Vice presidential searches underway; library campaign tops \$3.375 million goal

President, Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania As my second semester at Bloomsburg begins,

it seems appropriate to reflect on the past, and to consider the future.

As an institution — as individuals — we have been marked indelibly by the tragedies we have shared this semester. In the loss of a respected professor and in the unfortunate deaths of five young people, we have experienced remarkable acts of conrage and dignity, humanity and civility.

In these tragic events we have grown by reaching within ourselves to draw upon our strengths and talents. We are not quite the same as we were before.

Despite these tragedies, I continue to feel incredibly lucky to be here. This is a very good place that has the potential for greatness. I see it expressed in the talents of our faculty, staff, students and alumni — and in our commitment to the life of the mind.

Others also recognize the value of Bloomsburg. This past fall, U.S. News and World Report ranked B.U. fourth as a "Best Value" in higher education among regional universities in the northern part of the nation. I believe this ranking reflects our commitment to providing students with the highest quality education while keeping the cost of that education within reach of as many students and families as possible.

Bloomsburg is an institution with a proud past and a great future. One of the activities in which Page 2 we are currently engaged will markedly affect how B.U. will evolve in the days and years ahead. I refer to our recently concluded search for a new vice president for student life and ongoing searches for a provost/vice president for academic affairs and a vice president for university advancement. As you recall, all three of these positions have been filled on an interim basis since the retirement of the former vice presidents.

Following campus interviews of five candidates, Dr. H. Preston Herring was selected as the new vice president for student life. Dr. Herring, an administrator at Rochester Institute of Technology, is expected to begin his duties on March 1. In the meantime, Dr. John J. Trathen is serving as interim vice president.

Interviews for the other two positions will take place early in the spring semester, with appointments to be made no later than July 1, 1995.

On a final note, I have one very good piece of news that I am eager to share with you. As of December 6, we — faculty, staff, students, alumni and Foundation Board members — have reached our \$3.375 million goal for the library campaign by raising more than \$3.5 million dollars for *A Treasury of Ideas*. I am very proud that the library, which is really the center of learning on any campus, will be the first building constructed at Bloomsburg during my tenure as president.

Congratulations and many thanks for your generous support.

Secret ingredient for success: passion

A William Kelly, a 1971 graduate who is president of WVIA television and radio, delivered the address at the 125th annual winter commencement on December 17.

Another alumnus, Dr. Curtis R. English, Class of 1956, was awarded an honorary doctorate in recognition of his service as interim president of the University.

Kelly began his life-long interest in radio at age 12, when he began broadcasting from his basement radio station. By ninth grade he was working at WTTC in Towanda and describing everything from Harry James' music to horsepulling contests

His radio careeer spanned nine stations in Pennsylvania and New York, where he became known for his attentiongetting public service projects. His efforts as station manager of WYBG in Massena, N Y., resulted in the purchase of a new ambulance for the community. While at WARM in Scranton, his 25-mile Winter Walk for the March of Dimes raised more than \$25,000 to fight birth defects. Two years after the Hurricane Agnes flood, Kelly described the natural beauty of the Susquehanna River from a canoe in WARM's 100-mile "Great Canoe Expedition" down the river.

Today, Kelly is president of WVIA-TV Channel 44 and WVIA FM 89.9, the region's public television and radio stations. As the station's chief executive officer, he also serves as executive producer of several programs, two of which were nominees for the prestigious IRIS Award of the National Association of Television Program Executives. He is executive producer of "The News Directors" and host of the station's monthly series, "State of Pennsylvania." He worked closely with *The New York Times* as executive producer of "James Reston, The Man Millions Read," a major WVIA documentary aired by PBS in 1993. The Corporation for Public Broadcasting has recognized his efforts in fund raising and audience building with two national awards.

In 1988 he was named "Young Alumnus of the Year" by the Bloomsburg University Alumni Association. He has also received the Pennsylvania Medical Society's Walter F. Donaldson Award for Outstanding Medical Journalism and the Outstanding Volunteer Leadership Award from the Northeastern Chapter March of Dimes.

He has taught media courses at B.U. as an adjunct professor for many years.

Also a graduate of the University of Wisconsin Executive Management Institute, Kelly is a recognized speaker un communications theory and techniques

He and his wife, Janice, are parents of three children. They live in Mountaintop.

Because Kelly's address was well-received by members of the graduating class and others in the audience, we would like to share some excerpts with you:

Twenty-four years ago this month, I sat in this room with my parents, and I wanted the speaker to make it QUICK¹ But I've always been in too much of a hurry for the next experience to appreciate the quality of the one at hand. So my first pearl of wisdom to you, the graduates of 1994, is to try to live in the moment, starting now!.

The tests ahead of you still offer "multiple choices," but now the "professor" pays you, he or she can fire or prumote you, and your employer is not sympathetic. In this new "classroom," you "ace" the tests by effort, attitude, a sense of organizational politics and a few other ingredients.

There are three things which have helped me: Good luck, hard work and passion.

Let's take them one at a time. My definition of luck is basically being in the right place at the right time, and having the instinct to "go for it" when you can....

Hard work is one of those things your parents have probably talked to you about. It means, and pardon me if 1 sound like your parent, forgetting the hours you're supposed to arrive and leave, and sticking with the job until it's done so well that YOU are really proud of yourself!

But the "secret ingredient" in my recipe for success is passion. What power passion has, and what mountains it can move for you? Call it intensity, or enthusiasm, but when you know what you want, and will do what you have to do to get it, you are credible, compelling and practically irresistible to enterprising and ambinous employers. Eve come to believe that passion is as important in the job search as miellect and creativity ...

This passion thing is nothing new, of course, artists, composers, lovers and even some politicians have it. It's that "sparkle," and the good news for you today is that you don't have to be born with it! I'm sorry that after all these years in classrooms, you, the Class of 1994, can't "crain" for passion or find it in a book! If you have it now, the challenge is to hang onto it despite inevitable sethacks. If you don't have and want it, you have some pretty important decisions ahead, and some not misginificant sacrifices as well. . . .

But, whatever you do, don't act like a victim! Yuu will quickly discuver huw few people want to hear about your failures, and worse, it can sour you very quickly! Once your attitude has gone South, employers like me can pick it up in a flash, and you simply won't get a good start on your career by sounding like a victim! Wallpaper your room with those rejection letters, gain energy from them, and force yuurself to do what you have tu do. Yuu've carned a degree today, NOT a good joh! That's up tu yuu, and it may well he the hardest thing you've ever done.

Remember, a little luck, a lot of hard work, and unshakahle confidence in yoursell! And, when you get the job, get noticed by the quality of your work, then make yunrself too good to lose....

They can't teach you in college low to become a sensitive person, or how to care about other people more than your self, or, and this is particularly important, how to know who you are. These are the hard things to learn, hut they're essential to being whole and happy! ...

Part of your cullege education was to raise your sights, to teach you to think critically about life, to judge for yourrelf about the ethics ur morality of behavior, about the unfairness of stereotypes and racial or ethnic discrimination. In your youth and energy, and because of your education, you need only open your eyes wider to see your responsibilities to society.

Service to others can open your hearts and minds, and getting involved in your community enriches your life. 1 (Continued on Page 4)

know you have very little money, but learn now to give some to something you believe in. Find a youngster who really needs a Big Brother or Sister, spend part of this Christmas helping in a soup kitchen, inspire a young person to graduate from college. Although it may not seem so today, life is short and, as many of you learned this past semester, sometimes tragically short. So, resolve now not to waste these years; fook around you, count your hlessing, and through giving of yourself to others, learn to live life fully as soon as you can. . . .

Here's your last hst from Bloomshurg University. I'll call it "Thonghts on a happy, successful hfe!"

 Don't measure yourself, even in these early years, by money. This is easily said and not easily hved, hut you will be most satisfied with work, and will know great peace of mind when you realize how few things of enduring value are acquired by money.

2. Don't feel entitled to anything you don't struggle for Everyone gets a little bit of luck in their career, hut the successful and smart ones don't congratulate themselves, but work harder than ever and earn the next hig break.

3. Set goals in your life, and work systematically toward them. This takes discipline and patience, for the world will not move at your pace. Keep your eye on the goal, accept disappointments as part of the game, plap the work and work the plan, and you will get there!

4. Chances are you will work for several different employers in your career, and some are just not inclined to praise. Therefore, know yourself and be your toughest critic. Don't expect to be told you've done a good job. Impress yourself?

5. Marry for love (and passion), and then work at it. The greatest failure most people ever know is a failed marriage, and the victums are often those you love the most. Don't take each other for granted.

6. Don't waste your life with regrets! Live your life in the current and future, looking back only to gain perspective and insight that you can actually use. There really is only one time when regrets matter; so I leave you with these words:

At the end of your life, you won't think of the raise or promotion you didn't get, the new car you couldn't buy, or the deal yon almost made. At the end of your life, yon'll regret the time you didn't spend with parents as they aged, with the spouse you appreciated too late, and, certainly, precious time not shared with your children.

Walter "Whitey" McCloskey '44, a beloved teacher and coach in the Danville Area School District for many years, died on November 6 at age 73.

Widely known as a highly successful basketball coach, he coached the frommen from 1952 through 1974, compiling a 350-183 record and winning several Susquehanna Valley championships. A trademark of his teams was their huge rosters. He did not believe in cutting players and would often carry 35 or 40 players.

More important than all the wins and championships was the impression Whitey left on all who came in contact with him, according to those who remember him. The community's high regard spread all through the Susquehanna Valley League, where virtually all his fiercest coaching competitors became his great friends.

Whitey attended classes at Bloomsburg from 1940 through 1943, when he enlisted in the Navy. After his time in the service, he finished school and began teaching at Columbia High School near Lancaster in 1946. He later taught at Bloomsburg High School before moving to Danville in 1949

While at Bloomsburg, he was a three-sport athlete who captained the baseball, basketball and football teams. He also lettered in soccer his senior year when the Huskies did not field a football team because of the war.

It was during his wartime service in Jacksonville, Fla., that he met and married his late wife, Nan

While at Danville, he also served as assistant foothall coach and started elementary intramural haskethall, football and track and field programs. He was also director of the Washies Playground for more than 20 years and director of the Sunnyhrook Baskethall Camp for Boys for 10 years. He brought some of hasketball's most famous names — such as Bobby Knight, Sti Jackson and Matt Guokas — to the camp to give chines

Whitey and his wife raised eight children and adopted two others. Surviving are two daughters, Bethann Campbell and Rathy McCloskey, seven sons, Mike, Pat, Steve, Tim, Kevin, Frank Guthrie and David Reichwein.

DEVELOPMENTS — THE GIVING REPORT = Library Campaign Tops \$3.375 Million Goal

Bloomsburg University's library fundraising campaign, A Treasury of Ideas, has surpassed its \$3.375 million goal, announced Anthony laniero, interimvice president for university advancement and executive director of The Bloomsburg University Foundation, Inc.

As of Dec. 13, \$3,512,057 has been raised in gifts, deferred gifts, and pledges towards the construction of the muchneeded new library

"While we had some large donors, what you see here is a massive giving effort by many individuals who care about the university," says President lessica Kozloff.

The campaign was unexpectedly completed with a gift of \$225,000 received from the estate of Mary Taubel Rieder in memory of her mother. the late Mary Moore Taubel, an 1890 graduate of Bloomsburg Literary Institute and Normal School. (See related article on page 18.)

"This success is the culmination of months of hard work by many people," says Ianiero. "I want to recognize the alumni association, the

students, parents, faculty and staff, and community businesses and friends.

"This library is an investment in the community of Bloomsburg and will serve as a vital resource for the students of the university as well as many people from the region," adds laniero.

National campaign chairperson, John Scrimgeour '53, faculty emeritus from Bloomsburg, isn't surprised at the success of the campaign.

"I think this campaign has been successful for a couple of reasons. One, the library is such an important facility," says Scrimgeour. "I also think that there are people from Blooms-burg, both graduates and people from the area, who have a good feeling about the school.

The total cost of the project, including the design cost and private and matching construction funds to meet the \$10.5 million construction cost, will exceed \$12.4 million.

The new library will be located on the present site of the softball field, next to Waller Administration Building. Seating will increase from 387 reader stations to 1,219 while the stacks will hold more than 400,000 volumes.

Construction of the library should begin in June, 1995 and will take approximately 18 months to complete, according to Colin Reitmeyer, facility planner at Bloomsburg.

By 1899 school officials reported that "several hundred dollars worth of books were added to the library each year."

Despite investment of this scope, the library at the Normal grew slowly. By the mid-1920s, its collection had grown only to some 11,000 volumes. On the

Normal hecame the Bloomsburg State Teachers College, the hhrary still housed on the second floor of Old Wafler Hall - held fewer than 20,000 volumes. By the fate 1950s, its collection had doubled to 40,000.

But in the 1960s, things exptoded. The Harvey A. Andruss Library, opened in 1967, was huilt to hold 200,000 volumes.

Today, the collection of the Andruss Library in-

cludes more than two milfion items. There are 340,000 books and about 1,700 current periodieals, f.8 million microtexts, and 6,000 phonograph records and compact disks.

Mary Moore married after she left The Normal. She became Mary Moore Tanhel. She raised a family.

Today's hhrary is not what Mary Moore knew as a student in-1890. It is larger. It offers more services. Its card catalog - stifl of the "most approved kind"-is onfine from the university's mainframe computer.

And tomorrow's fihrary wifl be even more different, thanks in part to Mary Moore Taubel's famals

Her daughter, Mary Taubet Rieder provided a bequest to the university-in her mother's name - that put the "Treasury of Ideas" campaign over the top in its quest to raise the institution's \$3.375 million share of the new library

huifding's \$12.4 million cost. The Rieder gift was the second largest contribution to the fibrary campaign.

Her generosity also created a \$100,000 trust that will provide scholarships for students majoring in history at the university.

The hequest in Mary Moore's name was but one of the gifts to "A Treasury of tdeas" campaign from 5,244 alumni, 231 faculty and staff, 2,100 parents, and hundreds of other friends of the university

Together, these gifts and pledges will enable Bloomsburg University to increase the numher of reading stations in Andruss Library from 387 to 1,219 in the new hhrary - with 500 wired for electronic media capabilities.

The new building, to be located just west of Buckalew Place - which Mary Moore may have known as the "Senator's House" when she was a student here will have four floors. It will contain 105,000 square feet of space - roughly the equivalent of 25 baskethalf courts

When the new library building opens late in 1996, it will be the largest structure on campus.

If they were to visit the fibrary today, professor Jenkins and Mary Moore wouldn't find imposing rows of card catalogs. The card files have been replaced with onfine data services and PCs connected to CD-ROM drives. Jenkins and Moore would discover an automated circulation system that permits students to search the card catalog from a PC in their dorm rooms.

sing the new library's Internet connection, students will scan the catalogs of the world's most prestigious universities -Oxford and Cambridge or Harvard or the Sorhonne. They'lf review data from the U.S. Department of Commerce and read "Hamlet" from Shakespeare's 1623 First Folio.

They'll be abte to retrieve books and videotapes on computer screens and project the images so that a dozen friends working on a history project can simultaneously review the same lext.

New Scholarships for 1995-1996

Six new scholarships will be added this year to the 140 scholarships and awards, available for students. While a handful of scholarships have been in existence for many years, most have been created within the past eight years. by individual alumni and friends, organizations, and husinesses and corporations.

Last fall, approximately \$400,000 was awarded to nearly 350 students from the 140 scholarships and awards held by the Aliumni Association and The Bloomshurg University Foundation. In addition to these recipients, are other students who received Board of Governors fee waivers and student-athletes who receive assistance from the General Athtette Scholarship Find.

The six new scholarships are:

BU Association for the Hearing Impulsed Scholarship by current BU students who are members of the Association - a \$100 credit in the University Store for hooks and school supplies for an meaning freshman who is either deaf or hard-ot-hearing.

Seth P. Gavasan Memorial Scholarship by his parents, Dixie and Jeffrey Gavason \$300 to a student with a sensory, physical, or learning disahility. Seth was an 11-year old who lost his life in a bicycle accident. Mrs. Gavason is a current BU student majoring in secondary education, comprehensive social studies.

Legacy Scholarship by the BU Alumni Association - \$500 to a child of a Bloonishurg University graduate.

Nationwide Insurance Enterprise Foundation Scholarship by Nationwide \$700 (two awards) to a marketing or management major (one award reserved for a protected class member).

Sesame Street Scholarship by Donald and Kay Camplese - \$250 (6 awards) to residents of Sesame Street Apartments who are members of the tennis, women's soccer, field hockey, softhall, men's or women's basketball and foothall teams. A resident of Sesame Street who is majoring in psychology will also receive a scholarhsip. Dr. Camplese is professor emeritus of psychology, and Mrs. Camplese is an associate professor of hiological and allied health sciences.

Susquehanna International Folk Dance Scholarship by Oliver Larmi and Anne Wilson - \$5,000 to a student experienced as a folk dancer who is willing to teach dances from his or her folk tradition and to dance regularly with the Susquehanna Folk Dancers. Dr. Larmi is a professor of philosophy, and Dr Wilson is a professor of sociology and social welfare.

Production Begins on Ceramic Tile Mural

Commissioned in 1993 by The Bloomsburg University Foundation, Inc. Karen Singer Archatectural Ceramics, fuc., has been working closely with the Development Center to design ainmalrecognizing donois of \$1,000 to \$14,999 to the new library campaign, A Treasury of Ideas

Eighteen months ago, Karen Singer tomed the Bloomsbing University campus and met with a small committee to discuss various options for designing a ceramic (de mural. The overall theme would melude arches, reminiscent of the Old Waller Hall Long Porch and the Tillany Windows, trees to reflect the rural countryside, and enrient campus scenes from an aerial perspective.

Following intense conversations and studying many campus photos, Singer presented two renderings first a line drawing and later, a larger, water-color model both drawn to seale, for review and comment

Her intent was to capture a sense of people's leelings, memories, and visions about Bloomsburg and then translate them into physical form. In so doing, she challenges the viewers to expand their perception of the famil-RH

After acceptance of the final version of the drawing, the four stages of production begm. (In the Fall, 1994 issue of Bloomsburg, readers will find a draft photo of the proposed mural.)

The first stage of production, creating the plastic pattern, was started in January, 1995. This is a full-size model from which the mural will be crafted. During the summer, the wetwork stage will begin. In this phase each tile will be sculpted, in low relief, according to the pattern. Singer anticipates it will take approximately six months to complete the 480 tiles which will comprise the 5' x 16' muraf. Assisting Singer

with this work will be Marcy Abhau, an accomplished painter, who helps with the plastic pattern enlargement and sculpting. Production manager, Evelyn Stanley, will also assist with the sculpting.

Peter Adlowitz is responsible for pressing the names of donors (or the names designated) into the tiles during the third stage. The tiles will be glazed and fired in the final stage. Each tile will be coded on the back to facilitate installation in the proper order.

In her Philadelphia studio, Singer has heen

Singer earned an M.F.A. in sculpture from The University of Penn-

sylvania and a B.A. in art from Pitzer College, The Claremont Colleges, Claremont, Calif. She also studied printmaking at École Des Beaux-Arts, Paris, France and completed an apprenticeship at the Moravian Pottery and Tileworks in Doylestown, Pa,

Singer lives in Philadelphia with her husband and business partner, Peter Adlowitz. Adlowitz, who markets Karen Singer Architectural Ceramics, also deals with working out the technical issues related to the compnay's projects.

Bloomsburg University Cited for Best Value

Bloomsburg University has been rated a "Best Value" in higher education among regional universities by U.S. News and World Report magazine. In the U.S. News best value rankings, published in October 1994, Bloomsburg is ranked fourth among regional universities in the northern part of the nation. Other regions represented in the survey are the south, west, and midwest areas of the nation.

The best value rankings are based on a quality score U.S. News determined using a variety of factors and dividing that score by the total of tuition, fees, and room and board for the 1994-95 academic year. Only institutions with a quality score in the top 20 percent in their region or top 50 percent in the nation were even considered for the best value rankings.

In placing fourth on the survey, Bloomsburg Univresity is ranked with Trenton State College in New Jersey, first; SUNY College at Geneseo, N.Y., second; and Rutgers State University at Caniden, N.J., third.

Bloomsburg was rated based upon its tuition for out-of-state students of \$3,676 per semester for a total yearly cost of \$11,400 including room, board, and fees. A second component of the survey lists university values by taking into account grants that students receive. However, public universities such as Bloomsburg are still ranked based upon their out-ofstate tuition.

Ninety percent of BU students are Pennsylvania residents, and pay \$1,477 tuition per semester for a yearly cost of \$7,010 a year including room, board, and fees.

This is not the first time that national publications have taken notice of Bloomsburg University. In 1990, Money magazine ranked the University 30th for its quality relative to price in comparison to public institutions throughout the nation.

In 1993, U.S.News and World Report ranked Bloomsburg in the top 25 percent of the northern regional colleges and universities. Page 20

Task force named in wake of tragedy

In October, the University community monened the deaths of five young people who died in a fire at an off-campus residence on Finday, October 21, the day before Homecoming. Although the tragedy was reported widely by state and national news media, the following information is presented for those alimnit who missed those reports

The victims, all current or former University students, were Kyle Barton of Staten Island, N.Y., Deborah Keeler of Milton, N.J.; Deick Mooney of Downingtown, James Palmer of Millville; and Joseph Selena of Wyoming, Pa.

At an open niceting on the day of the fire, more than 700 students, faculty and staff gathered in Gross Anditorium to express their sorrow and to receive information.

"We have suffered a loss today," said President Jessica Kozloff to the assembled crowd. "I know that many of you are sorting through a realm of emotions. This entire University shares your loss "

University officials and student leaders decided to curcel the honiccoming parade and library site dedication. In place of the panade, the community gathered on Saturday morning along Lightstreet Road bear the sorority houses in a silent vigil for the dead. A 10 minute memorial ceremony was held before the start of the homecoming bootball game

On the following Monday, letters from President Kozloll were sent to parents and members of the University to inform them of the magedy. In the letters, the president summarized the tragic events

University officials learned of the fire at 57 from Street at approximately 5.30 a.m. In the letter, President Kozloff stated, "Enried to contact the parents of the young people who either lived in the residence or were guests there. I wanted to make sure that a personal contact from the University informed families about the possible tragedy hefore they learned of the live from news sources. We invited these parents to Bloomsburg, where the University provided counseling and a place for them to wart as news developed."

Throughout the day on Friday, students on campus were alerted that there had been a fire. Notices were posted throughout the campus within two hours after the fire was discovered. Information was available through the Be Safe Hothine and the Rumor/Communication line. Students were encouraged to contact

Because of the scope of the tragedy, faculty were asked to be especially sensitive to student absences and missed class work Connseling services were provided for any stodent for as long as counseling support was needed. The connseling was provided not only by the University courseling center, but also by the nursing and psychology departments, Family Coanseling Services in the Town of Bloomsbing, and Geisinger Medical Center in-Danville

At a news conference on Monday, October 24, President Kozlolf discussed the University's concernfor students wherever they live. The University has a coordinator for offcampos housing who deals with landlord-tenant disputes and refers code violation compfaints to the town's code enforcement office.

"The University has long had a cooperative relationship with town officials," said Kozloff. "Bloomsbing Mayor Bauman and I have already discussed plans to form a task force to explore how the Dinversity and town might work together even more closely to address off-campus housing issues."

The task force subsequently meton November 15 and 17. In the first meeting, the task force heard from parents, students, life company officers, University representatives and town residents who voiced their concerns about student housing inthe town.

In the second meeting, the task force listened to commentary solicited from a number of "experts," They included the Union County code enforcement officer, administrators from Bloomsburg and Wilkes universities, fire safety personnel from the town, an insurance industry executive, legal counsel from the State System of Higher Education, a representative from the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry and a state police officer

A number of suggestions were offered to improve off-campus. student honsing, including the formation of a tenant association and the development of a tenant-rights education program for off-campus students. Other suggestions included stricter code enforcement, insurance penalties for irresponsible property owners and mandatory fire safety programs for University students

Speaker after speaker suggested that resolving off-campus housing problems requires individual responsibility --- hy students as well as landlords

The task force, co-chaired hy Mary Lenzmi Howe and Roy Pointer, represents a broad cross-

Fall sports boast .698 record

Combining for a 52-22-5 record, a winning percentage of .698, the Bloomsburg University athletic squads enjoyed yet another successful fall season in 1994.

Football

Bloomsburg's football squad, under second-year Head Coach Damy Hale, earned a tre with West Chester for the Pennsylvama State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division title. The Huskies finished with an 8-3 overall record (5-1 in the PSAC East) to achieve its first winning season since 1988. After a 0-2 start, Bloomsburg rathed to win eight of its last nine contests, including a five-game winning streak to finish the season.

The Huskies' defense, led by senior All-American free safety Chet Henicle, keyed the turnaround by allowing just 17 points per game Bloomsburg's defensive unit led the PSAC in turnover ratio at +17 and in interceptions with 21. Senior cornerhack Boh James tied with sophomore cornerback Steve Foster for the individual lead in interceptions with five. Sophomore linebacker Frank Babula led the tearn in tackles with 76, and sophomore defensive end Jeremy Grim paced the squad with 7.5 sacks.

Junior Mike Johnson heeame the first Bloomsburg running back since 1985 to rush for over 1,000 yards, hoasting a total of 1,007 yards during the 1994 season. He also set a Bloomshurg single game record with four rushing touchdowns against Cheyney Sophomore quarterback Glen McNamee led the conference in passing efficiency and established a new Bloomsburg record with his 59.9 completion percentage during the 1994 season. Junior wide receiver Buck Eardley caught eight of McNamee's 16 touchdown passes and set a Bloomshurg career record with 2,128 yards receiving.

After the season, several Huskies gamered individual conference honors. Heniele, Grim, junior fullhack Syheed Brooks, sophomore punter Jim McCaffery, and junior center Kevin McCahe were named to the PSAC Bastern Division first team all-conference squad. Bahula, Eardley, James, senior offensive tackle Kevin Fee, semor defensive tackle Ross Landers, and junior placekicker Bill Beall were named the PSAC Eastern Division "Coach of the Year" after the Huskies improved on last year's 5-6 mark.

Field Hockey

The field hockey team advanced to the NCAA Division II finals before

The Bloomshurg defensive effort was also outstanding, posting 14 shutouts in 21 games. Senior goalie Rachel Trinidad led the defense, posting a 0.48 goals against average.

Several Bloomsburg players received post-season accolades as Miller and junior Chris Basalyga were named first team All-Americans while Fink and Trinidad were second team selections. Miller was also a first team selection on the all-conference (PSAC) squad, and Fink, sophomore Michelle Martin, and junior Shirley Powell were all second team selections.

Women's Soccer

The wonten's soccer team, under Head Coach Chuck Laudermilch, finished the 1994 season ranked seventh in Division II with a 14-2-2 overall record. After two early season ties, the Huskies won 12 consecutive games to bighlight the season. Senior Denise Pecoraro set the all-time Huskies record in career goals with 31. She led the team in assists with 12, adding to her career total of 28, also a Bloomshurg record. Freshman Rebecca Creedon set an all-time single season record in goals with 15, breaking Pecoraro's previous mark of 13 set in 1992. Freshman Kelly Conn was second on the team with eight goals, while senior Holly Panichelli and sophomore Bettina Buob each netted seven to key an offense that outscored its opponents, 61-12.

Junior goalie Amy Linn led a solid defense with 133 saves and a .7 goals against average. Five Huskies made the all-conference squad, with Creedon, Pecoraro, Linn, and sophomore Lisa Warno earning first team honors. Junior Lesley Beam made the second team after belping the Bloomsburg defense record nine shutouts during the 1994 season.

Men's Soccer

Head Coach John O'Leary's men's soccer team continued to improve during a rebuilding year, finishing with a 7-11-1 overall record. The Huskies finished 4-3-1 in the PSAC, including a 1-0 upset of West Chester midway through the season. Freshman Stewart Hill scored eight goals in his first six

Bloomsburg alumni find success in political arena.

The Huskies'

football squad didn't receive a bowl game invitation this year despite sharing a divisional conterence title. But the university fared well in other November competitions. This is a story, not about athlotics, but about politics.

Alumni Mark Schweiker '75, Tim Holden '80 and Phyliis Mundy '70 won political batties that sent them to Harrisburg and Washington. These elected

officials enjoy more than fond memories of their days at the college on the hili They share a strong interest in public education and

service.

Lieutenant Governor Mark Schweiker

In his remarks at the conference of the Pennsylvania Council of Alumni Associations held at Bloomsburg University last Junc, candidate Schweiker forecast sweeping changes in Harrisburg

over the coming months – changes with

a conservative bent, of course. Many of his remarks focused on higher education in Pennsylvania and how he values his own education at a State System university.

But how did Schweiker go from undergraduate to lieutenant governor of the Commonwealth?

A lifetime resident of Bucks County – his parents still live in Langhorne – Schweiker began his trek from Bishop Egan High School, where he played football and basketball. At Bloomsburg he played basketball his first year. A variety of physical ailments limited his athletic activity. Years later (in 1983), doctors would diagnose a rare degenerative hip condition that ultimately resulted in Schweiker's undergoing hip replacement surgery in March 1992.

Schweiker was influenced by his father's career choice, and, when he graduated from Bloomsburg in 1975, the young Schweiker used his degree in education – with a minor in business – to get a marketing job with W. H. Sadlier & Co., a publishing firm.

Later, he worked as a securities broker for Merrill Lynch. During this period, Schweiker also attended Rider College at night, earning a master's degree in administration in 1983. It was in graduate school that Schweiker first dabbled in politics. He worked on Elaine Zettick's successful bid for Middletown Township supervisor. Two years later, he ran for the same office and won. He served a six-year term, was re-elected in 1985, and served two more years before he sought a greater challenge, the office of Bucks County commissioner.

During his seven-year tenurc as commissioner, Schweiker stressed fiscal responsibility and the need for economic development. When his work began to attract attention from colleagues across the state, Schweiker began to think about running for higher office, specifically lieutenant governor.

He has maintained that government – at all levels – should be "more service minded," . . . that "governing is more about service than process. . . . "

The lieutenant governor credits much of his success in life to the education he received at Bloomsburg. He emphasizes that he and the new government are committed to securing opportunities for higher education for future generations of Pennsylvanians. "When I came to Bloomsburg ..., I was unprepared for the great adventure we ealled life," he said. "I learned that with an education and with the guidance of skilled and dedicated mentors – many of them at Bloomsburg – answers could be found and problems solved." He says that college gave him the tools necessary to achieve his aspirations, that without education those accomplishments would have been beyond his reach.

"I came to learn how lucky I was to live in a state that ensured a college education was available to those of even modest means.... Tom Ridge and I will work to see that Pennsylvania remains a state... where how well you live and how far you go is determined by your drive and determination and not by the circumstances in which you were born."

In recognition of his accomplishments and potential, the Bloomsburg University Alumni Association designated him a "Young Alumnus of the Year" in 1990.



U. S. Representative Tim Holden

Democrat Tim Holden of Saint Clair is back in his Congressional seat for a second term after defeating Republican

challenger Frederick C. Levering by almost 22,000 votes last November. In 1992 he defeated Pottsville attorney John E. Jones for the post.

The Sixth District comprises half of Northumberland County, all of Berks and Schuylkill counties, and a segment of Montgomery County.

Because much of his district has suffered from a loss of its manufacturing base — large employers — the availability of quality jobs was a central campaign issue, and one that most likely will continue to haunt public

officials across the nation. Holden also had to address voters' concerns about adequate health care, environmental protection, and the nation's stalled economy and plans for its economic recovery.

The campaign trail is familiar territory for this veteran stomper. He cut his teeth on local politics. His father, Joseph

"Sox" Holden, a former major league pitcher, won unprecedented support as a Democratic county commissioner in a largely Republican county. The elder Holden held his position for 20 years.

Following in his father's footsteps was a logical progression for the younger Holden.

An all-star linebacker for the Saint Clair Area High School foothall team, he earned a football scholarship to the University of Richmond. But fate would have it differently. Early on he was sidelined with tuberculosis. Circumstances eventually lead him to transfer to Bloomsburg, where he earned a degree in sociology with a concentration in criminal justice in 1980. New credentials in hand, he took a job as a prohation officer for Schuylkill County.

Five years later, Tim Holden jumped into the political arena. In 1985, he became the first Democratic sheriff in 75 years to he elected in Schuylkill County. He was in the third year of his second term as sheriff when he challenged for the Sixth District seat in the Congress. His election victory gave Schuylkill County its first Democratic Con-

gressman in 32 years.

Holden frequently notes his approach to public office echoes that of his father's political credo: "Serve the people. You're not there to be selfserving."

These elected officials enjoy more than fond memories of their days at the college on the hill. They share a strong interest in public education and service.

His constituents

would seem to agree with the Congressman's stand on several priority issues. He supports a \$20 hillion public works program aimed at rehuilding roads, bridges, and sewer systems. His health care proposals also mirror national Democratic policies. Yet he favors some things Republican, namely, a capital gains tax cut and opposition to abortion except in cases of incest, rape or threat to the mother's life.

Last summer, Holden voted for gun control legislation. When queried about his vote during the campaign, he said, "I've always had an independent record."

Holden and his wife make their home in Washington, hut he can generally he found in his district on weekends.

State Representative Phyllis Mundy

Phyllis Mundy returned to Harrisburg and the House of Representatives in January for her third two-year term. She credits her voting record and extensive service on the House Education, Professional Licensure, Federal-State Relations and Majority Policy committees for her victory in the November election.

During the past session, the Democrat served as Speaker Pro-Tempore of the Honse and as a member of the Pennsylvania Commission for Women.

Looking ahead, Mundy expects that "economic development will he a very important issue in this session." Like Holden, she believes that Pennsylvania's economy is a top priority that should be addressed expeditiously.

A native of Kingston, Mandy represents the 120th Legislative District, which encompasses 11 municipalities in Luzerne County, Prior to her 1990 election to the House, she was business manager for a local manufacturing company.

She has served as a volunteer for the Domestic Violence Service Center, the Junior Leagne, and the Volunteers for Literacy Program. Her long-standing memhership in the Wilkes-Barre Area Leagne of Women Voters helped fuel her interest in politics. Mundy served on the board of directors, then as the organization's president for two terms.

After graduating from Kingston High School, she earned a degree in secondary education at Bloomsburg. Her continued interest in education, evidenced also hy her House committee assignment and by her numerous community activities. She is a member of the Wyoning Valley West School/Community Advisory Board and Wilkes University's ACT 101 Advisory Board. In addition to serving on the boards of the Labor Management Council of Greater Wilkes-Barre and the Greater Pittston Chamber of Commerce, as well as on the latter's Business/Education Partnership, Mundy is on the Advisory Committee of the Domestic Violence Service Center.

Her many achievements have garnered her several honors, including a Pathfinder Award from the Wyoming Valley Women's Network and the John Heinz Friend of Nursing Award from the Pennsylvania Nurses Association in 1993.

She has heen selected as a 1995 recipient of the Bloomshurg University Alumni Association's Distinguished Service Award. It will he presented at the annual awards dinner on Alumni Day, April 29.

Career path leads to zoo

It's not far from Bloomsburg University to the Philadelphia Zoo, but for one B.U. graduate it took almost 10 years as well as 21 months of study in California.

Leslie Mitchell graduated from Bloomshurg in the spring of 1984 She received a hachelor of science degree to husmess administration with a cobeentration in marketing, with minors in social sciences and humanines. She participated in various organizations and was the advertising officer for the American Marketing Association.

In the five years following graduation, her career path led her to retail management, marketing research and financial management. But she always felt there was something else to be done, and she had a strong interest in animals and the environment. She visited numerons oceanarismis, zoos and theme parks, and her interest in exotic animals grew.

During her visits, she would ask staff members questions like "How did you get your joh?" and "What type of experience do yon need to get a job like this?" She finally got an answer that would change her life.

In 1988, Leslie met a parine manimal trainer who said she had attended Moorpark College m California for exotic animal training and management. That was the answer she had been looking for.

"I knew I couldn't sell popcorn and work my way up somewhere," she recalls.

In the fall of 1988, she contacted the school and learned as much as she could about the two-year

program, and she also took a volunteer position with the Philadelphia Zoo. She learned that there is another school in Florida with some similar courses, but Moorpark had more of what Leslie was looking for.

After a lengthy application process, she was one of 100 people from all over the world who was granted an interview. Three weeks later, a letter arrived accepting her into the program for the fall of 1989, along with 49 other students.

After driving across country, with minimal helongings, she began the grueling 21-month course. Besides carrying a full course load of animalrelated courses, the students had to he on the animal compound at 6 a.m. seven days a week to take care of over 160 animals, ranging from large camivores to hirds, primates and reptiles. In 21 months, she had only 20 days off. Her graduating class in 1991 had dwindled to only 31.

With an associate of science degree, Leslie moved to San Diego and began voluntcering with the Center for the Reproduction of Endangered Species at the San Diego Zoo, working on behavorial and hormonal studies with primates. When necessary, she fell back on her husiness degree and worked in accounting. Her next opportunity was as a veterinary assistant, working mainly with domestic animals, but on occasion with birds and reptiles.

Leslie flooded the market with resumes all over the United States. "You can't just say, 'I want to live here and hope there's a job available,' It's not like accounting, where you can go anywhere and find a job. You must be willing to go where the jobs are."

While back home in Pennsylvania in July 1993, Leslie landed an interview with the Philadelphia Zoo and was eventually lured as an open relief keeper, which means you fill in wherever you are needed. After three months, Leslie moved to an assigned relief position in the small mammal house and lion house.

"Working with felids was a professional goal for me, so I was lucky to get this position, which also allowed me to work with the lion cubs we had this year.

"This is a lifelong commitment which just begins with taking care of these animals. There is endless information to be learned about behavior, natural history and their status in the wild.

"Because of the loss of habitat and poaching, many animals face extinction. If this were a perfect world, I would love the animals to be free in their natural habitat. But as we destroy them, we destroy

QUEST: 20 years of exciting programs, trips

Director, Quest & The Corporate Institute Quest, now in its 20th year, continues to expand its offerings of outdoor courses and trips abroad, to students, alumni, friends of the University and corporations from around Pennsylvania.

Over the past five years, our students have journeyed to places they might only have dreamed about before coming to Bloomsburg University. Our travels have taken us to the snow-capped volcances of Mexico, the remote Brooks Range of Northern Alaska, the high Andes of the Ecuador, the rainforest and rivers of Costa Rica and the headwaters of the Amazon.

In 1995, Quest will offer walking trips through the Lake District of England (July 5-17), the Western Highlands of Scotland (September 21-October 3), and the Alsace region of France (June 15-28).

The England trip will be led by Brenda Smith '91, who worked in the Lake District during the early 1970s. Jan Runge, a professional photographer from Colorado, will lead the walk through the Western Highlands. Dr. Helmut Doll, math professor at B.U., will lead the walk through the Alsace region of France, an area where he walked and biked as a boy.

An account of Quest's coast to coast walk across England

Around 10,000 B.C., at the end of the last lce Age, rising seas finally broke through the shallow spit of land between Britain and the continent, creating an island nation, which in spite of its inconsequential size and miserable climate, became the center of an empire which in the 19th century spanned a fifth of the globe. The passing of centuries, the tramp of intruding Romans, Saxons, Vikings and finally the Normans in 1066, have left an indelible and distinctive mark on the British people and their land.

Our walk across the breadth of England started at St. Bees on the edge of the Irish Sea where in the 6th century the Abbess Bega, distraught at the turbulence in Ireland (little has changed), founded a nunnery in the protected cove there.

Thankfully, England is a small country, so a walk across its higher midriff is not too daunting a task — about 180 miles. We were to start on the west coast, first traversing the rugged fells of the Lake District and then proceeding eastward across the bleak North Yorkshire Moors to Robin Hood's Bay on the North Sea.

Our accommodations were bed and breakfast places — usually pubs and inns. The flight from New York to Manchester in England is always a wearying affair with little opportunity to sleep. Arriving in Manchester at 6 a.m., worn from the flight, we boarded a train at the airport and headed north along the magnificent coast line of the Irisb Sea, quite literally to the back doorstep of Mrs. Smith's Stonehouse Farm in St. Bees, our first bed and breakfast and the starting point for our walk.

Only a half mile from the sea, we stretched our cramped travel legs and tramped to the

almost deserted beaches. A Saturday game of rugby was in full swing on a field near the beach with the two sides, unprotected by any padding, bashing each other with unusual vigor. Presumably a grudge game. An extraordinarily clear, sunny day allowed us a wonderful view of the mountains on the lsle of Man some 30 miles to the west, but not Ireland, which is rarely seen from the British mainland.

The high hills of the Lake District loomed only a day away and 15 miles to the west. Our spirits were lifted by a traditional ploughman's lunch of tasty local cheeses, bread and chutney at the Queens Hotel, a 300-year-old inn, only a stone's throw from Mrs. Smith's Stonehouse Farm.

After several false starts, we were able to leave St. Bees behind and found the right footpaths and lanes that would take us across the narrow coastal plains, with its dairy farms and small villages, to the village of Ennerdale on the western edge of the Lake District.

Public footpaths are a delightful and enduring feature of the English countryside and allow the local or passing traveler to move from village to village, through a rural landscape, without having to be bothered by road traffic. Their legality stems from medieval law which allows a right of access across private lands if it can be proven that the path has been a traditional right of way for local people. Some of the paths have been in use for more than a thousand years. Others are of more recent vintage. Landowners who have public paths across their property - in the interest of minimizing potential damage to their land - often erect styles for the convenience of pedestrians, allowing easy access over thorn hedges and stone walls.

Walking through the Lake District is a journey into another century, to a world that by sheer good fortune and a consequence of geography and inaccessibility has retained the atmosphere and sense of timelessness of a preindustrial age. This is sheep country. Little else is hardy enough to withstand the difficult weather, other than the locals who by natural selection seem genetically insensible to weeks of non-stop rain.

Small, ancient-looking farms with grey, weathered granite walls and moss-covered slate roofs occupy the valley floors, surrounded by emerald green fields enclosed by stone walls. It seems virtually every structure in this part of England is stone. Stone walls, laboriously built by generations - often of the same family - divide one small field from another. Some of these walls date back over 600 years when the pruduction of wool became an important economic activity. Sume date back even earlier to the time when Viking invaders decided to settle here in the 9th century. As the hillsides steepen, the tidy fields give way to a wild, harsher environment of glacier-scarred rock outcrops, alpine grasses and sedges, bracken, and purple heather.

Our second day, from Ennerdale into the heart of the Lake District, was a tough one for the group, whose ages ranged from 26 to 62. It is easy to imagine a walk across England to be a relaxed affair, peering over garden walls and taking afternoon teas at quaint country tinns.

Lakeland hills are deceptively steep and sumetimes seem interminable. We decided that an English mile bore no resemblance to an American one --- it was thought to he roughly three times longer. The weather was magnificently clear, warm, and sunny, a rare comhination for a region that "enjoys" 180 inches of rain a year and where summer can be sometimes measured in days. The muuntain ash and birch trees became fewer as we climbed out of Ennerdale and at an elevation of only 2,000 feet, disappeared. The landscape is open and windswept, often scoured by low cloud and mist driven in by the prevailing westerlies off the Irish Sea. It is reminiscent of northern Alaska or northern Scandinavia.

Looking back, and now well below us, was Pillar Rock, a great buttress of dark granite where the earliest rockclimbers practiced in preparation for the first ascents of the Matterhorn and Mount Everest. To the west, we looked down on the sun-dappled water of Buttermere, and beyond, the lsle of Man still there — and the glistening, magical waters of the Irish Sea.

From this lofty terrain we began our deep descent into the valley of Borrowdale,

considered to be the most beautiful valley in the whole of Britain, which I remembered with great nostalgia, from the times I had spent there more than 30 years earlier.

Our tramp through the Lakeland fells and its many valleys was perhaps the major highlight of our walk. We spent an afternoon in Grassmere where Wordsworth lived, now huried in the local graveyard. Beatrice Potter, creator uf Peter Rabbit and many other animal characters, spent her most creative years in this heautiful part of England. On her death, she gave her extensive Lakeland properties and famis to the National Trust to be preserved in perpetuity. 1 was intrigued to learn that of all the visiting foreigners, it is the Japanese who apparently show the greatest interest in Beatrice Putter and the enduring characters she created.

Beyond the Lakes, we visited the medieval, market town of Richmond with its famous castle and ruined monastery, a victim uf King Henry the Eighth's nuturious dissolution of the monasteries in 1540. England is strewn with the empty shells of those once thriving monasteries, which in addition to being religious centers also served as important local and regional centers of edirection, industry and agriculture.

Our final tramp, across the hleak, treeless, North Yorkshire moorland gave us a glimpse of the stark, gray world where the Bronte sixters were born, lived almost their entire lives, and died. You have to tramp across a Yorkshire moor un a wet, windy day to appreciate where the scenic imagery and the dark and sinister character of Heathchiffe came from.

Our final day of walking was from the small fishing purt of Whithy, where Captain Cook, one of England's greatest sailors, was born. Another inipressive monastery dating back to the 7th century overlooks this picturesque town, its back overlooking the North Sea from where many of its principal antagonists came - the Saxons and Vikings. In spite of being ahandoned in the 16th century and being shelled hy a passing German hattleship in the second World War, the ravaged ruins look as though they might easily last another 1000 years. A delightful eight mile walk along the 300-foot high sandstone sea cliffs seemed more like 15, hut by now we were accustomed to the perverse humor of the guide book's estimation of distances. In the late afternoon, our destination, the village of Robin Hood's Bay, came into view with its slate roofed stone houses perched, some precipitously, on the edge of a pleasantly calm North Sea. That evening we walked to the

sbore and watched the rising moon cast a bright though cerie light across the gentle sea. A grand and peaceful finale. Our memorable tramp across England was sadly over; it was time to go bome.

Before leaving England, we visited the ancient city of York — a tourist city for inore than a thousand years — to walk its narrow, cobhled streets, its excavated Viking runs and to gaze in awe at York Minster, a great church even before William the Conqueror

Master's degree in accounting approved

A new master of science degree in accounting program will enroll its first students in the fall of 1996. Creation of the program was recently approved hy the Council of Trustees.

Richard Baker, chairman of the accounting department, notes that "more than 30 states require either a total of 150 hours of education or 30 hours of education heyond the hachelor's degree as a minimum educational requirement for licensure as a Certified Public Accountant.

"We expect the Commonwealth to follow this national trend in the next several years," he said. "Bloomsburg already has one of the largest undergraduate accounting programs in northeastern Pennsylvania. We think our new master's program anticipates the state's mandate and prepares students for a changing business climate."

Bloomsburg's undergraduate accounting program enrolls between 500 and 600 students and graduates hetween 110 and 150 students each year. More than 40 percent of the graduates take the CPA examination.

The new graduate program will complement the University's own undergraduate accounting curriculum and the programs of other nearby institutions. Other schools in the State System of Higher Education are expected to contribute graduates to the program.

"To our knowledge," Baker said, "nearby colleges and universities have not formulated plans to meet the fifth year requirement. There are no state-owned or state-supported schools within a reasonable distance that have an existing accounting program large enough to support a quality graduate program in accounting."

Baker indicated that, when it is mature, the Bloomshurg program could have as many as 50 to 60 students per year taking graduate courses in accounting.



Learning to be part of a community

Today's students have a lot to learn.

And they're doing it inside — and outside — the classroom because, as we all suspected when we were undergraduates, some of life's most important lessons aren't found in the pages of a textbook.

In social and service organizations, today's college students learn something about being part of a community. They learn it hy taking part in group projects and hy living in college residence halls.

They learn it by experiencing tragedies that shatter life's expectations.

They learn about community by discovering the common houds that unite us all — wherever we may he — as members of the human family.

In May — during the first week of their summer vacation — more than 70 of our education majors spent a week teaching in 11 Harrishurg schools as part of an extended urban field experience. For many of these students, their experience in Harrisburg's schools was their first in an inner-city setting.

Another 14 Bloomsburg education majors spent 10 days in one of Philadelphia's inner-city schools fearning first-hand about urban education in America. New and modern, with a strong vocational program and an on-site daycare center — Philadelphia's Edison High School shatters many of the stereotypes associated with an urban high school.

For students from small towns in rural counties, for those from suburban neighborhoods, these experiences may have been their slice of urban life.

Picture what it must have been like for Rie Ito, a junior majoring in education. Philadelphia may be three hours driving time from Bloomsburg, but it's light years from Rie's hometown — Tokyo.

Today's students live in a world community.

Last year, five Bloomshurg students spent their summer studying Chinese culture, history and language at Shenyang Teachers College in Liaoning province. Auother will study Chinese this summer in Qinghai province. Bloomsburg alumni have also taken part in the university's exchange program with China. Several have taken one-year teaching assignments there. Christopher Moulton, a 1994 communications studies graduate, is scheduled to teach in Shenyang next year.

These exchanges are part of a formal program that Bloomsburg has operated with China's Qinghai Education Commission since 1987 when Howard Macauley, dean of the College of Professional Studies, visited the People's Republic as part of his Futhright-Hays Fellowship program.

When today's students leave the university, I hope their ideas about community have exploded — been made larger and more expansive. And, I trust that they have come to recognize their own personal responsibility in creating a community — a world — where each is responsible for those who walk along this way with us.

It's impossible to put a price tag on alumni time and ideas

President, Alumni Association In today's challenging environment, graduating students from regional universities like Bloomsburg, face competition from around the world. To maximize students' potential, the university must use every asset in its portfolio, including the perceptive input of its alumni.

In fact, fund-raising has been the responsibility of the Foundation Board and the Development Office for nearly a decade. The Alumni Association, on the other hand, is charged with the responsibility of "friend-raising."

We hope that students and faculty will use the ideas and resources of alumni to help students achieve a level of preparation they may not otherwise attain. Small contributions by 40,000 alumni can produce big results. Moreover, when the university excels, everyone's degree becomes more valuable.

Quest plans trip to Peru

The Quest program is planning a trip to Peru over the winter holiday break, December 16 to January 12, 1996.

Participants will travel from Lima, the nation's capital, to the town of Hnaraz, west of the Cordiflera Blanca Range. From the Rio Santa they will trek castward up the valley de los Cedros through the range, climb a peak in the Alpamayo region, and descend into the Amazon basin rain forest.

They will trek through valleys that were terraced and farmed for centuries until the conquering conquistadors decimated the local populations. Religious sites, burial formations and irrigation ditcles are still evident in many of these remote valleys. They will trek over 15,000-foot monitain passes and will camp in remote, seldom visited valleys far from the beaten track.

After a visit to Cuzeo, the ancient capital of the luca empire, they will make a weeklong journey to Machin Pichii, one of South America's most spectacular ruins. This religious center of the lucas, with its terraced hillsides and extraordinary stone structures, was built in such a remote and maccessible hillside overlooking the Rio Urabamba that it cluded the plundering armies of the Spanish conquistadors. It was discovered by the outside world in 1911 by Hirain Bingham, the Yale archeologist.

The trip will be led by Roy Smith, director of the Quest program. He first visited the area in 1966 as a member of the British expedition that made the first ascent of the North Ridge of Alpamayor, the last unclimbed 20,000-loot mountain in the Andes.

The cost of the trip is expected to be about \$1,700. For information, call the Quest office at (717) 389-4323.


Attending both Alumin Weckend and Homecoming can substitute for a regional alumin event, since the latter are not held in all areas every year

Master's degree in accounting gets green light

The creation of a master of science degree in accounting at BU has been approved by the Board of Governors for the State System of Higher Education.

The new graduate program is expected to enroll its first students in the fall of 1996.

According to Richard Baker, chairman of the accounting department, "more than 30 states require either a total of 150 hours of education or 30 hours od education beyond the bachelor's degree as a minimum educational requirement for licensure as a Certified Public Accountant.

"We expect the Commonwealth to follow this national trend in the next several years," he said. "Bloomsburg already has one of the largest undergraduate accounting programs in northeastern Pennsylvania. We think our new master's program anticipates the state's mandate and prepares students for the changing business climate."

Bloomsburg's undergraduate accounting program enrolls between 500 and 600 students and graduates between 110 and 150 students each year. More than 40 percent of BU's graduates take the CPA examination.

The graduate program will complement BU's own undergraduate accounting curriculum and the programs of other nearby institutions. Other schools in the State System of Higher Education are expected to contribute graduates to the program.

"To our knowledge," Baker added, " nearby colleges and universities have not forumlated plans to meet the fifth year requirement. There are no state-owned or state-supported schools within a reasonable distance that have an existing accounting program large enough to support a quality graduate program in accounting."

Baker indicated that, when it is mature, the BU program could have as many as 50 to 60 students per year taking graduate courses in accounting.

A Treasury of Ideas — A Capital Success Story Featuring BU All-Star Cast of Thousands

It's summertime. Traffic on campus has thinned; shorts and sunglasses are in; and marigolds have replaced hardy mums all telltale signs that another academic year has slipped into the past tense.

It has been a roller-coaster year for Bloomsburg, packed with triumphs and tragedies of every magnitude. Dr. Jessica S. Kozloff took the helm as Bloomsburg's 18th and first woman president. Three vice presidential searches—for academic affairs/ provost, advancement, and student lifeended successfully, entrenching a new top administrative team in Carver Hall.

On the deficit side, Bloomsburg suffered the loss of five students in an offcampus fire; incidents of underage drinking and misconduct were reported; and we lost valuable and cherished friends in the deaths of Richard Benefield, Richard Wesner, and Boyd Buckingham.

Amid the hailstorm of events that defines BU 1994-1995 is a bona fide success story with a 105,000 square foot happy ending. The title of this best seller is *A Treasury of Ideas*. The story line details the University's efforts to underwrite construction of a crucially needed huilding by executing its first capital campaign.

The Bloomsburg University Foundation and the Office of Development functioned as the campaign's creative team, hammering out strategies and matching fund appeals with prospective donors.

Raising money for a library is the "stuff" development people in higher education dream of. The very nature of the project attracts broad-based support. Academic libraries serve every discipline at all interest levels. Its users include both the browser and the researcher. Libraries also function as a key resource for neighboring businesses, industry, and schools.

Via the information highways such as Internet, it can benefit users worldwide. (Library plans include 500 public-access connections for personnel computers, several laptop computers available on request, 145 stations with computers, CD-ROM databases, and an on-line catalog.)

For Bloomsburg huilding a new library facility was a project of uncontested need. Enrollment had more than doubled since Andruss Library's opening in 1966. Alumni, faculty, staff, students, and parents were keenly aware of problems with overcrowding, lack of storage, and noise.

A larger facility was first proposed in 1986, and although approved, the project lacked funding until it qualified for state aid under the Higher Education Capital Construction Program in 1992. The University immediately swung into action The initial challenge was to raise \$2.375 million from private sources. The goal later grew to \$3,375 million when it was decided to finish the fourth floor. Building costs stood at \$12.4 million.

In early December 1994, Anthony M laniero, current vice president for advancement, declared the campaign had surpassed its goal. A \$210,000 planned gift from the estate of Mary Tauhel Rider in memory of her mother, Mary Moore Taubel, Class of 1890, pushed the fund drive over the top.

The many heroes of this story can be found among the names on pages 18-49. They include alumni, parents, employees, businesses, organizations, foundations, and individuals — all of whom have contributed to the campaign.

Heroes come in all shapes and sizes. And this campaign has a wonderful cast of them. There's Jack L. Mertz, Class of 1942, who stepped forward early in 1992 to make the lead and what would prove to be the largest single gift to the library fund, donating a half million dollars.

There's a lovely lady named Harriet Hill Knorr of Berwick, a 1918 graduate of Bloomsburg State Normal School, who was the first to sponsor a ceramic tile in the fund drive's special recognition project. Mrs. Knorr celebrated her 100th birthday June 11 at the Berwick Retirement Village, She looks forward to the new library's opening in the fall of 1997.

Alumni formed the backbone of the campaign. Some 3,800 alumni contributed

\$1,637,968. The Alumni Association's Board had 100 percent participation. Several classes tapped their treasuries to contribute over \$83,000, (See page 40.)

The tile mural, being crafted by Karen Singer of Philadelphia, is another chapter in the success story. The 5'x16' design, shown above, depicts three views of campus and neighboring Route 11 on 480 tiles. It is fully subscribed. Once sculpted, each tile will have a name or message pressed into the design, then be glazed and fired. The first batch of names should reach Singer's studio by mid-June

Ground breaking is anticipated in early December or the spring of 1996, contingent on weather. The final chapter of BU's success story will close with the opening of the new Harvey A. Andruss Library in Tail 1997. Mark your calendars?

Among its recommendations, the report calls for increasing the number and scope of safety education and training programs for students, the addition of a second code enforcement officer by the town, and the formation of a tenant association to assist students in their dealings with landlords.

The report also called upon the university and the town to create a new task force to explore issues of alcohol and substance abuse among students.

The Student Housing Safety Task Force began its work last fall with two public hearing. Throughout the winter, the group collected expert testimony and completed research into housing and safety issues. Two public meetings that presented preliminary findings were held in April, prior to formal delivery of the group's findings.

University celebrates inauguration of 18th president

Jessica Sledge Kozloff's manguration as the 18th president of Bloomsburg University was celebrated on April 22.

Several hundred guests from the academic community representing more than 50 colleges and universities attended the event. Trustee Robert Buelmer served as master of ceremonies.

Guests and speakers included F. Engene Dixon, charperson of the State System Board of Governors, Mayor Daniel Bauman, and representatives of many campus constitutencies, including faculty, staff, administrators and students.

"Bloomsburg is family. I have been personally overjoyed and impressed by the individual who has come to this family," said Chancellor James McCormick, president of Bloomsburg from 1973 to 1983.

Keynote speaker James B. Appleberry, president of the American Society of State Colleges and Universities, discussed the need for the universities to adapt to fundamental changes in technology and culture,

In her address, Kozloff examined how the university has evolved from its medieval origins and how it will continue to evolve.

"I am particularly conscious, because of the pomp and circumstance of this inaugural ceremony, that we are celebrating not just my presidency," said Kozloff, "but the traditions that have been with us for hundreds of years — almost a thousand years — extending to the first universities, established in Italy during the 11th century." Kozloft discussed the symbolic importance of the academic mace. Originally a weapon of war, the academic mace has become a symbolic weapon in the fight for knowledge

"As the medieval knight brandished the mace against enemies on the battlefield, today's scholar takes up aims against ignorance and narrow-mindedness, against hopelessness and despair," said Kozloff

"The struggle is just as intense — the stakes equally high.

"If there is any word associated with this decade, it is *change*.

"We stand at the threshold of a new millenium. The prospects hefore us are exciting and dangerous."

The president looked at how universities are being asked to bring their resources to bear on today's problems.

"There are some who doubt whether the modern university can respond to the remarkable events that are occurring about us," said Kozloff. "I am convinced that we *can* respond to the challenges before us,

"It has been done before. We must — and can — do it again."

"Like the medieval institution that has bequethed us so many symbols and so much of our academic tradition, our early years were not perfect.... But this fledgling university, as imperfect as it was, faid the foundations that define what we are today.

"We must continue to celebrate the life of the mind.

"We must continue to excite intellectual currosity so that our graduates can confront change and embark on journeys to brave new worlds.

"After all, in the course of a lifetime, career options may change. Organizations may be reengineered. The nature of institutions may be irrevocably altered. But the power of human intellect and spirit to confront challenges and invent solutions.



Professors plan trip to Amazon

(Editor's Note: Two BU professors, Frederick Hill and Joseph Pifer, are planning a week-long trip to the Amazon River and rainforest of Peru, departing on January 7, 1996. The trip is open to the general public. For more information, contact either Hill or Pifer).

The Amazon is an integration of rivers and rainforest combined to form the largest wilderness area in the world, the Amazon Basin. Occupying over 2.5 million square imles and including major portions of nine South American countries, this area contains an enormous diversity and ahundance of fauna and flora. The largest river on Earth, the Amazon is truly one of the world's greatest natoral wonders. Originating as a tiny brook 17,000 feet up in thePernivian Andes, less than 100 miles from the Pacific Ocean, the Amazon Ilows 4,000 miles through Peru and Brazil.

It was with this in mind that Joseph Pifer, a meterologist, and I set out last year on an incredibly famastic journey. After flying to Iquitos, Peru, we encountered the Amazon-River for the first time. Words cannot describe the magnitude of this river. At Iquitos, which is nearly 2,200 miles. upstream from the month of the river, the Amazon is over 40 feet deep. The realsurprise was to learn that it gets at least 30 feet deeper during spring runoff from the Andes. We were surprised to see a majorocean-going freighter at anchor in the middle of the river. This is the farthest upstream on any river in the world that ocean-going commercial ships can navigalge.

We went hy motor boat about 50 miles down river to the Exploranta Lodge. The rainforest boaned above as our riverboat turned off the mighty river and continued along a narrow stream to the lodge. The lodge is almost nivisible through the trees, hut the dock provided a welcoming group of guides who helped us disembark. It was immediately obvious that we were in the jungle. Dozens of hrightly colored birds whose colors were only rivaled hy the myriad of hrightly colored flowers greeted us as we walked up from the boat dock to our hving quarters

We were pleasantly surprised by the acconninodations, they were much more than we had originally envisioned them to be! Meals were also a pleasant surprise in that the food was plentiful and good, featuring various meats (1 had never eaten water huffalo before!) and a wealth of fresh fruits and vegetables, rice and beans, all carefully and deliciously prepared and served. While at Explorama, we hiked well-groomed trails where our guides pointed out the plans and animals (shih — there is a troop of Pygmy Marmosets up ahead in the trees; look quickly or you will miss them!) and explanned how the local people utilized the

abundant resources of the forest.

We left Explorama by boat (there are no roads in the jungle so you either walk or take a boat) and traveled approximately 43 miles up the Amazon's Napo and Sucusari Rivers to Explormapo Camp. Nestled in remote ramforest off the boundary of the Sncusari, this camp is composed of large, open, thatch-roofed structures on stills, lit by the warm glow of kerosene lanterns (there is no electricity at any of the camps).

From Explornapo, we explored a black water lake (ever see a water hily pad that is six fect across?) and visited a colony of Hoatzins (very primitive pheasant-sized birds that have gasiric formentation and yon still have claws on their wings much the same as Archaeopteryx, the first bird) in their native habitat

We also saw four species of Kinglishers and dozens of individual birds in one small area, as well as three three-toed sloths up close and personal? This truly was a bighlight of our trip

One afternoon we took a walk into the rainforest and visited a Yagnii indian village and had an opportunity to trade t-shirts and hats for blow guins and heads — truly a imque experience!

We hiked to our next lodge, code-named ACEER, for Amazon Center for Environmental Education and Research. (By the way, the guides carried all of our gear for its, all we had to do was to hike and enjoy the wildemess!). This lodge is dedicated to study of the rainforest canopy. It is here that they have built one of the three Canopy Walkway Systems in the world, truly an engineering feat! It is a quarter mile-long, multi-level system of aerial platforms and pathways designed to be ecologically sensitive and allowing for researchers and ecotourists to interact with the living rainforest.

We elimibed into tree forts connected by rope walkways that are up to 120 feet above the forest floor. As we traversed the walkway, clinibing even higher, the secret life of the canopy began to reveal itself. Thousands of species of epiphytes crowded the branches, and flowers of every shape and color provided a show rarely seen by the human eye. The bold primary colors were almost too much for the senses to absoib.

Several species of birds, insects, Poison Arrow Frogs, arboreal mainmals and flowering plants were easily observed and studied from the ACEER Canopy Walkway, promising an almost endless source of new information about this environment.

It was with great regret that we ended our trip, but we agreed that we would go back soon to study and visit. Upon uur return to Pennsylvania, I quickly put together a course in neotrupical biology that will be offered this fall for undergraduates and graduate students. Students will study at BU during the fall semester, and then we will travel to Peru on January 7, 1996 to experience the Amazon River and rainforest in person.



Men's basketball, women's swimming, wrestling, baseball, softball, and men's tenms all reached the national playoffs this year, concluding successful seasons and eapping another very solid year for Bloomsburg athletics.

Those results, along with the field hockey unit's national runner-up firmsh in the fall, mean that seven Husky squads made national tournament appearances and helped the athletic program build an enviable (658 winning percentage with a 208-107-5 record for the recently completed 1994-1995 academic yem

The men's basketball team finished second in the Permsylvaria State Athletic Conference Eastern Division and dropped a pair of tongh games in the conference semifimals and NCAA first round. The women's basketball team missed the conference playoffs and finished 14–11, while the wrestling team stringgled in dnah matches but placed fourth in the PSAC tourney and placed three wrestlets in the NCAAs.

The spring saw four teams have fine seasons led by the softball team, which finished as the national rimner up after winning its. Bith PSAC title in the last 14 years. Baseball enjoyed its best season ever as the Huskies finished second in the PSAC and made their first-ever NCAA tournament appearance winning the North Atlantic Regional and playing in the Division II World Series.
