In their role of defending Pennsylvania State College and District 19 N.A.I.A. champions, this year's Bloomsburg State College nine will have to hustle to equal list year's laurels. The 1965 Husky aggregation finished the regular season 13-4 and overall with a 16-6 record. After winning the District 19 title, B,S,C, went on to the for second place in NAIA Area 8 at Shippensburg, Pennsylvania.

The nucleus of this year's squad will be John Gara, who plays either right field, shortstop or first base; Gary Horn, a third baseman; State Bilyk, at second base, and pitchers By Hopkins and Bill Hunter. Hopkins had a 10-3 record last season along with ERA of .99. Hunter was 3-0 and had a 1.89 ERA.

A number of promising prospects hope to fill vacancies created through the graduation loss of Roy Bower, a catcher who led the team with a .418 batting average last year; Ray Emma at first base, who hit .382; and Ronald Boyle, a pitcher with a 3-2 log. Ron Kirk, a .400 hitting shortstop who was signed by Detroit of the American League, will also be missing from this year's squad.

Vying for positions are King Perry, John McKay, Jack Hollis, and Ben Pollock, for catching positions; Bob Gibble and Gene Gruber, pitchers; Bob Tucker, Tom Taylor, first base; Jerry Devin, Mike De-Francisco, snortstops; Haroid Albertson, second base; Francis Callanan, third base; Pat Colgan and Tom Evans, left field; Jim Rupert, Bill Cron, Bill Mulin, centernield; and Terry Henry, right field. Henry is also a pitcher but is nursing an injured arm.

Mentzer has a great deal of work to do as the team had a late start due to practice facilities. The team will again use the Lightstreet baseball field.

Big job at the moment is to determine the best eight or ten hitters in order to develop a potent attack.

En McLaughlin, who will be assistant to Mentzer and will serve as freshman coach, has a five-game schedule lined up for the Husky Pups.

# HEAD **B**ASEBALL COACH RICHARD MENTZER

Head Coach Dick Mentzer came to Bloomsburg State College in 1963 and is in his third year as baseball mentor. A native of Martinsburg, Pennsylvania, he was a letter winner in football, baseball, and track in both high school and at Shippensburg State College.

He then coached at Cresson High School before going to Hollidaysburg, where he was head football and baseball coach in junior high school competition. Mentzer later became head backfield coach, J. V. basketball coach and head track coach at Hollidaysburg Senior High School.

Following an appointment as head football coach at Eastern High, Washington, D. C., his team logged 120 victories, 53 losses, and 6 ties winning 9 Washington, D. C., championships and city championships in 1950 and 1962. In addition, he managed and played with a baseball team at Martinsburg in Blair County. This squad won 3 championships. Mentzer was also a member of a city championship team at Altoona, Pennsylvania.

Mentzer received his Master of Education degree at Pennsylvania State University and is taking additional graduate work at the University of Maryland.

## ASSISTANT BASEBALL COACH ELI McLAUGHLIN

Eli McLaughlin, who completed his fifth year as head Swimming Coach at BSC and an active college swimming official, will be in his second season of baseball at the College.

McLaughlin started his College career at West Chester State College in 1949, which was interrupted by service in the Armed Forces. As a sergeant in the U. S. Air Corps, he served as Director of Special Services at Edwards Air Force Base, in California, where he organized, directed, and participated in various sports programs.

Returning to West Chester in 1953, he was an outstanding football center for three years and then served one year as Line Coach for the Freshman Team before graduating in 1957.

Prior to coming to Bloomsburg in September 1961, he taught and coached three sports at Penn Crest High School.
