Information Bulletin about Stalinist organizations and organizational forms.

This bulletin is initiated to facilitate orientation among the numerous Stalinist, Neo-Stalinist, and Stalinist influenced groups. The bulletin makes no claim to completeness, since the task of describing and analyzing the rapidly growing Stalinist movement here in the United States, in Europe, and in Asia is far beyond the capacity of only a few persons. Therefore it is confined for the most part to news items concerning the German political emigration and groups within the orbit of the German Stalinist movement.

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"FREE GERMANS" IN MOSCOW CALLING NEW YORK.

In New York, activity towards the creation of a "Free German Committee" has come to a happy ending. Obviously the Moscow center gave very strict orders for the organization of such a committee waiting impatiently for the welding of the "missing link" in the chain. Especially active, of course, is Hagen, "genuine" democrat, "Western soul", and an almost religious believer in liberal ideas who assumes the ridiculous role of a prospective conciliator between Moscow and Washington. Aide is his old bosom friend Jakob Walcher, leader of the remaining fragment of the so-called SAP (Sozialistische Arbeiter Partei). Walcher was always an admirer of the wise policy of the "great Stalin" and has come out in the open again since the outbreak of the German-Russian war. These two old manoeuverers are busy and eager to get the group of Weimar Social Democrats into the combination. They hope to make use of Grzesinski, Staudinger, etc. whose function will be to act as camouflage for the grouping around the core of the movement, Albert Schreiner, and his puppet, the incredible Boenheim.

Albert Schreiner, an old German Communist, was very early attached to the secret service of the German Communist Party, which was closely bound up with the Russian secret services in Germany. After a short "oppositional" interlude, he was, no doubt, as a reward for his special talents and in anticipation of future services, one of the very few oppositionists whom the Communist Party ever took back. He served Stalin well, especially in Spain and among the refugees. His grade in the GPU is approximately that of a major and he is one of those ruthless, brutal types who are being groomed for a very sinister role in post-war Germany. Cooperation with such types as Schreiner is an unpardonable crime and paves the way for the triumph of Stalinism. Boenheim is important only in tying together the various strands in the New York network. We shall deal with him on another occasion.

But the decisive thing is this: under cover of the good old slogan of the "United Front", utterly meaningless today and having only one concrete sense: unity with the Stalinists, these two "New Beginners", Hagen and Walcher have taken the floor in a series of meetings of German refugees and defended the necessity of the united front policy with Schreiner. Schreiner, of course, represents an important movement, - the German American Magazine and its organization of "open" Stalinists within the German political emigration.

Hagen and Walcher will come in for serious rebuke for their "inefficiency". The crisis in Europe is approaching its climax. Today sixteen Stalinist states, tomorrow 32 "free European states", all united by the GPU and its parties or by the Stalinist parties and their GPU. Harry up, New York German Stalinists and whip your helpers, or you lose your job-opportunities in "The Stalinist Free Germanies".

Already in the last issue (February) "Freies Deutschland" Mexico, Hagen is criticized.... Not the underground has broken Hitlers armies, but the Russian resistance.....

THE FREE GERMAN COMMITTEE IN SWEDEN

Max Seydewitz - Former left Social Democratic Deputee from Zwickau, Saxony. Social democratic contact man for Moscow at least since 1933. Author of a book "Trotzky or Stalin" based on material provided by the Moscow propaganda center.

Dr. Max Hodann - Specialist for sex.

News has just arrived from Sweden that a German National Committee of "Free Germans" has been formed with Max Seydewitz as President. It has not yet been confirmed whether Fritz Tarnow, former German trade-union leader has also donned the Free German uniform. August Enderle, close friend of Jakob Walcher is also in Stockholm.

BOENHEIM TAKES OVER

Dr. Felix Boenheim is preparing to capture all the German-American organizations. On January 30, a joint meeting was held by the German-American Emergency Conference (Stalinist front organization), attended by Mr. O. Sattler (Workmens' Benefit Fund) and Victor Ridder (Publisher of the N.Y. Staatszeitung & Herold). Another meeting was announced by the same group for Feb. 12, 1944 - this time for the purpose of demonstrating the

"loyalty of all German-Americans in the metropolitan area".

Still another meeting as announced for March 3, 1944, under the auspices of the German-American Emergency Committee. Representatives from the most divergent German-American groups, including the president of the Northeastern Saengerbund of America, Mr. M. Obermeyer, president of the Victory Committee of German-American Trade-Unionists, Mr. Alfred Kirschner, chairman of the New York Turnverein and others will be present.

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On January 2, 1944, friends and readers of the "German-American" met in the New School for Social Research, NYC., to celebrate a victorious New Year. Mr. Henry Cassirer, assistant director of the CBS listening post, and a columnist on the "German-American" addressed the gathering, saying:

"When worlds are being built we cannot criticize the builders for imperfections of detail".

(We do not think that this remark is directed against Stalinist methods.)

The propaganda wave extends all over the U.S. On February 20, the G.A.E.C. held a recruiting drive in Philadelphia, with Oscar Maria Graf and O. Sattler as speakers. As reported on in San Francisco:

"We distributed hundreds of our pamphlets on "WHAT WILL HAPPEN in GERMANY", by Paul Merker, of Mexico..... It will be more difficult, however, to rally those German-Americans who claim to be anti-Nazis, but who for some reason or other find all kinds of excuses against falling into step with the rest of us in our determination to create a united bloc of German-Americans....."

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GERMAN OFFICERS AS A PROPHYLACTIC

One of the speakers on this station is Edler von Daniels, a German officer in the Free German Committee in Moscow. An excerpt from his broadcasts:

4 | " ... Our first task is to save the lives of these German soldiers, to save them from the certain and useless death to which Hitler leads them daily. Our second task is to cleanse the besmirched honor of the German officers' corps. The third task is to act as a preventative against the civil war which Hitler will be faced with." (our emphasis)

Whereas on the one hand constant appeals are made to the various "underground movements" to finally let loose the long-awaited "civil war" -if they want to avoid sharing the guilt for the crimes of their governments- German officers in Moscow are permitted to speak of preventing the impending civil war.

M E X I C O

A) A LETTER FROM MEXICO

Dear Friend,

... I don't know whether you read the Stalinist press which appears here regularly. That is why I want to write you a number of facts concerning what has been happening here in the last few months. The German Stalinists and their supporters have succeeded in "taking over" the "Deutsche Auslandsorganisation" with its newspaper and club house. And I mean the word organization literally. The majority of German nazis in Mexico, especially the industrialists, merchants, brokers and exporters issued a statement to the "Free Germans" in which they declare that following the organization of a National Committee of Free Germans in Moscow, they now considered themselves anti-nazis. Everyone here knows that the whole thing is a farce, but what does it matter when

- 1) it is an imitation of events in Moscow, and
- 2) these rich business men provided half the funds for the maintenance of the club house and the publication of the paper.

The other half was provided, up to the outbreak of the war, by the German Embassy here. Now there is talk of its being paid by contributions from other sources.

The inauguration of the Latin-American Committee has been given a great play. It publishes an information bulletin in several languages, which is distributed to the Latin-American countries. Another recent acquisition here is the "German Democratic Woman's Movement", - and we expect that the men will shortly counter with the appearance of the "German Democratic Party". If one were not so familiar with the methods of these people one would really get the impression that the people involved in all this are "honest democrats". It is only to be hoped that the German working class will take a good look at the past of these bought agents, especially those who bear the weight of "heroic deeds" in the Spanish prisons and the special detention cells in the cellars of the GPU on their conscience....."

B) MEXICO CITY IS THE ORGANIZATION & PROPAGANDA CENTER FOR THE STALINIST "FREE MOVEMENTS" IN NORTH AND SOUTH AMERICA.

At the head are Paul Merker, former Communist deputy to the Reichstag, and Andre Simon (Otto Katz), a well-known GPU agent. The newly created Latin-American Committee has as its chairman Ludwig Renn, the writer. Paul Merker is secretary. This organization controls all the "Free Movements" in Central and South America, as well as in the U.S. and Canada. The Latin-American Committee formulates the "line" for all the fellow-traveler movements in the various countries. They initiate manifestos, resolutions, and "WELCOME" cables to Moscow. It demands the adherence of the different committees in London, Havan, Montevideo, Santiago de Chile, Buenos Aires, Paraguay, Brazil, and Canada and that of the U.S. when it is finally formed.

C) WORLD POLITICS

".... Our struggles, through our Spanish languish organ "Alemania libre", our fortnightly "Demokratische Post", and the "Press Service of the Latin-American Committee of the Free Germans", in Spanish, continue....
".... We have never concealed our admiration for the heroic Soviet Union. Today we are no longer a little group rallying around a literary political magazine - - we are the organ of a movement on this continent which, with the foundation of the National Committee "Free Germans" in Moscow and of the Free German Committee in London, becomes a factor in WORLD POLITICS (!) for the formation of a democratic future....."

D) THE INAUGURATION CEREMONY

of the "Free German House" in Mexico City, Calle Dr Rio de la Loza No.86 took place on October 16,43. The inaugural address was delivered by Ludwig Renn who presented the house to the "Free Germans". Refreshments were served by the "Democratic Women's Movement". "WELCOME" telegrams were received from the Jewish organizations MENORAH and HATIKWAH, and from "Free Hungary" in Mexico.

The U.S. staff - according to the Nov.43 issue - consists of Albert Norden, Alfred Kantorowicz, Lion Feuchtwanger, Berthold Brecht, Berthold Viertel, Ernst Bloch, Ferdinand Bruckner, Max Schroeder, etc.

These names are mentioned in a survey of the year's activities contained in the November 1943 issue.

G) WHERE DOES THEIR MONEY COME FROM ?

The latest creation for the propoganda machine is the publishing company " El libro libre", (called in the U.S. Stalinist edition : "Workers' Library ") which brings out writings by Paul Merker, Heinrich Mann, Theodore Balk, Bodo Uhse and Leo Katz, in German.

H) Broadcast.

The Machine also broadcasts regularly on Thursday evening from 8 to 8:15 via Radio Nacional Station Mexico (XEFO, 111) kc) and over short-wave Station XE2U (49 m).

M) A STALINIST NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF GERMAN TRADE-UNIONISTS IN SOUTH-AMERICA.

The Trade-Union delegation to the Latin-American "Free Germany" Committee has taken steps to unite the anti-Nazi German Trade-Unions in the Latin-American countries, and to establish contact with the Trade-Union Committees of the United Nations. The measures necessary for the carrying out of this action were discussed and adopted at the Conference of the German Trade-Union Delegation called on October 2 and 3, 1943, in Mexico City. A provisional statement was formulated by the Conference on the reconstruction of the German Trade-Unions, as follows:

"The future German trade unions should be organized according to industries, similar to the various sections of the C.I.O. in the U.S. The German trade unions should be unified. They should not be permitted to attach themselves to separate political parties, as did the "Allgemeine Deutsche Gewerkschaftsbund", the "Deutsche Gewerkschaftsbund" and the "Gewerkschaftsring Deutscher Angestellten, Arbeiter und Beamten" in pre-Hitler Germany. In the future German trade union movement no discrimination against any supporters of anti-Nazi opposition movements must be tolerated, whether these were Democrats, Christian, Socialists or Communists. The movement must be imbued with genuine trade union democracy. ... The first task of this new movement will be the rooting out of all the ideological and organizational remains of the Nazi Labor Front. The leaders of the future German trade union movement must therefore be chosen from the ranks of the underground fighters and the anti-Fascists in exile, who never ceased in their struggle against Nazism and will not cease until that time when the last traces of Nazi influence have been destroyed and new and honest labor leaders have appeared."

1. a Non-Partisan Executive
2. Suppression of all party differences
3. Unity of all groups.

From CHILI

"El Aleman Antinazi" is published by "Alemania Libre" (Free Germany) in Santiago. It is the official organ of the Free Germany movement in Chile. President is Frederico Oehrens, vice-president Herman Wels. The editorial staff is composed of Friedrich Wolff, Moscow and Paul Merker, Mexico.

**** From ARGENTINE

Ludwig Renn, Paul Merker, Erich Jungmann, Alexander Abusch, editors of "Freies Deutschland" Mexico, sent a telegram of welcome addressed to the VolksBlatt, official organ of the Free Germans in Argentine with headquarters in Buenos Aires.

Noticias Alemanas (German news) is published by "El Movimiento Aleman Democratico en el Paraguay" in Asuncion. The editors are Rudolf Kamann and Anton Hoerschgens.

The paper made an appeal for the formation of a German Democratic Movement and calls for financial support from its readers by becoming dues paying members.

**** CHAPLAIN TAUSIG

one of the newly elected members of the Executive Committee of the "Free Germany" movement in Great Britain, was greeted by his colleague, Division Chaplain Kaiser, in a special broadcast from the Station of the National Committee of "Free Germany" in the name of the "religious members" of the National Committee for a new and free Germany!

Sermons by Catholic and Evangelical priests are among the most important of the broadcasts to Germany. Chaplain Tausig was a leader of the Catholic Youth in Germany and a co-fighter with the group of Munich students who were executed, the friend and comrade of Hans Scholl, was also stated to be the first Free German speaker from London to Germany.

Following this appeal, the "Aufbau"(Reconstruction) New York of January 14, 1944 prints the following report:

" Chaplain Tausig, member of the Executive Committee of the Free Germany Movement in England is among those who will broadcast sermons from London to Germany."

**** "FREE GERMANS" in London for German SLAVE LABOR in RUSSIA.

"... as one of the outstanding economists, Prof. E. Varga of the Academy of Sciences in Moscow, recently made a concrete statement on the problem of reparation of war damage. Varga proposes that all material and personal damage be repaired."

Kuscinski offers technical advice on how to repatriate the factories and patents already abroad. All means of transportation are to lead directly into Russia. The otherwise scrupulously clear-thinking professor, who is actually a statistician by profession, carefully avoids however any discussion of what "Professor" Varga himself considers his most important point, and what the international press has characterized as the "transportation of slaves". After this striking omission of Varga's most important demand, Kuscinski closes with the following:

"...Such proposals are naturally of a special interest to us "Free Germans" and can serve as a point of departure for a number of fundamental resolutions."

The same issue of the "Freie Tribuene", London carries an editorial note which gives a hint as to the reasons for such fear.

"H.N. Braisford, in the "Reynolds News" states that only decent men are to be sent to Russia for reconstruction work...."

Naturally the Stalinists and the future Russian Quislings in Germany think of themselves as such decent men and reply :

" The SS and the members of the disease-ridden Nazi youth are to stay in Germany and be entrusted with the important tasks of reconstruction, and at the same time a program of reeducation is to be undertaken. This would be a fine solution - The anti-Nazis expelled from Germany, while the Nazis would remain."

The Communist editors of the "Freie Tribuene" must have thought with horror of their comrades who were drowned in the "purge", disappeared, or are ending their lives somewhere in Siberian concentration camps, if they were not officially executed.

"ALL SENSE OF SHAME HAS GONE TO THE DOGS"

German Social Democrat in London demand "Gleichschaltung" with Stalinists. Dr. Karl Rawitzki, former Syndicus of the "Deutscher Bergarbeiter Verband" (German Miners' Union) writes: " All sense of shame has gone to the Dogs"... because the German Social Democrats in the U.S. did not adopt the same resolution as was formulated by the London executive of the SPD. This resolution speaks of an understanding with the PEACE-LOVING S.U. Furthermore the U.S. Social Democrats have not yet formed a United Front with the Communists for the organization of a Free Germany Committee to be affiliated to the Moscow Committee. There is a full page polemic against the German Social Democrats who refuse to join a United Front with the Communists, and the article closes with:

" We have taken a clear and unequivocal stand for the policies of the United Nations and we must take a similarly clear and unequivocal stand in support of the "Free Germany Movement".

ADELE SCHREIBER DEMANDS INTRODUCTION OF "PENANCE AND EXPIATION".

Adele Sch., former Reichstag deputy, member of the National Executive of the "Freier Deutsche Kulturbund" writes in the January issue of its publication :

"None of us will ever really overcome the sense of guilt which we feel, even those of us who feel and believe that we did our best, and know that we have nothing to feel guilty about. But whatever we can do, in atonement to those who survive and to the future generation, must be done. In order to have a constructive influence, whether we have few or many years ahead of us, we must grow stronger and cleanse ourselves of all sin.

We must not be afraid, therefore, to repudiate openly and honestly our mistakes and shortcomings in the past. And since we must all begin our own activities on a small scale, the first step is to unite as Refugees from Germany, outside of former party lines, into a broad united front to support the fight against Hitler and prepare for the recovery of Germany."

LOYALTY OATHS AND HONORARY DIPLOMAS

The new group voted to extend their thanks to the Bolivian government for its complete understanding of the freedom movement. It praised the government for its aid in wiping out the fifth columnists.
