



The contract for the first two projects mentioned above has been awarded by the General State Authority.

Graduate Program Inaugurated at Bloomsburg June 15, 1961

Bloomsburg State College has taken another step forward in expanding its services to public school teachers with the inauguration of a program of graduate studies. On June 9, 1960, the State Council of Education of Pennsylvania authorized the College to develop graduate programs in Business Education and Elementary Education and to confer the Master of Education degree. Approval has recently been granted for graduate offerings in special education and speech correction. Graduate courses were first offered during the summer term, 1961, with a complete schedule of classes available in each of the summer sessions. During the current academic year, classes are scheduled on Saturday mornings to permit teachers in-service to continue their program of advanced study without interference with normal professional duties. The pleasant atmosphere found on the campus, the well-trained faculty available for graduate instruction, and the excellent classroom and library facilities make the Bloomsburg State College ideal for persons desiring to further their professional growth through graduate study.

The program of graduate studies at Bloomsburg is designed for persons who wish to:

- 1. Secure permanent certification by earning credit in graduate courses;
- 2. Become eligible for additional salary increments in those school systems that have adopted salary schedules recognizing graduate credit earned by their faculty members; and/or
- 3. Earn the Master of Education degree (and secure permanent certification simultaneously) in:

Business Education

Elementary Education

Special Education for the Mentally Retarded

Speech Correction

Although the program is now limited to elementary school teachers, teachers of business subjects, teachers of the educable mentally retarded, and teachers of the speech and hearing handicapped, careful consideration is being given to the development of curriculums in English and social studies. With the passage of time, graduate programs in other subject areas will undoubtedly be added to the offerings of the College.

Community Government Association

The Community Government Association co-operates with the responsible authorities in promoting personal and group responsibility in regulating the affairs of all students. Upon entering college, all students and faculty members automatically become members of the Association. The meetings of the Association are held during assembly periods upon call by the President of the Association, or by petition of twenty or more members. The legislative, executive, and judicial body of the Association is the College Council. College Council meets on the second and fourth Monday of each month to carry out the responsible legislation of the Association. Matters of extreme importance are submitted to the Association by referendum. The membership of College Council is composed of the officers of the Association, the Presidents of each class, a man and woman representative from each class, the Presidents of the two resident associations and two non-resident associations, the editor of the college newspaper, the Dean of Students—adviser, Dean of Instruction, the Dean of Instruction, the Dean of Women, the Dean of Men, and the Director of Public Relations.

The Community Government Association standing Committees assist the officers of C.G.A in making it a functioning, as well as a formulation organization. It was found that College Council directed most of its efforts in the area of all-college functions. With the aid of excellent committee work, we strengthened and spread our services into all areas of college life. 
The Huskies ended their season on an even keel as the Golden Rams racked up a decisive victory at Mt. Olympus.
