

Dr. Orlando-Marquez C. Kittrell, executive director for the PA Act 101 Programs at Commonwealth University participated MENTOR's Capitol Hill Day on Jan. 24 in Washington, D.C. Capitol Hill Day is an advocacy event that connects members of Congress and their staff to mentors, advocates, professionals, and young people from across the country to talk about critical issues facing the nation's youth and the legislation and policies they can implement to expand access to quality mentoring opportunities. Over 454 advocates participated in a total of 224 Congressional meetings.

Kittrell also participated in the 2024 National Mentoring Summit convened by MENTOR on Jan. 25-26 in Washington, D.C. The National Mentoring Summit was an opportunity for 1,342 mentoring practitioners, researchers, philanthropic investors, youth leaders, government and civic leaders, and Affiliates from 48 states and territories and 10 countries. Resulting from attending the summit, Kittrell plans to expand the mentoring and
