Applications are due to Dan Knorr in the President's Office no later than Thursday, Feb. 29. Questions and application materials should be submitted to dknorr@commonwealthu.edu. The President's Office will review all applications received and will send the information for my nominee to the Office of the Chancellor. After that, the Board of Governors will review the nominations received from around the State System and will make the appointment later this year.
