### In Memoriam

#### Gayle Marino April 12, 1956 — April 9, 1993

We mourn the loss of Gayle Marino, who died in San Francisco on April 9, after a brief struggle with cancer.

Gayle was an Erie native who had a strong commitment to the care and well-being of children. After she received a degree in Elementary Education from Edinboro College in 1978, she worked at the day care center of the downtown YWCA. In the early 1980s, she worked with great love and care as children's program coordinator at Hospitality House for Women. When she moved to Boston, she continued to work with the children of battered women. She had been living in San Francisco for the past several years, and was instrumental in setting up a day care program for children of Pacific Gas & Electric Company employees.

Gayle's lover, Mary Kay Hewitt, also of Erie, had this to say about Gayle: "She enjoyed life to the fullest. She had a magnificent smile and a sparkle that never left her. She kept her humor to the end, and died with dignity".
