# **- BLOOMSBURG UNIVERSITY -**

## **"A Commitment To Excellence"**

Bloomsburg University is a multi-purpose institution of higher education serving the citizens of Pennsylvania as one of the 14 Commonwealth-owned Universities. With a commitment to provide a quality, affordable education for all qualified students, Bloomsburg combines the tradition of an institution founded in 1839 with modern learning, living, and recreational programs and facilities. Commonwealth funding provides 55 percent of Bloomsburg's annual operating budget.

Undergraduate students may enroll in degree programs in 64 areas of study in the arts and sciences, business, teacher education, nursing, and health sciences. A program in engineering is offered in conjunction with the Pennsylvania State University, and preparation for post-baccalaureate study at professional schools is offered. Unique educational opportunities are available through advanced placement, study abroad, professional practicum, internships, independent study and the Center for Academic Development programs.

At the graduate level, the master's degree is offered in 25 areas of study and there are ten supervisory certification programs in the field of teacher education.

Extended program offerings provide continuing, life-long learning opportunities for people of all ages and educational interests through non-degree courses, non-credit mini-courses, international studies and exchanges, cooperative education, courses offered at off-campus locations and by public service television, and credit for work experience.

Enrollment for the Fall semester, 1984, totalled 6189 students. There were 5,045 full-time and 719 part-time undergraduates, and 93 full-time and 332 part-time graduate students. Instruction is provided by a 342-member faculty.

The University's 173-acre campus overlooks the Town of Bloomsburg and the scenic Susquehanna Valley. Carver Hall, built in 1867, provides a contrast with the modern facilities that include seven residence halls, a library, a 2,000-seat auditorium, student union, dining hall, gymnasium, administration building, five classroom buildings, athletic fields, and recreational areas on the lower campus.

An athletic complex and recreational area occupy the school's 100-acre upper campus. In addition, the James H. McCormick Center for Human Services is the newest building on the lower campus and is being used for the first time this fall.

Located less than two miles from an Interstate 80 interchange and 22 miles from Interstate 81, Bloomsburg is within one hour's driving time from Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, Hazleton, and Williamsport, 1½ hours from Harrisburg, 2½ hours from Philadelphia, and 3 hours from New York City. The community is 45 miles from the Avoca International Airport and is serviced by major bus lines.

Bloomsburg has an enviable placement record. Of the 1,183 who graduated in the 1982-83 academic year, 81% had meaningful employment or were in graduate school one year later.

Active files of over 25,000 living alumni are kept by the University. Graduates of BU have distinguished themselves in areas including law, medicine (one is a Nobel Laureate), science, architecture, education, industry, and research.

The Bloomsburg University is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education, and the Pennsylvania State Board of Education.

## Head Coach

### Sue Hibbs

Sue Hibbs enters her ninth season as head coach of the Bloomsburg University women's basketball team. She has guided the Huskies to a 65-78 record in her eight seasons with last year's 11-14 team going to the Pennsylvania Conference Tournament for the first time in Bloomsburg history. The Huskies dropped a tough 77-66 first round decision to eventual champion Millersville. In 1975-76 while filling in for Joanne McComb who was on a leave of absence, she had her best season as head Bloomsburg mentor as she led the Huskies to an 11-2 record and a 4th place finish in the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIW) Invitational.

Hibbs graduated from Western Kentucky University with a Bachelor of Science degree and received her Masters Degree from East Stroudsburg, both in Health and Physical Education. She coached Berlin (NH) High School to a 40-16 record in four seasons and took them to the State Tournament three of those years. She was also a graduate assistant at East Stroudsburg before becoming an assistant at Bloomsburg.

### Steve Goodwin

Steve Goodwin enters his first season as assistant women's basketball coach at Bloomsburg University. He will have multiple duties with the team, the most important of which will be conditioning. He will also help with some recruiting along with his other coaching chores. This fall, he completed his first season as Bloomsburg's head soccer coach.

He received his Masters of Science degree from Ohio University in Physical Education and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education from East Stroudsburg. He was an assistant soccer coach at Swarthmore College in 1981 and became head soccer and assistant basketball coach at Oakcrest High School in 1982.



## Outlook

"The competition in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference has never been as balanced as it is presently," stated head coach Sue Hibbs as she analyzed the upcoming season. With such balance, Bloomsburg can look forward to good competition game after game against some of the best Division II teams around.

Last season, Hibbs' squad went 11-14 and earned their first-ever PSAC Championship bid. However, a 77-66 loss to eventual champion Millersville squelched the Huskies' hopes for a title. This season the team will be looking for their second-straight tourney bid and shot at the championship game.

The key to the Huskies' success will be experience as ten members from the 1983-84 team return again in 1984-85. Of the ten, only two are seniors, three are juniors, and the rest sophomores.

The most important of the returnees will be junior forward Jean Millen. She broke Bloomsburg's all-time scoring record in her sophomore season compiling 518 points for a two year total of 822. In addition, she holds various single game, season and career records such as: most points in a season, most points in a game, most rebounds in a season, and highest rebound and scoring averages in a season. In 1983-84 when she set many of her records, she was second in the nation in Division II in rebounding and was 12th in scoring, averaging 15.6 rebounds per game and 20.7 ppg. These accomplishments earned her a spot on the PSAC Eastern Division All-Star Team. Jean will definitely be a mainstay in the BU offense and will be looked to for her leadership abilities.

Another player that will be counted on for leadership is senior center Jeanne Radcliff. "Could be one of the top two-three centers in the league," according to Hibbs. Jeanne was second behind Millen in rebounds per game and set a BU single season mark for blocked shots with 46.

Another inside force will be senior co-captain Sarah Hackforth. A physical player who saw action in all 25 contests in 1983-84, Sarah averaged 8.0 ppg. and will be another to provide some experienced play to an otherwise young squad. Millen, Radcliff, and Hackforth should give the Huskies one of the more solid front lines in Bloomsburg history. Sophomore Kim Joerger and freshmen Amy Wolf and Chris Pellman should also see action on the frontline as will sophomore Patti DelGrosso if she can overcome some preseason ankle injuries.

Quarterbacking the Husky offense will be junior Kris Zimmerman. The number one point guard from a year ago, she led the team in assists and was the only player, other than Millen, to average over ten points per game (10.9).

Sophomore Linda King seems to have the inside track for the offguard position. King, who could see some frontline action, will be hardpressed by, junior Ellen Fawley and sophomore Pam Bressi, to keep the job.

Newcomers Michelle Rowe and Carla Shearer should see action at the guard spots as will Lori Pisco, who is inactive until January 1. Shearer is a sophomore in her first year of basketball at BU. Rowe was a First Team Philadelphia All-Public League choice at William Penn H.S. last year.

The team has the speed and versatility to adapt to a fastbreak game if necessary but also has the experience to slow the game down and go with the structured offense if it is to their advantage.

According to Hibbs, "The team is anxious for the competition within the PSAC to begin." This year's team has a strong nucleus of returnees with a few newcomers added to provide a solid backbone for this season and seasons to come.

5'6" Sophomore  
Shamokin, PA Lourdes Regional H.S.  
Guard #20

Played in 22 of 25 games last season as a freshman. A hard worker with a lot of potential. Can play both guard spots and has good speed which could help should the Huskies decide to use the fast break. Her outside shot has improved since last season so she is expected to contribute more to this year's offense. Averaged 2.1 points per game while playing just over 14 minutes a contest. Major: Computer and Information Sciences.

## "Home Of The Huskies"



The Nelson Fieldhouse, located on Bloomsburg University's upper campus, serves as home for most of BU's athletic events. The facility has all the necessary ingredients as it holds a 3000 seat arena for all home wrestling and basketball games, an indoor track, two tennis courts, an olympic size swimming pool, and two handball/racquetball courts. The building has classroom and office space for use by the health/physical education and athletic staffs. Nelson also houses the wrestling practice room, which is a fully padded area located on the second floor. A totally equipped Nautilus weight room adds to the strength and conditioning areas of the program, and Nelson also offers a training room staffed by a full-time physical therapist and no less than six student assistants. Also an equipment manager handles the needs of most of Bloomsburg's 18 varsity athletic teams.
