## The School.

---

By virtue of an Act of Assembly passed in the Spring of 1893, East Stroudsburg became the seat of the State Normal School of the Fourth District of Pennsylvania. The district embraces Wayne, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Carbon, Northampton, Monroe and Pike counties. This is one of the foremost districts in the State not only in population and wealth, but also in matters educational. It excels in length of term, salaries paid to teachers, and in the number and quality of its High Schools.

It has been the constant aim of the authorities of the school from the beginning to make it in every way worthy of the magnificent district for the preparation of whose teachers it was specially called into existence; to make it, in short, a high grade and thorough professional training school. To this end every effort has been made to maintain a high standard of excellence in its corps of teachers, to make its Model School a model school in fact as well as in name, to develop a full and modern equipment, to beautify the buildings and grounds, and to promote every interest that can give life and character to the student body.

The school is progressive and is always seeking something better beyond. It has been remarkably successful in its efforts to guarantee to its graduates a high degree of scholastic attainment. The development of its professional courses of study is exceptionally complete and thorough, and the Model School is always full to overflowing and has always been fortunate in its management. It affords the best of practical training in all the different departments of public school work.

## Location.

There could be no better location for a school. Three miles away is the Delaware Water Gap, fifteen miles in another direction is Mount Pocono, and between, lies the richly varied and picturesque country now so well known because of the vast number of people who resort to it for health and recreation. The school is, therefore, surrounded by scenes of beauty unsurpassed, if equalled, anywhere else in our great State. Best of all, because of the elevation, the purity of the atmosphere, and the number of swift-running mountain streams of pure water, the location is as healthful as it is beautiful.

East Stroudsburg is separated from Stroudsburg by a narrow stream only. The two towns together form a busy and progressive community of nearly eight thousand people. They are practically one town, among the handsomest in the State.

## Buildings and Grounds.

On high ground overlooking the towns and much of the magnificent country surrounding them, on a spacious and beautiful campus, are located the buildings. They are four in number, not including the boiler and engine house located on an adjoining piece of ground.

The Administration and Dormitory Building is an elegant brick and stone structure, four stories high. It has a frontage of 176 feet, and three wings extending back 152 feet. On the upper floor of the central wing of this building is a handsome chapel with a seating capacity for nine hundred people, and on the first floor is a well-lighted, cheerful dining room in which four hundred can be comfortably seated.

A few paces north of the Administration Building, extending forward, is the Recitation Hall. It is 120

feet in length and 60 in width. In it are fifteen well-lighted recitation rooms, including large and well equipped laboratories, besides a number of side rooms provided for the convenience and comfort of the teachers and students. It is one of the very finest and best appointed buildings for the purpose in the State.

To the south of the Administration Building, directly opposite the recitation hall and similar to it in size and type of architecture, is the Model School. It is a thoroughly modern building. No better may be found anywhere. Over the Model School are two dormitory floors. These add a number of very attractive rooms for students.

To the rear of the Recitation Hall is the Gymnasium. It has a floor space 60 by 90 feet, and an annex, 40 by 18 feet, containing a reception room, parlor, office, and apartments for the instructor. The basement contains baths, lockers, and dressing rooms. The building is fully furnished with the best modern apparatus.

Back of the gymnasium is a hospital building, well furnished. It is intended to prevent the spread of contagious diseases, in case any should occur.

All the buildings are heated with steam and lighted with electricity.

### The Students' Rooms.

The school is made as nearly as possible a home for the students, cheerful and comfortable. Their rooms are unusually large, and are furnished with the best Ingrain and Brussels Carpet, substantial hard wood furniture, and neat iron bedsteads. Each bed is furnished with woven wire springs, a mattress, two pillow cases, sheets, and one comfort. It is advisable for students to bring with them extra blankets or quilts, each marked with the owner's name.

# The Four Years' Normal School Course.

---

This course is based on the "unit" plan as proposed by The Carnegie Foundation.

"A unit" represents a year's study in any subject in a secondary school. It is assumed to be the work done in one hundred and twenty sixty minute periods or their equivalent.

Students admitted to the First Year shall have a fair knowledge of Arithmetic, Reading, Orthography, Penmanship, United States History, Geography, Grammar, Physiology, Civics, and the Elements of Algebra to Quadratics. Test by Faculty.

In the fourth year Ethics, Logic and Sociology may be substituted for Virgil, French or German. Philosophy of Education, or Surveying may be substituted for Ethics, Logics or Sociology.

## Rules Governing Admission.

1. Properly certified graduates of approved Pennsylvania High Schools of the first grade and City High Schools as listed by the Department of Public Instruction may be admitted to the third year of the course without examination, and must be conditioned in the branches needed for admission which they have not satisfactorily completed.

2. Properly certified graduates of approved Pennsylvania High Schools of the second grade may be admitted to the second year of the course, and must be conditioned in the branches which they have not satisfactorily completed.

3. Properly certified graduates of approved Pennsylvania High Schools of the third grade may be admitted to the first year of the course without examination, and must be conditioned in the branches which they have not satisfactorily completed.

4. To be admitted to the fourth year students must be examined by both the faculty and the State Board of Examiners.

5. Residence for the last two years must be required of all students except graduates of four year courses in college approved by the University Council. Such students may be graduated after one year's residence.

## Supplementary Course.

(In addition to the Regular Course.)

### Leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Pedagogics.

Philosophy of Education, Advanced Psychology.

Discussion of Educational Questions; School Supervision, including School Law; Devices for Teaching; Educational Theories, etc.

School Apparatus and Appliances; Description, Use, Preparation.

### Leading to the Degree of Master of Pedagogics.

Two years' teaching after graduation in the Regular Course.

Professional Reading, with abstracts; History of Education in the United States (Boone); European Schools (Klemm), Systems of Education (Parsons).

Sanitary Science, School Architecture, etc.

Thesis.

A full equivalent will be accepted for any of the textbooks named above. The course in reading and classics for all the courses shall be determined by the Board of Principals at their meeting, and shall be the same for all Normal Schools.

### Special Rules Concerning Examinations.

1.—If the faculty of any State Normal School, or the State Board of Examiners, decide that a person is not prepared to pass an examination by the State Board, he shall not be admitted to the same examination at any other State Normal School during the same school year.

2.—If any person who has completed the examinations required for admission to the Third or Fourth Class at any State Normal School, desires to enter another Normal School, the Principal of the school at which the examination was held shall send the proper certificate to the Principal of the school which the person desires to attend. Except for the reason here stated, no certificate setting forth the passing of Third Year studies shall be issued.

3.—Candidates for graduation shall have the opportunity of being examined in any higher branches, including vocal and instrumental music; and all studies completed by them shall be named in their certificates.

4.—Persons who have been graduated may be examined at any State examination in any higher branches, and the Secretary of the Board of Examiners shall certify on the back of their diplomas to the passing of the branches completed at said examination.

5.—A certificate setting forth the proficiency of all applicants in all the studies in which they desire to be examined by the State Board of Examiners shall be prepared and signed by the Faculty and presented to the Board.

6.—Graduates of State Normal Schools in the regular course and graduates of accredited colleges may become candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Pedagogics and Master of Pedagogics. To obtain these degrees, candidates must be examined by the Faculty and State Board upon the studies of the Supplementary Course. Three years' successful teaching in the public schools of the State since graduation (or two years in the case of candidates who taught in the Model School) will be re-

quired of all candidates for the degree of Master of Pedagogics, in addition to the branches of study indicated above.

### **College Preparatory Work.**

A large percentage of our students prepare for college. Some of these are special college preparatory students, but most of them also complete the Normal Course. All the Academic studies of this course are necessary for preparation to enter college, and by making proper substitutions and doing some extra work a good student of the regular course may be ready to enter college by the time he graduates. When students confine themselves to preparatory work, their work is arranged to harmonize with the requirements of the college or university they intend to enter. We have sent students to all the large colleges and universities in the East, and their high standing there attests the excellence of their preparation.

# Departments of Study.

---

## Pedagogy.

We never lose sight of the fact that, as a professional school, it was for the department of Pedagogy in particular that our Normal School was founded, and we always endeavor to give to this department the importance and dignity which it properly demands. There are three branches of the work, School Management, Methods, General and Special, and the History of Education.

The design of the course in School Management is to set forth, (1) the aim of school government as related to the pupil's character and the teacher's control, and (2) the means whereby the aim may be realized.

**METHODS.**—The aim of the instruction in Methods is to lay a secure theoretical foundation by the study of the technique of instruction for the pupil's cadet teaching in the Model School in the Senior year and his subsequent work as a teacher. The topics studied include: The nature and aims of the educative process; the recitation, as instruction, test, drill, assignment; the Batavia class-individual system; the media and methods of instruction; the inductive development lesson; lesson plans; the text-book; examinations and marking; the art of asking questions; the training of observation. A general survey of the aims, principles and methods of teaching geography, arithmetic and reading, and of language training, is supplemented by reports by the students based upon their observation of the teaching of these branches in the training department.

In the Senior year there is special class study of the fundamental principles of pedagogy and the practice training of the Model School. This latter involves a weekly meeting with the principal for criticism and in-

struction in the details of school work and meetings of groups of student-teachers with the special teachers of the Normal School who have supervision of their work. In these group meetings, as in the meetings of the whole class with the Model School principal, the students receive instruction in methods.

**HISTORY OF EDUCATION.**—This study is reserved for the Senior year, awaiting the full maturity of the school life of the students. They are expected to trace the development of modern educational thought and practice, to obtain such knowledge of educational systems as will enable them to avoid the errors of the past and adopt what is tried and true, to become inspired by the devoted lives of the world's great teachers, and be led to form the noblest and best possible ideals of the work in which they propose to engage.

## Psychology.

The position of Psychology in the Normal curriculum is no longer in dispute. It is fundamental, constituting the introductory discipline which more than any other conditions the intelligent mastery of pedagogical literature. Recognizing its central position in the Department of Pedagogy, we have made provision for an entire year of 200 periods for its study.

The work consists of the mastery of a text, experimental demonstrations, class experiments, lectures, quizzes, the presentation of papers and reports, and training in the observation of the student's own thoughts, feelings and acts, preliminary to the observation of the expressive acts of others. The memory mastery of the text is subordinated to original psychological insight and self mastery; the constant aim is to train the student to 'psychologize', as well as to become a critical and intelligent reader. The point of departure and the point

of return also, is always a practical, concrete situation, most frequently a schoolroom situation. The course aims to be the training course of the curriculum.

The following indicates the scope of the work :

### I. OUTLINES OF GENERAL PSYCHOLOGY.

This covers the ground work of the science from the descriptive and functional points of view; sensation, perception, association, memory, imagination, reason, movement, instinct, impulse, habit, etc.

II. PHYSIOLOGICAL PSYCHOLOGY. In keeping with the modern tendency among psychologists, technical details in anatomy and neurology are avoided, and the emphasis placed upon the functional relationship existing between the mind and the nervous system. The department is provided with models; and charts of the functionally important members of the nervous system are made and explained by the students. The study of the nervous system is developed from the standpoints of phylogeny and ontogeny, emphasizing its unifying function.

III. EXPERIMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY. The laboratory is provided with a full set of the Milton Bradley Company Pseudoptics, eye test cards, skeins for detecting color blindness, touch weights, Edelmann-Galton whistle, a campimeter, esthesiometer, color mixer, kymograph, plethysmograph, sphygmograph, pneumograph, ergograph, etc. Besides, numerous experiments are performed without apparatus or with simple pieces devised in the laboratory. Qualitative and quantitative experiments are carried out on the senses, especially vision, the elementary bodily expressions of mental states, association, memory, etc. The laboratory work has not only proved interesting to the student and familiarized him with some of the methods of current



research upon which the modern structure of psychology largely depends, but has frequently proved the entering wedge into a science whose elusive processes render it particularly difficult of mastery. A simple experiment has proved more fruitful than hours of verbal explanation. There is good reason why the 'objective method' should be applied in psychology.

IV. EDUCATIONAL AND GENETIC PSYCHOLOGY. Frequent reference is made throughout the course to the pedagogical bearing of the facts studied, and to their differences as dependent upon different stages of development in the race and in the individual. A special text-book is used in Educational Psychology, emphasis being laid on such topics as Heredity, Instinct, Predisposition, Habit, Attention, Fatigue and Learning. The tests commonly used in the schoolroom are also presented. Each student offers a thesis on the subject in which he is most interested. Aside from the literature, opportunity for the study of the child mind is afforded in the practice work in the Model School. Opportunity for work in applied psychology is also given in the Methods class.

### Mathematics.

The work in all the subjects in mathematics is carried on with the special aim to aid the student in teaching the various branches studied. Every effort is made to inculcate a love of study, the power and desire to carry on original investigations, and the realization that the work done in the class room is but the beginning of the work of the true student.

The *sine qua non* of success of the teacher is first the mastery of the subject matter, so thoroughness in preparation of the academic part is made essential and neces-

sary in all of the subjects. Accuracy in statement, and rapidity in execution receive careful attention as requisites of great importance for the teacher's work. Ability to apply the principles is tested by a wide range of exercises in all of the branches.

### Physical Science.

The physical sciences are pre-eminently the studies in which students should develop the habit of careful observation, accurate discrimination, independent judgment, correct inference, and an enthusiastic interest in the marvelous mechanism of the universe revealed in the forms of existence that environ them. In the different departments of science, text-books, as far as possible, are used only as aids to the study of the things themselves. The students are required to investigate by observation and experiment, make inferences and keep systematic records of the results.

**GEOGRAPHY.**—The course in this subject includes Political, Mathematical, and Physical Geography.

The school is well supplied with maps, globes, and the other materials necessary to correct and interesting instruction; and they are used not only so the student may learn from them, but that he may also be prepared to use them in such manner as will enable him to teach successfully with them.

This section of the State offers a fine field for observational work in geography, and this is made a prominent feature of the course.

**BOTANY**—The aim of the course in Botany is to give the student a general idea of the physiology, ecology, reproduction, and morphology of all plants and to arouse intelligent interest in the study of vegetation. By individual experiments and laboratory work, the structure

and functions of the various parts of a plant are determined. The response of plant life to heat, light, and moisture is carefully observed. All data are recorded and drawings are made.

Familiarity in the use and care of a compound microscope is required. The student prepares and examines microscopic slides. Forestry is studied and each student makes a detailed study of the development of a tree for a year. An herbarium is required. Diversified forms of plants are analyzed in order that the student, himself, may analyze any unfamiliar specimen. The growth, structure and effects of bacteria and other fungi are observed. Ferns and other cryptogams are classified.

In ZOOLOGY also the laboratory plan is followed, with numerous supplementary lectures and illustrations. The work begins with those specimens with which the students are most familiar and which are common at the time. The students are led to compare these with others of similar but less familiar classes and of a lower order until the amoeba is reached. Then the work proceeds to the higher types, always by comparing the more familiar with those less familiar to the student. A collection of dried and mounted specimens is required of each student.

In CHEMISTRY the laboratory work occupies two days of a week and demonstrations with lectures and recitations three days. All experiments must be performed by the student under the direction of the instructor and a record must be made before the students leave the laboratory of observations of the phenomena accompanying each experiment.

When GEOLOGY is studied, numerous excursions are made in order that the students may become acquainted with the effects of the various geological forces and agents. This section of country,

so rich in geological formations, makes the subject a very delightful one. To supplement the work there is an unusually fine collection of minerals based upon the valuable separate collections of Joseph C. Roop, Mrs. Margaret C. Brodhead, and Garret Tucker, presented to the school. Brigham's Geology is the text used.

PHYSICS.—This subject is taught inductively. By means of experiments and by calling upon the pupil's own experience and observation the various laws and principles are illustrated and formulated. Manipulation of the apparatus in experimenting is required of the pupils.

Original investigation and illustration are strongly encouraged.

PHYSIOLOGY.—It is the aim of this branch of study to give to the students correct ideas of the structure, activity and care of the human body, and, at the same time, make the subject a valuable means of mental development. As the importance of observation and experiment in this branch is also recognized, facilities are offered for the objective methods of study.

The student is encouraged to confirm the knowledge he gets from the text-book, by the actual observation of the objects themselves. The use of the microscope is encouraged, and lectures and illustrations accompany the recitations. One of the finest manikins that can be procured in Paris is the property of the school.

## History.

GENERAL HISTORY.—Four periods a week for thirty weeks are devoted to Ancient and Mediaeval history by the first year class.

The *second* year class is given the same amount of time for Modern and English history.

The *third* year class is required to spend a half year in the review of United States history and civil government.

The study of history is made a thought exercise by comparisons and the study of events in their relations to each other, and their bearing on civilization.

Papers on different topics are required from time to time.

Government is studied in large measure in connection with history.

### Language.

In teaching ENGLISH GRAMMAR the aim is not only to have the students obtain a thorough knowledge of grammar as a technical study, but also to accustom them to correct and fluent use of the English language in speech and writing.

Examples are taken from compositions, examination papers, and conversations, and are brought before the class for correction. Students are thus helped to avoid the ordinary mistakes made in the use of the mother tongue. Such corrections and abundant constructive exercises make the work of the grammar class training in an art as well as in a science.

COMPOSITION AND RHETORIC.—The course offers thorough drill in Composition and in Rhetoric; daily themes in the practical application of the principles underlying the forms of prose discourse; critical study of the Novel, the Short Story, Description and Poetry; oral composition. The course aims to arouse in the pupil an intelligent appreciation of the beauties of the mother-tongue, an ability to speak and to write with clearness, force and ease, and a genuine love for the best in literature.

LITERATURE.—The course in Literature conforms as nearly as possible to the college entrance requirements of the Middle and Eastern states. The study of the classics is supplemented by a course in the history of English Literature, in which constant effort is made to give the prominent characteristics of each period together with the salient details of the lives of the representative makers of prose and poetry.

The aim in the reading of the classics is not only to give the student a knowledge of the selections read but to create a taste and appreciation for the best literature and to equip him with a working knowledge of the principles of criticism, whereby the reader can determine for himself what constitutes good literature.

LATIN.—The first year in Latin is devoted to Caesar's First Campaign, the object being to ground the pupils thoroughly in the fundamental principles of paradigms and construction. The disciplinary value of the study is held to be of prime importance. Constant stress is laid upon close, careful, and painstaking study in the preparation of the lessons assigned. The quality of the work done is rated above the quantity of ground covered. The aim throughout the course is to afford every student the best opportunity to acquire a knowledge and free use of the means and methods of translation and interpretation.

GREEK.—Those students who desire to take the classical course in college are required to study Greek. The aim is to give them a thorough preparation, such a command of the vocabulary and syntax of the language as will enable them to become acquainted with the literature, its beauties, and its nobility, and the inspiration of Greek life is always kept in view.

MODERN LANGUAGES.—The beginning classes in modern languages are taught by the conversational

method. A class in German, for instance, is made as nearly as possible a German class. The lessons are object lessons conducted in German. The command of language developed in the oral exercises is perfected in written themes. This work is supplemented with easy reading lessons, and as rapidly as possible, the students are grounded in the elements of grammar. The first reading lessons generally are not translated. The reading is followed by questions in the language to be answered in the same way. This method not only introduces the students to a usable knowledge of a foreign tongue, but serves also as the best possible preparation for the study of its literature, as it develops grasp of the spirit of a language as mere translation can not.

### The Practical Arts.

**DRAWING.**—The purpose of this work is to develop observation and concentration of thought, to train the hand to execute quickly and accurately that which the brain dictates, and to cultivate an appreciation of the beautiful. A good foundation in freehand, perspective, still-life, nature study, landscape-sketching, pose-drawing, composition and design is developed in the students. The mediums used are pencil, crayon, charcoal and water-color. The class work of the second year consists in a daily exercise of twenty-eight weeks, and special emphasis is laid upon the methods of teaching drawing. At least one lesson a week during the year is given those seniors who teach drawing and all seniors who desire may join this class.

**SPECIAL INSTRUCTION IN DRAWING.**—For those who wish to make drawing a specialty, a thorough course including the applied arts, weaving, basketry, troled-leather and stencilling is planned and special instruction may be had in any branch in any medium.

SEWING.—A thorough course in all the fundamental stitches is given the students of the first year class; also embroidery suitable for application to waists, belts, etc. In the second year class, students apply the work of the first year to the making of garments.

MANUAL TRAINING.—This department embraces Clay Modeling, Mechanical Drawing, Raffia Work, Basket-weaving, and Wood Work. The wood work is designed to develop practical skill in knife work, wood carving, and in such use of carpenter's tools as will be useful to the students in their future work. The articles made are such as embody the different exercises in the order of their simplicity and have practical utility.

PENMANSHIP.—Thorough instruction in the principles of both Vertical and Slant Systems is supplemented by practice for good, healthful position and rapid, easy execution preparatory to practical applications in exercises in books and on the blackboard. The blackboard exercises are an important feature of the work.

BOOK-KEEPING.—Both single entry and double entry systems of book-keeping are taught. The work consists in thorough drill in writing up from dictation the principal commercial papers, and complete sets of books are kept, applying all business processes as they occur in actual transactions. The students are compelled to reason out each transaction.

### Physical Training.

The aims of this department are: The attainment of bodily health and symmetry; education of the will; and greater co-ordination between mind and body.

All students physically able are required to take physical training during their entire course. It is necessary that they provide suits before entering—or, these



may be ordered at the school, prices ranging from \$3.50 to \$5.00. For women, the suit consists of blue serge bloomers, a middy, and gymnasium slippers; for the men, a sweater or jersey and gymnasium shoes.

Before entering a class, all women are given a physical examination. This examination determines the muscular development of the student and ascertains any weakness or deformity that may exist.

The course has been carefully graded. It includes: tactics, free calisthenics (German and Swedish systems), light apparatus, heavy apparatus, games and plays, rhythm work, folk-dancing, and athletics.

During the third year special attention is given to the theory and teaching of gymnastics, each student being required to conduct regular class work. During the Senior Year the students have the privilege of teaching classes in the Model School. This experience enables each pupil to conduct the physical training work required in most public schools.

## Music.

All students who intend to graduate are required to take a course in vocal music to prepare them to teach music in the Public Schools. They are given opportunity to teach music in the Model School under the direction of the supervisor of music.

A three year course in the Teaching of Public School Music has been established.

Material necessary for use in the grades and High School, and the best method of presenting this material, is carefully outlined.

Voice placing, Sight singing, Harmony and Music History are taught.

A Male Glee Club, Womens Chorus, and Mixed Choral Society are maintained and give opportunity for those

who sing to secure instruction in part-singing and interpretation.

## The Model School.

In connection with the Normal School, a Model School is maintained. This school is housed in a new and commodious building, well equipped and modern in every particular. Its class rooms are light and airy; the assembly room for the pupils is large and attractive; and the school maintains its own library, which gives its pupils access to wholesome and helpful books and magazines.

The Model School consists of nine grades and does the regular work of the first nine grades of the public schools. The teaching is done by the Seniors under the close supervision of the model school principal and assistants. Here the Seniors put into actual use the principles of teaching taught in the Normal School, become acquainted with aids and various devices in teaching, and receive instruction and gain experience in the handling of classes.

The course of study and the text-books used are kept in touch with conservative progress in school work. The Aldine System in primary reading is used, followed by many supplementary readers. The arithmetic work is in keeping with the best ideas on this subject, and the material is drawn from the business life of to-day. In geography and history, teachers learn how to use supplementary material, using a text-book mainly as a guide to a definite line of work that shall not lack coherence, proportion, or system. Drawing, music and physical training are under the supervision of the heads of the departments of the Normal School. Science and Nature Study receive special attention, and the locality furnishes excellent opportunity for such work. No senior has less than twenty-one weeks' actual experience in the teaching, and as many seniors as can be provided for are expected to teach throughout their senior year. A well equipped and well conducted Kindergarten is maintained in connection with the Model School.

## Rules and Regulations.

---

1. Loud talking, whistling, scuffling or any other rude and boisterous behavior in the buildings is strictly prohibited.

2. The use of tobacco in any of its forms in or about the buildings, and the use of intoxicating drinks or profane language and card playing are strictly prohibited.

3. No dirt or other refuse shall be thrown from the windows, nor thrown into slop sinks or toilets; waste baskets are provided for this purpose on all the halls.

4. Students shall not visit each other's rooms during the regular hours of study except by special permission of the teacher in charge.

5. No student shall withdraw from the school during the session without permission from the Principal. It is desirable that students leave school as little as possible during the terms, and no permission will be granted to visit relatives or friends at a distance, or friends in town or vicinity over night unless a written request for such permission is received by the Principal from a parent or guardian.

6. All students are expected to be regular and prompt in attendance at class, chapel and meals.

7. Ladies and gentlemen are not allowed to associate together, excepting at such times and occasions as may be designated by the Principal. Standing in groups in

the main corridors, or prolonged conversations are not allowed.

8. Each occupant will be held responsible for the condition of his or her room and any damage done to furniture. No nails, screws, tacks, etc., shall be driven into the walls, doors, windows, furniture, etc. No contrivance shall be attached to locks or transoms for the purpose of opening them. Climbing into rooms over transoms breaks the locks and doors, and is prohibited. Pressing botanical specimens under bed post, breaks the rails and head boards, and is, therefore, also prohibited.

9. No student shall withdraw from classes to which he has been assigned without special permission from the Principal.

10. No gentleman not connected with the school will be permitted to meet, walk, or ride with a student of the opposite sex except in cases of necessity and by permission.

11. Students shall attend public worship each Sunday morning at the church of their choice or designated by parents or guardian.

12. It is to be understood by the students that it is enjoined upon the members of the faculty to see to it that the requirements of the school are complied with, and that they have full authority to correct any improper acts that may come to their notice.

Breakfast, 7.00 a. m. ; Dinner, 12.00 m. ; Supper, 6.00 p. m. ; Study Hour, 7.00 p. m. ; 1st Retiring Bell, 9.45 p. m. Lights must be out promptly at 10.00 p. m.

## Miscellaneous.

---

### Library and Reading Room.

The Library and Reading Room contains reference books, standard literary works, International and Standard dictionaries, cyclopedias, daily papers, magazines, leading periodicals, and educational journals. Lately large additions have been made of books on travel, history and pedagogy.

Mrs. Margaret C. Brodhead has presented to us a number of valuable works, and we have developed a plan for making regular monthly additions of the best new books published. This plan has proved so satisfactory that we shall continue to adhere to it.

### Lectures.

In order that the students may have opportunity to hear some of the best lectures and musical attractions during the year, a course of four or five entertainments is arranged.

In addition to this the Music Department of the school gives a concert, and the Societies each a public entertainment. The Model School gives a closing Concert and other interesting exercises.

The commencement concert is always a very interesting feature of the year.

### Literary Societies.

There are two flourishing Literary Societies, the Minisink and the Shakespearean, which hold meetings every Saturday evening. All students except such as cannot attend are required to join one or the other. These

societies hold open meetings on the first and second Friday evenings following the opening of each term.

### Christian Influence.

The Young Men's Christian Association, organized in the Fall of '93, has continued a steady growth since. The meetings are held in the Chapel every Sunday morning. It is doing a good work among our young men.

The Y. W. C. A. is equally as flourishing and its influence for good is very marked. The meetings are held in the Model School Chapel every Sunday morning.

Every Sunday evening all the students whose church relations do not forbid it are required to attend Bible study in the Chapel. The study is conducted by the Principal. Subjects in controversy among the churches are passed by.

Sunday morning, students are expected to attend some one of the churches in the towns—naturally the church to which they or their parents belong.

Devotional exercises are conducted in the Chapel each noon by the Principal or a member of the Faculty, at which all the students are expected to be present. Students whose church relations do not permit them to be present during the religious exercises are required to present themselves there for the announcements.

### Athletics.

A large part of the campus has been fitted up as an athletic field. It is kept in good condition, and a commodious grand stand has been erected upon it. The Trustees encourage athletic sports by contributing money freely for their support. The athletic spirit among the students is strong and healthy.

## Laundry.

Each pupil is allowed to send to the laundry 12 pieces of clothes per week, including handkerchiefs, napkins and towels. In calculating these 12 pieces a pair of cuffs is counted as one piece, and a pair of hose as one piece. The fact that pupils may have put in less than 12 pieces during any one week does not entitle them to put in more than 12 pieces any other week. For the ladies only three starched pieces will be laundered per week. These starched pieces will not include white shirt waists, white dresses, or white dress skirts. Such articles will be laundered at a cost not exceeding forty per cent. of the public laundry charges. White petticoats will be washed the entire year but will be ironed free only during the months of September, October, May and June. Woolen and merino dress skirts will not be done in the laundry. Each article of clothing must have on it the pupil's name, plainly marked with indelible ink. Clothes which are not marked will be returned unlaundered. Clothes must be taken to the laundry in laundry bags, each bag must have pupil's name plainly marked on it with indelible ink. No clothes will be washed for any student the first week or the last week of any term.

## Outfits.

Each pupil is expected to furnish, for personal use, the following articles: One bed comforter or pair of blankets, also towels and napkins. These must be plainly marked. All articles of clothing likely to be sent to the laundry, must be plainly marked with indelible ink. As no silverware is allowed to be sent from the Dining Room, a knife, fork and spoon should be included in the outfit for use in cases of sickness. Slippers, overshoes, an umbrella and raincoat should also be included.

This charge of \$1.00 per term is payable to the Principal of the Model School at the beginning of each term when pupils register. No pupil will be admitted to any term until the bills of the previous term have been settled in full.

### Payments for Boarding Students.

Fall term:—Boarding pupils entitled to State Aid are required to pay \$34.00 when they register, Sept. 3, 1912, (this includes the \$2.00 Registration Fee), and \$32.00 at the middle of the term, Oct. 28, 1912.

Winter Term:—Boarding pupils entitled to State Aid are required to pay \$26.00 when they register, December 30, 1912 (this includes the \$2.00 Registration Fee), and \$24.00 at middle of the term, Feb. 10, 1913.

Spring Term:—Boarding pupils entitled to State Aid are required to pay \$26.00 when they register, March 31, 1913 (this includes the \$2.00 Registration Fee), and \$24.00 at the middle of the term, May 15, 1913.

Boarding pupils who do not receive State Aid are required to pay \$1.50 in addition to the amounts named above.

## Payments for Day Students.

Fall Term:—Day students who do not receive State Aid, are required to pay \$14.00 when they register, Sept. 3, 1912 (this includes the \$2.00 Registration Fee), and \$12.00 at the middle of the term, Oct. 28, 1912.

Winter Term:—Day students who do not receive State Aid, are required to pay \$11.00 when they register, Dec. 30, 1912 (this includes the \$2.00 Registration Fee), and \$9.00 at the middle of the term, Feb. 10, 1913.

Spring Term:—Day students who do not receive State Aid are required to pay \$11.00 when they register, March 31, 1913 (this includes the \$2.00 Registration Fee), and \$9.00 at the middle of the term, May 15, 1913.

Day students who receive State Aid, will be required to pay only the Registration Fee of \$2.00 each term, but these fees must be paid at the opening of each term when students register.

Charges for Chemicals for Laboratory use or any other charges, other than those named above against students, will be payable at the middle of each term.

Payments are to be made to the Principal of the school, who acts as agent for the Trustees. Bills are payable, one-half at the beginning of the term, when pupils register, and the other half at the middle of the term, and no deviation will be made from this rule except by special agreement, in advance, with the Principal or Board of Trustees.

Lectures and other entertainments in the regular course and the school publications are free to all students.

### Special Notice as to Payments.

Special attention is called to the *amounts* and *dates* of these payments, as we do not make a practice of sending out bills, and parents and pupils are expected to arrange for the prompt payment of all accounts on the dates specified. No pupil will be admitted to any term unless the bills of the previous term have been settled in full.

### Deductions.

No deductions are made for absence for the first two or the last two weeks of any term except by previous arrangement with the Principal. Positively no deductions will be made for the first or last week of any term.

For absence two or more consecutive weeks on account of personal sickness one-half of the usual charge for board will be allowed.

### Damage Deposits.

Every boarding student is required to deposit fifty cents for the key to his room. If the key is given up when the student leaves school the fifty cents are returned to him. A deposit of \$2.50 is also required to secure the school in case of damage to the students' room or other

school property. When no damage is done this money is also returned to the student when he leaves school. Damage charges are deducted from the amount.

### State Aid.

For students seventeen years of age or over who take the prescribed courses of study and who sign an agreement to teach at least two full years in the public schools of Pennsylvania, the State pays the tuition charge of \$1.50 a week.

### Reports of Standing.

At the end of the fall and winter terms reports of the standing of all the students are sent to their parents or guardians, and reports of the standing of all students who do not take State Board examinations are sent also at the end of the spring term. In case such reports are not received the principal should be notified. Reports of standing may be obtained at any time by asking for them.
