Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Edinboro State Teachers College has been apprised of the shortage of teachers in the fields of Special Education and of Commercial Education in the City of Erie and in other parts of the five counties served by the Edinboro State Teachers College, and

Whereas, frequent requests come to the College authorities not only for such teachers but for opportunities to prepare teachers of these fields,

Therefore, be it resolved that the Board of Trustees make known this situation to the State Council of Education with the hope that as soon as possible the State Council of Education approve the petition of this institution now pending before the State Council for permission to establish special curricula in Special Education and in Commercial
