F O R E W O R D

In its one hundred twenty-five years of growth, Bloomsburg State College has undergone many changes. The Class of 1964 has been witness to much of this progress. This year's graduating class came to Bloomsburg in its first year as a State College. They leave Bloomsburg in its first year as a Liberal Arts College.

But much more has changed at Bloomsburg than just the curricular offerings. To those of us who leave Bloomsburg this year, there has been one ever-present reminder of the dynamic spirit which has characterized our college since its beginnings as an Academy in 1839. 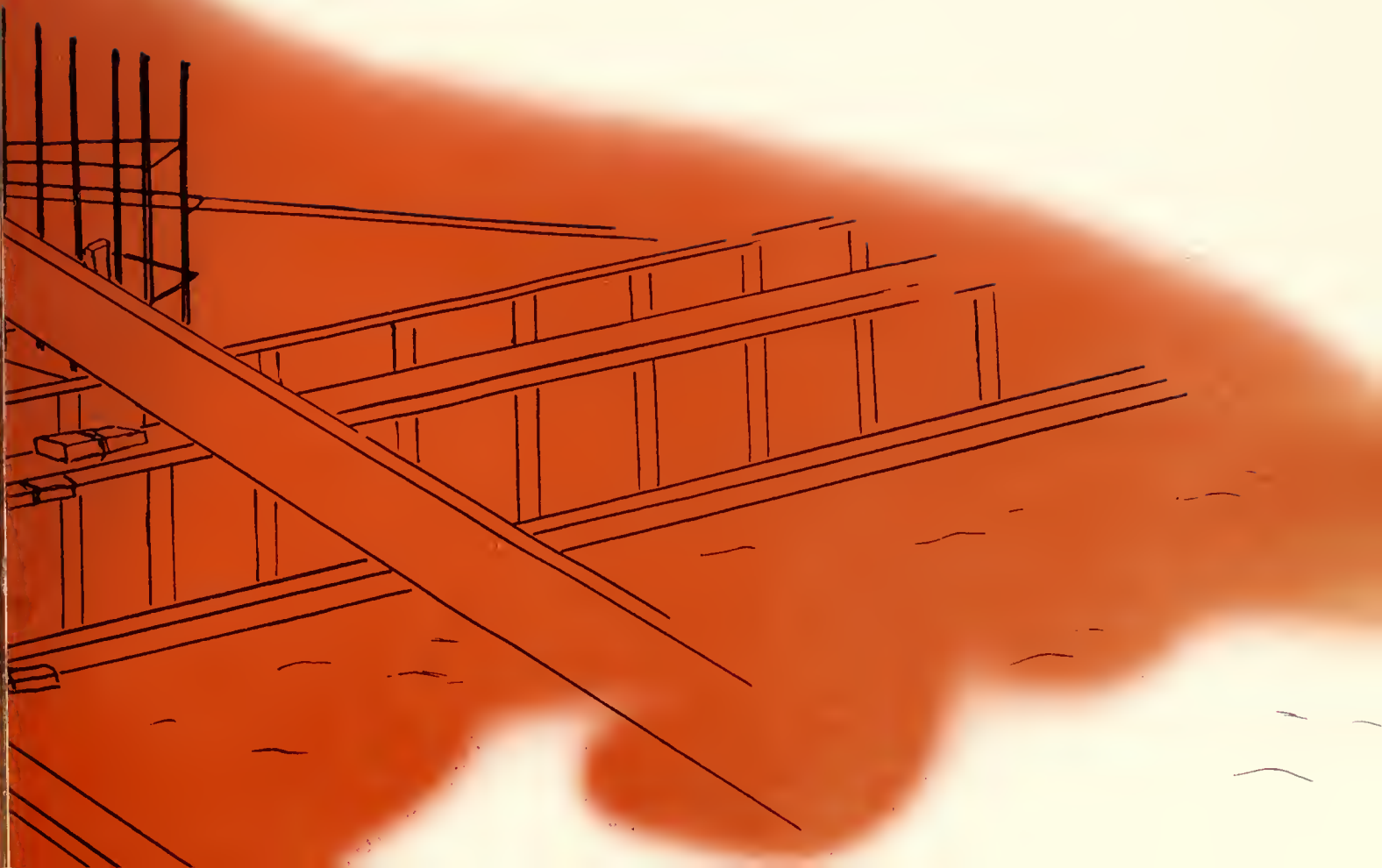

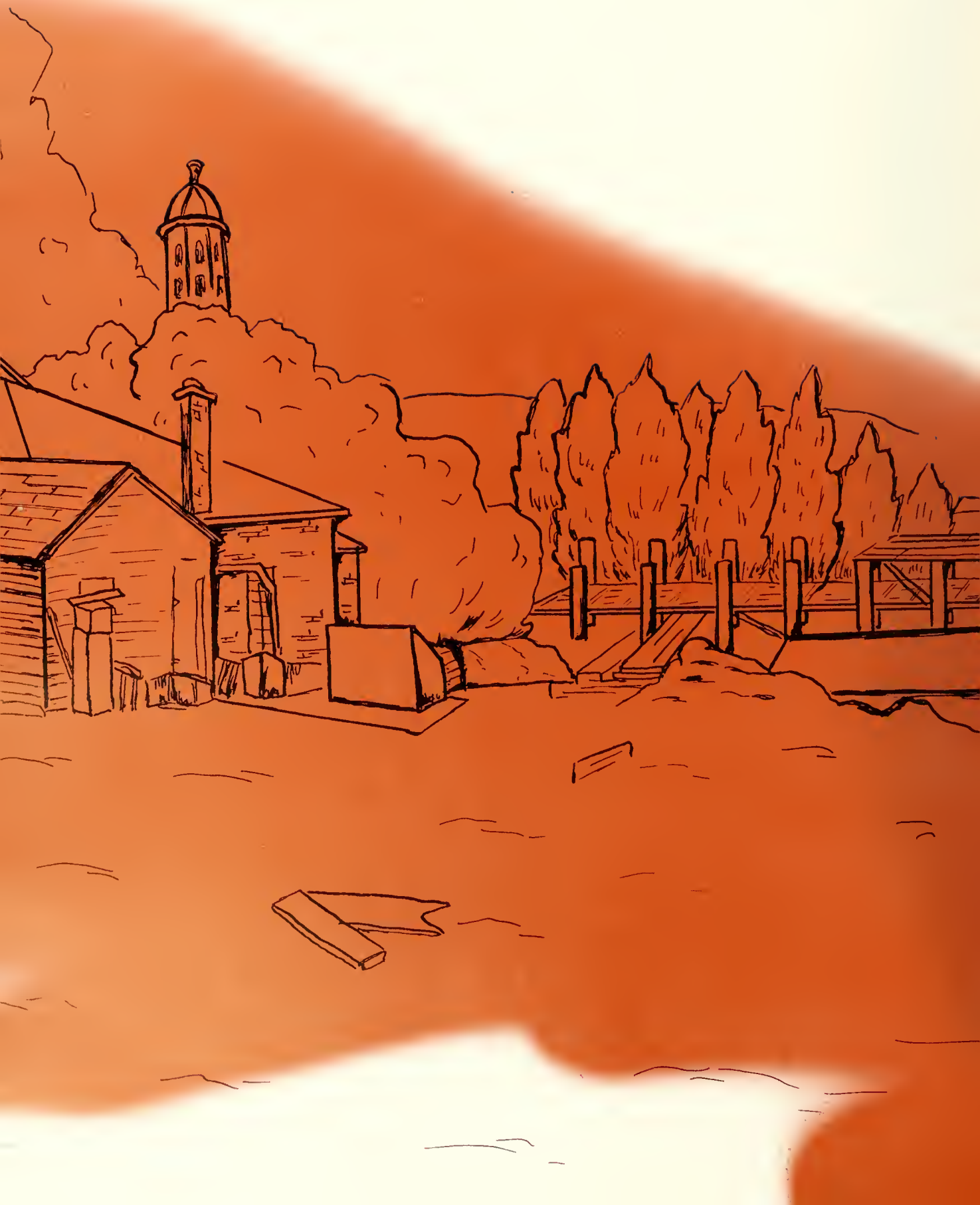

Just the same . . .

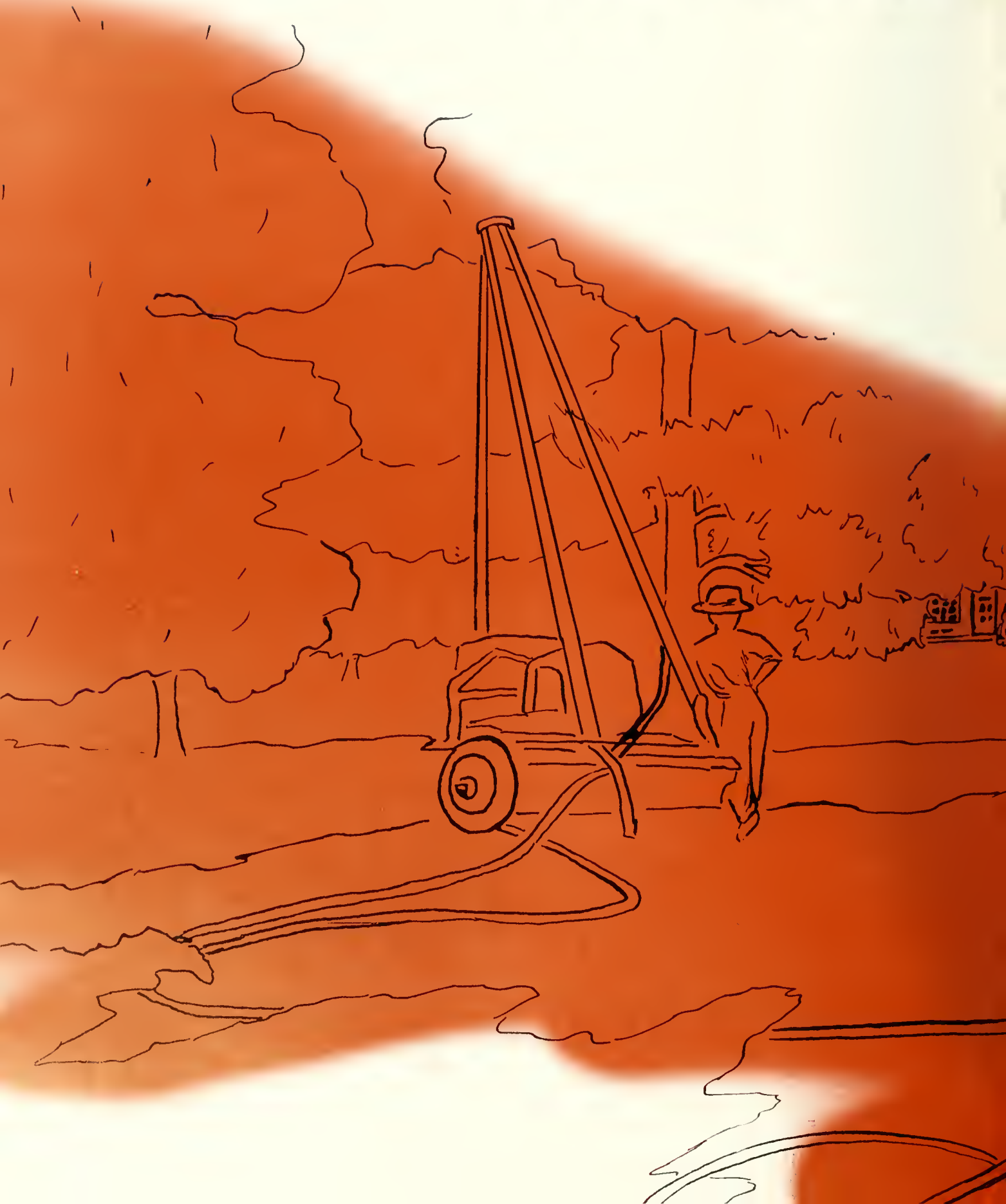


To the Members of the Senior Class:

COLLEGE WINS 3/M ASSISTANCE GRANT TO EDUCATION AWARD

Bloomsburg State College was one of five schools in Eastern Pennsylvania to receive the grant based on proposals for use of the overhead projector by faculty. Shown in the accompanying photo are, left to right, Mr. Jack D. Saunderson, Sales Representative of Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Company; Dean John A. Hoey, who accepted the award in the name of the college; Mr. J. M. Bergin, Sales Supervisor of MMM; and Mr. Thaddeus Pirowski, Audio-visual Education professor, who acted as chairman of the committee preparing the material which was submitted to an impartial board of judges. The college was deeply honored by being selected as one of the recipients of this award, the monetary value of which is in excess of \$3,000.

With the rapid growth of the college in all fields of activity, certain academic areas have felt the impact of recent changes in curricular growth and development. In order to take advantage of rapidly-improving techniques in educational television, the faculty is engaged in a continuing study of closed-circuit television as a means of improving classroom instruction. Sutliff Hall, the newest classroom building of the campus, is completely wired for closed-circuit TV, while other new buildings are being planned with similar facilities.

There has been a phenomenal increase in interest in modern foreign languages—German, French, and Spanish. The installation of a foreign language laboratory and a well-prepared, enthusiastic faculty in the Department of Foreign Languages have given impetus to an emphasis that has been long overdue in teacher education. Three summer study tours to Germany, France, and Spain will highlight the innovations that have marked the growth of this academic department.

Beginning in September 1965, the new Elementary Education Curriculum Materials Center in the Benjamin Franklin Laboratory School will be available for use. Plans for the center have been formulated and include a textbook library, displays of up-to-date instructional materials used in the language arts, arithmetic, elementary science, and the social studies, and research reports in the area of curriculum and instructional activities.

In addition to these specific improvements, the present teacher education curriculum is constantly subject to review

and evaluation. The College will be visited by a team from the Department of Public Instruction early in the fall of 1964 for the purpose of evaluating the revised curriculums in teacher education for automatic program approval. Special emphasis will be placed on recent improvements in offerings in Science, Mathematics, Foreign Languages, and Fine Arts.

The programs in the Arts and Sciences, which were inaugurated in September 1963, are also being restudied by special faculty committees which have been appointed by the Dean of Instruction. These new offerings will be subjected to a critical evaluation by the Middle States Association of Schools and Colleges in 1966, and the College hopes that all necessary changes and refinements will be effected by that time.

Increased faculty interest has been evidenced in the area of the newer techniques in classroom instruction. This was evidenced recently when the College was awarded a 3-M AGE Grant of \$3000 for the purchase of overhead projectors and equipment for the preparation of visual materials for classroom instruction.

With the tremendous growth and expansion of enrollment in the Division of Graduate Studies, the College has extended its academic services to include graduate programs in Business Education, Elementary Education, Special Education for the Mentally Retarded, Speech Correction, and English. The newly-created State Board of Education will soon consider an application to add Social Studies, including Geography, to the list of graduate studies,

GRADUATE STUDIES

On June 9, 1960, the State Council of Education of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania authorized the Bloomsburg State College to inaugurate a program of graduate studies and to confer the Master of Education degree. Graduate courses for students desiring to secure the Master of Education degree in Business Education, Elementary Education, English, Speech Correction, and Special Education for the Mentally Retarded are now offered by the College. The program is operative within the framework of policies and curriculums developed and approved by the Graduate Council of the College.

Courses are offered during summer sessions and the academic year for both full and part-time students desiring to improve their professional competence. There are now over four hundred students enrolled in the program which began in the summer of 1961.

The dedication of the College to the success of this endeavor is but another step in the continuing effort to serve the academic community and to improve the status of the teaching profession.

The need for professional education for teachers extending beyond the undergraduate level has long been recognized by educational leaders throughout the United States. In recent years the Pennsylvania State Council of Education has taken positive action to improve instruction in public schools by upgrading certification requirements for teachers. This action indicates a clear recognition by the State Council of the need for training beyond the Bachelor's degree. Mandated salary schedules which provide salary differentials for holders of Master's degrees in the form of higher maximum salaries give additional recognition of the value of graduate study.

The program of graduate studies at Bloomsburg State College has as its primary purpose the increasing of the competency of teachers in Pennsylvania. To achieve this purpose, the following specific objectives, as they relate to the individual student, have been developed.

1. To provide opportunity for advanced study in a selected field of specialization.
2. To provide an opportunity for developing a better understanding of the culture of our society—a society in which the teacher is expected to assume an increasingly important role.
3. To encourage independent thought and initiative and develop problem-solving ability.
4. To provide an incentive for continuing professional growth.
5. To develop a basic understanding of research methods and techniques so that reports of research in the field of education may be correctly interpreted and evaluated.
6. To develop a more comprehensive understanding of the teaching and learning processes.

For nearly a century one of the chief objectives of this institution has continued to be the preparation of teachers and professional personnel for public school careers. However, in 1960 our name was changed from Bloomsburg State Teachers College to Bloomsburg State College; in 1961 the college was authorized by an Act of the General Assembly to formulate academic curriculums in the Arts and Sciences leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts; and on May 3, 1962, the college was granted approval by the State Council of Education to proceed with programs for this degree during the academic year 1963-64 that is now drawing to a close.

The first year of the Arts and Sciences has been a very encouraging one. More than eighty students enrolled during the first semester, and the second semester saw an increase of approximately ten per cent. Within a very few years there will no doubt be several hundred students enrolled in the program.

Many "Liberal Arts" students are conscious of the necessity of this type of education as preparatory to the graduate degrees required for careers in college and university teaching; others are enrolled in the program in preparation for medical, law, and other professional schools; and still other students are working towards the B.A. as a terminal degree which will stand them in good stead for entering directly into careers in business, industry, and research.

In the Bachelor of Arts curriculum it is possible to major in any one of a wide variety of subjects within one of three general areas of concentration:

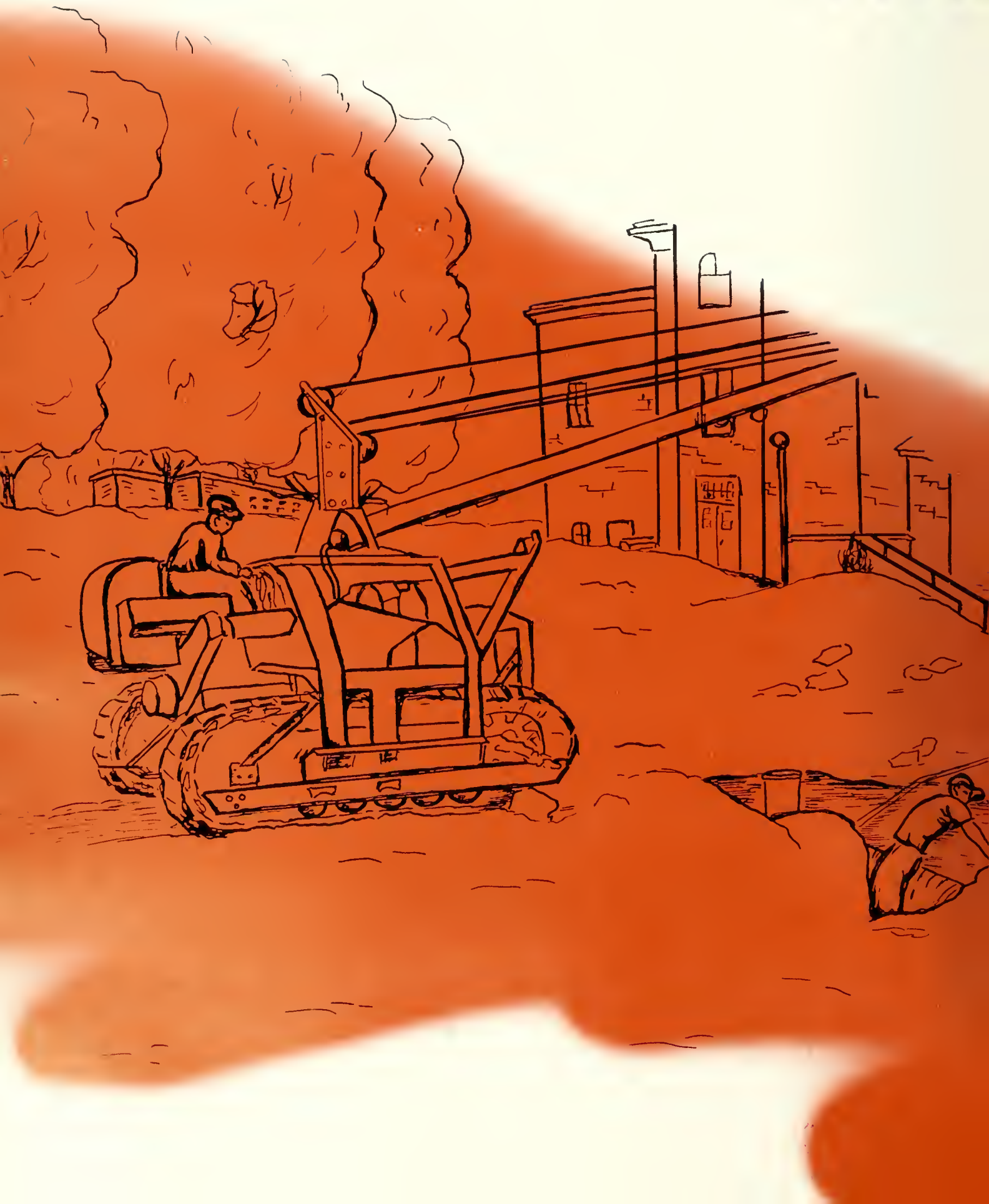

Students concentrating in the Natural Science area are required to take two years of mathematics (through Differential Calculus) and two years of a laboratory science, but students concentrating in the Humanities or Social Sciences areas are required to take only one year of mathematics and one year of a laboratory science. Foreign language through the sophomore level is required of all students in the program.

As head of the Arts and Sciences division, I wish to express my personal congratulations to you pioneering "Liberal Arts" students who have made the grade this year. 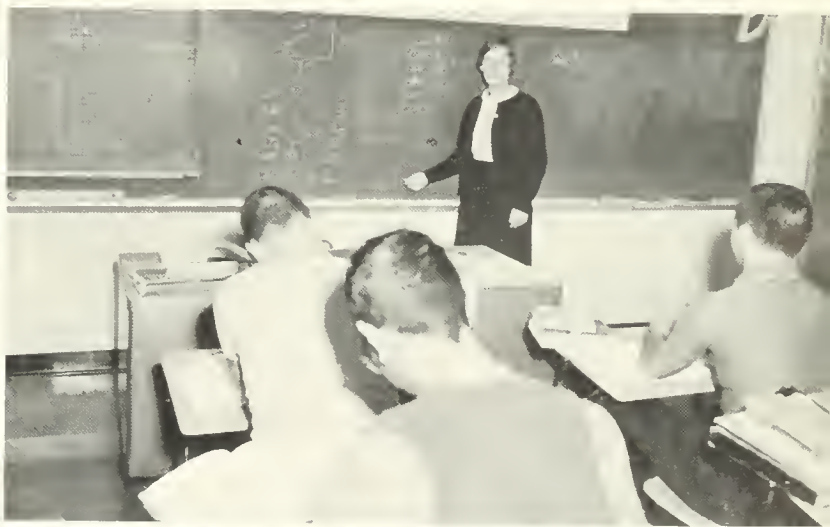

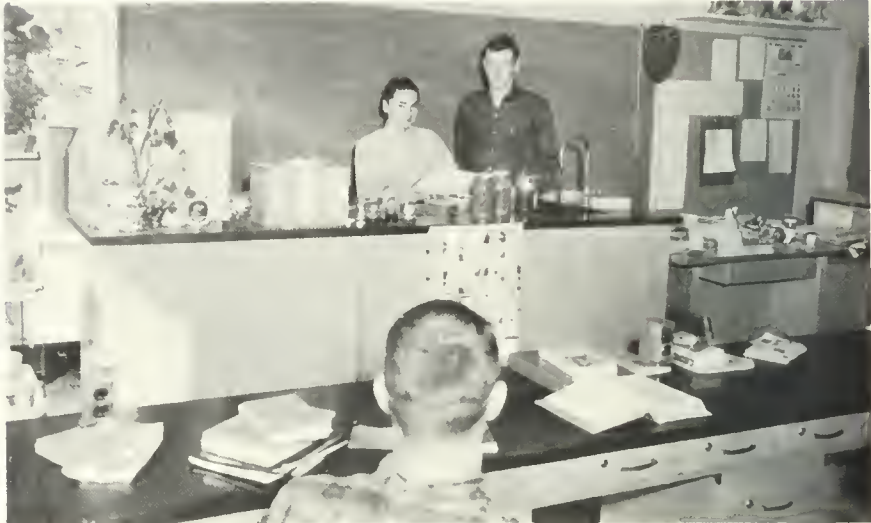

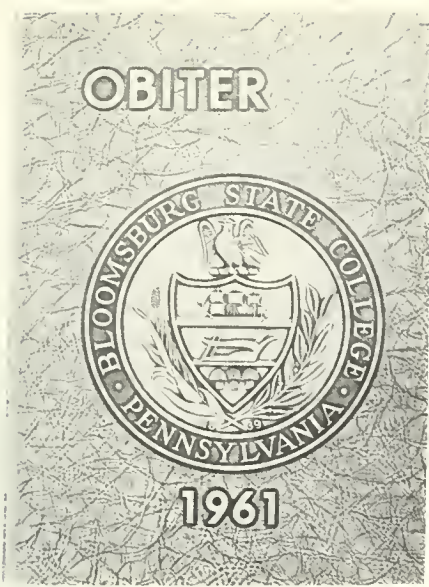

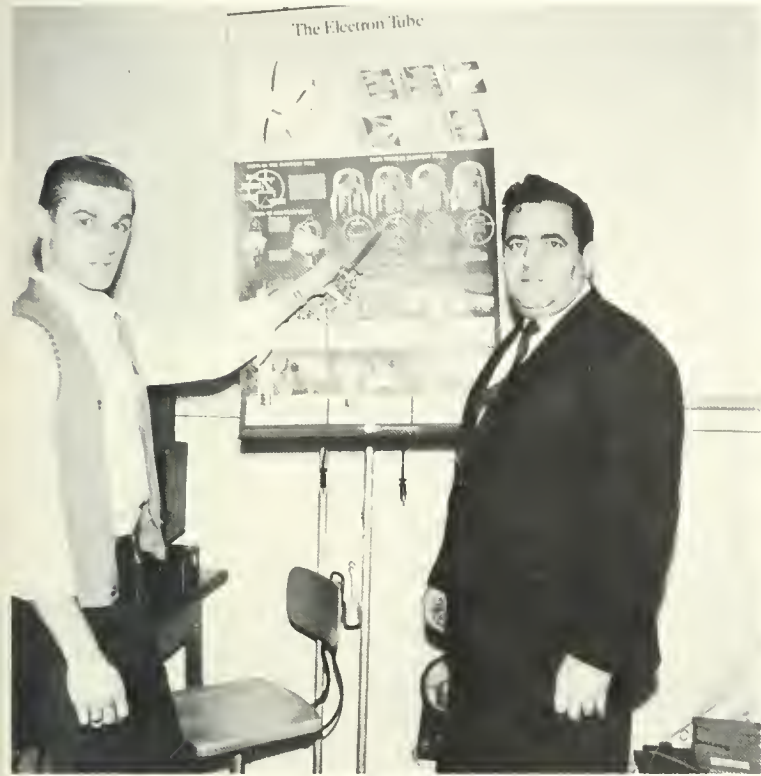

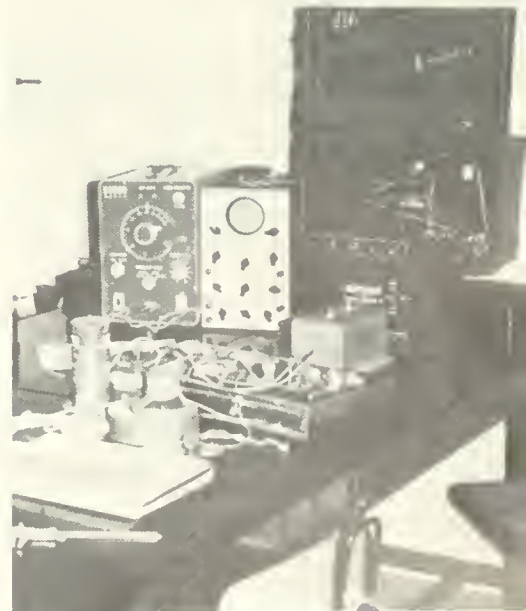

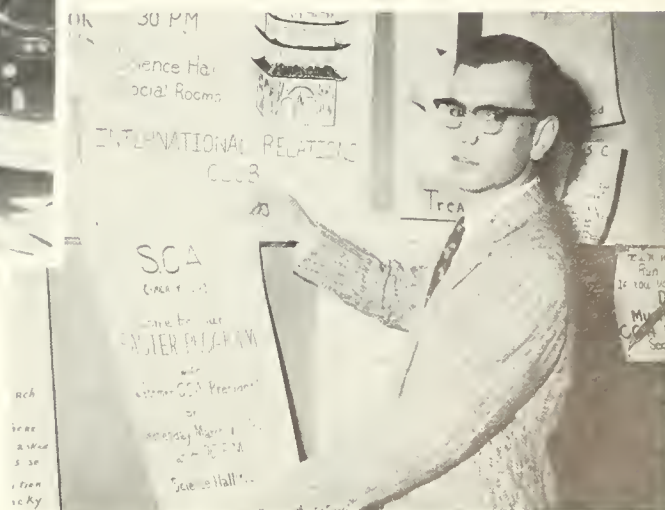

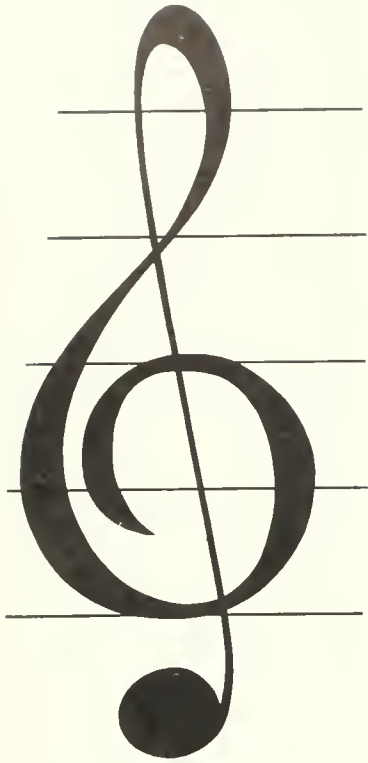

THE ATHLETIC STAFF

The Athletic Staff of Bloomsburg State College is composed of faculty members who have had experience in various college athletics or have a deep and abiding interest in athletics. As will be apparent in the photograph above, membership in this group is not limited to any particular college department, nor to any specific college curriculum. Our college coaches have demonstrated their love for athletics by giving freely of their time to train outstanding athletes and to develop character.

Mr. Russell Houk, Chairman of the Athletic Committee, needs little introduction since his wrestling teams have consistently won state and national honors. His teams have established records in all weight classes and in both individual and team competition. Mr. Houk has been equally fortunate in his selection of athletic assistants. Leading the list is Mr. Walter Blair, Chairman of the Department of Physical Education, who acts as head football coach. Mr. Blair's assistants are Mr. Eli McLaughlin, line coach; Mr. Richard Mentzer, backfield coach; and Mr. George Wilwohl, end coach. All of the assistant coaches are members of the Physical Education Department.

This year Mr. Robert Norton, Supervisor of Secondary Student Teachers, assumed the role of head basketball coach, succeeding Mr. William Foster, now head basketball coach at Rutgers. Mr. Norton is assisted by Mr. John Bzik, of the Mathematics Department. Mr. Eli McLaughlin is in charge of the swimming team. His swimmers have established several college records during the past three years.

Mr. George Wilwohl is in charge of track. Bloomsburg has an enviable record in this sport, having established

several track records in intercollegiate contests, notably in the 100 yard dash and the shotput. This year, Mr. Richard Mentzer will be in charge of baseball, succeeding Mr. Robert Zeigler, who resigned last spring to accept a directorship with a Lutheran Church foundation.

Mr. Craig Himes, of the Science Department, replaces Dr. Martin Satz as head coach of golf this year. Dr. Satz, of the Special Education Department, organized this particular sport on the BSC campus and his teams maintained enviable records in league competition. In addition to coaching basketball, Mr. Norton will handle the tennis assignment this year, replacing Mr. Himes, who has coached this sport for the last two years.

Bloomsburg State has been fortunate in having enthusiastic support for its athletic program not only from the students and faculty, but from area residents as well. Even though athletic scholarships have not been available, Bloomsburg State College has had better than average teams to compete in the tough Pennsylvania State College Conference competition. From time to time, there have been outstanding football, baseball, and track teams. In recent years, the wrestling and basketball teams have received national recognition. The sports of swimming, tennis, and golf have been in the building stage and more will be heard from these sports in future years.

All in all, Bloomsburg State College students can be proud of their Husky teams, their coaches, and their Athletic Director, Mr. Russell Houk, whose enthusiasm and direction have been the key to a progressive Bloomsburg State College sports program.

Kings 6

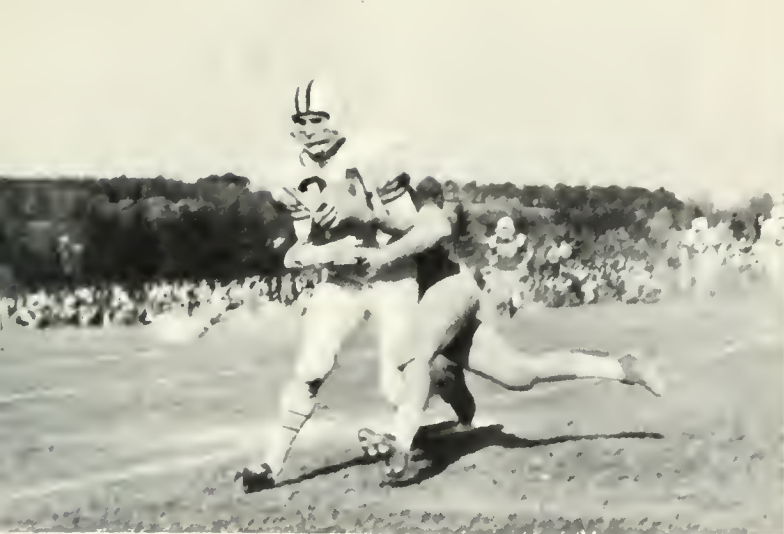

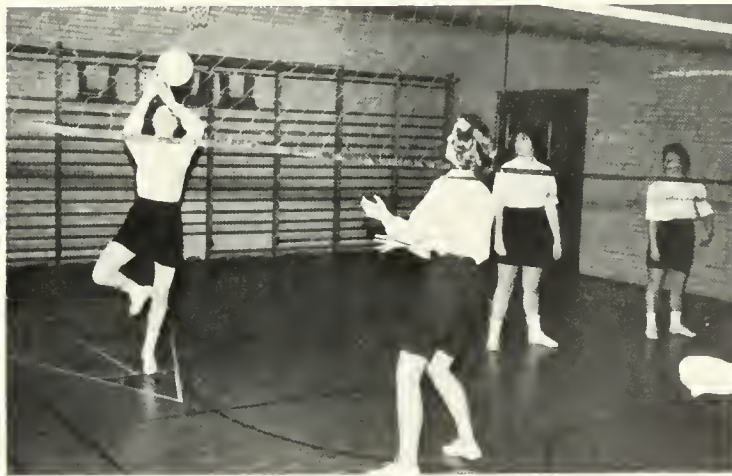
