

As the white man continued to settle on the new frontiers, resentment grew among the Indians who owned the land. In, 1767, the story has it that Indians met on the present site of California to voice their anger at the intrusion.

Their chief was Sagamoor who was aided by another powerful red man from Washington—Catfish. As was the case with most of these types of sit-ins, the white man paid no attention and settled anyway.



Samuel Johnson bought from the Indians on April 5, 1769 a tract of land containing Indian Hill where he settled.

This was near Fort Redstone (Brownsville). No settler ever built very far from a fort.

Pennsylvania and Virginia laid claim to the territory throughout the period following the Revolution.



Even New England states laid claim to this territory on the Monongahela.

The community of California like so many other such towns was nothing more than trees, a few homes and more trees.


It wasn't until the middle 1800s that California began to grow into important industrial town.



The title to the town of California was at one time vested in an Indian Chief known as Indian Peter . . .

Brick making was a big industry for many years in California.

These bricks were "hand pressed" and a company's daily output might be 20,000 bricks.



The lower end of College Avenue was originally known as Brick Alley.

Beginning in 1851, a boat building industry existed which extended from Coal Center to Phillipsburg or the entire length of California. The constructed crafts were sent from California to the Ohio, Mississippi, Missouri and Monongahela rivers. Many boats were sent as far as the mighty Amazon of South America.



There were four launch ways for these large crafts—two north toward Pittsburgh and two south toward Brownsville.





Frequently boat races were held on the Mon River when the river was at flood stage. But the boat building industry diminished with

the coming of the railroad which sliced straight through the boat yards.



Greenfield (Coal Center) was laid out in lots in 1819 . . . The name of its Post office was "Pike Run", named after the creek that was the dividing line between Greenfield and California.

In the early days of our town, much produce was shipped from this point to New Orleans by flatboats which still slide down the Mon River.







On the edge of Hi-Point there were many road houses where the town residents could watch the boats pilot around the horseshoe curve.





With the coming of the "Omnibus Bill" and its fifth provision concerning "Fugitive Slaves", jury trial for Negroes was made impossible.

Many citizens aided the Negroes in their escape to Canada.

California had two sources for its supply of runaways—Cumberland, Maryland and Morgantown, Virginia.



The runaways from Cumberland, upon reaching Pittsburgh, were hidden on boats destined for the upper Monongahela.

Some of these were taken from the California wharf, at the foot of Union Street, and quickly hurried up First Street to the Job Johnson Hotel, corner of First and Woods Streets.

Another home that was a haven for runaway slaves was the hotel that is the present Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity House.

Reverend Samuel Rothwell, a lay minister, established the first common school in 1851. He was an outstanding instructor in woodwork—the first vocational teacher.

This lasted one year, then the California Seminary was built at Fifth and Liberty streets.

AL SCHOOL INSYLVANIA

Early in the morning strangers were coming in and by eleven o'clock the Steamer Chieftain arrived at our wharf with a large crowd of people . . . The number that day was variously estimated at from three to five thousand persons." The term of 1874–75

increased the enrollment of the entire school to 359. All students over 17 who agreed to teach the common schools received 50¢ a week and there was a provision that he would be paid one dollar a week if his father had been killed in the Civil War. He was

charged \$3.00 a week for Room and Board, and tuition was \$1.25. But ill times fell. The Sheriff sold all the house and kitchen furniture. The school was able to rent it back for \$100 a year.



THE COLLEGE 1913 . . . Students were entertained in the Chapel with funeral marches.

For one week the College was under quarantine with guards posted around the school to prevent anyone from leaving.

As a treat, one of the woman teachers took the dormitory gire to the moving pictures.



The school had a garden and every senior had a plot. The vegetables were used by the school.


Pitt University ran an advertisement in the Yearbook showing an enrollment of 2,700 students and 300 instructors.


A drinking fountain was established in Main Hall.

On a typical cold, windy morning in November, people from all over Western Pennsylvania came to Californi
















The Vulcans found themselves on the losing end of the 14-0 first quarter score against IUP. The second quarter

Frezzel, piled up 1,502 total yards rushing for the '67 season. This rapid real estate dealing resulted in CSC accumulating 187.7 yards per contest. The opponents checked in with 92.6 yards coming for their game average. In the passing department Jeff Petrucci, junior quarterback from Charleroi, attempted to complete 233 aerials this past season; connecting with 114 and having 22 intercepted. Petrucci ranked high in the final NAIA tabulations, with 1,984 yards coming via the pass. On the opponents' side of the log: they attempted 198, completing 84, and had 11 picked off by CSC's defense for a total of 1,238 yards through the air.

The combined offensive yardage total for CSC was 3,486 yards for a 435.7 yard per game average in both the passing and running departments. As for CSC's opponents they checked in with 1,979 yards for the combined total with a game average of 247.3

yards.

Jim Boggio by virtue of scoring four TD's in the last game of the '67 season against Edinboro, claimed the honor of scoring the most TD's, nine for 54 total points. Checking in with six Td's, George Carlock was in constant rivalry with Pete Gialames who scored five TD's. Carlock snared the oval 26 times in 8 games for 425 net yards that resulted in a 53.1 yard average per game. Edging out Carlock in every department except for TD's Gialames caught the pigskin 29 times in 8 games for 525 net yards and a 75 yard per game average.

Jeff Petrucci led the CSC Vulcans throughout the '67 season in making clutch calls pay off for Vulcan offensive effort. In the '67 season Petrucci tossed for 19 touchdowns in 8 games and as a result had 1,984 net yards compiled in

his favor.

Throughout most of the season the Vulcan offensive line moved steadily into enemy territory and usually capitalized on good field position for the score.

Jeff Weaver, CSC senior center from California, who was forced out of action in the last few contests because of a hairline fracture of his leg, composed the duo that delivered for the Vulcans. With Petrucci at the helm and Weaver at center the Vulcans had a productive offense in '67 . . . John Wislocki—CALIFORNIA TIMES.







































Greek Week


















































Sigma Kappa won the overall Greek Week trophy again this year in addition to winning Greek Sing, Indoors, and Outdoors.

The Delts captured their first over-all trophy for Greek Week. They had a total of 37.5 points.








Grant Robbin








On January 17 the audience at Hamer Hall had a double treat. This night two groups instead of one appeared—Tommy James and the Shondells and Jay and the Americans.


























the Vulcans in the second half and the Indians took advantage of this and built up a nine point lead. The Vulcans fought back and took a one point lead.







Winter was also the battleground for the resident as it provided the ammunition for many bitter snowball fights.




to graduation. It was a smile from Dr. Duda as we walked across campus that made us feel that we were an integral part of California and not just a number.
