

HE WAS DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE'S SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY, AND ASSISTANT TO THE CHAIRMAN FOR MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY'S SCHOOL OF OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE, DEPARTMENT OF BIOMECHANICS. HE ALSO WORKED IN STUDENT LIFE POSITIONS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT, KENT STATE UNIVERSITY AND MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY.

HERRING EARNED A DOCTORAL DEGREE IN ADMINISTRATION AND HIGHER EDUCATION FROM MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY, A MASTER'S OF EDUCATION FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT AND A BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE FROM WEST VIRGINIA WESLEYAN COLLEGE.

HE IS SURVIVED BY HIS WIFE, VIRGINIA; SON, BRYCE; DAUGHTER, ASHLEIGH SPIEGEL; AND GRANDSON MATTHEW SPIEGEL.

On October 9, 1933 the student body of the Bloomsburg State Teachers College voted nearly unanimously in favor of adopting the husky as the school's first official mascot. Proposed by art professor (and avid husky trainer) George J. Keller as the ideal mascot because of it's noble qualities. An actual husky was donated by Keller and made his first appearance at a pep rally on October 13.


Named Roongo after a combination of maroon and gold, our first mascot proudly served in his role, sporting a blanket adorned in the school's colors.

A total of five dogs served in the role of official mascot from 1933 until 1958, three of them with the name of Roongo. It was eventually decided that the cost of keeping an actual dog was too great, but since the school still needed an actual representation of the mascot to promote spirit at athletic events a costume was designed in 1979 for a student to personify the husky.

Five costumes have been used since that time, the latest debuting in 2005. Originally known only as the husky, he now once again goes by his historic name of Roongo.



# Football Team



Head Coach Danny Hale


Serving in his 17th season at the helm of the Bloomsburg Huskies Football Team for the 2009-2010 year. He holds the school record for the most coaching victories and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II (winning percentage).

He has been named the AFCA District I Coach of the Year honors nine times (twice in consecutive seasons). He has been named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year 10 times and was also a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award.

He is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and was the team's MVP in the 1967 State Championship game. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the PA Sports Hall of Fame. He was signed with the Pottstown Firebirds (1968), the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

Hale and his wife Diane are the parents of four children: Roman, Brandie, Tyson and Christina and also have nine grandchildren.

## Field Hockey Team



Head Coach Jan Hutchinson


January 1978 - June 2010

A true NCAA coaching legend, Jan was in her 33rd and final season as a coach at Bloomsburg University for the 2009- 2010 year. She has run a program that has won 16 national championships and 17 conference titles in the past 29 years. She is also one of the top college coaches (based on winning percentage) in any division with 1,734 combined wins between field hockey and softball.

She has the most wins as a coach in NCAA field hockey history and is the only coach with over 500 victories. She has been honored with induction into the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame. In addition, she was named the winner of the C. Vivian Stringer Award by the United States Sports Academy in the summer of 2006.

She was a 1971 graduate of East Stroudsburg University and also earned a master's degree in education from the school in 1979. Prior to Bloomsburg, she initiated the women's physical education program at Blair Academy and served as the head coach for field hockey, basketball and softball. She has also been inducted into the Newton High School and Sussex County (NJ) Halls of Fame.


He was named the 2007 EWL Coach of the Year.
