### C. University

One of the 14 universities in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education (SSHE), Edinboro University is located in Erie County, a rural borough of Edinboro. It is the oldest teacher-training institution in the state west of the Allegheny Mountains. It is the second oldest institution in Pennsylvania. Edinboro Academy was chartered in 1856. Following the passage of the State Normal Act in 1857, the school opened as "Edinboro Normal School" for the preparation of teachers. Under its original charter, the school was privately administered. In 1861, the Commonwealth chartered it as a state normal school. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania purchased Edinboro in 1914. The state recognized the school as a four-year college in 1926. This title granted Edinboro the right to offer a Bachelor of Science in Education degree in three areas: elementary, secondary, and art education. The name of the institution was changed to Edinboro State College in 1960. University status was given to each of the state colleges in 1983. In addition, a comprehensive Commonwealth University System known as the State System of Higher Education (SSHE) was established.

Of the 7,778 students currently enrolled at Edinboro, 6,922 are undergraduates. Eighty-six percent of our student population attends class on a full-time basis. Edinboro University maintains six on-campus residence halls for approximately 2,500 students. There are more than 43 buildings situated on its spacious 585-acre campus, which includes open fields, a lake, and many wooded acres.

Edinboro University in Erie-The Porreco Center, located on West 38<sup>th</sup> Street in Erie, Pennsylvania, consists of a 27-acre tract of land and buildings. The Porreco Center serves to centralize and expand outreach programs to the greater Erie area. Undergraduate, graduate, and continuing education classes are offered at the center. It includes a conference/convention center, 11 buildings, wooded areas, a pond, orchards, and parking for 160 cars. Newly renovated classrooms and meeting rooms are fully equipped to serve educational programs, social events, or teleconferences for 5 to 80 people. The Porreco Center can accommodate banquets, buffets, receptions, or light refreshments.

Edinboro University is accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, 3624 Market Street, Philadelphia, PA 19104, 215-662-5606. The Commission on Higher Education is an institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation.

In April of 2001, the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) granted formal accreditation to Edinboro University's professional education unit.

Other University accreditations and program approvals include: the Bachelor of Science in Nursing by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, the Bachelor of Science in Nutrition (CP) by the American Dietetic Association, the Master of Arts in Rehabilitation Counseling by the Council on Rehabilitation Education, the Master of Arts in Counseling-School Guidance and Student Personnel Services programs by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs, the Master of Arts in Speech-Language Pathology by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the Bachelor of Science in Social Work by the Council on Social Work Education, the Bachelor of Arts in Music by the National Association of Schools of Music, and the Bachelor of Science and Associate of Science in Business Administration by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs. The Pennsylvania State Board of Nursing approves the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, and the Pennsylvania Department of Education approves the Teacher Certification programs.

## **D. Location**

Edinboro University is located adjacent to the business district of Edinboro, Pennsylvania, and near the intersection of Interstates 90 and 79. Passenger services operate on frequent schedules connecting Edinboro with nearby cities and towns. This includes Erie, Pennsylvania's fourth-largest city. The Erie International Airport on Tom Ridge Field, Amtrak Union Depot, Greyhound Bus Lines and Erie Metropolitan Transit Authority are just 30 minutes away. The community of Edinboro is within walking distance of the campus. It has a population of approximately 6,800 people and eight churches of various denominations.

## **E. Facilities**

The focal point of the campus is the modern seven-story Baron-Forness Library, the restoration and use of two turn-of-the-century structures. Reeder Hall and the Diebold Center for the Performing Arts, have maintained the traditions of the past.

The Baron-Forness Library contains over 480,000 bound volumes, more than 1,300,000 microfilm units, an on-line public access catalog, and access to on-line CD ROM databases. It also provides a Kurzweil reader for the visually impaired, an instructional computer lab, interlibrary loan service, and a web page that serves as an introduction to the library services and resources.

Memorial Auditorium, used for lectures, concerts, and stage productions, offers professional sound and lighting systems. The auditorium maintains seating for 875. A major renovation of the facility began in the spring of 2002. In addition to staging local theater productions and hosting visiting theatrical companies, the Diebold Center accommodates guest lecturers, serves as a classroom laboratory/recital hall, and hosts special workshops and continuing education classes. Space within the complex currently functions as a center for senior citizens within the region. These two facilities add a cultural, social, and community dimension to the University.

McComb Fieldhouse contains three basketball courts, a swimming pool with one-meter diving, a weight room, modern athletic training facilities, and bleacher seating for 3,200. Sox Harrison Stadium, with a seating capacity of 5,600, serves as host to the Fighting Scots football team. In addition, it contains a 400-meter all-weather track as well as special viewing facilities for disabled spectators and accommodations for the hearing impaired.

The University Center is the hub of student interaction. It contains the University Bookstore, several lounges, a multipurpose room with stage lighting, electronic games, banking facilities, the "MacCato's Bog" (an upbeat dining facility), and an office for student government. An addition completed in 1994 expanded office and bookstore facilities, added racquetball courts, an indoor track, a complete fitness center, recreational equipment facilities, an aerobics room, a climbing wall, and a basketball court. These are all for student recreational use.

The Governor George Leader Speech and Hearing Center provides services to individuals of all ages with communication impairments. Services include screenings, evaluations, therapy, and training in the areas of fluency, language, articulation, voice, accent modification, hearing-impairment, middle ear disease, and augmentative/alternative communication. The center is located adjacent to Compton Hall with the Assistive Technology Research Education and Training (CATER) located in Compton Hall, Room 102. Although the Center operates on a fee-for-service basis, reduced fees are available for those who qualify and no client will be turned away due to inability to pay. Graduate students or seniors (under the supervision of licensed speech-language pathologists or audiologists) provide all services. Contact the Center at 732-2433 for further information.



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The new Arts and Sciences Center, completed in January 2000, is a centerpiece for the integration of technology in the classroom. The new building contains state-of-the-art teaching and learning facilities with four auditorium-style classrooms, four technology enhanced classrooms, and a distance education classroom. Eight of the classrooms include the 'smart podium,' a specifically equipped desk that enables faculty to operate computer and audio-visual equipment from one location. The distance education classroom allows us to link to a number of learning sites in the area as well as the SSHE office and other SSHE schools for multi-point video-conferencing.

Miller Laboratory School of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is a model program that delivers instruction by university faculty to children from preschool through fourth grades, which includes children with special needs. The Mission of the Miller Laboratory School is to provide a place to learn, a place to observe, a place to practice, and a place to research. With respect to the servicing of elementary students, the primary mission is to provide appropriate, theoretically-based learning experiences using developmentally appropriate practice in a multi-age setting so that all children can realize their potential. Content delivery is done through the use of integrated thematic units that incorporate the state standards. Authentic assessment techniques are used and compiled in a portfolio format. Second, Miller Laboratory School provides model programs where pre-service and in-service teachers, and students from other fields, can observe and practice. Third, Miller Laboratory School provides opportunities for educational research, curriculum development and collaborations with University faculty and local school districts.

Campus Child Care Center and Preschool (CCCC) is a childcare facility administered by Edinboro University of Pennsylvania that provides services for university students, faculty and staff, and other community families. This NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) accredited child care center operates a mixed age classroom which accommodates children from 18 months through 5 years of age, a preschool classroom for 4 and 5 year olds and a "before and after school" program for children from the General McLane school district and Miller Laboratory School of Edinboro University. Our mission is to support children's development by providing activities, which are designed to promote children's physical, cognitive, social and emotional growth. Our staff consists of professional educators who are dedicated to provide a safe and healthy environment and work collaboratively with parents to enhance children's lives.

Technology and Communications, located in Ross Hall, provides the University with a powerful, flexible, university computer facility, advanced networking and video capabilities, as well as voice communication services. Technology and Communications uses Compaq Alpha-series servers configured in a cluster environment. This supports administrative and instructional systems.

Technology and Communications supports/manages microcomputer labs located in various buildings on the main campus and at Edinboro University in Erie-The Porreco Center. These services include a computer lab designed for students with disabilities and a campus-wide network, based on the Ethernet protocol that connects numerous buildings and the on-line library system. The campus network is connected to the State System of Higher Education Central Office and to the other 13 universities in the State System. This is made possible via PA-SSHENET, a regional network with a gateway to the national Internet. All students are provided with network and email accounts. Students are also given access to SCOTS (Students-Centered Online Transaction System), a web-based system for registering for classes, checking grades and academic history, reviewing their bill, paying on-line, and more.

Other special facilities at Edinboro University include a planetarium, science laboratories, a solar observatory, an instructional TV studio (ETV), and a campus radio station (WFSE). The campus is accessible for use by students with disabilities and a variety of services are provided by the Office for Students with Disabilities. These services include attendant care, transportation services, wheelchair repair, occupational therapy, learning disability, captioning, interpreter, and academic and meal aide services.

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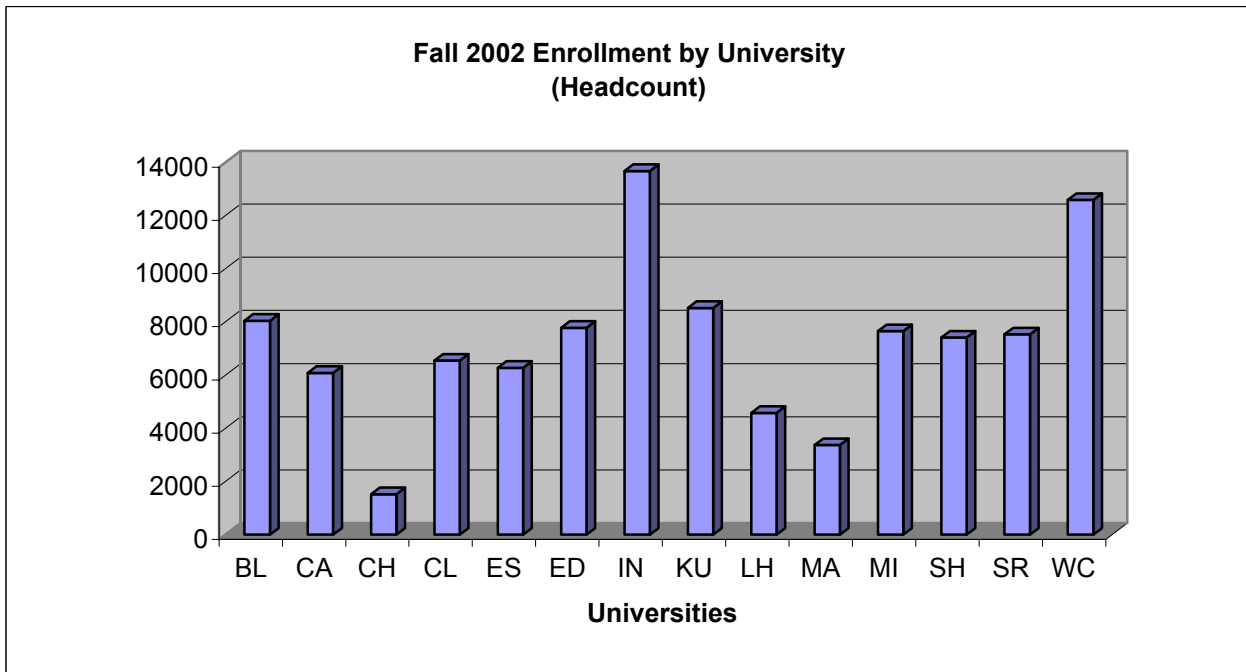

## **B. Technology and Communications Resources – Fall 2002**

Technology and Communications is a University-wide function composed of three main areas:

### **1. Enterprise Systems**

Enterprise systems is responsible for providing mission-critical information services to the University community and is also responsible for system and resource management, enterprise mail, messaging, conferencing systems, web server administration, and intranet development.

Edinboro utilizes Compaq servers for all central-processing purposes. They are interconnected via Compaq cluster technology.

Edinboro utilizes the Banner software package from SCT. This system provides students with access to their academic records, financial and billing information, class schedules, financial aid, and on-line registration. Furthermore, it provides faculty with access to advisee information and class rosters. Overall, it provides improved student services. EUP has an extensive set of web pages for both on and off-campus students. Students and employees are provided with tools and techniques for creating their own web pages.

### **2. Networks and Telecommunications**

Networks and Telecommunications is responsible for University-wide voice, video, and data communications services. Its primary purpose is to provide resilient information networks and to promote and integrate advanced telecommunications services throughout the University. The Edinboro campus network is an Ethernet-based network utilizing fiber optic and twisted pair running the TCP/IP protocol. The campus network is also connected to the State System of Higher Education and the other 13 State System universities via SSHENet, a regional network with a gateway to the national Internet.

Networks and Telecommunications is currently working on two initiatives that support our goal to be a leading-edge institution providing faculty, students, and staff with innovative services. Our plan is to enhance technology campus-wide and provide contemporary telecommunications services to support enrollment and retention of students.

The EUP Campus-Wide Information Network (CWIN) project, when complete, will result in an outside plant and new inside wiring for the majority of campus buildings. The first phase of the CWIN provided fiber and coax connectivity to all residence halls and Hendricks Hall. The next phase of CWIN, which is scheduled for completion in December 2001, will provide outside plant fiber and coax connectivity to 27 buildings on EUP's main campus, 8 buildings at Edinboro University in Erie-The Porreco Center, and new voice, video and data wiring for a combination of 6 auxiliary classroom and administrative buildings.

The Alliance project, which came on-line in the fall of 2000, provided residence hall wiring for voice, data, video, and a variety of communication services to students. Students now have access to a private satellite-based cable TV system, high-speed Internet access, and long distance services in residence hall rooms. The Nextira Student Technology Center at Edinboro University was opened in Dearborn Hall for sales of computer hardware and software, cellular phones, and a variety of ancillary products. Help desk services for students, computer repair services, and billing (long distance, cellular, internet and cable television) will be managed from this location. Off-campus students are able to sign up for the same Internet services connecting via modems.

A new voice communications PBX system for Edinboro University students, faculty, and staff was installed in 2000/2001. This system provides advanced telecommunications features and voice mail to faculty and staff. These advanced features and voice mail are available to students on a subscription basis via the Nextira Student Technology Center.

### 3. Desktop Systems & Learning Technology

Desktop Systems & Learning Technology supports and manages microcomputer facilities for teaching and learning, distance education services, a television and media services function, and the Help Desk, which provides a single point of contact for the campus community to receive assistance with computer and peripheral related problems or questions.

Several Ethernet-based local area networks run the Windows 2000/NT network operating system using the TCP-IP protocol. These LANs connect to the campus network with one Windows authentication server that currently provides authentication services to 20 computer labs.

The purpose of the laboratories is to gain practical experience in microcomputer applications and learn how technology is utilized within particular disciplines. Programs available include spreadsheets, database management, graphics, various programming languages, word processing, and host to micro file transfer. E-mail and Internet access are also available in most labs. A computer lab also exists for students with disabilities. All students automatically receive network account when they register in order to access these facilities and services. Facilities as of 9/2001 include:

Desktop Systems and Learning Technology is a comprehensive support unit that provides distance education, media resources, and services to students, faculty, staff, and management in support of their respective needs and missions. It provides equipment distribution and repair services campus wide. The television studio facilities have been used to promote the University and to teach courses for the Speech and Communication Studies Department and in association with the Edinboro News Network (ETV). Integrative video conferencing facilities are available for classes and conferences. Courses provided in this mode are connected to students in remote locations such as Warren, PA and to regional high schools.

A number of classrooms have been upgraded with additional TVs, VCRs and Special AV equipment, overhead projectors and Gateway and Mac workstations. Both Butterfield and the Arts and Sciences Center are equipped with state-of-the-art video conferencing rooms.

# **Glossary**



## 16. Glossary

**Articulation Agreement\*** : Letter of understanding which facilitates the transfer of credits by students between high schools, community colleges, colleges, and universities.

**Associate's Degree** : An award that normally requires at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college level work. Degree types used in this document: AA and AS.

**Bachelor's Degree** : An award that normally requires at least four, but no more than six years of full-time equivalent college-level work. Degree types used in this document: BA, BS, BSED, BSN, and BFA.

**Certification Program** : A program of study that leads to certification. Certifications are offered at the undergraduate and graduate level. The degree types used in this document: AC, CR, and TC.

Advanced Certificate (AC) is awarded by an outside agency. Application for certification must be filed with the outside agency.

A certificate (CR) is awarded by Edinboro University of Pennsylvania.

Teaching Certificate (TC) is awarded by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE). Application for certification must be filed with the PDE.

**Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) Code** – A numerical classification for secondary and postsecondary instructional programs. The CIP code is the accepted government standard for program coding in all education information surveys.

**County\*** - County within the state of Pennsylvania for which the student resided when first admitted to the University.

**Ethnic Categories\*** - Categories used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with, or belong in the eyes of the community. These categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The groups used to categorize U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and other eligible non-citizens are as follows:

American Indian or Alaskan Native: A person having origins in any of the native peoples of North America and who maintain cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian/Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or Pacific Islands.

Black (Non-Hispanic): A person having origins in any of the black groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic Origin).

Hispanic: A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish Culture or origin, regardless of race.

White (Non-Hispanic): A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic Origin).

Non-Resident Alien: A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Unspecified: Ethnic category not supplied or specified on application forms.

**Class Standing** - Freshman: Undergraduate credits earned 0-31.  
Sophomore: Undergraduate credits earned 32-63.  
Junior: Undergraduate credits earned 64-95.  
Senior: Undergraduate credits earned 96-128+.

**Full-time Equivalency (FTE)\*** - A measure that combines full-time and part-time student credit loads or faculty and staff workloads and equates those to a full-time number by using the following formulas. Undergraduate FTE is equal to the total number of credits enrolled/30 for academic year. Graduate FTE is equal to the total number of credits enrolled/24 for academic year.

**Full-time Status** - Undergraduate student credit load is equal to or greater than 12 credits/semester.  
Graduate student credit load is equal to or greater than 9 credits/semester.  
Faculty and staff workload is equal to 37.5 hours workweek

**Graduate Student\*** - A student who holds at least a bachelor's or first professional degree and is enrolled at the post-baccalaureate level. This includes non-degree students in graduate courses who may or may not be admitted to a graduate program.

**Master's Degree** - Successful completion of a graduate program that consists of one or more years of post-baccalaureate work. Degree types used in this document: MA, MFA, MSN, and MED.

**Part-time Status** - Undergraduate student credit load is equal to or less than 12 credits/semester.  
Graduate student credit load is equal to or less than 9 credits/semester.  
Faculty and staff workload is less than 37.5-hour workweek.

**Residence Status** - Off Campus: A student who temporarily resides away from their primary residence to attend classes on campus. Housing typically involves apartment rental within the community in which the campus is located.  
Commuter Student: A student who resides off campus in housing that is not owned by, operated by, or affiliated with the college. This category includes students that commute from their primary residence.  
Residence Hall: A student who resides in housing that is owned by, operated by, and/or affiliated with the college. This setting is typically a dorm room located on campus.

**Square Foot\*** - A unit of measurement used to determine the space available within a given set of parameters.

**Undergraduate Student\*** - A student enrolled in a bachelor's degree program, in an associate's degree program, or a non-degree seeking student matriculated in a lower or upper division course.
