

#### BASKETBALL OUTLOOK - 1966

Competition in the Pennsylvania State College Athletic Conference is expected to be keener this year than it has been in a number of years. Hower, the Cheyney State College team with its tremendous height, is again expected to dominate the conference. Bloomsburg doesn't have that really big man to control the boards against all the tall teams. Mike Morrow and Larry Burris are Bloomsburg's biggest men, at 6'5'', a height which is considered average with today's teams of stratopheric players.

The brighter side of the picture for B.S.C. is the return of five lettermen from last year's squad and the addition of five sophomores from a good freshman team, plus two transfer students from Hershey Junior College. New Head Coach Earl Voss has designated that the combination of hard work, hustle, and determination will be the key to a winning season for the Huskies.

With sophomore Palmer Toto in the role of playmaker, the Maroon and God should fulfill Voss's hope for a team with hustle. As was evident last year, Toto, the only member of this year's squad under 6 feet, was able to keep the Frosh team going at full steam as he is a magician in handling the ball. Practically all of the Huskies can be classified as good shooters, but against the taller opponents the Voss men will have to make that first or second shot count.

The return of Mike Morrow to the lineup after his ineligibility last year, should prove a real spark to the team. Mike is ont only a threat in scoring but is also a demon on the boards. Back from last year's squad are two regulars, Rick Fertig and John Gara, who were consistenly in double figure scoring during the latter half of the season. Gara, a senior with three years varsity experience, will be instrumental in bringing the ball up the floor. Fertig, in addition to being a good one hand set shot, is a fighter on the boards.

George Chellow, a transfer from Hershey Junior College along with Burris, is vying for a starting position. In fact, Voss, at this point, doesn't consider any starting position as being nailed down. In addition to the above mentioned players, Joe Alansky (good speed and shooting ability), Jack Carney (a good driver), Bob Matuza (a hard worker), Jim Dulany (a real workhorse), Dave Duke (the master of the fake), and Bob Mull (steady Eddie) are all in the thick of the fight for a starting berth.

"With so many players similar in height, but quite different in abilities, our team should benefit because they are all hustlng," Voss stated. For the first time in a number of years the Huskies will be participating in a holiday tourna-

#### HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

Earl Voss takes over the reins as head basketball coach this year replacing Bob Norton who resigned to devote full time to his responsibility as supervisor of seniors doing student teaching. Voss joined the Bloomsburg State College faculty in the fall of 1965, and served as freshman basketball coach last year. His freshman team had a 17 win, 4 loss record.

A native of Wilmington, Delaware, Voss was a former captain of the basketball and baseball teams at West Chester State College. He earned his master of education degree at Temple University in 1958.

While in the service, he played with some outstanding teams at U. S. Army posts. Five of the last ten years of his high school coaching were spent at Wilmington High School before coming to Bloomsburg State College. He coached a nuumber of players who made All-State selections with many going on to play college basketball.

During the past several summers, Voss has conducted a very successful basketball camp near Wilmington and has featured many of the nation's outstanding coaches. He is a member of the staff of the Physical Education Department at B.S.C.

# DOUGLAS BOELHOUWER FRESHMAN COACH

Boelhouwer, a native of New Brunswick, New Jersey, joined the Bloomsburg State College faculty in the fall of 1965 when he served as assistant freshman football coach. He is a 1959 graduate of Rutgers University where he played his college football. Prior to coming to Bloomsburg State, Doug was a member of the faculty of South Plainfield High School, New Jersey, where he served as line coach of the varsity football team. Last spring he was head track coach at B.S.C. and has just completed this season as head freshman football coach. His all-around athletic ability and his eagerness to recruit athletes for B.S.C. makes Doug a valuable asset to the athletic program.
