Upon motion of Mrs. Mahoney, seconded by Dr. Renz, the Board accepted the bid of the C. D. Norris Coal Company to furnish approximately 1800 tons, 1½ x 2½" nut coal, shaker screened, delivered in the bin at Edinboro State Teachers College for \$5.80 per ton, subject to the approval of the Department at Harrisburg and subject to the terms of the Guffey Coal Act. This contract awarded to the C. D. Norris Coal Company on account of the superior grade of coal furnished and prompt delivery made by this Company during the past year.

Upon motion of Mrs. Mahoney, seconded by Mr. Marsh, the Board approved the recommendation of Dr. Ross that Walter Peterson be employed by the Edinboro State Teachers College as Fireman, beginning July 1, 1937, subject to the regular salary schedule.

Upon motion of Mrs. Mahoney, seconded by Mr. Bordwell, the Board approved the recommendation of Dr. Ross that Miss Pe Sarah Pettit be employed by the Edinboro State Teachers College as Dietitian, beginning September 1, 1937 - subject to budgetary conditions and the regular salary schedule.

Upon motion of Mr. Marsh, seconded by Dr. Renz, the Board approved the recommendation of Dr. Ross that Mr. C. J. Christenson be employed by the Edinboro State Teachers College as Rural Education Teacher at a salary of \$2,800.00 for 36 weeks, subject to budgetary conditions.

Upon motion of Mrs. Mahoney, seconded by Mr. Bordwell, the Board approved the President's recommendation that Miss Hazel Ober, Johnstown, Pennsylvania be employed by the Edinboro State Teachers College as resident directing nurse, with teaching duties, subject to the salary schedule, be begin work September 1, 1937.

Upon motion of Mr. Marsh, seconded by Mr. Bordwell, Dr.

Ross was authorized to negotiate with and hire if possible, Mr. Ferley Kline for night watchman at the Edinboro State Teachers College, beginning September 1, 1937.

Upon motion of Dr. Renz, seconded by Mrs. Mahoney, the meeting was adjourned.
