#### Cotton Destruction a Crime

From Washington, D.C., comes the demand to cotton growers in the U.S. to destroy their 1931 cotton crop!

This is not the first time that our state and national officials of the Democrat and Republican parties have recommended the destruction of farm commodities. It's done right along.
