Health Disparities & Older Adults

- US population aged 65 or older projected to reach 23.5% by 2060 (Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, 2020)
- Journal of General Internal Medicine (2019) found out one out of five older adults experiences ageism in health care settings and those who frequently experience it have a higher risk of developing a new disability or worsening existing ones. (Hoyt, 2019)

Health Disparities & LGBT+ Older Adults



- About 2.7 million U.S. adults 50 and older identify as LGBT, including 1.1 million age 65 and older. Those numbers are expected to nearly double by 2060 (American Heart Association, 2018)
- LGBT older adults report worse psychological health and greater substance use, such as heavy alcohol consumption and cigarette smoking, compared to their non-LGBT peers. (National LGBT Health Education Center, 2019)

During 4 years of education, the average medical student spends about 5 hours learning about LGBT health issues, the majority of which is focused on HIV/AIDS (Winter, 2012, p. 15) out of 35,040 hours

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
LGBTQ+ Older Adults in Long-Term Care

- Nearly nine in 10 respondents said that they thought long-term care staff would discriminate against someone who came out in a facility. (Redman, 2011)
- To avoid discrimination, many—34% of LGBTQ older people and 54% of transgender and gender nonconforming older people—fear having to re-closet themselves when seeking elder housing. (SAGE, 2021, p. 7)



Certified Nursing Assistant Training Impact on LTC Facilities/States

Better outcomes with residents

| Total Initial Training | 2004 State- 49 NH-16,125 | 2010 State- 51 NH-15,508 |
|------------------------|--------------------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| Greater than 75 hours | State- 26 (53.1) NH-8,300 (51.5) | State- 31 (60.7) NH- 9,426 (58.6) |
| 75 hours | State- 23 (46.9) NH- 7,825 (48.5) | State- 20 (39.3) NH-6,664 (41.4) |

NHs in states requiring clinical training hours above federal minimums had significantly lower odds of adverse outcomes






