take action in the matter without delay,

by which either society is governed be so  
revised as to contain the regulations em-

Sec. 2.— Any member in good and regular standing in the senior class shall be eligible to this place.

The term good and regular standing as used in these articles is to mean a good department record and all back work at time of election fully completed.

Continued.

Art. III.

Sec. 1. Class no. 2. "Orator Merito" shall consist of five persons chosen by the faculty.

Sec. 2. For convenience in selection but without further significance the places in this class shall be designated 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> + 5<sup>th</sup>.

Sec. 3. Each member of the faculty shall by secret ballot vote for one person for 1<sup>st</sup> place. The person receiving a majority vote shall be declared elected.

Should no majority vote be cast the three persons having the highest votes shall be declared the candidates for this place and a new vote by ballot taken.

A majority vote again failing to appear the two with highest votes shall be the candidates for final vote in which the person receiving the majority shall be declared duly elected.

Sec. 4. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> + 5<sup>th</sup> places in this class shall be filled separately and respectively in same manner as presented for 1<sup>st</sup> place.

Sec. 5. All persons in good and regular standing in the senior class and whose grades in all departments at time of election shall average 90% or over shall be eligible to any place in this class.

Art. IV.

Sec. 1. Class 3. - "Society Orator" shall consist of four persons, two chosen by the members of the Potter society and two, by the members of the Phi. Society.

Sec. 2. All persons in good and regular standing in the senior class shall be eligible to a place in this class.

Art. V.

Sec 1. The order of selection by classes shall be as follows:

The class orator shall be chosen first and the result reported to the faculty.

Sec. 2. The faculty shall select the persons for class no. 2. during the sixth week of Spring term

Sec 3. Class no. 3. "Society Orators" shall be elected at first regular meetings of the respective societies after the election of "Orators merito"

Art. VI.

Sec 1. All regulations or parts of regulations inconsistent with these articles are hereby repealed

Sec 2. These articles shall be the regulations of this institution covering the matter herein mentioned until same are amended or repealed.
