# *Leadership and Loyalty*

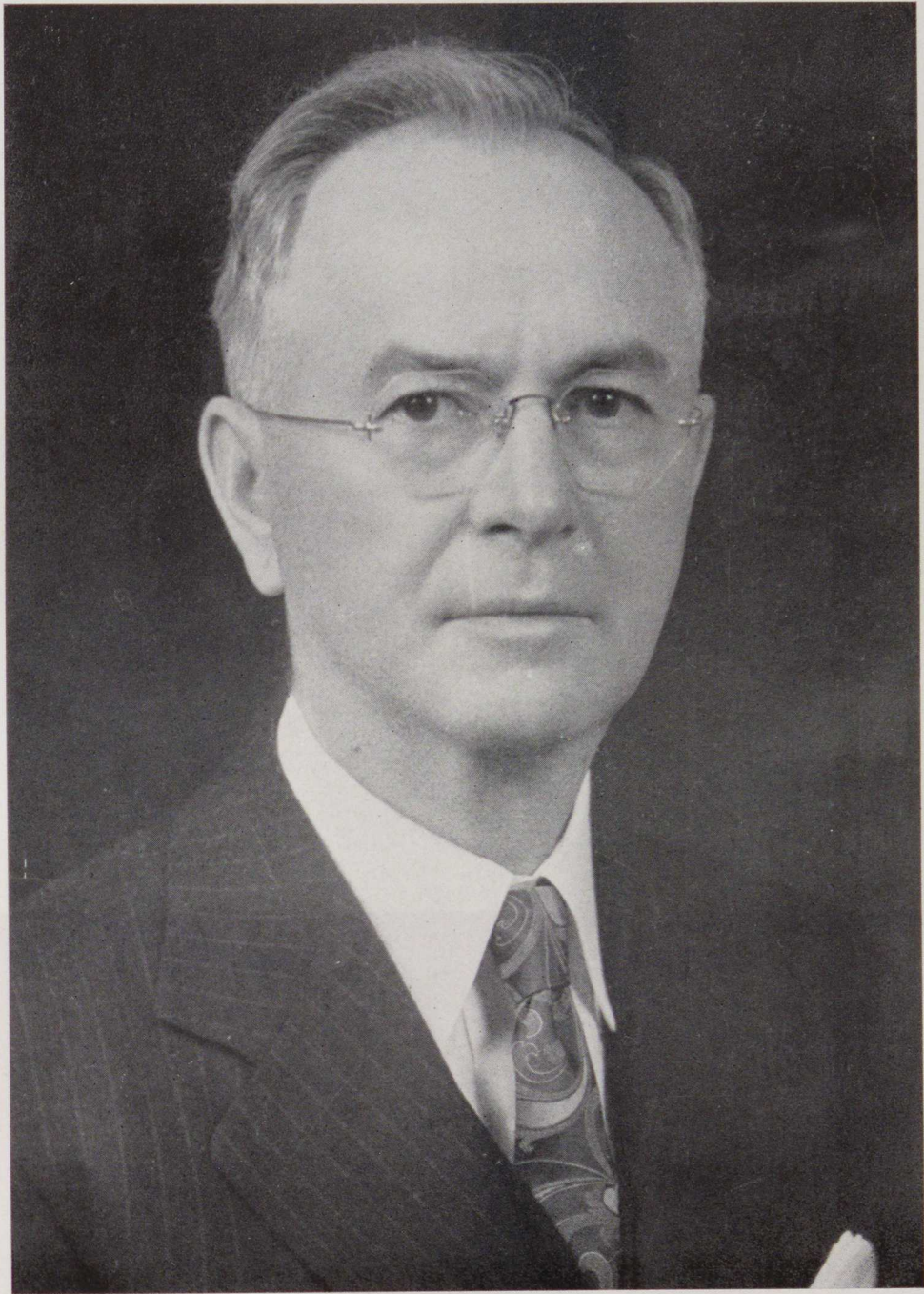

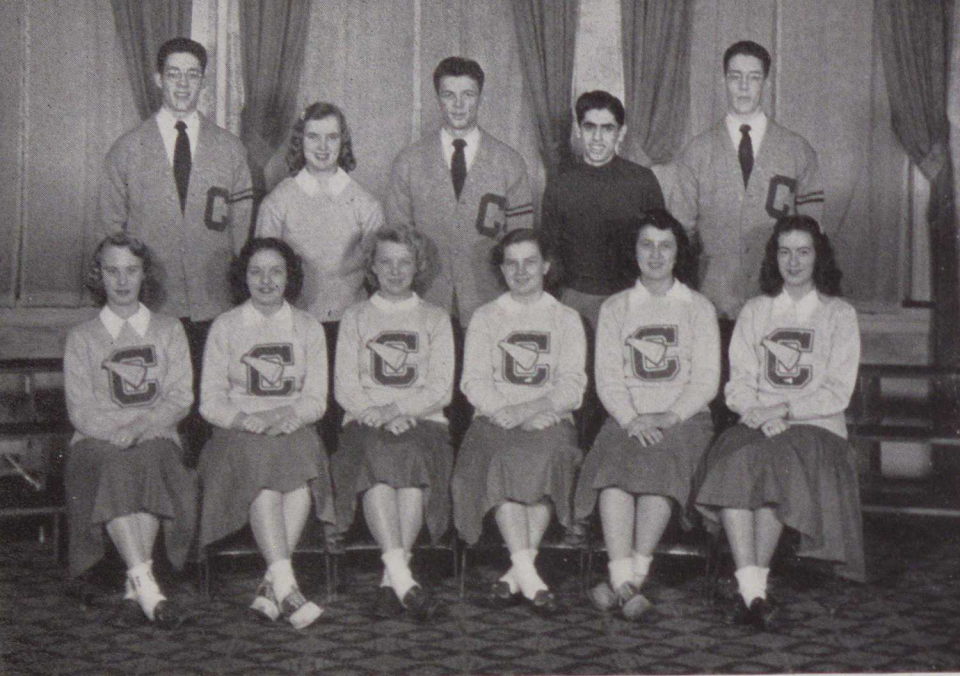
## *Band*

Student participation at bonfires, pep meetings, and snake parades and response with cheers at basketball and football games proved the success of their efforts.



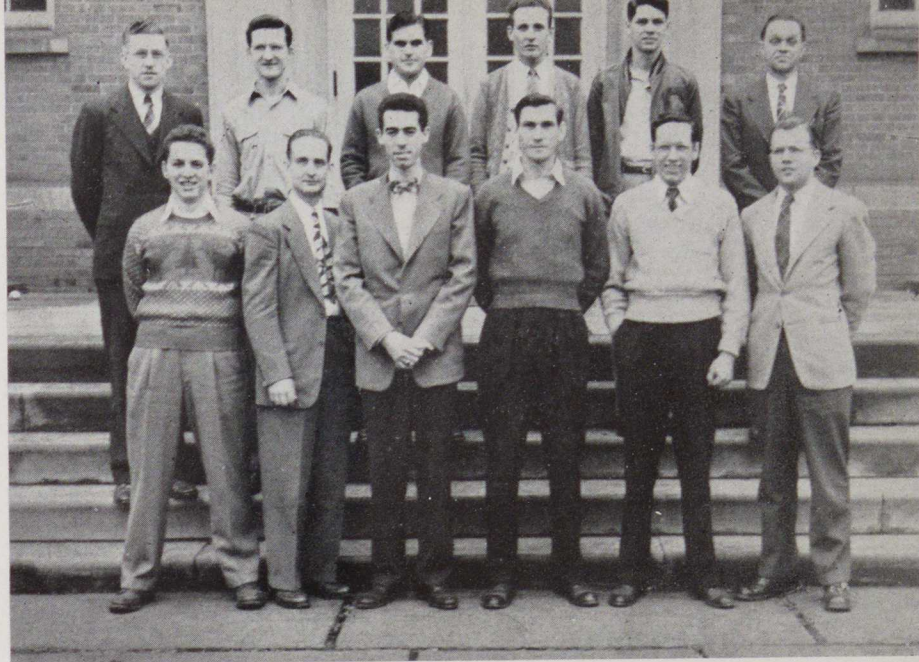

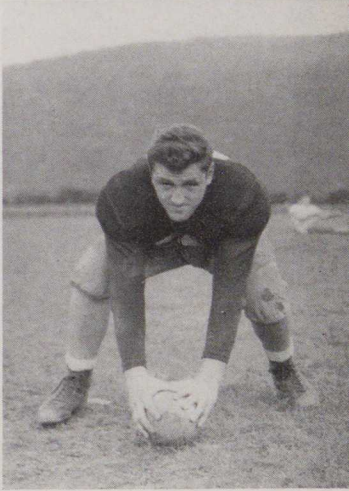
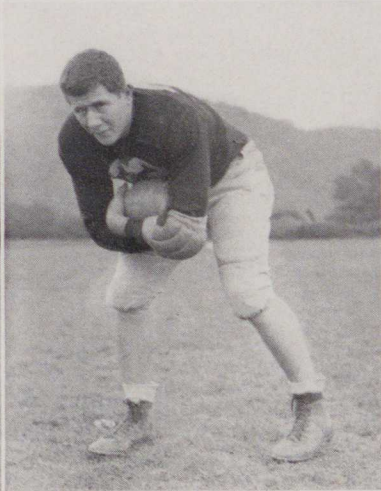
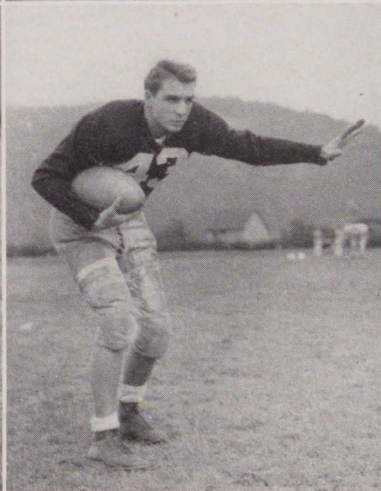
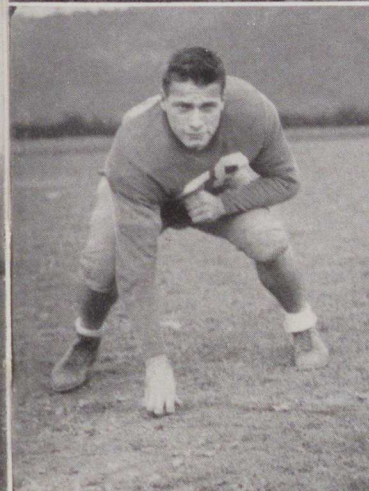
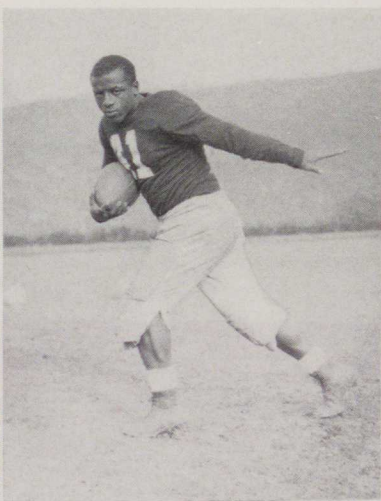
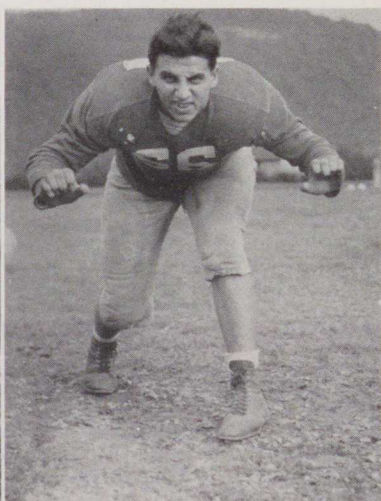
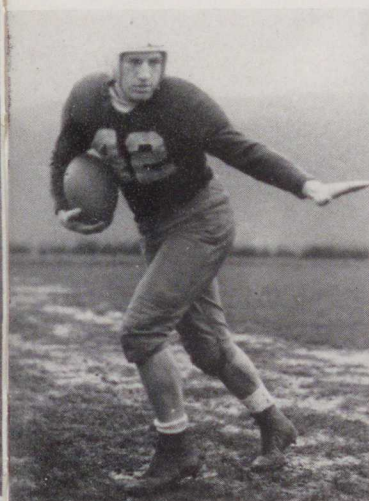






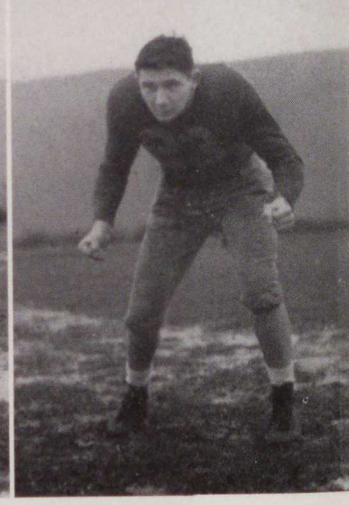
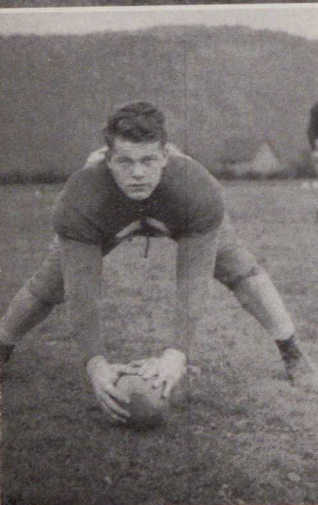
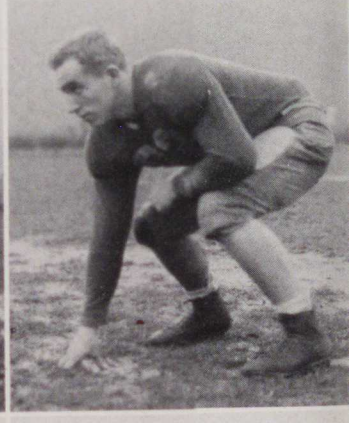
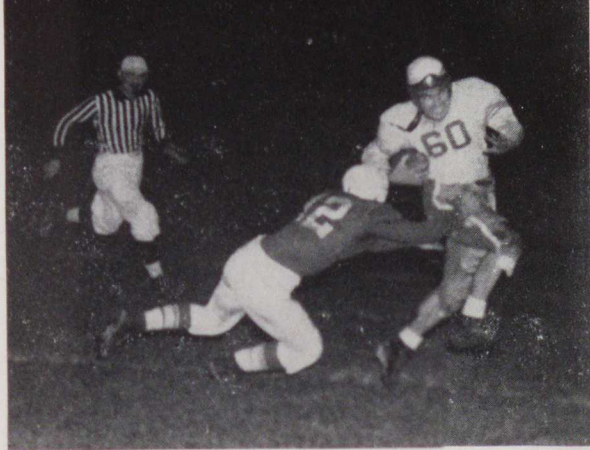
When the All-State Teachers College football selections were made, the Vulcans received their share of attention. Two men made the first team and one other was mentioned on the list of those receiving honors.
