California University, a proud member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, is eagerly moving forward in the 21st century, while remaining proud of its more than 150-year history. Some of its structures date to the mid-1800s, but three new residence halls, located on the lower campus, opened fall 2004.

Cal U traces its roots to California Seminary, which opened in 1852. California has been a normal school, state teachers college and, since 1983, a university. The campus has grown over the years from a handful of buildings to 39, located on 92 acres. Our location along a bend of the Monongahela River is only 35 miles from downtown Pittsburgh.



Students can choose from more than 100 undergraduate courses of study and 30 graduate programs, many online. In addition, Cal U offers associate

degrees and certification programs. Its mission is to build character and build careers, and Cal U has been nationally recognized for the excellent curriculum and its emphasis on character-building qualities.

The Welcome Center, located in the Eberly Science and Technology Center, provides visitors with additional information about the university.



The entire campus, including residence halls, is equipped with fiber optic cable.

Explore all our campus has to offer such as the exquisite stained glass windows of Pennsylvania wildflowers in Grand Hall of Old Main. Old Main Park with its iron fence and trickling fountain reflects the look of the

original campus. The Founders' Garden, adjacent to Old Main, is a quiet oasis on our busy campus. Stroll through our sculpture garden with its featured work, the magnificent Ascent of Humanity that adorns the Duda World Culture Building.

Off-campus, there are many activities to enjoy in the region including hiking, rafting, bicycling, canoeing, skiing, and horseback riding. Nearby shopping includes Washington Crown Center, Century III and South Hills Village malls, as well as quaint antique shops and specialty shores.

From the North (Erie, Pittsburgh)
Interstate 79 South to Interstate 70 Exit, Interstate 70 East to Exit 37A (Toll Road 43)

From the South East (Baltimore MD, Washington DC)

Take the California Exit (bear right at end of exit). Stay straight toward Wood Street. Follow Wood Street down to intersection at Third Street. (at stop light) At the stop light, turn right onto Third Street and follow straight onto campus.
