Dear Sir,

In view of the recent action taken by the Board of Trustees and the attitude of the State Department, in reference to the granting of the diplomas of Miss Edith Palmer, Miss Mary J. Gurn, and Mrs. Geo. W. Clark who stand charged with disobedience and insurrection, we deem it incumbent upon ourselves to state to you for purposes of future reference and for an understanding of our position in the matter that we consider such action unprecedented and unwarranted for the following reasons.

(I.) The power to grant Normal Certificates is vested wholly in the faculty and any pressure brought to bear upon this body by any higher authority for the purpose of coercing them into granting diplomas to unworthy persons is revolutionary and dangerous and shall always be resisted by us.

(II.) We reserve the right to withhold a diploma whenever in our judgment we have sufficient evidence that the holder would be a menace as a teacher to our public institutions and a failure in disciplinary powers.

(III.) While we recognize that ultimate disciplinary powers resides in the Board of Trustees, yet it is patent that the Faculty is held responsible for the dignity and tone of the school, and to reverse its rulings invites insurrection.

In consideration of the above facts, let it understood that we do not consider

Misses Palmer and Gryn, and Mr. Clark  
to be graduates of the Edinboro Normal School,  
and that while the diplomas pass from  
this body, it shall never be considered that  
by this act the possessors are thus entitled  
to teach in the public schools of Pennsylvania.
