
### Pygmalion




### College Players Present




### Kappa Delta Pi

### **Tennis**




We sincerely believe that the graduates of California State Teachers College are adequately prepared and possess the professional competencies for effective teaching in a modern society.


#### Science Building



Science Hall, which stands near the center of the northern boundary of the campus, was built in 1892 and remodeled in 1938. The laboratories, equipped to accommodate 30 students at a time, are modern in every respect. The chemistry, physics, and biology laboratories with lecture rooms adjacent are located in Science Hall. Approval has been given to erect a new classroom building for the sciences. An Allocation of \$8,665,000 has been made for this purpose.
