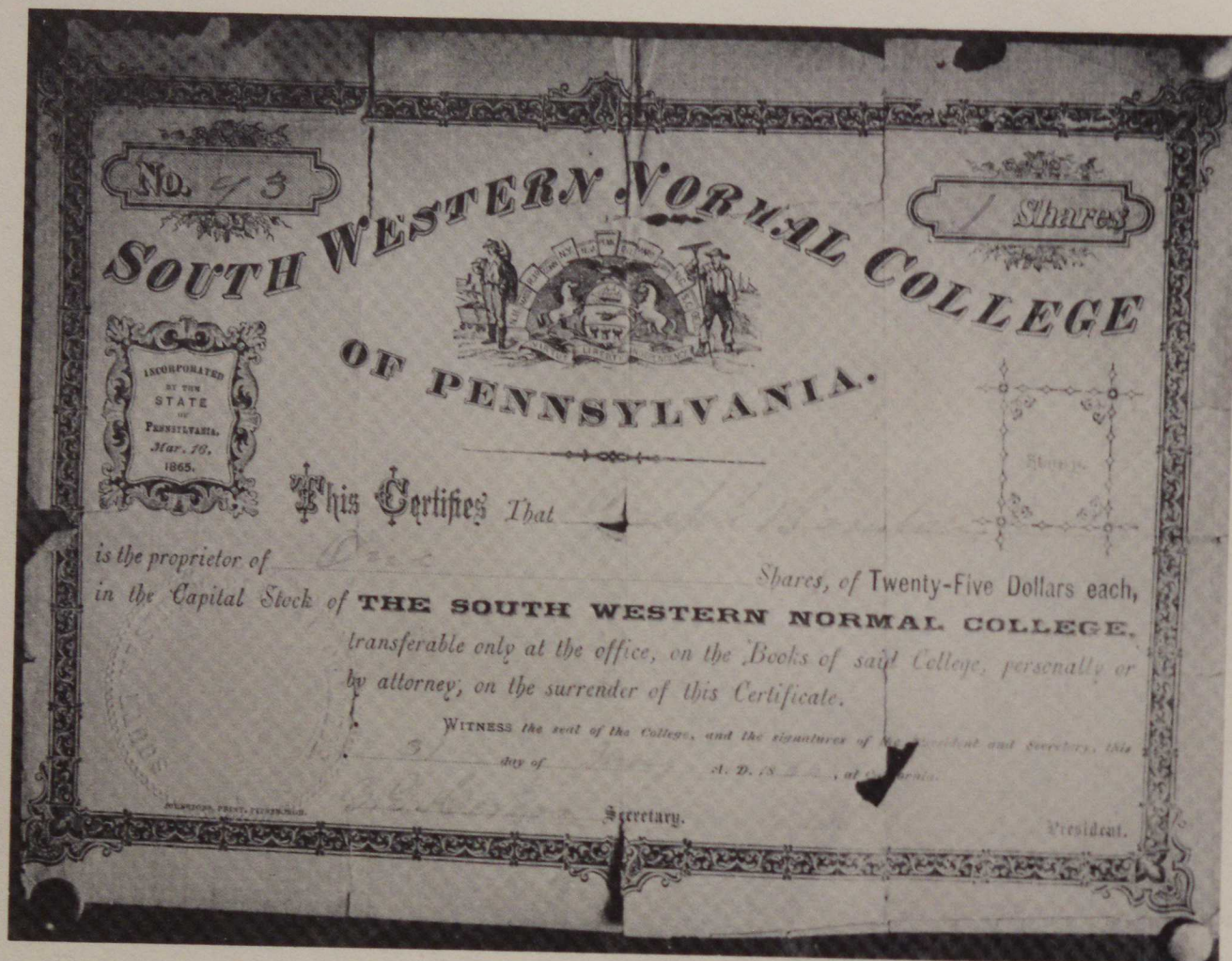

History of the College

The borough of California was so named because it was founded in 1849, the year of the California gold rush. To meet the need of the settlers for higher education, an academy was established in 1852. Official recognition as a Normal School came on May 26, 1874.

In 1913, the stockholders of the original institution voted to accept a proposal of the State Board of Education for the purchase of the school, and in 1914 the Governor approved an agreement making the Southwestern Normal School a state-owned institution.

In 1928, the college was granted the right to offer a four-year curriculum of elementary education, leading to a degree of Bachelor of Science in Education.

Near the close of 1928, the State Council of Education approved the addition of a four-year curriculum for the preparation of teachers for public secondary schools. When fourteen students received degrees at the commencement in May, 1929, the school officially became a teacher's college.

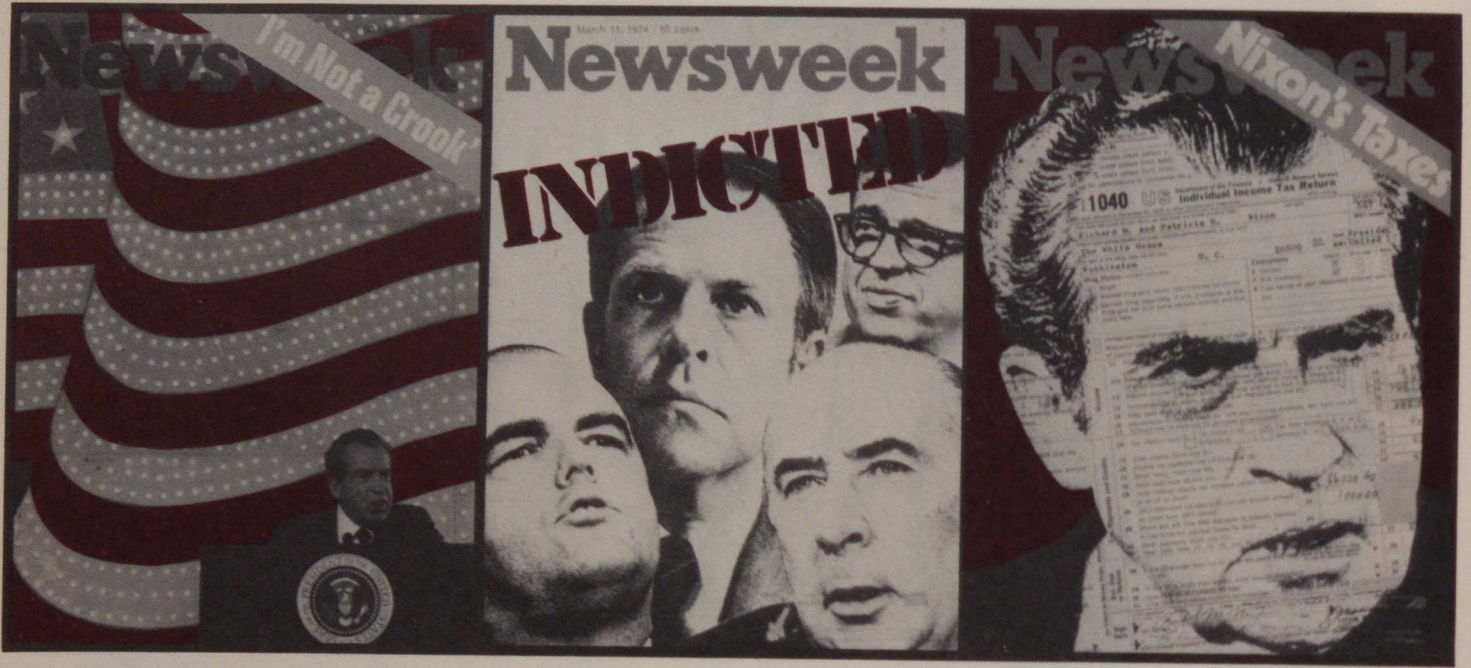
In the year 1959 the college was approved for the Bachelor of Arts degree, becoming a multi-purpose institution, and the name of the institution was changed to California State College. The other state colleges made the same change.

The curriculum now includes Elementary Education, Secondary Education, Industrial Arts Education, Special Education, Speech Pathology and Audiology, Public School Nursing, Dental Hygiene, and an Arts and Science program which includes all the academic disciplines plus Medical Technology, an Introduction to Social Work and an area in Nature Recreation. The Graduate work leading to the degree of Master of Education was inaugurated at California State College in the Fall trimester of 1961. Seven years later the first Master of Arts program was inaugurated. Master of Science programs were also added to the curriculum as well as special certification programs in Reading and School Psychology.

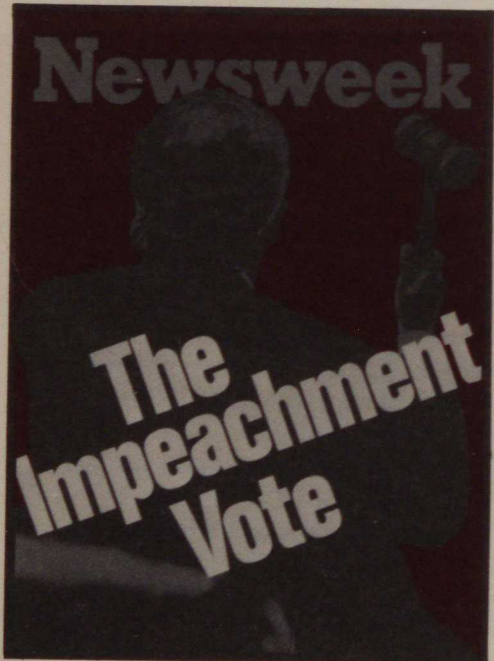

Granting Pardon to Richard Nixon

By the President of the United States of America

A Proclamation

Richard Nixon became the thirty-seventh President of the United States on January 20, 1969 and was reelected in 1972 for a second term by the electors of forty-nine of the fifty states. His term in office continued until his resignation on August 9, 1974.

Pursuant to resolutions of the House of Representatives, its Committee on the Judiciary conducted an inquiry and investigation on the impeachment of the President extending over more than eight months. The hearings of the Committee and its deliberations, which received wide national publicity over television, radio, and in printed media, resulted in votes adverse to Richard Nixon on recommended Articles of Impeachment.

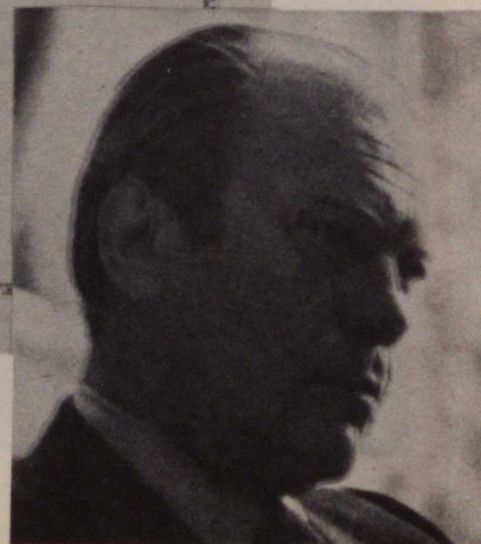
As a result of certain acts or omissions occurring before his resignation from the Office of President, Richard Nixon has become liable to possible indictment and trial for offenses against the United States. Whether or not he shall be so prosecuted depends on findings of the appropriate grand jury and on the discretion of the authorized prosecutor. Should an indictment ensue, the accused shall then be entitled to a fair trial by an impartial jury, as guaranteed to every individual by the Constitution.

It is believed that a trial of Richard Nixon, if it became necessary, could not fairly begin until a year or more has elapsed. In the meantime, the tranquility to which this nation has been restored by the events of recent weeks could be irreparably lost by the prospect of bringing to trial a former President of the United States. The prospects of such trial will cause prolonged and divisive debate over the propriety of exposing to further punishment and degradation a man who has already paid the unprecedented penalty of relinquishing the highest elective office of the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Gerald R. Ford, President of the United States, pursuant to the pardon power conferred upon me by Article II, Section 2, of the Constitution, have granted and by these presents do grant a full, free, and absolute pardon unto Richard Nixon for all offenses against the United States which he, Richard Nixon, has committed or may have committed or taken part in during the period from January 20, 1969 through August 9, 1974.

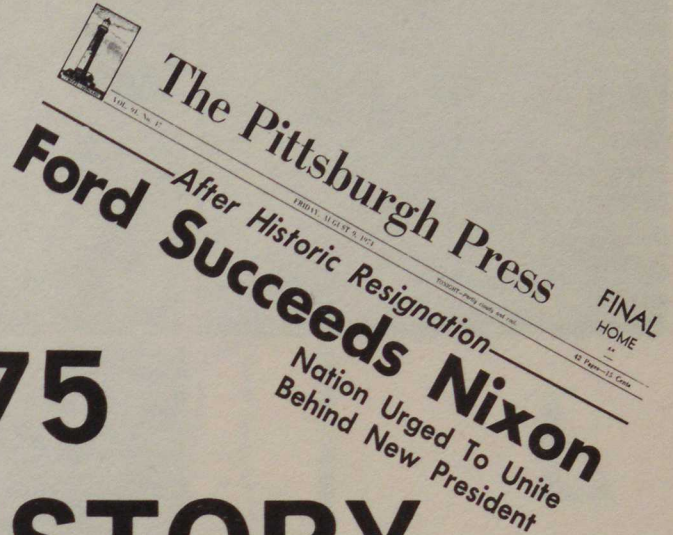
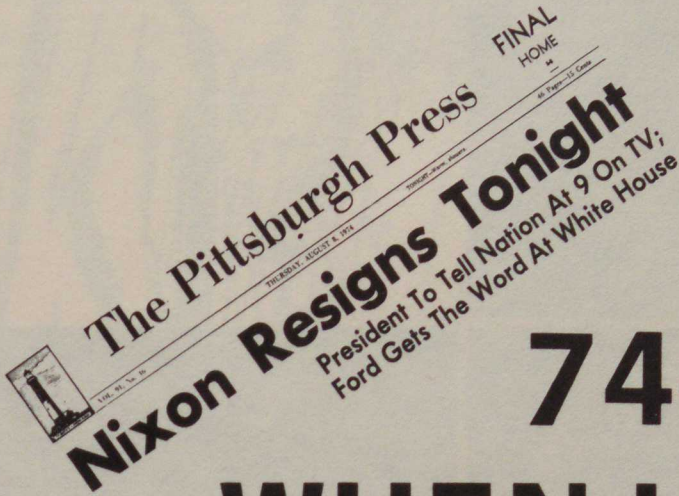

In the forward to the first issue of *Pegasus*, (1959), CSC's magazine for the creative arts, Professor Alex Newell, then faculty editor said:

"With the appearance of *Pegasus* on campus where Vulcan is already an honored figure, students at California State Teachers College are now flanked on both sides by terms that would indentify them and this metal-working region with creative ingenuity. It is significant, however, that Vulcan, the clever smithy and craftsman of the gods, should easily find a permanent place among us, while *Pegasus*, in the form of one literary publication or another, should stop here only occasionally for a fitful visit. The symbolic import is obvious: ours is a technological, industrial culture in which horses with or without wings have been giving way to machines.

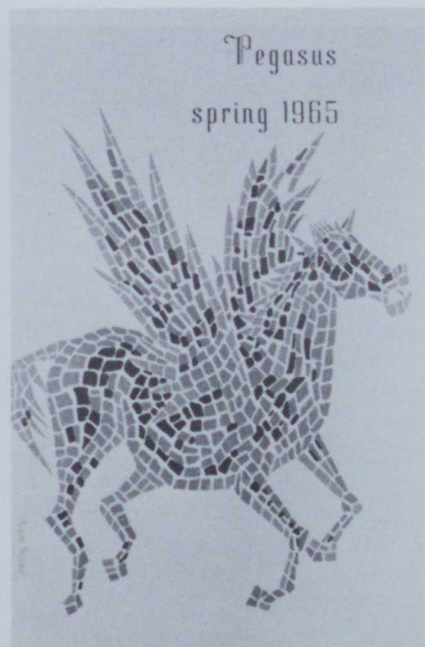
As may be gathered, this foreword is to greet and vindicate the return of the horse—the horse with wings. For the moment, he has established symbolic equilibrium on our campus. He reminds us of poetry and the liberal arts in a society preoccupied with machinery, science, and the industrial arts. Vulcan has



been provided with a lounge; *Pegasus* needs a permanent stable or—bless our modern age!—a hangar. And he need more students who will not be afraid to mount him for a lonely but exhilarating ride among the clouds."

With the exception of the *Tower Times*, literary supplement, circa 1961-62 and appearing as part of the *Monocal* in 1974, *Pegasus* has continued as an individual publication. The purpose of *Pegasus* was restated by faculty advisor, Gene Halboth in the 1968 edition: "... to publish the creative efforts of students, both in the area of the written word and in visual art forms. Its intent is at once to stimulate creativity and provide an outlet for that creativity: to publish poetry, short stories, vignettes, short plays, and to reproduce paintings, sketches, photographs, and other works submitted by students."

Dr. Vernon Bloemker, Mr. John Lawrence, and Mr. Arthur Knight of the English Department; Mr. Angus Douple and Mr. Phillip Schaltenbrand of the Art Department plus many others of the faculty have served as advisors to *Pegasus*.

On February 26, Leonard Nimoy presented a lecture entitled "Odyssey to the Borders of the Mind."

Drawing on material from Star Trek and other works of science fiction, he presented a dramatic creation of the sense of our world today—and tomorrow as a science fiction story written long ago.

Since Star Trek, Nimoy has appeared

in Mission Impossible as Paris and has played other roles in television, in movies, and on Broadway. Aside from acting and directing, his favorite outlet is photography and writing. In the spring of '73, Nimoy's first book, "You and I", was published. It is a sensitive love story expressed through his own poetry and photography.



One of the foremost figures of our times appeared in the mid-Mon Valley when the California State College Lecture Arts Committee presented Dr. Margaret Mead in a lecture on December 12 in Hamer Hall.

Dr. Mead's field work and research into

both Western and non-Western societies has resulted in an enormous amount of writing, which includes books, scientific papers, monographs, journal articles, and popular articles including a regular column in Redbook magazine.
