## Cross-Country Team Splits, Will Host N.A.I.A.

The CSC Cross-Country team evened its dual meet record for the year at 2-2, with a 15-50 victory over W. & J. Wednesday afternoon in Washington.

Barry Lynch and Clyde Van-Divner led the way for the Vulcans with a tie for first place. Steve Randall, Len Collell, Francis Kovak, Jim Simons and Dave Miller followed in that order to complete the sweep of the top seven places.

Prior to this, the Vulcans only win of the year came against Lock Haven, while losses were at the hands of Slippery Rock and Clarion.

Dr. Coleman, the coach of the trailmen, reports that Cal. State will host the N.A.I.A. District championships October 18, 11 a.m. at the College Farm.

## Cross-Country finishes

The Vulcans Cross-Country team ran the trails pretty regularly the last couple of weeks, and although the results weren't that impressive, they did have their high points.

Dean Shaw, the freshman standout who has been running well all season long for Coach Phil Coleman, qualified to run against the Nation's best, when he travels to the National Championships November 15 at Kansas. Shaw has been running superbly all year, but Coach Coleman hasn't been able to find the right combination behind him.

October 10 the Trailmen traveled to West Virginia for the West Virginia Wesleyan Invitational, and finished fifth out of nine teams. The 18th found the Vulcan runners hosting the N.A.I.A. championships. Seven teams were entered and the Vulcans finished sixth. Finally, the Vulcans dropped in at West Virginia for the West Virginia Invitational, and once again they finished in the middle of the pack with a fourth place finish out of six teams.



# GOLF '76

After getting off to a rather slow, shaky start, the CSC Stokers finished the second half of their golf schedule with impressive wins over 7 consecutive opponents. By 4/23/76, the Stokers had laboriously struggled to a 9-6 card, then easily stroke over Pitt, Waynesburg, Washington & Jefferson, Duquesne, Frostburg, Pitt again, and Fairmont in championship fashion. This string of victories boosted the season record 19 16-6, a considerable improvement over last year's 12-12 car. Two matches with Slippery Rock had to be cancelled due to unfavorable weather, otherwise the record easily could have been 18-6.

In retrospect, Coach Schuler is pleasantly pleased with the overall results of the season and gives considerable credit to the dedication of his golfers. Despite inconsistent scores ranging from par to the mid-eighties from the same player on successive days, the CSC Stokers were able to dominate the last two weeks of play.

Considering that golf scores are usually lowest when the temperatures are in the high 70's and the sun is shining brightly, I feel this season has been an outstanding achievement by the CSC golfers. Our guys have been observed playing in the rain, sleet, hail, and snow flurries, with the temperatures dipping down into the 30's. Keeping the ball in play in the fairway during warm, clear weather conditions.

(for the average duffer) is a feat in itself. But to consistently post scores in the 70's during the unfavorable elements mentioned above must be recognized as a major accomplishment.

Despite the weather handicaps, we should recognize the sacrifices and evotion to the sport displayed by our divor-diggers. In fact, we should recognize all the jocks who participate in all college athletic programs. Missing classes, hustling to catch up on lecture notes, making up missed exams, and missing scholastic deadlines, all contribute an additional burden to the academic demands. It just isn't an easy cakewalk to participate while maintaining one's grade level.

Participatin in the state tournament at Shippensburg on May 3-4 was viewed with mixed emotions. Overall team standings had CSC finishing 7th, only 4 shots out of 4th place. Our highlight of the event was CSC's Bob King who tied for third with a 75 card.

Competition in the NAIA Tournament still remains on the schedule for May 13-14, and CSC is primied to go for some high finishes. So win, lose, or draw, each individual golfer performed well and should be congratulated for a fine effort. Plaudits go out to Paul Salera, Bob King, Dan Paulone, Matt Kluck, Steve Bransburg, Mark fritz, Mike Smida, Terry Baseshore, and Chuck Klein or a job well Done and ahighly successful season.

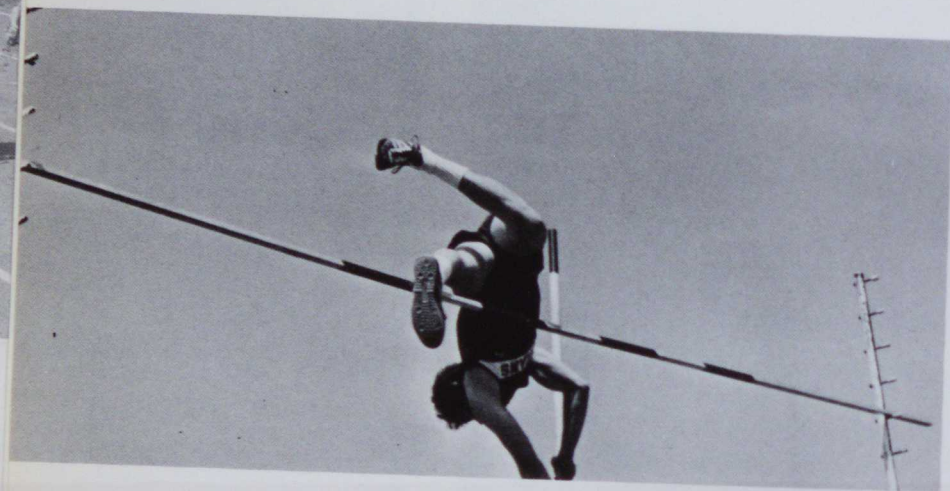


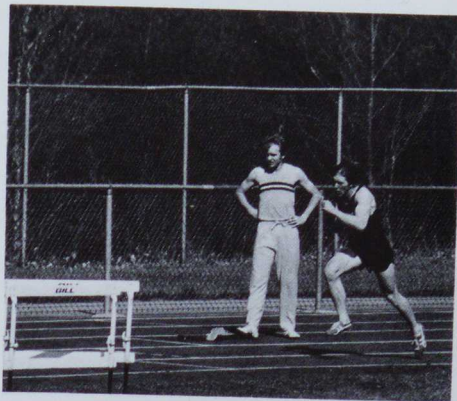

## Tracksters start, best ever

California State College turned in an impressive 86-55 triumph over Geneva College yesterday afternoon at Adamson Stadium in its opening track and field meet.

Jud Flint, junior speedster, sparked in the opener for Coach Ray Lister's thin clads as he topped three events.

Flint was victorious in the 100-yard dash, 220-yard dash and anchored the 440-yard relay.

Other first place winners for the Vulcans were Clyde Van Dyner, six mile run; H. E. Johns, high jump; Ron Turpin, shot put; Dean Shaw, three-mile run; Dan Uhrin, 440-yard run; Dave Gentile, discus; Joe Goodman, javelin; and Jim Acres, long jump.

Flint covered the 100 yard dash in 10.2, the 220 yard dash in 23.9.

Running with Flint in the 440 yard relay were Charles Harper, Acres, and Bill McCord and the team ran the distance in 44.9.

Van Dyner turned in an impressive performance in the six mile run as he won the event in 34:09. The junior long distance runner took an early lead and was an easy winner as he led all the way.

A former Brownsville High School standout and a current record holder for the high jump at CSC, at 64", won the high jump yesterday under poor conditions at 64.

Uhrin, a promising freshman, won a thrilling 440-yard run in 55.6 as he nipped the Geneva runner at the tape.

Bert McCoy of the Vulcans turned in a fine performance as he finished second in the 440 yard intermediate hurdles.

Steve Huss, another promising freshman, was nipped in the 120 yard high hurdles as the Geneva runner covered the distance 15.5.

A top cross-country far the Vulcans, Shaw was an easy winner in the three-mile runner as he hit the top end 15.9 Summary.

The Vulcans' track 110 yd relay team, consisting of Charlie Harper, Jim Acres, Bill McCord, and Jud Flint, won its second match of the young season by defeating a good Slippery Rock sprint relay team, turning in a time of 45.0 seconds.

Cal State continues to show improvement, although losing a double duel track meet to Slippery Rock 10-44 and Grove City 82-63.

Cal State's thin clads turned in some fine individual efforts, winning five and seven first places

against Slippery Rock and Grove City, respectively.

Other victories against the Rock came in the shot put by Ron Turpin, 45-8"; triple jump, Ken Thornton, 43-7 1/2"; 220 yd dash, Jud Flint, 22.7; three mile run, Dean Shaw, 14:57.4.

CSC lost a close decision to Grove City, capturing seven firsts to Grove City's nine victories.

California's wins came in the high jump, H. E. Johns, 67"; javelin, Joe Goodman, 176-11"; long jump, Jim Acres, 20-3/4"; triple jump, Ken Thornton, 43-7 1/2"; and Jud Flint a double winner in the 100 yd dash, 10.2 and the 220 yd dash in 22.7. Dean Shaw won the three mile run in the good time of 14:57.4.

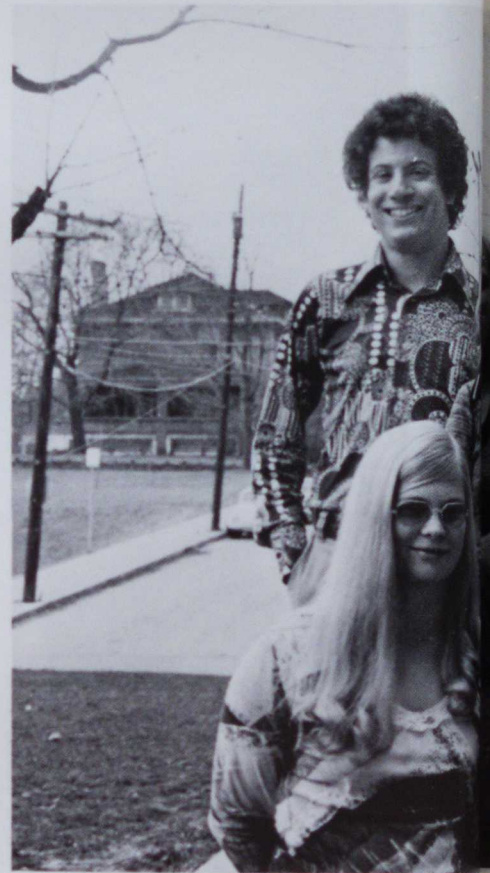


## California State College Choir
