Imprinting donors' names on handcrafted ceramic tiles is now underway in artist Karen Singer's Philadelphia studio. Approximately 500 tiles depicting three views of upper and lower campus and adjacent neighborhoods will come together in a 5-foot by 16-foot, nine inch mural.

Each tile will bear a name or an inscription designated by a donor who has given a minimum of \$1,000 to the library campaign. Many of the tiles are dedicated to former teachers, parents and loved ones. Several businesses, Bloomsburg sports teams, and student groups are represented.

The mural is slated to adorn a wall of a central meeting room on the first floor of the new Harvey A. Andruss Library. Groundbreaking for the new facility will occur in the early spring.

Leading figure in teaching of reading dies

Dr. Margaret Means Sponseller, 85, a 33 year resident of Bloomsburg and former professor of reading at Bloomsburg, died on October 30, 1995.

She was widely known and respected for her involvement with the Bloomsburg State College Reading Conference, which she founded in 1965, and the Keystone State Reading Association, which she served as president in 1976-1977.

Dr. Sponseller served as director of the popular Reading Conference until her retirement from Bloomsburg University in 1981.

Her eventual 29 year career at Bloomsburg also included tenure from 1964 to 1981 as director of the University's campus Reading Clinic and director of the Graduate Reading Program. She initiated both the master's degree program in reading and the reading supervisory certificate program at Bloomsburg.

Dr. Edward Poostay, who succeeded Dr. Sponseller as director of the graduate reading program, observed, "It's impossible to do justice to Dr. Sponseller's contribution to the Reading Clinic, including its programs, its conferences and its students. Because of her efforts, we have a proud history spanning 35 years and accented by successful graduates."

Dr. Sponseller was a graduate of Lewistown High School and earned a bachelor of science degree in education from Indiana State Teachers College. She earned a master's degree and a doctorate in education at Penn State. She took additional coursework at Temple University and the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to accepting a post at Bloomsburg, she taught at Westminster College, Bucknell University, and in the Lewisburg School District. She authored several publications. Two of her works, *Guidelines for Teams Evaluating the Reading Component of Teacher Education Programs in Colleges and Universities in Pennsylvania* and *The Essential Competencies for Beginning Teachers of Reading*, were combined into a work entitled, *The Elements for Consideration in the Review of Reading Components of Teacher Education Programs*, and published by the Pennsylvania Professional Standards and Practices Commission and the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

She belonged to numerous professional groups and organizations including the KSRA, International Reading Association, College Reading Association, and the State of Pennsylvania Reading Committee. She also founded the Susquehanna Valley Reading Council and served as its president. She held memberships in Delta Kappa Gamma, Phi Delta Kappa, the Order of the Eastern Star Mercer Chapter, and the Daughters of the American Revolution.

A memorial fund has been established in Dr. Sponseller's name through the

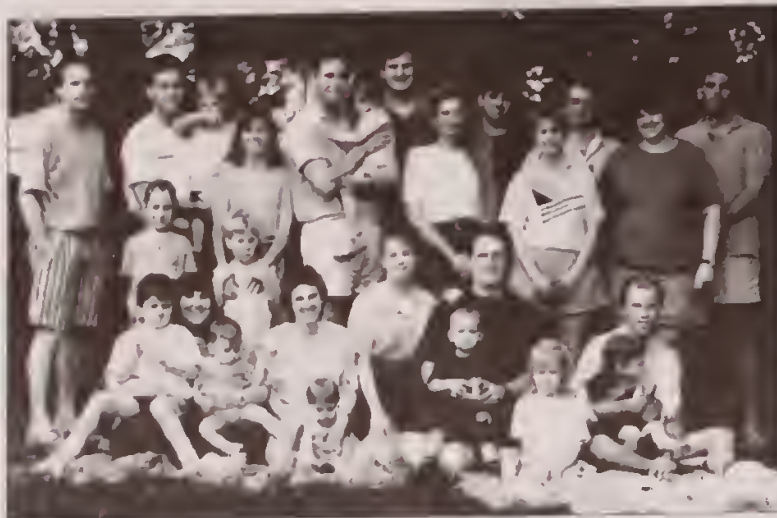

1995 marked the end of the 50-year commemorative World War II period. It was a busy one for our Alumni Veterans Committee as we cooperated with the Department of Defense in planning, coordinating and publicizing events which honored all former students who were in the armed services or who labored on the homefront.

On Alumni Day, April 29, approximately 35 World War II veterans were recognized for their service to country and sacrifices for the principles of democracy and world peace.

Dr. John P. Magill Jr. '48, a decorated World War II veteran, delivered a moving review of what could be the last "roll call" in Carver Hall for Bloomsburg veterans who made the supreme sacrifice for their country. Our committee was honored to be part of the ceremony.

On November 12, the 50-year commemorative World War II period ended. A few weeks before, on Homecoming, a "Peace Tree" was planted in the front yard of the Fenstemaker Alumni House, near the Veterans Memorial Garden. The tree is a tribute to all former Bloomsburg students who fought in wars for world peace.

The committee's effort continue by:

(1) Awarding an annual \$1,000 veterans memorial scholarship. This year's recipient is Teresa Greiner of Pennsdale, a junior elementary education major.

(2) Adding to our list of veterans' biographical forms kept at the Fenstemaker Alumni House (now at approximately 800 names).

(3) Planning to upgrade and improve the Veterans Memorial Garden and monument on the grounds of the Fenstemaker Alumni House.

(4) Supporting projects of the Alumni Board and the property committee.

(5) Expanding our outreach to veterans through contact in alumni publications and communications.

(6) Publicizing, whenever possible, information calling for direct involvement of veterans in alumni activities.

(7) Planning for a tape repository for veterans' accounts of their service experiences. This could become a valuable research tool for students in cooperation with the library archives.

University responds to task force

The university's response to the report from the Off-Campus Student Housing Safety Task Force has been released by President Jessica Kozloff and Vice President II Preston Herring. The task force submitted its report to university and town officials following a series of hearings and meetings last spring.

"We have identified every recommendation that is directed toward the university, and we have give a response to each," said Kozloff. "In many cases the recommendations have already been implemented, while others will require more study and analysis."

A total of 19 recommendations were directed to the university.

"We have outlined action steps to deal with each of the committee's recommendations," said Herring. "We want to service those out there in the community already, but a lot of this educational process will also be put in place for students considering the move off campus in the future."

Several major initiatives have been implemented since the task force presented its recommendations to Kozloff and Herring. Responsibility for the off-campus housing program now lies in the office of student standards, directed by Donald Young. Residence life staff, including Greek affairs, will continue to provide programs for off-campus students. The office of student standards is now the contact point for off-campus student issues.

The student life committee of the Forum is reviewing the existing drug and alcohol policy and will recommend necessary changes. A drug and alcohol intervention program with the community and local school districts to coordinate education and training initiatives has also been implemented.

In response to the call for building more on campus housing, the university is conducting a feasibility study to review the availability of student housing as well as preliminary designs for additional university housing on the upper campus.

A combined town/university newsletter will discuss inspection and code enforcement activities by the town, general safety recommendations and how tenants can obtain legal advice and other assistance.

The university will use the student newspaper, *The Voice*, to publish off-campus student housing information with safety tips and where to call for information and assistance.

An "Off-Campus Housing Fair" was held during the fall to reach students living off-campus and to provide information to those planning to do so in the spring semester. Residence halls will hold mandatory spring meetings to help those planning to move off campus in the near future. A "Parents' Guide to Off-Campus Student Housing" will also be available.

Safety training for students living off campus will be provided through tours and safety assessments of buildings housing university students. The training will be a joint effort between the university's off-campus housing official and the town's code enforcement officer. The task force also requested that the town fire department be

Student tenants' group formed

The formation of a student tenants' association in Bloomsburg was announced at a press conference on November 20, 1995.

Chris Vogler, president of the Community Government Association, spoke on behalf of the individuals spearheading the start of this student advocate group.

"This is the first such association at a Pennsylvania State System university designed to deal exclusively with off-campus housing issues," Vogler said. "This is a student initiative which has the complete support of the university's administration."

Vogler worked with a core group of fellow students to develop the basic goals of the group. Those students included Jennifer Adams of Catawissa, a member of the university's Council of Trustees; Scott Bird of Clarks Summit, Jody Borchers of Orfield, Dan Buddensiek of Staten Island, N.Y., Keith Curran of Philadelphia, John Lank of Blue Bell, Pete Mayes of Allentown, editor of *The Voice*, the student newspaper; and Robin Reinhardt of Kendall Park, N.J.

The students' plans include dealing with safety concerns in off-campus student residences and working with the town's code enforcement officers, as well as providing legal advice through the campus lawyer for students with questions about leases and their responsibilities, as well as those of their landlords.

Vogler also discussed a survey which will be developed by the tenants' association dealing with the condition of housing currently occupied by university students.

"Our primary goal is to help get answers to legitimate concerns," Vogler said. "We want to make positive strides to improve living conditions for many students."

The student tenants' association will work closely with the university's vice president for student life, Dr. H. Preston Herring, and his staff, including Donald Young, director of the office of student standards and off-campus housing.

"In their representation of Bloomsburg University students, CGA could deal with no issue that affects many of them more day to day than off-campus housing," said Herring.

"Based on the recommendations of the student housing task force, this association has been created to deal directly with the safety of our students. However, ultimate responsibility still rests with the tenants, and for this effort to be successful, the triangle of the university, town and tenants must be complete with all sides working together."

Huskies record most successful fall sports season ever

The Bloomsburg University fall sports teams completed their most successful fall season ever, combining for an overall record of 66-11-4 (.840) in 1995.

The FOOTBALL team was crowned champion of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference East Division for the second consecutive season. At 5-0-1 in the conference, the Huskies only blemish was a 28-28 tie with co-champion, Millersville. Head Coach Danny Hale's squad finished with an overall record of 9-1-1, completing Bloomsburg's most successful campaign since 1985, when the team went 12-1 and lost in the national semifinals. The Huskies registered nine wins or more for only the third time in school history. Bloomsburg had eight players named to first-team All-PSAC, the most of any school, and four to the second team. First-team selections were **Syheed Brooks** (Philadelphia/South Philadelphia), **Buck Eardley** (Altoona/Altoona), **James Smith** (Monroe, N.Y./Woodbury), **Frank Babula** (Lattimer/Hazleton), **Jason Grim** (Walnutport/Northampton), **Josh Kline** (Sunbury/Shikellamy), **Jarrett Roth** (Emmaus/Emmaus) and **Irvin Sigler** (Philadelphia/George Washington). Second-team selections were **Kevin McCabe** (Huntington/Huntington), **Glen McNamee** (Phillipsburg, N.J./Phillipsburg), **Sean Smith** (West Chester/Henderson) and **Tim Baer** (Hughesville/Hughesville). Hale was voted PSAC East Coach of the Year and Region One Coach of the Year by the Football Coaches' Association.

Peter R. Wisner, who taught at Bloomsburg from 1946 to 1950, died on October 22, 1995 at age 84.

He formed Gallaudet's first performing dance troupe, the Gallaudet Dance Company, which made national and international tours and performed on television.

In his coaching career, he routinely used dance both as a training regimen and as a full-fledged sport, often selecting the burliest athletes and transforming them into a performing dance troupe.

"Movement," he once explained, "was the prime interest in my life."

A Navy veteran of World War II and the Korean War, he also studied dance and choreography at Bennington College and Connecticut College.

He earned master's degree and a doctorate at Penn State University.

The 1995 women's TENNIS season was highlighted by a number of outstanding individual performances. With the guidance of PSAC Coach of the Year **Marty Coyne '83**, the Huskies finished the regular season 12-0, the best record in school history. Bloomsburg won the PSAC title by defeating conference rival Shippensburg, winning four of six individual singles titles. **Stacy Withrow** (Halifax, Nova Scotia) was named the PSAC Rookie of the Year after completing the season with a 14-3 record. Four B.U. players were named to the PSAC All-Conference team, including **Trish Sweeney** (Philadelphia/St. Basil Academy), **Amy Koontz** (Bedford/Bedford), **Cara Evangelista** (Pittsburgh/North Allegheny), and **Amber Lee** (Perkasie/Penn Ridge) after each won a PSAC singles crown.

In FIELD HOCKEY, Bloomsburg finished second in the PSAC for the second consecutive year behind Lock Haven. Head Coach **Jan Hutchinson's** team finished the year with a 19-3 record, with all three losses to the Bald Eagles. Bloomsburg was again the NCAA Division II national runner-up, losing to Lock Haven, 1-0, in the championship game. Named first team All-Americans were **Chris Basalyga** (Nicholson/Lackawanna Trail) and **Michelle Martin** (New Holland/Garden Spot). Named to second team All-American were **Nicole Mowrer** (Manheim/Manheim Central) and **Tracy Barndt** (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh). Three Huskies were named to the All-PSAC team, while two others received spots on the second team. Heading the list of first team members were three juniors, including **Tracy Barndt**, **Michelle Martin**, and **Nicole Mowrer**. Represented on the second team were junior **Megan Shaughnessy** (New Tripoli/Northwestern Lehigh) and senior **Chris Basalyga**. In addition, freshman goalies **Bev Hartley** (Mount Pleasant Mills/Selinsgrove) and **Bethany Canner** (Pine Grove Mills/State College) were named PSAC Co-Rookies of the Year.

The WOMEN'S SOCCER team finished the season with an overall record of 15-2-1, the top mark in school history. The Huskies were ranked as high as fifth in the NCAA Division II poll, finishing the year ranked eighth. Bloomsburg went 9-0 in the conference during regular season, but lost the PSAC championship game, 1-0, to IUP. Seven B.U. players received spots on the post-season all-conference team. Named first team All-American was **Amy Linn** (Harrisburg/Central Dauphin), while **Becky Creedon** (Woodbury, N.J./West Deptford) was named second team All-American. Earning first team All-PSAC honors were seniors **Amy Linn** and **Alisa Healey** (Jamison/Villa Joseph Marie), sophomore **Becky Creedon**, and freshman **Julie Bugg** (Mt. Aetna/Tulpehocken). Selected for the second team were seniors **Stephanie Adams** (Bridgewater, N.J./Bridgewater-Raritan) and **Patricia Cobane** (Whippany, N.J./Whippany Park) and freshman **Erin**

Beggs (Plains/Bishop Hoban). Head Coach **Chuck Laudermilch** was named the PSAC Coach of the Year.

The MEN'S SOCCER squad achieved its best season in nearly 10 years, finishing with an overall record of 11-5-2. Five alumni join Athletic Hall of Fame

Four men and a woman were inducted into the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame during ceremonies on Friday, October 27.

The 1995 inductees were Jon Bardsley '82, Brighton, Michigan; Michael Blake '82, Upper Saddle River, N.J.; Stephen Eachus '78, Coatesville, Phil Lockcuff '60, Northumberland; and Cathy Sheridan '84, Mountaintop.

The inductees were also recognized prior to the Homecoming football game against West Chester.

BARDSLEY is one of only four B.U. basketball players to have his jersey retired after a standout career from 1978 to 1982.

He earned All-American honors as a senior and holds university records for assists in a season with 180 and assists in a career at 589.

In addition to directing the Huskies' attack with his deft passing and ball-handling, Bardsley was a scoring threat. He finished his

career with 1,252 points, ninth on the school's all-time list.

In his junior and senior seasons, the Huskies qualified for the NCAA playoffs. He led B.U. to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship in 1981.

BLAKE was a three-time All-PSAC first-team selection during his four seasons with the Huskies football team. While the team struggled to just one win in his final two seasons, Blake enjoyed solid years, Blake enjoyed solid years, earning All-American honors, including an honorable mention as a junior and first-team honors as a senior.

Statistically, his best year was 1980 when the tight end led the Huskies with 55 receptions for 731 yards and two touchdowns. In four seasons, Blake caught 107 passes for 1,327 yards.

EACHUS established himself as one of the top distance runners in the B.U. history in the

late 1970s competing on the cross country and track teams.

His times of 14:15.8 and 30:28.30 shattered regional records in the 5,000 and 10,000 meters. His clocking in the shorter race helped him to a national runner-up showing and All-American honors in the 1978 NCAA cross country championships. He also earned All-American recognition two seasons.

He set eight school records, including the two- and three-mile indoor and outdoor marks, the six-mile standard and the steeplechase. He represented the U.S. in international competition against Mexico in 1978 and was a two-time PSAC champion.

LOCKCUFF earned three letters in football and baseball during his four years at B.U. However, he is most noted for his coaching accomplishments at nearby Shikellamy High School, where he has established the Braves as a perennial power.

After five seasons at Line Mountain and

eight at Shikellamy as an assistant coach, he assumed the head coaching duties. In 21 years, his teams have posted a 311-57-6 mark and captured three Pennsylvania Class AAA state titles.

In addition, he has led the club to numerous conference and regional crowns.

He has coached nine state champs and has been selected as the state's coach of the year three times.

SHERIDAN was the Huskies' first swimmer to win a PSAC individual title when she placed first in the 200-yard breaststroke in 1982.

The All-American was part of two national championship relay teams, helping the Huskies to a national runner-up team finish in 1982. She set eight school records and led the Huskies to four runner-up finishes in the PSAC and four-year dual mark of 34-6.

She won several PSAC championships and earned All-American honors 13 times.

Championship football team returns to mark 10th anniversary

The Huskies captured the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship and reached the national semifinals before ending an outstanding 12-1 season.

Former head coach George Landis, along with some assistant coaches and staff, joined 33 players, wives and guests for several events throughout the weekend, highlighted by the current Huskies' thrilling come-from-behind 41-31 win over Shippensburg.

A reception/banquet was held Friday evening at Days Inn-Danville, including video and audio presentations of highlights from one of the most successful seasons in Bloomsburg football history. Each player received a booklet of press clippings detailing their undefeated march through the regular season, as well as the games in the conference and national playoffs.

The representatives of the team were guests of the athletics department at Saturday's game and were recognized in ceremonies prior to the kickoff. A picnic lunch at half-time preceded one of the biggest comebacks in school history as Coach Danny Hale's squad rallied from a 31-7 deficit for victory.

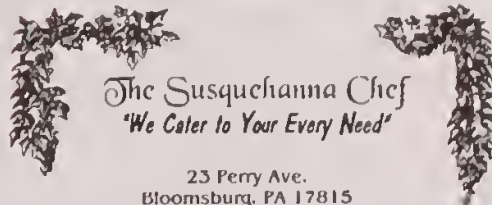

1879

(The following excerpt from Books in Canada was written by Robin Roger.)

In 1904 Hannah Breece (Class of 1879) was lowered from a steamship into a rowboat and taken through crashing waves and torrents of rain to the island of Afognak, her first post as a teacher of natives in Alaska. This arrival set the tone for her adventures over the next eighteen years. In 1937, aged 77, she collected the letters she had sent home, and with the help of her great-niece Jane, tried to turn them into a publishable manuscript. The project failed.

In 1993, Jane Jacobs took another look at her great-aunt's manuscript, and saw how exciting it was. In a sort of posthumous collaboration, she edited and annotated it, and then, after traveling to Alaska to track Hannah through the archives, she wrote a commentary to complement the memoir.

In conversation, Jacobs says of her great-aunt much that is true of herself: "Hannah had an interest in the concrete. She's not an ideologist. . . . She's really thoughtful. She was no dummy in any way. She was down-to-earth. . . . Hannah would not have reacted to today's world with generalities. I think she would have tried to instill a different attitude, case by case. She would not be making didactic fulminations about 'whither society' if she were alive today."

Fifty-five years after her death, Hannah Breece's book has appeared. It has aged well from the delay: untimeliness makes it quite timely. She is a woman of the past with whom women of today should reckon.

1914

The following article about Lovisa Sheard Gossman '14 was written by Georgine Loveland for The Weekly Almanac of Honesdale.

From horse and buggy days to the man on the moon, Lovisa "Vi" Gossman has experienced mind-boggling changes in her 100 years, and has relished every minute of it.

Born on December 8, 1895, on a farm in Boyd's Mills, to George and Blanche Crocker Sheard, she was possessed of a curious nature; a restless, adventurous spirit, and an abundant sense of fun.

"I don't think I did many chores," she remembered, "I just sat in the corner and read."

At the time, the old farmhouse had no plumbing, electricity, or running water, the same as the other farms of the day.

"We had eight or nine cows and raised potatoes," she said. "Flour and sugar came in barrels and the buckwheat we raised, Mother made pancakes with in the winter. My father was a carpenter, and my mother sold the maple syrup we made, in Honesdale, for \$1 a gallon.

"We bought our first telephone from the Big Eddy Phone Company, and there were no monthly fees, but there were 20 people on the same line. East customer listened for their special ring. Ten short rings signified a fire somewhere, and we could find out where it was."

Mrs. Gossman liked to ride into Honesdale with her father, when he bought coal, and go to Menners or Katz's Department Stores.

"I liked to ride on the elevator," she said. "We used a horse and buggy in good weather, and a buffalo robe kept us warm in the horse and cutter

(sleigh) in the winter. The cutter was small and had a rounded body — one good fat man could have filled it," she remarked.

In the winter, the family moved the range into the dining room from the summer kitchen. There was a pot-bellied coal stove in the living room. Eventually, they acquired a furnace in the basement and a large register in the hall, but the house still wasn't that warm, especially in the bedrooms.

A stovepipe ran through the room that she and one of her sisters shared, but the room would still be so cold sometimes that the water in the wash basin would freeze.

"We wore long woolen underwear then, not silk panties like they do now," she said.

"Mother and Father were always there for us. We couldn't miss school. When the weather was bad, my father would carry me to school; we had to go. When we did chores for the neighbors, or ran errands, we got a penny, or rarely a nickel, if the chore was really hard.

"We always went to Grandmother Crocker's for Thanksgiving, and spent Christmas at home. We usually had chickens for dinner, because we raised them, and wonderful breads and pies. Mother would test the oven's temperature by sticking her hand in it; there was no other way then.

"The Christmas tree in church was decorated with candles, held on with little clips. It's a wonder the whole thing didn't go up in flames. We would be given little net bags with hard candy in them, and an orange, which was like a piece of gold.

"I suppose we were poor," Mrs. Gossman commented, "but we never knew it. We always had enough to eat, and a few toys, too." She remembers listening to the first radio — a crystal set with headphones.

After graduating from Damascus High School, Mrs. Gossman attended Bloomsburg State Normal School, a teachers college.

"The only thing a woman could be in those days was a nurse or a teacher. I chose teaching, and taught for seven years, but I didn't like it."

Instead of continuing in a field she knew was not for her, she took the civil service exam and worked in the Adjutant General's Office, part of the War Department, in Washington, D.C. during World War I. She kept track of servicemen's records, and was able to tell who was eligible for benefits after the war was over.

Mrs. Gossman has fond memories of spending evenings at Keith's Orpheum, where various types of entertainment were presented and where President Wilson had a box. The fun ended in 1918 with the arrival of the disastrous flu epidemic.

She then went to Chicago and worked at Montgomery Wards, answering complaint letters. She found a better job as secretary to the vice president of the Live Poultry Transport Company.

Mrs. Gossman had prepared by attending night school in Washington and thereafter "could always get by, by typing. I was not fast, though," she stated, "not 100 words per minute or anything like that."

When her boss was promoted to president of another company, she went along, and was working there when President Harding died on a train.

Then she got tired of Chicago and, in April of 1922, decided to see the country by train. She and

her "shirt-tail" cousin, Bessie Kimble, started off on a grand adventure, at a time when such an escapade was unheard of for two young ladies.

Mrs. Gossman never cared too much about society's opinion; she craved adventure, so off they went to Kentucky; New Orleans, where they "did the town," were ferried across the Mississippi and hooked onto the Albuquerque Express, and sped across the West.

"Lots of sand," she said.

They stopped for six weeks in Los Angeles, where a slick salesman tried to sell her land lots, and worked at a public stenographer's office for a few weeks, until they had enough money to continue.

From there, the intrepid pair made their way to Oakland, Salt Lake City, Colorado, Michigan and Kansas, before returning to Chicago. Then, she came home to Pennsylvania for a while. She landed in Honesdale on a bus, with one silver dollar left.

When people would ask her father why he let her do these outlandish things, he would reply, "I might as well, she'll go anyway."

In 1927, Mrs. Gossman left for New York City, where she worked for 23 years. She met her husband, Joseph A. Gossman, at a teacher's placement agency where she worked. Mr. Gossman worked for the D&H Railroad. When his health began to fail, the couple returned to Boyd's Mills. The two travelled much, and after her husband's death, she continued to wander whenever the opportunity presented itself. Mrs. Gossman went to England in 1964, across the Channel to Holland, and spent three weeks touring Europe. She especially liked Italy and Switzerland.

She also worked at *Highlights for Children* and learned to drive a car, "after a few attempts." She drove until 1988, when she was 93 and decided to take herself off the road, but still misses the independence driving gave her, and is reluctant to depend on others.

Kent Brown, editor of *Highlights for Children*, complimented his long-time friend.

"Vi has always been an inspiration to me," he said. "She hasn't changed in all that time. She has always been alert and lively, and interested in a broad range of subjects."

A voracious reader, Mrs. Gossman loves mysteries, and now travels by means of a new cable television hookup. Her eyes sparkle as she shares her remarkable life experiences.

"They tell me I was named after my grandmother," she explained, but then noted she was named for a character in a long ago fairy tale — Lovisa, the old witch!

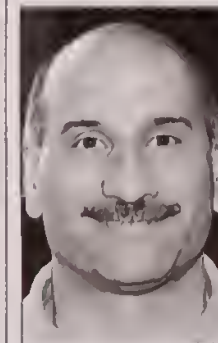

Dear Editor,

I received my January issue of *The Maroon & Gold* in yesterday's mail and was impressed with both the new name and the format. My compliments to you and your staff on the change. I, too, had a feeling of nostalgia when I saw the new banner, as I was formerly an editor of *The M&G* back in 1948. History has a way of repeating itself.

I also read of the death of Peter (Pete) Wisner. His passing reminded me of his presence at Bloomsburg in those years after World War II. There was no mention of his having coached our varsity basketball team during the seasons of 1946-1948. Also worthy of mention was an incident which occurred during his first year on campus. As we all learned during the 1946 football season, Pete was a graduate of East Stroudsburg State Teachers College and brought his allegiance along with him to our campus — proudly announcing to our football team members that he had absolutely no chance of defeating East Stroudsburg in our final game of the year. In fact, he was so sure of his pronouncement that he wagered a bet that if the Huskies were to beat Stroudsburg, he would push a peanut (with his nose) up the full length of College Hill to the fountain in front of Carver Hall.

Husky fans of that era will recall that we rose to great heights that cold November day at East Stroudsburg and came back with a 7-6 victory, much to the surprise of many, including one Pete Wisner. The victory enabled the Huskies to finish the season with four wins and four losses under interim coach John Hoch.

Coach Wisner was good to his word, and on the Monday evening following the Saturday game, he appeared at the street at the bottom of College Hill ready to fulfill his end of the lost wager. Fifty years tend to cloud somewhat the details of that event, but I do recall that just about the entire student body (some 650 students) turned out for the occasion. I even remember that a town fire engine provided the lighting essential for Pete's mission.

As a member of the football team, I joined my teammates who gathered along either side of Coach Wisner's path to make sure he complied with his promise to push that peanut all the way up College Hill. It was a carnival-like atmosphere, with lots of cheering (the band and cheerleaders were on hand) and hilarity during the hour it took for that peanut and that nose to reach the fountain. The important thing to remember was that Pete Wisner was a good sport and provided an exciting evening for the entire college community.

Perhaps some of your older readers will recall that night of 50 years ago.

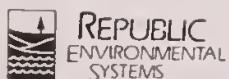

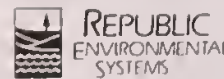

Alumna finds early intervention makes difference in son's life

(The following article by Brenda Shaffer Conger '78 of Vestal, N.Y., appeared in the February issue of *Exceptional Parent magazine*.)

Nothing in my 17 years of teaching special education students ever prepared me for the enormous task of parenting a child with disabilities. But ready or not, in April 1993, our son, Clifford, was born eight weeks premature with multiple disabilities and a wide range of health disorders.

After two months in the NICU and no diagnosis, Clifford's doctors, believing he would not live long, told us to just bring him home and let nature take its course. At that point, early intervention was the last thing on my mind; I could focus only on the goal of day-to-day survival.

In retrospect, however, our family's survival was greatly influenced by our county's early intervention program. My first encounter with early intervention staff came when I halfheartedly brought four-month-old Clifford to the High Risk Birth Clinic in Binghamton, N.Y.

I was afraid to hear how low-functioning my son was, but the teacher in me wanted to know his developmental levels and whether his vision and hearing were normal. At home, we had seen no reaction to sound, and he would only move his head to one side. A close friend — a teacher of students with visual impairments — had given me some ideas for stimulating his vision. So it was that I bravely walked into the clinic that day, clutching my older daughter's Cinderella light-up wand to show the professionals what Clifford and I had been doing at home.

I never expected to find such positive and caring people. When I broke down in tears over my frustration at producing a child with disabilities and at my inability to understand his needs, the team members offered the support I so desperately needed, praising my efforts to work with Clifford. They introduced me to the clinic's parent support group and called me almost every day — just to see how things were going. The clinic nurse made a home visit, taught me infant massage to help with Clifford's constipation and offered advice on nutrition.

Through the early intervention program, Clifford began receiving in-home speech, physical and occupational therapies. And after every therapy session, the home health aide worked with Clifford to reinforce the new skills he was learning.

Nothing came easily. I never dreamed a child would need to *learn* how to hold a bottle! Since both my husband and I worked, we had little time to practice these skills with Clifford. Our evenings were devoted to cuddle time with both children, and to writing lots of notes for therapists and home health aides.

But slowly, everyone's hard work began to pay off. Clifford, the child with such a bleak prognosis, finally started to respond to his surroundings and to acquire new skills. The

only thing still missing was interaction with children his own age. By the time he was 16 months old, Clifford had started to resist his at-home therapies and wanted only to be held and cuddled by his home health aide. In my heart, I knew it was time to "push him out the door" and integrate him into the real world.

Because Clifford was still considered medically fragile, some health care professionals opposed a switch from in-home therapies to a center-based program. And I'll be the first to admit that Clifford's first few months at the Handicapped Children's Association were not easy. But as time went on, he gradually began to interact with the other children. I was so proud when his teacher sent me a note saying that Clifford had crawled over to the sand table, pulled himself up to a little girl's chair and tried to push her off. Clifford was finally telling everyone that he wanted to join an activity!

In two years of early intervention, we have made many changes in the services our family receives and have held endless meetings to update goals for Clifford's program. Through this process, I have become further involved in the early intervention system — attending county-wide meetings, serving on the respite committee, acting as a parent representative and, very recently, becoming a co-chair of the local early intervention council.

I want to encourage other parents to fight for what they feel is right for their children without worrying about "making waves" along the way. Parents know their children best, and if they don't advocate for the necessary services, who will? *I know* Clifford would never have made such progress without the program at Handicapped Children's Association and all the in-home therapies he received prior to starting school. I share his story in part as a special "thank you" to all the wonderful people in Clifford's past and present, who have never given up on him.

Ithaca dean leads College of Business

David K. Long, dean of the School of Business at Ithaca College for the past 14 years, is the new dean of the College of Business at Bloomsburg.

"Dr. Long has a distinguished career in higher education, especially in the areas of business and business administration," said Dr. Wilson Bradshaw, provost and vice president for

academic affairs. "He will provide enlightened leadership for the College of Business, especially as we pursue accreditation by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business."

In his role at Ithaca, Long provided academic and administrative leadership for departments of accounting, finance and international business, management and human resource management,

and marketing. He administered programs in a school of business that enrolled 600 students and had a full-time faculty of 32 members and a staff of six.

During his tenure, Ithaca's business program instituted many changes, including the addition of degree programs in marketing and international business as well as interdisciplinary degree programs in theater arts management, economics management, telecommunications management, administration of health services, computer information management, sports management and medical information management. In addition, numerous minors were added to the curriculum within and outside the School of Business.

He was responsible for the college's strategic plan for seeking AACSB accreditation and the recruitment and hiring of 30 new faculty members. Under his direction the business school created a fully integrated computer system and has embarked on several fund-raising campaigns.

Prior to assuming the duties of college dean, Long served as the school's assistant dean from 1979-1982. He was a member of Ithaca's faculty as a professor in the departments of management and speech communications. He also served as chairperson of the management department for two years.

His professional affiliations have included the Board of Directors of the Middle Atlantic Association of Colleges of Business Administration, AACSB Candidacy Committee, Harvard University Management Development Program, AACSB Implementation Committee and the Board of Directors of the Tompkins County Chamber of Commerce.

Long received his bachelor's and master's degrees at the University of Akron and earned his doctorate at Kent University in 1974.

Student recruiter for 17 years

A member of the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame and a former member of the Alumni Association Board of Directors, Dick Lloyd has coordinated Bloomsburg University's alumni student recruitment program in New Jersey for the past 17 years. In that volunteer role, he has been responsible for training and scheduling fellow alumni to represent the

university at 25-40 college night programs each fall.

Lloyd is assistant vice president for alumni relations at Rutgers University in New Jersey, where he has served in various capacities for the past 31 years. Long-awaited library construction underway

Now that the first dirt has been moved, and there is a hole in the ground, many questions can be answered concerning the new Harvey A. Andruss Library.

How will it all get there, and how much will it cost? Five major contractors and many sub-contractors will work on all facets of the construction.

Mar-Paul Company of Dunmore is the general contractor and will oversee the building from its initial stages to completion. The firm was awarded the job by the Department of General Services based on its bid of \$5,130,000.

The mechanical bid of \$1,724,500 went to Bognet, Inc., of Hazleton, while \$207,000 worth of plumbing went to Bohrer-Reagan of Reading. Medlar Electric Company, also of Reading, received the electrical work for a bid of \$1,196,000. The final contract for fire protection, including sprinklers and detectors, was

awarded to Fire Protection Industries of Landing, N.J. Total projected cost of the building is \$8,394,250.

And yes, the name will accompany the books, computers, microfilm and other materials to the new location at the east end of the lower campus. No new name has been chosen for the existing library, but the building will be used for student services including admissions, financial aid and advisement.

The proposed opening of the new library is scheduled for the spring of 1998. Four floors encompassing 105,000 square feet will make the new building the largest academic facility on campus. Study seating for more than 1,000 people and 20 group study rooms with access to computer data will be available.

One hundred forty-five laptop computers will be made available at the circulation desk, and public access connections for personal computers

will number 500, with conduits for 125 future connections. Personal computers will have access to the library's on-line catalog, CD-ROM databases on a local network as well as national and international databases via the Internet.

The spacious facility will provide for exhibits in the lobby and meeting space, including an "after-hours" study room for students when the library is closed, and an outdoor reading area on the fourth floor with a view of the Susquehanna Valley.

Among all the newness, there will be some of the traditional. Three Tiffany windows and four Spence stained glass windows from the current library and the original Waller Hall will be placed in the new facility. The exterior of the building will feature an area reminiscent of the Long Porch on the original Waller Hall, which once stood on Second Street where Lycoming Residence Hall stands today.

Husky football coach honored

Heading into his fourth season as the Huskies' head football coach, Danny Hale has been selected Division II Newcomer of the Year by *American Football Quarterly*. A newcomer is defined as a coach who has completed three years at a school.

Hale joins Terry Bowden of Auburn as one of five divisional honorees.

Under Hale's direction, Bloomsburg has gone 22-10-1 in the last three seasons, winning a share of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Eastern Division in 1994 and 1995. In each of the three seasons, the Huskies' record has improved, culminating with a 9-1-1 season this past fall, only the third time in school history that Bloomsburg has won nine or more games in a season.

Prior to Hale's arrival, Bloomsburg went through a 1-9 season in 1992. The following season, the Huskies improved by four wins, posting a 5-6 season. The team went three games better in Hale's second season, going 8-3 in 1993 by winning eight of the final nine games of the year after starting with two losses.

Honors are nothing new to Hale at Bloomsburg. He was awarded District I Coach of the Year honors by the American Football Coaches Association and PSAC East Coach of the Year honors in each of the last two seasons.

Heading into the 1996 season, the Huskies return 13 starters — 10 on the defensive side of the ball — and 38 letter-winners. The Huskies open the season by hosting Wayne State of Detroit, Michigan, at Redman Stadium on Saturday, August 31, at noon.

BloomU wins first Dixon Trophy

Bloomsburg University has the premier athletic program among the 14 members of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference as the Huskies sit atop the final standings for the inaugural F. Eugene Dixon, Jr. Trophy, signifying the best all-around athletic program in the State System of Higher Education.

Backed by a conference title in men's and women's tennis, PSAC East titles in football, men's and women's basketball and softball, and conference runner-up finishes in field hockey and women's soccer, Bloomsburg compiled a total of 116 points, one ahead of second-place Edinboro.

"I am extremely pleased that Bloomsburg University has won the first Dixon Trophy," said Dr. Jessica Kozloff, University president and member of the NCAA Presidents' Commission.

"Winning this award is yet another confirmation of the quality of our student-athletes, coaches and athletic administrators. I am honored to be involved with a group of people who have set the standard for a comprehensive, well-rounded intercollegiate program."

On the women's side, the Huskies are tops in the conference with 60.5 points, outdistancing second-place Slippery Rock by 2.5 points. In men's sports, Bloomsburg is second, 9.5 points behind Edinboro.

Bloomsburg finished in the top four in the conference in six women's sports and five men's sports, for a total of 11 top-four finishes out of 18 sponsored programs. The next closest school had seven teams with top-four finishes.

"We believe in the values of a sound, competitive program for all participants," said Mary Gardner, director of athletics. "There is a strong emphasis throughout the success of the student-athletes both on and off the playing field."

"An all-sports trophy gives the PSAC an opportunity to recognize athletic achievement with attention to broad-based programming," said Dr. Tod Eberle, PSAC commissioner. "The Dixon Trophy may not always be awarded to an institution that wins championship in the higher profile sports, but rather to a university that competes at the highest levels in the conference in every sport."

The determination of the winner is based on a university's finish in conference competition. The maximum point total awarded per sport is based on the number of schools sponsoring a specific sport. For example, in a sport which is sponsored by all 14 schools, the champion will receive 14 points, second place gets 13 points, etc. In a sport with nine sponsoring members, the champion earns nine points, etc. Points are earned in the top six men's and top six women's finishes for each member school in conference competition.

For the 1995-1996 academic season, the 18 Bloomsburg University athletic teams combined for a record of 204-105-4 (.658). In the fall, the teams combined for a record of 66-11-4 (.840), the best fall season ever at the University.

Seven teams were represented in the NCAA Division II Championships, and 13 of the 16 teams which competed in dual-match competition had records of .500 or above.

During the school year, Bloomsburg had 49



student-athletes who earned All-PSAC honors or were an individual champion in PSAC competition. In addition, eight players or coaches earned major awards in their respective sports by the PSAC, including the men's and women's conference player of the year.

The trophy is named after Dixon, the chairperson of the Board of Governors for the State System of Higher Education since the body's inception in 1983. Under his guidance, the board is responsible for planning and coordinating the development and operation of the System, including fiscal, personnel and educational policies for the 14 State System universities.

Athletic teams rank 17th in Sears Cup

After winning the Dixon Trophy as the top all-around athletic program in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in May, BloomU athletics furthered its standing as the top team in the conference by placing higher than any other league school in the inaugural Sears Directors Cup.

The Huskies placed 17th in the final standings, which places points on a school's finish in the NCAA Championships for each sport. The national champion earns 64 points, and points are awarded down the line. California-Davis won the Division II race, earning a division-high 251 points in the spring season to run away with the title with 610 points.

Other PSAC schools in the top 50 include Edinboro and Millersville (tied at 23rd), Kutztown (25th), Shippensburg (28th), and Slippery Rock (32nd).

In the spring season, Bloomsburg had three teams place high in the NCAA Division II championships, highlighted by the quarterfinal appearance of the men's tennis team. In addition, the softball and women's tennis teams advanced to the Round of 16, giving the Huskies 163.5 points for the spring season.

Kozloff named to NCAA body

President Jessica Kozloff is one of nine new members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Presidents Commission. The newcomers, chosen by chief executive officers at NCAA institutions, began their terms at the conclusion of the 1996 convention in January.

"It's a great honor to be elected to this important commission," Kozloff said. "I'm sure my selection is due in large part to the outstanding and well-rounded athletic program we have here at Bloomsburg University. I firmly believe that intercollegiate athletics are important for the character and leadership development of our student-athletes, and to help build a sense of community pride for the University."

Kozloff was one of three chief executive officers joining the Presidents Commission at the Division II level, along with Charles D. Dunn of Henderson State in Arkansas and Albert Shannon from St. Joseph's College in Indiana.

The 44-member Presidents Commission serves as a leadership structure and forum for presidential interests in intercollegiate athletics matters. It is the first defined ongoing forum for chief executive officers within the NCAA structure, and its primary function is to represent the interests of presidents and chancellors in major policy issues in college athletics.

There are several principles which are of great concern to the Commission because they inherently relate to major athletics policy matters and because they are of interest to chief executive officers. The group's primary concerns include institutional control, the student-athlete, concepts of ethical conduct and fairness, academic standards and the primacy of the educational mission, and economy and appropriate balance between athletics and other institutional priorities.

For Kozloff, this is not the first time she has served on a national body. She is a member of the Presidential Policies and Purposes Committee for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and also the Commission on Leadership Development for the American Council on Education.

Professor's columns cut through follies and foibles

(The following article about Walter Brasch, professor of journalism, appeared in the March 31 issue of *Citizens' Voice* of Wilkes-Barre. Brasch teaches newswriting, feature writing, public affairs reporting, social foundations of the mass media, and magazine editing and production. Each spring, he teaches a 240-student megasection introduction course.)

On the day Bloomsburg University journalism professor Walt Brasch was in Wilkes-Barre selling a handful of his latest book, cross-dressing shock jock Howard Stern was in Philadelphia selling 15,000.

"I don't regret taking a few sales away from Howard," says Brasch implishly, "but I'm grateful that because of him and other celebrities who think they can write, I'm not burdened by tax shelters and investment decisions."

Brasch is one of the nation's leading satirists whose rapier wit cuts through the follies and foibles of American government, social institutions, and the media. He is now making the rounds through Pennsylvania to conduct book signings and about 50 radio talk shows to promote his ninth book, *Enquiring Minds and Space Aliens*, a collection of his newspaper columns.

The title column is an interview with the editor of the newspaper that first revealed that space aliens were advising the 1992 presidential candidates. "Aliens are influencing them again this year," says Brasch, "since their inane ideas don't seem to have any earthly basis."

Brasch acknowledges that advertising is important, and good advertising is often a joy to watch. But he can't resist poking fun at campaigns.

In "The Chicken Army," he wonders what would happen if the Army adopted ad techniques similar to those of Kentucky Fried Chicken. In "Sex and Single Beer Can," he peels away sexual themes in beer advertising.

And in "Jeanetics and the Cool 'Wannabe,'" he investigates America's fetish with jeans, noting, "On labels as wide as barn doors, to be displayed on bodies nearly as wide." America

has become infatuated with designer jeans.

While the media and politicians come under scrutiny, some of Brasch's most cutting wit is reserved for the academic establishment. "I have seen worse writing from journalism professors than from my own students," says Brasch, who points that "many pros think writing esoteric and useless research makes them more 'professorial.' "What it does is make their students unemployed. Maybe these pros should drop the presentation they're teaching journalism and admit they're frauds," says Brasch, whose own Ph.D. in mass communication has never gotten in the way of clear lucid thinking.

In "The Fine Art of University Grantsmanship," he rips apart academic pretension by having a "media behavioral research scientist" interview a cat who's willing to take the prof's grant money in exchange for answers about TV viewing habits.

In several columns he plays with TV newscasts, much like a cat plays with a mouse before devouring it. In "Long Island Lolita," he exposes what he calls schlock journalism of titillation. And in "The Beeper Cacaphony," he tweaks society's fetish for instant communication.

Brasch himself combines both academic and professional lives. He is a former newspaper reporter and editor whose column currently appears weekly in 23 newspapers.

Recipient of national awards

During the past three years, he has won major national awards for his newspaper column from the National Society of Newspaper Columnists, Pennsylvania Press Club, National Federal of Press Women, International Association of Business Communicators, and the Spotlight contest of the Society of Professional Journalists.

He is also national correspondent for *American Reporter*, the nation's only completely on-line newspaper. Before becoming a professor, he was also a writer-producer of multimedia productions and media consultant for entertainment and political campaigns.

Brasch is also president of the Keystone State professional chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists and founder of Pennsylvania

Journalism Educators.

Most of his books are about the media and social issues. Two of his books — *Black English and the Mass Media* (co-authored with Dana Ullloth) and *The Press and the State* — were named outstanding academic books by *Choice*, the magazine of the American Library Association.

Brasch is a vigorous proponent of the First Amendment and in freedom of information issues. In "Stealing the First Amendment," he lambasts the *Washington Post* for arguing that stealing newspapers can be seen as freedom of speech.

Giving readers the facts

Not all of Brasch's columns are satirical. In "All in Vein," he pokes fun at newspaper columnists while reporting about what having varicose veins has done to his career.

Many of his columns are quite serious, too. "Sometimes, you just have to present the facts and hope the readers see the truth," says Brasch. Many of his columns focus on labor issues. A member of three unions, Brasch says he believes in the labor movement, "even if I have trouble accepting what some union leaders have done to harm the movement by their lack of labor knowledge or failure to fight for critical social issues."

In "We're Management, We Don't Have to Tell You Anything," he explores the problems of corporate greed, management stupidity, and downsizing as it affects newspapers. But he can't stay serious for long. In "Traded for Two Rookies," he questions what it would be like if newspapers traded reporters like baseball teams trade outfielders. And, in "Downsizing Baseball's Problems," he suggests that the strike could have been averted by reducing player salaries and laying off the shortstop who he said is just another superfluous position.

Sanders

Retired coach honored

Two honors were accorded recently to Roger Sanders, professor of health, physical education and athletics, and retired head wrestling coach.

In March he was selected as a game official for the 1996 Paralympic Games in Atlanta, and in May he was honored as a Distinguished Alumnus by West Chester University, his alma mater.

As head coach for 25 years, his teams compiled a record of 200-90-4 (.678). His teams won six Pennsylvania State Athletic Association team championships, and the Eastern Wrestling League Championship in 1981. He coached 37 wrestlers to PSAC championships and 23 wrestlers to EWL championships.

He was elected to the Pennsylvania Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame and served as president of the National Wrestling Coaches Association. Two of his articles have been published in *Wrestling USA* magazine.

Sanders serves as an officer of the National Blind School Wrestling Association. He dedicated a sabbatical leave to offering seminars at schools for the blind. He has served as the coordinator of the United States Association of Blind Athletes and accompanied blind wrestlers to the World Championships in Istanbul, Turkey. He is spearheading an attempt to have blind wrestling added to the Impaired Olympics to be held in Sydney, Australia, in the year 2000.

He has also been active as a fundraiser for Multiple Sclerosis at the local and state levels. He has volunteered to serve as a clinician for the NCAA Youth Education Through Sports program.

Baseball

The Huskies reached the 20-win mark for the third consecutive season for only the second time in school history. They ended the year even across the board with a 22-22 record, including a third-place finish in the PSAC at 10-10.

After starting the year 2-8, the Huskies won five in a row, and later had a seven-game winning streak late in the season to give them their 20th win.

The young Bloomsburg squad, graduating only two seniors, placed four underclassmen on the PSAC All-Conference team.

At first base, freshman Trevor Fetterman led the team in doubles and triples and was among the top four in batting average, walks, and slugging percentage. He also pitched four games, picking up two wins and a save.

Joining him on the first team was sophomore outfielder Ben Hlenicle. Leading the PSAC and the team in stolen bases, he was also tops on the team in batting average, runs scored, hits, and had an 11-game hitting streak when the season ended. He also was second in at-bats and triples.

Another sophomore outfielder, John Stillo, was selected second team All-PSAC. Stillo led the team in home runs, including three-run and two-run homers against Kutztown to earn the PSAC East Player of the Week honor. He finished the season with a hit in 17 of the last 18 games.

Also receiving a second team selection for the Huskies was freshman pitcher Chris Brown. He had the best winning percentage on the team (.4-1) and collected two saves to get the relief pitcher spot.

Softball

The softball team finished with 35 wins for the 12th consecutive season (36-12) and gave Jan Hutchinson, the winningest coach in Division II softball history, her 600th career victory.

The Huskies also earned a trip to the NCAA Division II East Regional for a record 14th time, where they placed second after winning the PSAC Eastern Division title.

Finishing her career at Bloomsburg, senior Jen Lefever was named to the Mid-Atlantic Regional All-Tournament team at shortstop. Leaving the Huskies with 14 school records, Lefever was the only two-time All-American at shortstop for Bloomsburg.

The other three All-Tournament spots belonged to freshmen catcher Megan Hunsinger, outfielder Bev Hartley and pitcher Christie Kittle.

Earning PSAC Eastern Division Rookie of the Year honors, Kittle was also named to the first team. Hunsinger, freshmen Mindy Ballie in the outfield and Marcie Hickey were also named first teamers of the Eastern Division. Hickey and Kittle were also named to the ECAC Division II South Softball All-Star team.

The team leader in home runs, Hickey added 42 runs scored and 26 runs batted in.

On March 12, Kittle pitched a no-hitter in only her sixth start, the 37th in school history. She later went on to win 30 games for Bloomsburg, leading the PSAC in wins.

The same day Kittle threw a no-hitter, Bloomsburg gave Hutchinson her 600th win, a 7-0 victory over Sacred Heart.

Husky Sports

Men's Tennis

Bloomsburg capped off a great season by capturing its 10th consecutive PSAC championship, taking all six singles championships and the three doubles championships.

The Huskies then travelled to Edmond, Oklahoma, to compete in the NCAA Division II championships, and advanced to the quarterfinals, the farthest ever in school history.

After such a successful season, post-season honors did not elude the Huskies as Coach Marty Coyne '83 was named East Region Men's Coach of the Year.

Junior Kyle Richards was named the Player to Watch in the East Region. Playing at first singles, he was ranked third in the East Region and 13th nationally and pulled off a big win in the first round of the NCAA championships when he defeated fourth-ranked Ignacio Ruiz.

Richards ended the year with a 25-15 mark, as well as posting a school record for most doubles wins in a season (32) with his partner, junior Evan Rosen.

Freshman Marcus Nilsson was also honored by being named the Rookie of the Year for Division II. He had the highest winning percentage on the team (28-10) at .737, and was ranked fifth in the East Region, 25th nationally.

In the NCAA championships, Nilsson scored a three-set win to seal the first round victory, 4-2. He teamed with classmate Rob Dixon to be ranked third nationally in doubles and finished with 30 wins, including an Eastern Rolex Tournament Championship in the fall.

The team posted a final record of 15-8 and returns all members of the team except Scott Connelly, who ended his Bloomsburg career with two PSAC singles titles.

Women's Lacrosse

Bernadette Macca's first season at the helm made a turn for the better when the women's lacrosse team split their last four games of the year to finish at 2-9.

Junior Betsy Roberge led the PSAC goaltenders in save percentage at .597, a school record, and also set a school record with 23 saves in a game versus PSAC season champ West Chester. Roberge set another school record with 192 saves, playing in every minute of the Huskies' season.

Defense was also honored as senior Kim Bullock was named to the 1996 women's lacrosse All-Conference first team at third man. Even though she played defense, it did not stop her from scoring five goals and passing off for two assists.

The leading scorer for the Huskies was senior Colleen Fahie, whose 21 goals, seven assists, and 28 points were all team highs. Classmate Kelly McKee was second in all categories, collecting 18 goals and 20 points. The top returning scorer for next season was junior Erica Brower, who tallied 11 goals.

Track and Field

The men's track and field team posted second-place finishes in both the Dickinson and Lock Haven Invitationals, while finishing third in the Shippensburg Invitational and 11th in the PSAC championships.

The top performance at the PSAC championships was sophomore Joe McGinnley, with a third place finish in the discus. Also, sophomore Kip Hoffman placed sixth in the 1500 meters, while junior Chris Moscatello finished fourth in the 10,000 meters.

The top performer on the women's side was freshman Bethany Canner, with strong showings in the discus, javelin and the shot-put all year.

Hurdles seemed to be a strong event as well, with juniors Nikki Noll and Rachael Kostecki placing in most invitationals in the 100 meters, while freshman Mary Pappas and junior Melissa Mackey competed in the 400 meters.

"She has been very instrumental in the success of the library campaign, as well as many other projects such as increasing scholarship and equipment acquisition dollars in both amounts and numbers of awards. She is an outstanding team player and a tremendous asset to the advancement organization and the university."

Helwig, who served as interim director since 1993, served as assistant director of development from 1986 to 1988. She implemented a comprehensive Annual Fund program and helped double support in two years. She also

initiated fund-raising efforts with parents and directed the university's faculty/staff campaign.

She became associate director in 1988 and took more responsibilities for overseeing the daily operations of the office and its staff. She implemented the university's first comprehensive campaign, "The Trust for Generations," achieving a goal of \$3 million.

In her interim role and now as director, Helwig plans and executes the university's annual comprehensive fund-raising campaign. She administers an annual budget of \$250,000, which supports the development and alumni operations as well as projects for the Bloomsburg University

Foundation.

During Helwig's tenure, the development office has quadrupled alumni support and doubled the number of alumni donors. Under her direction, the Parents Fund has been rated number one in the State System of Higher Education based on dollars raised and rate of participation every year since 1987.

Annual gifts of \$1,000 or more have increased by 250 percent, while annual gifts greater than \$100 have increased 400 percent. The current actual, deferred and in-kind gift receipts surpassed \$1.5 million in 1995.

Prior to joining the staff at Bloomsburg, she served as director of industrial/corporate services and coordinator of public information and development at the Berwick Hospital.

She holds a master's degree from Bloomsburg.

She and her husband, Skeeter, are parents of two children, Tara, age eight, and Joshua, age five. They live in Catawissa.

Fund-raising efforts bring banner year

Bloomsburg University students, faculty and many programs will benefit in the 1996-1997 academic year as result of a record-breaking year of contributions. The final numbers for the 1995 campaign are in, and Susan Helwig, director of development, reports that they are good.

According to the figures released, University fund-raising efforts during the year exceeded \$1.5 million. Those dollars were raised from a variety of sources and will be distributed through the Bloomsburg University Foundation, Inc., across the campus in the upcoming year in many ways.

"We had a banner year," says Helwig. "We set ambitious goals from the start, and our constituents came through in a big way. Our alumni and parent funds were very active, and the faculty/staff campaign has made tremendous strides over the past years."

Bloomsburg's alumni participation rate is approximately 25 percent, much above the national average at public colleges and universities throughout the nation. The University's faculty and staff members contributed more than \$78,000 in 1995, up from just \$6,000 in 1990. Retired employees make up an increasing portion of those donations.

"People are really starting to know the needs of the University," says Helwig. "Many younger alumni are participating because many of them were helped by the dollars the Foundation has raised. The 'bricks and mortar' campaign we

conducted to build a new library is something tangible and easily understood by donors, so that helped us. But there is simply a better understanding of our needs, and people are answering the call."

Business and corporate scholarships have also risen in recent fund drives and will be one of the focuses of the development staff's attention in the future.

"We have much more to do, and that is definitely an avenue we will pursue. An example is our established relationship with Pepsi. Those types of opportunities and partnerships are sponsorships we want to increase."

Annual fund supports many programs

Approximately \$819,000 of the monies were directed to the annual fund which is used to maintain on-going scholarships, including the honors and scholars programs. In addition, faculty and staff development, as well as alumni activities, are funded from this area. Special events such as the President's Ball and Poinsettia Pops Concert are avenues to enhance the scholarship fund and to build future relationships with donors to the University.

The annual fund also provides monies for scholarships for student/athletes, reaching nearly \$108,000 in the recently concluded campaign. Dollars in that area are supplemented by fund-raising ventures such as golf outings, the annual auction/dinner-dance and raffles which accounted for \$31,646 last year.

The biggest portion of the total dollars raised came in a single gift from the estate of Mary Taubel Rieder. Mrs. Rieder donated \$200,000 in memory of her mother, Mary Moore Taubel, an 1890 graduate.

In addition, a gift to support the University's efforts to attract world-renowned talent for the Celebrity Artists Series was received from Barbara Hudock, Class of 1975, and her husband, Michael. They donated funds for the purchase of a Steinway grand piano in memory of Barbara's father, Francis J. Benner.

The University's new library project will be the biggest recipient of dollars raised in the campaign as more than \$600,000 will be put forth this year as part of the University's combined effort with the Commonwealth to build the facility. Construction began in May.

The Foundation is also about to initiate a campaign to purchase new seats for Mitrani Hall in the Haas Center for the Arts. The facility currently seats 1,900 people, and the total cost of the project is about \$230,000.

"The Foundation continues to work diligently to support the strategic goals of the University," said Anthony M. Ianiero, vice president for university advancement and executive director of the Foundation.
