

That I will obey its laws and customs, respect its ideals, and honor its traditions; That I will continually endeavor to prepare myself for the noblest of all professions — that of teaching;


And in all these ways I will strive to transmit to my successors a greater, better, and more beautiful California than was inherited by me.



HE FUNDAMENTAL objective of every college is, and ought to be, education for effective citizenship on all levels—local, state, national, and world. Citizens are needed who have a broad perspective and a critical and constructive approach to life with convictions and standards of value by which men can live noble lives. They must have the ability to think, to communicate, to make valid judgments,

and to evaluate moral situations. We need citizens who have a deep sense of responsibility for their fellows and who are not bounded on the north, south, east, and west by themselves. We want citizens who are deeply concerned with moral and spiritual values, whose philosophy of life will not be built on a materialistic foundation. We want them at all times to place public usefulness above personal succees. We want men and women who are not ashamed to do the humble things of life and to discover and use for themselves and society the special gifts with which they have been endowed. Citizens must know that the democratic way of life cherishes freedom, but it also entails obligation and even sacrifice for its preservation. A democracy cannot exist if its citizens are parasites endeavoring to get something for nothing. It can survive only if its citizenry is composed of independent and responsible persons who think and act wisely when confronted by any new idea or situation, and who are sufficiently disciplined to observe the rights of others and to aid others in sharing their privileges. A democracy will advance to the extent that its citizenry, in addition to the qualities cited, uses its leisure in ways "creative not corruptive" and goes on learning throughout life, adapting to change without losing either principle or conviction.

Of major importance on the calendar of activities were the College and the High School Playdays. On these days the California girls acted as hostesses to girls of other colleges and high schools.


Although outstanding ability was recognized by letter awards, the chief goal of the organization was the stimulation of an active interest in sports.





The Vulcan football team opened its 1950 season with a 14 to 7 victory over the State Teachers College at Edinboro. Natali and Bailey both scored for California, and Polak kicked the two extra points.

West Liberty continued to win over California for the fourth consecutive time. The West Virginians presennted themselves as a powerful opponent to whom the Vulcans lost with a 13 to 0 score.

Perhaps the most outstanding game of the season was that with the State Teachers College at Indiana. Frank Shaffer, Indiana quarterback, led his teammates to a 20 to 0 victory with a fine exhibition of football handling.




