county agent agreed to reserve a slide show for us that provides a retrospective look at farming. As well, he provided a film catalogue that I reviewed. Nothing included looked really appropriate.

indicated he and his staff had other commitments on 25 July; however, he did provide a certain amount of statistical information on Erie Co.scene. By way of example, the average dairy farm milks from 46-48 cows. In his words, our area farmers are locked into the dairy industry. He sees no replacement for it.
