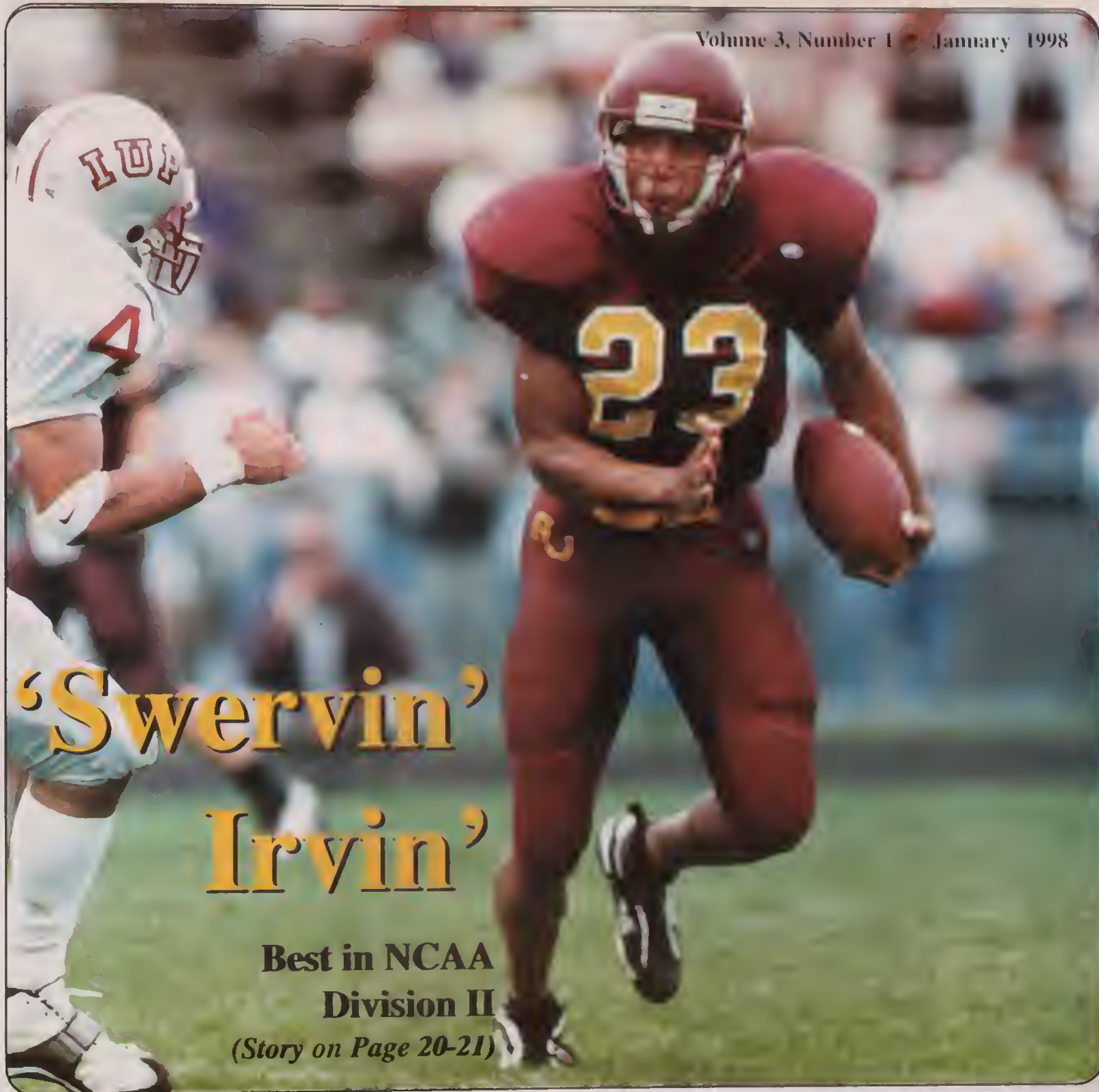

Alumnus completes master's at age 80

Ralph Jones, who completed his bachelor's degree at Bloomsburg University in 1992 at age 75, has reached another milestone.

On December 12, he was one of 96 students to receive master's degrees during ceremonies at Bloomsburg. He is thought to be the oldest student in the school's history to receive a master's degree.

A resident of Espy, Mr. Jones attended classes at Bloomsburg in the 1930s but left without completing his degree. He moved to Philadelphia, where he first worked as a tailor and then entered the U.S. Postal Service.

After retiring to his family home in Espy in 1972, he started taking undergraduate classes in psychology and sociology for no credit. A fervent reader, he soon amassed so many credits that he decided to apply them toward a degree.

And it doesn't look like he is ready to hang up his bookbag yet. He said he may take even more classes.

"They're learning to earn," he said of his fellow students. "I'm just learning to learn."

Former BU president's son returns to deliver commencement address

Returning to the same campus where he spent his childhood 60 years ago, Francis B. Haas Jr. need only gaze on Carver Hall to stir a flood of memories.

Bloomsburg University was then called Bloomsburg State Teachers College, a new moniker given to the former Bloomsburg Normal School when his father, Francis B. Haas Sr. became president in 1927.

He lived in Bloomsburg over the next 12 years as "the president's son," he told graduates at the winter commencement on December 12.

He still fondly remembers Buckalew Place as home "despite a few other occupants in the last 58 years." He also recalls romping through old campus buildings with boyhood chums Dong Dillon and Jimmy Gillespie.

"I'm sure I was a considerable itch to college personnel," he remarked, adding he probably knew "more tunnels and cellar and attic spaces on this campus" than anyone else.

He remembers watching farm hands slaughter cattle "by hitting them between the eyes with a sledgehammer" in a barn on the Dillon farm near Second Street just off what was campus at that time.

"I'm told you don't do this much anymore. . . . That's progress!" he told the assembly.

He also reminded President Jessica Kozloff that there was once a pig farm out

behind Buckalew Place, just beyond an acre of Dillon's camations where the tennis courts are now.

"They were pretty smart then," he noted. "The camations were a nice olfactory barrier between the house and the pigs."

Speaking in the auditorium dedicated to his late father in 1967, Haas said Bloomsburg still retains much of its "small town charm."

But his father would barely recognize today's campus as the one he ran in the 1930s.

"There were never more than 900 students here at that time. And not nearly as many buildings," said the 70-year-old, who carved out a distinguished 45-year law career in Harrisburg.

"I don't know what my father might think. That was a long time ago. But while times are certainly different, the critical importance of institutions remains the same," Haas said.

Having retired in 1995, he said he stays active with causes in education and equality.

"Get involved in institutions, public and

private, each in your own way, following your own particular interests," he challenged. "Don't shrink from controversy."

Haas helped draft the first Fair Housing law while serving with the state's Equal Rights Committee.

He has worked on many government and educational panels in the Capitol, including a stint as superintendent and solicitor for Harrisburg Area Community College.

As deeply rooted to Bloomsburg as he is, Haas admits to one shortcoming.

He never received a degree from Bloomsburg, attending Bucknell University before moving on to the University of Pennsylvania School of Law.

"My father moved the family away when he stepped down in 1939. But we stayed very close to Bloomsburg. The Dillons are still very dear friends of the family, he said.

Upward Bound to celebrate its 20th year

The Upward Bound program at Bloomsburg University is celebrating its 20th year in 1998. This grant-funded program works with 13 area high schools in Columbia, Montour, Northumberland and Schuylkill counties.

Upward Bound provides high school students with opportunities and assistance to explore their potential for academic, social and personal growth. Its purpose is to provide equal access to post-secondary education for high school students by giving them adequate preparation.

Over 250 students have graduated from the Upward Bound program, with 87 percent going on to college. Of that group, 77 percent are college graduates.

A 20th anniversary celebration/dinner is planned for the evening of July 18, 1998. The dinner will be held in the Kehr Union Ballroom, beginning at 6 p.m. Alumni and special guests will speak, and entertainment will be provided by the Upward Bound chorus and a decjey.

Harold "Pat" O'Brien '35 of State College died on July 16, 1997, at age 84. He was an associate dean of the College of Liberal Arts for Commonwealth Campuses at Penn State University and a faculty member for 28 years before retiring on January 1, 1976.

A veteran of World War II, he was awarded the Purple Heart.

He earned a master's degree and a doctorate at Penn State.

He was a consultant to governmental and industrial groups and an author and well-known speaker on communications. He conducted and participated in numerous communication seminars and workshops at Penn State.

He was the debate coach and teacher of speech and parliamentary procedure at Penn State from 1947 until 1959. He also served as general chairman of the Alumni Institute for many years.

In June 1975, he was honored as the 11th recipient of the Lion's Paw Medal, which is awarded by the Lion's Paw Alumni Association to a person who has contributed notable service to the university while fostering the school's worthwhile traditions.

Prior to joining Penn State, he taught at Clearfield High School.

Surviving are his wife, the former Janet Szymanski, a daughter, Patricia Matzeck, a son, Daniel, five grandchildren, two sisters and a brother.

1926

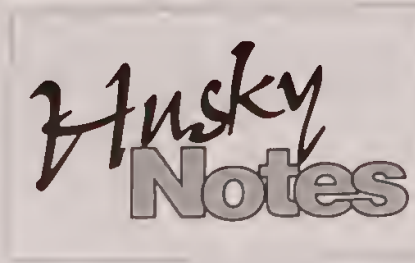

University at record enrollment

Bloomisburg University served more students this past fall than ever before.

Total enrollment is about 6,800 full-time equivalent students, topping the previous enrollment of 6,704 FTE set in 1991. The record enrollment is due in part to a retention rate of 85 percent for last year's freshmen — far surpassing the national average of 60 percent.

"The quality of life at Bloomisburg — in and out of the classroom — and the work of the faculty and staff who support that quality are key reasons for the high retention and Bloomisburg's popularity," says President Jessica Kozloff.

Because of the size of the freshman class in 1996, the freshman class this past fall was slightly smaller by design. About 1,712 new students (freshmen, summer freshmen and transfers) arrived on campus in August, in contrast to 1,944 in August 1996.

The freshmen this year are even better prepared academically than their predecessors.

The average class rank of freshmen is now in the top 30 percent, compared to the top 34 percent last year. The number of students qualified to apply for Mitram and Honors and Scholars program scholarships increased from 298 to 470.

"It's a very strong group," says Chris Keller, director of admissions, "not only academically, but in extracurricular activities as well."

"It's a very involved class. More than half of the new students played one or more sports in high school. More than half were involved with music or drama. A third were involved in student government at their high schools."

Keller attributes the academic strength of the freshmen class to the increased size of the applicant pool.

"We were up more than 300 freshmen applications over last year. This was especially remarkable because many institutions were down significantly in applications. Right now, the demographics don't favor us to be up in applications."

'Swervin' Irvin' brings honor to himself . . .

Irvin Sigler, who rewrote the record books at Bloomsburg University, won the Harlon Hill Trophy, given to the nation's best NCAA Division II football player.

Winning the award capped a superb four-year career for Sigler – and instantly raised the Bloomsburg University football program up several notches nationally.

The award was given to Sigler at a banquet at the Convention Center in Florence, Alabama, on the eve of the Division II national championship game on December 13.

The 6-1 senior accumulated 208 points in balloting among the 152 sports information directors in Division II. Twenty-three candidates were considered for the award. That list was cut to eight in November, with the top three vote-getters invited to Florence for the presentation.

Sigler beat out Emporia State running back Brian Shay by 20 points and netted 122 points more than New Haven quarterback Cazzie Kosciulek.

A Philadelphia resident, Sigler is the first BU player and first Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference player to win the award and joined a list of 12 past honorees, including Johnny Bailey from Texas A&I University, who was a three-time winner.

"As far as size is concerned, I think this is the biggest award in college athletics," Sigler said of the 36-inch, 63-pound trophy. "I don't think anyone could imagine holding it. I never imagined I could win it . . . it's an unbelievable feeling."

When he first saw the trophy in Florence, he realized just how important it is.

"Just the way the award is designed makes you appreciate how prestigious the award is," he said. "Throughout the course of the week, I came to the realization of how important the award is, and how much of an honor it was to be a finalist."

Sigler said that when they were announcing the winner, he

was just hoping to get out of way and remain dignified in doing so because he expected Shay to win.

"You can never really grasp the concept of winning an award like this, so I was hacing myself for the worst – which would be to lose," he said. "When the enveloped opened, I thought I was going to faint or something. It took me a moment to realize he said my name. Talk about shock."

When he flew from Muscle Shoals, Alabama, to Memphis for a connecting flight to Philadelphia, he had to strap the trophy into the seat next to him with the seatbelt.

On the flight from Memphis back to Pennsylvania, Sigler said the airline put the trophy in a special case for the trip. "But I knew where it was at all times."

Lugging the three-foot high award through

the airports got him some strange looks.

"I definitely stood out," he said. "Everybody was inquiring about what the trophy was all about. Once they found out, they were very nice and congratulatory."

When he came out of Philadelphia's George Washington High School in 1994, most college football coaches were looking at Sigler as a linchbacker or a defensive end.

But Danny Hale, who had just finished his first season at Bloomsburg, saw something special in Sigler and decided to look at Sigler as a tailback.

After finishing 5-6 in his first season, Hale knew he had to get a tailback who would be the foundation for the Husky offense.

Enter Sigler.

Irv was a role player for his first two seasons

before erupting for 3,801 yards and 45 touchdowns in the last two seasons. In his junior and senior seasons, Sigler was named the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's Eastern Division Player of the Year.

Hale said he couldn't be happier for both Sigler and the Bloomsburg program.

"Talk about a shot in the arm right when you need it," said Hale, who is hard on the recruiting trail.

"You better believe that we're going to showcase it (the trophy). Everybody we talk to is going to hear about this."

Hale said that Sigler being named the nation's top player is the best thing that has happened to the Bloomsburg program since he arrived.

"For him to win the award is truly a team thing," said Hale. "Irv Sigler did not win this award because of him. It's the defense for getting the ball back to us. The kicking game getting us field position, and the offensive line and fullbacks blocking."



his team, and to Bloomsburg University

At the awards ceremony in Florence, a highlight film of Sigler's career was shown, and Hale said it fired him up.

"I got pumped up watching that film," Hale said. "Some of his cuts were unbelievable, but so were the hlocks. You should have seen (fullback) Jon Johnson and (split end) Ron Lelko blocking. It was beautiful. Sigler is cutting back and forth and the linemen like Adam Rertz, Phil Yzeik and Timmy Baer running down field to get another hlock.

"All those guys were pulling for him and he knows it."

The award says a lot about the caliber of football in the PSAC and in Bloomsburg, Hale said.

"It's good for the conference because the conference can brag to recruits about coming here and having your talents be noticed throughout the nation," said Hale. "And for us, we're getting some big time ink from the Philadelphia papers, which is what we need."

In addition to the Harlon Hill Award, Sigler was named to the Daktronics II All-American team, a first-team AP Little All-American, and a Burger King/Division II Coaches All-American.

He was also honored as the PSAC offensive player of the year for the second consecutive year, and was picked to play in the Snow Bowl, the Division II all-star game.

Hale said Sigler is just as good a person off the field as he is a player on the field.

"What's great about Irv is that he's so humble," he said. "He didn't come out and say that he wanted to start now when he showed he could play in 1994. Then in 1995 he was still the number two guy behind Mike Johnson. We knew he could do the top role."

When he did take over the top role, he never looked back.

He became the PSAC's all-time leading rusber this season, finishing his career with 5,105 yards. He owns every BU rushing record except for most carries in a game and single-game rushing yards.

"I would have liked to have broken those records," Sigler said. "But that record wouldn't have meant anything to me if I had to stay in a game where we were embarrassing some team.

I didn't want to break records that way."

All of the records he did break, 29 national or school records, were all set the right way. Just the way Sigler played.

System, Widener sign pact

The State System of Higher Education and Widener University have signed a new partnership agreement which provides special admission and scholarships for State System students who want to attend the Harrisburg campus of the Widener University School of Law.

The agreement, which includes Bloomsburg University, assures admission to Widener University School of Law for qualified graduates of the 14 universities throughout the state through an Express Admission Program.

The partnership will also allow State System students to earn their bachelor's degree and a Juris Doctor degree in six years, rather than the usual seven, through a 3+3 Early Admission Program.

Additionally, eligible students will receive approximately \$300,000 in renewable scholarships to assist with tuition costs. Titled "Dixon Scholars" in recognition of the contributions made to Pennsylvania by E. Eugene Dixon Jr., chairman of the State System's Board of Governors, these scholarships will offset 30 percent of the annual tuition fee for selected students. Up to 56 Dixon Scholars may be selected each year.

Death shocks friends

Susan Rusinko, professor emerita of English and retired chair of the Department of English at Bloomsburg University, died unexpectedly on September 24.

A specialist in the modern drama, she wrote dozens of articles and reviews, and also was the author of books on playwrights Terence Rattigan (1983), Tom Stoppard (1986), Henk Levy (1994), and Joe Orton (1995). Her study, *British Drama 1950 to the Present - A Critical History*, was published in 1989. A sixth book, which she completed just prior to her death, will be published in the spring.

Born in Berwick, Rusinko attended local schools and received the B.A. degree from Wheaton College (Illinois), and the M.A. and Ph.D. from The Pennsylvania State University. She wrote her doctoral dissertation on the plays of Harold Pinter. She also did graduate work at Columbia University and the New School for Social Research.

Rusinko began her teaching career at Westmont College in Santa Barbara, California, and joined the faculty at Bloomsburg University in 1959. There, she rose through the ranks, was assistant department chair for many years, and then served as chair for three years until she retired at the end of 1991.

In 1990, the Pennsylvania Academy for Professional Teaching presented her with its Salute to Teaching Award. In her hometown, she was inducted into the Berwick Academic Hall of Fame in recognition of her 40-year career in higher education.

Former president dies at 76

Robert J. Nossen, former president of Bloomsburg University, died at his home near Pittsburgh on July 29, 1997, at age 76. He served as president from 1969 to 1972.

During Nossen's tenure, the physical facilities of the campus grew significantly. Columbia Residence Hall, Scranton Commons, Bakeless Center for the Humanities, and the tri-level parking garage were all constructed during this time.

Academically, Bloomsburg's general education program was restructured so that students could choose their own general education courses.

"The Bloomsburg University community is always saddened when we lose one of our faculty," says President **Jessica Kozloff**.

"Dr. Nossen's many contributions to the university will remain as his legacy to us."

With the exception of two years of teaching high school, Nossen spent his entire life in higher education. He earned his bachelor's degree in English literature at the University of California, Berkeley, and his master's and doctoral degrees at Northwest em University.

Before coming to Bloomsburg, he held teaching and administrative positions at Creighton University, Lamar University and the State University of New York.

After serving at Bloomsburg, Nossen moved to the University of Pittsburgh, where he was associate provost and professor of higher education. He was also editor of the Journal and Newsletter of the Pennsylvania Association for Adult and Continuing Education and

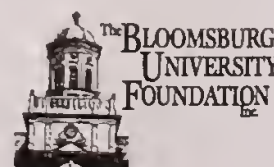

Simon is a former newspaper publisher and member of the Illinois General Assembly who went on to serve five terms in the U.S. Senate.

Simon was appointed to the National Institute for Literacy advisory board by President Clinton in May 1997.

He is expected to speak on libraries and literacy in a Democratic society during his visit to the Bloomsburg campus.

1916 alumnus also served in Congress

As the Alumni Association prepared to honor Congressman Tim Holden as "Young Alumnus of the Year" on Alumni Day, we learned that another alumnus had also served in the U.S. House of Representatives.

University archivist Robert Dunkelberger actually came across the information while he was doing research on the history of football at Bloomsburg.

Dunkelberger discovered that Percy W. Gillitis, Class of 1916 at the Bloomsburg State Normal School and captain of the football team during his senior year, was elected to Congress in 1942 from the Marietta area in southeast Ohio.

Gillitis served three terms before being defeated in 1948. According to a biographical directory of members of Congress, he died in 1983 at age 90.



Francis "Doc" Sell '35 of Boyertown, a member of the Bloomsburg University Alumni Association from 1981 to 1988, died on July 7, 1998, at age 85.

He owned a real estate business in Boyertown for 40 years.

ished in *Shenandoah* during a volume year. *Shenandoah* is considered one of the nation's most respected literary reviews.

Humes, a Leidshtatsville resident, is the author of eight books of poetry and fiction, including "The Bottomland" (1995), "Evening in a Small Park" (1992), "The Way Winter Works" (1990), and "A Weather of Surprises" (1988).

"The Pigeon Door," set in the coal-mining region of Schuylkill County, is the story of a father who emotionally withdraws from his family. Humes says he wrote the story because he wondered what would happen if "one of the parents in a family just stopped talking to the children."

The story has roots in Humes' own life. He grew up in the small mining town of Girardville, Schuylkill County, and his father was a miner who eventually succumbed to black lung disease. The similarity ends there though, Humes says, noting that his father was not like the father in his story. Humes says he is "obsessed with the landscape" of Schuylkill County and has written many of his poems and short stories about life there.

As a youth, Humes says he began to think he would like to be a writer "which was a silly thing to think when you're growing up in Girardville—but it persisted." A self-described late bloomer, Humes says he "really started reading books after high school, messed around a number of years," and was almost 25 when he finally got to college.

Humes credits one of his undergraduate professors, Richard Savage, with helping him appreciate poetry and realize he could become a writer. He was a "very charismatic teacher (and) a brilliant man."

Humes published his first book when he was in his early 40s, and has been the recipient of numerous honors and awards since.

Another primary source of inspiration for Humes' writing is fishing, something he has enjoyed since childhood. "It's not even about catching fish," he says. "There is a relationship between writing and fishing. And I just like being on the water, the process (of fishing), it's very contemplative."

His preference for writing the shortest of short stories seems natural to Humes. He says, "Perhaps writing poetry for so many years has something to do with

it. My focus and concentration are good—up to about 10 pages," he says, then laughingly adds, "but I get bored when a piece starts getting too long, so I just write 'the end' whether it is or not."

Humes has taught at Kutztown since 1968. He says his students have been "consistently good and friendly" and adds that the college has supported him in many ways.

One of those ways is through the publication of *Yarrow*, a poetry magazine, since 1981. Humes is founder and editor of the journal, which is published twice a year and welcomes material from both new and established writers.

Humes' earlier honors and prizes include the 1986 Theodore Roethke Award from Poetry Northwest for the poem, "Calling in the Hawk"; the Robert Traver Fly Fishing Fiction Competition Award for "Ghost Pan" in *Fly Rod & Reel Magazine* (June/October 1996 issue); and the World's Best Short Short Story for "The Cough" from *Sun Dog*, the Southwest Review.

A four-time recipient of a Pennsylvania Council on the Arts poetry fellowship, he received a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship in 1990.

Humes' poetry has been published in many magazines and journals, including *Antaeus*, *Gettysburg Review*, *Poetry*, *Poetry Northwest*, *Prairie Schooner*, *Shenandoah*, *Yankee*, *The Nation*, and *Virginia Quarterly Review*.

Humes holds a master of fine arts degree in creative writing from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

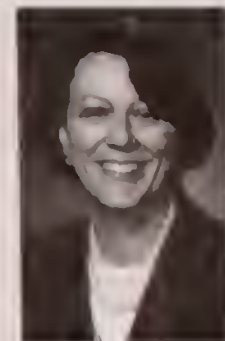

University rates as 'best buy'

Bloomington University has been named one of the 100 best college buys in the country for the second consecutive year by a publication that rates America's colleges and universities.

The *Student Guide to America's 100 Best College Buys* profiles schools that are rated highest academically, but have the lowest total cost for the college year.

Compiled by Institutional Research and Evaluation in Gamesville, Ga., the guide gives complete information on each selected institution, including costs, majors offered, and campus life.

The guide describes Bloomington as a place where "academic programs have kept pace with the times, offering current, relevant educational opportunities for today's world. As a teaching institution, the university offers you the full benefit of professors in the classroom, the labs and the studios."

In compiling the guide, publisher John Culler researched 1,800 higher education institutions throughout the nation. To be selected for *America's 100 Best College Buys*, colleges had to meet specific requirements. They must be an accredited, four-year institution, must offer full residential facilities including residence halls and dining services, must offer opportunities for need-based, academic-based and athletic-based financial aid, must have an entering freshmen class with a SAT or ACT score above the national average, and must have a cost of attendance below the national average.

Bloomington University and Indiana University of Pennsylvania were the only two universities from the state selected for inclusion in the guide.

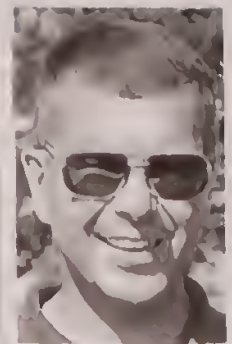

Successful soccer coach steps down

Chuck Laudermitch, who turned a club team into a national powerhouse, has stepped down as coach of Bloomsburg University's women's soccer team.

Laudermitch, who has been the Huskies' head coach since the program started in 1990, will remain at Bloomsburg as a faculty member and would like to remain with the program in some capacity.

"It's difficult leaving something that you've helped build," said Laudermitch.

"Anyone who coaches always wants to step away when they're still effective. I wanted to get out when I could still feel good about what we did."

The sociology professor said teaching and coaching was just taking too much of his time.

"The timing is right because it's become like two full-time jobs," he said. "It's just too time consuming now. This way I can refocus myself on the classroom."

Laudermitch believes there are a few different reasons for the success of the program, which included six straight 10-win seasons and a top-15 national ranking in each of the last five seasons.

"We were able to attract good student-athletes who helped us establish a winning tradition early on in my career," he said. "The women on these teams understood the importance of hard work, fitness and commitment to the building of a tradition at the school."

With the commitment to winning, 10 of Laudermitch's players were named All-American and 23 were selected to the All-Northeast Region team.

"A program that has established a winning tradition

is easier to keep at a high level," Laudermilch said. "I also believe that I have been lucky to be surrounded by capable assistants like John O'Leary (now the head coach of the men's team), Sandy Dickson and others. They have made my job a lot easier."

Laudermilch said he informed his players prior to this season that the 1997 season would be his last.

"I thought it was important to be up front with the players and recruits," he said. "For the most part, they understood. It's going to be a difficult transition, but the players have worked hard, and the program will be OK."

When going out on the recruiting trail last fall, Laudermilch said he told prospective players that he would not be coaching next season, but it didn't affect recruiting efforts.

"Bloomsburg is an easy recruit," he said. "When you have people like Jan Hutchinson and Mary Gardner, it makes recruiting for women's athletics a lot easier. Women's athletics have been terrific over the years at Bloomsburg."

The women's soccer program reached its pinnacle in 1996 when the Huskies were ranked as high as third in the country before losing in the national quarterfinals. Bloomsburg finished the season 18-3-1, and Laudermilch was named Northeast Region Coach of the Year.

During the 1997 season (13-4-2), Laudermilch won his 100th career game. He finished his career with a mark of 104-335-8.

In addition to the NCAA playoff berth in 1996, Laudermilch also led the Huskies into post-season action by teaching the Eastern College Athletic Conference playoffs in both 1992 and 1993.

1998 Hall of Fame inductees announced

The 1998 inductees to the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame have been announced.

Inducted on Friday, October 23, will be **Russ Verhousky '53**, football; **Robert Hall '63**, wrestling; **Marty Coyne '83**, tennis; **Jean Millen Daughtry '86**, softball and women's basketball; and **Tony Woods '86**, football.

The induction dinner will be held on Homecoming Eve at Magee's Main Street Inn, Bloomsburg. Tickets may be reserved by contacting the Alumni Office.

Russ Verhousky was a standout on the football field for the Huskies and helped the team to a record of 28-4-1 in his four years under Hall of Fame coach Robert Redman. Playing both offense and defense, Russ was a four-time letterwinner for the Huskies, often times playing the entire game.

As a junior in 1951, he was on the last undefeated Huskies team and was co-captain for one game, an honor usually reserved for seniors. As a senior, he was named to the first-team All-Teachers College team; as a junior, he was named honorable mention All-Pennsylvania by the Associated Press and second-team All-Teachers College.

Robert Hall was a standout on the mats for the Huskies. He was the first Bloomsburg wrestler to place (fifth) in NCAA competition and first to be named All-American. He was also an NAIA champion and a two-time PSAC champion.

Along with his fifth-place NCAA finish, Robert was third at the NAIA championships as a

senior helping him earn the school's Robert B. Redman Award as the Outstanding Senior Athlete in 1963.

A teacher for over 30 years, Hall helped start the wrestling program at Coealeco High School.

Jean Millen Daughtry was a two-time softball All-American and holds Bloomsburg records for base on balls in both a season and game, most career putouts, and is tied for the highest all-time fielding percentage.

As a member of the women's basketball team, Jean finished her career with 1,113 points, seventh all-time at Bloomsburg. She is also second on the all-time list with 942 rebounds and holds Bloomsburg records for rebounds in a game with 24 and in a season with 390. Her rebounding averages of 15.6 for the season and 14.2 for her career are also Bloomsburg records.

Marty Coyne, the head men's and women's tennis coach at Bloomsburg, is the only person to win PSAC titles as both a player and a coach. He posted a career singles record of 112-29, which ranks third all-time at Bloomsburg. He was also one of Bloomsburg's first All-American tennis players.

Marty is also one of only three players in PSAC history to win PSAC singles, doubles and team championships all four years of his career. He was an NCAA championship tournament participant three consecutive years.

With his doubles partner, Dave Superdock, the pair combined to post a record of 46-16. Marty was also named the university's outstanding underclass

male athlete of the year in 1982.

He has posted a record of 73-30 in five years as head coach of the men's team and a mark of 68-14 in four years as the women's coach, including a mark of 22-2 this past season.

Tony Woods was a two-time Associated Press All-American as a defensive back with the football team, earning second team honors in 1984 and third team status in 1985. He also was selected to the Kodak All-American football team in 1985 by the American Football Coaches Association. Woods was also a three-time PSAC first team selection and holds the school record for interceptions for both a season and a career with 10 and 26 respectively.

A key member of the special teams for the Huskies, he also holds the team single-game record for highest kick return average (36.5), which he achieved during the team's first NCAA Division II playoff appearance against North Alabama.

In his four seasons, Bloomsburg registered a combined record of 24-18-1, including a 12-1 campaign in 1985. Woods was a member of the Huskies' 1985 PSAC championship squad which defeated IUP, 31-9, and eventually reached the national semifinals. The Huskies also reached the title game where they lost to California University of Pennsylvania, 21-14.

As a member of the Bloomsburg track team, Woods won the 1985 PSAC 100-meter race and finished third in the 200-meter race. In 1984, Woods was third in the 100-meter race and second in the 200-meter race at the PSAC championships.



Assistant takes over as coach

Sandy Dickson has been named head coach of women's soccer at Bloomsburg University, replacing Chuck Landermeilch, who retired at the end of the 1997 season.

Dickson, an assistant coach at Bloomsburg for three years, is a 1994 graduate of Rutgers University. At Rutgers, she was a four-year member of the women's soccer team, serving as captain during her senior year. As a midfielder, she helped the Scarlet Knights to three Eastern College Athletic Conference titles (1990-1992) and a Division I ranking of 13th.

As a high school performer, Dickson was named a regional All-American in both 1988 and 1989, and was named the 1989 New Jersey South Midfielder of the Year in addition to all-state honors.

"I feel fortunate that there will be some continuity with my having been an assistant at Bloomsburg," said Dickson. "Chuck treated me more as an associate than an assistant head coach, which has been a great springboard for my coaching career. My goal is to continue what Chuck started nine years ago and build upon it."

The Huskies, 13-4-2 a year ago, return two-time All-American Julie Bugg as well as regional All-American Tracy Wirth in goal in 1998.

"I think one of our first goals, as a team, is to be competitive in the conference and reclaim the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship," Dickson remarked. "We return a very talented group of players, probably the strongest group we have ever had here at Bloomsburg, which will help

Centennial Gym to assume expanded role

Officials at Bloomsburg University are planning a \$6.9 million upgrade of Centennial Gym that will replace the gym and pool with classrooms and offices.

Construction is expected to begin in mid-1999 and nearly double in size the building that first opened in 1939 as the school's primary physical education center.

The gym now encompasses 43,000 square feet. Expansion and reconstruction will bring it to 70,000 square feet.

The Centennial project, featuring sweeping gabled entrances at both front and rear, should be completed by the fall of 2000. A nursing-wellness center and several departments – including athletics, audiology and speech, and anthropology – will be located in the building when it is completed.

Since 1972, many of the university's health and physical education programs have relocated to Nelson Fieldhouse. Centennial, in the meantime, has been heavily used by faculty and town residents for its pool and adult fitness programs.

But a committee of faculty and staff, who met with architects in recent weeks, decided that the aging pool had to go, adding space for large classrooms, including a 250-seat theater-style lecture hall and five large rooms each capable of holding up to 100 students.

BU Provost Wilson Bradshaw said that while planners were reluctant to eliminate the popular indoor swimming pool, the committee was aware that the downtown YMCA is planning to build its own pool.

"A survey found significant use of the pool. But at the same time, the pool and its equipment are old and adding a new pool would have a big impact on the project budget," Bradshaw explained.

Officials say more and bigger classrooms are badly needed. Several departments now find themselves in cramped quarters because incoming freshman classes have grown steadily in recent years.

Funding for the Centennial conversion will come from marketing state bonds. The total price tag is \$6,953,000, Bradshaw said.

In addition to the theater lecture hall and 100-seat classrooms, the building will include:

A 2,700-square-foot multi-purpose room for general use in either instruction or intramural athletics.

Allegheny agreement signed

An agreement between Bloomsburg University and Allegheny University of the Health Sciences in Philadelphia has increased the options available to college students interested in pursuing a career in physical therapy.

With the new agreement, students who complete a degree at Bloomsburg and meet the entry standards at Allegheny are virtually assured entry into that university's two-year master's degree program in physical therapy.

This option complements an affiliation made with Thomas Jefferson University in 1983 whereby students attend Bloomsburg for two or three years before transferring to Thomas Jefferson for three years to complete a master's program in physical therapy.

Now, with two formal agreements, students completing a degree at Bloomsburg (typically in

A 1,500-square-foot adult fitness center, primarily seen as a complement to the student recreation center, for use by faculty and staff.

A 1,200-square-foot dance studio that will also be made available for other recreational activities.

A spacious lounge and vending areas where students, faculty and staff can mingle informally.

Six medium-sized classrooms for up to 50 students each, and two computer class centers for 40 students.

biology), can choose between these two universities or others where no formal agreement exists.

Although the competition for acceptance into any physical therapy program remains high, the new articulation agreement with Allegheny targets Bloomsburg students for special consideration.

There are presently 86 students in the pre-physical therapy program at Bloomsburg who will select a variety of institutions to complete their education.

Dr. James Cole, program coordinator, notes that the new affiliation "will likely increase the placement rate of our physical therapy students in graduate schools."

Associate A&S dean appointed

Robert P. Marande has been named associate dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Bloomsburg University.

He previously served as associate professor and chairperson of the department of mathematics, physics and computer science at the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia (formerly the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science).

While at Philadelphia, Marande reduced the department's operating budget by 15 percent, created applied physics and mathematics majors, and developed teacher certification programs in both mathematics and physics.

Through the implementation of new personnel policies, Marande helped increase faculty publications by 250 percent.

Marande has also held teaching positions at Penn State University and Heidelberg College. His research has led to several patents.

Marande earned his bachelor of science degree in physics and mathematics at Saginaw Valley State University, a master of science degree in physics at the University of Akron, and a doctorate in physics at Kent State University.

us toward achieving that goal."

Dickson, who holds the NSCAA National Diploma coaching license, will graduate later this year with a master's degree in exercise science from Bloomsburg.

Survey of alumni reflects satisfaction

Most 1991-1992 graduates of the 14 state-owned universities said they are so satisfied with their education that they would go back to the same university if they had to do it all over again.

The majority who responded to a recent survey said the university they attended did a good or excellent job preparing them for their present job. Nine out of 10 who want to work are employed. Three-quarters of those interviewed said they still live in Pennsylvania.

Those are some of the findings in the State System of Higher Education's first alumni satisfaction survey, conducted between October and December 1997 by Millersville University's Center for Public Opinion Research.

Some 2,479 randomly selected graduates – about 200 from each university – were asked the same 71 questions. The survey had a 78 percent response rate. The margin of error was plus or minus two percent.

Frank Gerry, the State System's assistant vice chancellor for academic and student affairs, said the findings were pleasing, particularly the high marks on alumni satisfaction with their college choice.

The State System survey results mirrored those from a system-wide student satisfaction survey conducted in 1996-1997, which found eight out of 10 students were satisfied with their college choice.

Another finding common to both surveys was the low satisfaction rate with the registration, availability of courses and the advising process.

About a third of the alumni thought the performance of their academic adviser was worse than expected, and a fourth felt the same about course availability.

"A number of State System universities are using this data as the impetus to seek ways to make these areas more user friendly and generally improve how we go about advising students, scheduling students and scheduling classes," Gerry said.

Alumni who graduated five years ago were chosen for the survey for a reason, Gerry said.

"We thought after five years, people would be in a position to be more reflective about the value and nature of the service and education they received at a State System university," he said.

System officials would like to do the alumni survey every three or four years. Next year, the System plans to interview its freshman class to find out the type of students its universities are admitting and to start tracking how many graduate in four years.

Here are some additional findings from the alumni survey:

- 87 percent of those who majored in education found jobs related to teaching; of those, 70 percent are classroom teachers, primarily in Pennsylvania.
- The single biggest aspect of their college days alumni remember is the social life, followed by professors and academics.
- 47 percent felt the quality of instruction in their major exceeded their expectations.
- 36 percent borrowed between \$5,000 and \$10,000 to pay for college; 28 percent borrowed between \$10,000 and \$15,000.
- 93 percent are completely or somewhat satisfied with their jobs.
- 61 percent own their own homes.
- 77 percent live in Pennsylvania.
- 67 percent reported total household income above \$30,000; 21 percent reported household income above \$50,000.
- 85 percent of survey participants are registered to vote.
- 74 percent provide volunteer service in their community, usually in excess of 120 hours in the last two years.
- On average, the alumni surveyed have had 2.3 jobs since graduating from college.
- One of every two alumni have taken courses since graduation.
- Changing majors or colleges were the most common reasons why it took 49 percent of the alumni more than four years to earn their degrees.
- Three in four said they held jobs while they were students.
- On a 10-point scale, with 10 being very satisfied, alumni rated their overall satisfaction with their college days an average 7.97.

Sanders inducted into National Wrestling Hall of Fame

In an April 25 ceremony attended by many family and friends, Roger Sanders was honored by the National Wrestling Hall of Fame for "Lifetime Service to Wrestling" as a coach.

The long-time coach was honored for dedicating his time, knowledge, talent and energy to develop self-esteem and character in the young men he coached. His leadership and philosophy encouraged them to achieve beyond victories on the wrestling mat, to serve society and to reach beyond their grasp.

Roger Sanders might best be described as a man of many accomplishments – from his high school days at Pennsbury High School, where he was a two-time District Champion, to West Chester University where he won the NCAA College Division Championship in 1964.

He started his coaching career at Palmyra High School in 1965 and two years later became head coach at New York University. In 1972, he became head coach at Bloomsburg University. In short order, he restored the Huskies to a level that commanded respect in Pennsylvania and the nation.

Sanders remained at Bloomsburg as head wrestling coach until 1993. With 300 career wins, he has coached eight Pennsylvania Conference team championships and two Eastern Wrestling League titles. At the same time he accomplished an outstanding record as a coach, he also served as athletic director for seven years.

When Sanders retired from coaching after 28 years, he continued to demonstrate his leadership and expertise by working with the United States Association of Blind Athletes. He served as a coordinator of the USABA and accompanied the Blind Wrestling Team to the World Championships in Istanbul, Turkey.

In 1996 he dedicated his sabbatical leave to working with the U.S. Association of Blind Athletes locally, nationally and internationally.

Sanders and his wife, Nancy, have two daughters: Julie Lea and Traci Lyn.

BU slated for review in 1999

In March 1999, the University will be visited by a team from the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. The Middle States Association accredits colleges and schools in the middle Atlantic states.

Accreditation signifies that an institution has reviewed itself and has been examined by a group of professionals and found to be meeting its own goals as well as standards set by the educational community. Accreditation visits normally occur every ten years and are considered major events in an institution's life.

Preparation for the accreditation visit consists of preparing a self-study. The self-study not only reviews the institution's performance for the visiting team, but helps the institution identify strengths and weaknesses.

Starrett stays as coach

Momica Starrett, who served as interim coach of the women's basketball team during the past season, has been appointed head coach after guiding the Huskies to a record of 22 wins and eight losses.

The Huskies won the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Eastern Division title and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

As the number six seed in the NCAA East Region, Bloomsburg defeated both the number two and three ranked teams in the tournament before losing in the regional final.

The 22 wins under Starrett were the most for a first year coach at Bloomsburg and just the eighth time the women's basketball team has reached 20 wins.

During the season, the Huskies used a suffocating defense and solid shooting to win 15 games by 10 points or more.

The Huskies held opponents to just 37 percent shooting from the floor while shooting over 43 percent themselves.

Starrett came to Bloomsburg after spending one season as assistant coach at Bucknell University, three seasons as an assistant at the University of Utah, and two years as head coach at Salt Lake City Community College.

But I am interested in what you are doing right now, today. Whether you realize it or not, we are all impacting our world in some way. Only you can decide whether you do it positively or negatively.

Each of us has been blessed with varied and unique abilities to be able to make positive contributions in the world for the future generation. But it can be very easy at times to sit back and be complacent in today's world; after all, we are constantly being bombarded with messages that tell us we need not be concerned with anyone but ourselves. We are told that we should do what feels good; concentrate on our own needs and desires. Well, the truth is that it is not all about us. It's about those who will come after us, my children and yours.

As we prepare to leave Bloomsburg University and move on with our lives, let's look beyond ourselves and our own little world. If some of you

are wondering why this topic seems so important to me, it's because there were many who gave of themselves in past generations. There were times when they had absolutely nothing to rely on but their faith in God to see them through. Yet they staged marches, they picketed, and they refused to quit. They demanded equality and freedom for those who were thought to be incapable of learning. They said "no" to discrimination against women and proved without a shadow of doubt that "yes" we were created equally by God. Because of those people, I am able to stand here tonight and boldly tell the naysayers they were wrong.

Giving increases to new level

Alumni giving tops \$1 million, sets record

For the first time since the inception of the Bloomsburg University Foundation in 1985, alumni giving topped the \$1 million mark in 1997. Alumni gave \$1,014 million which boosted their contribution to 55.7 percent of the total gifts received.

"We're excited that alumni giving has reached a new height. As alums, we have a great stake in the success of Bloomsburg," commented Susan Mitchell Helwig '82, director of development. "Giving back is one way to show our loyalty," she added.

Friends of the university, who provided the second largest gift amount of 15.5 percent, contributed \$280,476 to support a range of Foundation initiatives. Bloomsburg parents and employees, representing nine percent of the contributors, gave a combined total of \$117,400. Additional funds were received from businesses, corporations, organizations, and private foundations.

VISA affinity cards, held by 8,954 Bloomsburg University alumni, students

and friends, generated \$38,029. MBNA America Bank donates to the Bloomsburg University Foundation 0.4 percent of all charges made.

Gifts in kind totaled \$46,271 and included a wood sculpture, "The Jewish Wedding", by Paul Lehr, imprinted athletic clothing from AMPRO, a cookbook collection from James E. Parsons, professor of biological and allied health sciences, and numerous other items from alumni, friends, and area businesses which were auctioned at the annual Husky Club Auction in April.

The largest gift, \$485,000, was received from the bequest of Adaline Burgess, Class of 1921, of Wyoming, Pa. The endowed scholarship, given in the

Jack Mertz, sister Eleanor Seward, donate \$250,000 for scholarships

Jack Mertz '42 and his sister, Eleanor Mertz Seward, have recently given the university gifts totaling \$250,000 to support student scholarships. Mertz, 83, gave the university three annuities totaling \$195,000 and his sister, 85, contributed \$55,000.

The funds are "going to be used for a very good purpose, which is very important to me," says Mertz. "I probably could not have gone to school unless there was a state college. I always had fond memories of Bloomsburg," says Mertz. "I appreciated the education I got, which I thought was very good."

Mertz completed his bachelor of science degree in business education at Bloomsburg in 1942. Following his graduation, he was drafted and served as an air operations specialist in the Army Air Corps during World War II in the China/Burma/Indonesia Theatre. After the war, he returned home and enrolled at Bucknell University where he earned a master of science degree in commerce and finance in 1947. Later that year, he accepted a position to teach accounting and business mathematics at the Drexel Institute of Technology in Philadelphia. In 1948, Mertz was appointed assistant professor of business administration at Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he taught accounting, economics and business communications.

Mertz left teaching in 1951 and accepted a job as a junior accountant on the staff of the United States General Accounting Office in Washington, D.C., where he conducted management reviews of various government offices and departments, including the Public Housing Administration, Maritime Administration and Foreign Operations Administration.

He was named chief assistant to the director of the Civil Accounting and Auditing Division in 1957 and was responsible for recruiting, hiring and training new staff.

"Years ago, when I was working at the GAO, I used to come to Bloomsburg, talk to classes and try to convince people to work at the General Accounting Office," says Mertz. "That's one of the reasons I've thought of things I can do for the place."

For his service, Mertz was awarded the United States General Accounting Office's Meritorious Service Award in 1972.

These are not the first gifts that Mr. Mertz has made to the university. In 1992, he gave the university a \$500,000 unrestricted gift, and in 1995, he donated \$50,000 to support



professional development of accounting department faculty.

Seward, working at WKOR radio in Sanbury during the 30s and 40s, helped pay for Jack's college expenses at Bloomsburg. During the Korean War, she worked for American Red Cross in New Jersey. Later she, too, joined the federal government's General Accounting Office, where she worked for 19 years.

Although she is not a Bloomsburg alumna, since her retirement, Seward has participated in many of the Bloomsburg events with her brother. "From the very beginning I went to Jack's functions," says Seward. "I'm beginning to think I went to Bloomsburg."

Steph Pettit supports football scholarship

Former Bloomsburg University football player Steph Pettit '89 is establishing a \$60,000 scholarship to support the university's football program.

"Football has been a guiding force in my life," says Pettit. "I played football for 18 years and have coached for the past five years. The discipline and hard work involved in the sport has carried over into my business career."

Pettit was a member of Bloomsburg's 1985 championship football team, and, in his four years on the squad, was a leading tackler.

The 31-year-old native of Red Bank, N.J., now owns Clean Earth Systems Inc., a manufacturer and seller of hazardous waste containers. Through his firm, he will fund the \$60,000 scholarship over five years.

When not working on building his business, Pettit serves as head coach of a Florida minor-league football team, the Tampa Bay Congars. The position gives him first-hand familiarity with the concerns of young football players. His players generally fall into two groups, older players who've already been to college, and younger players, who, because of poor finances or academic preparation, haven't had the opportunity to play in college.

The Florida league is a nonprofit organization set up so none of the players will



lose their eligibility to compete in college athletics through participation. "These kids pay for their own equipment and travel," says Pettit.

"Because they really want to go to college, they spend their own money to play for a minor-league team."

"The older guys show the younger ones what they have to work on," adds

Pettit. "The skills of the younger guys jump up many notches by playing for our program."

In addition to football, Pettit remembers Bloomsburg fondly for both its beautiful campus and its broad curriculum. "I was trying to get as broad an education as I could, because I knew my future was in sales, and I'd need a broad knowledge base," says Pettit, who entered the university as an economics major and later changed to mass communications. "I used my free electives for business classes."

name of her father, C. H. Burgess, will support, in part, scholarship awards for students receiving Presidential Leadership Scholarships.

Unrestricted funds of \$240,878 support continuing initiatives such as the honors and scholars program, faculty and staff development, and alumni activities. Restricted funds of \$1,677,502 were given by donors for scholarships, the new library, Mitrani Hall seat campaign, and student-athlete scholarships.

During 1997, more than \$42,200 was approved by the Foundation for university faculty and/or student projects. Partial funding of these activities included a faculty member's attendance at the American College Sports Medicine

meeting and a faculty presentation at an international conference on economics.

Other individual faculty participated in the Pacific Barnacle Project, conducted studies in the Permian Amazon, and gave a sports medicine presentation to the U.S. Olympic Committee. Selected students studying public relations were able to attend a national convention. Funds were also allocated for the Martin Luther King celebration and for field hockey and soccer scoreboards. The Bloomsburg Alumni Association allocation was \$105,600.

A total of \$752,572 was provided in the form of scholarships to 426 students during the 1997-98 academic year.

"It is very gratifying to see the response from our alumni, friends, and parents who support Bloomsburg University," said Anthony M. Ianiero, vice president for university advancement. "Obviously, the many constituencies with which we deal are very proud of this university. Their giving reflects the confidence they have in the direction in which the university is heading."

Ianiero also expressed his desire to "pay tribute to the work of the Alumni Association and Office, the Bloomsburg University Foundation, and the Development Office staff for their hard work and dedication in making it possible to provide resources for many scholarships and faculty projects."

Lehr (shown at left outside his studio) died Monday, July 27

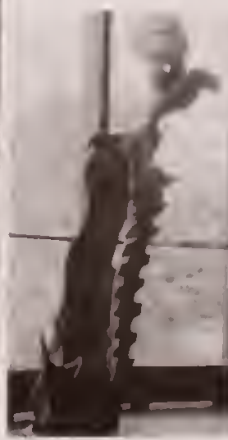
Lehr, who lived near Orangeville, illustrated the covers of books authored by Isaac Asimov, Ray Bradbury, Arthur C. Clark, H.G.

Wells and others. He created the "Grok" painting which graced the cover of Robert A. Heinlein's *Stranger in a Strange Land*, one of the best selling science fiction paperbacks of all time.

His painting of the first moon landing, which appeared in the *Saturday Evening Post* in 1959 – ten years before the actual event – is in the permanent collection of the National Air and Space Museum in the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C.

A New York native, Lehr lived in Columbia County since 1968, pursuing sculpture in addition to his work as painter.

Lehr had two exhibitions in the Haas Gallery of Art that featured his painting and sculpture. During the exhibits, he discussed his art career with university students.

A beautiful eulogy for a beautiful person

(President Jessica Kozloff delivered the following eulogy at the funeral service for Eda Bessie Beilartz Edwards, Class of 1941.)

How does one say good-bye to a lovely, gracious lady?

I think we do it by remembering all of those qualities which made her such a wonderful person.

As I think of Eda Bessie, there are certain key words and images that come to mind.

Over the past few days, I've had the opportunity to speak to many of you about this lovely, gentle woman we are so saddened to have taken from us. So many of you simply defined Eda Bessie as "one classy lady." Both words in that phrase — *classy* and *lady* are so very appropriate.

This was a woman who loved people, especially children. Everyone was always welcome at Stu and Eda Bessie's home. When you visited, you would always be treated to tea and cookies or cake. And, no matter how long you stayed, when it was time to leave, she'd always ask, "Must you go so soon?"

A few weeks ago, I stopped to see Stu and his Bessie, to drop off some spring tulips and to see how she was doing. Eda Bessie had just been in the hospital, and I knew she was quite tired and under doctor's orders to rest. I called Stu and asked if I could come by. I expected to find her in bed, or at least dressed in a comfortable robe and slippers. Instead, I was greeted by a beautifully groomed woman with a bright sunny smile. She insisted that I sit down with her in the living room and talk while Stu put the tulips in water. She was a lovely, gracious hostess, and I found it difficult to believe the reports I had received about her health.

As always, she wanted to know about me — about my family, and how I was doing. When I directed the conversation to her and her health, she responded that she was doing very well . . . she was walking for short periods each morning and

afternoon — as her doctor suggested. She told me that her doctor said she was in perfect health, except for her heart. But what a heart it was — one that was shared with so many.

Over the weekend, I had a chance to talk with Terry Daly, who asked that I make a few remarks for her since she and Chuck were unable to be here. Stu was Chuck's very first basketball coach in high school and, of course, Eda Bessie was also there as Stu's partner and as the players' "second mother." Terry went on to tell me that the players and students always felt they were Eda Bessie's family and how welcome she made everyone feel.

And, while Eda Bessie always made it a point to talk to all of the students and players and to be interested in their lives, Terry emphasized that she never wanted to dwell on problems. One of Eda Bessie's best known phrases was, "It's going to be all right." No matter how tense or difficult a situation, this lovely lady somehow brought a serenity to any situation. So many people have told me that they never saw her upset.

Her personality was *bright and sunny*. Perhaps that is one of the reasons that yellow was her favorite color. I find it hard to think about Eda Bessie without thinking of the *simple pleasures in life* . . . about birds, nature, and especially — flowers. She loved to sit at her window and talk to the birds. Terry recalled her last conversation with Eda Bessie and her excitement that "the daffodils are peaking up already." This was a lady who loved and appreciated the simple things in life.

Another word that describes Eda Bessie is loyalty. I've talked about what a classy lady she was. Well, she was also very loyal to her class, the Class of 1941. As recently as April 1996, Stu and Eda Bessie hosted class members who attended their 55th reunion. She was loyal to this university. She encouraged the establishment of the scholarship fund for the Class of 1941 so that others could have the opportunity to attend her alma mater.

She served on numerous university committees during her 44 years in Bloomsburg and, as university historian, wrote that wonderful book about the university, *Profile of the Past, A Living Legacy*. She was a mainstay for so many other organizations — her church, the Bloomsburg Ivy League, the PEO sisterhood and the American Association of University Women.

All of these organizations — and certainly the university — will find it hard to imagine our lives without her. But we are all so very grateful that she was here to enrich our world. Her gracious and generous gifts of herself and her talent have enriched our community beyond words.

Lastly, it is impossible to say the words "Eda Bessie" without adding, "and Stu."

What a wonderful partnership — 55 loving years of marriage. They have been inseparable companions since they fell in love at Bloomsburg State Teachers College. I keep remembering my last visit to them . . . and the image I have of them sitting there with me in the living room, with loving glances and gentle words of conversation.

Last night I stood with Stu and we looked upon his "Bessie" for the last time. He proudly pointed out that he had chosen the lovely pink suit she was wearing. We agreed that, as always, she looked beautiful. But, you know, Eda Bessie's beauty was much more than what we saw on the outside. She had an inner beauty that made her lovely physical features glow. Who among us will ever forget those kind, gentle eyes and her sweet smile.

It is very difficult to lose such a woman. But, if there is any solace, it is this: She lived a good life. She "did good" in this life. She loved and she was loved. She left this life as she lived it — with beauty, dignity and grace — and at the very end, she was in her own bed, in the home she loved, and next to the man she cherished.

The "angel among us" is now with angels. God bless you, dear Eda Bessie.
