Spring groundbreaking for addition expected

The Alumni Association will usher in the new century with a significant addition to the Howard F. Fenstermaker Alumni House.

The project will add 2,675 square feet, with nearly half that space being a "great room" for receptions, meetings and other alumni activities.

"This exciting project would not be possible without the generous support of the Bloomsburg University Foundation," said Eileen Albertson Chapman '67, president of the Alumni Association.

"We are especially grateful for the support of Tony Janiero, vice president for advancement and executive director of the foundation," she added.

"In the spirit of cooperation, the Alumni Association Board of Directors has pledged the support of our alumni in funding the difference between the foundation grant and the actual cost of construction."

If everything proceeds according to plan, the groundbreaking will occur sometime in the spring. Dedication of the new facility could be a highlight of Homecoming 2000.

The Fenstermaker Alumni House has been the home of the Alumni Association since 1985, when the association purchased the 1929 structure from the estate of the late Dorothy John Dillon '24. Since that time, it has been the location of the Alumni Office and numerous alumni activities.

In addition to the great room, the expansion will include a new entrance foyer and reception area, two accessible restrooms, a kitchen, coatroom and storage area. Some other improvements to the existing structure will also be part of the project, including a new heating and air conditioning system.

Special appeal nets \$36,383

The Alumni Association would like to thank everyone who contributed to the special appeal that was mailed in September.

As of December 17, 1999, a total of \$36,383 had been received from 821 alumni.

"We are gratified by the response to the special campaign," said Eileen Albertson Chapman '67, president of the Alumni Association.

"This extra financial support, coupled with the annual budget provided by the Bloomsburg University Foundation, will enable us to enhance the programs and services offered to our 44,000 alumni.

"Specifically, it will help us expand communications to our alumni through *Maroon & Gold*, which grows from 40 to 52 pages with this issue, as well as through the Internet. In addition, we plan to sponsor more constituent group reunions such as the successful M&G newspaper staff and Concert Choir alumni reunions held in 1999."

Of the total number of contributors, 70% were alumni who already made a contribution earlier in 1999; 11% made a contribution in 1998; 13% made their last contribution prior to 1998; and 6% were first-time contributors.

At 95, twin sisters remain quite a pair

Sitting side by side on the couch, Isabelle Ferguson Lettinger '24 and Charlotte Ferguson Ford '24 seem like mirror images. The 95-year old twins had their hair in the same fashion, wear similar cotton blouses with their summer skirts and sport the same winning smile.

But appearances can be deceiving. Take, for instance, their personalities.

"I do have a little humor stuck in," Isabelle admits. "This is rough world."

Charlotte, on the other hand, is somewhat quiet and a bit more serious.

Together they make quite a pair.

"We've always stuck together. People don't realize that twins are different from two sisters," Isabelle says. "You're closer."

The twins were born July 30, 1904, in Bryn Mawr. They are two of eight children—four boys and four girls—born to Irish-Scottish immigrants William and Annie Ferguson, who later settled in Jenkintown. William worked as a coachman taking wealthy families on trips with his carriage and horses. For a time, he also cleaned and readied the car for the Wanamakers of Philadelphia department store fame.

The sisters joined Grace Presbyterian Church in Jenkintown in 1915.

"When you were younger, you went to church. We had a big children's department. That's where your friends were," explained Isabelle, who still attends services there, while Charlotte goes to her daughter's church.

The sisters attended Jenkintown schools and are their oldest alumni. They both studied elementary education at Bloomsburg University, then called Bloomsburg State Normal School.

Charlotte remembers the fun of growing up as half of a set of twins. The pair often dressed alike when they were youngsters. Their relatives could tell them apart, but others would sometimes confuse the two—which could actually work to their advantage.

Isabelle recalled a time when they were in college and Charlotte skipped class because she wasn't feeling well. Isabelle stepped right in but not without wondering if they could really pull it off.

"I didn't know much about the class when I went in, so I was very nervous. I just sat there and prayed the whole time," she said.

After graduating in 1924, the pair became teachers in the Upper Moreland School District. They were responsible for an array of subjects from reading to art and physical education.

Charlotte taught for four years until she married plumber and building inspector Chester Ford. In those days, you weren't allowed to teach and be married. They raised two sons, now deceased, and a daughter, Charlotte Ford, who lives with her mother in Hatboro.

Isabelle met her future husband "on the job." She and Upper Moreland School Superintendent Leonard Lettinger wed in November 1941. They had one son, now deceased, and moved to Huntingdon Valley. Isabelle moved back to

Jenkintown in 1970.

The twins' brother, Edward Ferguson, 86, lives in Jenkintown. Both women are widows.

The pair enjoy good health and share many memories.

Charlotte has lived in the same house in Hatboro since she was married. She remembers the old movie house on Old York Road where they would go to see the latest Hollywood pictures.

"It was a little different then, not as many people," Isabelle said of Jenkintown. But it still holds charm for her.

"It's a lovely little town. It's still home to me."

When she was younger, Isabelle shopped at Strawbridge's and worked at McDonald's, "the drugstore, not that other McDonald's," she joked. Those and other shops have come and gone over the years. Neither sister has ever driven a car. They have grown accustomed to walking to the market or just strolling through town. Isabelle, in particular, enjoys frequent walks.

"I still like to get out and walk. You can talk to yourself."

She also enjoys knitting "to keep myself out of trouble," she joked. The hats she makes are

donated to church bazaars or needy children.

Charlotte reads her Bible several times daily. She phones her sister at about the same time each day and visits her in Hatboro for a few days every couple of weeks.

"They've been there for each other through husbands and children," says Susan Ryerson, Charlotte's granddaughter visiting from Woodstock, Georgia. She is one of three grandchildren. There are five great-grandchildren.

Ryerson credits the twins' "simple lives" for their longevity.

"You got married, stayed home to raise your children and walked where you needed to go. I don't think they've ever eaten fast food." Both Charlotte and Isabelle hang out their wash every day. Charlotte is known in the family for her wonderful cooking.

As for the secret to a long and happy life, Isabelle offered these thoughts: "You live one day at a time and maintain a sense of humor. You take life as it comes and are grateful. So many people just take things for granted, like their health or what they have."

M. Eleanor Beckley Sabota '40 of Evers Grove died on November 23, 1999, at age 81.

She was the first woman in the nation to gain a private pilot's license under the Civil Pilot Training program conducted at Bloomsburg State Teachers College. She joined the Women's Air Force Service Pilots during World War II and trained at Sweetwater, Texas.

Assigned to Laredo Air Base, she flew eight different types of planes, including the B-24 Liberator and the B-17 Flying Fortress. She was engaged primarily in towing targets for aerial gunnery students.

When the WASP unit was disbanded in 1944, she served with the Red Cross in the Philippine Islands and later in Germany.

She briefly taught special education at the Benjamin Franklin Training School on the Bloomsburg campus after graduation and again after the war. She was then a service club director at various Air Force bases.

Dorothy Derr Tilson '40 has been working in various aspects of world work since retiring. She is secretary and treasurer of the American Movement for World Government.

"The thing about Curt that comes to mind immediately is his selflessness. I have tremendous gratitude for what he did as interim president."

She noted that English came to Bloomsburg as interim president knowing that state policy prevents the interim from becoming a candidate for the permanent position.

"Yet he refused to sit idle and proceeded to lay groundwork to insure the success of anyone who followed him in this position. He was a wonderful healing presence at the time and set the stage for the next chapter in Bloomsburg's history.

"The character of this wonderful man and his love for this university contributed to the success we continue to enjoy today. He was a great person and a tremendous alum."

While at Bloomsburg, English helped reactivate a town-gown committee as a forum to deal with issues of concern.

In what may be his most enduring contribution to the university, he changed a plan that would have left the new Andrus Library unfinished. Original plans called for the fourth floor to be left as a "shell" for future expansion.

But he told officials "A 75

percent library is not what we need. We need a 100 percent library."

After convincing the BU Foundation Board of Directors to raise an extra \$1 million, he persuaded the Council of Trustees to change the building plans.

When President Kozloff took over the reins on July 1, 1994, English returned to East Stroudsburg University and resumed his role as vice president of finance and administration.

He then became president of Hiwassee College in Madisonville, where he served from July 1, 1996, until his death. He had planned to retire in 2001.

Before joining East Stroudsburg's administrative team, he served as manager of corporate planning for VSE Corporation in Virginia. He was also executive director of the Presidential Commission on Merchant Defense.

After all those years in the classroom, a teacher such as Bob might find himself bumping into former students in the strangest of places.

A few years back, he needed gall bladder surgery. Lying on a hospital gurney dressed in a paper gown, he expected to see the father of a former student peering down at him. Instead, it was the former student - Mark Schiowitz.

"I immediately thought to myself, 'Good God, what kind of grades did I give that boy?'"

Schiowitz, who said he got good marks from Bob, remembers his teacher as a dramatic, engaging man.

"He was so theatrical and funny. We even got around to some science once in a while," Schiowitz said. "But seriously, he did whatever was necessary to get through to a class."

It wasn't always easy, though. Looking back on past classes, Bob said he has noticed an alarming trend.

"This was not the job I signed on for 35 years ago," he said. "Then, there was a different ethic. Students had an intrinsic respect for their teachers, a desire to please them."

"Now, students desire to please themselves."

But Bob doesn't blame today's children for their attitudes. He blames society as a whole.

"Our priorities are all screwed up. Our values are a mess. When I was in school, you felt sorry for the kids who had jobs because that meant their families needed help putting food on the table," he said. "Now our children have jobs so they can buy jeans and cars."

Bob's parents were both Bloomsburg alumni. His father, **Charles Hensley '33**, was a teacher and principal in Wilkes-Barre schools for 43 years. His mother, **Elizabeth Krumanoeker Hensley '34**, taught for only two years but was a Girl Scout leader for many years. Both were recipients of BU Alumni Association's Distinguished Service Awards.

"They instilled in me a real value of education and the desire to educate others," Bob said. "They were both inspirations to me."

"After we finished, I thought we were done," she recalls. "But then a Parade magazine article named me as a chapter coordinator and people from all over started sending me blankets."

And she's been receiving blankets from all over the country ever since.

Project Linus, she emphasized, is perfect for those knitters who love to make blankets but have run out of people to give them to.

"I think these blankets are made with a lot of love and care, and I think it's because people get motivated. They know they are staying right here in the community.

"I tell women, if you are a crafter, you will enjoy this. It's a good cause, and it's wonderful and worthwhile. These blankets really do come from

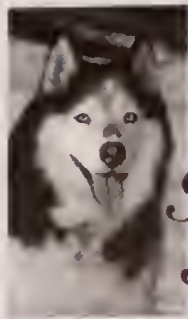

In order to compile the mailing for the recent Maroon & Gold student newspaper reunion, I went back through every issue of the paper from 1960 to 1974. Anyone who was listed on the masthead was mailed a letter, provided we had a good address.

This seems to have been the case with **John D. Evans '66**. But his story, told in his own words, has an interesting twist: it's a beautiful tribute to Mr. Savage in whose honor the reunion was held.

The secret of success

When I attended Bloomsburg way back in 1962, it was my intention to follow in my father's footsteps and major in physics. I soon discovered that my poor math skills were going to be a major handicap in pursuing that dream.

At about the same time, I was taking a freshman course in literature taught by Richard C. Savage. It was Mr. Savage who opened a whole new world for me. He introduced me to literature, the beauty of the written word and the subtleties of meaning.

Before the course was over, I gathered my courage and knocked on the door of the English Department Chairman, Cecil Seronsy, to request permission to switch from physics to English.

I can still hear his voice as I fumbled for something to fill out the form, "Good Lord, man! You walked in here without a pen?!"

Instantly, I had doubts about my decision. I made the switch anyway, however, and tried to take as many of Mr. Savage's courses as I could.

I experienced a wide variety classes in my new major, but somehow I always walked away from Mr. Savage's more enlightened and with a deeper appreciation for what I had read. Then something

happened in a class that revealed his secret for success.

We had been given an assignment: a chapter or two to read and prepare for discussion. It soon became apparent that no one had done much reading the night before.

Mr. Savage paused and delivered one well-paced comment in his distinct, gentle voice, "Well...if no one has read the assignment, I guess I'll have to cancel class." Then he turned and walked quietly out of the room.

No one moved. In any other class, there would have been a celebration — but not here. Instead there was an overwhelming feeling that we had done something profoundly wrong. We had crushed his feelings. After a few minutes, some students left. Many of us stayed behind to read the assignment. By

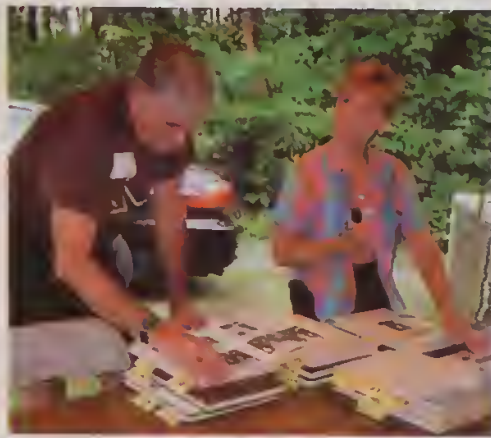

the next class, we all were ready for that discussion.

The secret was simple. Mr. Savage had a love for his subject that was universally recognized and respected by his students. I read many assignments for other professors—some in fear for my life, others from a sense of duty. Some, I must confess, didn't get read at all. But I always read in preparation for Mr. Savage, trying to anticipate his insights. In doing so I discovered insights of my own. That was why his classes were always more rewarding.

When I started my own career, I tried to pattern my teaching after Mr. Savage, loving my subject, respecting my students and quietly demanding that they try their best. It is a formula that has served me well for more than 30 years.

And for these same 30 years, I have regretted not being able to thank Mr. Savage.

After I graduated in 1966, I did not return to Bloomsburg. Almost as soon as I left school, a new building program threatened to tear up the campus, uproot stately trees and eliminate long walkways through wide expanses of lawn. I preferred to keep the memories of my college days untrampled by the footsteps of progress.

Then one day several months ago, I read in the *Maroon & Gold* alumni publication that a reunion was planned at the Savage Farm especially for student newspaper staff members who served during his tenure as advisor. I was instantly excited to learn that

Mr. Savage was still in the area, but deeply disappointed that the picnic was not open to all. I had not been part of the newspaper staff.

Then, a few weeks later, miraculously, I received an invitation to the reunion. I had forgotten that when I switched to English, I thought I should be involved in something literary so I had attended an organizational meeting of the student paper, then called the *Maroon & Gold*.

Somehow my name stayed on the staff listing for more than three decades. Needless to say, this invitation was a sign from above. I made up my mind to return to Bloomsburg after 33 years, not for the reunion, but for the opportunity to thank someone who gave me so much.

I missed the tour of the campus that morning, but drove around on my own, entering the campus from Lightstreet Road, I said to my wife at every turn, "I don't recognize anything. This is all new."

She pointed to building after building, saying, "Surely that one was there." But the corner stones told the truth: 1968, 1970, 1998.

It was the sight of Carver Hall that brought back the memories I had been protecting all those years.

We turned and drove through town and I made an amazing discovery. For the first time, I looked at the town itself and found a charm that I was unable to appreciate in my younger years. Those buildings hadn't changed much except for fresh paint and restorations. It is a town I could proudly make my own.

I attended the reunion, secretly afraid that someone would discover that I was a "fraud." I talked with several people, found everyone friendly and not overly suspicious of my presence.

Then I finally got a chance to thank Mr. Savage for instilling in me a love of literature and serving as a model for what good teaching should be.

When I approached him, his eyes twinkled as he nodded and said, "I recognize you." I don't doubt it, but he must have remembered me from class, not from the *Maroon & Gold* office. I was never in it!

Alumna carries on goal of 'Image'

It was her involvement with Image at BU that inspired Leslie Ann Williams Hoal '86 to continue signing to music at her church, weddings and the school where she teaches.

A member of Image for two years, Leslie carries on the goal of the organization, "to further the understanding and appreciation of manual com-

munication by educating and entertaining both hearing and deaf persons through interpretation and communication via sign language, facial expression and body language."

Since graduation from Bloomsburg, Leslie has taught at Choconut Valley Elementary School in the Montrose Area School District. The first year she

taught, she invited her Image friends to come to the school and perform.

She decided to teach her second graders a few songs in sign language, too. That year the class put on a modest show with the help of a few parents and a boom box.

Today, shows feature music directed by the music teacher, props constructed by the art department and costumes made by a small group of parents. Each year they end the show with "Love in Any Language," a musical tradition with Image.

Past shows by Leslie's class have centered on themes. The year they used a weather theme, each musical number was introduced with a forecast. When a twister was predicted, the students signed and sang "Twist and Shout."

Another year, students in the upper grades gifted program researched inventions. As one student talked about an invention, for example, the telephone, another student interpreted in sign language. Then the second graders sang "Why Haven't I Heard From You?"

One show everyone still talks about is the "The Lion King" because of the popularity of the Disney movie.

This spring Leslie's classes tried something different. They signed songs for a show about friends and family. The play, written by fifth and sixth graders, told of a young boy's attempt to fit in and how others learned a valuable lesson in acceptance.

As the second graders in Leslie's class learned signing and practiced the songs for the show, they learned the importance of accepting everyone for the special things they bring to life. Their minds were opened to friendship and diversity. When the students performed, they enthusiastically demonstrated this lesson for the entire school and the community.

Leslie says she has never had a student in her class who did not want to sign. They discuss the reason we have sign language as they learn how to use it. Leslie sees students' self-esteem soar as they realize they are learning a very special skill.

Leslie Ann Williams Hoal '86 is the mother of three children: Emily, 9; Cory, 5; and Caleb, 2. She has taken sign language courses through the University of Scranton and plans to pursue music interpretation when her children are all school age.

Women's athletics ranked #3 in USA

If you are a female athlete looking for one of the best schools in the country, then Bloomsburg University is for you, according to *Sports Illustrated for Women*.

The national magazine ranks Bloomsburg University third among Division II schools for women's athletics. Bloomsburg is the only Division II school east of the Mississippi River ranked in the top five and one of just two Pennsylvania schools listed by the magazine. (Penn State is ranked 11th in Division I.)

"The overall success of the women's athletic program is built on a solid philosophical base of understanding where every program is important and the quality of the experience for the student-athlete is the same in every aspect within the university," said Athletic Director Mary Gardner.

"Therefore, it has been incumbent upon the administration to hire the very best coaches to ensure this expectation is met, and obviously this has occurred. We have an outstanding coaching staff led by veteran coach Jan Hutchinson.

"Our coaches clearly understand our mission, work diligently and are solid role models. Women coach the majority of our programs, and we continually encourage the mentoring of young women interested in pursuing careers in coaching. We presently have four alumni on our coaching staff.

"At Bloomsburg, there is an atmosphere where coaches and athletes feel a part of the whole and recognize the importance of their contribution to the success of the total program," said Gardner. "It has been a rewarding experience watching the program grow and succeed over the past 11 years. There is every indication that the best is yet to come!"

To create the rankings, *SI for Women* considered the numbers: championships won; varsity, club and intramural opportunities; graduation rates; financial aid and fan support. The

magazine also looked at facilities, sports-related curricula, traditions and attitude.

Bloomsburg features several nationally ranked teams among its nine sports offered for women. The field hockey team is four-time defending NCAA champion, the women's soccer team won the 1998 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship and appeared in the 1998 NCAA championships, the women's tennis team tied for

the PSAC title and made an appearance in the 1999 NCAA championships. The women's swim team finished 10th at the national championships last season, and the softball team made its NCAA-record 18th straight appearance in the national playoffs last spring.

The overall record for Bloomsburg's women's teams in 1998-1999 was an astounding 138-29-4, a winning percentage of .818. Over the last five

years, the women's programs have combined for a record of 639-176-10, a winning percentage of .780.

In those five years, the Huskies have also earned 62 All-American awards and hundreds of All-PSAC honors.

From basement to penthouse:

The new Harvey A. Andruss Library officially opened in May 1998. For me, as university archivist, one aspect of the new facility is particularly important. For the first time in nearly 24 years, the University Archives, official repository for records and materials relating to the history of the school, is once again an integral part of the library building.

When the first Andruss Library was built in 1966, a room on the ground floor was designated for the archives, but it served as little more than storage for historical items. The library also held what was known as the Bloomsburg State College Collection, located in the reserve area. It included course catalogs, yearbooks and scrapbooks of newspaper clippings, but no official records.

The first step toward creating the archives was made in September 1972 when James B. Watts, former director of the library, was named archivist and special services librarian. He was to collect and organize materials relating to the history of the college, but the collections still needed a proper home.

This occurred in the fall of 1974 when two rooms in the basement of the Hartline Science Center were designated for the college archives as well as a labor and industrial history archives, which was being assembled at that time.

Historical records were solicited from offices around campus, in addition to materials from vaults in Carver and the Waller Administration Building. In addition, many records acquired before the move to Hartline were stored in Old Science Hall.

When Watts retired in February of 1978, the archives became inactive for more than a year.

Early in 1979, the archives was moved to the basement of the Bakeless Center for the Humanities and reopened under the new archivist, Roger Fromm. He had been hired in 1974 as a reference librarian and, like his predecessor, had no formal

archival training, but did have a love of history and desire to preserve the school's legacy. He remained archivist until his retirement in 1995.

The new room in Bakeless was the best that could be hoped for at the time, but it was small and had large water pipes running through the ceiling — exactly the environment that should be avoided to ensure safe storage of permanently valuable materials. The archives remained in Bakeless for more than 19 years.

I came to Bloomsburg in the fall of 1996 as university archivist and coordinator of special collections. I had worked as an archivist at the University of Illinois and accepted this job primarily for the opportunity to help plan and occupy a brand-new archival facility.

During the planning of the library, it was decided that the archives' new space would consist of four areas: a reading room for patron research, an office for the archivist, a workroom for organizing materials and a large storage area

containing compact shelving and a vault. The archives would cover 2735 square feet of the new library, compared to the former space in the basement of Bakeless that was only 1000 square feet.

With the additional space, both the archives and the library's special collections could now be housed together, allowing the union of these two valuable research collections.

Once the building was completed, a great deal of work went into the process of actually moving all of the material from archives and special collections materials into the new space. Detailed floor plans and layouts were created to show the exact location for furniture, equipment and the collections. The move took place over several weeks, entailed a lot of work, but in the end, was definitely worth the effort.

Although I may be biased, the archives reading room has to be one of the most visually stunning areas on campus. In addition to housing

historical treasures, it is adomed by five of the seven stained glass windows from the old library. The arched Tiffany window is over the doorway; four rectangular windows made by the George W. Spence Company of Boston are paired on two of the walls. Preservation work has just been completed on the windows, which were cleaned and covered with protective glass. The Spence windows are now back lit by two six-foot fluorescent tubes, bringing out the full colors of the glass.

The Spence windows were originally acquired for old Noetling Hall just over 80 years ago to provide a studious atmosphere. They continue to do that to this day.

The reading room also holds copies of university publications over the years, including yearbooks, course catalogs, student handbooks and newspapers, alumni magazines, athletic media guides and scrapbooks. Special collections is represented by books from its extensive collection on local and regional history. The rest of the archives' collections include thousands of photographs, more than 800 films, blueprints, office records, posters, videotapes and many types of memorabilia. Three large tables and 12 chairs are available for researchers.

A big part of collecting historical items is also exhibiting them. In front of the archives, located on the third floor, are three exhibit cases for displaying the collections. Exhibits featured in the last year include the Ben Franklin Training School, the *Maroon & Gold* student newspaper from 1960-74 and Philippine art objects donated to the university by a graduate.

It has been more than a year and a half since the Bloomsburg University Archives moved and the new space has worked out masterfully. It is a vast improvement over the previous facility and should serve the archives and special collections unit of the Harvey A. Andruss Library for years to come.

Preserving Tiffany treasures

A Tiffany window panel bearing the title, "Always Forward," is being restored after a faculty member found it tucked away in the basement of Bakeless Center for the Humanities last spring.

Sandi Kehoe-Forutan, geography and geosciences, reports the university is "rectifying history." When restored, the window panel will be hung in a more visible, but secure, location in the first floor lobby of Bakeless.

Presented to the university in 1970 by the Bakeless family as a memorial to Oscar H. Bakeless, 1858-1933, the Tiffany window panel was in the family's possession for 50 years. Bakeless, an 1879 graduate of the Bloomsburg Literary Institute and Normal School, taught at Bloomsburg for 30 years and was instrumental in raising funds for the larger Tiffany windows which are now in the new Andruss Library.

Last summer, professionals removed the latter treasures from the front of Andruss Library so they could be cleaned. They were then reinstalled inward four inches from the outer protective glass so air can circulate and keep the windows cooler.

Inside the library, a layer of glass was placed over the Tiffany and Spence windows above the door to the University Archives and inside the archives to give them added protection.

Peter Koch from Williamsport restored the Tiffany panel and worked on the Andruss windows project.

Fall sports highlights

The 1999 fall sports season at Bloomsburg University ended in typical Husky fashion. The football team posted another strong showing, while the women's field hockey team again proved itself the best in the nation in Division II

Football

The football team finished with a 7-4 overall record and a 4-2 mark in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division.

Bloomsburg posted solid victories over Shippensburg and Edinboro, both of whom defeated the Huskies in 1998 while playing teams such as New Haven and Millersville competitively.

Leading the way for Bloomsburg was senior receiver Matt Wilson and defensive end Justin Vent as well as sophomore quarterback Eric Miller. Wilson set a single season record with 16 touchdown catches and had 64 total receptions for 1,345 yards. His efforts earned him PSAC first team honors.

Vent concluded his career with 50 total tackles this season, 24 solo and helped anchor the Huskies defensive squad. He was also selected as a PSAC first team honoree.

Miller passed for 2,571 yards on 171 completions in 270 attempts. He set the Bloomsburg single season record for completion percentage at 63.3% while tossing 25 touchdowns.

The Huskies ended their season with a 65-16 rout of Edinboro in which Wilson caught three touchdown passes.

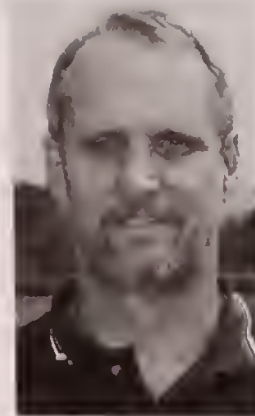

PRIDE program helps inner-city youths

Support from organizations like the Whitaker Foundation, AMP Inc., the Greater Harrisburg Foundation, the Grumbacher Foundation and the Susquehanna Employment and Training Corporation (SETCO) helped make Bloomsburg University's PRIDE program possible in 1999.

The acronym, PRIDE, stands for Personal Responsibility in Developing Excellence. Instituted in 1992, the program promotes the attainment of post-secondary education and training for low-income, inner-city Harrisburg youths, who too often fail to complete high school.

The program advocates education as a priority and inspires students to become passionate about learning through a variety of classroom exercises as well as cultural activities and field trips.

The State System of Higher Education, Bloomsburg University and Harrisburg-area businesses and industries are collaborative partners in the program.

"This is an effective way to get low-income students thinking about going to college," says **Adrienne Flack**, Bloomsburg's director of pre-collegiate programs.

"We work with students during their formative years to change attitudes about education. Some of the participants never leave their own neighborhoods; we show them that there are opportunities outside their communities."

The PRIDE program consists of two components: a residential summer program and a Saturday program that occurs throughout the academic year.

With the assistance of university staff member **Illuminada Toledo**, former Harrisburg teacher **Jack Anderson** and 29 BU students, the PRIDE program served more than 100 students during the last academic year.

Outcomes of the program are tangible, with three former PRIDE participants now enrolled as freshmen at the university.

"Not only do we serve the PRIDE program students, but it also helps market the university," says Flack. "We want them to consider going to college, but it's even better if they choose Bloomsburg."

BU students benefit from the PRIDE program as well because the Saturday program offers a training opportunity to many education majors.

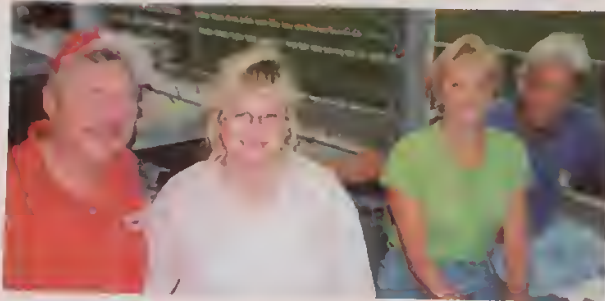

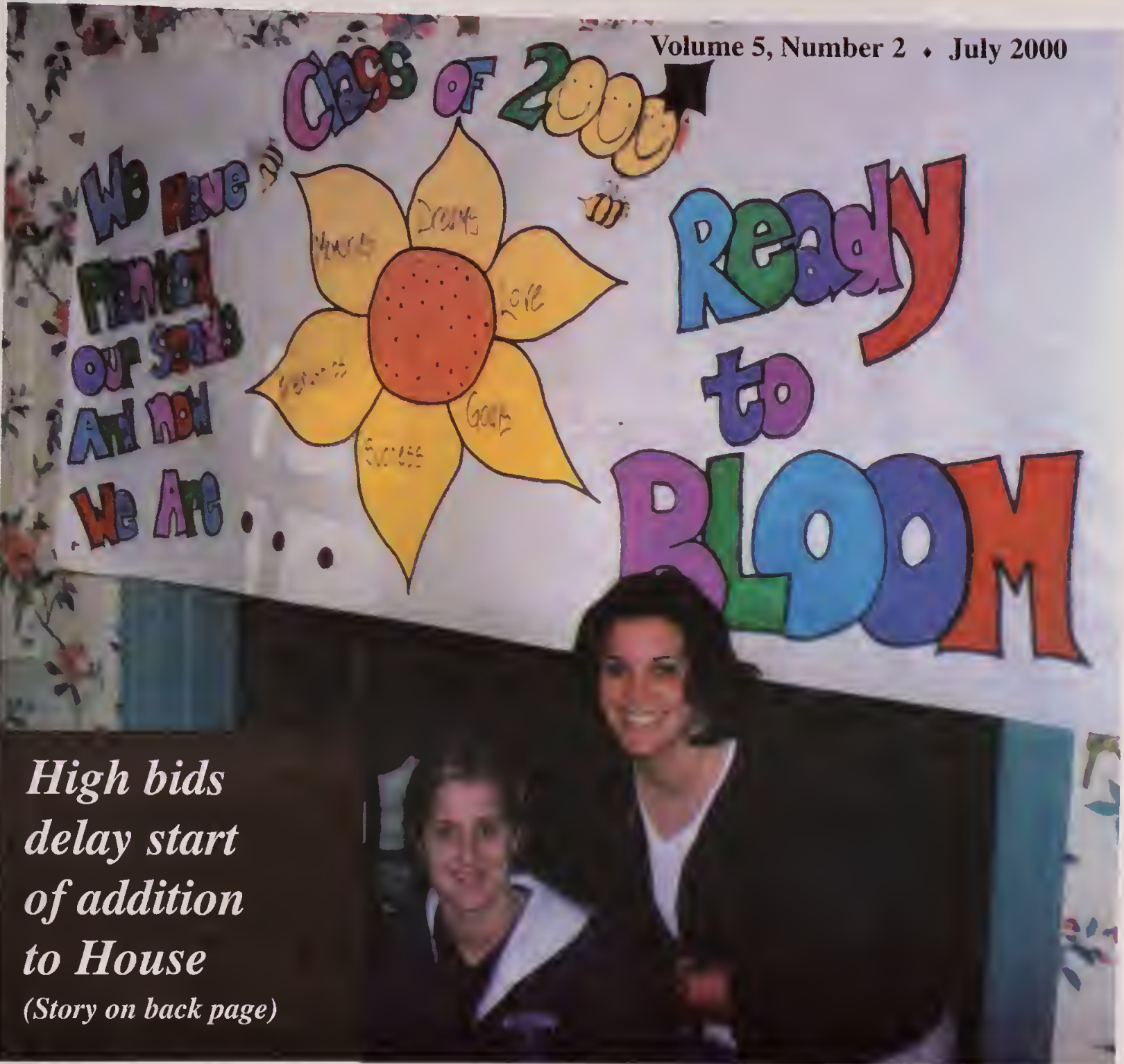

Charles J. Daly '52 Distinguished Service Award

Charles J. Daly '52 received a Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his professional coaching success as well as his ambassadorship to the university.

One of the university's most recognized alumni, Chuck has said that the teaching skills he learned at Bloomsburg have always been an essential part of his coaching.

Chuck attended Kane High School in western Pennsylvania, where C. Stuart Edwards guided him as a three-year varsity player. Coach Edwards appreciated Chuck's commitment to practice and analysis of the game. Chuck was a team leader by his own example.

After high school Chuck headed for St. Bonaventure in New York but after one year, transferred to Bloomsburg State College. Chuck's devotion to basketball continued; he became Bloomsburg's leading scorer in his junior and senior years.

As a secondary education major Chuck prepared to teach in three disciplines: speech correction, English and social studies. He said he always knew he wanted to coach basketball so he took speech to help him communicate better with his players.

As an undergraduate, Chuck was a member of the track team, Varsity Club, sports staff of the *Maroon and Gold* and Sigma Alpha Eta, the professional speech and hearing fraternity.

Chuck graduated in 1952. After two years in the army he became head coach at Punxsutawney High School. While teaching and coaching he earned a masters degree in educational administration at

Penn State University.

In 1963 Chuck wrote a letter to Duke University telling them "they needed him." He was named assistant coach and stayed six years. He then accepted an offer as head coach at Boston College. Two years later, in 1971, he became the head coach at the University of Pennsylvania.

His professional coaching began in 1977 when he became assistant coach for the Philadelphia 76ers. In 1981 he accepted a job with the floundering Cleveland Cavaliers. In the fall of 1982 Chuck went back to Philadelphia as a TV commentator.

The Detroit Pistons approached Chuck in 1983. The winning began and in 1989 and 1990 he lead the team to back-to-back titles – a feat only three other NBA coaches can claim. Chuck, known widely for his ability to relate to professional athletes and inspire their greatest effort, modestly claims he has been fortunate to work with players who can win a championship.

In 1992 he coached the basketball "Dream Team" to an Olympic gold medal in Barcelona. This was the first year professionals were allowed in the Olympics and the U.S. dominated the competition.

Chuck stayed with Detroit three more years, went with the New Jersey Nets for two years and retired in 1994. He returned to coaching in 1997 for two seasons with the Orlando Magic.

Bloomsburg University has honored Chuck on two previous occasions. In 1983 he was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame. Chuck Daly Way, the street along the east side of Centennial Gymnasium, was named in his honor in 1993.

Chuck and his wife, Terry Cierlitsky Daly '50, live in Tequesta, FL, and West Bloomfield, MI. They are the parents of daughter, Cydney.

Hugh M. Dempsey '70 Distinguished Service Award

Hugh M. Dempsey '70 received a Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his professional accomplishments and civic contributions as well as his support of Bloomsburg University.

After graduation from Bloomsburg State College in 1970, Hugh taught elementary school in the Wyoming Area School District. In 1972 he was appointed elementary principal. He earned his masters in education from Bloomsburg in 1975.

He continued his professional studies earning a doctorate in early childhood education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1979. He taught early child development there from 1975 to 1978.

Hugh next served as major donor officer and director of institutional research at Saint Vincent College, 1978-1986. He also became founding executive director of Saint Vincent College Prevention Projects, earning national recognition for this early intervention project serving the 17 school districts in Westmoreland County.

Hugh served as president and chief executive officer of the Eye & Ear Institute of Pittsburgh from 1986 to 1992. During his tenure, the institute grew from an operation with six employees and no active research to a program with 100 employees and extensive research funded by more than \$3 million in government and private support.

From 1992 to 1997, Hugh was owner and president of The Dempsey Group, Inc., a holding company comprised of a management consulting firm specializing in organizational development and

In 1996, Hugh became the founding president of the Community Foundation of Westmoreland County. In that capacity he raised more than \$7 million to endow its future. Hugh was also named a Distinguished Alumnus of Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1996.

In 1999, Hugh assumed the role of vice-president of the Institute for Advanced Catholic Studies. He is responsible for energizing a campaign to raise \$60 million to establish the institute, a residential program for 20-25 scholars doing research on the Catholic tradition and its relevance today.

Hugh has held many leadership roles in numerous community organizations. His credits include president of the Westmoreland Symphony orchestra, president of the Westmoreland Museum Society, former chairman of the Westmoreland Community College board of trustees, national vice-chairman of the Catholic Campaign of America, chairman of the Patron of the Arts in the Vatican Museums.

In 1991 Hugh received the Maimonides Award of Philanthropy from the state of Israel and in 1999 the Antonio Canova medal from the Vatican Museums.

Robert J. Gibble '68 Distinguished Service Award

Robert J. Gibble '68 received a Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his successful career in the accounting field and his service to Bloomsburg University.

A native of Reading, Bob earned a B.S. in accounting from Bloomsburg State College in 1968. While at Bloomsburg he lettered all four years in varsity baseball. John L. Tentromono '61 retired after 39 years in the field of education.

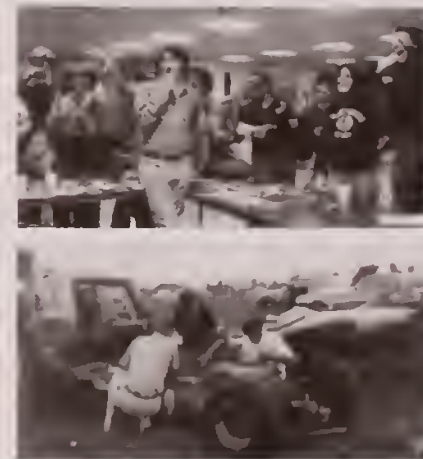

James J. Gallagher '64 retired this year after 35 years of teaching. But his retirement was more than just a farewell to many years of service.

If you lived in Philadelphia and went to Philadelphia Public Schools, chances are Jim taught you. He was a public school teacher assigned to the Franklin Institute. His classroom was within the museum. Since 1966, Jim has taught 18,000 children a year or 630,000 students.

Through an agreement made in 1924, Philadelphia is the only city in the nation that hires certified teachers to link the classroom curriculum with the city museums, city hall and the zoo.

Jim's innovative lessons cover everything from electricity to microscopes to earthquakes to the metric system. He is well known for his ability to make complicated concepts fun and understandable for all of his students—from grades one to twelve. His sensitivity and devotion as a teacher, especially to those who have trouble in school, stem from his own difficulties as a student due to poor vision.

Jim, who is legally blind, has further distinguished himself among his colleagues as an advocate for teachers who have disabilities. In 1986, he founded the nation's first teachers' union local for educators with disabilities including vision and hearing impairments, diabetes, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis.

He is chairperson of Working Members with Disabilities, an advocacy group of the Philadelphia

Our young father walked Ash Alley whistling "Rescue the Perishing," but already he carried mine tunnels home in his black-streaked breath. It was like first sleet against an attic window. Some of the men who stopped at our house to see my father had tongues like fish that stuck out between wards. Gray-faced, shoulders bony, they all seemed about to cave in. My mother would leave the room, her lips thinner than ever, but the cough followed her across the linoleum, down cellar steps, hunkered close when she planted sage and primrose. The cough was like a child. It was always hungry. It demanded attention. It woke us up at odd times and sat in the good chair by the window. In winter, it trailed behind my father like a peacock feather on a woman's hat. One summer he told us we were on a planet going nowhere fast. He made a model he called an orrery, and showed us how the heavens worked. The center was bright and hung there like one of my mother's peony blossoms. "That there's what pushes it," he said. "And that's what made the coal." We looked at him and nodded, but we had our own ideas about what made it go. We could hear it behind the least little thing.

Maurer surfs the digital edge

Allan D. Maurer '72 was feature editor for the Maroon & Gold, the student newspaper, in 1969-70. Here, in his own words, is an update on his life, along with his thoughts on an online line of work (sic).

After years of freelance writing for magazines from *Omni* to *Playboy* to *Modern Maturity* (highest circulation magazine in the world at about 20 million), I somehow got into the publications startup business.

First, I started two business monthly tabloids, then a series of city magazines. The last, *Charlotte's Best* (Charlotte NC), had great promise but the era of money-making, general-interest magazines is coming to an end. They are costly to produce and you have to give them away to ensure advertisers a result.

It was a lot of fun. I wrote about art, food, restaurants, films and blues music in addition to writing features. I ate well. I got to watch Carolina Panther's NFL games from the press box high above the stadium, met all the players. I interviewed Hugh McCall of Bank America among other top dawgs of the region. But I didn't make much money.

When I saw the old world of print publications giving way to the Internet, I gave up my interest in *Charlotte's Best* – literally just walked away from it – and retrained myself at online writing. That took about a year. I wrote for *Charlotte Magazine*, *Creative Loafing* and two chapters in the book *The Writer's Complete Fantasy Reference* (Writer's Digest) on magic and witchcraft, neither of which I practice but I'm a wizard at research.

As I gained Internet skill, I began applying for online writing jobs. [Dbusiness.com](http://dbusiness.com) gave me a shot at its grueling, wire-service-like pace. I wrote five stories a day on business

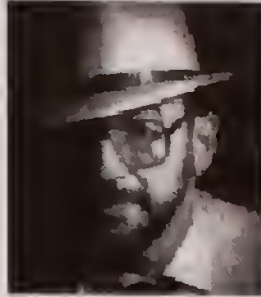
and technology companies, focusing largely on the so-called "new economy" of the Internet, information technology, biotechnology and venture financed start-ups of every stripe.

They hired me fulltime after two weeks and I wrote 700 stories in the first eight months. It's the hardest work I've ever done but also the most fun.

I hear from my readers. This can be humbling, because I hear about every mistake I make, but it also means I know I'm being read. People who are among this region's movers and shakers constantly tell me how much they use what I write, how important it is to them. That's motivating. It also pays better than any other journalism job I've had. I'm now paying more in weekly taxes than I was making doing the magazine.

Some National Public Radio (NPR) pundit said that financial and technology writers today are like the journalists who wrote about rock in the 60s. Business, the market, entrepreneurship, that's the leading edge of popular culture at the moment, and I always did love surfing that rolling, thunderous leading edge.

It's made me something of a celebrity in the Research Triangle of North Carolina, where I now live in a two-loft apartment with my black and white cat, Bobby Lee. I have a wall-sized window that looks out on tree-canopied Duke Street and the Durham School of the Arts. There are five bookstores within walking distance. The Gothic east campus of Duke University is just up the street and



the renovated warehouse district is very cool, arty, bohemian. I love it. If you want to see where I live, rent the movie *Bull Durham*. When the camera pans over the ballpark fence, behind the fire tower, you'll see the unpretentious brick rectangle of the Burlington Warehouse. That's the place.

Swing dancing is popular here, and because I had the good fortune to date an Arthur Murray teacher (\$60,000 in free dance lessons), I can still do a bit of hoofing and do.

In addition to writing daily for dbusiness.com, I also work for the company's profitable and highly regarded magazine, *digital south*.

Not long ago I turned down a job offer from another national magazine because my company instantly exceeded their offer, resulting in a raise only slightly less than my entire teaching salary in 1973.

I've learned quite a bit about this new economy, from the difference between servers, routers and switches to the ins and outs of telecom lingo and what the DNA plumbers of biotech are up to (saving my aging bacon, I hope). I learn quite a few new things every day and do my best to tell my readers about them.

If you're in a city with dbusiness.com and have an interest in emerging companies, entrepreneurs, venture capital or small capital public companies, come by and see us. Meanwhile, catch ya in Catawissa, baby.

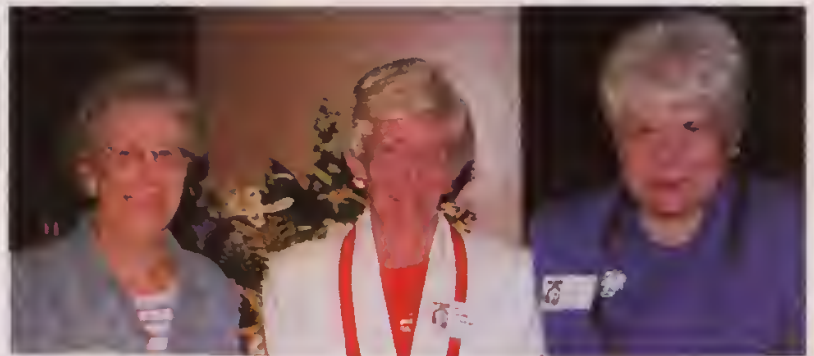

DirectCoupons.com, the email newsletter, claims 450,000 subscribers.

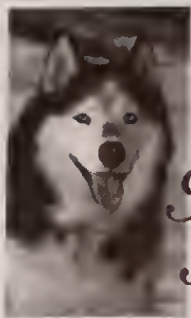

Drew Hostetter '76

Drew was the first men's tennis standout at Bloomsburg University.

Drew compiled a mark of 81-18 playing at number one singles each of his four years. 25 years later, his winning percentage of 82 percent remains the best mark in school history. He helped the Huskies to a second place finish at the ECAC championships as a sophomore, first place as a junior and second place as a senior.



Drew was named the school's Senior Athlete of the Year in 1976 and graduated summa cum laude.

Following graduation he won the Maryland State Clay Championship singles title in 1977 and was named as one of

the top tennis players in Lancaster County in the 20th century by the Lancaster Area newspapers.

Eric Koetteritz '75

As a walk-on to the track and field team, Eric scored more points for the Huskies than any other athlete, accumulating 348 during his four years on the team. In his career he posted 56 victories, 20 second- and eight, third-place finishes, while leading the team to a record of 54-7 in dual meets.



A three-year captain, he set nine indoor and outdoor school records in the pole vault, sprinting and relay events, several of which still stand. As a senior, he qualified for the NCAA championships and placed ninth in the 440-relay and 10th in 220-yard dash.

Eric was also the first freshman to receive the President's Scholarship Award. He later went on to be the first person to ever win all four major senior awards; the Academic Achievement Award (Dean's List all four years of college); the Lifetime Athletic Pass (four-year varsity letter winner), Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities and the Service Key Award.

Wayne Richards '79

During his career at Bloomsburg, Wayne was the first male swimmer to gain NCAA All-American honors in each of his four years of competition. He was named NCAA All-American six times



in three different events. As a freshman he captured the PSAC crown in the 100 Butterfly and ended his career with top six finishes in both the 100 and 200 Butterfly in each of his four years.

Wayne served as team captain in 1979 and stayed on at the school to serve as a graduate assistant coach in 1980.

Throughout his career, Wayne broke numerous team records in both butterfly events, the 200 IM and as a member of the 400 Medley, 400 Freestyle and 800 Freestyle Relay teams.

Wayne currently holds team records in the 200 Butterfly and 400 Freestyle Relay, marks that are now more than 20 years old.

Civilian- Military Relations Symposium

Eileen Albertson Chapman '67

On May 5, your Alumni Association sponsored a Civilian-Military Relations Symposium. Six talented speakers presented viewpoints on our national security and defense positions during the full-day seminar.

Professor Don Zillman from the University of Maine traced the development of the citizen-soldier from Revolutionary times to the all-volunteer force of today. He also chronicled the public's relationship to those forces through the years.

Scott Silliman, executive director of the Center for Law, Ethics and National Security at Duke University, gave a detailed analysis of the impact of international law and the rules of engagement on the use of force by the military.

John Hathaway, from the office of the Directorate of Military Support for Civilian Authorities in the Department of Defense, described the assistance the department gives to civilian authorities in cases of mass emergency. He briefed the audience on steps taken to prevent the use of weapons of mass destruction.

The Adjutant General of Pennsylvania, Major General William Lynch, spoke about the Pennsylvania Army and Air National Guard. He

explained how they have become a significant part of the integrated force of our national defense.

Major General Robert McIntosh, assistant to the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff for Reserve Matters, followed with a detailed presentation on the increasing daily use of Reserves in our national security.

The Marines were represented by Colonel Kevin Winter, deputy staff judge advocate to the Commandant of the Marine Corps and former battalion commander at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island. He described the recruiting, training and education of young Marines who deploy around the world to defend our country and protect our national security interests.

The symposium wrapped up with a roundtable discussion between presenters and audience moderated by university professors, Nancy Gentile Ford of the history department and Gloria Dion-Cohen of the political science department.

The symposium was designed to provide students and members of the local community with information not available through textbooks or the media. Those who attended were amazed at what they learned and suggested that a similar event be held in the future.

Needless to say, the presentation was spiked with several appropriate jokes and, for many of us, swallowed tears.

Our friend—a friend to all—Doug responded with a sincere thank you and kind remarks.

A superb dinner followed, served with background music, tables with floral basket centerpieces and programs tied with red or blue ribbons. All veterans were identified with a red, white and blue ribbon bar pin. Leading the pack ...

Having increased year-end fundraising totals 41 percent over the past four years, Bloomsburg University continues to set institutional records and maintain a top spot in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education.

The Bloomsburg University Foundation, which secures private funds from alumni, organizations, and other foundations, raised \$3,645,233 during 1999—an 18 percent increase over 1998.

"Our success has been a result of continued support from close friends of the university and some very significant contributions from new donors," says Anthony M. Ianiero, executive director of the Bloomsburg University Foundation. "This kind of continued relationship with the university indicates the confidence that people have in this institution. We're very proud of that confidence."

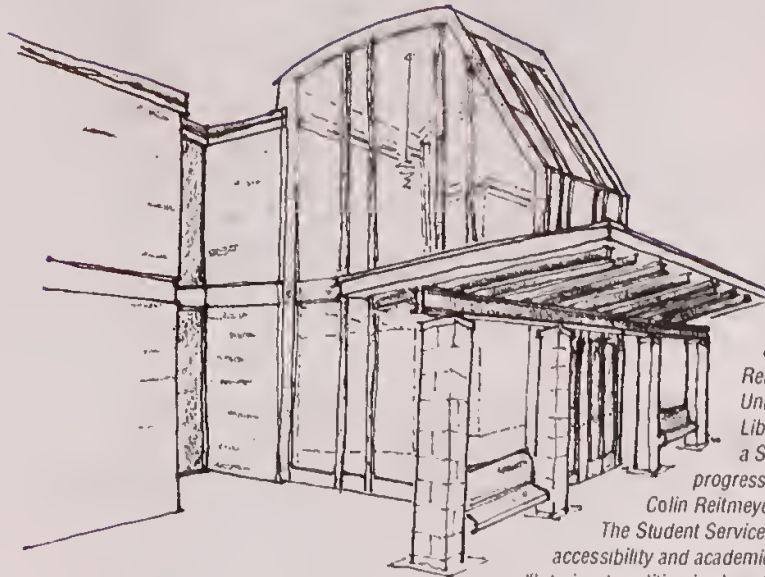
In addition, Bloomsburg University raised the largest dollar amount of all 14 State System of Higher Education schools in 1999. Bloomsburg also ranked among the top five universities in the categories of dollars raised per alumni, alumni participation, and percent of increase in both funds raised and endowment growth in five years.

Bloomsburg's record-breaking year comes as the university launched its first comprehensive campaign, *New Challenges, New Opportunities*, which focuses on funding opportunities for excellence projects, increasing academic scholarships and the annual fund, and renovating the former library into a Student Services Center.

Over \$10 million has been raised toward the \$11 million campaign goal, with about \$1.1 million designated thus far for the Student Services Center project. The Student Services Center is expected to open during the spring semester of 2001. Over 9,400 individuals and organizations have contributed to *New Challenges, New Opportunities*.

"To be successful, we need the participation of all of the university's constituents in our fundraising efforts for *New Challenges, New Opportunities*," says Susan Hicks, manager of development operations. "Small gifts, as well as large gifts, are important because they indicate the strength of commitment our alumni, parents and friends have for Bloomsburg."

Of the \$3.6 million in gifts to Bloomsburg during 1999, alumni contributed \$1,177,334, or approximately 32 percent of the total. Organizations made up about 39 percent (\$1,454,122), while parents (2%), friends (13.5%), faculty and staff (2%), matching gift companies (4.6%), and

other corporations and foundations (6.9%) rounded out the remaining \$1,013,777.

Alumni giving increased 5.1 percent over 1998's mark—a \$359,323 jump. Additionally, the alumni participation rate increased from 14 percent in 1998 to 17.7 percent in 1999. Bloomsburg University faculty and staff members also posted a \$10,280 increase in their giving.

"We are very pleased to see that the overall alumni giving rate has increased," says Hicks. "That's a significant fact during Bloomsburg's campaign, and we're hopeful that it will continue to increase."

One of Bloomsburg's largest donations came from the Community Government Association, the university's student-run governing board, which contributed a campaign gift of over \$1 million to support the renovation of the university bookstore and to create upper campus recreation facilities.

Among other significant gifts to The Bloomsburg University Foundation in 1999 were from the estate of Eleanor Sharadin Faust ('38), the estate of Richard W. Sands, and gifts from Mildred Quick Muller ('34) and Robert "Doc" Warren.

An endowed distinguished lecturer series for the nursing department was established with funds from the Faust estate and the Margaret E. McCern Memorial Scholarship was established via the Richard W. Sands estate. McCern taught Business Education at Bloomsburg University from 1954 to 1976.

Muller's gift supports the scholarship established in her name and benefits incoming freshmen students in the College of Business. Warren, faculty emeritus, who retired in 1983 from Bloomsburg University's department of history, designated his gift to support the Presidential Leadership Scholarships and to establish an annuity. He earned honorary alumnus status in 1995.

Special Addition



The Alumni Association had hoped to start construction this summer on a significant addition to the Fenstemaker Alumni House. When bids were opened on June 29, 2000, however, they were significantly higher than anyone expected, including the architects.

The officers of the Alumni Association have asked the architects to make modifications, which will not affect the size or scope of the project. New bids will be sought later this year and if they are acceptable construction could start in early spring of 2001.

Nearly half of the additional 2,675 square feet will be devoted to a Great Room, named for **Curtis R. English '56**, interim president of the university from 1993 to 1994, who passed away last year.

The expansion will also include a new entrance foyer and reception area, restrooms, kitchen, coatroom and storage area. Other improvements to the existing structure, such as a new heating system and a wired smoke alarm system, will also be included in the project.

Purchased in 1985 by the Alumni Association, Alumni House is named in honor of the late **Howard F. Fenstemaker '12**, long-time faculty member and Alumni Association president. The 1929 structure was purchased from the estate of **Dorothy John Dillon '24**.

This important project—our special addition to the Alumni House—is being funded by a Bloomsburg University Foundation grant and the support of individual alumni.
