Despite a dismal rain, the parade on Saturday morning went on as planned. The Honorable Fred H. Hobbes attended as a special guest. The State Police mounted horse color guard and the Irem Temple Shriners String Band highlighted the parade.

In early spring, Bonnie Korngold, a high school junior was cast to play Anne Frank in the Players' production of *The Diary of Anne Frank*. *Trouble in Tahiti* and *The Devil and Daniel Webster* were the two light operas which were presented as part of the Spring Arts Festival.



SPECIAL CAMPUS GUESTS





During the course of this academic year several special guests visited the campus. To avoid a depressing lull in social activity, Buffy Sainte-Marie was contracted to give a concert in Haas Auditorium on the week-end after Homecoming. Albert Burke gave a lecture about education in November, and later that day he led an informal discussion on world affairs in Waller lobby, attracting several hundred students. Thousands of students waited in Haas Auditorium on February 6 to hear Vincent Price speak about art appreciation. Although he was late in arriving, students agreed that he was well worth it; they received him enthusiastically. Afterwards, he visited with the art students for a discussion and critique of their work. Jay and the Techniques were the featured performers during Winter Week-end. JANUARY GRADUATION

Commencement exercises were held in the new Haas Auditorium for the first time. One hundred and twenty-nine bachelor degrees were granted, and 11 masters degrees. John K. Tabor, Pennsylvania Secretary of Internal Affairs was the guest speaker.



MOCK REPUBLICAN CONVENTION



Initially conceived by the social science department during the summer of '67, the idea of a mock political convention was introduced to our college for this important presidential year.

The key to the entire program was the scheduling of an important speaker. The department was able to obtain the Honorable Gerald F. Ford, minority leader of the United States House of Representatives, for March 16, 1968. On this basis, the date of the convention was established.

The steering committee, however, felt that a convention with no preliminary speeches or rallies would not serve as an accurate representation of an actual political convention. With this in mind, a series of pre-convention activities were arranged which included state meetings for dissemination of information and the formation of strategy. Friday afternoon, March 15, E. John Bucci, public opinion pollster, and James Reichley, former legislative assistant to Governor Scranton, and associate editor of *Fortune Magazine*, participated in a seminar on "The Republican Prospects in 1968". Later that evening, Craig Truax, former state Republican chairman, former Secretary of the Commonwealth, and legislative assistant to the majority leader of the Pennsylvania General Assembly, held a pre-convention rally. With this program, 1,333 pseudo-delegates were attracted from 15 different colleges.







The weekend of March 15 was no ordinary weekend for those who were a part of the activity in Centennial Gymnasium. Students took part in an educational experience so keyed with emotion that most of them were unaware that they were learning about an important phase of our government.

Comments were made to the effect that it was as realistic as it could possibly be. All of the essentials were there—accurate decorations and physical lay-out, multiple roll calls, platform presentation and the ensuing fight, polling of delegations and demonstrations.

To the amazement of all, an amendment was proposed from the floor for the party platform, stating that the draft would be abolished. A roll call vote defeated the proposal 770 to 563. The contest itself was a heated one, with the presidential nomination going to Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller on the second ballot, and the vice presidential slot going to Governor Ronald Reagan on the first ballot. For everyone who attended, the B.S.C. Mock Republican Convention of 1968 will be remembered as a unique and enjoyable experience.







GREEK WEEK

The first annual Greek Week was held March 31 through April 3. The activities for this special week were conceived and planned by the Inter-fraternity and Intersorority Councils. On Sunday night many gifted students were spotlighted during Talent Night in Carver Auditorium. A marathon race on the terrace outside Husky Lounge preceded a concert by the Temptations and Chuck Jackson and his Sextet on Monday evening.

On Tuesday, chariot races were held in the center of campus. Theta Gamma Phi won the sorority race, and Phi Sigma Xi was the victor in the fraternity race despite Bob Wynne's fortitude on behalf of Beta Sigma Delta when his "chariot" fell apart.

The finale of Greek Week focused on a Gymnastics Night on Wednesday which was followed by an all-college dance from 10:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. In conjunction, the A.R.W. sponsored a very successful money-making project, "Penny Night". Resident women were permitted to remain out until 2:00 A.M. if a penny was paid for each minute past midnight.

As an anti-climax, the resident men stormed the women's dormitories on Thursday night in a second unsuccessful attempt at a panty raid. Dean Hunsinger and the campus guards nervously stood by while Dean Jackson and the Head Residents guarded the doors from the inside. Complications arose when girls in Waller, East, and West Halls set off fire alarms. The anxious co-eds streamed to the doors. The men got ready to charge inside. And the Head Residents determinedly stood their ground. Greek Week proved itself to be one of the social highlights of the spring semester.







Spring Arts Festival

Bloomsburg's annual attempt to disburse culture to the masses—the Spring Arts Festival—began on April 4 with an exhibition of paintings and sculpture by Joseph A. Smith. A creative writers' conference featured lectures and readings by Maurice Valency, a critic, Stanley Kunitz, a prize winning poet, and Peter Taylor, a writer. The Bloomsburg Players and the Concert Choir presented two light operas, "Trouble in Tahiti" and "The Devil and Daniel Webster". The New York Pro Musica performed in Haas Auditorium on April 30 and a contemporary dance concert was given by students from East Stroudsburg State College on May 3.

Voices Of Student Dissent

This year student opinion crystallized in a number of constructive but often controversial ways. The most prominent of these were the appearance of SURGE, *The Gadfly*, and policy revisions by the ARW, The Association of Resident Women.

The Gadfly published its first issue on September 29, 1967. The lead article was a "China Report", the first in a series of satires on policies and personalities of the administration of the college. Before the newspaper had printed its last issue of the year, it had published articles on foreign affairs, national politics, and editorial comments on specific policies with suggestions for remedies.

For financial support, however, *The Gadfly* placed a coin box beside the newspapers when they were distributed, running afoul of the school's regulations against solicitation. In

the Students" in January in which he described what he felt were the attempts at suppression by the school administration. At the end of January he was again brought before the disciplinary committee to be tried on charges filed by the Director of Public Relations. Two days of hearings followed during which Slack and his advisor, James Percey, argued that the right of freedom of speech made the charges invalid. The hearing committee finally decided that Slack was guilty of some acts of journalistic irresponsibility and punished him by requiring him to write an article on disciplinary procedures in colleges.

Meanwhile, in February, lawyers for the American Civil Liberties Union had informed President Andruss that if the ban was not rescinded "forthwith", they were prepared to file suit against the college.

an attempt to obtain these rights its editor, Lyle Slack, went before the Student Government Association in November where solicitation rights were not only denied, but the newspaper was banned from distribution on campus.

In a now-famous remark after the meeting, Lyle Slack vowed that *The Gadfly* would continue regardless of what the student government did, for, he contended, the ban was unconstitutional. Slack was supported by the American Civil Liberties Union which agreed to take the case in February.

In December, Slack had been brought before the campus disciplinary committee on charges of misrepresentation of students in an "Open Letter to Students" which most of the nine students alleged that they had not signed. Slack, however, produced an original of the letter with the signatures of the nine. He was acquitted with a letter of censure.

Since the student government ban was specifically against *The Gadfly*, Slack felt free to publish a "Report to

The Gadfly reappeared in April and published to the end of the school year—twelve issues in all. Gary Pletcher, a first semester senior, was named to edit the 1968-69 editions of *The Gadfly*.

SURGE (Student United in Reform Government and Education), the first student political party, was formed in February. Organized by Ron Schultz, Lyle Slack, Gary Pletcher, and Joe Cappello, it declared itself to be for greater student freedom, specifically with regard to social regulations and student government. Seven of the eleven SURGE candidates were elected to offices in the April elections.

The Association of Resident Women, headed by Connie Fike, also made great strides towards liberalizing the regulations governing women. Seventy-eight reforms were made in dorm rules. The most significant were the establishment of late minutes, expansion of women's hours, elimination of compulsory bed-making, and restrictions on the house mother to insure privacy during room inspections.

President Of The College

When Dr. Harvey A. Andruss became President of Bloomsburg State College in 1939, he had been a public school administrator since the age of nineteen. In the years preceding 1939 he had served as a university instructor, college department head, and Dean of Instruction. Holding a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Oklahoma, he earned the Master of Business Administration degree at Northwestern University and the Doctor of Education degree at the Pennsylvania State University.

A native of Texas, Dr. Andruss has been affiliated with the public schools of Oklahoma; also with Northwestern University, Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and Bloomsburg State College. Dr. Andruss has served as an educational consultant and head of the Department of Accounting of the First American Army University in Shrivenham, England from 1945-1946, and as visiting professor at The Pennsylvania State University during the summer of 1957.

With a special acumen for business, Dr. Andruss was the organizer and first Director of the Department of Business Education at Bloomsburg State College from 1930-1937. In the latter year he became the Dean of Instruction; in 1939 he succeeded Dr. Francis B. Haas as President of the College.



Dr. Andrus' administrative foresight was particularly important during his first decade as President when it was necessary to secure funds to keep the College operating while the country was involved in World War II. The economics of recent years have also demanded administrative ability of a high order as the State Colleges are being called upon to meet the educational needs of an exploding population. Dr. Andrus has been quite influential as a member of the Board of State College Presidents by virtue of his talents and his long tenure. He has been particularly active in the fiscal policies and programs of the State Colleges and has appeared before numerous legislative committees in quest of more funds for State Colleges in general and for Bloomsburg in particular.

The Class of 1968 has observed a tremendous series of changes at Bloomsburg State College since they began in 1964, but the changes observed by Dr. Andrus through the past thirty-eight years are almost impossible to contemplate. These countless changes must constitute a vast storehouse of memories for him . . . and they must be a source of much understandable pride.



Dean Of Instruction

During the past thirteen years Bloomsburg State College has realized a tremendous rate of growth and development. This growth has been reflected by a rapid multiplication of students, faculty, facilities, and programs. One of the many persons vitally involved in this growth has been John A. Hoch, Dean of Instruction.

During his tenure as Dean of Instruction the responsibilities of the position have multiplied rapidly and will no doubt continue to as the College expands to university status.

Dr. Hoch came to Bloomsburg State College in 1946 after serving as a teacher and coach at Milton High School. He served as Dean of Men, Director of Public Relations, and as Director of Athletics before assuming his present post. In addition to his other responsibilities, Dr. Hoch was football coach during the 1946 season, and assistant football coach from 1947 to 1955.

Dr. Hoch earned his A.B. degree at the Pennsylvania State University, his M.A. degree at Bucknell University, and his Ed.D. at Penn State. During Dr. Andrus' two trips around the world Dr. Hoch has served as Acting President of the College.

Dean Of Students

Dr. Paul S. Riegel has served as Dean of Students at Bloomsburg for the past three years, a period characterized by tremendous enrollment increases which strained available facilities, a perplexing situation common in most institutions of higher education, especially those supported by the state. In addition, the entire committee structure of the College has been revamped during the past two years in an attempt to create a better balance of power among the administration, faculty, and students. This project took a great deal of time and effort by many people, including the Dean of Students. All these factors have made the job more demanding than at any other time in history.

A native of Berwick Pennsylvania, Dr. Riegel received a Bachelor of Arts degree in English Literature at Middlebury College, Vermont. He earned both his M.A. and Ed.D. degrees from Teachers College of Columbia University. Among other positions, he was Assistant Registrar for Special Projects at the latter institution prior to his appointment as Dean of Students at Bloomsburg in September, 1965.

In addition to his experience in the area of student personnel work, Dr. Riegel has been active in various personnel aspects of the United States Army and has been Assistant Coordinator of Inter-Agency Training for the United States Civil Service Commission in Washington, D.C.

Director Of Development



Directors of Development and Public Relations, quite frequently, are college administrators who are invisible to most students. Their presence is manifested not through daily personal contacts like the Deans of Instruction or Students, but by the steel and concrete skeletons of new buildings, trenches for underground utilities, conferences with a variety of groups and individuals, newspaper articles and brochures, and, sometimes, an inevitable sea of mud.

At Bloomsburg State College, Boyd Buckingham's Office coordinates a countless variety of details encompassing the continuing expansion and growth of the College. Development involves knowing what the campus looks like today (including where the sidewalks are and where the students actually walk) and what the campus should look like ten years from now. Construction on a State College campus must meet with the approval of state agencies and the State Legislature as well as the students, faculty, and administrative personnel who will use the new structures when they are completed. Through the cooperative endeavor of many staff members, Bloomsburg has developed a master campus plan with sufficient flexibility to accommodate unforeseen changes. This plan establishes guidelines for present and future buildings.

Design and construction of campus projects must be also coordinated with local business and government officials who are responsible for water and sewage, electricity and telephones, zoning and traffic patterns. Mr. Buckingham must reconcile the desires and problems of students, faculty, administrators, architects, and municipal and state authorities as the campus grows. He may be invisible to most students, but to student leaders, faculty committees, administrative planners, and hundred's of others, he and his office are the keys to Bloomsburg's future.

Public Relations embraces every aspect of the college community and its relations with its many publics—alumni, townspeople, parents of students, business and civic organizations to mention a few. The aid and assistance given the college, directly and indirectly by these groups, makes possible scholarships, loans, and other benefits which are not provided by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Mr. Buckingham is a native of York, Pennsylvania. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree at B.S.C., his Master of Science degree at Bucknell University, and is a candidate for the Ed.D. degree at Penn State. He served as an officer and a heavy bomber pilot in the European Theater during World War II, and taught for eight years in the public schools of Athens and Sayre, Pennsylvania, before joining the faculty at Bloomsburg in 1953 as an Associate Professor of Speech.

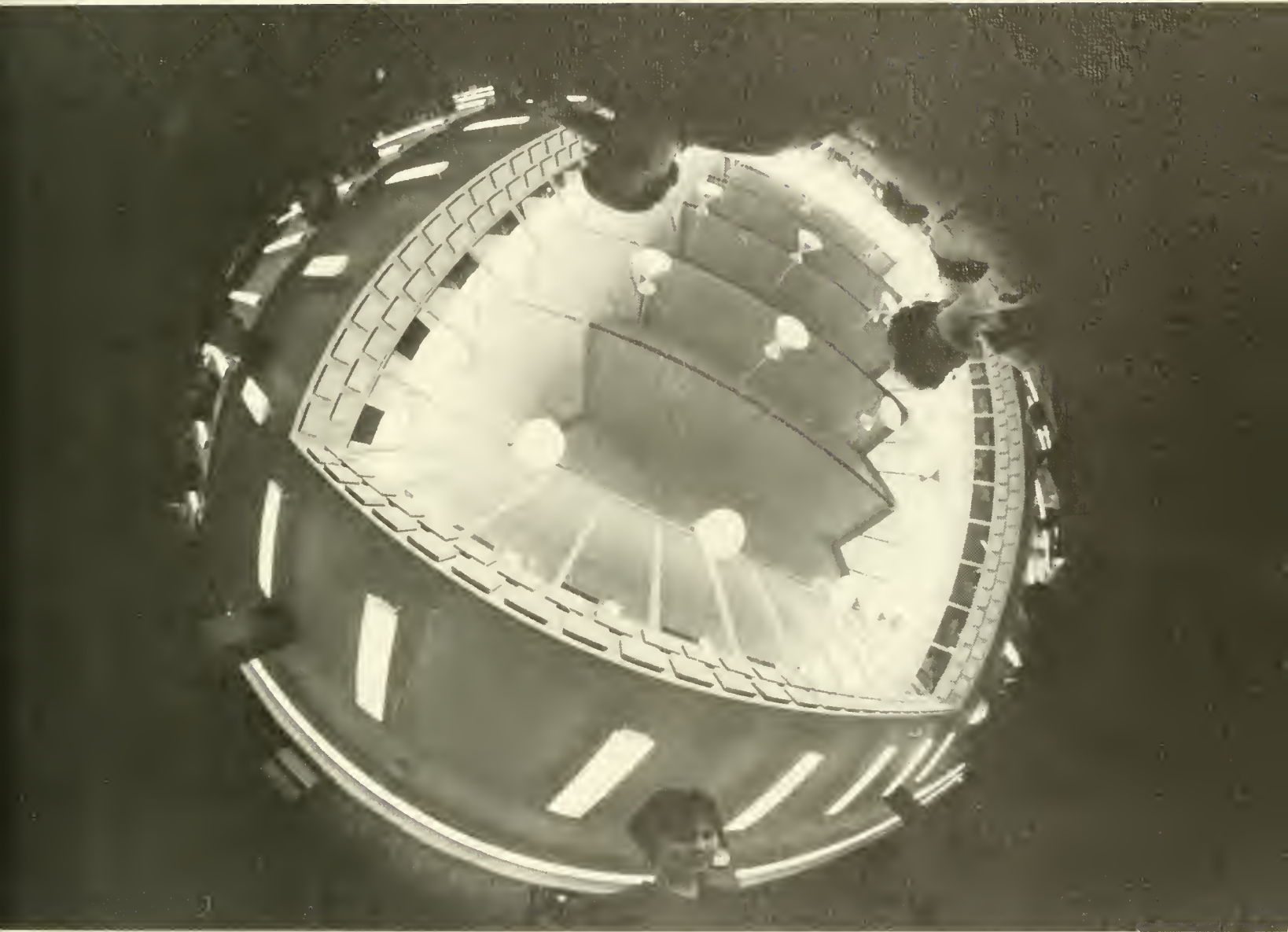

Professor Rygiel Retires

For more than four decades prior to his retirement in January of this year, Professor Walter S. Rygiel had taught Commercial and Business Education subjects, teaching the last thirty years of his career at Bloomsburg State College. His ability as a teacher is indicated by the honors and awards that have been accorded him, by the achievements of his students, and by the high esteem in which he is held by these students.

This esteem was perhaps best demonstrated at the dinner honoring Professor Rygiel upon his retirement, when a portrait of the educator was presented to the College by Phi Beta Lambda, Pi Omega Pi, the Business Education alumni of Bloomsburg, and faculty members of the College.

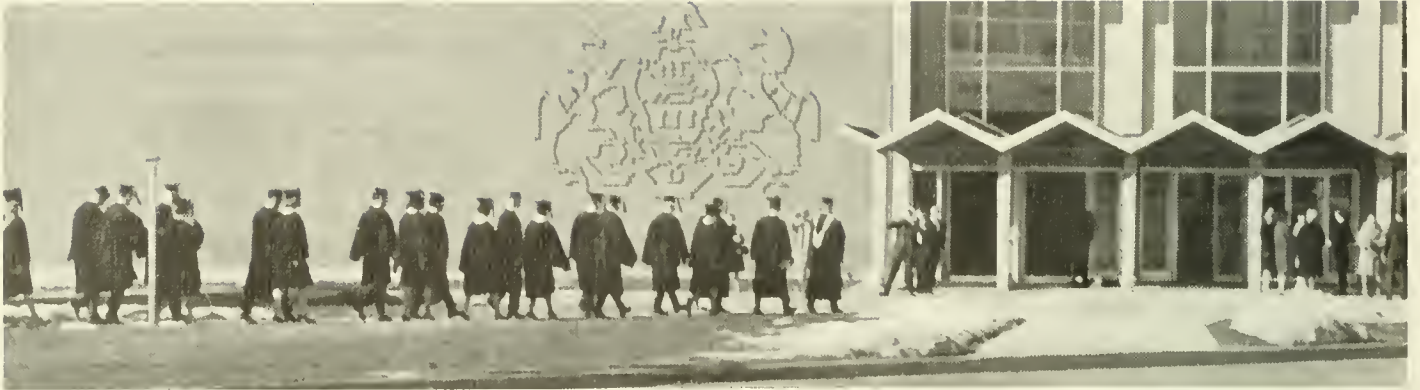
Last spring Professor Rygiel's shorthand class placed first in a world-wide competition sponsored by the Gregg Publishing Company. His 28 member team surpassed the efforts of some 25,000 other contestants from Europe, Asia, North and South America. Prior to this triumph Professor Rygiel's students had won three successive first prizes in the National Shorthand Contest.

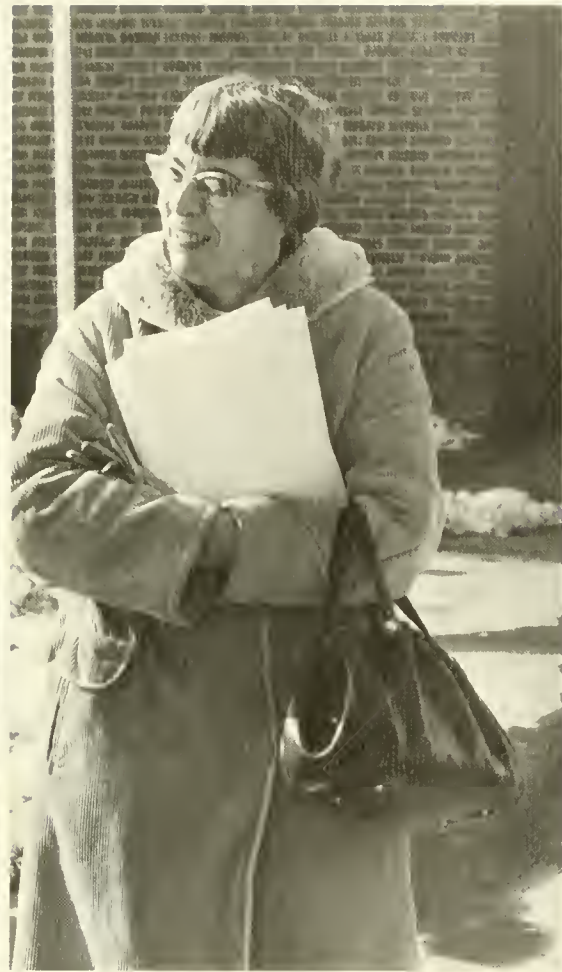
Professor Rygiel received a Bachelor of Science degree in Commercial Education from Temple University in 1925 and a Master of Science degree in Education (also from Temple) in 1936. He subsequently did graduate work at the University of Pennsylvania, Bucknell, and Penn State University.

This year Bloomsburg had the best gridiron team that it has fielded in many years. It was a season of great individual records and performances, but marred by some injuries, notably Stan Kucharski's.

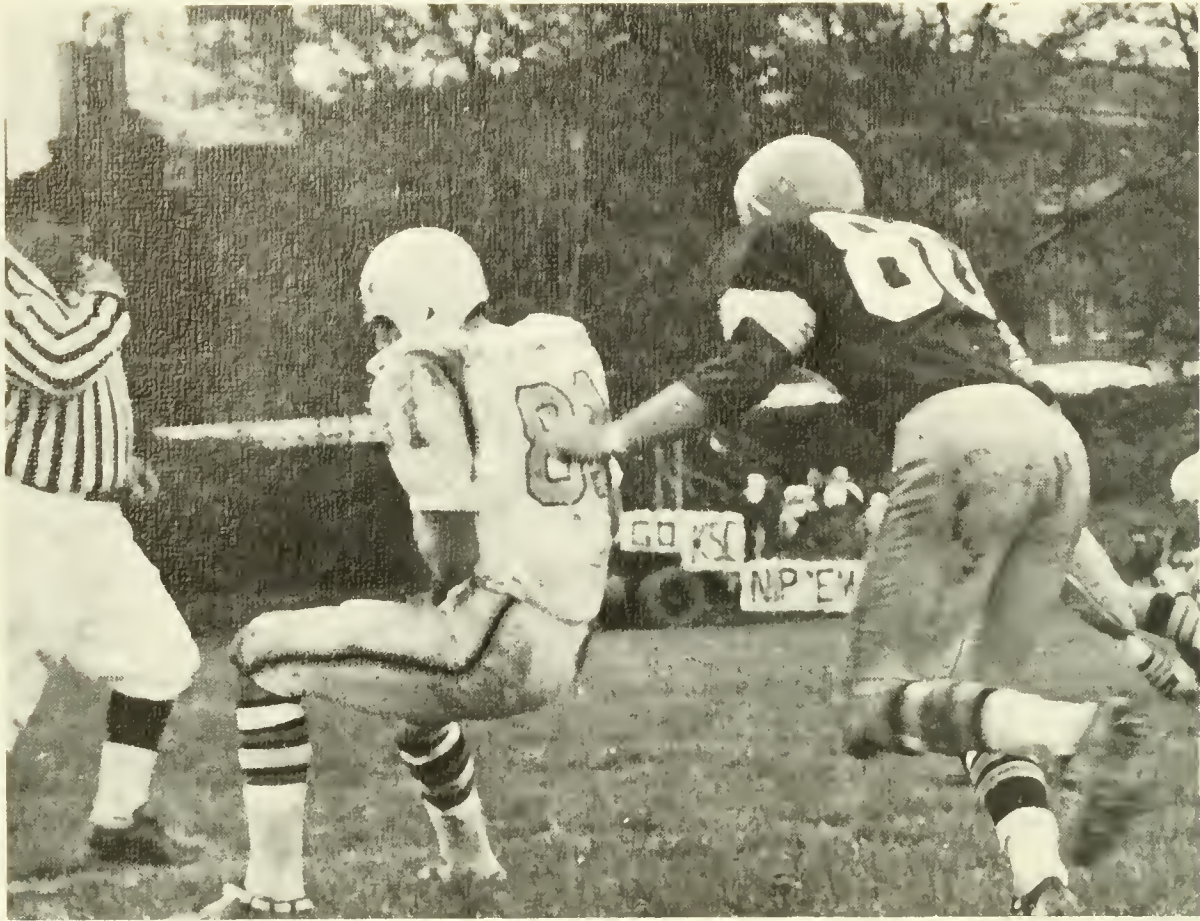
Three performers stood out and were named Tri-Captains; they signed to play professional football next year. They are the golden-armed quarterback Rich Lichtel, and his two sure-fingered receivers Bob Tucker, and Stan Kucharski.

Their records were: Tucker caught 77 passes for 101 points and 1325 yards, a national record; Lichtel passed for yardage of 2771 yards at 307.76 yards per game and 26 touchdowns, also a national record; and Kucharski caught 28 passes for 10 touchdowns and 64 points (all in 3 games).

The highlight of the season was the trip to a hostile, standing room only crowd at Mansfield, beating the Mounties in the last minutes with superb passing and a never say die attitude.

Bloomsburg lost to perennial powerhouse West Chester, but it was not until the final quarter that the Rams took more than a one touchdown lead against a Kucharski-less team. This was Bloomsburg's Homecoming game and no one there could possibly forget the outstanding acrobatic catches of Bob Tucker. All in all it was the most exciting, fulfilling team in many years.

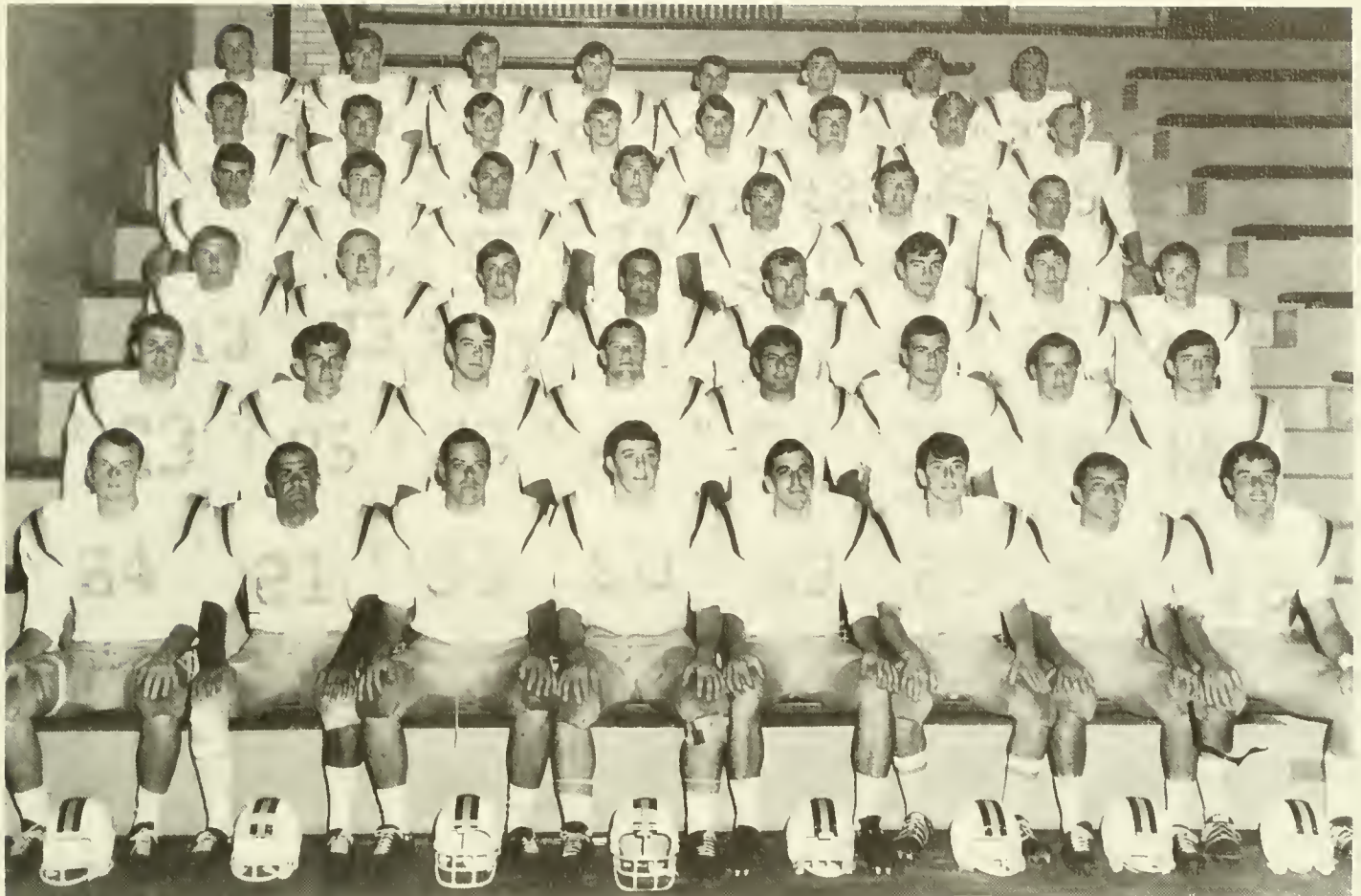

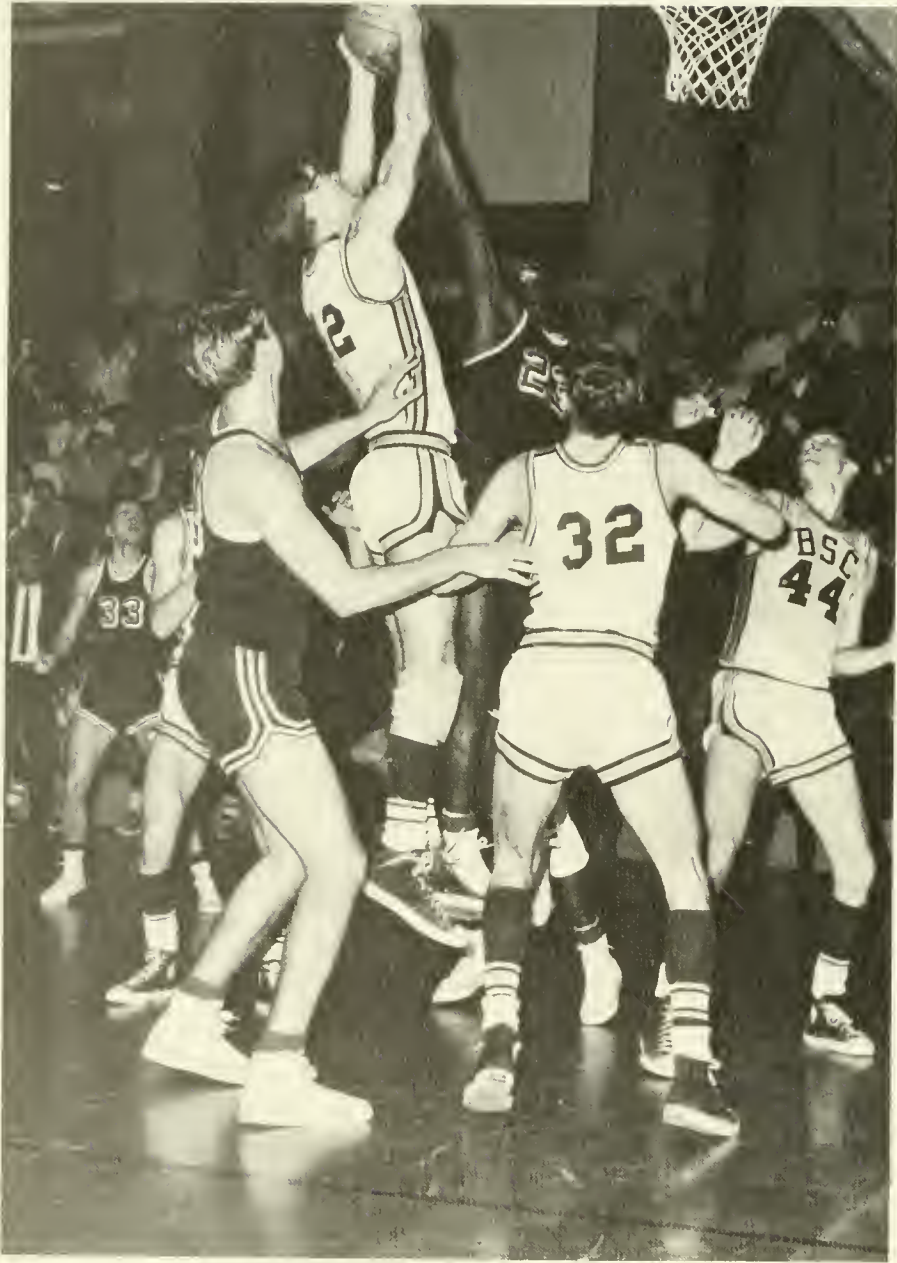

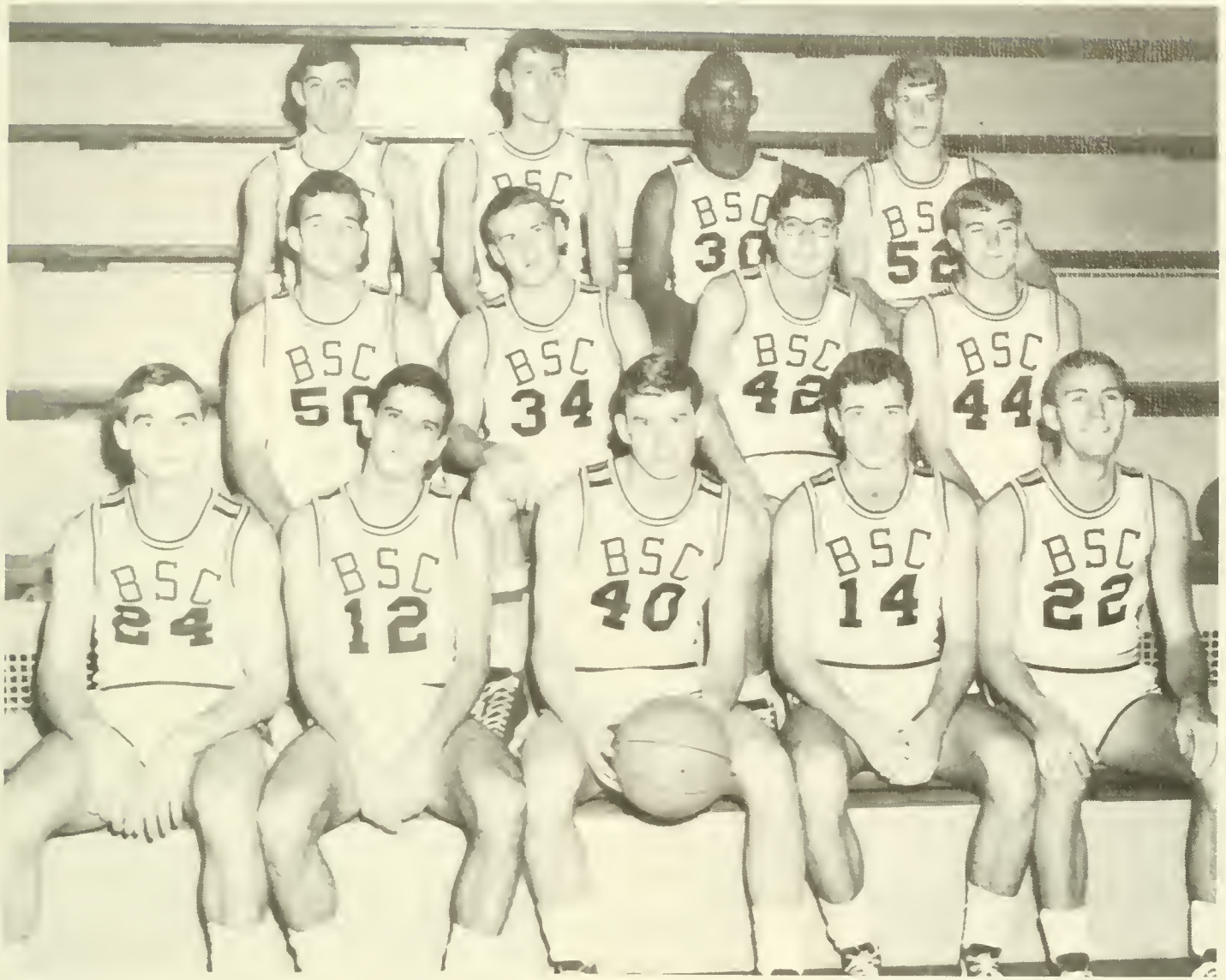
Coming off the bench many times to inspire the team with quick scoring flurries and fiery defense were sophomores Bob Snyder and Bill Mastropietro.

Wrestling . . .



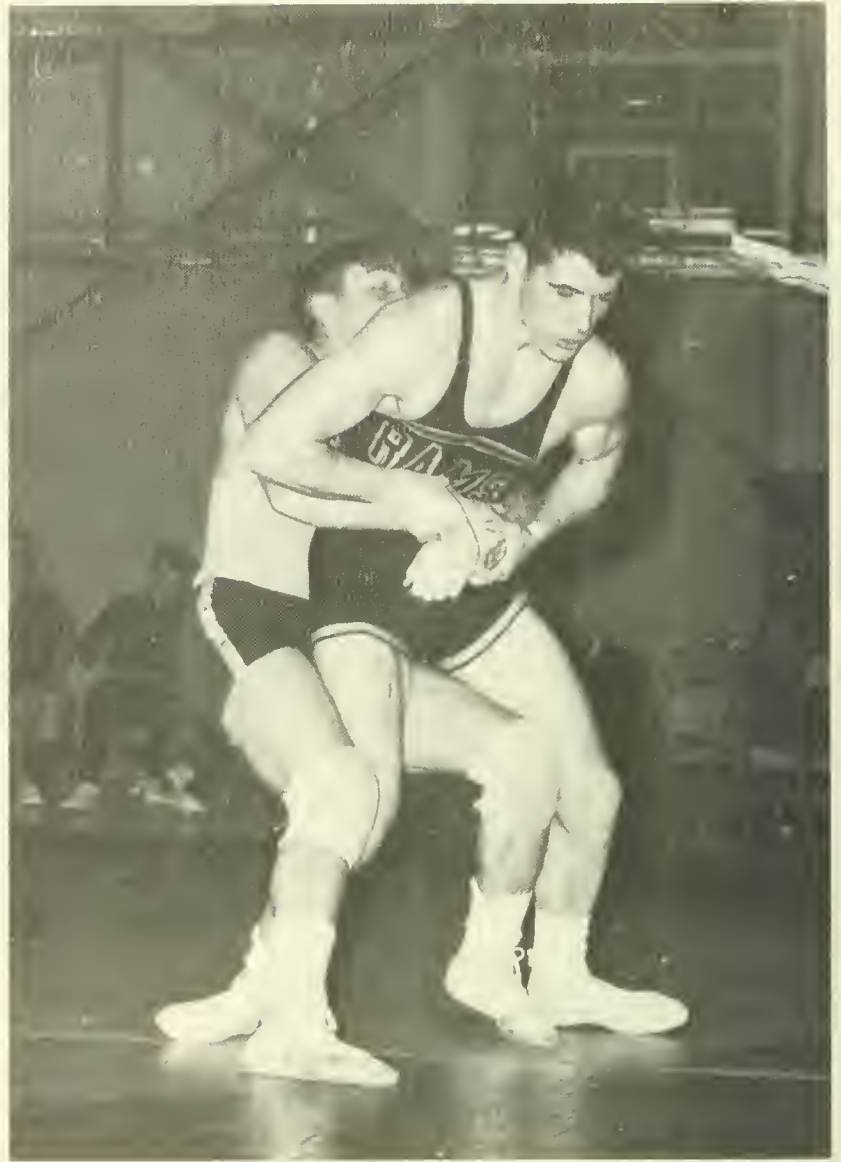

Coach Houk once again made the B.S.C. community proud by the performances of our grapplers all around the country.

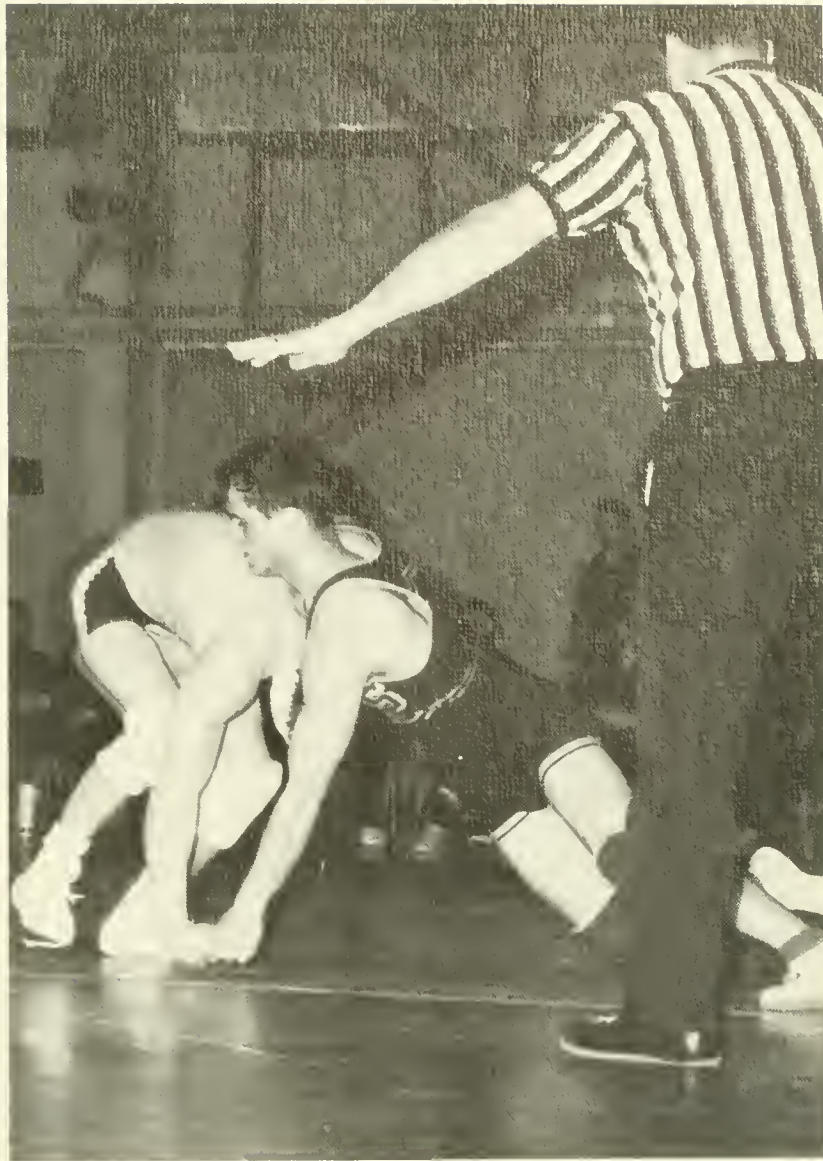

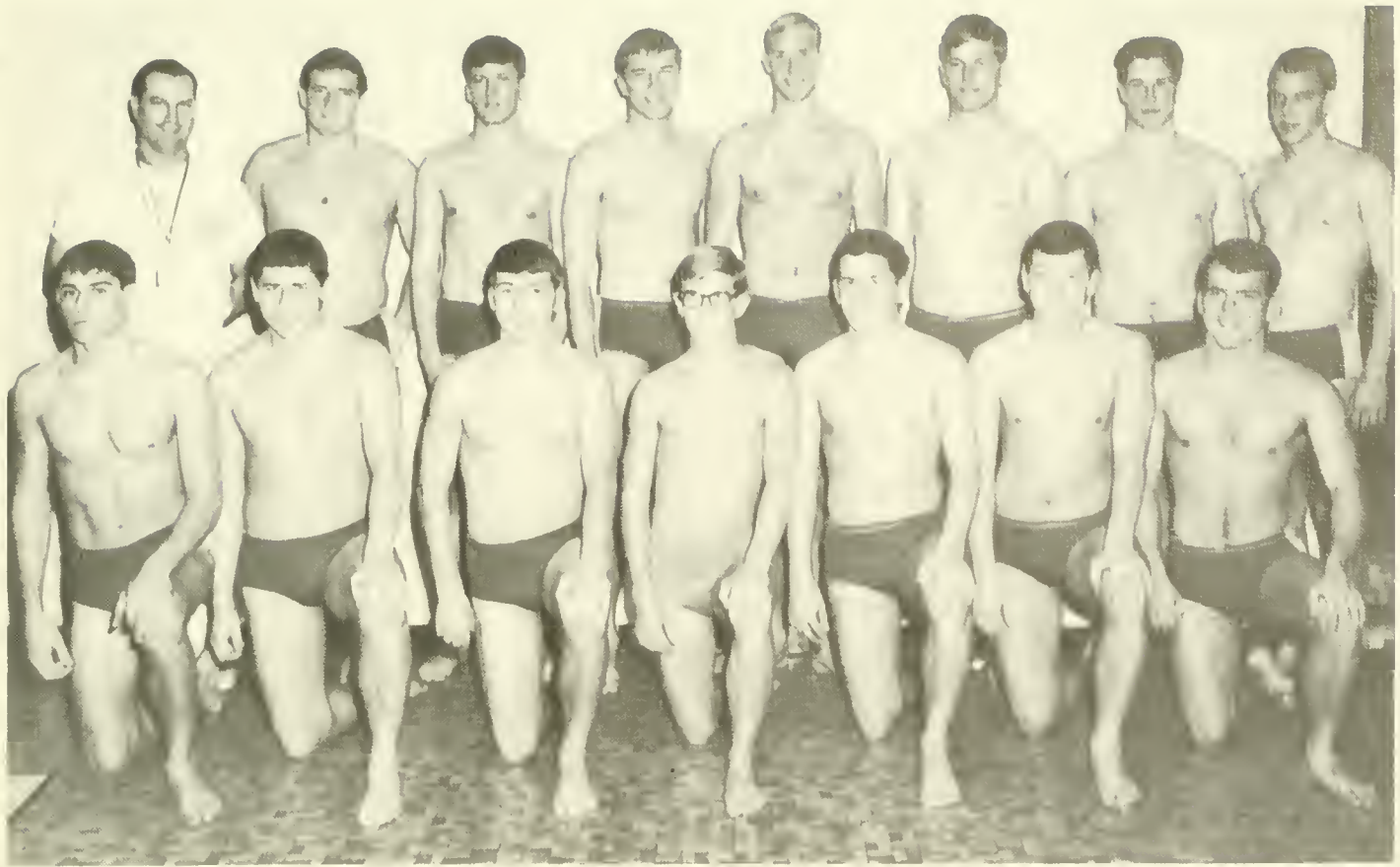

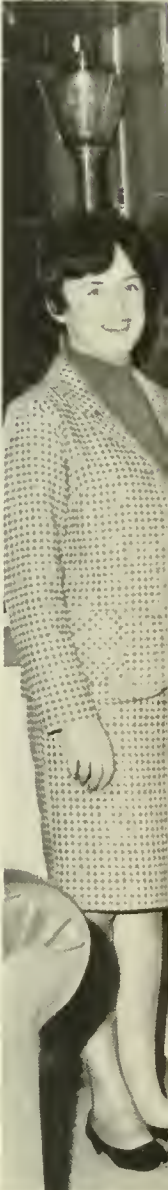
Inter-Fraternity Council
