J. In Witness Whereof, the Board of Trustees of the said College has caused this Bond to be signed on its behalf by its President and Secretary and countersigned by its Treasurer and has caused its corporate Seal to be affixed thereto this second day of June A. D. eighteen hundred and seventy three.

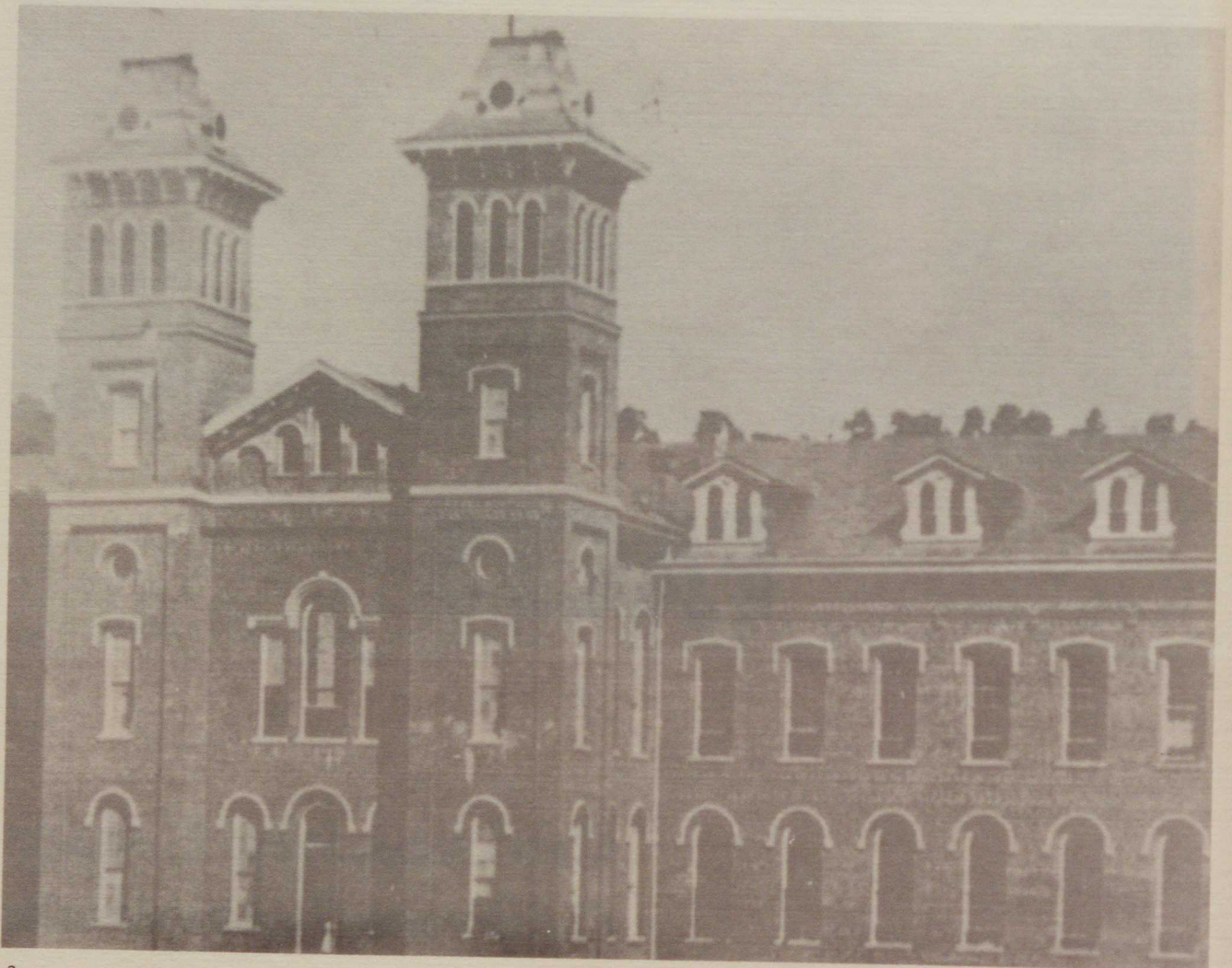

HISTORY OF CALIFORNIA STATE COLLEGE

In 1865 a charter was secured from the state for the Southwestern Normal College, and what had been the California Seminary was gone forever. The population of the school was 576, and the faculty was composed of the principal and five other teachers. The summer term of 1867 boasted 125 students, the largest enrollment in the school's history.

Codes of conduct and behavior for students were established. For example,

"Every student who willfully disobeys the rules of the institution will be promptly dismissed; and if he leaves before the session, without an honorable dismissal or is deficient in punctuality or payment of dues, or persistently refuses to prepare his Literary Exercises, or avoids the Examinations, his name will be marked in the next annual catalogue as delinquent."

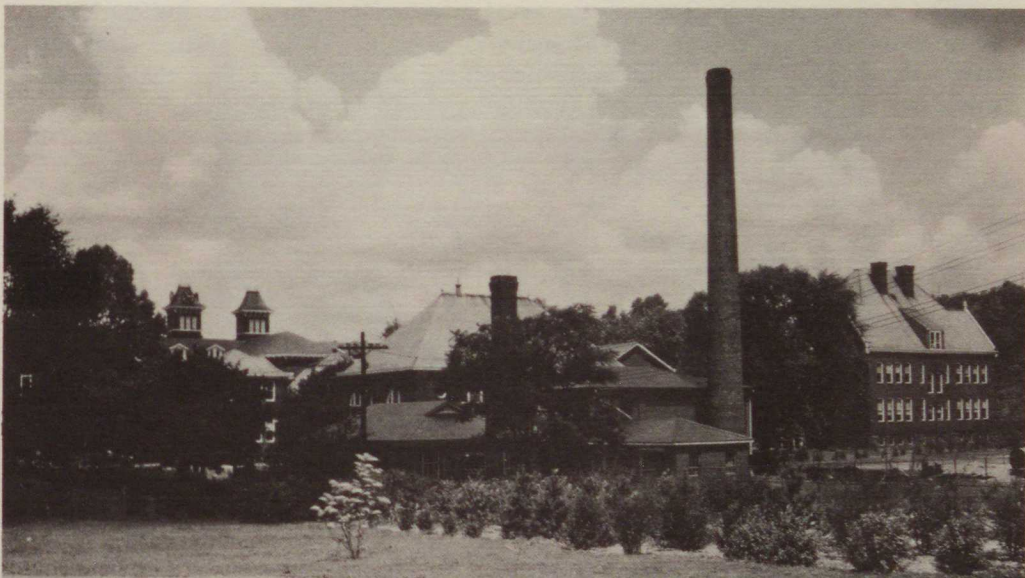


Students were required to go to chapel every morning and to the church of their choice on Sundays. The California borough maintained its ban on liquor within the institution.



The official recognition as a Normal School came on May 26, 1874. The first faculty consisted of 12 teachers, and the student enrollment was 359, with the senior class boasting two members.

The tuition at this time for a 12 week session was \$8.00. For those students who needed financial aid, the following program was set up; All students over 17 years of age agreed to teach in the common schools of the state were to receive 50¢ per week or if he were an orphan of a soldier or a sailor who had lost his life in the service of the U.S., \$1.00 per week. Room and board were \$3.00 per week, and tuition was \$1.25.

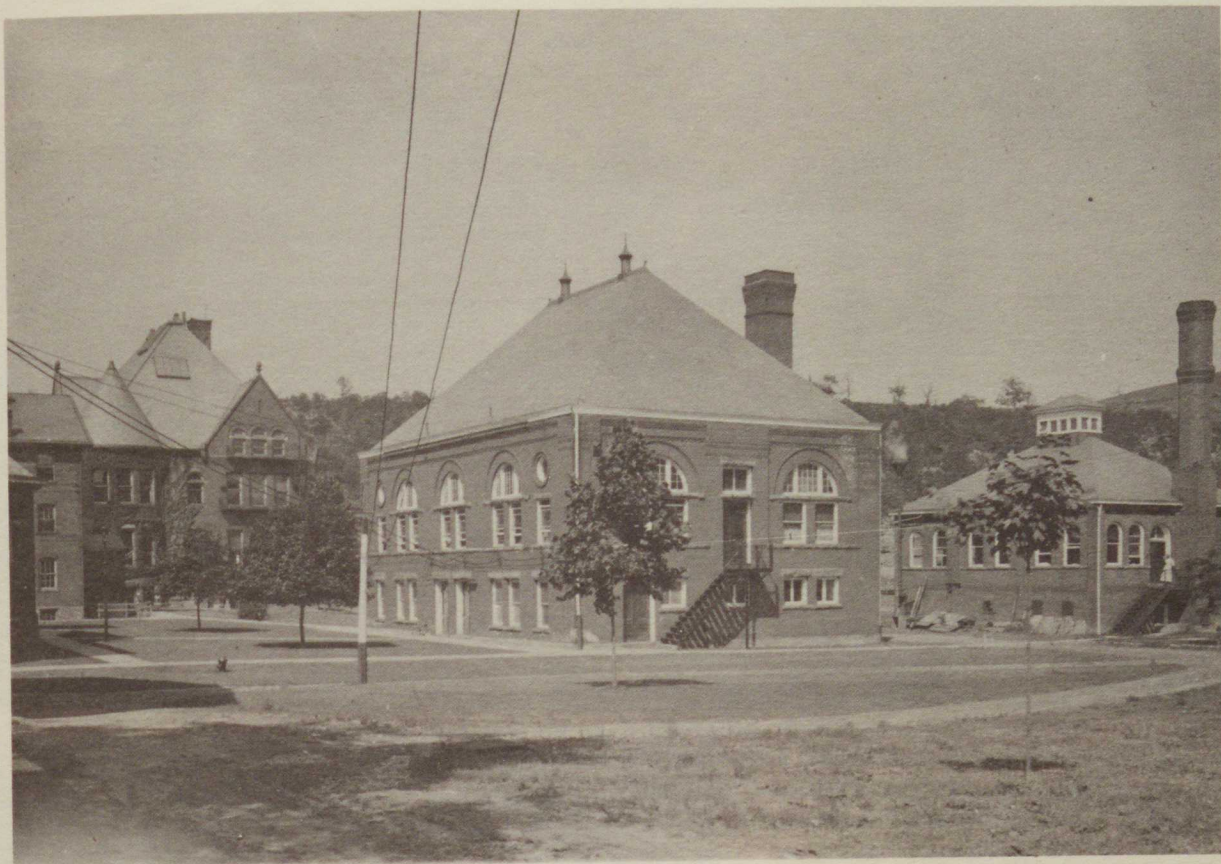




The school was badly in debt in 1877—by \$55,000. One professor, Charles Ehrenfeld, presented his bill for \$1,100 unpaid salary, but readily accepted \$800, giving a receipt in full. John N. Dixon once gave his personal check for \$750 needed to meet the state's bill. At another time, the property he and his sister owned was mortgaged to the limit in order for the school to carry on. In spite of the constant need for money, the trustees never penalized the students for rising costs. In fact, to recognize the needs of the part-time student, tuition was reduced by 25¢ per week, where only one or two courses were taken. Also, in 1878, free tuition for Anna Pflasterer was approved for as long as her father was employed by the board as a janitor.

It was in 1878 that the P.V. and C.R.R. railroads held a conference with the school regarding its right-of-way across the school's campus. The trustees felt that the mutilation of their campus grounds was unthinkable and requested the railroad to reroute its course so as to avoid crossing their grounds. But the company insisted under its right of Eminent Domain to do as it wished, and the tracks should not come within 200 feet of the building and that the railroad would put up obstructions so that cattle could not come onto the grounds.

In 1894, the gymnasium was completed at a cost of \$15,000 and was considered to be very modern, containing the first water system installed in the school.



In with the spirit of the "Gay Nineties" was the construction of a ten foot bicycle track encircling the entire campus. Tennis courts were laid out on the campus near the river. A varsity sports program began to grow for both men and women.



The baseball team in 1891 was called the "Normal Stars", and by 1901, their schedule included games with ten other schools. In 1905 the football team was undefeated.

When the U.S. entered the war in 1917, there was a noticeable decline in the number of male students. The graduation class of 1917 had one male student.

Because there was a lack of dormitory space and there were so many communities just a short distance from California, the school became a popular "day school". To accommodate the students who traveled, a lunchroom was opened. As of 1918, no item of food was priced higher than five cents. This room was also equipped with a pool table.



Boarding students were permitted to go into town to see a movie one day each week. The school added its own Patheoscope in 1917 and showed its own movies, the first being Longfellow's **The Children's Hour**. The activity fee was initiated in 1917 when \$1.00 was charged for the six attractions in the lecture series.





The automotive age arrived on campus with the purchase of a one and a half ton Stewart motor truck for \$3,170. This purchase was necessary to replace the horse and wagon that were used previously, since they both were practically worn out. The campus of California had very little room to expand. In 1930 the Women's Athletic Association set out to earn money to purchase suitable land for women's activities. They conducted a bazaar, similar to a county fair, and they collected \$2,000. In 1936 this money was used as the down payment on the \$5,000 purchase price of an 82 acre farm located two miles south of the main campus on Route 88.

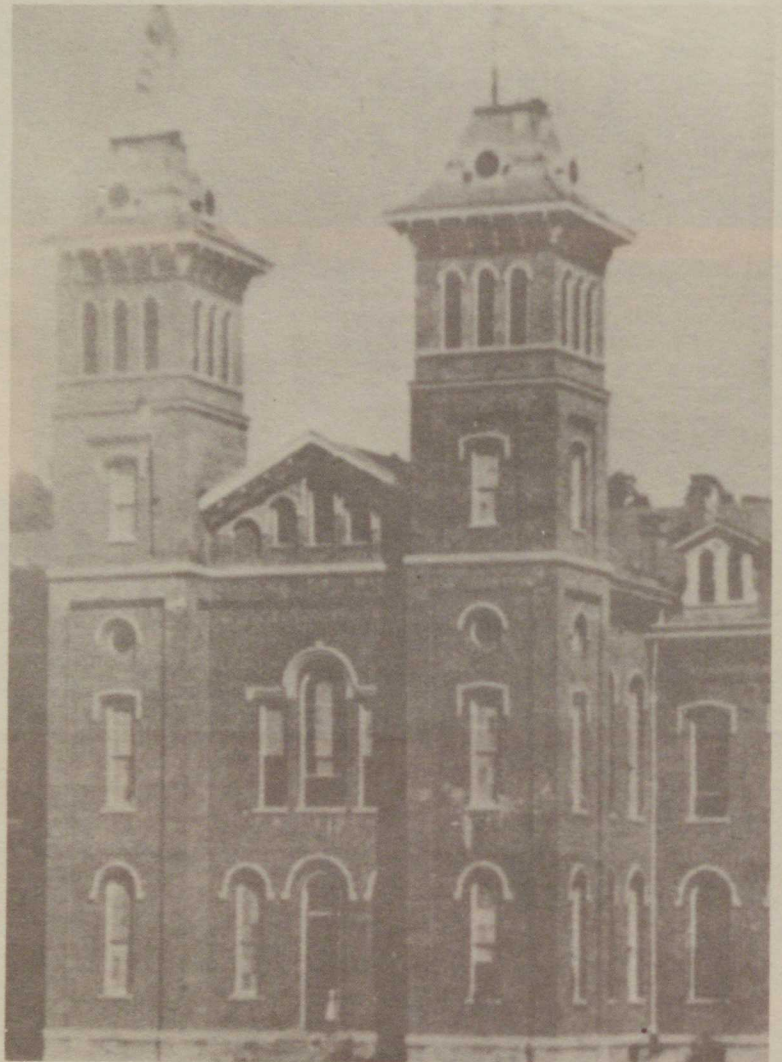
The Student Congress had been organized in 1933, and the Student Activities Association was chartered in 1937. These two groups paid the mortgage on the farm and also started improvements.



As World War II came to an end, those students who could not previously afford an education could now do so under the G.I. Bill. The fall term of 1946-47 showed a large increase in enrollment.

Students and their attitudes began to change. The student newspaper, **Tower Times**, became the organ of student opinion on most campus issues.

In 1947, the first Campus Queen was crowned. An R.O.T.C. program was introduced in 1947, also, new courses were started, such as Military Organization and Administration and Military Law, as well as drill and military exercise.





The first California State Teacher's College Homecoming Parade was in 1949.

In 1959, Governor David Lawrence passed into law legislation to delete the word "Teacher's" from the names of the colleges. On January 8, 1960, our name became California State College. The significant change was that the law provided for the transition of the colleges into multi-purpose institutions. A graduate program was initiated in 1961.





In the middle 1960's came the period of student movements, for both civil and student rights. The student newspaper, **California Times**, took the administration to task for having unnecessary rules, when four girls were not permitted into the dining hall for going against the dress code. They were wearing loafers.

Fraternities and sororities were beginning to be organized.

Dr. Roadman became president of the college in 1969.

On May 26, 1974, California State College celebrated 100 years of state ownership. There are an approximate 19,000 alumni since 1874.

a State College Pennsylvania?

The California State University and Colleges have announced the addition of a 20th campus to the system. The new campus – to be called California State College, Pennsylvania – has been opened to help alleviate pressing enrollment increases in the existing 19 campuses.

Thus, students who cannot get into some of the CSUC system's larger campuses, such as Long Beach or Los Angeles, can simply get a boat, go down the Monongahela River and enroll. You can't miss it. It's just 40 miles south of Pittsburgh.

Actually, there are still only 19 campuses in the CSUC system, but California State College, Pennsylvania does exist.

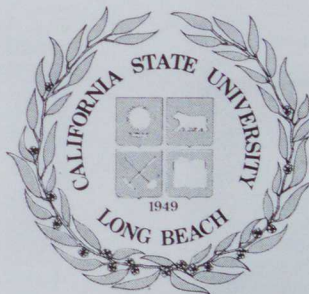
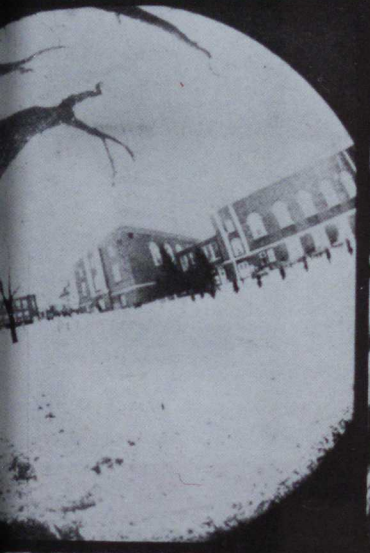
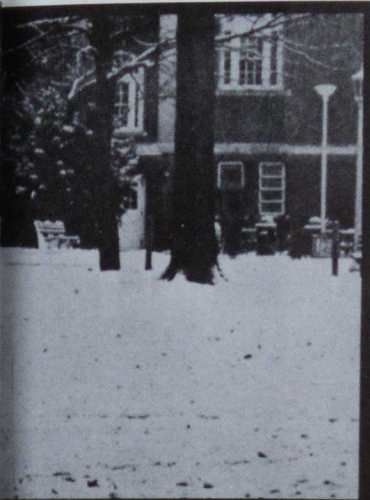
The college is one of 14 institutions of higher learning owned by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Its origin goes back to the establishment of an academy in 1852, only three years after the community of California was founded.

About 6,000 students are enrolled at CSC, Pennsylvania, which offers 46 undergraduate and 20 graduate degree majors. It is on the trimester system. Thirty-eight per cent of the nearly 400 faculty members hold doctorates.

Interestingly, similarities between the Long Beach and Pennsylvania campuses go beyond their names. For instance, the town of Pennsylvania was settled in 1849, just two years before California became a state. As a result, the community took its name from the fact that it was settled during the Gold Rush Era.

Both campuses are – and have always been – primarily teaching institutions. (About 75 per cent of the students at CSCP are Education majors.) Students at both schools are largely commuters. And, the student unions at Long Beach and Pennsylvania both opened their doors in August of 1972.

Finally, students living in California can of course enroll at California State College, Pennsylvania – but don't be surprised if you're charged "out-of-state" tuition.

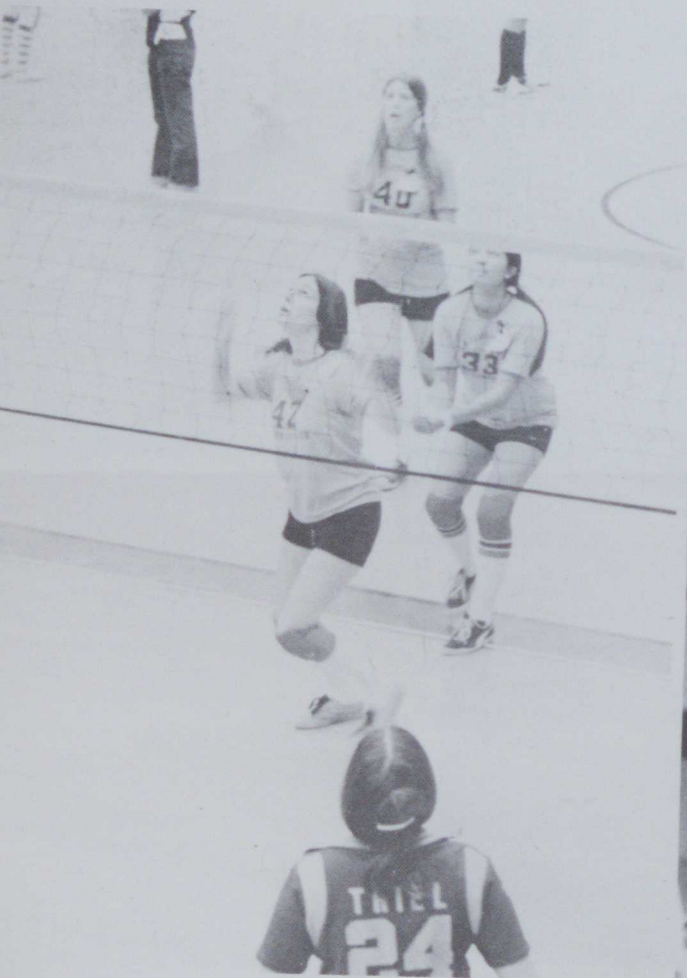
