## March on Washington Update

Here's the latest on efforts to get Erie area people to the April 25 March on Washington.

A lot of people from our area are driving down to the March in their own vehicles.

Vans can be rented most cheaply from Sears/Budget or New Car Rental: both offer free unlimited mileage. You must have a credit card to rent a van. If you're interested in taking a van down, but don't have people to travel with, call the Erie March on Washington (MOW) Committee to see if they can match you up.

There will be a Bus leaving from Erie and Edinboro late Saturday night (April 24). The bus is from Anderson Tours is non-smoking and features a TV, a VCR and a bathroom. The bus will travel overnight (this means you sleep on the ride down) and return after the March late on Sunday. Send your check for \$37 made out to EGO (or Edinboro Gay Organization) to Prof. Jessica Jopp, EUP, Faculty Annex 108, Edinboro, PA 16444.

Efforts are now being made to raise money so that people who can't afford the price of the trip can attend the March. Scholarships of up to \$25 will be available. ## AIDS Funding Crisis—You Can Help

The AIDS Council of Erie County, Inc. has endured difficult times since its inception—uncertain funding, personnel problems, poor public image, spending controversies—but the current funding shortfall threatens to drastically curtail Council functions unless quick action is taken by the Governor's Office of the Budget.

**Backround** The AIDS Council is partially funded by Ryan White funds distributed by the federal government to states hardest hit by AIDS. In PA, the funding channel used to be from the Bureau of HIV/AIDS to the local AIDS service organizations. The process has changed the funds are now diverted to seven regional coalitions which oversee allocation of funding to all areas of the state. Our regional coalition is the Northwest Rural AIDS Alliance (NRAA), administered by Clarion University. Clarion, being a state entity, decided to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding with the Bureau (instead of the usual contract), a move they thought would enable them to avoid the six month delay that NRAA encountered last year. Unfortunately, because of the way this process has been handled, negotiations which began in March of 1992 (for the fiscal year beginning in July, 1992) have not yet resulted in the release of \$63,000 to the AIDS Council.

Results of Delay As this negotiation process sputtered and stalled, the Bureau of HIV/AIDS proceeded to distribute all of the available funds to the other six coalitions, plus the Department of Public Welfare's Special Pharmaceutical Program. The additional funding necessary to fulfill the Memorandum had to be requested by the Bureau, and must now be approved by the state. Despite assurances that the moneys could be released as soon as late February, nobody knows what bureaucratic hell awaits the request.

What You Can Do The local lesbigay community can have a great impact on this funding situation by calling and writing their elected officials. Urge your legislators to apply immediate pressure to the Governor's Office of the

Budget to approve the Bureau of HIV/AIDS Request for Additional Federal Funding (RAFF) so the the Northwest Rural AIDS Alliance can distribute critically needed Ryan White funds to the AIDS Council of Erie County. Let them know that this funding delay is affecting people you know and care for.

LGLV-Erie Efforts The League of Gay and Lesbian Voters is spearheading efforts to ease the AIDS Council dilemma. They are in the midst of a postcard writing campaign designed to urge increases in Ryan White funding and a more efficient system to distribute these moneys to AIDS service organizations across the state. Postcards are available at the local bars and through League members. You needn't worry about your elected officials' names and addresses, just sign your name and address to the cards and return them to the League. LGLV will address and mail them for you.

Calling your legislators or writing letters are much more effective ways of dealing with them. The League is available to guide you in your contacts. If you don't know who your legislators are, or would like a sample letter to send, call the League for help. The above-mentioned postcards are also available for distribution to friends and family.
