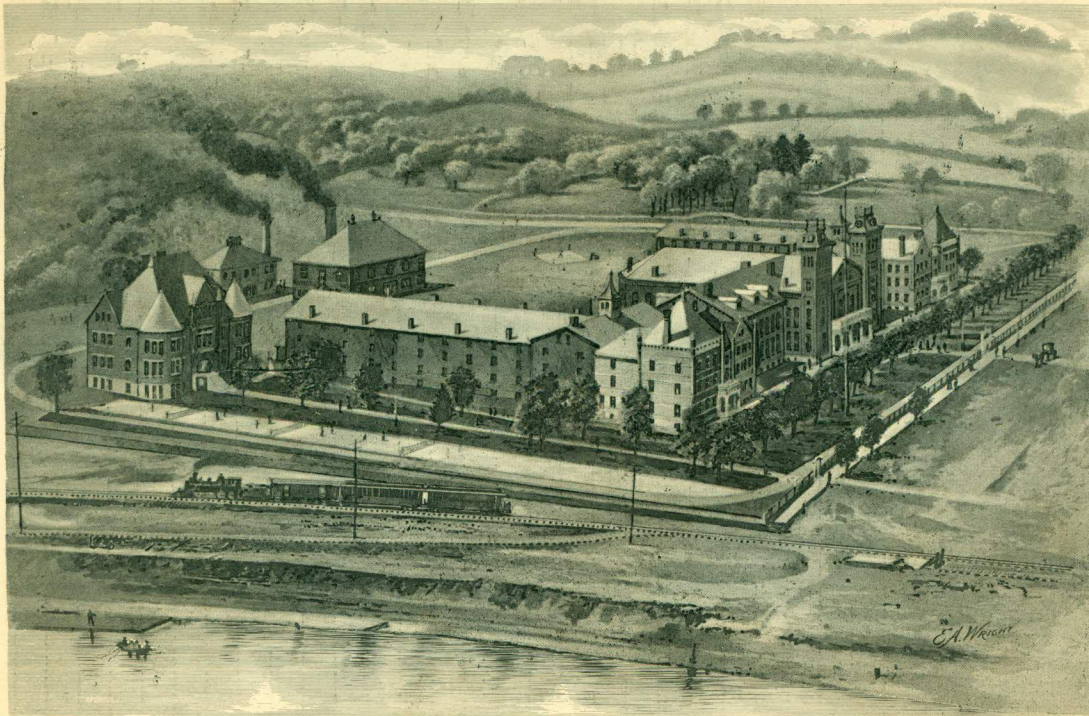

As Revised November 8, 1900.

### REGULAR COURSE.

named above. The courses in reading and classics for all the  
courses shall be determined by the Board of Principals at their  
annual meeting, and shall be the same for all Normal Schools.



## Rules for Final Examinations, Admissions to the Middle and Senior Classes, Etc.

[For all the Normal Schools of Pennsylvania.]

1. Admission to the senior and middle classes shall be determined by the State Board of Examiners at the annual examination by the Board.

2. In order to be admitted to the middle class at any State Normal School, students must be examined by the State Board in all the junior studies (except English Grammar, Arithmetic, Geography, and United States History), and this examination shall be final. Persons who desire to be admitted to the middle class without having previously attended a State Normal School, must pass an examination by the faculty and State Board of Examiners in the academic studies of the junior year (except the senior review studies), and Plane Geometry or the first Book of Cæsar, and must complete School Management in the middle year. No conditions or substitutions other than those named shall be allowed for any of the studies required for admission to the middle class.

3. In order to be admitted to the senior class, students must be examined by the State Board in all the middle year studies (except Methods), and this examination shall be final. Persons who desire to be admitted to the senior class without having previously attended a State Normal School, must pass an examination by the faculty and State Board in the academic studies of the entire course, except the review studies of the senior year; and must devote their time during the senior year to the professional studies of the course, and the review studies. No conditions or substitutions other than those named shall be allowed for any of the studies required for admission to the senior class.

4. If the faculty of any State Normal School, or the State Board of Examiners, decide that a person is not prepared to pass an examination by the State Board, he shall not be admitted to the same examinations at any other State Normal School during the same school year.

5. If a person who has completed the examinations required for admission to the middle or senior class at any State Normal School, desires to enter another Normal School, the principal of the school at which the examination was held shall send the proper certificate to the principal of the school which the person desires to attend. Except for the reason here stated, no certificate setting forth the passing of the junior or middle year studies shall be issued.

6. Candidates for graduation shall be examined by the State Board in all the branches of the Senior year, including English Grammar, Arithmetic, Geography, and United States History. They shall have the opportunity of being examined in any higher branches, including vocal and instrumental music and double-entry bookkeeping; and all studies completed by them shall be named in their certificates.

7. Persons who have been graduated may be examined at any State examination in any higher branches, and the Secretary of the Board of Examiners shall certify on the back of their diplomas to the passing of the branches completed at said examination.

8. A certificate setting forth the proficiency of all applicants in all the studies in which they desire to be examined by the State Board of Examiners shall be prepared and signed by the faculty and presented to the Board. The certificate for the studies of the junior year shall also include the standing of applicants in the review studies of the senior year.

9. Graduates of State Normal Schools in the regular course and graduates of accredited colleges may become candidates for the degrees of Bachelor of Pedagogics and Master of Pedagogics. To obtain these degrees, candidates must be examined by the faculty and State Board upon the studies of the supplementary course. Three years successful teaching in the public schools of the State since graduation (or two years in the case of candidates who taught in the Model School) will be required of all candidates for the degree of Master of Pedagogics, in addition to the branches of study indicated above.

10. Attendance at a State Normal School during the entire senior year will be required of all candidates for graduation; but candidates for the pedagogical degrees may prepare the required work *in absentia*.

## General Statement.

This institution, usually called the "Southwestern State Normal School," is one of the thirteen schools having the powers and privileges of State Normal Schools under the laws of Pennsylvania. There are in the State thirteen "Normal School Districts," in each of which a State Normal School has been established. The first of these schools to receive "recognition" as a State Normal was the one at Millersville, Lancaster county, in 1859.

The business affairs of each State Normal School are managed by a board of eighteen trustees, two-thirds of whom are elected by stockholders (or contributors), and one-third appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

This school was officially recognized in 1874 as the State Normal School for the Tenth District, composed of the counties of Washington, Fayette, Greene and Somerset.

The Southwestern State Normal School is the outgrowth of an Academy, first opened in 1852. Three years earlier the town of California was laid out. It owes its name to the excitement then prevailing over the discovery of gold in the State of California.

A bill incorporating the "California Academy" with the privileges of a State Normal School was vetoed by Governor Packer in 1859. In 1865 the school was chartered under the name of "Southwestern Normal College." The corner-stone of the present Main Building was laid August 26th, 1868. The Ladies' Dormitory was first used about four years later, and the Gentlemen's Dormitory in 1876.

Science Hall was built in 1892 and the Gymnasium in 1894.

The front extensions to the dormitories were completed in 1899. The new laundry building was also completed in 1899. The new library extension was completed in 1901.

### Location of School.

The Southwestern State Normal School is beautifully and healthfully located on the south bank of the Monongahela river,

fifty miles from Pittsburg. It is in the heart of the Monongahela Valley, and is conveniently reached from all points, being but thirty miles distant from Pittsburg by air line. Direct road from Union Station, Pittsburg. There are seven trains each way daily. The school is distant only twenty miles by rail (three trains daily) from Uniontown. There is but one change of cars from Greensburg, Scottsdale and Connellsville. Two changes from Hyndman and Meyersdale. Direct boat from Rice's Landing, Greensboro and Morgantown.

### **Grounds and Buildings.**

The School grounds consist of about 12 acres, covered with a beautiful sod, and planted with ornamental and shade trees, shrubbery and flowers. There are six buildings—a central massive and imposing edifice, having the general form of a Greek cross, with two wings used as dormitories—the one by ladies, the other by gentlemen,—Science Hall, the Gymnasium, and the Laundry.

A smooth and well graded bicycle track ten feet in width, made of fine cinders, has recently been constructed for the use of students. It surrounds the campus and is about half a mile in length. The new athletic field purchased and graded in 1900 is a model of its kind. It is about 500 feet in length, about 350 in width, and is enclosed by a board fence 8 feet in height.

## The Aim and Departments of the School.

### AIM.

The main object of the school is to furnish a thorough course of professional training for teachers in the public schools. This renders necessary first of all and most of all a body of instructors who have an ample knowledge of the subjects they teach, a deep interest in those whom they teach, and a full realization of the ever-changing needs of the public schools.

"As is the teacher, so is the school." As is the faculty of a normal school, so is the normal school. If the true teaching spirit pervades the atmosphere of a normal school, students will catch it, but not otherwise.

The faculty of this school is composed of experienced and helpful teachers — men and women who are devoted to their work, earnestly endeavoring by their teaching and their lives to set before young people high ideals of character and the surest road to true success in the teacher's calling.

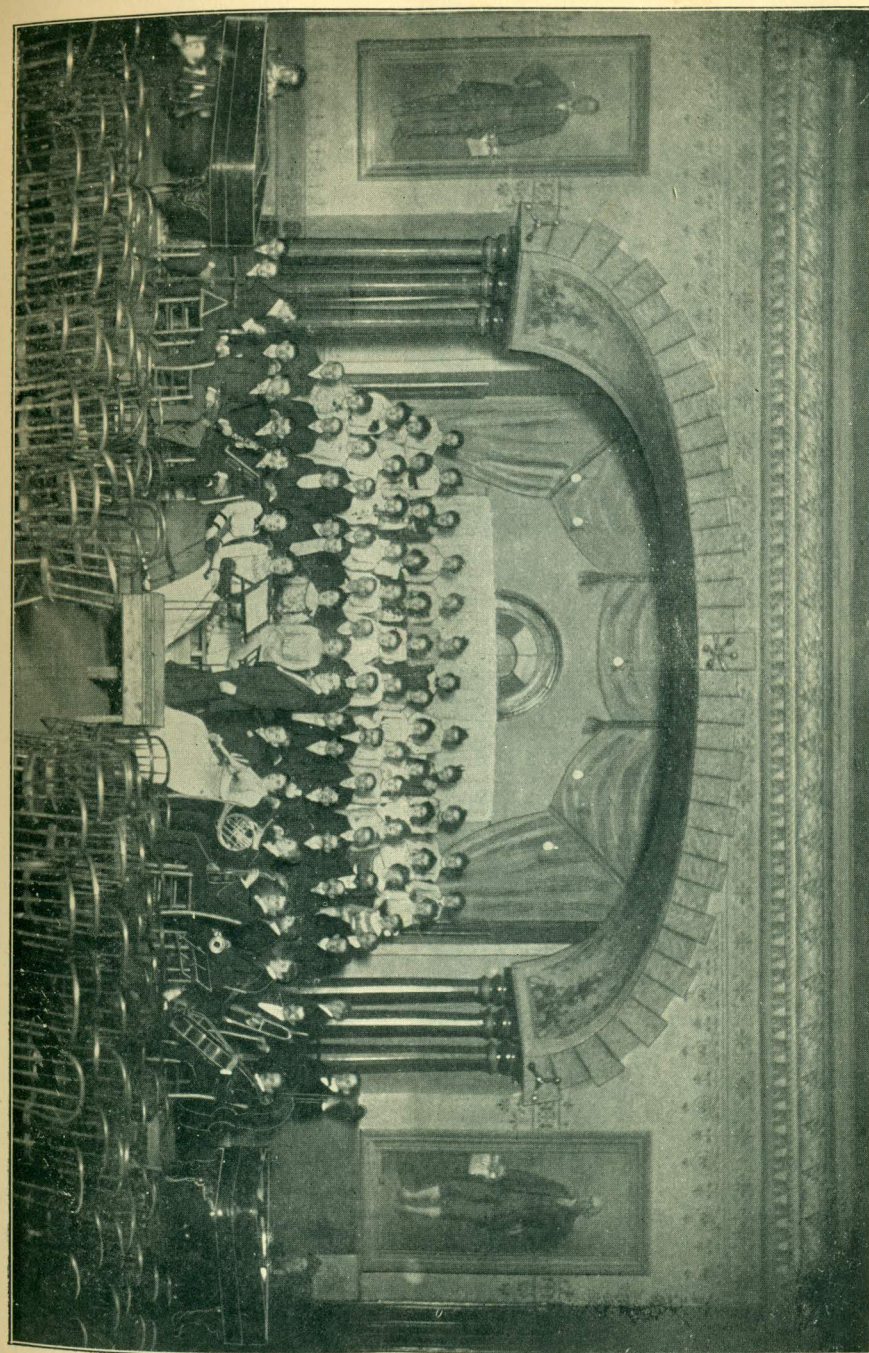
Constant efforts are made by the instructors to improve and enrich their work. Some are actively engaged in the work of teachers' institutes and as contributors to educational periodicals. Faculty Conferences are held weekly. These are chiefly devoted to literary and pedagogical discussions, and are most helpful in keeping teachers abreast of the best educational thought of the day.

### DEPARTMENTS.

The division of the work of the school into several departments serves to promote better the one great object of the school, viz., the thorough preparation of teachers.

#### Normal Department.

The normal department includes all pupils who are pursuing the studies of the Elementary or Advanced Courses. Those who have completed satisfactorily the study of the common branches in the public schools at home are prepared to enter the Normal Course here.

The school stands for a high grade of scholarship as well as good teaching ability. Yet there is no desire to consume more of a student's time than is really necessary to do the work well.

### **The Practice Department.**

#### **THE MODEL SCHOOL.**

The central aim at California is the training of teachers. For the preparation of these, in any adequate degree, an efficient practice school is necessary. "Practice is the best of all instructors."

Students study not only the theory of teaching, but engage also in the practice. The Senior class is divided into small groups, one member teaching a class of children in the presence of the critic teacher and of the other members of the group. By means of written plans for each lesson and kindly but searching criticism, each practice teacher is kept at his best. Nothing is gained by repeating mistakes, and hence we endeavor to eliminate errors as speedily as possible. The most approved methods are used. The student has before him constantly a high standard of teaching.

### **Department of Music.**

The branches taught are Piano, Violin, Voice Culture, and Theory of Music. The regular course on the pianoforte consists of three years of carefully graded work, the completion of which prepares the pupil to enter any of the best Conservatories of Music. Students may enter the course at any stage and will be graded according to their ability.

Singing is thoroughly taught, not only in the Normal department, but in all grades of the Model School. Vocal organizations, such as quartettes, choirs for the literary societies, glee clubs, etc., are numerous and afford abundant practice.

At the daily chapel exercises the regular music is often supplemented by vocal duets, quartets, etc., and by the use of such instruments as violins, cornets, etc., by students, whose help is willingly given.

In the public schools of the State vocal music has been greatly neglected. Our students are impressed with the fact

that all children may learn to sing, that a songless child Nature is rarely responsible for, but neglect or bad teaching often.

Music, especially vocal music, we use largely as an educational means and not merely as an art by itself. It promotes habits of close attention, concerted action, mental alertness, development of the vocal organs, good cheer, greater interest in school.

### Physical Culture Department.

It is the duty of a normal school to send out students who are physically as well as intellectually and professionally well equipped for the arduous tasks of the teacher's vocation.

### GYMNASIUM.

The work in our gymnasium has the two-fold object of securing the symmetrical development and promoting the general health of students, and making them familiar with the best methods of physical education suited to the needs of the common schools.

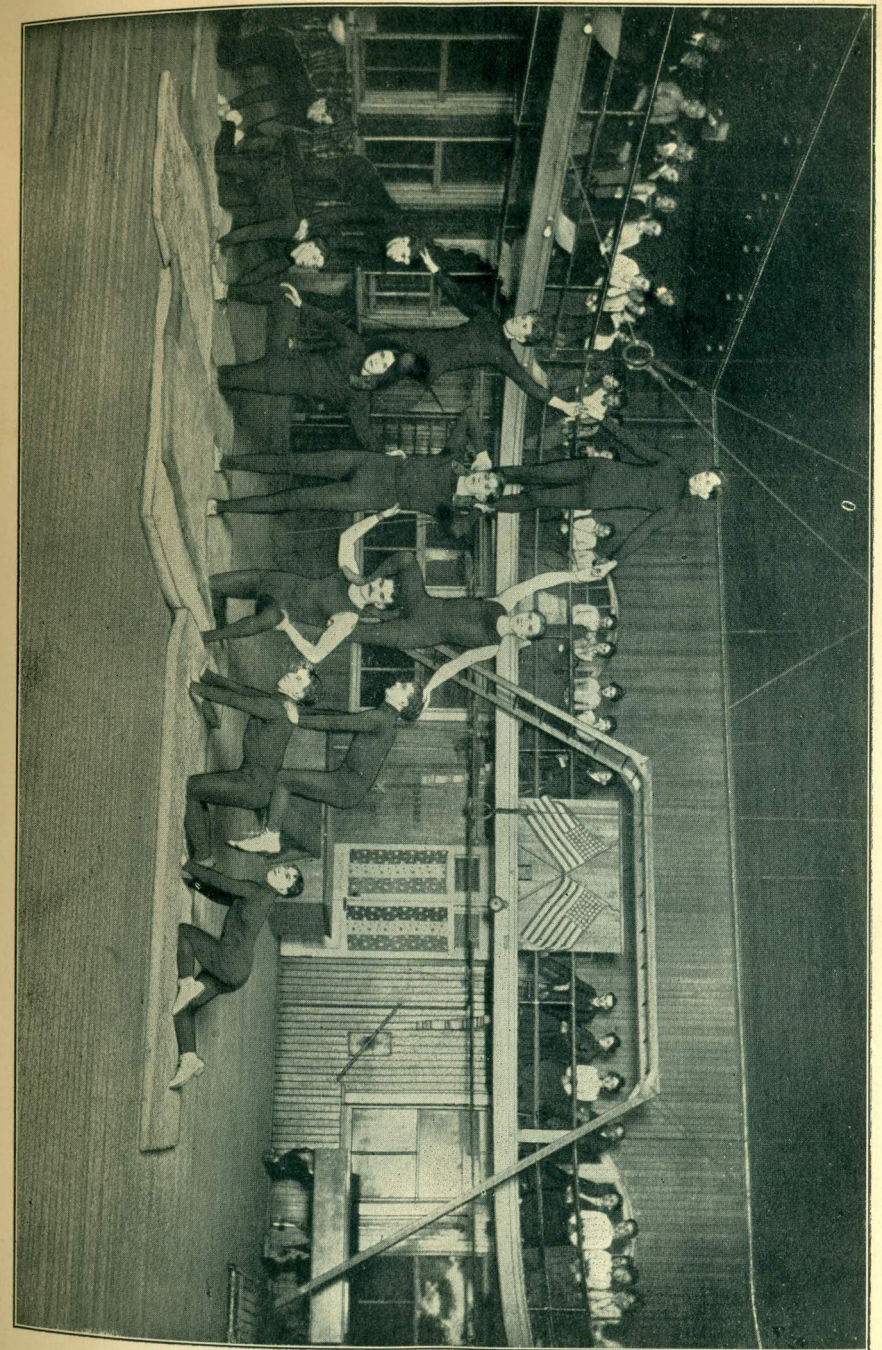
The new gymnasium is fully equipped with the best and most useful modern appliances for developing the body and correcting physical defects.

The regular class drills, which all students in the senior and junior classes are required to attend, consist of Indian club, dumb-bell and wand exercises; also free exercises and apparatus work, together with marching and various recreations. Gymnasium suits are required. Suits (dark maroon) for ladies may be purchased or rented at the school.

We encourage, within limits, such games as base ball, foot ball, basket ball, lawn tennis, etc.

### HEALTH RECORD OF CALIFORNIA.

Few schools, if any, can show such a remarkably good health record as California. Aside from ordinary colds and the occasional prevalence of such light diseases as measles, the cases of sickness have been extremely rare. Among the thousands of students who have resided at the school in the last twenty years, there have been but three cases of typhoid fever and three of scarlet fever, none of which were malignant. There has never been a death at the school, nor an epidemic of any dangerous

disease, and for years in succession we have been exempt from any case of serious illness. The sanitary condition of the buildings is the safest and best.

### **Commercial Department.**

In this department, instruction is largely individual, thus enabling students to enter at any time. The aim is to fit students to undertake at once the duties of qualified amanuenses, type-writers, and bookkeepers, upon leaving school. The course includes Bookkeeping, Shorthand, Typewriting, Banking, and Commercial Law, with supplementary training in Spelling, Punctuation, etc., Manifolding, Indexing, Letter Filing, Business Forms, and Correspondence. If desired, students may enter for one of these branches only. The Pernin system of Shorthand is used, the most concise, brief, rapid, legible, comprehensive, and easily learned system of shorthand in practice. Diplomas are granted to all who complete the course and pass the final examination.

### Characteristic Features of the School.

#### The Library.

The Normal Library is one of the finest school libraries in the State. The collection of books is large and choice. Many daily newspapers, about forty weekly papers and the leading magazines, and illustrated periodicals are to be found on the tables. The new Library Annex will be ready for use Sept. 1. It will more than double the present size of the library.

The reading room is very large and is beautifully lighted with electric lamps. It is centrally located in the buildings, and is central to most of the work done in the school. Impressive silence prevails, even when the library is thronged with readers.

The Library is a very hive of industry. The conditions are such as to give the student familiarity with the best books and power in using them. The work in the class room shows the effect of the Library. The Library method characterizes the whole literary side of the school, and the laboratory method the science side. The aim is to promote research, independence of thought, and vital interest in all work done.

We have sought earnestly, and successfully, to make our reading room highly attractive and valuable to our students.

The Library and Reading Room are combined. The room is open an average of seven and one-half hours daily. Book cases cover six hundred and fifty-two square feet of sides of room. The books are classified, arranged, and shelved so that even the youngest student in the school can find reference books on any subject.

A Reading Course on some special line of work is prepared for each class in the school. This is kept in the Library and the name of each student using the books is placed on file.

Each student is required to read not less than three hours a week on this special course, not including reference work, and at stated times to present a report of what has been read. The so-called "book report" is a most interesting and valuable feature of the literary work of the school.

#### Literary Societies.

There are two flourishing Literary Societies, the Clonian and the Philomathean, at the Normal. They have worked side by side in friendly rivalry for many years. Each Society occupies a large and beautiful hall, complete in all its appointments. The weekly exercises are of a very interesting character and afford to the members a most valuable literary training. Much of the success of California Normal graduates is due to the training received in these societies. No event of the year at California is quite so popular as the "Annual Contest" between these two societies, and the Normal Chapel is usually crowded by the audience assembled to witness this "battle of the giants."

Science and Nature Study.

The Science Rooms are especially well arranged and equipped. The Lecture room accommodates on its rising tiers of seats over one hundred persons. For illustrative purposes, a solar camera and magic lantern are in use. The Laboratory is a large room well provided with individual tables for students, cases for apparatus, etc.

The course in Physics consists of lecture room experiments and recitations covering the subjects of Properties of Matter, Mechanics of Solids and Fluids, Heat, Electricity, Sound, and Light. Individual experiments in laboratory are carried through the year, each student performing twenty or more experiments verifying important principles.

The work in Botany, as well as in other lines of science, is begun in the lowest grades of the practice school as systematic observation lessons.

The study of Physiology is aided and supplemented by frequent dissections, material from the butchers, models, charts, manikins, etc. Excellent facilities are found to render the study of Chemistry, Geology, Zoology, attractive and profitable.

Social Life at the Normal.

Education without social culture is incomplete; and none stand more in need of refined tastes and polite manners than the teacher. Every public school should have a teacher with a well informed mind, refined manners and a pure life. Ample opportunities for social culture are given in the school. Through the fall and winter terms, receptions and sociables are frequently held. These are attended by students and teachers; and the aim is to blend instruction with entertainment, and to cultivate that ease of manner and, at the same time, that becoming reserve, which should characterize the associations of ladies and gentlemen. During the spring term, indoor socials are less frequent, general games on the campus meeting to a large extent this need.

The Twice-a-Week Club.

This association, formed one year ago for faculty and all boarding students, has proved to be a most popular and fruitful means of entertainment and instruction.

Reception committees meet new students at the station, when they arrive, and show them just those kindly attentions that are most needed and appreciated at such a time.

No occasion for embarrassment or homesickness is allowed to arise if it can be prevented. The spirit of the best home is the spirit of the school. The motto of the school is "Help Everybody, Hinder Nobody."

### Art Study.

The study of Art, although incidental to the direct purpose of the school, is emphasized in an unusual degree. A large collection of photographs of great works of art, paintings, statues, and buildings, has recently been received from Europe. These are appropriately framed and adorn the walls of the buildings. They are all silent teachers of art.

The works of Michael Angelo, Raphael, Leonardo da Vinci, Guido Reni, Murillo, Rembrandt, Rubens, Titian, and many later masters are represented by numerous specimens. The teaching of such subjects as literature, history, geography, etc., is illustrated by these pictures and by the use of the stereopticon.

### Religious Life at the Normal.

The religious atmosphere of the Normal impresses every one. The active Christian work of the students and faculty is an inspiration to every new student. There are strong organizations of the Y. M. C. A., Y. W. C. A., etc. Each year delegates are sent to Moody's Summer School at Northfield, Mass. Earnest young people and thoughtful parents appreciate the advantages of a school that provides a safe Christian home. A healthful moral atmosphere should surround the student. While the authorities of this school avoid everything of a sectarian nature, they endeavor in every proper way to interest students in Christian work. Devotional exercises are conducted on the morning of each day in the Chapel. Attendance at some church service in town on Sabbath morning is expected of all, as is also attendance at Sabbath evening services in the Chapel. A voluntary students' prayer meeting is held on Sabbath evening just previous to the Chapel service. This meeting has been largely attended for several years, and has been a means of

great good. In all the religious services of the schools students are encouraged to take an active part.

### The Students' Rooms

are large, light, and cheery. They are heated by steam, lighted by electricity, carpeted, newly papered, and provided with dressing case, table, spring bed, washstand, and wardrobe. They are cosy and attractive.

### The Boarding

at a boarding school is always inquired about with genuine interest by those who are to enjoy it, or at least to endure it, for a year or more. We have made a careful study of the whole problem. We do not promise such a variety in the table fare as may be had at a hotel where the charges are as much per day as they are here per week. We provide, however, substantial food, in sufficient quantity and of a good quality, with neat and careful service. We can say for our boarding that our students like it. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating."

The dining room is a spacious, pleasant hall, well lighted by electricity. The meal times at the Normal are among the hours that will linger long and pleasantly in the memories of students. The teachers and most advanced students are so distributed as to make conversation interesting and profitable at each table.

### SUGGESTIONS TO THOSE EXPECTING TO BECOME STUDENTS.

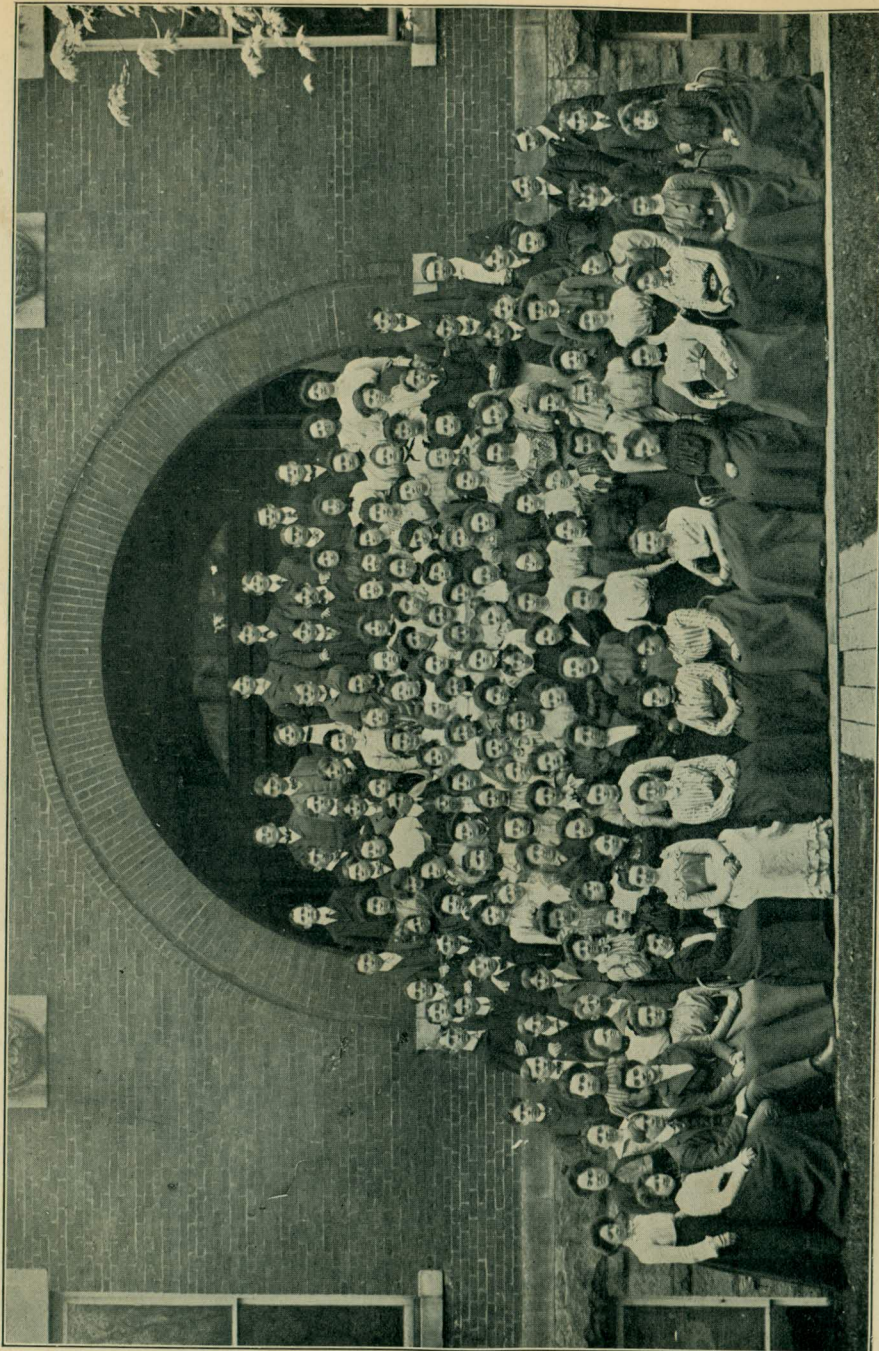
1. You are prepared to enter here when you have completed the usual course in common schools at home.

5. Expect to do faithful, earnest work while here, and to make study your single aim.
6. Come on first day of term, neither earlier nor later, unless circumstances require it.
7. Bring with you for reference whatever text books you have; you will find such books useful. The new books you may need can be bought cheaper here than at home.
8. The Normal School is but five minutes' walk from the station. Leave trunk checks with the agent, and come at once to the Principal's office at the school. The baggage will be delivered at the school free of charge.
