 40 miles to another university to take my coursework — of course, trying to be a fairly good mother under those circumstances. Steve usually was the one who went to school to pick up a sick child in those days.

There were a number of occasions when I really was ready to chuck it, and he wouldn't let me. And tonight as we were driving here and there was a police escort, and I

said, "Can we learn to live like this?" I turned to him and I said, "Did you ever think we would have this kind of moment?" And he said, "no." I'd like to introduce you to him. He's also, by the way, my Pennsylvania credential. Back in Colorado, where I used to live, the legislators get very upset when you don't choose a Coloradan as a president and, while you haven't chosen a Pennsylvanian, you did choose one who had the good sense to marry one. Steve, would you stand up please.

I'm also who I am because of two wonderful children who could not be here tonight. Kyle, our son — who, by the way was born 26 years ago in Philadelphia, so I've also produced a Pennsylvanian — is working tonight in France (at least he claims he's working there) on a business assignment. And our daughter, Rebecca, is finishing her second year of law school and finals begin next week, so she couldn't be here. But they're very eager indeed to visit all of you and to meet you and to visit their parents' new home.

These two children endured a very interesting childhood and adolescence growing up with me — and I can tell you that they very cheerfully accepted the fact that what came out of the kitchen was rarely gourmet, and I was never going to be confused with a domestic goddess.

It's really impossible for me to speak of my own children tonight without thinking of the parents of Terry Linn (Bloomsburg University student who died as a result

Chancellor James McCormick praised the method of choosing a new president, and those who served on the search committee.

"What a moment. The best of times is now," Jessica Sledge Kozloff told over 500 faculty, staff and students gathered on April 21 in Haas Auditorium for a reception welcoming her as the president-designate. The brief program was held shortly after the Board of Governors of the State System of Higher Education voted to appoint Kozloff the 18th president of Bloomsburg, effective July 1, 1994.

Ramona Alley, vice chair of the Council of Trustees, welcomed guests and commended the presidential search committee for an "excellent" job. Chancellor James McCormick remarked that Kozloff was the 10th president appointed in the 11-year life of the State System. "It has become our custom to present the president-designate to the campus community immediately after board approval," McCormick said.

The chancellor offered his commendations to members of the search committee and recognized trustees James Atherton and John Haggerty, who served as co-chairs. "The committee members deserve a great deal of credit for their many hours of

hard work. They have identified someone with the essential characteristics of leadership needed," he said. "The committee is to be commended for working in the spirit of Act 188 (the legislation which created the State System) and I want to acknowledge and thank them."

McCormick praised the trustees for overseeing the search process and performing their duties as outlined in Act 188. "I believe the process worked very well. Act 188 was carried out maintaining the balance between the universities and the State System. We should all celebrate the success of the process," he said.

McCormick described Kozloff as an "outstanding and dynamic person who will bring wise leadership to Bloomsburg."

The chancellor recognized Interim President and Mrs. Curt English for their "outstanding dedicated service to the State System of Higher Education." He brought the crowd to its feet for sustained applause as he described the interim president's "devotion" to his alma mater. "Curt English has been an effective leader. He is an experienced administrator with great insight into the dynamics of the public university system," McCormick said. "He has done everything he could to set the stage for an orderly transition. I want to extend my personal thanks to both Curt and Janet."

of alcohol poisoning) and Jeramy Williams (Bloomsburg University student critically injured in an automobile accident). And I just want to say to all of you that my thoughts have been with them so much the past few days, and they've been with you who are Jeramy and Terry's extended families, and my thoughts will certainly remain with them.

My father was a school superintendent in a small Texas community. I spent many hours with him after school — a very, very fortunate situation for me. I would follow him around, tag along with him on his various tasks.

My father had started out to become a minister and had switched to education because, at least for him, he felt this was the way that he could really make a difference. I had the great fortune of listening to him on many occasions talking to people about what he thought about education.

Education was the key to empowering and transforming and enriching lives, and through that transformation we made the world a better place. He would talk about this with the fervor of a country preacher teaching the gospel. And I knew from the time I was a little girl that I wanted to be a teacher, because I knew that to be an educator was to be called the very noblest of professions.

My mother, Ann Acklen Sledge, was a wonderful role model for me. My father laughingly referred to her often as his life insurance policy because he had a medical condition and was unable to get life insurance. And my mother worked to help support the family and to give a sense of security if something should happen to him.

These were the days when women rarely, especially the wife of a school superintendent, worked. Mother was a wonderful, wonderful role model for me because she showed me, in a time when this was an all too rare experience for a little girl, that a woman could be a loving mother and wife and also pursue a demanding career.

As I grew older and people would say to me, "You know, Jessica, you're really going to have to make some choices." It just didn't compute because I knew someone who did both and did them both with great grace and with courage. Unfortunately, my father's prediction of mother as a life insurance policy proved all too true, and a few days before my 16th birthday, he died and my mother assumed the responsibility for our family. She assumed an enormous amount of debt, and we were in a very serious financial situation. College for me seemed absolutely out of the question except for two things. My mother was willing to make a great personal sacrifice for me to attend college, and there was a state university near us so I could live at home and attend college. Because of this experience, I had a profound appreciation for the role that our state universities play in providing affordable, quality education.

So what am I doing here at Bloomsburg? Well, about a year ago this time, I decided that I was going to test the presidential waters. A number of colleagues and mentors had encouraged me to do this. And I began to give a great deal of thought to the kind of university or college I would like to lead. I decided that I wanted to find a very good place that was ready to become an exemplary place, a place that held the same values that I hold, that was dedicated to teaching and believed in education as the way to change lives.

I wanted to find an institution that would become a model of excellence. Now what do I mean by excellence? Probably not the traditional way it's defined, often in terms of an institution's reputation or GPA of the entering students or even the size of the endowment. I've been very influenced by a book by Alexander Aston. It's called *Achieving Academic Excellence*. And Aston defines excellence as the degree to which an institution adds value to the lives of its students, its faculty, its staff, and I would also include to the life of the community around it.

The fact is, we know much more about how to improve the collegiate experience than we practice, and what I wanted to do was to find an institution that was ready to put into practice what we know in theory. When I left here in February after my visit, I knew that I had found the place ...

I also have on my desk back in Colorado another important book. It's called *How College Affects Students*. It's a very thick volume of over 20 years of research on student retention and student success.

It's a book about how college, how the college experience, enhances the lives of its students and about the effective practices that lead to that enhancement. It

talks about changing our students' lives through their collegiate experiences in and outside the classroom.

This book concurs with Aston's contention that these traditional definitions of excellence are really misleading. And that what's really important for students is not where they attend a university or college, but what happens to them once they get there. The development of critical thinking is obviously essential to our role as educational institutions, but a model for excellence must also contribute to our students' understanding of self and their respect for others, their values and attitude and behavior so that they leave us ready to become productive members of a democratic society and to fully enjoy the post-collegiate years.

The fact is, we know much more about how to improve the collegiate experience than we practice, and what I wanted to do was to find an institution that was ready to put into practice what we know in theory. When I left here in February after my visit, I knew that I had found the place — that Bloomsburg University was that institution — that you are that institution. I knew it because of the faculty and staff I met here. I was impressed with your credentials, but more than that, I was impressed with your aspirations for the future — that you wanted this university to become all that it can be and it should be. I was impressed by the students. I was very cognizant of the fact that the next president here would be very fortunate indeed to follow in the footsteps of President English, who has so unselfishly prepared the way for someone else.

Perhaps though the crowning moments of my decision and the reason I was very certain that this was the place for me was the drive I had leaving Bloomsburg with a young man from your maintenance department — his first name is Todd, and I can't remember his last name, but I will find out. Todd volunteered to drive me back to Harrisburg in a terrible snow storm — it was sleeting and snowing. We spent three hours in a car driving back to Harrisburg. And during that three-hour drive, we talked a lot about why he liked working at Bloomsburg University and the pride he had in this place, and the pride he had in his work was very touching to me.

I make no apologies. I want us to be the best. ... Only by setting that kind of goal that we can push ourselves to be all we should be for our students and for the people of Pennsylvania who support us.

As I got out of the car at the airport and told him goodbye, I said, "Now Todd, I think you should stay overnight in a motel because this really was horrible." He said no. He said, "They're going to need me tomorrow and I need to get back." And I left here knowing that if he was any indication of the kind of dedication to duty that you have here, that this indeed was the place for me.

My presidential agenda is for Bloomsburg to become an exemplary university. I make no apologies. I want us to be the best. Not because I want us to be better than our sister institutions — because I assume they are going to be striving to be the best also — I want Bloomsburg to be the best, to try to be the best, because it is only by setting that kind of goal that we can push ourselves to be all we should be for our students and for the people of Pennsylvania who support us.

Just as we must set high expectations for our students in the classroom and outside of the classroom as members of our academic community, we must set the same expectations for ourselves.

As Steve and I were flying out in the airplane — was it yesterday or the day before? — I'm losing track of time — I was looking through one of those magazines that sells things, and there was an advertisement about inspirational posters for your office. So I thought I'll look through here. Maybe I'll find one that I need. And I did. And I think it probably describes how I feel at this time better than anything else I could say. Let me try to describe the poster to you. It's a view of a very beautiful vast lake. The photographer is standing on one shore of the lake looking out across this vast expanse of water to the other side — and there is a canoe that's parked at the foot of the photographer, so you're looking out past this

canoe over the water to the far, far side of the shore. And the inscription under this poster reads "Success is a journey, not a destination." And that's how I feel about us striving to be the best. And I know that the waters will not always be tranquil. I've already gotten an inkling of that. I suspect that I may head out in the wrong direction every once in a while, and I don't know how long it's going to take us to get there, and I have no idea where we may land eventually. But I do know one thing. I know that if we have the courage to commit to this journey, that we will prove ourselves to be very worthy stewards of the public's trust and that our students will be the beneficiaries. Thank you so very much.

From the mail

(We received the following letter from Gladys Hirsch Lyon of Wilmington, Delaware.)

The Hirsch family of Tamaqua, Pennsylvania, has been associated with Bloomsburg College from 1910 to 1977. My father's sister, Annabelle Hirsch Wade, entered Bloomsburg Normal School in 1910. In 1912, I was four years old and visited the college when she graduated. Then I decided to be a school teacher.

In 1926, Annabelle Wade brought me to Bloomsburg Teachers College when I enrolled in their three-year program. In 1927, the program was extended to four years. Lacking finances, I completed my courses in one year and one summer school in 1928.

In 1931, my sister, Irene Hirsch Heister, enrolled at Bloomsburg State Teachers College and graduated in 1933.

I taught school in Tamaqua for eight years, attending summer schools at Bloomsburg (1929), Pennsylvania State College (1930-1933) and Duke University (1934-1935). I married in 1936 and moved in Wilmington, Delaware.

In 1941, with the help of my father, Hon. J. Noble Hirsch, a State Representative, the ban on married women teaching school in Pennsylvania was removed.

Substitute teachers were needed in 1948, and I began teaching in Wilmington. Extension courses were offered by Columbia University and I began attending them. The University encouraged me to continue the courses and I began commuting to Columbia on weekends. I received a bachelor's degree in education signed by Dwight D. Eisenhower. I taught in the elementary grades of the De La Warr School District in New Castle County from 1952 through 1974.

In 1977, my nephew, Dane Hirsch, received a master's degree in business education at Bloomsburg University.

Task force to study Greek life

A special Greek Life Task Force will be convened to determine the impact of the Greek system on the quality of student life on and off campus, how the system complements the mission statements of the university and the type of relationship the university should have with the Greek system. A key element of the process will involve examining the Greek system for its adherence, both in letter and spirit, to the expectations and standards expressed in the university's code of conduct.

Although discussion concerning such a task force has been under way for several months, the April alcohol-induced death of a student escalated the process. A 21-year-old junior from Camp Hill died after attending a fraternity party. The coroner reported his blood-alcohol level was near 4.0, four times the legal limit.

In addition, as of early May, six of the 10 fraternities recognized by the university were on various forms of probation imposed by either the university or their own national organization. In each case, violations of the alcohol policy or disorderly conduct prompted the discipline.

All but one of the 10 fraternities have been cited for violation of university policies since 1991. Currently, four fraternities have their charters suspended pending the outcome of ongoing investigations.

Since the spring 1990, six of the 10 sororities have been disciplined for violations of the alcohol policy or disorderly conduct.

Equipment Donation Enhances Students' Hands-on Experience

This semester, Bloomsburg students are using a Beckman Metabolic Cart to examine the effects of physical activity on the human cardio-respiratory system.

The instrument measures oxygen consumption and carbon dioxide production, which is the best indicator of cardio-respiratory fitness, says Leon Szmedra, who teaches exercise physiology.

"We're in the process of doing research on individuals ranging from college-age athletes to members of the general student population and senior citizens."

Donated to the university last year by Harrisburg Hospital, the metabolic cart is valued at \$24,500, and would cost \$39,000 to replace with a new unit. Szmedra, who directs the

Human Performance Laboratory in Centennial Gymnasium where the equipment is housed, worked with the hospital

for a year to secure the donation. The equipment is used by approximately 15 graduate exercise physiology majors and 50 under-

graduate adult health majors as well as students from other disciplines. "It's unusual for undergraduate and graduate students to have hands-

on experience in a classroom setting working with a metabolic cart," says Szmedra.

The typical research process first involves the testing of individuals to establish a baseline measure of oxygen consumption as an indicator of their cardio-respiratory efficiency. Subjects are then prescribed an exercise regimen, such as a treadmill running and/or cycle ergometry, and tested periodically to determine if their ability to consume oxygen has improved.

Besides learning from the results of the research, students will benefit from hands-on experience with this type of equipment. "Many of our students are interested in cardiac rehabilitation or corporate fitness and upon graduation may use this type of instrument," says Szmedra. "I've always believed that if students, both graduate and undergraduate, are exposed to the research process, the transfer of knowledge is expedited and more enjoyable. This instrument will have a positive impact on the educational environment of our students."

As of May 5, 2,787 alumni have pledged \$121,122 to the 1994 Annual Fund campaign. During eight weeks this spring, 40 students have been calling from a bank of telephones in the basement of Elwell Hall. Each evening, Sunday through Thursday, 15 students call alumni to update alumni files, provide news and information on campus events and to request their participation in this year's Annual Fund.

Alumni and friends of Bloomsburg have established a strong tradition of making yearly gifts to the university. Every January the BU Foundation renews the process of requesting unrestricted financial support of alumni, families, and friends to improve the university's academic and living climate.

In recent years, more than \$300,000 has been donated annually by alumni to assist the university in achieving its mission. Although this represents 20% to 30% of the total received each year, it is critical to the strength and vitality of Bloomsburg University.

Unrestricted monies received through the Annual Fund give the university flexibility that the operating budget is unable to provide. These funds offer:

- educational services and programs — scholarships, academic equipment, seed money for research, and support for the University Scholars program.
- Alumni Association activities — Homecoming and Alumni Weekend, regional events, chapter meetings, this publication, and other alumni requests.
- special projects — faculty development and staff development.

Specially designated gifts to the Husky Club, also a part of the Annual Fund, support scholarships for academically and athletically talented students.

Separate from the Annual Fund is the campaign to build a new library, *A Treasury of Ideas*.

As state allocations decrease, Bloomsburg alumni are stepping forth admirably to help assure the strength and vitality of their *alma mater*.

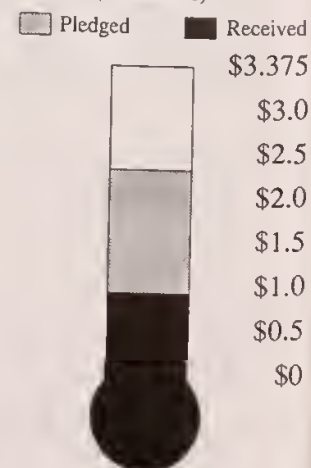

Alumni giving sets record

\$1.249 Million Garnered for BU in 1993

Setting a record in 1993, alumni giving continues to inch toward the half million dollar mark. Contributions to the Annual Fund and The Trust for Generations, including library construction, totaled \$457,185.

"BU alumni can be very proud of their commitment to their alma mater," said Curtis R. English '56, interim president. "Their support for the new library has been very responsive. They understand the need and are meeting the challenge."

Gifts from individuals—alumni, parents, employees, and friends—made up a significant portion of giving in 1993, totaling 53%. These gifts, in addition to generous contributions from other private sources—businesses and corporations, foundations, deferred gifts, gifts-in-kind, and the Alumni Association's affinity card, — have maintained many

important programs supported by the BU Foundation.

Of the total contributions received, \$424,388 was designated for the new library, *A Treasury of Ideas*. Another \$488,162 was received for The Trust for Generations, the five-year cam-

paign begun in 1989 to build endowments for library acquisitions, scholarships, and academic excellence.

This year, 136 students received scholarships totaling \$65,739. This was made possible through various direct gifts and endowed, interest-bearing accounts held by the BU Foundation and Alumni Association. Another 80 students received scholarship monies from the Fred Smith Golden Rule Trust Fund. Athletic scholarships and projects received \$107,032 from designated contributions and gifts-in-kind.

The remaining \$230,363 helped to support the Scholars Program, faculty and staff development, academic equipment purchases, special projects, alumni association activities, and the publication of *Bloomsburg*.

Aetna Pledge will Benefit PRIDE Program

The Aetna Foundation recently pledged \$20,000 to the Bloomsburg/Harrisburg Partnership Project, the PRIDE Program. Monies will be used to help assure the continuation of a specially designed educational enrichment program for young inner-city teenagers, particularly African-Americans, who attend the Harrisburg City Schools.

According to Mary Harris, the program director and associate professor in the Department of Curriculum and Foundations, approximately 24 students in each

group attend week-long classes on the Bloomsburg campus every summer from the sixth through twelfth grades. By helping these students gain academic skills and develop their individual potential, the expectation is that a high proportion of them will matriculate in college. The first group will be ready for college in 1996.

In addition to Aetna, the PRIDE Program has also received funding in previous years from AMP, Inc. and the Greater Harrisburg Foundation.

Alumni Board Achieves 100% Participation in Library Campaign

According to Susan Helwig '82, acting director of development, all the members of the Alumni Association Board of Directors have given or pledged to *A Treasury of Ideas*. Of the various governing and advisory boards of Bloomsburg University, the Alumni Association Board is the first to achieve this distinction.

"We're proud to have the united support of the Alumni Association's Board of Directors," says Helwig. "For a project of this magnitude to be successful, the support must start at the top. A Treasury Of Ideas

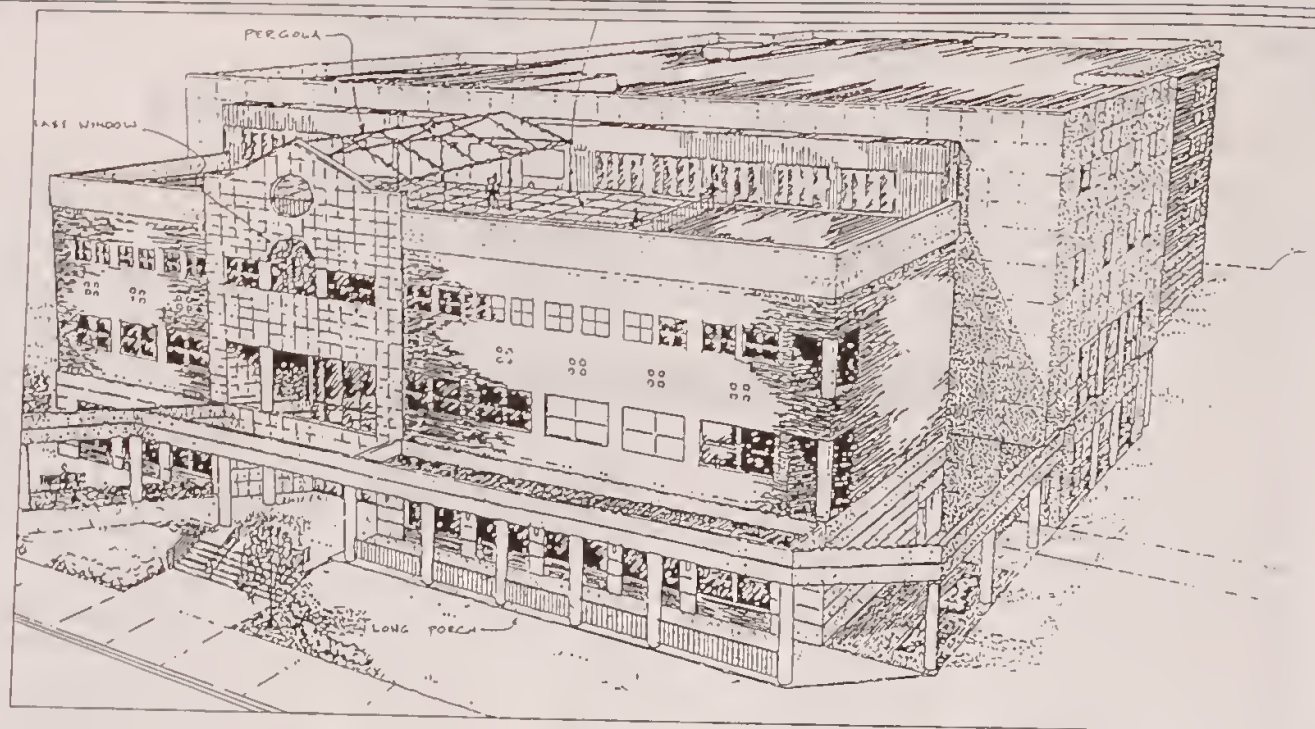
With \$2.316 million received in gifts and pledges, the original fund-raising goal for the new library, \$2.375 million, has nearly been met. This represents 7,180 pledges across the university's constituencies and an average pledge/gift of \$246.23.

The additional \$1 million of the new \$3.375 million goal, authorized last winter by the BU Foundation board and the BU Council of Trustees to complete a portion of the building originally projected to remain temporarily unfinished, has yet to be pledged.

Of the total pledged, nearly \$1.5 million has been received in gifts and planned gifts. Contributions and new pledges arrive daily. The ceramic tile mural will be enlarged to accommodate the number of alumni and friends who have pledged at the \$1,000 level and above. Few tiles remain unreserved.

Alumni

Thus far, over 5,000 alumni have made gifts and pledges this past year to the library construction campaign. The average alumni gift stands at \$204.12. During the next three years, alumni gifts (to date) of \$1.5 million will be transformed into bricks and mortar.

Parents

Gifts and pledges from more than 1,700 parents of BU students presently total \$159,555 for the library. The Parents' Fund campaign will be held again during the fall semester.

Faculty and Staff

The annual employee campaign, under way in April, again focused on the library. Faculty and staff (omitting alumni employees) have pledged more than \$83,000 toward their goal

of \$100,000. Thus far, 47 employees have reserved a tile. Included in the employee group are retired faculty and staff who, to date, have pledged more than \$14,000 to the library.

Student organizations

The Community Government Association has committed \$75,000 to the library over a four-year period. The Husky Ambassadors were the first student organization to reserve a tile by making a \$1,000 gift last fall.

Other student organizations and groups which have pledged \$1,000 include the Association for Childhood Education International, Columbia Hall, the Data Processing Management Association, the English Club and Sigma Tau Delta, the Football Team, Luzerne Hall, Lycoming Residence Hall, Phi Omega Phi and Delta Pi Epsilon, the Supervisory Roundtable, the Men's Swim Team, the Women's Swim Team, the Men's and Women's Tennis Teams, and the Wrestling Team.

Trustees Receive Report

Bloomsburg Leads System in Operation Jumpstart

Development Center milestones continue to dominate fund raising in the State System of Higher Education, reported Anthony Ianiero, interim vice president for advancement. As of Dec. 30, Bloomsburg led the State System in monies raised toward projects designated as part of Governor Casey's Operation Jumpstart initiative. As of early April, Bloomsburg has raised \$2,316,741 in gifts and pledges toward construction of the library. This represents 99% of the original fund-raising goal.

This total includes a \$75,000 pledge to the library by the Community Government Association for which the night study patron lounge will be named. The Class of 1994 has pledged \$36,800 toward a \$50,000 goal.

"We are grateful to all those in the university community who have so generously and enthusiastically supported the library campaign. It's wonderful to see how we can all pull together for this crucial project," Ianiero said.

Setting another State System record were Bloomsburg University parents who in 1992-93 gave more than \$68,000.

To enhance the rate of return on the university's investments, the Council of Trustees recently approved a resolution to transfer 50% of the \$8.4 million portfolio of The Bloomsburg University Foundation, Inc., and the Community Government Association to the Common Fund. This investment fund is used by colleges and universities across the country.

Business minor offered

Undergraduate students in any major at Bloomsburg University now have the opportunity to gain a background in business through a newly-offered business minor.

"We think the new business minor will be very marketable to students seeking employment," says John Olivo, interim dean of the College of Business. "No matter what discipline you're in, everybody deals with business at some level during their lifetime. This minor will give them an awareness of what they're dealing with on a daily basis."

The new seven-course minor program enables students to gain an understanding of how businesses operate and the areas of accounting, finance and law, information systems, management and marketing.

Additionally, the minor in business will provide students with the prerequisites needed to enter most MBA programs.

Formal discussion on the possibility of offering a business minor began in the spring of 1993, says Olivo.

"I'd like to publicly recognize the College of Business curriculum committee for its work in creating this minor."

The addition of the minor is partly in response to student inquiries about minoring in business and also in response to requests from the chemistry and physics departments for a program which would allow their majors to graduate with a bachelor of science degree and an MBA in five years.

In researching the need for a minor in business, it was found that from the spring semester of 1990 to the fall semester of 1993, between 15 and 50 percent of the students enrolled in the seven courses required for the business minor were non-business majors. Previously these courses were counted as free electives by the university when taken by non-business majors. Now, as part of a business minor, these courses will enhance Bloomsburg graduates' employment opportunities, Olivo says.

The recommended course sequence for the minor is Introduction to Business, Introduction to Computer and Information Science, Financial Accounting, Principles of Management, Business Law I, Principles of Marketing and Principles of Finance. Economics I and II are prerequisites for the minor. A minimum of 12 of the 21 credits in the minor must be taken at Bloomsburg University.

"This has been a long time coming, as many faculty stated," says Olivo. Besides benefiting non-business majors by giving them a

Chuck Daly '52 resigned as coach of the NBA's New Jersey Nets on May 26, indicating his next venture will be broadcasting.

"This is a happy day for me," Daly said at a news conference. "It's not a sad day, even though I had to agonize over it because when you do this for 38 or 39 years, . . . it's a tough decision.

"But it was a decision I had to make personally because I felt it was time to go. It was a gut feeling. I knew when it was time to leave Detroit, not on what transpired but that it was time to leave. I felt this was the proper time for me to remove myself from the bench and move on to these other endeavors."

While using his trademark "You never say never" expression, the recent inductee into the Basketball Hall of Fame said he doubted he would either return to coaching or take an NBA general manager's job.

Daly, who led the Detroit Pistons to consecutive titles in 1989 and 1990 and posted a .598 winning percentage in 12 NBA seasons, signed a new two-year contract with the Nets to do infomercials and possibly pre-game shows. He also said he has signed a four-year contract with TBS to be an analyst on the superstation's new game of the week on Thursday nights.

"I love basketball," Daly said. "I love NBA basketball and I am going to continue to work in it and talk about it."

Student receives national award

John McDaniel, a senior from Philadelphia majoring in sociology and criminal justice at Bloomsburg University, received The Michael Schwerner Activist Award on May 23 in Washington, D.C.

The award is dedicated to the memory of Michael Schwerner, an impassioned civil rights activist who was kidnapped and murdered along with two associates in Mississippi in June 1964.

Five awards of \$1,000 each are presented annually to the undergraduate college students in the United States who best fulfill the spirit of citizen activism and promote positive solutions for social change.

McDaniel was instrumental in the planning and organization of the university's first and second Gospelrama programs. As a past treasurer of the Student Government Association, he helped develop student leadership retreats and helped organize a campus-wide rally against hate crimes. He supported the creation of Students Together Alleviating Racial Tension, a multiethnic student group who work to overcome the barriers of racism and inequality. McDaniel backed a successful movement to win approval to include a course requirement in cultural diversity as part of the university's general education program.

Among his other honors and accomplishments, he has received the Outstanding Student Award four times. He was special projects chairperson for the Black Cultural Society and a member of the Black History Month committee. He has served on the University-Community Task Force on Racial Equity and helped coordinate that organization's "Hands Across Bloomsburg." For

Roy Smith, director of the Quest program at Bloomsburg University, has announced the following schedule of trips for the rest of 1994:

England

Our 12-day walk across the breadth of northern England will take us through some of the island's most beautiful mountains and moorlands. Our walk will begin in the Lake District Region of Northwest England and will finish across the North Yorkshire Moors from St. Bees on the Irish Sea to Robin Hood's Bay on the North Sea.

The walk passes through a hilly landscape of highland sheep farms, villages of stone walled houses, inns and ancient churches. It is the land of Wordsworth and James Herriot, author of *All Things Bright and Beautiful*. The Romans passed through this region 2,000 years ago, followed by the Danes, Saxons and Vikings. Traces of their passing can be found along the old pathways, churches and landscape.

12 days, July 30 to August 10, 1994. Total cost including airfare: \$1,700.

Scotland

We will start this trip at Ruwardemun, which lies on the eastern shores of Loch Lomond, across the western fringe of Rannoch Moor and on through the magnificent and wild landscape of Glencoe and the Manmores to Fort William at the foot of Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain.

From Fort William, we will travel by train to Kyle of Lochalsh via Inverness, passing through remote and beautiful highland glens. The following morning we will take the ferry across Lochalsh to the Isle of Skye, spending an entire day and night on the island before crossing back to the mainland and traveling south to St. Andrews and Edinburgh, where we will spend the last of our time in Scotland.

13 days, September 24 to October 6, 1994. Land cost: \$1,200.

France

This walk begins in the small towns of the Alsace into the mountains of the Vosges. We will begin in the city of Mulhouse in the Valley of the Rhine and travel north, with Strasbourg, the capital of the Alsace, as our final goal.

Our walk will take us along one of Europe's long-distance hiking trails, leading us over moderate peaks and past impressive medieval ruins. On

the way north, we will visit the Colmar, one of the region's most beautiful towns and a leading art center.

Several moderate hiking days, interrupted by sightseeing in charming towns, will bring us to Strasbourg, known around the world for its cathedral, museums and picturesque neighborhoods.

14 days, May 23 to June 14, 1994.
Land cost: \$1,100.

Alaska/Yukon

We will descend the Tatshenshini River (described in the February 1994 issue of *National Geographic*), starting in Yukon Territory and traveling west through the Coastal Range to the Pacific Ocean.

In recent years the river has achieved international recognition on account of the spectacular nature of the country it passes through. As the river threads its way west, the land grows increasingly dramatic, escalating from lush upland meadows — habitat of bald eagles, grizzlies, wolves and Dall sheep — to the floating icebergs and the 15,000-foot peaks of the St. Elias Range, which harbors the world's largest non-polar glacier system.

(This trip will be led by Roy Smith. In 1976, he led a National Geographic-sponsored expedition of six students that made the first crossing of the Alaska Brooks Range on skis, a journey of 400 miles from the Arctic Circle to the Arctic Ocean.)

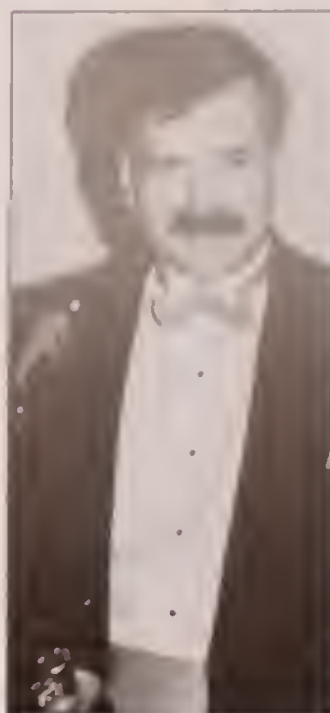
Ambassadors win recognition

Tom Little '62 was featured in an article by Ted Caddell which appeared in the June 12 issue of the *Wilmington Sunday News Journal*. Excerpts follow:

When we last left former Wilmington attorney Tommy Little, he was languishing in a Namibian hospital recovering from a virulent bout of malaria and wondering how he was going to get home.

Well, the indomitable expatriate has landed on his feet.

Little — former Marine Corps drill instructor, state representative, public defender and judo champion — has a teaching position at a company-run

school on the coast of that west African country and is flourishing.

"I'm teaching law to policemen, English to adults, coaching at a local swimming pool, and I'm having a good time," Little, 58, said in a telephone interview. "I feel great."

Little left the United States in January, having signed on with a nonprofit organization that provides educators for Third World countries. He was assigned to a small village in the hush of the northeast panhandle of the Republic of Namibia, living in a mud hut and subsisting on a corn meal and tinned food diet.

He later discovered that it was one of the worst places in the country for malaria. Little had been advised to take a course of medicine before going to Namibia to guard against malaria. "The bottom line was, the drugs cost \$4,000. I just didn't have it," he said.

In April, he began suffering from what he thought at first was heat exhaustion. While house-sitting for a friend, Little fell unconscious. Only the arrival of another friend three days later saved him, he said.

Little drifted in and out of consciousness for three days in a hospital, his temperature rocketing to 103.5.

He was eventually released from the hospital, less 30 pounds on his already slight frame. The teaching organization, WorldTeach, Inc., was forced to give him a medical discharge.

When he left the hospital, he was without a job, and appalled at the detour his life had taken. "I was broke," he said. "I hadn't been paid since I came over."

He stayed two weeks at a Catholic mission, recuperating, and with the help of friends got a reservation on a flight back home, due to leave on June 2.

Several days before he was to leave, Little ran into a man whom he had met when he first arrived in Namibia. The man was leaving a teaching position at a school run by the Rossing Uranium Foundation, a private mining concern in Swakopmund, near the coastal city of Walvis Bay.

"An hour before I was to leave, I got the job," Little said. He has a guaranteed job until January, and wants to stay even longer. He was still without money, however, and called a friend to wire him \$500 from his Wilmington account.

So Little is fulfilling his dream again — teaching, and has put all the bad memories behind him.

"I'm an optimist," he said. "Once the pain goes away, I'm all right."

Walter and his wife, Joy, moved to Orlando, Florida, in January and recently moved into their new golf course home in the Hunter's Creek section of Orlando. His current plans are to play golf, swim, walk, travel and spend considerable time with his two granddaughters who live nearby.

Alumnus named to new Vatican post

Hugh Dempsey '70 has been named executive director of the newly created Vatican Museums Foundation, which raises money to preserve and restore the Vatican's artistic treasures.

From paradise, purgatory, or perhaps some ring of Dante's inferno, ancient artists are crying out for Hugh Dempsey's help.

When he considers those who toil for the faith in slums and war zones, Dempsey readily notes that his work lacks an element of heroic virtue.

"I don't want to make it sound like I'm trying to replace Mother Teresa," he said. But he does believe his efforts are a religious calling.

Preserving the Vatican's cultural treasures "is tied right into the very origin of our faith, because our faith is about love of and for people and civilizations. The museums really house civilizations. It's not just a picture gallery."

The Vatican Museums encompass 13 separate museums, the most famous of which is also a worship site: the Sistine Chapel. They also include a museum of contemporary art, a tapestry museum and a carriage museum featuring modes of papal transportation through the ages.

Although the museums are a part of the Holy See, they receive no money from the papal treasury, which has battled deficits for years. Entrance fees from two million tourists a year pay for staff and utilities. But money for preservation, restoration, acquisitions, exhibits and building renovations must come from elsewhere.

Japan's Nippon Television network underwrote the famed restoration of Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel masterpieces. Although the general public isn't likely to notice, the project "involved redoing the whole airflow system in the chapel. If we are intent upon preserving these works for future generations, we must do this. This is ancient art housed in very old buildings," Dempsey said.

Art experts agree.

The Vatican Museums house "without a doubt, one of the major collections of art in the entire world," said Albert Labriola, a distinguished professor at Duquesne University. Labriola, who teaches interdisciplinary courses in art and literature, has led field trips to the Vatican Museums.

"In some of the museums, the holdings are in dire need of restoration. The need is as great as there was for the restoration of Michelangelo's paintings in the Sistine Chapel," he said.

Some renowned paintings have become "inaccessible to scrutiny, so many of their details are obscured," he reported. The Vatican has demonstrated its expertise at restoration, but only when it can find the money to pay for it.

Dempsey, 45, is somewhat amazed that this task should have fallen to him. He was raised in a traditional Irish-Catholic family in northeastern Pennsylvania, but attended public schools and was never an altar boy. In college, he studied education and child psychology, not art. His first job was as a first-grade teacher and principal in a three-room school in Falls, Wyoming County, where he regularly had to chase cows off the playground.

Time and circumstance have since led him down other paths.

From elementary education he moved to college education and then to business. He made his fortune as owner and chief executive officer of The Dempsey Group, a management consulting firm. He also has been active in Republican politics.

The Catholic Church has long tapped Dempsey's fund-raising expertise. In addition to local projects for the Greensburg diocese and St. Vincent

College, he has served as international vice chairman of the Social Action and Preservation Committee of St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York. That led to his induction into two Catholic religious orders for lay people — the Knights of Malta and the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre.

Both dated to the Middle Ages. But in the United States, the Knights of Malta has become a powerful forum for bringing men and women from the business and philanthropic communities into the active service of the Catholic Church.

Joining the Knights of Malta "was probably the most significant religious awakening I have had in terms of realizing that many, many lay people feel called to do more than average (for the church) with their resources and their time," Dempsey said.

His wife, Ruey (Class of 1967), an expert on Food and Drug Administration regulations who works for Vascor Inc. in Fox Chapel, is a Presbyterian. Yet she has been totally supportive of his efforts, Dempsey said. His favorite picture of them as a couple shows her shaking hands with Pope John Paul II.

Dempsey's involvement with the Vatican Museums began three years ago with a suggestion from a close friend with strong ties to the museum. In the time since, he's worked with patron groups in cities and states across North America building support for various preservation and restoration projects.

In April, he led 250 Americans to the Vatican for the unveiling of the restored "Last Judgment" in the Sistine Chapel. The same week, the Vatican announced his appointment as executive director of the foundation.

One major task is to build an endowment, which the museums now lack. Plus, there are many specific restoration projects for which he seeks sponsors.

Dempsey hopes the museum can someday acquire a current popemobile — perhaps the 1980s Mercedes dune buggy version or the Chevrolet pickup truck His Holiness used in August in Denver.

"There is a papal garage that I would love to get into," he said.

California patrons subsidize the museums' conservation laboratory, a state-of-the-art studio where the Sistine Chapel restoration was researched and planned.

Some relatively inexpensive projects are also available. Restoring a single piece of armor in the papal military museum is a very manageable undertaking, he said.

Pittsburgh patrons have taken on the restoration of two statues — a bust of Julius Caesar and a larger-than-life rendering of Neptune being tended by cherubs — for a combined total of \$15,000.

"I see this fund raising, in five years, as really becoming a major, major help to the museums," Dempsey said.

"And although a great deal of (this work) is financial, it also involves planning. So many of the people who go to the museums are Americans. I see a tremendous interest on the part of the museums in being user friendly."

Dempsey has restructured the management of his company so he can give high priority to the Vatican Museums Foundation.

"It will take a great deal of time because there is a great deal of travel involved," said Dempsey, who has visited the Vatican five times this year. "I see myself at some point later in life spending more time there."

For now, he's still a little in awe of it all.

"It's a long way from Falls Elementary School," he said.

Miniature golf course memorial to daughter

The following article about Thomas R. Fleegeer '71 was written by Vicki Terwilliger for The Pottsville Republican newspaper.)

Thomas R. Fleegeer strategically positions the waterfalls and sandtraps at his new miniature golf course to challenge every player.

However, losing a 14-year-old daughter to cancer was one experience Fleegeer never wants anyone else to encounter.

It was after the loss of his daughter, Krista J., in October 1991, that the Tri-Valley High School business teacher embarked on his latest business venture.

"When Krista was sick, we had so much support from the community, monetarily and spiritually. We were looking for a way to help pay the community hack," said Fleegeer, of Valley View.

Like any well-attuned father, Fleegeer saw children in the area searching for fun and wanted to provide them with a recreational outlet. Family and friends portray Fleegeer as a man who "adopts" all children in the community as his own.

On Sunday he opened the Tri-Valley Miniature Golf Course. Fleegeer, 45, purchased the Tri-Valley Treat along Route 25 in Valley View in November 1991 and started building the course this March.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the restaurant's founding, according to Fleegeer. He kept the name the same, although several people had asked the family if they would consider using Krista's name.

Krista had seen the restaurant and ice cream stand was up for sale on her way home from school.

"A week before she died, we told her we were going to buy it and she was happy," Fleegeer said. "It's mostly because of her that we're here," he said.

His 18th-hole course consumes 14,000 square feet behind the restaurant. Natural obstacles like waterfalls, sand traps and ponds offer hackers an inviting view at every turn.

He grins as he tours his miniature golf course, pointing to the inviting pools of water.

"We've got the fishing nets. That's why the kids like it. They'll be able to splash in the water a little bit. They don't care about their scores," Fleegeer laughed.

This summer, cancer patients from Geisinger Medical Center's pediatric unit will have a chance to pitter on Fleegeer's course. He plans to close the greens to the public for one day to allow the children a day to play. The date of the event has not been finalized.

Krista was treated at Geisinger and received excellent care, her father said. Fleegeer realizes how difficult it is for children to be hospitalized.

He said he wants to see them laugh and allow them fun time away from the hospital. Volunteers will be provided to help patients around the course if they request assistance, he said.

Fleegeer's home near the restaurant is also medically accessible, which means he has installed ramps and will have beds available for children to use. He said he wants to open his home to cancer patients so that they can have a place to rest or receive intravenous treatments while they visit.

Fleegeer and his wife, Patricia, have three other children. Pamela, 22, Steven, nine; and Michelle, eight. Pamela majored in elementary education at Bloomsburg and graduated in May. She was married on May 21 and now lives in Norfolk, Virginia.

The two younger children spend many of their afternoons at the restaurant and the golf course.

"My kids want to be the managers, so I tell them they are," he said.

Michelle and Steven hug their father as they get off the school bus. He listens as Michelle tells about a friend's slumber party and offers her dad a suggestion on where to place a mountain goat on the golf course.

"We've already had something so terrible happen to us that if anything

else happened, it's significant," Mrs. Fleegeer said. "He's the calmer of us two.

"He always said if things work out, OK. If not, we'll just start over," she said of her husband's driving spirit.

Fleegeer seems to be a natural hit with children, perhaps because of his own sense of adventure. Fleegeer said he always enjoyed playing sports, lettering four years in college baseball. He served as a football and basketball coach at Tri-Valley in the early 1970s, and was student council advisor for 20 years.

A fellow teacher, Harold Frantz of Pine Grove, got Fleegeer interested in harness racing about 20 years ago. Frantz is now retired.

Fleegeer raced at Pocono Downs in Wilkes-Barre, the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia, the Meadows in Pittsburgh, Rosecroft, Md., and Yonkers, N.Y.

"Krista used to go with me. She loved the horses," he said.

About 10 years ago, Fleegeer was in a racing accident where he got banged up and broke his arm, his wife said. However, he continued to race until his daughter became ill in July 1991.

He owned 17 standard bred harness horses but put them and his 54-acre farm in Spring Glen up for sale in 1991 to help pay his daughter's medical bills.

Fleegeer left his wife at his daughter's bedside at and hospital and returned with the news he was selling the farm.

"He didn't talk to either of us about it. Krista cried and was a little mad, because she wanted to start training with Tom," Mrs. Fleegeer said.

Mrs. Fleegeer said Krista wanted to learn to race. She also loved to cook and had considered being either a chef or a veterinarian, her mother said.

"It gave us something to do after she was gone. You need something to go on," Mrs. Fleegeer said of the restaurant.

English teacher Jack Herb has known Fleegeer for 20 years. He said Fleegeer has an excellent rapport with students and staff.

"He's the kind of person that will go out of his way for others. He's very low-key and doesn't thrive on notoriety," Herb said.

Fleegeer was also a former chief negotiator for the Tri-Valley Education Association.

"It was more I was drafted than volunteered," he said of his 12 years negotiating for the 70-member union.

Fleegeer's personality also made him an easy choice for the negotiator's job, according to Herb.

"He's more than able. He has a quick mind and can deal with impromptu, but also long-range planning," Herb said.

Despite wanting to spend more time at the hospital with his daughter, Fleegeer continued to serve as negotiator in 1991. He scheduled contract talks late in the evening so he could be with Krista during the day in the summer and his wife could stay with her at night.

Although he realized his position may not be a popular one with everyone in the community, Fleegeer kept negotiating. His tenure was marked by a nine-day teachers' strike in September 1991, just weeks before his daughter's death.

Mrs. Fleegeer said they had discussed his quitting the negotiations, but Krista wanted him to stay on board. Krista died before she could see the results of her father's labors.

Fleegeer grew up in Turbotville and graduated from Warmor Run High School in 1967. He earned a bachelor's degree in business education in 1971 at Bloomsburg. In September of that year he landed his first job as a business teacher at Tri-Valley High School.

"I moved here with the idea of only staying a year or two. But I loved it here, then I never left," he said.

After his 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. shift at the high school, Fleegeer spends his evenings at the restaurant. His wife runs the business during the day.

"This is a family thing to do and I believe families should do things together," Fleegeer said.

Placement record hits 80%

Of the 1,300 Bloomsburg University graduates of December 1992, May 1993 and August 1993, 80.31 percent secured professional or meaningful employment in their chosen fields. This represents an increase of 7.02 from the overall placement rate of 73.29 for 1992.

"We are tremendously proud of this record," says Carol Matteson, interim provost and vice president of academic affairs. "It is an outstanding accomplishment by our graduates, especially in today's challenging economic climate. This speaks very well for the reputation of its faculty and students."

The percentage of graduates placed in each of the university's three schools is as follows: College of Professional Studies (including education majors), 74.49 percent; College of Arts and Sciences, 82.96 percent; and College of Business, 84.97 percent.

A significant number of education majors are substitute teaching on a day-to-day basis, according to Carol Barnett, director of the Career Development Center.

In the College of Professional Studies, graduates in the following curriculum areas experienced 100 percent placement: Dental hygiene, interpreter training, medical technology, radiological technology, secondary education/chemistry, secondary education/earth and space science, secondary education/Spanish and early childhood education. Nursing and speech correction graduates experienced placement above 90 percent.

Graduates in the College of Arts and Sciences experienced 100 percent placement in the following curriculum areas: Anthropology, art history, economics, French, health physics, humanities, liberal arts, music, philosophy, social science and theater arts. Over 90 percent placement was achieved by graduates majoring in adult health, biology and political science.

Getting HIGH in India

Jim Thorpe, Pennsylvania is known as "The Switzerland of America." Built in three distinct sections (Downtown, The Heights, The East Side), it tentatively pours itself over mountain ridges, through ancient mountain canyons, down the sides of hundred-million-year-old alluvial fans. In a state noted for its mountains, Jim Thorpe (nee Mauch Chunk: "Bear Mountain") teeters on taking mountain living to the extreme: Race Street in the Downtown area boasts a line of rowhouses and a church (St. Mark's) actually built into the mountainside, the bare mountain rock providing the rear wall of the buildings.

Bear Mountain, after which the town was named, provides a wide fortress wall for the East Side that pretty much kept the world outside during the 1950s. Occasionally an airplane (still an object of curiosity in 1953) or dirigible breached the long mountain on its way to somewhere else. In order to pull television signals in from the outside world, local businessmen interested in selling television sets from their appliance stores invented community cable TV systems.

Jim Thorpe was an insular world dependent on the outside world. The anthracite coal mines drilled into the surrounding mountains were in the process of exhausting themselves while the hardy, weed-like white birch tree had begun reclaiming abandoned slag heaps where strip mining had scarred the backsides of nearby mountains. If they wanted to work, the men of Jim Thorpe were forced to leave the mountain fortress for jobs at the Bethlehem Steel Company, the Palmerton Zinc, or light manufacturing plants in Hazleton.

The mountains that kept the world out and the kids in provided a perfect playground. Kids swarmed over Bear Mountain like mice over, around, and through a mountain of Swiss cheese. They occasionally found the skeleton of a wayward dog on the backside of the mountain and attempted to convince each other they were rare dinosaur bones.

Bear Mountain and Mt. Pisgah across the Lehigh River (where the world's first gravity railroad once ran) were benign babysitters, wondrous playgrounds, sacred places rife with abandoned tunnels and conglomerate boulders the size of school buses. From atop Big Rock, at the pinnacle of Bear Mountain, we could linger over our lunch while surveying and theorizing about other ranges of mountains miles and miles away and what might lie beyond them.

Stuffed with book knowledge and television images spirited from television stations hundreds of miles away, we squirreled away little nuts of knowledge and hoarded them until they germinated.

To our knowledge, the four great mountain peaks of the world were Bear Mountain, Hawk Mountain (where we were occasionally driven by our parents to watch the raptor migration), Spyglass Hill (as described in Robert

Louis Stevenson's *Treasure Island*), and Mt. Everest, which was the highest mountain on the planet (reputedly almost *twice* as high as Bear Mountain). Located on the opposite side of the world, Everest had just been climbed by a guy named Sir Edmund Hillary. We assumed Hillary was from England (he was actually from New Zealand) and that you had to have a royal title of some kind in order to engage in supreme adventures such as climbing the highest or traveling the farthest or driving the fastest. That naive notion was eventually to be exploded by Yuri Gagarin and the Mercury astronauts.

Hemmed in by our mighty mountains, receiving the occasional signal from the outside world, we were warm and snug in our seven-year-old cockiness and stupidity.

But with each year's assault of cable television signals, and with each armful of both required-reading and optional-reading books, the dimensions and protection of our mountains diminished. And the Himalayan chain and other distant mountain ranges grew. We saw dramatic pictures of Everest with its eternal and infernal snows. We saw films of the Rocky Mountains and the terrible Sierra Nevada where the Donner wagon train stalled in 1846 and where some of the immigrants survived by eating their dead.

Increasingly, there was a terrible aspect to the world beyond our mountains. Yes, bad things happened occasionally within the confines of our mountains, but the bad things were always recognizable in a town where everyone knew everyone else. Beyond our mountains, bigger bad things happened — some things so big they were beyond comprehension.

Beyond the mountains, it seemed almost anything

could happen anywhere in a bigger way — and often did: War, earthquakes, famine, floods. Our disasters were minor by comparison: the occasional hurricane visited us, the odd snowstorm trapped us in our houses and cancelled school, a former miner too long out of work got drunk and tried to beat up everyone on the block.

Eventually, in high school in the early 1960s, the center of our universe lept the entire length of the country. Our youth culture received cryptic instructions from California sent over our cable TV through "American Bandstand" and through AM radio stations. The totems were cars and surfboards and ocean waves rising in our imaginations as high as our precious mountains, and perhaps higher.

Jan & Dean sang about "Sidewalk Surfing" and the Beach Boys sang "I Get Around" and overnight our entire graduating class of 1964 lusted to rush to California. I resisted the California dream as too great a leap for a small town kid.

That autumn, the college experience started at Bloomsburg State College and the fashion statement was a silly dink, a frosh sandwichboard with our name and hometown, demands from sophomores to perform "I'm A Little Teacup" in front of the lunch crowd in Husky Lounge, and the Madras shirt from India: a shirt dyed so poorly its colors were actually *supposed* to run. As the 1960s progressed, the Beatles and some of the Beach Boys rushed to India for enlightenment. As my classmates in high school had lusted for California, now fledgling teachers graduating BSC postponed their careers to travel to India for some sort of spiritual enlightenment I didn't quite understand. As I'd resisted

is a former newspaper and magazine editor, author
a part-time runner who has several times run from

the California dream, I now resisted India and returned
to Jim Thorpe to work on the local newspaper.

In that cosmic irony that permeates life, a decade later
the stick-in-the-mud ended up living in Northern
California, and a decade later still, an opportunity
arrived to check out the Himalayan Mountains from
India's northern edge — and to compare them lamely to
the mountains of Pennsylvania.

Of course my education in relative altitudes had
expanded somewhat since early grade school. I'd had
several opportunities in California to backpack for a
week at a time in the Sierra Nevada. I'd lived for five
years in the shadow of Mt. St. Helena in California's
Napa Valley, the mountain resort Robert Louis
Stevenson used as the model for Spyglass Hill. And I'd
taken day hikes four or five times to the peak of Mt.
Whitney in southeastern California — at 14,494 feet the
highest peak in the lower 48 states.

It had come as something of a shock to my Pennsylva-
nia prejudice to realize that benign old Mt. St. Helena, a
pile of discarded volcanic debris piled to 4,344 feet, is
higher than any mountain in Pennsylvania, where the
highest peak (Mt. Davis in Somerset County) is a mere
3,213 feet.

It came as even more of a shock to realize while doing
research on the Himalayan Mountains that they essen-
tially began where California's Mt. Whitney left off. Mt.
Everest, in fact, is more than twice as high as Whitney.
Recalling the difficulty I'd had breathing at Whitney's
peak, the trip to India's northern borders for an unim-
peded view of the Himalayan range promised to offer
some spiritual enlightenment, even if it came in the cut-
rate form of hypoxia.

The Himalayan trip materialized in a round-about
way. In 1991, Jim Crosswhite, an adventure runner (i.e.,
a guy who spends days running across mountains while
entirely self-sufficient) who had done quite a bit of
running on the shoulders of the Himalayan mountains,
felt compelled to share his experiences with other
athletes. He organized a small group of ultrarunners and
hailed their asses to northern India to run what turned
out to be an 88-mile, five-day stage race that started at
7,045, peaked at 12,000 feet, and then returned to its
starting point.

In 1992 Jim increased the size of his group and again
ran the 88-mile loop in five days. He'd set up the course
as a 100-mile stage race, but found that the rapid ascent
to altitude pretty much wiped out many of the runners
after they'd spent more than a day traveling halfway
around the world.

For 1993, the trip was again expanded in size and
length. Forty runners from nearly a dozen countries
flew to New Delhi, caught a few hours' sleep, then flew
to Bagdogra, an Indian Air Force base that accepts one
commercial flight per day, but under very strict security.
The Indian Air Force at Bagdogra flies MIG fighters,
each of them painted to the pilot's specs with caricatures

of dragons, tigers, and other beasts I assume either
reflected that particular pilot's highly inflated opinion of
himself or indicated he was stalled in early adolescence.
The firebird painted on the hood of Burt Reynolds' Pontiac
Firebird in his "Smokey & The Bandit" movies pretty much
captures it. For a country whose resources are strained by
something like one million births per month, the fighter pilots
squandered enormous amounts of fuel launching themselves
over a particularly incongruous scene: Women carrying
cobblestones in their baskets on their heads while men on
their knees fitted the cobblestones to repair the sides of the
runways.

Stuck in the grassy parking lot of the Bagdogra airport
for two hours while our baggage was adroitly hoisted

atop three waiting buses provided an opportunity to meet
our traveling companions. Our bus trip from Bagdogra
(414 feet) to the Chancellor Hotel in mountainous
Darjeeling (6,890 feet) was estimated at four hours. It
was four hours of some of the most invigorating travel
I'd ever experienced.

Our diesel-driven bus was about half the length of an
American bus but with the same width and twice the
capacity to belch out noxious exhaust. Unfortunately,
the country roads in India had never been built for buses;
they'd been built for ox carts. Consequently, when the
bus straining uphill met a Jeep coming downhill, the
uphill vehicle had the right-of-way (not too unlike
backpacking) — if the driver could get his bus around
the stopped Jeep. The process often involved a great
deal of hacking up and inching forward. Fortunately, the
buses had not been recently painted, for if they had been,
we'd have had more fenderhending than we did, because
some of the passing vehicles came within one coat of
paint of disaster.

As if the close quarters weren't enough, the pride of
Darjeeling is a coal-fired narrow-gauge Toy Train that
runs from Darjeeling into the valley many thousands of
feet below — along the side of the same road we were
on, often crossing it. Halfway through our trip, as
darkness came on, the single headlight of the Toy Train
approached from uphill while our bus was halfway onto
the tracks in an attempt to get around a line of three
diesel smoke-spewing Jeeps. Our driver pulled the bus
off the tracks just as the flame-and-cinder-spewing train
went noisily and cheerily past, gaily-clothed passengers
hanging out the windows waving enthusiastically
between grimaces of anticipated disasters.

As we chugged up the increasingly narrowed winding
road, we passed often windowless homes clinging to the
side of the road, backed onto 500-foot drops. As often
as not, the meager little houses were illuminated inside
by the glare of a black and white television set. Occa-
sionally, on the roofs of some of the better-constructed
houses, satellite TV dishes perched. (We would be
doubly taken aback two days later when we visited the
Ghoom Monastery, which boasts a satellite TV dish on
its roof. Apparently the spirits of CNN and BBC are

welcomed in the rarefied air as gladly as are the ethereal spirits.)

The Chancellor Hotel was chosen as our base of operations because, according to Major Domo Crosswhite, it was more dependable than other hotels in Darjeeling: It had its own water supply and its own electric generator. Power in Darjeeling was, at best, a fleeting option; the glass resistors still in use on the power poles would set the heart of any antique collector fluttering wildly.

Our room was spacious enough, but damp and chilly. Heat was provided by an electric space heater and/or a kerosene heater whose fumes were too deadly to chance. The room featured a television set that offered six channels: an Indian government-controlled channel, a BBC channel, a channel that seemed to be empty half the time, and three channels offering MTV filtered through Hong Kong or somewhere deep in southeast Asia. Not long after unpacking, the power in our section of town went out and the generator eventually kicked in. The space heater died, all but one 25-watt bulb went out, and the television stayed on! Before going to dinner, we watched a 15-minute production of a 15K all-India cross country meet in which each runner was subjected to a thorough medical examination before he was allowed to line up at the start. If young men about to run 9.3 miles were being subjected to such close scrutiny, I wondered what type of invasive medical exploration was in store for our 40 odd "mature" runners intent on running 100 miles.

We went upstairs to the dining room for a briefing and an evening meal heavy on rice, bread, and chicken parts in a blonde gravy. We discovered that the hotel offered a Calcutta beer in tall (Japanese style) bottles for Rs. 40 — a bit more than a dollar (We'd changed \$200 into rupees at our hotel in Delhi; the manager discouraged us from changing more. As it was, the \$200 translated to Rs. 6200, a wad of paper that I stuffed into my front left jean pocket. As I was frisked by the police sergeant at the domestic Delhi airport before boarding the plane for Bagdogra, he encountered the wad of rupies and smiled: "Ah, A Tourist!")

We crawled into bed at 9 p.m., exhausted from flying halfway around the world. Our exhaustion was soon to be tested, however. At 3 a.m., a dog began to bark. It sounded as though it had set up housekeeping in the bathroom. Its bark was very much unlike an American dog: Less monotonous and more insistent. The barking began to gradually fade away, then vanished, only to increase in volume a half-hour later. For the rest of the night, the dog's barking vanished and reappeared. We were too exhausted for it to keep us awake

for long, except at those roughly one-hour intervals when the dog seemed to be in the same room with us.

In the morning Rhonda Provost, my wife, took a shower. The radical difference between the warm water and the cold air created an impenetrable cloud in the bathroom, so Rhonda opened the shoulder-high window, only to find that a spider the size of a pack of Tastykake bitter-scotch krumpets had been waiting patiently to come scurrying inside, where we felt obliged to dispatch it to meet its ancestors. When I looked out the bathroom window, I understood the strange acoustics of the barking dog. Even though our room was on the third floor, Darjeeling is built on such a steep slope that the ledge of our bathroom window was on the level of the crumbling asphalt of an alley behind the hotel. The dog had spent the night wandering up and down the alley, while the spider huddled outside waiting for an opportunity to get away from the dog.

Over breakfast we were informed that dogs in India are not kept as pets and that they are periodically hunted and killed. Doc Ben Jones, a fellow Californian always fond of statistical knowledge, informed us that each year some 50,000 people worldwide die of rabies, more than half of them in India, and that perhaps as many as 90 percent of the dogs in India are rabid, and that at night they form packs and roam the streets. No wonder the spider wanted into our room.

Incredibly, when we walked outside the dining room at breakfast and stood on the balcony that placed us four floors above the alley fronting the hotel, we saw that some people living around the edge of an old courtyard across the way were keeping dogs as pets. Three of them were on chains attached to stakes in the ground. In contrast to their level of activity the previous night, these dogs were doing what dogs do best: sleeping.

As we moved to the far end of the balcony, our attention was elevated from the alley below to a view of the edge of the magnificent, snow-covered Kanchenjunga, a massive mountain within the borders of India that stands seemingly akimbo by itself, many miles from the cluster of Lhotse, Everest, and Makalu, which were not visible from our hotel. Kanchenjunga stands an impressive 28,373 feet, nearly twice the height of Mt. Whitney. The sight of Kanchenjunga as it appeared from behind a transient cloud lured the rest of our group to the far edge of the balcony, until we thought we might inadvertently tilt the hotel on its side.

Jim Crosswhite conducted a "briefing" at 9:00 that would have better been described as a "lengthening." Considering that he was

talking to some 60 people from nearly a dozen countries, most of whom had never been to India before, and that he was throwing out names of towns most of us had never heard of and certainly couldn't spell (the race was to begin at the village of Maneybhanjyang, for example), and that he was going into great detail concerning what we'd need to take with us for the five days and what we'd need to leave in the hotel's storage room, the "briefing" lasted a mere 107 minutes.

In the two previous years, the itinerary had been to give an early morning briefing, then load people onto buses for the two-hour ride to Maneybhanjyang, where the first stage of the race would begin. Unfortunately, by Day 3, most of the contestants, still whirling from jet lag, would crump on the side of the trail. This year, the plan was modified to allow us to spend our first full day in Darjeeling resting or touring.

We opted for tonring. We headed off for the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute in the company of Jim's wife, Margaret, a marine doctor who had come along to serve as medical director of the trek.

We decided to stretch our legs and walk the several miles to the famed Institute. The city of Darjeeling exudes an earthiness sohered with a haunting quality of loss. The markets are crowded and bustling. Citizens unaccustomed to the term "trash" liberally littered the street with candy wrappers. Half-inch water pipes ran through gutters and were occasionally driven over by vehicles and patched with tied rags.

We were tom by the price of India's independence from Britain. Their independence was much deserved, hut as we linked to the Institute, we passed constant evidence that the systems that had made Darjeeling a jewel of a mountain station had been allowed to decay. We passed a boys' school and then a college that were deserted. From the walkway above them we could look down into the classrooms, where a book lay open on a desk and a notepad lay next to it, covered with dust. It looked as though the management of the school gave out one day, an announcement was made, the students got up from what they were doing, marched out, and someone padlocked the doors. The gutters on the roofs were clogged with dead leaves, the windows in places translucent with wind-blown dust. The playground of the boys' school was swept clean by the wind, the debris from the overhanging trees swept by the same wind into a pile against a classroom building wall.

Along the narrow macadamed walkway, candy and potato chip wrappers scudded in front of us, yet the one trash receptable we

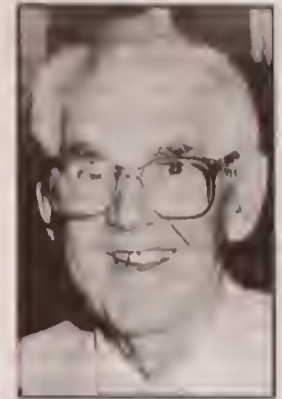

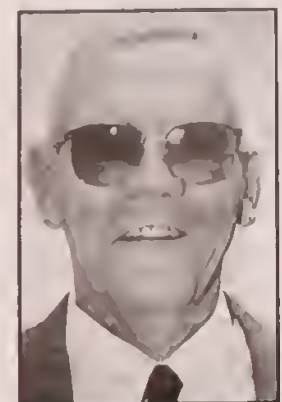


Dan Kemple '40

in addition to playing one season of football. He played on some of the same basketball units as former NBA coach and current Athletic Hall of Famer Chuck Daly '52. As pitcher, his hatterry mate was 1993 inductee George Lambrinos. Byham won seven letters at Bloomsburg.

Playing basketball under Coach Harold Shelley, Byham contributed to some highly successful squads. His team posted a 12-7 overall record in the 1949-1950 as he scored 113 points, good for sixth best on the squad. The following season, his 168 points placed third on a squad that recorded a 9-7 mark. In his senior campaign, the Huskies were 12-4, and he scored 138 points, the second-highest total on the club. For his efforts in the 1951-1952 campaign, he was recognized as an All-Pennsylvania Collegiate Basketball Team honorable mention selection.

He was equally impressive as a baseball player, with a newspaper once describing him as "a hurly southpaw from Kane possessing good control, a tantalizing curveball, and a teasing 'hopper.'" While he was a fine hitter, he truly excelled as a pitcher. In one four-day span during the 1951 season, he hurled consecutive complete game victories over Temple University and King's College, striking out 13 batters on each occasion.

After attending Bloomsburg, he spent over 30 years working in sports radio, while also teaching in the Williamsport area. He has been extremely active in Little League Baseball and in September of 1993, he was recipient of the W. Harold Hartman Friendship Award for his commitment to Little League and for being the radio voice of the Little League World Series for over 31 years.

offensive line, playing center in his initial two campaigns as Bloomsburg posted marks of 5-2-1 and 3-4. An injury halted his junior season as the Huskies went 2-5. He returned his senior year and helped his team garner a 5-2-1 mark.

After graduating, he pursued football coaching as a career. In six seasons at John Harris High School in Harrisburg, his teams posted a 58-4 overall mark, including four undefeated seasons. Each one of those squads won conference championships as Champ was selected "Central Pennsylvania Coach of the Year" following each of his six seasons. After acting as an assistant coach for Ohio State and the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers, he returned to the head coaching ranks.

He coached IUP from 1982-1985 as his teams garnered a 24-16-1 record. He then moved to Marshall University for four years, where his teams achieved a 33-16-1 mark. He has been the head coach at the U.S. Naval Academy since 1990.

Entering the 1991 season, Champ's overall collegiate coaching record in 12 seasons is 68-65-2 while his combined overall record as a head coach in the collegiate and high school ranks is 131-75-2.



Robert Gibble '68

Gibble, a graduate of Reading High School, was a four-year letterman for the baseball squads of the mid-1960s. He graduated with a degree in accounting and was recognized as a member of "Who's Who Among Students in American College and Universities."

As a pitcher, he frequently led his team in a host of categories. In 1966, he led the club in games pitched (seven), complete games (two), innings pitched (40.1) and strikeouts (26). He started that season's opener and hurled a complete game victory, striking out 12 in the 9-5 win over East Stroudsburg. In a complete game 3-2 loss against Kutztown later that season, he struck out 14.

out his career, he was recognized as the team's most reliable starter. He frequently tossed complete games and for his entire collegiate career averaged over one strikeout per inning.

After Bloomsburg, he signed a professional baseball contract with the Oakland Athletics organization and played minor league baseball in the Gulf Coast, Florida State and Southern leagues. After working at Ernst & Young accounting firm, he moved to Beard & Company Inc., where he currently holds the title of president.



Art Luptowski '73

Luptowski, after starting out as a member of the freshmen team, played three years on the Huskies' varsity basketball squad. He was known for directing the Huskies with his dazzling ball handling and playmaking skills in addition to being a clutch player and fine leader. He graduated from Ridley Park, where ironically he failed to make his high school team.

Luptowski first broke into the Bloomsburg starting line-up with only six games remaining in the 1970-1971. A local newspaper probably best summed up the contribution that he made that season. "his ball handling, ball hawking, and scoring provided the spark that was missing from the team for most of the year." The Huskies won their final five games, and Luptowski scored 81 points while appearing in 15 games on the year.

He earned second-team all-conference honors his junior year. He scored 265 points and dished out 146 assists in 24 games, acting as the point guard of a team that posted an 18-7 mark. In 1972-1973, he was the Huskies' captain, a first-team all-conference selection and a NAIA District 19 all-star. He scored 252 points and recorded 178 assists in his senior year.

He finished his career with 598 points and 333 assists. At one time, he held school records for assists in a season and a career. He still holds the single game record for assists (18) and steals (13) in the 87-72 win against West Chester on February 12, 1972.

Souders was a standout pitcher for some of the dominating softball teams of the early 1980s. She was one of the Huskies' first-ever All-Americans in that sport, earning that honor in 1982, 1983 and 1984. During her four seasons, Souders' teams amassed a record of 114-17, good for an .870 winning percentage. Her squads won two PSAC championships and twice placed second in the NCAA East Regional.

In her freshman season, Souders made an immediate impact, posting a 14-2 mark. The next season she was 21-2, a mark that included 15 shutouts. Her 0.25 ERA was the best in the nation, while her 181 strikeouts ranked second. In 1983, she won 22 games and struck out 207 batters while walking only 13. She amassed 17 wins in her senior campaign and a 0.26 ERA.

In a two-day NCAA East regional against Sacred Heart and Mankato State, she pitched 45 consecutive innings, including an NCAA single game record of 23 innings in a 1-0 loss to Sacred Heart on May 11, 1984.

Her 74 career wins ties her for 15th overall on the NCAA Division II list, while her 0.34 career ERA ranks third. She recorded 635 strikeouts and a school-record 46 shutouts in her 610-inning career. She threw three no-hitters, including perfect games against Misericordia (April 16, 1982) and Springfield (May 13, 1983).

She has been employed as a cottage director at the Cunningham's Children's Home for almost six years. A member of the National Association of Social Workers, she earned a master of social work degree at the University of Illinois in 1992.

BU Alumnus Donates to Permanent Art Collection

Joseph E. Hudock '41, this spring, contacted his former classmates, C. Stuart and Eda Bessie (Beltz) Edwards, expressing his interest in giving some of his art to Bloomsburg University.

Discussions with Kenneth Wilson, chairperson of the department of art, led Hudock to send the university a portfolio of 12 photographs of selected pieces, along with accompanying "artems" (BIAFRA CHILD lower right). (According to Hudock, artems are lyrics composed by the artist for his art.)

This gift was followed by five lithographs — Indian Chief and artem (below) and four Albrecht Dürer studies and interpretations (Adam and Eve, St. Jerome, St. Anthony Outside the City, and the Conversion of St. Paul).

After completing a career in teaching, Hudock decided to pursue his first love — art. A California resident, he enrolled in Santa Monica College in the 1970s where he "took every art class available" and worked in every medium. One hundred credit hours later, Hudock has produced more than 500 pieces of art and is still helping his lithography teacher and the students in those classes.

Hudock has had a private showing at Santa Monica College and is now developing a new concept of art which he calls "future art". This concept is based on the

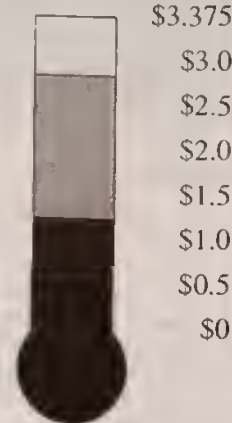

Update - State Goal Surpassed

A Treasury Of Ideas

The Bloomsburg University Foundation has raised \$2.9 million in gifts, pledges, and planned gifts toward building a new library, exceeding the amount necessary to qualify for state matching funds, according to Anthony Ianiero, interim vice president for ad-

vancement.

By raising more than \$2.375 million, representing 25 percent of the cost of the library that the university must raise, Bloomsburg has qualified for \$7.125 million in funding from the Commonwealth's Higher Education Capital Construction Program.

Originally, the plans for the new library called for the construction of a four-story building with the top floor left unfinished for future expansion. In the fall of 1993, the Foundation, with the endorsement of the university's Council of Trustees, voted to raise Bloomsburg's library campaign goal by \$1 million, to a total of \$3.375 million, so all floors of the 105,000 square-foot building could be finished. The total cost of the project, including the design cost and private and matching construction funds to meet the

\$10.5 million construction cost, will exceed \$12.4 million.

"We have less than \$500,000 to raise in order to complete the fourth floor," says Susan Helwig, acting director of development. Of the 28,000 alumni contacted, more than 5,200 pledged.

"Constructing a larger library has been Bloomsburg's top priority capital project for many years," says John Scrimgeour, campaign chairperson and a retired Bloomsburg faculty member. "Since the current Harvey A. Andruss Library was constructed 27 years ago, enrollment at Bloomsburg has doubled.

"Right now, we're aggressively visiting friends of the university, foundations, and corporations to see if they will participate," says Helwig, who stresses the importance of gaining broad-based support in this fund-

raising drive.

"It's the participation of each person that will put us over the top. Businesses and foundations take a project more seriously if the university can show a high participation rate, especially from alumni," says Helwig. Among the recent contributions to the library campaign are \$77,000 in donations from alumni class treasuries and \$36,000 from the 1994 senior class.

"We hope to have the remaining funds raised in time for the ground-breaking ceremony at homecoming in October," says Ianiero. "Actual construction of the library would begin in the spring of 1995."

The new library will be located on the present site of the softball field. Construction is expected to be completed in 1996.

State Funds 44% of BU Budget for 1994-95

State legislative appropriations for Bloomsburg University (and other State System universities) passed in June resulted in \$29,566,366 toward a total budget of \$66,961,877 or 44 percent. This reflects a long history of gradually decreased funding for the State System, for instance, from 60 percent in 1980 to 42 percent in 1992-93 (latest complete data available).

While most people would probably agree that Pennsylvania public higher education is very important and should be funded at a level that is both fair to all its various sectors (community colleges, State System universities, state-related, and state-aided universities) and affordable to students and families, it remains a problematic issue. As long as tax dollars are insufficient to fund public higher education along with increasing demands of other state-funded agencies (i. e., transportation, welfare, and prisons), the challenge reoccurs each year for finding the resources to cover the actual costs of operating state universities.

A large portion of the unfunded balance is met by tuition charged to students, a practice which has been in place for many decades. In the mid 1960s, the basic fee to attend Bloomsburg was \$125 per semester. In 1983, when Bloomsburg received university status, tuition was \$740. This fall it is \$1,543.

For many years it has been a State System objective to offer the best possible education at an affordable cost. The allocation of state funds and tuition paid by students allows Bloomsburg to "open its doors" — pay salaries and purchase basic supplies and a limited amount of equipment. (Room and board fees are set to cover costs resulting from these services and are paid in addition to tuition.)

Unfortunately, the state funds and tuition fail to provide the special programs and opportunities that help to set a Bloomsburg University education apart from others. This is where gifts from private sources become important.

There is not an area at the university that has not been positively affected by these gifts. Funds from these private sources, which comprise approximately 1.7 percent of the university budget, have been, for years, helping Bloomsburg offer an educational curricula that goes beyond "just opening the doors".

But, as long as state dollars available to Bloomsburg University continue to decline and costs increase, the gap to be filled by gifts from private sources will only widen further. Hence, the response from requests to alumni and friends for support becomes increasingly important to sustain the value of a Bloomsburg education.

New IRS Rules Affect Giving

Recent Internal Revenue Service (IRS) rulings and regulations can have a significant affect on Bloomsburg University donors. The deductible value of charitable donations is now subject to new interpretations by the IRS.

The IRS's basic premise is this: A charitable gift can be considered fully deductible only if it is given with no anticipation of receiving — or commitment to receive — anything of substantial value in return. If a donor does receive a benefit, the tax-deductible value of the contribution must be decreased by the worth of the benefit.

Further, the IRS considers it the obligation of the charitable organization — in this case, The Bloomsburg University Foundation — to inform the donor as to the "fair-market value" of the benefit as well as what portion of the gift is deductible. Examples of benefits include tickets to sports events, clothing, and gifts. The fair market value of any gifts will be specified on the solicitation.

For instance, if a donor contributed \$100 to athletics, and received \$15 worth of tickets as a result of that donation, the charitable contribution would be \$85.

Audio-Video recording new track option

Audio-video recording has been implemented as a new track option within the University's bachelor of arts in music degree.

"This program is designed for those musicians with a serious career interest in the technical aspects of sound recording and sound enhancement in the studio, sound lab, or concert hall," says Dr. Stephen Wallace, chairperson of the music department.

Students in the audio-video recording track will take 44 credits of core music courses and four one-semester application internships for 11 credits. While the track option may be new, Bloomsburg has placed interns in a nearby commercial sound and video studio for the past six years.

Wallace stresses the importance of combining formal music education with the technical knowledge of recording techniques. "If you're going to record something, you need to develop a perceptive ear, so you can tell when something sounds right."

Recording equipment in the music department currently consists of a K-2000 Kurzweil keyboard connected to a dedicated 486-level personal computer with "Encore" software, one cassette and two reel-to-reel on location decks, a 12 channel powered mixer board, monitor and main speakers.

Acquisition of additional software and digital audio tape (DAT) recording equipment is imminent. Students in music theory courses also use the computer-keyboard-software combination for music writing, editing and creating compositions which explore multi-instruments. The curriculum will soon include sampling and sequencing.

The department also operates two video camcorders and will engage the equipment, counsel and cooperation of TV/radio services and the department of mass communications.

Music majors may also choose two other tracks — applied (performance) and music history.

encountered next to a park bench was nearly empty.

Nearing the Institute, we opted to take the back way in, which took us through the zoo. Once onsite, the zoo was in need of repair and a coat of paint. Some of the cages had obviously not been used in years. The cage that contained the zoo's tigers was relatively generous; the tigers were huge, their paws the size of tennis rackets, their backs rippling with rivers of sinew at once loose and relaxed, yet clear with their hair-trigger potential.

Above the zoo we passed through the nicely maintained monument to Tenzing Norgay, the Sherpa guide who accompanied Hillary to the peak of Everest in 1953. The monument is dominated by a 20-foot statue of Tenzing, a benign and generous smile etched on his weathered face.

We hurried down to the Mountaineering Institute so as not to delay the showing of a film that detailed a 1977 attempt by the Indian Army to summit Kanchenjunga. The attempt fell well short. One scene in particular stayed with us: In order to cross a particularly deep crevasse, an aluminum extension ladder had been brought up and laid across the crevasse; members of the expedition took turns walking across the ladder while a thousand-foot hole yawned open waiting to devour the unsteady.

On the walk back to the hotel, while Rhonda and Margaret wandered through the market looking at jewelry and clothing, I allowed myself to be lured into the Oxford Book & Stationary Co., where I found a 306-page hardback book on the history of Darjeeling and the Sikkim Himalaya for Rs. 250 (about \$7.50) and a slightly damaged and musty but very serviceable 1983 reprint of a 1921 book on the Darjeeling-Himalayan Railway which went for only a buck.

I took my treasures back to our hotel room and began to page through them only to be overtaken by a dozen time zones. I woke in time to reorganize our duffelbags: One was going with us for five days, the other was staying at the hotel against our return. We ate early and went to bed with a 4 a.m. wake-up call.

Sometime around 10 p.m., a guest in another room suffered upset stomach and began a marathon session of vomiting. Outside our alley-level room, the same dog made his rounds, howling at a moon that had not yet come out. We stuffed toilet paper in our ears and slept.

Dutiful travelers, we were up at four a.m. and in our bus at five. The bus moved out the alley to the street and sat there, with us stuffed into it, for 75 minutes. We eventually began the two-hour drive to the start of the run, which involved 1,000 feet of uphill driving before dropping 1,000 feet down a winding road on the

Veterans committee designated as 50th anniversary unit at B.U.

Commemoration of the World War II years, 1941-1945, using on-going programs over the period 1991-1995 has dominated national news events over the past months. Most recent press and television coverage was of the 50th anniversary of D-Day on June 6.

The Department of Defense, in an effort to promote knowledge of World War II and to provide a continuing legacy for future generations, has established programs that will allow designated committees to participate in the World War II 50th Anniversary Commemorative Program.

The Bloomsburg University Alumni Veterans Committee applied for designated status which was received on June 15, 1994. Acceptance by the Department of Defense was based upon the Veterans Committee meeting certain criteria through present and past efforts to promote veterans' programs and to provide scholarships to veterans' sons or daughters.

Excerpted text of the application to the Department of Defense is as follows:

1. Organize a Commemorative Committee. The Veterans Committee of the Bloomsburg University Alumni Association was organized 10 years ago and has been involved in on going projects for veteran recognition including scholarships to qualifying family members. We continue to meet on a limited basis to review old projects and consider new avenues for Alumni Veterans.

2. Plan three or more events per year from 1993 through 1995. Enclosed are publicity items, schedules of dedicatory events, brochures, and memorial planning sheets that we submit to you for consideration as meeting criterion two for three events per year. These events include:

A. (1993) Fiftieth anniversary celebration by the U.S. Navy's V-12 classes at Bloomsburg University in July 1993.

B. (1993) Awarding the Veterans Memorial Scholarship to a Bloomsburg student.

C. (1993) Encouraging veterans or their survivors to complete biographical data sheet for inclusion in the books of Service or Valor on display in the Fenstermaker Alumni House.

D. (1994) On-going events that include the Veterans Scholarship, display of World War II memorabilia, publicity urging veterans to complete biographical data sheets, and wreath-laying ceremonies at the Veterans Monument during Homecoming events in October.

E. (1995) On-going events plus other projects to be considered.

3. **Submit a completed application form** Completed form is included in this correspondence.

4. **Agree to keep us informed of your activities through brief reports.** I have enclosed newspaper clippings, brochures, forms and outlines for projects completed to date. Other publicity items and reports will be submitted for future projects in 1994 and 1995.

The Veterans Committee is planning several programs for August to December 1994 and January to November 1995. These projects will satisfy requirements as outlined by the Department of Defense.

Other members of the Veterans Committee include Millard Ludwig '48 of Millville, John Magill '48 of Millerstown, Andrew Magill '43 of Sugarloaf, John Thomas '47 of Hamburg, Curtis English '56 of Stroudsburg, and Elwood Wagner '43 of San Antonio, Texas.

other side of a mountain. Halfway down, one of the buses died, which was perfect timing because two of our walkers were suffering stomach troubles from the wild careening and made good use of the unscheduled stop. We consolidated buses, and rushed toward Maneybhanjyang (7,045 feet), a charming little village largely inhabited by Tibetans who had decorated the soccer field with banners and flags for the visiting contingent, and who, in their native costumes, offered fruit and breads and light prayer shawls to their guests. The village elders gave some short speeches, made more so because we were already running 78 minutes behind schedule.

The baggage for the runners and hikers was piled in a corner and loaded on aging Land Rovers for transport to Sandakphu, a rough camp at 12,000 feet, where we would be spending the next two nights. We all agree that based a half-world away, Jim Crosswhite had done a Herculean job of organizing a potentially chaotic group.

The field of runners circled the soccer field once and was off — immediately uphill. The first five miles were uphill on cobblestone, to roughly 9,900 feet. If a runner happened to step off the left side of the road, he or she was in Tibet, naturally, almost everyone made a point of taking a slight detour off the first path on the left side of the road that presented itself.

This climb was followed by a three-mile downhill to the little village of Garibas at 8,849 feet, followed by a 12-mile climb to Sandakphu at 12,000 feet! I don't know that there's another 20-mile course in the world that is quite as tough.

Bill Antholine, a 24-year-old graduate student in geography from Georgia who was on the trip doing research on the feasibility of ecologically-sensitive foreign travel, and who had within the past year entered the wonderful world of ultrarunning, finished the 20 miles in four hours flat. Last year's winner, 35-year-old Mario Malerba, a veterinarian from Italy, finished eight minutes behind. On the women's side, Hilary Cashmir-Pitts, the 30-year-old banker from Sandi Arabia who does her hillwork on a 200-meter high sand hill outside Riyadh, finished in 305 minutes, one minute in front of Theresa Daus-Weber, who lives and trains in Colorado. The two upsets and the close competition against massive odds set the tone for the rest of the week.

Unfortunately, the weather at 12,000 feet was iffy: Big scudding clouds, a chilly wind stirring the prayer flags atop the big rock atop the highest hill about a quarter-mile away. The dark clouds above mixing with the slithering fog below gave the impression that we were stranded on an island in the sky. Unfortunately, the lead runners had heated the ancient Land Rovers carrying their packs. We ran around trying to find spare blankets to wrap the runners in as they reached the top.

Sandakphu is a hilltop hostel-in-progress. There are three main buildings, big stone dorm-like buildings, with a fourth one in the process of being built. There is no water; it must all be transported up from 5,000 feet below. There is no heat. The "facilities" consist of two porcelain slabs with a hole in the middle of each of the three buildings. The full-time residents live in thatched huts clustered just above the stone buildings, along the road to Molle, 11 miles away across a long ridge currently encased in a ground fog.

As each of the runners reached the top, we scavenged what we could to keep them warm. One by one, the Land Rovers gasped their way to Sandakphu. Unfortunately, they didn't arrive in the order of the runners, so we borrowed some warm clothes from the packs that had arrived.

Eventually, everyone was settled into the buildings. Jim had arranged to have a dozen kerosene heaters transported by the local tourist agency to Sandakphu; unfortunately, even with several of the Japanese in the party who were familiar with kerosene heaters helping, we could get only two of them working, and feebly at that. In spite of the enfling of heat produced by the two semi-functioing heaters, the one we set up in the dining room building quickly gained a dozen ardent supplicants.

A group of us were housed in the dining building, in two rooms just off the dining area. The Sherpas who were hired to help prepare food were billeted in the big storage room off the front door.

Our roommates were a pair of retired medical doctors from Canada who were hiking the five-day trek before going on to Tibet, where they had volunteered to offer their services free for six months. The fifth member of our room was Bill Fitzgerald from Chicago.

After a hurried meal that quickly steamed up the windows, we all retired to our sleeping bags. Around midnight, Rhonda became sick and spent much of the rest of the night tiptoeing over the sleeping Sherpas to get to the restroom so she could be sick. Then, around two a.m., one of the dogs that called Sandakphu home began to circle the camp barking in a strange pattern that seemed to indicate a canine speech impediment. He went on for an hour, took a half-hour lunch break, and came back for more. The next night, I would make the mistake of having taken just about enough and would attempt to go outside to throw something at him, only to be stopped by the Sherpas, who indicated by sign language that it was better to have the dog bark, since this was a national park and was therefore home to wild animals that were less preferable than the dumb dog.

The dog finally gave up its speech therapy around 3:30 a.m., and we fell off

to sleep, even the now-exhausted Rhonda.

Then the sun came up, attempting to stream in through window panes that had turned our night's frosty breath into a coating of ice. I crawled out of my sleeping bag and scratched some of the ice off the window pane and before I could help myself, a "Wow!" erupted, which caused my four roommates to stir.

"You oughta see this!" I said, struggling into some warm clothes and rummaging around for my cameras. In a minute we were out the door, a bedraggled, sleepy-eyed, half-dressed handful of rank tourists, pulling lens caps off cameras as we clawed our way to the highest rocks we could find.

In front of us, Kanchenjunga filled the horizon, a long, wide monster of a mountain, snow-covered, impressive, intimidating. Off to the left, a trio of peaks stood together above the ground fog, as though sitting on a cloud: Lhotse (28,053 feet), Everest (29,198 feet), and Makalu (27,968). Kodak Film stock half a world away on the New York Stock Market ratcheted up more than a point as we fired away. Our less-than-subtle excitement soon roused everyone else, and the rough hillsides of Sandakphu were suddenly peppered with half-dressed, frosty-breathed visitors from a dozen countries come out in the numbing cold to offer respect to the world's most awe-inspiring mountains.

Although we stood at 12,000 feet, these monsters seemed to merely begin their climb to the sky at this altitude. We turned in circles, using up all 360 degrees of the view, taking in everything, unable to absorb it fast enough and thoroughly enough. Below us, valleys rolled away, one after the other, ground fog slipping through them, hillocks stringing themselves out between us and Kanchenjunga, the ridgeline between Sandakphu and Molle forming a defining line above which Lhotse, Everest, and Makalu towered.

For a moment, the briefest of moments, I thought of Big Rock on Bear Mountain halfway around the world in Jim Thorpe. Although its might had long since been usurped, it would always hold a special place in my heart. The sun wouldn't fall on Big Rock for another dozen hours, but it would, after all, be the same sun that feebly attempted to warm us here.

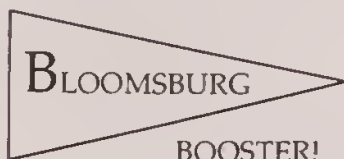
