Western Union cuts wages 10%. Fifty thousand workers are affected by the slash.

Between 1926 and 1928 our national productivity increased 27%. Wages increased only 4%. American producers are the American consumers and it naturally follows that a people can not buy back 27% more goods with only 4% more real wages. These are government figures available to all who wish to be enlightened. Because this fact is undeniable we have cyclical over-production but under-consumption. Farmers hungry, tailors raggedy, and shoe makers barefoot, all because they have not the money to buy back the necessities they have produced. And our great minds say they will restore prosperity by still further reducing wages.
