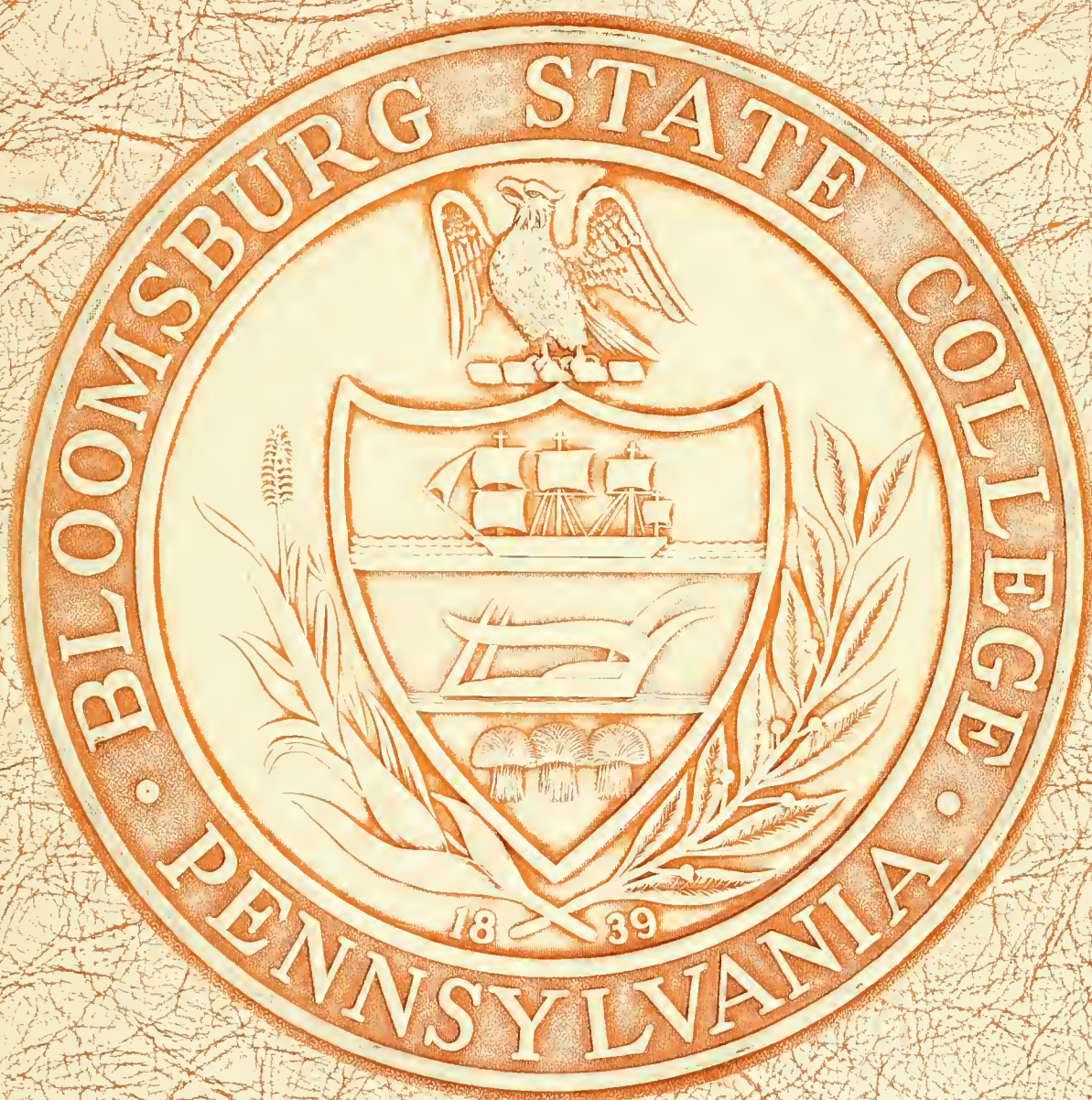

There have been many tangible changes on the campus of what is now Bloomsburg State College since we entered it four years ago.

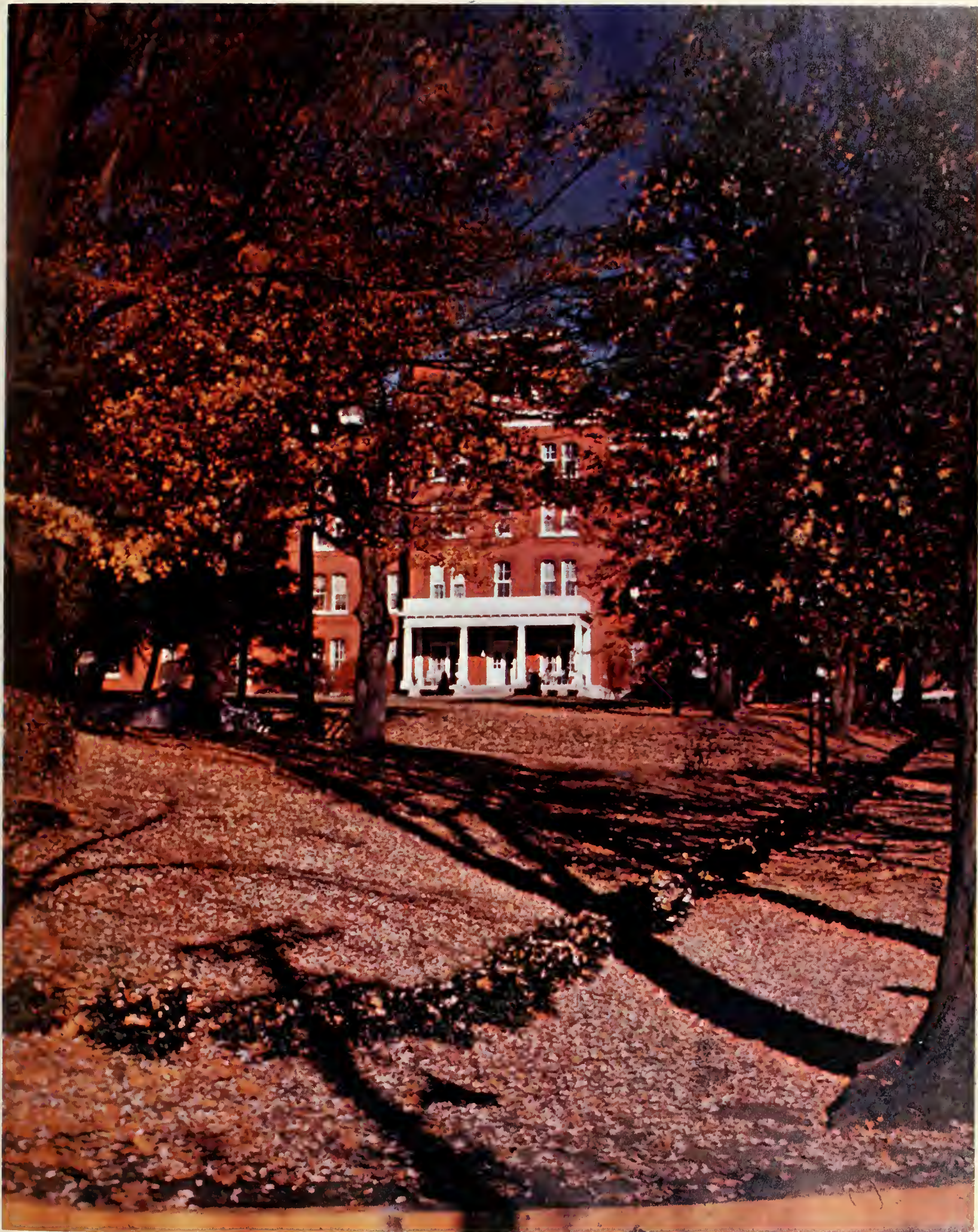
The 1961 OBITER provides a pictorial record of those changes.

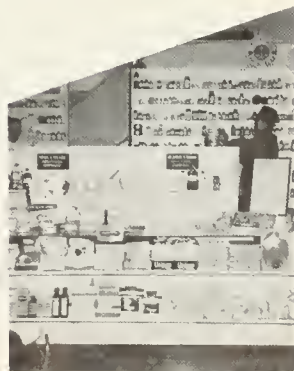

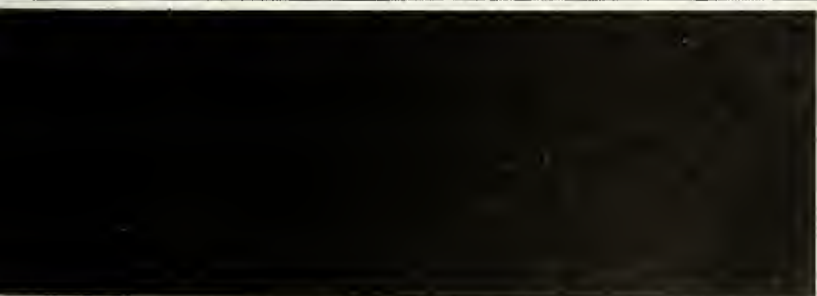
## Night

This magazine is published only once a year, but the enjoyment one finds in this magazine is long remembered.



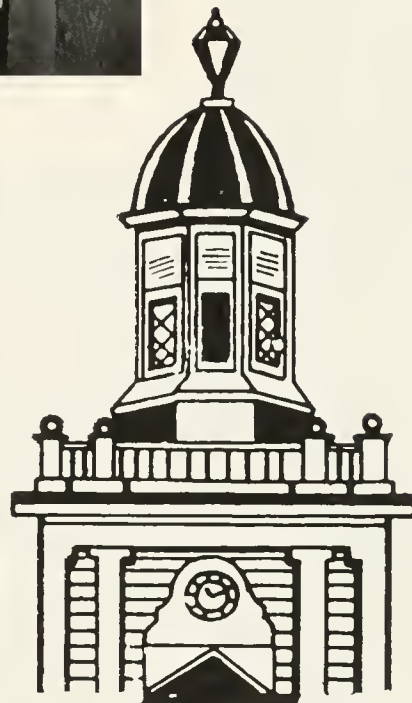

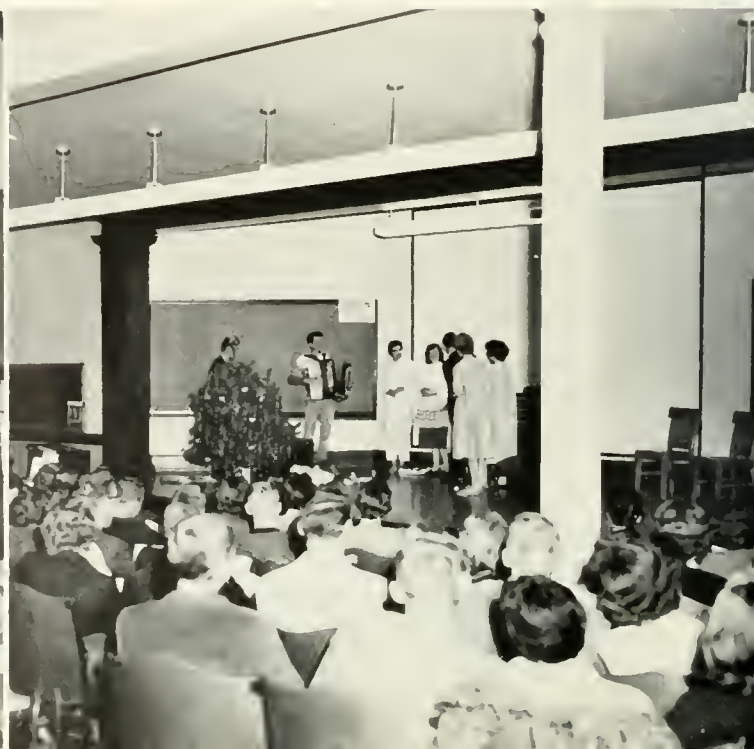

This year the club has participated in a number of novice debates and has functioned as host to the Kings College Debating Team.





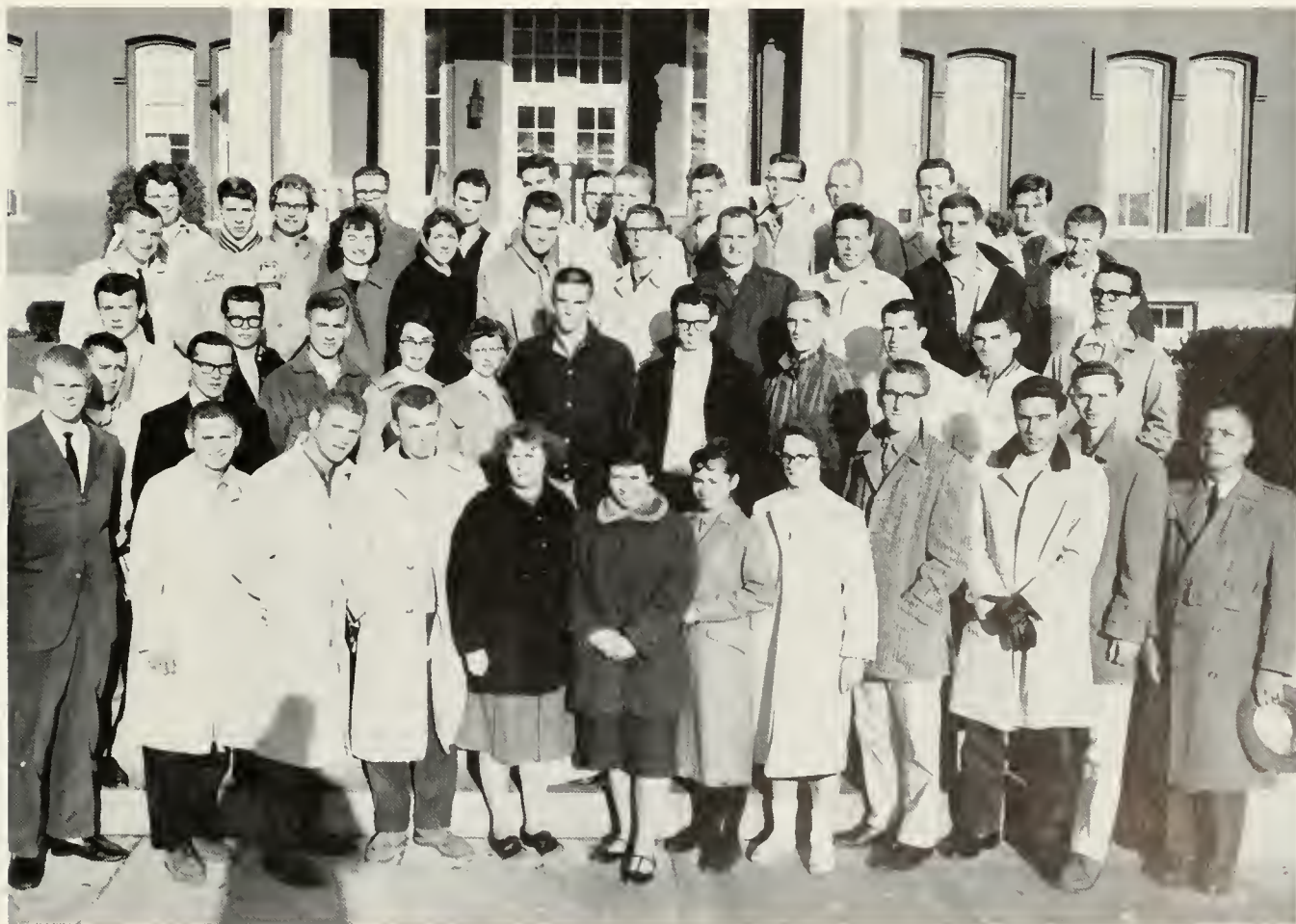

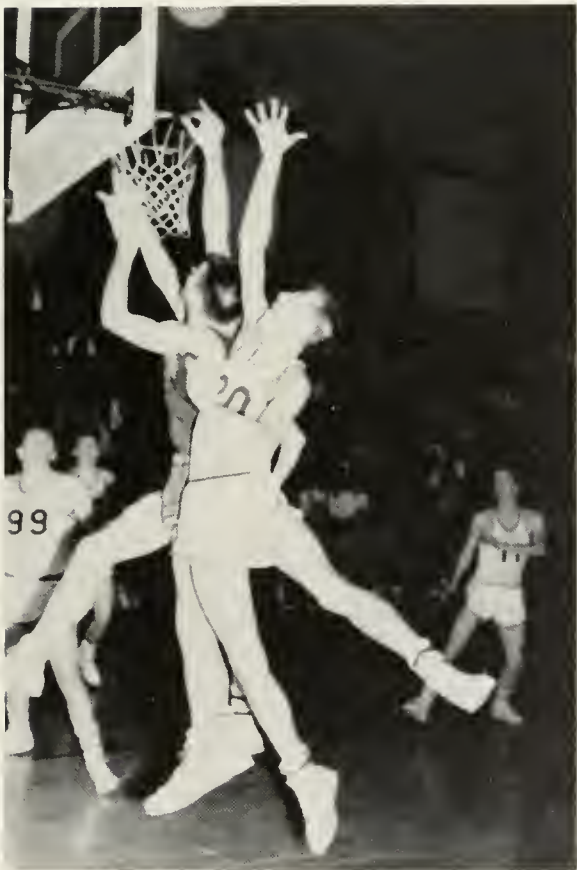

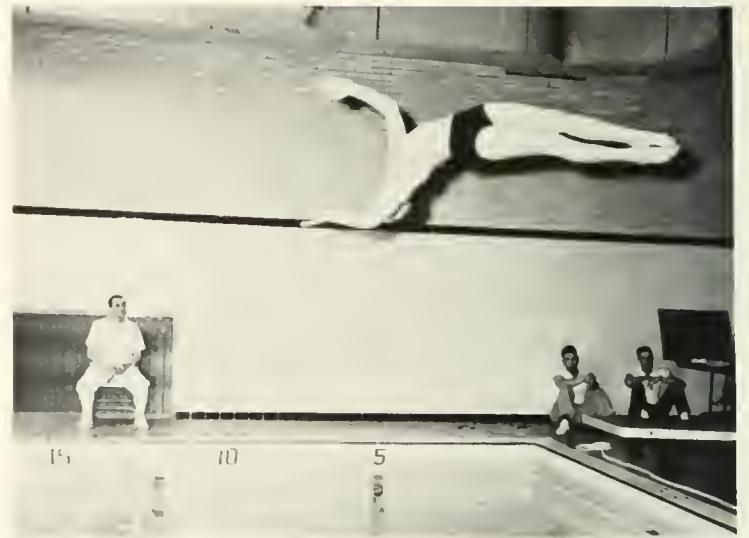
