Students Invited to Apply for Board of Governors Position

Commonwealth University is a member of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher education, which is overseen by the Board of Governors – a 20-member body that includes the Governor, the Secretary of Education, legislators, trustees, and three students among its members. One current student member will rotate off the Board upon graduation in December, so the search is underway to identify a replacement.

The Office of the President has the honor of nominating one student for the Board to consider when it makes the appointment later this year. - Letter of intent stating why you want to serve
- Your resume
- A copy of your unofficial transcript

toward several special projects, two of which are the digitization and preservation of local and university historic materials and providing textbook scholarships to deserving students.


