Caught From Behind



Anything that could be written in the next few paragraphs could not begin to describe or illustrate the 1958 edition of the State Teachers College Conference Champions, the only undefeated team in Pennsylvania, and one of the four-teen undefeated small colleges in the nation—California State Teachers College Vulcans.

The pigskin wonders started off their fabulous season against their arch rivals from Indiana. Turning a pair of fumbles into T. D.'s, our Vulcans copped their first win 13-0. The Bald Eagles of Lock Haven offered the Vulcans their next opposition, and C. S. T. C. Dads went home happy over a 20-7 victory. The following week end saw our team traveling to far away Shippensburg. This was to be California's big test, and they handed in a perfect paper, blanking the Red Raiders 19-0 and outgaining their opponents on the ground, 275 vards to 74. Headlines told the news; California, for the first time in Conference history, took sole possession of the Conference lead. At the time it was also announced that the Vulcans had filled their schedule by contracting Susquehanna University to fill an open date. To climax one of California's biggest and best Homecoming Days, the Vulcans tallied four times in the second half to annihilate the Rockets of Slippery Rock, 34-6, before an enthusiastic throng of more than 4,000

fans. California partisans were thrilled by the spectacular ball handling of Sophomore Quarterback, Tony Soukovich; the outstanding running of halfbacks Phil Clifford and Carl Trimber; and also the fantastic defensive eleven who, thus far, held their rivals to 2 T. D.'s in the four games to date. Seven days later the Vulcans tacked on number 5 at the field of the Clarion Golden Eagles. Trimber and D'Arrigo paced the field to lead their squad to a 28-0 victory. Now came the real test, the long trek to Susquehanna to play the first non-conference game. Vulcan fans were again thrilled as their boys smothered their N.C.A.A. opponents, 32-12. The fever was now running at a torrid pitch. Six straight victories . . . Would we go all the way??? This was the question on the lips and in the minds of everyone as California journeyed to cold and blustering Edinboro for their last conference game. After a scoreless first half, Phil Clifford

broke the scoring ice as California fans shrieked with joy. Headlines now read:

"Cal. Teachers Grab 7th Straight; C.S.T.C. Can Cop S.T.C. Conference Crown if Indiana Loses Next Week to Clarion." They did, and on the same day California wound up a perfect season by

crunching W & J, 41-6.


Coach Nemeth was named "Curbstone Coach of the Year," Phil Clifford and Carl Trimber were acclaimed the scoring leaders of the S.T.C. Conference and also of Western Pennsylvania. Don Skupinsky was named the best punter of the N.A.I.A. Cal. Teachers was rated by Litkenhous as being a better team than Yale; all of this, plus the fact that California State Teachers College Vulcans were undefeated Conference Champions for the first time in history, made the 1958 football season at C.S.T.C. one that will never be forgotten.




Basketball


