INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENT REGISTRATION
FOR SUMMER TRIMESTER 1966

Step I. PROGRAM OF STUDIES

- A. Arts and Science students must have a preliminary program approved by their adviser on file.
- B. Education students must have an adviser approved program of studies and curriculum projection on file with the department.

Step II. SCHEDULING

- A. At time and place announced for schedule advising, accurately complete the schedule card and have it approved by your schedule adviser. (1) Changes from the approved preliminary schedule must receive specific approval of the personal adviser of the dean.
- B. Take approved schedule to the tally post--wait for card to be completed and stamped; tallied. (1) Do not schedule closed classes.

Step III. REGISTRATION

- A. Present approved tallied schedule card (green edged).
- B. Pick up envelope containing all other registration forms.
- C. Fill in all cards completely and accurately.
- D. Have all cards checked and stamped.
- E. Take envelope containing all approved forms to Business Office window in Main Hall.

Step IV. PAYMENT OF FEES

- A. All students must pay their college fees by the deadline in order to complete the registration process.
- B. Residents of college dormitories on campus must pay the housing fee of \$272.00 by the deadline.
- C. Residents of private dormitories off campus must pay the dining hall fee of \$144.00 by the deadline. (Room rent must be paid directly to the Dormitory Manager according to instructions to be issued to residents in this category.)
- D. No student has a dormitory reservation unless (a) it has been assigned through the offices of the Dean of Men or Dean of Women, and (b) the housing fee has been paid by the deadline.
- E. The Business Office will inspect the schedule card and the Bursar's fee card. Once this has been done, the student will receive a statement of fees and the date the fees are due.

Step V. FINAL INSTRUCTIONS

- A. At the beginning of the term, students must report to the Library to secure or renew their Library Cards.
- B. Report to the Student Activities Office to secure or renew your Student Activities Card.
- C. Register your motor vehicle in room 135, Main Hall. (This only applies to those students who did not register their motor vehicles for the previous trimester.)
