The impact of his loss to the yearbook is hard to accept, particularly for the staff of the 1966 OBITER, for whom he did a great deal.



Pennsylvania . . . we live it . . . we love it.

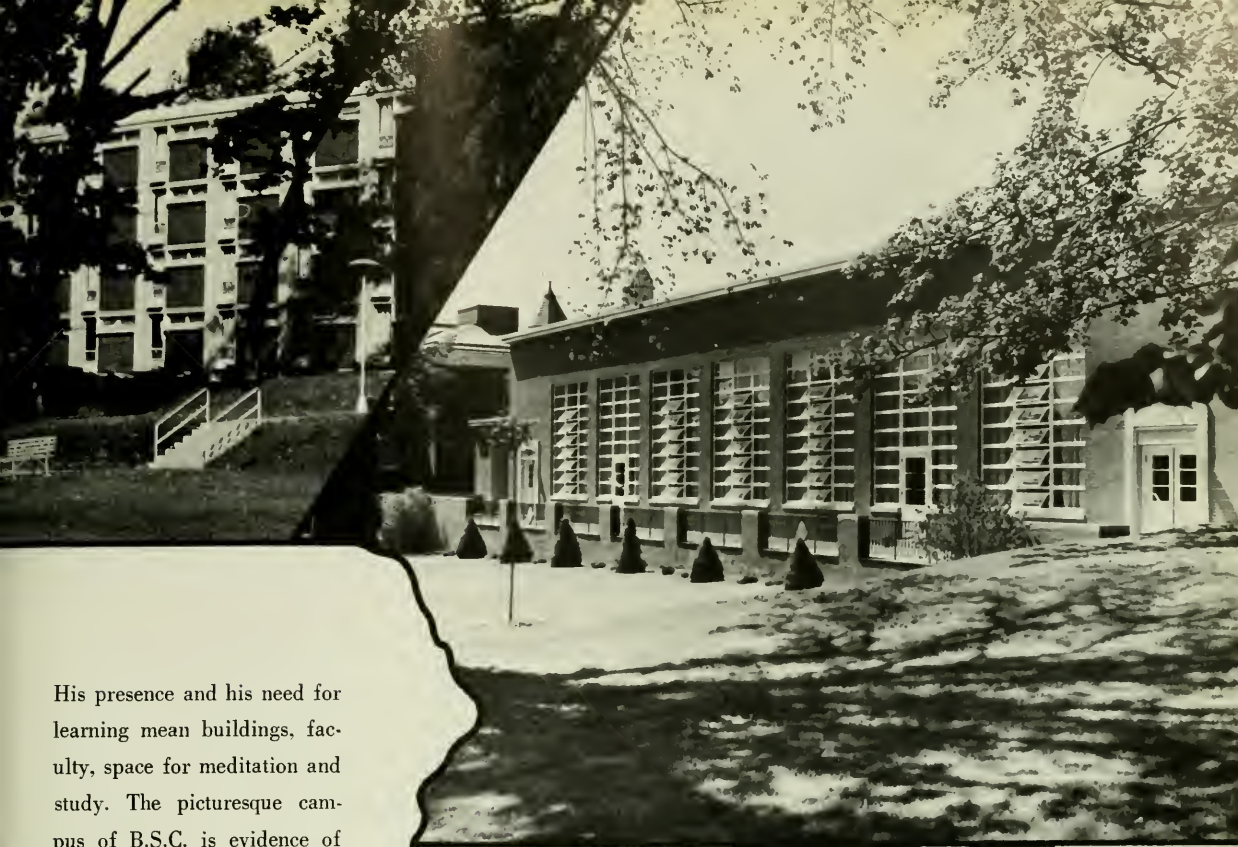




Traditionally —

In Tribute

At the time of Professor Edward T. DeVoe's death he was the oldest member of the English staff in point of service, and as an associate of his, I can attest to the respect which he had earned from colleagues and students alike.

What is of more immediate concern here is that over a period of nearly 20 years, Dr. DeVoe was more actively associated with college student publications than was any other person. For many years he was advisor to all the publications at the same time: *Maroon and Gold*, *Olympian*, *OBITER*. Numerous other publishing responsibilities he undertook most capably—preparation and proof-reading of college brochures, handbooks, and catalogues. Up to the time of his death he continued to serve as chairman of the Publications Committee and as advisor to the staff of the yearbook.

It seems fitting that this yearbook, which Dr. DeVoe advised for so many years, should pay tribute to one who worked so hard in furthering its growth. One of Dr. DeVoe's admirable traits as advisor was the strictness with which he kept publicity on himself in the background. It is good to recognize that institutions—and a yearbook is one—don't just miraculously appear. They have a continuity that sometimes students fail to sense in their brief stay at college. Dr. DeVoe played an important part in that continuity by bringing from his own experience a professional touch to our yearbook. His death is a loss to the whole college community.

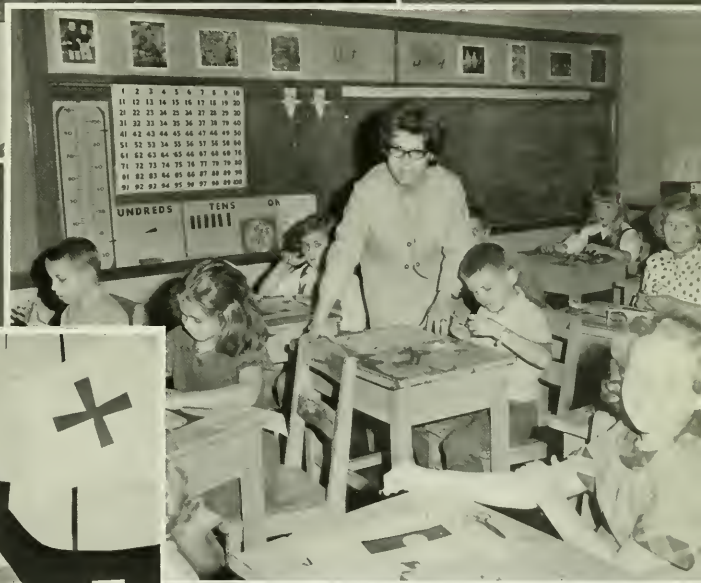

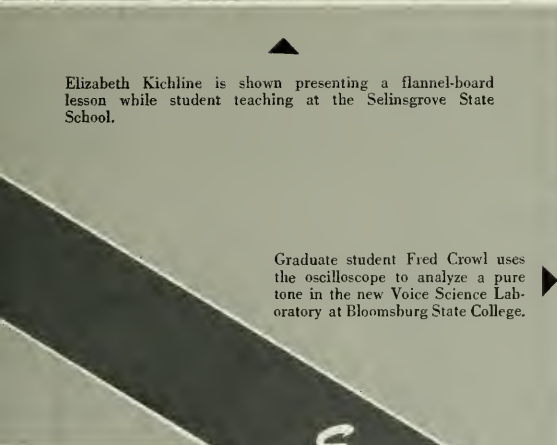

This spring and summer will witness the graduation of the first Bloomsburg State College students to achieve the Bachelor of Arts degree. They represent a mere handful of individuals most of whom are completing their programs by means of acceleration. These individuals are to be congratulated on an attainment which will serve them admirably wherever they may be headed in life. (Since next year will be the fourth year of the degree program, the first sizable group will not be graduated until that time.)

While a program of studies in the Arts and Sciences Division may or may not differ significantly in depth from a teacher-education program, the Bachelor of Arts degree represents universally and traditionally a different kind of achievement than Bachelors degrees in teaching or other professions. The B.A. (or A.B.) degree, whether terminal or preparatory (to careers in business, industry, research, graduate study, law, medicine, etc.) suggests a somewhat wider range of academic subjects, in lieu of the teacher-preparation courses required for the B.S. in Ed. degree. Accordingly education courses are not permitted within the 123 credit hours for the Bachelor of Arts degree at Bloomsburg.

In the Arts and Sciences curriculum at Bloomsburg, the student follows one of three different general areas of concentration: (1) the Natural Sciences, (2) the Social Sciences, or (3) the Humanities. Within each of these areas many specific "majors" are constantly being developed as new course offerings are instituted. All students in the Division of Arts and Sciences are required to take at least one year of Mathematics, at least one year of a Natural Science (Biology, Physics, Chemistry, or Geology), and a modern Foreign Language through sophomore level (Spanish 201-202, French 201-202, German 201-202, or Russian 201-202).

There are currently about 270 students enrolled in the Arts and Sciences Division, and with the expansion of Bloomsburg State College as a multi-purpose institution and with increasing local awareness of the universal significance of the Bachelor of Arts degree, it is anticipated that the growth of the program will be increasingly rapid in the years ahead.

Again, congratulations to the small proud class of '66 in the Division of Arts and Sciences,—the first of its kind in Bloomsburg's history!

On June 9, 1960, the State Council of Education of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania authorized the Bloomsburg State College to inaugurate a program of graduate studies and to confer the Master of Education degree. Graduate courses for students desiring to secure the Master of Education degree in Business Education, Elementary Education, English, Speech Correction, and Special Education for the Mentally Retarded are now offered by the College. The program is operative within the framework of policies and curriculums developed and approved by the Graduate Council of the College.

Courses are offered during summer sessions and the academic year for both full and part-time students desiring to improve their professional competence.

The dedication of the College to the success of this endeavor is but another step in the continuing effort to serve the academic community and to improve the status of the teaching profession.

The need for professional education for teachers extending beyond the undergraduate level has long been recognized by educational leaders throughout the United States. In recent years the Pennsylvania State Council of Education has taken positive action to improve instruction in public schools by upgrading certification requirements for teachers. This action indicates a clear recognition by the State Council of the need for training beyond the Bachelor's degree. Mandated salary schedules which provide salary differentials for holders of Master's degrees in the form of higher maximum salaries give additional recognition of the value of graduate study.

The program of graduate studies at Bloomsburg State College has as its primary purpose the increasing of the competency of teachers in Pennsylvania. To achieve this purpose, the following specific objectives, as they relate to the individual student, have been developed:

1. To provide opportunity for advanced study in a selected field of specialization.
2. To provide an opportunity for developing a better understanding of the culture of our society—a society in which the teacher is expected to assume an increasing important role.
3. To encourage independent thought and initiative and develop problem-solving ability.
4. To provide an incentive for continuing professional growth.
5. To develop a basic understanding of research methods and techniques so that reports of research in the field of education may be correctly interpreted and evaluated.
6. To develop a more comprehensive understanding of the teaching and learning process.

My work with the College government has been a most rewarding challenge. In retrospect, there are always areas where more could have been accomplished; however, since there is no end to the paths of progress, we must pass this challenge on to those who follow.

Delta Chapter of Gamma Theta Upsilon, Professional Geographic Fraternity, was chartered October 16, 1931, a year after the founding of the national organization. Today, it is the second oldest continuously active chapter among 90 in the United States and Canada. The purpose of Gamma Theta Upsilon is to advance the professional study of geography both as a cultural discipline and as a practical subject for study and investigation.

Although earlier geographic clubs undoubtedly existed on campus, records of only one other exist. In October, 1926, The Geographic Society of Bloomsburg State Teachers College was organized with Dr. H. Harrison Russell as advisor. All students and interested faculty members were eligible. The group continued to function until the spring of 1940.

A greater measure of academic achievement was required for membership in Gamma Theta Upsilon. As a result, both geography organizations functioned with occasional joint activities for nine years. Dr. Russell advised both groups.

Persons who travelled in foreign countries presented programs. Student papers and trip reports were read, a variety of field trips were made, and an annual banquet culminated the activities each year. In earlier days banquet speeches were followed by dancing, bridge, pinochle, or "games that were enjoyed by all."

Rear Admiral Richard E. Byrd and Richard Halliburton, famous adventurers, spoke before the fraternity and were made honorary members. A total of 350 students have been members of the local chapter over the past 33 years.

Besides Dr. Russell, the fraternity has had Dr. W. B. Sterling, Dr. Bruce E. Adams, Dr. John Enman, and Mr. Hopple as advisors.
