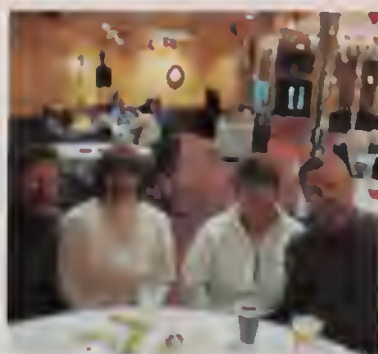

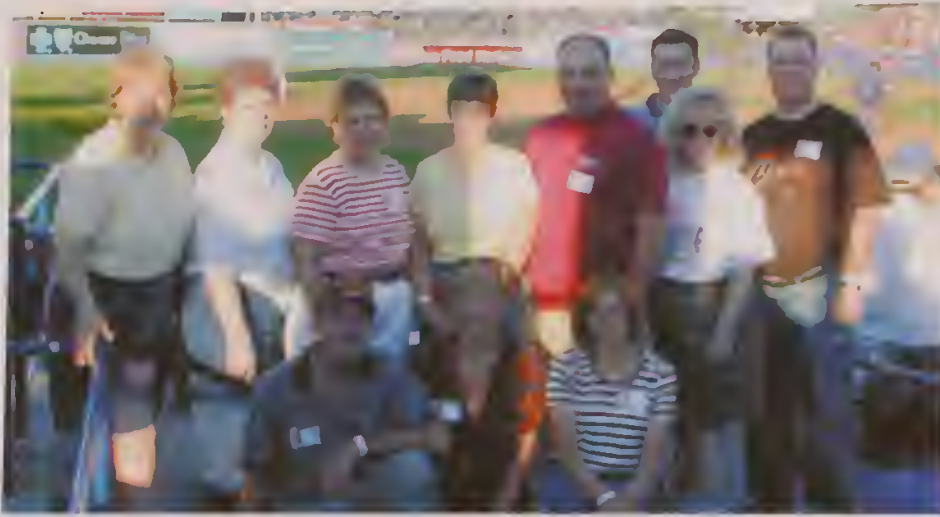

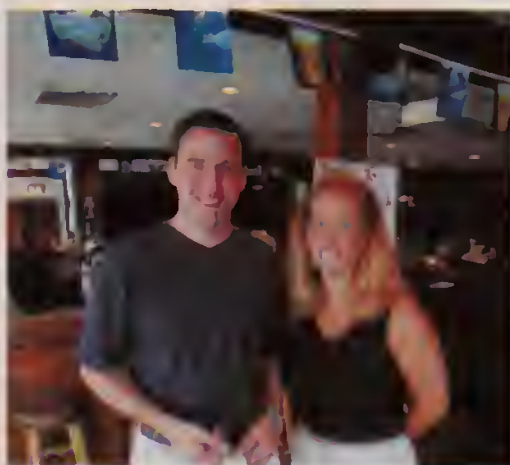

1951 Championship Football Team



The Bloomsburg University Athletic Department recently established an award to honor PSAC championship teams. In celebration of the 50th anniversary of its Pennsylvania State Teachers College Conference championship, the 1951 football team was the first to receive the new Team of Champions Award.

The 1951 football team, coached by Bob Redman, was one of only two teams in Bloomsburg football history to go undefeated (1948 was the first).

The award was presented to team alumni on September 8 when the Huskies hosted Shippensburg University in a season-opener at Redman Stadium. The reunion was well attended; 35 out of 55 team members reunited to celebrate the honor (nine team members are deceased).

Festivities began with a pre-game brunch at Buckalew Place, hosted by University President Jessica Kozloff. During half time, the 1951 team was honored on the field. Following the game, team members gathered on the lawn of the Fenstemaker Alumni House to reminisce and enjoy the company of former teammates and their families.

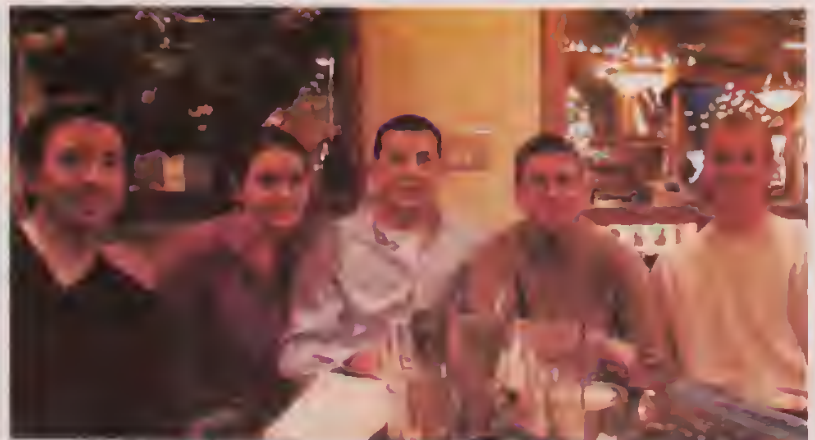

Huskies' Fall sports wrap-up

Football

Led by PSAC Eastern Division Offensive Player of the Year, Marques Glaze, and PSAC East Coach of the Year Danny Hale, the Bloomsburg football team posted a record of 9-1 during the regular season. The Huskies also earned a berth to the NCAA championships for the second straight season where they lost to Grand Valley State, the eventual NCAA Division II runner-up.

Glaze, a senior tailback, rushed for 1,327 yards and 12 touchdowns on 211 carries this season, including a career-best of 222 yards against East Stroudsburg. He finished his career as the school's third all-time leading rusher with 3,331 yards.

Hale was named the PSAC Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year and eighth time overall. Hale has led the Huskies to the NCAA Division II playoffs two years in a row for the first time in school history. He has compiled a record of 73-29-1 in nine seasons at the helm for Bloomsburg and an overall record of 113-42-1 in 14 seasons as a Division II head coach. The 73 wins at Bloomsburg is a school record. He was also named the American Football Coaches Association Division II Region I Coach of the Year for the eighth time in his career, five of them coming at Bloomsburg.

The Huskies started the season with four straight wins before losing a tough, 23-12 decision on the road at Indiana (PA). Needing to win their remaining games to get a playoff berth, the Huskies rolled over East Stroudsburg, Mansfield and Millersville before struggling to beat Kutztown. In the final game of the season, the Huskies easily beat Slippery Rock to earn the fourth and final NCAA Northeast Region playoff spot.

Traveling to Allendale, Michigan, for the opening round of the playoffs the Huskies were not able to overcome some missed opportunities and fell to Grand Valley, 42-14.

After working at the Glen Alden Colliery in Wanamie, he became a teacher in Freehold, NJ.

His wife, the former Eleanor Stackhouse, died in 1986. Surviving is a son, John Ermon, and a sister.

Soccer

The men's soccer team wrapped up a successful season with a 3-1 win over California (PA), the first place finisher in the PSAC regular season. The Huskies ended the year on a four-game winning streak which included an overtime victory against PSAC-rival Lock Haven.

Bloomsburg was also ranked fourth in the final Mid-Atlantic Regional rankings.

Defense was the name of the game for Bloomsburg this year allowing just 21 goals. Goalie Kevin Wright was 6-1-1 with four shutouts while Phil Bocchino was a standout on defender all season.

The women's soccer team once again had another very successful season posting a record of 15-4-1. Coach Sandy Dickson led her squad to the PSAC finals for the second straight year (where it lost in four overtimes for the second straight year) and to the NCAA Division II tournament for the third time in four years.

Senior Alea Balthaser and junior Renee Williams led the Huskies' offensive attack combining for 32 of the team's 54 goals on the season. Balthaser, named an All-American following the season, finished her career as the school's all-time leader in goals (60), assists (35) and points (155). Also, freshman goalie Heather Hartman set a school record with 12 shutouts this season to lead the defensive effort for the Huskies.

Cross Country

Both the men's and women's cross country teams showed improvement during the 2001 season with 10th place finishes at the PSAC championships.

For the men, sophomore Chris Turner placed 21st at the PSAC championships and

was 19th place at the NCAA Regional championships. It was the best finish for a Bloomsburg men's cross country runner since Chris Moseatello's 18th place finish in 1997.

For the women, 39-year old Kim Gasper was the top finisher at the PSAC championships in 20th place, while coming home in 33rd place at the NCAA Regional championships.

The men's team will return everyone next season, while the women will return all but three runners to next year's Huskies squad.

Field Hockey

The Bloomsburg field hockey team wrapped up another successful season by winning its final nine games to finish with a 14-3 record. The Huskies, however, did not earn a post-season bid for the first time in over 20 years.

Four members of the team went on to earn All-American honors for their play this season. They were Shanna Fritz and Marlea Partlon, named first team All-Americans by the National Field, while Nikki Hartranft and Trish Leitzel were named second team All-Americans.

Fritz, a sophomore, finished the season with 19 goals, six assists and 44 points. Partlon, a senior back, had a solid final year, playing excellent defense in all 17 games she played in this season. She helped the defense hold opponents to just a 0.57 goals against average on the year. Hartranft, a sophomore, was second on the team with 13 goals and 34 points, while leading the team with eight assists. Leitzel, a junior goalie, posted a 0.63 goals against average and an .853 save percentage. She allowed just 10 goals and made 58 saves en route to 11 shutouts on the year.

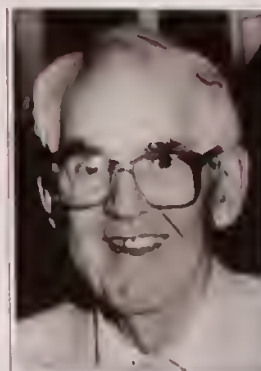

Jerry is general manager of the New Columbia Joist Company. They reside in Loyalsock Township.

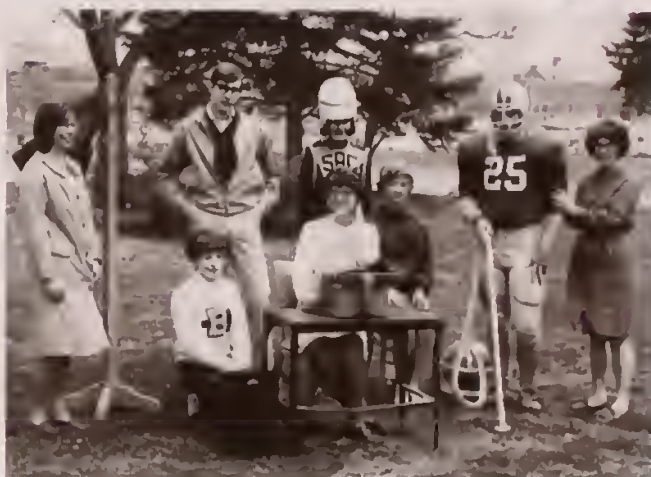

A new look at Henry Carver and Institute Hall

There have been a number of histories written about Bloomsburg University, the first in the mid-1870s by Colonel John G. Freeze and the most recent by Eda Bessie Edwards a century later in 1979, *Profile of the Past*. These chronicles vary in completeness and accuracy, especially concerning the mid-1860s when Henry Carver came to Bloomsburg and when Institute Hall—now Carver Hall—was built. This article offers a new interpretation of this period in the history of both the university and the town using contemporary sources, including never-before researched articles from a local newspaper, the *Columbia Democrat and Star of the North*.

One fact that must be made perfectly clear when looking at the history of the university is that it would not be here today if not for the unwavering support of the people of Bloomsburg. They saw the potential of the school and knew what its success would mean for the community's future. What would one day become Bloomsburg University started in the spring of 1866 when Henry Carver came to town to begin teaching classical courses. This was the true beginning of higher education in Bloomsburg.

Carver comes to Bloomsburg

As the story goes, Henry J. Carver of Binghamton, NY, came through Bloomsburg, probably in early March 1866, on a vacation down the Susquehanna River. He had an extensive background in education and had previously run schools and academies in New York and California. Carver stayed in Bloomsburg several days and inquired about the status of the schools, meeting with prominent men of the town including the Rev. David J. Waller. He was most likely shown the Academy Building on Third Street, a facility he must have judged inadequate for a first-class educational institution.

The discussions with Henry Carver were first made known to the public in a notice published in the *Columbia Democrat and Star of the North* of March 21, 1866:

The attention of the public is directed to the fact that the School Directors of Bloom township have taken initiatory steps to get a number of stockholders or contributors sufficient to erect and establish an Academy in the town of Bloomsburg, for the instruction of young men and women in both the professional and ordinary business affairs of life. This is a move in the right direction. Such a building in this place is imperatively demanded.

Henry Carver was introduced to the citizens of Bloomsburg at a meeting held in the Lutheran Church on March 28. The purpose of the meeting was to take immediate action to open a good, first class school in the town since one did not currently exist. Carver addressed the meeting as a teacher with a long, successful, academy and literary institute career. He provided those present at the meeting with practical information on what needed to be done. After lengthy discussion, a committee was appointed to immediately begin the process of opening the school and erecting suitable buildings for it. Carver must have made it quite clear that the primary condition of his staying in Bloomsburg to teach was that the inadequate Academy Building be replaced.

All previous histories have stated that Henry Carver was in Bloomsburg and teaching for a period of anywhere from one month to two years before mention

was made of the need for a new school building. The article from the newspaper clearly shows that discussion of a new facility occurred before he ever opened a school here, and he must have insisted that this be done. A man of his background would not have been content teaching at a small school for a low salary and no assurances that something better was imminent.

On April 4, it was announced that the Bloomsburg Literary Institute was now open for students with Prof. Henry Carver as principal, the Rev. J. R. Dimm of the Lutheran Church serving as Professor of Ancient Languages and Miss Sarah Carver, Henry Carver's daughter, as preceptress or female teacher. The first 11-week term was due to begin on April 16. The institute would allow young men to acquire a thorough business education or college preparation, and young ladies a useful education.

Interest in the Literary Institute must have been high because it opened a week early on April 9, 1866, when Prof. Carver made his opening remarks to the students, outlining their responsibilities and how they could best achieve success both in school and later in life. This date marks the start of classes at what would one day become Bloomsburg University.

Official date linked to Academy

Although the university dates its origin to the start of the Bloomsburg Academy in 1839, this date did not appear in any official school publication, in this case, the course catalog, until 1928. In fact, the 1901 catalog, in reference to the College Preparatory Department of the then Bloomsburg Literary Institute and State Normal School, clearly states that the department dates back to the original establishment of the school in 1866 when Henry Carver began teaching—not 1839. The direct connection between the university and the academy was not made until the J. H. Beers history of Columbia and Montour counties was published in 1915.

The first historian of the school, John G. Freeze, in his 1883 history, actually relegated the Bloomsburg

Academy of 1839 to the category of a common school. He stated that what is now Bloomsburg University began in 1856 with the original chartering of the Bloomsburg Literary Institute. But since that school ceased operating a number of years before Henry Carver came to town and the quality of its education was at the secondary level, it can be argued that the historical start of the university was in April 1866.

The reason for using the 1839 date seems to relate to the fact that when the history of the school section in the 1928 catalog was written, using information from previous histories and especially the most recent one by Beers, Bloomsburg had been a state teachers college for only one year. The 1839 start date was probably chosen because it made the new college seem as old as possible, helping it compete with other institutions. The school's 100th anniversary was now just 11 years away instead of 38.

A little more than three weeks after the first classes began, the charter for Bloomsburg Literary Institute, initially formed in September 1856, was revived on May 2, 1866. The Board of Trustees met two days later and wasted no time in forming a committee to determine the location of the new institute buildings. It is evident the trustees wanted to maintain the momentum brought about by the arrival of Prof. Carver and push forward with construction of the first building. But this could not be accomplished without money, and it was up to the citizens of Bloomsburg to supply the financial backing. The trustees decided to sell 1000 shares of stock in an attempt to raise \$20,000 for the land and construction. The shares were valued at \$20 each, payable in \$5-installments.

Influential citizens involved

The trustees during these early years included many of the most influential citizens of Bloomsburg. These men played a crucial role in providing support, primarily financial, for the school as it grew and developed. They included the Rev. David J. Waller; judges Leonard B. Rupert and William Elwell; merchants Isaiah W. Hartman, John Wolf and Elias Mendenhall; lawyer John G. Freeze; and William Neal, owner of a major iron furnace in town.

By the end of May, Prof. Carver was formally elected to the position he was already serving in, that of principal of the institute. The trustees were confident in his abilities as a teacher and what he could do for the school. On May 31, a report was made suggesting a number of possible locations in the town for the institute, and it was decided to have the stock subscribers vote the following month for their choice. The decision was postponed once, but on June 22 the stockholders overwhelmingly voted in favor of three acres of land owned by William Snyder costing \$1500. The land was located at the east end of Main Street on the hill overlooking the town.

The institute at this point became more financially solvent, with 596 shares subscribed for a total of just under \$12,000. But the selling of stock remained a continuing concern for the trustees to insure that enough money was available. An architect in Washington was consulted, although in the end it was left up to Prof. Carver to draft a plan for the institute building along with the estimated cost.

On June 28, there was an extensive debate among the trustees as to whether or not to proceed with the amount of money that had been raised. After more

shares were sold, it was decided to acquire plans and specifications for a building to house 300 students at a cost of no more than \$15,000.

The institute meanwhile concluded the spring term, the first one under Prof. Carver, on the afternoon of June 28 when it held its closing exercises. The students seem to have made good progress, evidenced by the reading of their own compositions in front of teachers, parents and the public. Carver was praised for interesting his pupils in their studies, leading to great improvement in their education. Although he had only been in Bloomsburg for a short time, Henry Carver had won the confidence of the community and would continue to head the institute after it moved to its new location on the hill.

Institute moves to the hill

On July 12, Prof. Carver presented a building design that could be built at an estimated cost of \$14,000. Even though there was still some concern over the expense, the plans were accepted as proposed. Another committee of trustees was formed to find both contractors to construct the building and to work with William Snyder to determine the site of the building on the land he had offered for sale.

The majority report of the committee on location voted to place the building at the top of the hill at the end of Main Street. A minority report of Rev. David J. Waller stated that the location was not acceptable because the site was isolated, the grade of the hill too

steep and the lot was surrounded by two stables, the rear of a tavern and a tannery. After going to the site to view the land, the trustees voted to accept the majority report.

The one major drawback to the selected site was the fact that a tavern, more accurately the Forks Hotel, was in the middle of Main Street next to the present-day location of Town Hall. But the trustees attempted to reassure the public that in the near future the hotel would be removed to open up Main Street to the front of the Institute Building. This hope for a speedy removal was unrealistic, however. The hotel had been remodeled just four years earlier and again in 1866. In May of that year plans had been announced to enlarge it 60 feet and add another story. This did not sound like a building ready to disappear.

By the end of July, Prof. Carver was contracted to erect the institute building, and workmen began to prepare the foundation so bricks could be laid. Workers needed to be paid and supplies purchased, so a notice was put out that the subscribers of the Bloomsburg Literary Institute were requested to pay the first installment of \$5 for each share they owned before August 1. The fourth and final installment would be requested by January 1, 1867.

Work progressed rapidly and within five weeks the foundation walls had gone up and the masons had almost completed their work. The fall session began on September 3 in the Academy Building with a full class and one more instructor. This was Alice Carver, a second daughter of Henry, who became assistant preceptress and teacher of instrumental music. During this term, in addition to the regular classes that had been offered during the spring, Prof. Carver gave a series of lectures on the theory and practice of teaching for anyone who

desired to become a first-class teacher. This was a prelude to the focus that would soon be made on teacher education when the Literary Institute became a state normal school.

In early December, a committee of trustees examined both the finances of the institute and the progress of construction; both were in good order. Another teacher was hired so that Prof. Carver could serve as contractor and personally supervise the work. The last term in the old Academy Building began on January 7, and by February work on the institute building was nearing its end. The floors were down, windows in place and heaters in operation. It was hoped the building would be ready for occupation by the beginning of April, an event everyone looked forward to with great anticipation since this would be a far superior facility to the existing one.

Institute Hall dedicated

By late March the Institute Building was completed and the dedication set for Wednesday afternoon, April 3, 1867. It was a warm and beautiful day, and a procession led by the Bloomsburg Brass Band began at the Academy Building and went east on Third Street toward Market. It then proceeded north to Main and then on to the institute. The doors were unlocked by Leonard B. Rupert, President of the Board of Trustees, after which the faculty, pupils, parents, trustees and citizens of Bloomsburg marched into the hall for a long day of pomp and ceremony. It was so long, in fact, that by late that evening only half the program had been completed. The program finally concluded the following night.

In his history, John G. Freeze mistakenly gave the *continued on next page*

dedication date for Institute (now Carver) Hall as Thursday, April 4, and this error has been repeated ever since. It is clearly shown in a number of contemporary sources that the dedication was held Wednesday, April 3, and the ceremonies ended the following day.

The importance of the new building and Bloomsburg Literary Institute to the history of the town of Bloomsburg can hardly be overestimated. It quite possibly could be the single most defining moment that shaped the path the community has followed since that day. As the *Bloomsburg Democrat* of April 17, 1867 stated:

This is an epoch in the history of Columbia County, and of Bloomsburg in particular, which will not soon pass out of our recollection of local events, for the Institute building itself will be a standing monument of the enterprise of our citizens, and of the energy and business capacity of the projector, Professor Henry Carver

The attraction of the new facility was tremendous, as was reflected in the size of the class for the spring term, growing from 40 pupils the previous year to 180. But additional fundraising was still necessary in order to complete the building. A bell was needed for the cupola, and the cost for one weighing just over 2000 pounds was \$1,115. Even with the existing debt, it took only one week to raise the money by subscription. The bell was ordered in mid-April, arrived on May 24, and was raised into the cupola the next afternoon to ring for



the first time. As a writer declared in *The Columbian*, a great deal of credit had to go to the citizens of Bloomsburg and the surrounding area for displaying a sense of community spirit in supporting this effort. They knew what the school would mean to the town and were willing to make financial sacrifices to see it succeed.

Further money-raising activities were carried out to complete the furnishings of the building. One was in June 1867 when the ladies of Bloomsburg held a week-long strawberry festival at the Literary Institute, where they served ice creams and cakes. It was a great success and the proceeds from the festival were used to pay for chandeliers that had been purchased for the auditorium, as well as hooks for the library, scientific equipment and maps.

The Bloomsburg Literary Institute continued to grow, and in March 1868 the trustees approved a

resolution for the institute to become a state normal school for the purpose of teacher education. This decision both changed the course of the school's history and insured that it would survive. Money was raised to construct a dormitory that was necessary for formal accreditation, and the building was completed early in 1869. On February 8, the trustees wrote to the State Superintendent of Common Schools to say that all was in readiness with the grounds, buildings and school, so a formal inspection could now be conducted. A committee was sent 11 days later and their recommendation was positive. On February 22, 1869, a proclamation officially recognized the school as the Bloomsburg Literary Institute and State Normal School of the Sixth District.

Through the rest of the 19th century and up until the Bloomsburg State Normal School was bought by the state in 1916, it was primarily the responsibility of the Board of Trustees to find funding for buying land and constructing more buildings. The trustees carried out this responsibility with determination and foresight, cementing the prospects for the school's future growth into a university.

But it was the efforts of Henry Carver together with the support of his students and the citizens of the town of Bloomsburg in early 1866 that ultimately allowed the school to succeed. This initial embrace of higher education has benefited the community for the past 135 years.

Enduring Love: Newlyweds learn meaning of "in sickness and in health"

Laura Thompson '99 and Mark Shive '99 were looking forward to getting the keys to their new house in Fredericksburg, VA. They headed out to the closing in separate cars, both packed with stuff to move to their new home later that day.

"We got separated on the way," Mark said, "which is easy to do here, so I got there first. I expected her to pull up in five minutes. The five minutes turned into 10 minutes, then 20 minutes. At 45 minutes I started to panic."

A few blocks away, Laura was driving on a four-lane highway when a 19 year-old woman, trying to make a left-hand turn, pulled out in front of her.

The crash totaled Laura's car. She had burns on her hands from the air bag, but she refused to go to the hospital.

"I was afraid that we wouldn't be able to close on our house," she said, "so the tow truck driver drove me there."

"I was just getting ready to go look for her when the flatbed pulled up," Mark said. "She had burns pretty bad but she looked OK. About 30 minutes later, during the closing, her body turned into a big knot and she had neck and back pain. She had a hard time writing her name."

After the closing, Mark took her to Mary Washington Hospital. She was treated for burns and severe whiplash, given painkillers and muscle relaxants, and then sent home.

In pain, and groggy from the medication, Laura was unable to help Mark move their belongings the next

day. Friends helped while another friend stayed with Laura.

Two weeks later, Laura returned to her job teaching fourth grade, even though she was experiencing some confusion and memory loss problems.

"I thought it was from the meds," Laura said, "so I stopped taking them."

But the problems got worse. The back and neck pain became more severe and spread to her legs. The scope of her intellectual problems hothered her even more.

She'd get lost in her house. She would head for the closet and end up in the bathroom and didn't know why. She would go to take a shower and turn the cold water on instead of the hot.

"Here I was, a college honors student, and I couldn't remember things," she said. "I couldn't teach my students or grade their papers. I couldn't add. I couldn't take my class to lunch because it was a big school, and I wasn't very mobile. My co-workers and aides helped me finish the year."

"Her intellectual problems didn't stick out because of all the physical pain she was in," Mark said.

In June 2000, the doctor said she wasn't healing fast enough and referred Laura to Sheltering Arms Rehabilitation Hospital in Richmond, VA.

Then she was referred to a physiatrist, a physical medicine and rehabilitation specialist in both permanent and temporary disabling conditions.

"She located trigger points, marble sized knots in my muscles that were causing pain and numbness in my arms and legs," Laura said.

For months she received painful cortisone injections to help her cope with the pain.

That same month she developed severe migraines and was referred to a neurologist. But it was the physiatrist who mentioned a possible reason for Laura's problems.

"The doctor mentioned that my brain could have been sloshed and could have cognitive difficulties that are usually resolved in a few months."

And her wedding date was fast approaching.

Laura and Mark discussed the possibility that she wouldn't get back to normal, but that possibility didn't bother Mark.

"When you love someone you, don't leave them four months before the wedding just because they were in an accident," Mark said. "I got upset with friends who asked me about it. It shocks me when they ask."

Laura spent most of the rehearsal dinner lying in a dark room.

"The over stimulation at seeing friends and family, plus the added tasks of practicing and trying to concentrate on what I had to remember the next day, were too much for me," she said.

It was obvious she was going to have trouble walking down the aisle.

"Mark is 6 feet 4 inches tall and I'm 5 feet 2 inches tall and my wedding shoes were two and a half inch heels," Laura said. "My dress had been fitted for heels, but I couldn't wear them,"

Her physical therapist suggested lightweight platform shoes with good support.

"We couldn't find white," Laura said, "only black. My friend helped me spray paint them and put ribbons

and lace on them."

At first Laura thought her new wedding shoes were ugly. But Mark thought they were cute. Despite her disappointment over having to change her shoes, the new ones gave her the support she needed to walk down the aisle.

The wedding was at 6 p.m. and she spent most of the day on a portable traction machine, with a heating pad on her neck.

Because she couldn't stand for long periods, she sat on a padded chair during the ceremony. After the ceremony, Mark asked if he could carry her down the church steps. She said she wanted to walk.

"I walked down very slowly and Mark watched every step to make sure I was OK," Laura said.

They knew that the honeymoon cruise they had planned would be too much for her, so they spent a few days at Ocean City, MD.

Laura and Mark celebrated their first anniversary August 12, 2001.

Laura continues with physical therapy and still experiences many cognitive difficulties. She says she has started to see a vocational rehabilitation counselor to find work she could do a few hours a week from home. She is still unable to drive.

Mark teaches 10th grade world history in the Stafford County (VA) Schools and is an associate scout for the Anaheim Angels Baseball Club Inc.

"We spent it on the beach," she said, "not walking on the boardwalk."
The first nine months of marriage were rough.

"I couldn't even explain to friends how bad things were," Mark said. "I couldn't hug her for nine months because of her neck and back pain. She'd be on the floor crying with pain."

She couldn't even hold a cleaning rag.

"Mark was amazing," Laura said. "He did all the cooking, all the cleaning. He drove me to doctor appointments because I couldn't drive."

The year following the accident, Laura had a doctor appointment every day. Now it's down to three times a week. Juggling a job and taking care of Laura was stressful for Mark.

"There were days when she'd see how stressed I was from working my job and then cooking and cleaning and it would bring her to tears," Mark said. By sitting down and talking it out, they got through it.

"We have good family support," Mark said. "We never could have gotten through this without our parents help—financially and especially emotionally."

Each set of parents took turns helping out on weekends.

Heeding the doctors' advice, Laura returned to work in September.

"I had planned to change schools," she said, "but because of the difficulties, my doctors decided it wouldn't be possible to take on a new job at that time."

Laura decided to teach fifth grade because she would be teaching the same children she had the previous year and thought it would be easier. But things didn't improve.

"I couldn't remember the new kids' names," she said. "I still couldn't grade papers because I couldn't add, and I'd transpose the numbers. I'd set up a parent-teacher conference but when they showed up I'd be surprised. I couldn't remember that I had even talked to them on the phone..."

It was a constant struggle even with her co-workers and aides helping.

"By the end of the day, she would be in such pain she'd be in a wheel chair at work," Mark said.

The migraines got worse. By October she was constantly in pain and nauseated. She had to let the aides take over her class.

"It was easier to try to get through the day then to try to make plans for the substitutes," she said.

By December, the migraines were constant and she couldn't keep food down. She was admitted to the hospital for dehydration and nutrition problems. She was

getting better physically but was beginning to realize the extent of her cognitive difficulties.

She was referred to a clinical psychologist who had training in neuropsychology.

It was she who recognized the signs of a brain injury—post-concussive syndrome. Laura had to take a leave of absence so she could work with her therapist and the doctors.

The accident has completely altered their lives.

"Instead of going out with friends, we're more like hermits," Mark said, explaining what a day is like for Laura.

Everything has to be written down into a planner, which she keeps with her everywhere she goes. It tells her how to get places, when to go and why.

"They call it (her planner) the right side of my brain," she said.

In addition to her notebook, their house has signs to remind her what to do.

"She can't miss these signs," Mark said. "They are big signs—pink, fluorescent signs. You'd have to be blind to miss them."

There is a laminated sign in the shower that details every step: rinse hair, apply shampoo, scrub, rinse out shampoo, apply conditioner, rinse out conditioner. There's a sign that tells how to brush her teeth. Mark said that they are going to tackle the kitchen next.

Laura also has sticky notes and cards posted to tell her what to do, when to do it and how to do it. There are notes on how to do the laundry and how to get dressed (pants go before shoes).

Over stimulation is still a problem. She can't go shopping for groceries. She can't go shopping for clothes. She can't go dancing or do many of the other activities that she once enjoyed.

"If we go out to eat, we need a corner seat in the restaurant, and two hours is her limit in public," Mark said.

"There's too much to look at and it becomes overwhelming," she said.

She can socialize with two people for a couple of hours, but one hour is the maximum she can handle with four people, and she still has to leave the room from time to time to rest. Mark quietly suggests she go upstairs for a little while."

The medical term for Laura's condition is Cognitive Disorder NOS (not otherwise specified). There is a significant drop in her intellectual functioning that is likely to be permanent. While Ritalin helps her focus, she probably will never read or teach again.

"A job is possible," Mark said, "if the conditions are right—night hours in a quiet environment."

In April of this year Laura began tutoring a young child at the Sylvan Learning Center for one hour, twice a week.

"It's part of her therapy," Mark said, "but it could become permanent. They're trying to increase it to three days a week. Her short-term memory is her only problem, her long-term memory is even better than mine."

Therapy includes accepting that their lives are very different and telling people about it instead of trying to hide it.

While Laura and Mark are not the same they were when they became engaged, their love hasn't changed. Indeed, it may have deepened. For it's their love that has brought them out of the depths of despair and given them hope for a better tomorrow.

Friends of The Bloomsburg University Library Association

Since our last report about the programs and activities of the Friends of the Bloomsburg University Library Association, a number of things have taken place.

In July 2001, we reported that because of the generosity of two donors, the Friends were able to provide funding for the purchase two music listening stations. At the same time, the library ordered two additional listening stations. Now, all four listening stations have been installed and are operational. Students may listen to long-playing records, compact disks, and the like without disturbing others nearby. The goal is to have 12 listening stations available for use in the library.

Friends of the Library has authorized funds to purchase the 1930 Census microfilms for the Bloomsburg University library. (There is a period of 72 years between the census year and the release of the data.) This acquisition will encompass Columbia, Luzerne, Lycoming, Montom, Northumberland, Schuylkill, Snyder, Sullivan, and Union Counties.

To help celebrate the Town of Bloomsburg's bicentennial in 2002, the 2001-02 Friends of the Library program series includes four presentations focusing on small towns. Last fall, Faculty Emeritus Turner talked about "Why Is Bloomsburg The Only Town In Pennsylvania?" and Faculty Emeritus Ronald Fendock spoke on the subject of "Old Time Radio: Scary Isn't Just For Halloween." Faculty Emeritus William Aronno, will present the film "The Molly Maguires" on March 3, 2002, at 1 p.m. The concluding program, April 7, 2002, at 2 p.m., will be Professor Andy Waskie in the persona of General George Meade talking about the Civil War. All programs are held in the Gathering Room of the Harvey A. Andruss Library and are open to the public.

In March, the Friends will hold a Used Book Sale to raise money to support library projects. The sale last year was very successful, and members are hoping for a similar result this year. If you wish to join the Friends or have comments, please communicate with us at 570-389-4343.

Foundation exec Ianiero resigns

Anthony M. Ianiero, Executive Director of The Bloomsburg University Foundation Inc., resigned in July to become Executive Vice President for Operations at the Bloomsburg Medical Corporation.

Ianiero joined the university in 1984 to begin a development program and to reactivate the foundation board. Three successful fundraising campaigns were initiated during his tenure:

- *The Trust for Generations* (\$3.5 million for the library, scholarships, and academic equipment);

- *A Treasury of Ideas* (\$3.375 million for library construction); and

- *New Challenges, New Opportunities: The Campaign for Bloomsburg University* (\$11 million - increased to \$15 million - for the Student Services Center, scholarships, and special projects).

Under Ianiero's leadership approximately \$35 million was raised from private sources, and the assets of the foundation were built to more than \$9.9 million.

Player-of-the-Year honored by Husky Club

Bloomsburg's Husky Club of presented former softball player Erica Miller with a commemorative ring at its November board meeting. The ring was given to Miller in honor of her being named National Division II Softball Player of the Year for the 2001 season. In addition to Player-of-the-Year, Miller was the Division II softball nominee for the Honda-Broncevic Award, symbolizing the nation's top female athlete. During the 2001 season, Miller hit .477 with 17 homers and 52 RBI. She had 20 doubles, 144 total bases and a .966 slugging percentage. Miller helped lead the Huskies to a 44-7 record, the PSAC championship, and a fourth place at the NCAA Division II national championships.

Parents' Phonothon tops \$80,000

An excellent university doesn't just provide a top-notch education.

Today's modern college must produce well-rounded students who not only achieve passing grades in required courses, but also a solid foundation in extracurricular areas.

That's where *New Challenges, New Opportunities: The Campaign for Bloomsburg University* comes in. The campaign supports scholarships for students who otherwise cannot afford a quality education, and it helps to fund faculty-student research programs.

Additionally, this campaign helped defray the cost of the renovation of the old library into a new Student Services Center. This modern facility brings together different aspects of student life, including classrooms, computer labs,

conference rooms, a cafe, and more.

The 2001 Parents' Fund is an integral part of the campaign that allows parents to support the school — while their children attend the school.

For one month student development officers contact parents every Sunday through Thursday from 6 to 9 p.m. for the Parents' Phonothon. Each evening, approximately 15 student officers hope to talk with at least 25 parents. Altogether, 45 students, two student supervisors, and a development advisor coordinate information and paperwork — and make sure those conducting the phonothon represent the best Bloomsburg University has to offer.

Exceeding the goal of \$80,000, parents pledged \$81,341 during the 2001 phonothon. Most of the funds were designated for the Student Services Center.

"The feeling one gets when a parent makes a donation to the school is unexplainable," said Alexie Kupka '01, a student development officer.

"To know they are supporting not just any student, but their own children is pretty amazing."

Lori Vetter '02 added, "knowing that the money these parents give is going right to Bloomsburg University programs makes this worthwhile. Each successful call brings the university one step closer to reaching its goal."

New Scholarships

James E. Cole Scholarship — A professor in the department of biology and allied health from 1968 to 2001, this scholarship was established in Jim's honor by his friends and former students.

Michael R. Clovas Scholarship — Established by Michael R. Clovas, Class of 1986, this scholarship will be awarded to a member of the football team from the Lehigh Valley area.

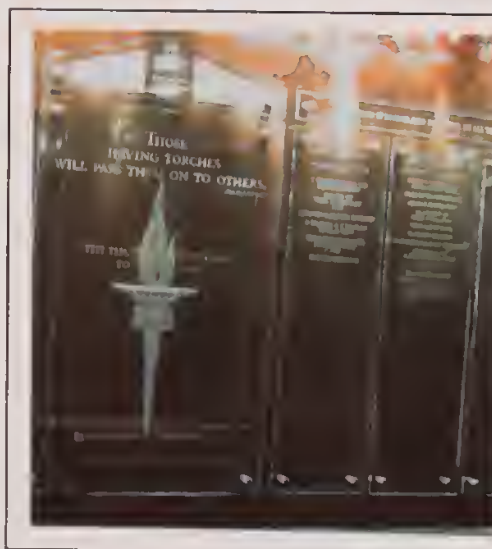

Teachers continue in their craft—in Romania

JoAnne and Joanne have spent the past two summers in Deva, Romania teaching conversational English to students ages 12 to 15 at the Andrei Muresanu School. Their teaching experiences have been sponsored by Teachers for Tomorrow, an organization that sends teaching teams to areas of Romania and India each year.

JoAnne Growney retired from Bloomsburg University in 1997 where she taught math for 28 years. She is currently completing a master of fine arts degree in creative writing (poetry) at Hunter College, CUNY. Joanne Shaffer Pileski '64, retired from the Bloomsburg School District after 31 years as an elementary teacher. She is currently a member of the BU Alumni Board of Directors.

Excerpts from Joanne Pileski's 2001 journal tell of their experiences:

Sunday, July 8

When our plane landed in Timisoara, Romania, my luggage was searched. An airport official insisted that I open the manila envelopes containing the letters that my granddaughter's third grade class had written for Romanian students. As last year, it is such a relief to leave that heavily guarded airport.

The three-hour ride from the airport to Deva was nostalgic. The countryside is so beautiful. Women are still leading cows from the pasture and chickens and geese are still on the front lawns. We passed countless horse drawn hay wagons.

So much of Romania reminds me of life in the States in the late '30s and '40s.

Tuesday, July 10

We arrived at school yesterday to a greeting that was overwhelming! Students brought flowers, gifts and stood when we entered the classroom. Many students have returned to our classes from last year and seemed so excited that we have come back to Romania.

The pattern after class is the same as last year. We are taken to the home of a different student each day for a huge meal. (I compare it to a Thanksgiving Dinner and we have a meal of this size each day of the week!!) Along with the meal, each family likes to make a toast with their favorite home brew called *tuica*. This is a

brandy made from plums or apples—very powerful stuff and they like to toast more than once. Today our host made a lengthy toast that our translator told us meant if we did not drink it in one gulp, evil spirits would enter the home. Since I can only handle a sip at a time, I am fearful that many evil spirits are alive and well in the Romanian homes that I am visiting.

Wednesday, July 11

We have established a schedule for a typical day:

Rise and shine at 6:00 a.m.

Breakfast with our hostess, Ana. Today's breakfast was spaghetti noodles in warm milk with honey.

Walk 20 minutes to school

Teach two classes of English

Go to the school's computer lab to help students learn to use the internet which has been provided by funds from JoAnne Growney and friends.

Spend time with a student's family. This is time usually spent in their home and on a planned excursion to a local attraction or business.

More *tuica* at Ana's

Bed around 10:00 p.m. followed by weird dreams due to the *tuica*!!

Thursday, July 12

During our visits to the homes, we hear many different political views. Romania still does not belong to NATO or the European Union (EU). They would benefit economically if accepted, however, they are not being considered since they do not meet the requirements. Ironically, the requirements are a sound economy, low unemployment, better roads, etc. Inflation is worse this year than last. The exchange is 28,000 lei to \$1. Last year it was 20,000 lei to \$1. Last year the interest rate on loans was 80%; this year it has gone down to 60%. Most people say that they do not trust the banks and would not borrow even if they could. There still seems to be a profound mistrust in the infrastructure of the government and talk of bribing officials for jobs. We still hear people say they miss the security of communism.

One host was not eager to belong to the EU and

was also critical of the Teachers for Tomorrow program. He said he did not want everyone in his country speaking English and eating hamburgers at McDonald's. He felt the traditions of his country were threatened.

He mentioned a theory that I have also observed: the world seems to be more homogenized. I went to Poland and expected to see and hear polka music and instead only heard the Backstreet Boys. And when I was in Beijing, we ate at the Hard Rock Cafe. It is sad to think that these changes from tradition are often a result of being too materialistic.

Friday, July 13

Today in class the students asked me about Los Angeles and Las Vegas. These are places that they

have heard about on television. Our discussion continued about their impressions of the United States. Comments ranged from: everyone is rich in the US, to there is much crime and the people are always under pressure. All these thoughts are from the influence of TV.

Saturday, July 14

We spent the weekend in the hills of Transylvania. It was quite a relief from the heat, humidity, pollution and the dogs of Deva. Did I tell you about the Romanian dogs? Every village and city in Romania has hundreds of ownerless dogs that roam the streets and bark all night. A pack of five or six dogs of different breeds will travel together. If another dog enters their territory, they fight like crazy.

The dogs are not dangerous, but are a dirty

nuisance. However, the people in the blocks don't mind at all and actually feed them. Ana even sends her leftovers to school with us to give the dogs around the building. We heard that in Bucharest the government is poisoning the dogs and also taking beggars out of the city in order to attract international investments. These decisions have not yet reached Deva.

When we returned to the city, it was hotter than when we left! What a night! Of course there is no air conditioning. The dogs barked all night and the Romanian roosters don't wait until dawn, they crow all night. The windows have no screens and I was a feast for mosquitoes and black flies. I am reminded of a Bill Bryson quote: "I am not saying all this to make you sorry for me, though sympathy is always welcome!"

Monday, July 16

When we go to the homes of students, I start to

understand why I come to this country. When I see the pride in the parents' faces that their children are speaking English, it makes this teaching experience so rewarding.

Last night we went to the home of a wonderful student and the poverty in which he was living made me very sad. However, when we were about to leave, his father said that they were so sorry that they could not give us more—but what they gave us came from their hearts.

One day last week, a grandmother of one of the students actually cried as she hugged and thanked us for teaching her granddaughter English. (At least this is the explanation our translator gave us for her tears. Not knowing the language ourselves keeps us humble and we survive with a sense of humor.)

Two Grads on Guam

The Island of Guam, "where America's day begins," is also where the day begins for two Bloomsburg alumnae. Kelly A. Williams-Sitkowski '87 and Marybeth Duffin-Torres '79 and '80 live and work on the small island in the Southwest Pacific, a long way from their roots in Pennsylvania and their days at BU. Guam is an American Territory located in the Marianas Islands chain, located about three hours flight time south of Japan.

Kelly, a Lieutenant Commander in the U.S. Navy, is an audiologist at the U.S. Naval Hospital where she has worked for three and a half years. Marybeth has worked in speech pathology for 12 years for the Guam Department of Education. Both are graduates of BU's Communication Disorders Department and they found each other purely by accident!

Small world

One day Marybeth received a call at work from Kelly, who identified herself as an audiologist at Naval Hospital. Kelly had tested a high school student and wanted to know if the department of education was aware of the student's special aural rehabilitation needs. They found themselves talking for

quite a while.

"We just hit it off right away," says Marybeth, "even talking about getting a group of professionals in related fields together for networking." The conversation eventually turned to the topics of hometowns and educational backgrounds.

"Imagine our surprise when we each named our alma mater! We just couldn't believe the coincidence," said Marybeth. "Talk about a small world: two BU Communication Disorders grads, both from Pennsylvania. Needless to say, we found that we had a lot in common and knew that we had to meet as soon as we could."

A lunch date quickly followed and, of course, they had lots to talk about. Kelly and Marybeth shared memories of Bloomsburg, their professors, how they had come to Guam, their jobs, how much they enjoyed island life and a lot more.

That was several years ago, and their friendship has grown. The alums have a chance to share work-related opportunities as well as get together outside of work to enjoy the joys of living in a tropical paradise.

"We are thankful that we found out about each other soon after Kelly's arrival on the island. Although we were seven years apart at BU, we share lots of memories of those

days," said Marybeth. "Now we enjoy every chance we get to make new memories."

Marybeth's story

After earning a master's degree in 1980, Marybeth worked for eight years as a speech pathologist in the North Penn School District as an employee of the Montgomery County Intermediate Unit. While she found the work satisfying, something told her that there was a special opportunity out there. She decided to check out job options around the country and overseas.

Although she was concentrating her search on the West Coast, she happened to spot a small ad in the back of a professional journal for speech pathologists in Guam. This was the chance she had been looking for!

"I had heard about Guam while growing up, since my father was stationed there during World War II," said Marybeth. "I started doing some research and found the island and its history intriguing. The more I read, the more I knew that I had to give it a try."

"I knew it was a big leap of faith—leaving family and friends, a job I really liked, the place I had called home all of my life. But I also knew that if I didn't do it then, I probably would never do it."

That was August 1988. Marybeth knew that she couldn't wait an entire school year to make the move or she would lose her nerve. She started the ball rolling immediately by applying for the position. Her goal was to be in Guam for the start of the second semester. To her surprise she found an

enormous amount of support from family, friends and coworkers when she shared her goals with them.

"I guess I thought a lot of people would try to talk me out of it, saying it was a crazy idea, a big risk, too far away, things like that," she said. "What I found was that they, too, had at one time thought about moving to a far off land, teaching overseas or joining the Peace Corps. Most of them told me they hadn't the courage to follow through and that they had always been sorry. That was just the incentive I needed."

"I left in January 1989 with two suitcases and a lot of hopes and dreams."

Marybeth had planned to stay just a year while on leave of absence from her job in Pennsylvania. But one year turned into two, and two turned into twelve.

"It was the best decision I have ever made," she said. "It has changed my life in so many positive ways. When I think of the opportunities I would have missed, the people I would not have met, the places I would not have traveled to, I just can't imagine it."

She's been fortunate to have traveled to places that would have seemed out of reach in her undergraduate days: Hawaii, Japan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, Singapore, Hong Kong and the islands of Saipan, Yap, Pohnpei and Palau.

Marybeth began as a staff speech pathologist and is now program coordinator for the speech therapy department, supervising 20 pathologists. She is also affiliated with the University of Guam's outreach programs, doing consultation, assessment and training in the Islands of Micronesia.

The challenges are many and the joys even greater. Marybeth says the people of Guam and Micronesia are among the most beautiful in spirit as any she has ever met. She enjoys her work immensely and hopes to spend more years here, further developing programs and continuing work on other Micronesian Islands.

Marybeth met her husband, Victor, while living on Guam. He is a native and of Chamorro descent. He holds a bachelor's in anthropology and a master's in public administration. He works for the government of Guam as a historian in the Historic Preservation Division. They have been married for eight years.

Victor is an avid surfer, windsurfer and fisherman. Marybeth loves the beach, especially snorkeling and scuba diving.

Marybeth is able to get back to Pennsylvania twice a year, once in the summer and again in November following a

professional conference. Three flights and 20 hours of flying time is grueling but it continues to be worth it to be able to visit home and maintain ties with family and friends. Marybeth says she has the best of both worlds: maintaining home connections on both sides of the globe.

Kelly's story

Kelly worked as an audiologist in the private sector following a master's degree in 1987. After a few years, she felt that a change was in order. She started exploring the possibility of a career with the military. Her research resulted in her enlistment in the U.S. Navy in 1992.

Assignments have resulted in positions in Naval hospitals in Florida, Japan and now, Guam. She is currently assigned as a clinical audiologist at the Guam U.S. Naval Hospital. As the only audiologist at the hospital, her days are busy with administrative duties as well as providing patient care.

"While the pace is hectic, I love my job and am proud to serve in the United States Military," says Kelly. "I am stationed here with my family, which includes my husband, Ken, and my five year old son, Kenneth Colin (K.C.), who was born during my duty time in Japan."

"We love the Island of Guam, taking advantage of every opportunity to enjoy its warm, tropical temperatures. Every weekend finds us enjoying the beach, snorkeling, swimming, searching for shells and exploring the island's many exciting sites. We have also had the opportunity to travel to lots of exciting locations, including Hong Kong, Hawaii, Rota, Palau and Saipan."

Kelly and her family manage to travel home to Pennsylvania, but not as often as they would like. Her next assignment may possibly be on the East Coast, which will provide more opportunities to visit home and catch up with family and friends.

"I agree with Marybeth that Guam is a fantastic place to live and practice audiology," says Kelly. "So if you have an adventurous spirit and want a unique experience, consider being a Navy audiologist or working overseas where you will make a difference!"

Thinking back to their days at BU, sometimes it seems like only yesterday, sometimes it seems like a lifetime ago. Fond memories of people, places and events remain strong and will stay with Kelly and Marybeth, no matter where they travel. Both feel very lucky to have had the opportunity to experience different cultures and to have met one another.

"It's one thing to tell other BU alumni about our island home, but even better to actually share that journey with one another right here," they say. "It's nice to know that you can travel as far away as somewhere like Guam and still have the possibility of running into another BU grad."

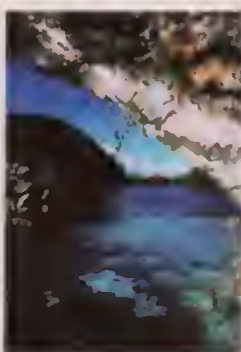

Where America's Day Begins

Guam, in the time zone 15 hours ahead of the U.S. East Coast, is the first American community to greet each new day.

It's the largest and southern most island of the Mariana Island chain, approximately 3,700 miles west-southwest of Honolulu. The western most possession of the U.S., it is a self-governing territory.



Guam's location 900 miles north of the equator gives it a tropical climate with daily temperatures averaging 81 degrees. The island covers an area of approximately 212 square miles; it's about 30 miles long and 4 to 9 miles wide.

The island is made up of volcanic hills, limestone plateaus with steep cliffs and a narrow coastal shelf. It is lush and green with many exotic flowers and delicious fruits.

Guam's main industry is tourism, welcoming more than a million visitors a year from Japan, Korea, China, the Philippines, Australia, the U.S. Mainland and other islands of Micronesia. Beaches abound and the water is both warm and crystal clear with an average temperature of 80 degrees. Scuba diving, snorkeling, windsurfing, jet skiing and fishing are popular.

Known as the flying judge

Although presiding over a case in another part of the state might seem like a hothouse for someone else in his position, Northumberland County Senior Judge Feudale thinks the long commute is the best part. **Barry F. Feudale '72** uses a non-traditional means of transportation, a Cessna Skyhawk, his single-engine plane.

"I'm known as the flying judge," he said, although he prefers the designation circuit rider. (Is that because he sometimes travels by Harley Davidson Super Glide?)

As Senior Judge he's appointed by the Supreme Court to handle a variety of cases ranging from the routine to the complex and controversial. He's often assigned to fill in where there is a vacancy due to retirement, resignation, illness or vacation. In many instances he's assigned due to recusal of the bench.

Barry has set a personal goal of hearing a case in each of Pennsylvania's 67 counties and so far he's served in 55. His goal may be hard to meet, though, because some counties have their own senior judge and don't need one to fly in. But it's a fun goal to work toward.

"As I travel around the state, I keep a little diary of observations," he said. He takes aerial photos of the courthouses and rates them on architecture. He makes a note of the quality of the pizza in town. "Nothing mean-spirited, of course. I'm just waiting to see which is my favorite county," he joked.

Flying to and from work has a big advantage when hearing cases that don't take all day. "I'm out and back before my kids get home from school," Barry said.

However, there are logistical problems. He can't land his plane next to the courthouse and he doesn't have a car when he lands. If the courthouse is less than three miles from the airport, he walks. If it's farther, he uses a courtesy car, seeks a ride from another pilot or asks someone from the courthouse to pick him up in exchange for a ride in the plane. There's usually always someone willing to take advantage of that trade!

He also sits in his home county one week a month handling all the cases involving child abuse/

dependency and termination of parental rights.

In addition, Barry teaches courses for the Pennsylvania Bar Institute Training Program. In the past year, he's lectured on child abuse and neglect as well as the role of guardians for children.

Barry enlisted in the Navy and served in Vietnam after graduation from Our Lady of Lourdes High School, Shamokin, in 1964. He attended Shippensburg for a year and then graduated from Bloomsburg with a bachelor's in education/comprehensive social studies in 1972.

"I was a commuter, the guy sitting in the back of the classroom shivering and/or drenched," quipped Barry. His transportation at that time was a 305cc Honda Dream motorcycle.

After graduation he substituted in Shamokin schools, instructed inmates in basic education at Allenwood Prison Camp and worked three and a half years for the Northumberland County Child Welfare Agency. While investigating and testifying in cases of physical and sexual abuse for the county, he earned 27 credits toward his master's degree in social work at Marywood College.

At age 30, he attended the University of Bridgeport (now Quinnipiac) School of Law and graduated in the top 10% of his class. In 1989, the University of Bridgeport honored him with their Distinguished Alumni Award.

After law school, he returned to Northumberland County as law clerk to President Judge Peter Krehl. He next served as solicitor of Northumberland County Children and Youth Services. While engaged in general law practice in Shamokin from 1981 to 1987, he also served as Chief Public Defender of Northumberland County (1984-87).

Barry was elected to a ten-year term as judge on the Northumberland County Court of Common Pleas and was sworn in on January 4, 1988. He was appointed president judge by the PA Supreme Court in January 1996 and senior judge in January 1998. He is currently the youngest senior judge in the state.

Barry is a licensed pilot and a certified scuba diver. He also enjoys hot air ballooning, white water rafting, rappelling, skydiving and camping with his family.

His association with Bloomsburg University continues through the Quest outdoor experiential program including some high altitude mountain climbing in the Himalayas and Andes. In early January, he and five friends trekked and climbed in Ecuador.

Barry is an active volunteer as room father, guest lecturer and fill-in teacher in the school his youngest son, Michael, attends. Most popular with the students is his sharing of stories and photos from his many trips, even tape recordings of wild animal sounds! Eight-year-old, Michael thinks his dad is the all-time best, not because of Barry's prestigious judicial position, of course, but because of those monkey calls and other stuff on tape!

Barry's older son, Matthew, 16, has accompanied him on some of his trekking. This semester they took their slide show, "Mexico, Monarchs and Matthew, Too" to Kiwanis Club and local elementary and high schools.

Barry and his wife, Violette, live in Coal Township with their two sons.

Who remembers?

◆ In Noetling Hall the stairway to the second floor was wooden and its banister was a lovely temptation Miss Carpenter was ever watchful, but still there were many stolen slides, probably by some college students as well as by boys and maybe girls.

◆ Each week students made a weekly trek to the library on the second floor of Waller Hall. There we saw Miss Mason behind the counter, with her pencil-cum dating stamp behind her ear and two perfect circles of very red rouge on her cheeks. What threats of expulsion and other dire penalties were uttered to any potential little naise-makers!

◆ A battered old Gulbransen studio piano from the gym was moved outside for the maypole winding each May Day. Gerald Hartman, a BSTC alum and teacher in the Catawissa High School, was imported to play it because none of Mrs. Miller's pupils could keep time to suit Miss McCammon. The music was always the same every year, for every class, "Amaryllis." We rehearsed at recess time when we would rather have been playing games.

Bloomsburg Literary Institute provided space for a model school in the original dormitory building from the time of its completion in 1869 until it burned in 1875.

The catalog for 1868-1869 states that the model school course was designed to "afford those attending it as pupils the very best instruction, and to place before the normals (Institute students) correct models of methods of instruction and school management as was practicable."

The first elementary school erected on the campus was a one-story, white clapboard building known as Hemlock Hall. It was located north of Carver Hall on the present site of the Schuylkill (formerly West) Hall, and built in 1875 soon after the fire.

In 1886 Normal Hall, later known as

Noetling Hall, was built to house the model school. The two-story, 26-room, brick building included 20 recitation rooms, each accommodating five or six children, the student teacher and an observer.

William B. Suthill who served the college for many years at both instructional and administrative levels observed, "It never seemed to occur to the faculty or trustees that student teaching in a regular classroom under normal conditions may have been a better plan."

From 1930 until 1967, Ben Franklin served as the laboratory school for student teachers. Here BSTC and then BSC students practiced their future craft in larger rooms with classes of 26 to 29 students and an elementary department faculty member.

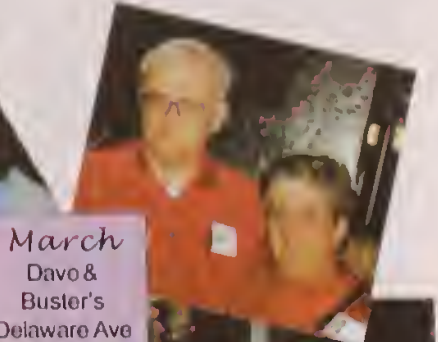

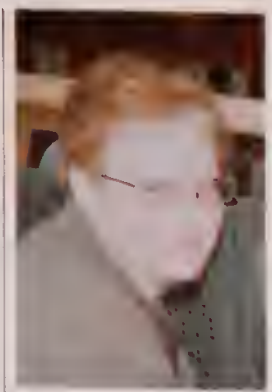

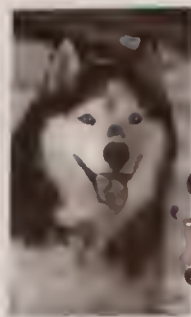

The spring sports season at Bloomsburg was another successful one for the Huskies.

Softball

In softball, the Huskies finished tied for third at the NCAA championships with a record of 44-8. Under coach Jan Hutchinson, they won both the PSAC championship and the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional titles to earn a trip to the national championship round in Salem, VA. In Salem, the Huskies won their opening round game over Kennesaw State before falling to St. Mary's of Texas. Bloomsburg then came back and beat Barry University before dropping a tough, 1-0, to Grand Valley State on a hit in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Bloomsburg had three players named All-Americans with Jess Shnyder picking up first team honors, Lisa Mull second team honors and Kerri Cooper, third team. Cooper was also named the PSAC Eastern Division Athlete of the Year.

Baseball

In baseball, the Huskies finished with a record of 24-24, an improvement of eight wins from the previous year. At one point in the season the Huskies won 13 of 14 games and won the opening-season Apprentice College Tournament. Earning post-season honors for the Huskies were Jason Helcoski and Brian Sperling. The two were named second team All-Region selections by the coaches of the North Atlantic Region.

Lacrosse

In lacrosse, the Huskies finished with a record of 10-4, losing in the PSAC title game 12-11 to West Chester on a late goal. After starting the season with a record of 2-2, the Huskies rattled off seven wins in a row at one point in the season to reach the PSAC title game. Despite the loss, two players were named All-American for the year. Katie Maelean was a first team selection while goalie Yshonda Wisner was a second team selection.

Men's Tennis

The men's tennis team finished the year with a record of 12-6. The Huskies finished second at the PSAC championships, dropping a tough 5-3 decision to Kutztown. The team advanced to the NCAA championships and lost a heart-breaker, 5-4, to Assumption College. Several members of the team earned All-PSAC honors, while freshman Mike McGrath was named the East Region Player to Watch by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Women's Tennis

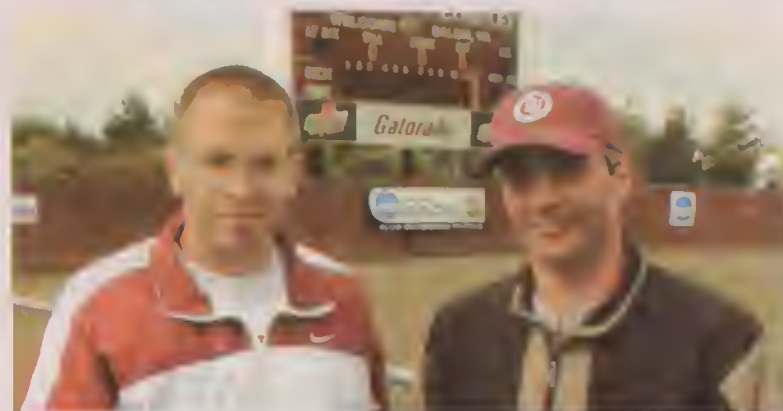
The women's tennis team posted a record of 11-8 on the year and finished second at the PSAC championships before winning the NCAA East region title and advancing to the national championship round. At the NCAA championships the Huskies lost their first round match to Barry University. Junior Erin Bartsch was named the PSAC Athlete of the Year in women's tennis, while Julie Bramante, was named the Rookie of the Year in the East Region by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Track

In track, the Huskies had an outstanding freshman, Danielle Kramer, who turned in a terrific season. In her first season at Bloomsburg, Kramer took part in nine regular season indoor and outdoor meets and had eight wins and one second in distances ranging from 1500 to 10,000. At the prestigious Penn Relays in late April, Kramer ran the 10,000 meter race in a personal-best time of 36:04, the second fastest time in Division II this season. At the Susquehanna Invitational Kramer set a stadium record at 10,000 meters by winning in a time of 36:49, then set a new meet record at 5,000 meters (17:49) at the Christopher Newport Invitational. At the PSAC championships Kramer finished second at 5,000 meters in a time of 17:39, new personal record. Kramer qualified for the NCAA championships and finished 14th at 10,000 meters.

In lacrosse, the Huskies finished with a record of 10-4, losing in the PSAC title game 12-11 to West Chester on a late goal. After starting the season with a record of 2-2, the Huskies rattled off seven wins in a row at one point in the season to reach the PSAC title game. Despite the loss, two players were named All-American for the year. Katie Maclean was a first team selection while goalie Yshonda Wisher was a second team selection.

Men's Tennis

The men's tennis team finished the year with a record of 12-6. The Huskies finished second at the PSAC championships, dropping a tough 5-3 decision to Kutztown. The team advanced to the NCAA championships and lost a heart-breaker, 5-4, to Assumption College. Several members of the team earned All-PSAC honors, while freshman Mike McGrath was named the East Region Player to Watch by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Women's Tennis

The women's tennis team posted a record of 11-8 on the year and finished second at the PSAC championships before winning the NCAA East region title and advancing to the national championship round. At the NCAA championships the Huskies lost their first round match to Barry University. Junior Erin Bartsch was named the PSAC Athlete of the Year in women's tennis, while Julie Bramante, was named the Rookie of the Year in the East Region by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Track

In track, the Huskies had an outstanding freshman, Danielle Kramer, who turned in a terrific season. In her first season at Bloomsburg, Kramer took part in nine regular season indoor and outdoor meets and had eight wins and one second in distances ranging from 1500 to 10,000. At the prestigious Penn Relays in late April, Kramer ran the 10,000 meter race in a personal-best time of 36:04, the second fastest time in Division II this season. At the Susquehanna Invitational Kramer set a stadium record at 10,000 meters by winning in a time of 36:49, then set a new meet record at 5,000 meters (17:49) at the Christopher Newport Invitational. At the PSAC championships Kramer finished second at 5,000 meters in a time of 17:39, new personal record. Kramer qualified for the NCAA championships and finished 14th at 10,000 meters.

Bloomsburg University To Induct

The 21st Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame class will be inducted Friday, October 4, during Homecoming Weekend. The induction of five graduates will bring to 93 the number of members in the Bloomsburg Athletic Hall of Fame.

Softball and field hockey star **Laurie Snyder '84**, track and field star **Jim Davis '72**, baseball and basketball great **Don Butler '53**, women's swimming star **Beth Roeder-Zimmerman '88** and football and baseball standout **Line Welby '75** will earn the university's highest honor based on their contributions to Bloomsburg athletics.

Laurie Snyder '84

Snyder was a three-time All-American for the Huskies' field hockey team and a four-year letter-winner in softball.

During her field hockey career, Snyder had 28 shutouts and led the Huskies to two national championships.

She posted a 0.72 goals against average in 1981 to lead the Huskies to the AIAW national championship. She also posted 10 shutouts that season and added 12 in 1983 as the Huskies won their first NCAA title. She finished her career with 23 shutouts.

In softball, Snyder played for four years for the Huskies, helping the team to an overall record of 114-21 and, in 1983

and 1984, the first two PSAC championships ever held.

Snyder was also the Huskies starting first baseman on the 1982 AIAW national championship team, the first-ever national title won at Bloomsburg.

As a freshman she led Bloomsburg in hitting with a .395 average.

Snyder was also a standout in the classroom and was selected as an Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America in 1983.

Jim Davis '72

As a standout on the track and field team Davis won the PSAC title in the 100-yard dash in 1971 and 1972. In the 220-yard event, Davis was second in 1971 and took first in 1972. At the 1972 PSAC championships, Davis won the award for most points scored at the championships (18).

During his four years at Bloomsburg he helped the Huskies post a dual meet record of 44-3 as well as finishing third at the PSAC championships in 1971 and second in 1972.

Davis was a three-year captain for the Huskies and earned the Underclassmen of the Year honor in 1970 and the Robert B. Redman Award as the Outstanding Senior Athlete in 1972. He also selected to the Outstanding College Athletes of America and Who's Who Among American Universities and Colleges.

Our veterans committee met on Alumni Day, May 4, and discussed a lengthy agenda:

- Our veteran memorial scholarship fund needs your support. To be a self-sustaining award, \$24,000 is needed. To date \$14,000 has been contributed. - Thanks to our Alumni Association for funding the new sidewalk connecting the Alumni House to the veterans memorial garden.
- Plans are in place to replace the diseased and overgrown shrubbery around the memorial garden.
- We have parade flags of the Marine Corps and the Coast Guard. Navy, Air Force and Army flags will also be procured. Metal ground standards will be placed around the veterans monument so that the flags can be displayed at formal programs and for patriotic holidays.

- A letter will be sent at the appropriate time to relatives of deceased BU veterans. They will be asked to complete a veteran's bio form to be included in our book of service at the Alumni House.
- The WWI veterans' monument, long a topic in this column and the object of our committee efforts, will be moved to the grounds of the Alumni House and finally being given proper recognition. Unknown to us, students of Dr. Nancy Ford, when pursuing a class project, located the monument and were appalled by the neglected site. They have 800-1,000 signatures on a petition to restore and sanctify the site through a rededication effort. Plans are in progress to achieve that goal through fundraising projects. Our Veterans committee supports their efforts and commends them for their show of dedication, patriotism and commitment to a worthwhile cause. More on this topic as work progresses.

The veterans committee has received official notice that BU has been designated by the US Defense Department as a commemorative community to honor our Korean veterans during 2003, the 50th anniversary of the end of the Korean War. Materials, flags, pins, etc., will be part of our Alumni Day 2003 program in May. Letters will be going out to BU Korean veterans this summer. More information will be forthcoming to all alumni as plans progress.

At the time of his graduation, Davis held three individual and three relay records.

Following graduation, Davis coached girl's track at Cedar Cliff High School from 1975 to 1996. His team won two conference titles and he coached numerous district and state place winners.

Don Butler '53

Butler was a four-year letter-winner for the Huskies in baseball and a three-time letter-winner in basketball.

As a member of the baseball team, Butler finished his career with a batting average of .407 while hitting 14 homers and driving in 53 runs. He helped the team to a four-year record of 41-9.

Butler hit safely in 18 straight games at one point of his career, covering parts of three seasons. During the course of his streak he had two or more hits 15 times and had a hit in 42 of his 50 games he played in during his career. Butler was also an excellent outfielder making just one error during his career.

As a member of the basketball Butler scored 348 points in his career and was the team's second leading scorer during the 1950-51 season when he averaged 10.6 points per game.

Following graduation, Butler played in the farm system of the then Boston Braves and the Chicago White Sox. He also played baseball in St. Thomas, Ontario, Canada, for five years.



Roeder-Zimmerman

Roeder-Zimmerman '88

Roeder-Zimmerman, known as Beth Roeder during her career with the Huskies, was a seven-time All-American for the women's swimming team at Bloomsburg.

She earned four All-American honors in individual events and three as a member of a relay team. She also earned five honorable mention All-American awards at the NCAA championships.

Roeder's highest individual finish at the NCAA championships was second in the 200 fly in 1988 in a school-record time of 2:04.40, a mark that still stands today. She also finished fourth as a junior in 1987 in the 100 fly in 58.18 seconds.

At the PSAC championships, Roeder took home three individual titles and one relay championship in her career and helped the Huskies to four, second-place finishes at the PSAC championships.

At the time of her graduation, Roeder held two individual records (100 and 200 fly) and was part of the record-holding 400-medley relay team.

Line Welles '75

Welles was a four-year letter-winner in baseball and a three-time letter-winner in football for the Huskies. He was named the Underclassmen Athlete of the Year as a junior and won the Redman Award as the school's top senior athlete in 1975.

A two-time All-PSAC selection in both football and baseball, Welles led the NCAA Division III in punting in

1973 with a mark of 43.8 yards. That is still good for the 12th best mark in the division since 1973, a span of 29 years.

Welles was also an all-conference selection as a defensive back and is the co-holder of the single-season interception mark at Bloomsburg with 10 in 1974.

On the baseball diamond, Welles hit .398 for his career with a homer and 27 RBI. In 1973 and 1974 he was named first team All-PSAC and was a second team selection in 1975 after missing eight games due to injury. He was team MVP in both 1973 and 1975.

Following his playing days at Bloomsburg, Welles punted and played defensive back for the Philadelphia Bell of the World Football League, where he averaged 38.6 yards per kick in the 1975 season.

Welles is in his second year as the head football coach at Wyalusing High School after spending 21 years as an assistant coach.
