Upon motion of Mr. Desmond, seconded by Mr. Earp, the Board approved the plans and specifications for a four car garage, a W. P. A. Project, as recommended by Dr. Ross.

Upon motion of Mr. Carlson, seconded by Mr. LaBounty, the Board approved the plans for rewiring Music Hall, a W.P.A. Project, as recommended by Dr. Ross.

Upon motion of Mr. Earp, seconded by Mr. Rose, the Board approved the plans for the completion of (a) Athletic Field, (b) Roads, (c) Farking Space, W.P.A. Projects, as recommended by Dr. Ross.

Upon motion of Mr. Earp, seconded by Mr. Carlson, the Board authorized Dr. Ross to have plans made and cost figured, by Mr. Johnson, for the Social and Recreation Room in the basement of Haven Hall.

Upon motion of Mr. Rose, seconded by Mr. LaBounty, the Board authorized Dr. Ross to secure from the proper authorities at Harrisburg, the necessary authorization for the demolition of the old power plant and Recitation Hall, in accordance with the plans heretofore approved: that authorization be secured for the demolition of Recitation Hall as a W.P.A. Project in order to use the materials contained therein for the construction of a four car garage on the campus.

Upon motion of Mr. Desmond, seconded by Mr. Rose, the Board authorized Dr. Ross to take up the matter of landscaping with the proper Department.

Upon motion of Mr. Desmond, seconded by Mr. LaBounty, the report of Mr. Marsh and Mr. Carlson, regarding Mr. Carl Arris, was accepted and the appointment of Mr. Carl Arris as Chief Operating Engineer A was confirmed, salary as per State Schedule.

The Board adjourned at 12:30 P. M. for luncheon.

The Board re-convened at 2:00 o'clock P. M. with Mr. Earp presiding.

Upon motion of Mr. Carlson, seconded by Mr. Desmond, the Board authorized Dr. Ross to again make application for the Special Curriculum in Business Education.

Upon motion of Mr. Carlson, seconded by Mr. LaBounty, the President of the College was instructed to see if he could secure from the proper authorities at Harrisburg the necessary authorization for the demolition or removal of the two frame houses known as Cottages, on the eastern edge of the Campus. The President was further authorized to secure estimates for the cost of the complete restoration and improvement of these houses in order to determine the final disposition of these buildings.

Upon motion of Mr. Carlson, seconded by Mr. LaBounty, the meeting was adjourned.
